PILGRIMAGE TO THE DEWUNDERA SRI VISHNU
MAHA DEWALE.

Rules made under Pilgrimages Ordinance, No. 13 of 1896.

1. The duration of the stay at Dondra of pilgrims to the Dewundera Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale shall be restricted to a period of twelve days, namely, July 14 to July 25, 1932. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period herein prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious, or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity before or during the pilgrimage or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all visitors to leave Dondra at once, and return to their homes, and to prescribe the routes by which they shall travel. Any person disobeying the order of the Assistant Government Agent shall be guilty of an offence.

3. Any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, and not forthwith reporting the same to the Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police present at Dondra, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be guilty of an offence.

4. Any person selling meat, fish, or fresh vegetables at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board and any person selling meat, food, or drink of any kind condemned as unwholesome by a Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Mudaliyar or senior officer of Police present at Dondra, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. All cakes, sweetmeats, and other foodstuffs exposed for sale at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases or other fly-proof receptacles. All such receptacles shall be kept clean.

6. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the erection of proper latrine accommodation on a site and of a type approved by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board sufficient, to last during the continuance of the pilgrimage, for which purpose he shall forward plans and specifications for the approval of the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman, Sanitary Board, at least ten days before the pilgrimage commences. He shall further be responsible for the supply of coir dust, or sand, and disinfectants of a quality approved by the Assistant Government Agent, and for the proper conservancy and cleaning of the latrines at least twice a day during the continuance of the pilgrimage. In the event of the proprietor or lessee contravening any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who shall during the pilgrimage use any other place for the offices of nature than that set apart for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Sanitary

Board or the proprietor or lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the collection and removal of all straw, rubbish, cattle dung, or any kind of litter at least once every day during the continuance of the pilgrimage, and such rubbish and litter shall be burned or buried at a place approved by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board. Any proprietor or lessee failing to carry out or to cause to be carried out the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

9. No booth or other building for the purpose of the pilgrimage shall be erected at Dondra within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla and of the approach road to the dewale, and no stall-holder, vendor, or betel-seller shall expose any article for sale within such space. Any person contravening this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

10. No booth or other building shall be erected at Dondra on such portion of the ground as may be reserved by the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, for the accommodation of visitors or vehicles. Any person contravening the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

RULES.

Business Reply Envelopes and Cards.

(1) "Business Reply Cards" and "Business Reply Envelopes" addressed to any holder of a permit obtained in the manner hereinafter prescribed shall, subject to the provisions of these rules, be transmitted by the inland post without prepayment of postage, and shall not be regarded as unpaid-for matter.

(2) The postage due on such Cards and Envelopes shall be calculated at the prepaid rates applicable to such classes of articles and collected from the addressee on delivery.

(3) Persons desiring the privilege of having Business Reply Cards and Envelopes transmitted to them through the inland post without prepayment shall obtain a permit from the Postmaster-General.

(4) The fee for a permit shall be Rs. 10 and shall be paid in advance by the applicant. Such permit shall expire at the end of one year from date of issue but may be renewed for further periods of one year at a time on payment of a fee of Rs. 10 in respect of each such renewal.

(5) Without prejudice to any other penalties prescribed in the Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908, the permit shall be liable to cancellation in the event of default in the payment of the postage due on such cards and envelopes as are transmitted to the permit holder through the post.

(6) Business Reply Cards and Envelopes shall conform in size, form, and quality to the conditions prescribed for post cards and letters of the Inland Post.

(7) Business Reply Cards and Envelopes issued by the permit holder shall bear on the address side such particulars and identifying marks as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe.

1. Except as otherwise ordered all trees 12 inches and upwards in girth must be cut within 6 inches from the ground and for every stool which exceeds 6 inches in height from the ground, a fine of 25 cents will be levied.

2. Work shall proceed only in one block at a time, and all work shall be completed in block No. 1 before block No. 2 is entered, &c.

3. The contractor shall not enter a fresh block without the written permission of the Range Forest Officer.

4. The block lines shall be widened sufficiently by the contractor to form extraction paths and for the stacking of firewood and for its subsequent transport to the delivery depôt. There shall be allowed only one main extraction cart track.

5. Trees which emit milky exudation such as ficus species, kaduru, &c., shall not be converted into firewood, when felled, but burnt with other brushwood, &c.

6. The firewood shall be in lengths of 3 feet and not less than 2 inches in diameter. All billets over 9 inches in diameter shall be split.

7. Every tree felled shall be converted into firewood, and for every log left in the area unconverted a fine of 50 cents will be imposed.

8. Stacks on railway line must be in rows convenient for loading the firewood into railway trucks. To economize ground space and to allow space between the stacks for inspection, stacks shall be either 3 feet, 4½ feet, or 6 feet in height as the Forest Officer in charge may from time to time direct. Walking space to be left between each two stacks.

9. The contractor will be responsible for the safety of the firewood when stacked in the forest or on the railway line, or when it is in transit.

10. The contractor may be required at times to increase the supplies should the railway requirements necessitate, and at times also to decrease the supplies, but the average output shall be as described in the schedule.

11. A penalty of 10 cents for every cubic yard of firewood not stacked or delivered at the monthly rate stipulated will be exacted from the contractor.

12. The contractor is to be paid monthly at the convenience of the Divisional Forest Officer for firewood supplied as above and accepted at the accepted rate per cubic yard on production of formal receipts signed by a responsible officer of the Railway Department, deductions being made for any fine or penalty imposed under this contract. Rejected material will not be paid for but will lapse to Government. In the event of a dispute arising owing to deductions for bad stacking, &c., the wood is liable to be restacked by the contractor and the measurement then taken shall be considered as final for purpose of payment. No payment or certificate shall protect or be deemed to protect the contractor in the case of any over-payment.

13. Nothing in this contract shall preclude the Divisional Forest Officer from taking action in accordance with the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, against the contractor for felling or allowing his coolies to fell any tree within or outside his area of contract which should not be felled in accordance with the conditions of the said contract or without the necessary permit prescribed by the said Ordinance.

The contractor shall clear-fell all trees and saplings, except such as are marked by a Forest Officer for standards, standing in a demarcated area of about 20 acres in extent, bounded on the north, east, and west by cut lines, and south by old teak areas, and in the portion of forest about 4 acres in extent just opposite to the demarcated area and surrounded by teak in the Palugama Proposed Reserve in Anuradhapura Range, or in additional blocks to be demarcated in the above specified area, if required, sufficient to yield 6,000 cubic yards (more or less) of firewood, with the least amount of wastage, transport such firewood and deliver same neatly stacked at the Anuradhapura Railway Station Yard, not further than 30 feet from the nearest

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 11, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 141 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 82 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1932, viz., 291,260) was 25.3, as against 26.9 in the preceding week, 29.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 106 (4 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 15 Moors, 1 Malay, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 19.0, as against 19.4 in the previous week, 29.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 106 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 19 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, and Kotahena South, as against 7 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against nil in the previous week, and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), and Wellawatta North. The number registered during the preceding week was also 3, and the weekly average for last year was 5.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, and Slave Island, as against 8 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. (a) One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 3 in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Plague*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Four deaths from *Debility* were registered; 3 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Enteritis*, and *Worms*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Dysentery* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 49 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-four cases of *Chickenpox*, 10 of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Measles*, 3 of *Plague*, and 2 of *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 7, 12, 5, 5, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Maradana South, as against 13 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 8 in the previous week, and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the preceding week was also 3, and the weekly average for last year was 5.

(b) The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approved price fixed by the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder, on being declared the purchaser, shall sign his name in the register of sale in admission of such purchase and deposit the necessary amount.

(c) Twenty-five per cent. of the bids to be deposited immediately after acceptance of the bids. The balance should be paid within 20 days of the date of sale, when a permit for removal will be issued.

(d) The measurements as recorded by the Divisional Forest Officer must be accepted, but prior to date of auction any prospective bidder is at liberty to check the measurements, and to represent any difference promptly.

(e) Prospective purchasers must before bidding for any timber satisfy themselves as to the quality and conditions of the timber for which they offer and that no representations as to quality and condition of the timber will be entertained after bid or an offer has been accepted for the same.

(f) All timber sold and the full price bid of which has been paid must be removed from the depôt within 20 days of date of sale, and will be at the risk of the purchaser until removed. A charge of Re. 1 per log or per lot of timber per week or part of a week is liable to be made for any logs not removed within 20 days of sale. 11. All mining, gemming, and quarrying rights in respect of this land are reserved to the Crown.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Galle Municipal Council, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, April 16, 1932, pursuant to notice dated April 11, 1932.

Present :—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; Dr. S. P. Joseph; Mr. P. R. Gunasekara; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel; and Mr. A. M. Saheed.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of March 12, 1932, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. Amarasuriya asked the following questions :—(1) Were notices of meetings of the Council given to the Member for ward 2, after the General Meeting held on November 14, 1931, till the end of January, 1932? (2) What right has the Secretary, in the absence of any written information to that effect, to presume that a Member would not be able to attend, and hold back notices of meetings? (3) What was the reason for closing the road connecting Dickson's road with Wakwella road, which runs between the Power House and the Quarry? (4) Was this road used by the public for over 50 years for foot as well as vehicular traffic, until it was closed in January, 1932?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) The answer is in the negative. (2) The Member for ward 2 is well aware of the circumstances of this case. It is not considered that any one was to blame for the non-delivery of notices while the Member was away from Ceylon. The peon responsible for not delivering the notice of the meeting of January 30 has been suitably punished, as the Member had returned to Galle on January 26. (3) In order to prevent the recurrence of a madman or any other person committing mischief to the Power House and its appurtenances. (4) I am unable to give a definite answer to this question. Apparently my predecessor regarded this road as a private one for the use of the Quarry. But I am given to understand that the road has been used for some time by the public as a footpath, but am not prepared to admit that it was used for vehicular traffic for which it is clearly unsuitable.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved—That the Chairman do take steps to cause the obstruction to the use of the road connecting Dickson's road with Wakwella road going past the Power House, to be removed and restore the legal rights of the public for the use of this road. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara seconded.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the Council do arrange that for the present the gates at each end of the fence be opened between the hours of 6.30 A.M. and 7 P.M., with a view to giving the public facilities for the purpose of passing along the Quarry road, without conceding that the public have any vested interests to the use of the same, and on the understanding that the Law Committee will submit to the Council within three months a report on the question of such rights. Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved—“That the fees of the motor bus stand at the Bazaar be reduced from Rs. 7.50 to Rs. 5 per quarter till the end of the current year.” Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.

Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe moved, as an amendment, that the motion be altered to read as follows :—That this Council request His Excellency the Governor to amend Regulation No. 4 published in the *Government Gazette* No. 7,685 of January 11, 1929, under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, by reducing the fee of Rs. 7.50 to Rs. 5.

The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment which was put to the meeting and carried.

5. To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed on February 13, 1932, “to make an early report as to the best method of dividing the Municipality into seven wards.”—Resolved that the report of the Special Committee be adopted.

With the permission of Council Mr. P. R. Gunasekara moved that a deputation of this Council consisting of Messrs. J. E. Perera, C. L. Wickremasinghe, and P. R. Gunasekara do wait on the Minister of Local Administration to urge further consideration of the decision of the Executive Committee on the second part of the original resolution passed by Council on February 13, 1932, and to supplement the report of the Chairman on the first part of the resolution. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded—carried unanimously.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Galle Municipal Council, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, May 14, 1932, pursuant to notice dated May 10, 1932.

Present:—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; Dr. S. P. Joseph; Mr. P. R. Gunasekara; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel; and Mr. A. M. Saheed.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 16, 1932, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Date of meetings of Council and Standing Committees:—Agreed that the next meeting of the Standing Committees be held on June 11 and the General Meeting on June 18.

3. Mr. T. Amarasuriya submitted two petitions—one from the rate-payers of Kaluwella in ward No. 2 asking that they be provided with water and electric lights in the form of a standpipe and two lamps, and the other from the residents of Weliwatta also in ward No. 2 asking for proper drainage along Hirimbura road up to its junction with Kong Tree road. The petitions were tabled and the Chairman said that they would be inquired into after due inspection of the localities concerned.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

4. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of April 30, 1932.*

(2) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 500 for building manholes to surface level in Fort sewers.—Recommended. (b) Rs. 775 for rebuilding 202 l. ft. drains and steps along Dangedera road from Mosque to No. 369A.—Recommended that the estimate be passed, and that tenders be invited for the work. (c) Rs. 240 for erecting a barbed wire fence with concrete posts along the road frontage at the Infectious Diseases Hospital.—Recommended. (d) Rs. 620 for building two double and two single bullock scavenging carts.—Resolved that the Superintendent of Works be requested to submit a more detailed estimate to be circulated again among members of the Committee.

(3) To consider a report submitted by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department, *re* battery charging on Municipal account together with a statement of the capital and working expenditure involved.—Recommended that the matter be dropped.

(4) To consider 16 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(5) To consider tenders for—(a) building a public latrine for males and females at Mahamodera.—The Committee recommend the acceptance of the tender of H. M. Jamis Appu for Rs. 1,226.71; (b) building a small proof dépôt for conservancy buckets at Templars road.—The Committee recommend the acceptance of the tender of K. P. Hinniappuhamy for Rs. 598.12; (c) for cutting and removing the overhanging branches along the Keppu-ela from the Mahamodera lake to the Bope bridge.—Recommended that the work be entrusted to the Mudaliyar, Four Gravets, the cost not to exceed Rs. 175.

Resolution.

With regard to item 2 (d) it was resolved that the matter be referred back to the Standing Committee for further consideration.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

5. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of April 30, 1932.*

(2) To consider Mr. T. Amarasuriya's motion, *viz.*, that a temporary levy be taken from the salaries of the Municipal Staff during the prevalence of the present financial depression as is being done in the case of other public servants, with a view of giving some relief to ratepayers.—Recommended that no levy be made for the present.

(3) To consider the payment of a commuted travelling allowance to the Secretary.—Recommended, Mr. J. E. Perera formally dissenting, that the Secretary be paid a commuted allowance of Rs. 50 to include travelling and overtime spent in dealing with matters of assessment and sale of advertised properties.

(4) To strike off rates on demolished buildings in Wards 2, 4w, and 5.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(5) To waive the rates for the 1st quarter, 1932, on the evacuated buildings in the plague area amounting to Rs. 194.95 in ward 2 and Rs. 56.75 in ward 3.—Recommended that the rates be waived.

(6) To confirm the purchase on behalf of the Council of property No. 679A, Maitipe, sold by public auction for non-payment of rates.—Recommended that consideration be deferred till the next meeting, the Secretary in the meantime to submit a report on the matter.

(7) To consider a letter from the Hony. Secretary, Galle National League, relating to "Aid to the Galle Ayurvedic Association".—Recommended that no action be taken on the request of the Galle National League.

(8) To consider an application for reduction of rent from D. D. Babun, tenant of one of Council's boutiques in the Fish Market.—Recommended that the application for a reduction of rent be refused.

With regard to item (2) Mr. T. Amarasuriya, in opposing the recommendation of the Committee, moved that the original motion of March 7, 1932, be adopted, but there being no seconder, the motion fell through.

Mr. J. E. Perera asked permission of the Chairman to make a few remarks on the matter in view of the fact that he was the seconder of the original motion, and he felt that some explanation from him was necessary. Permission having been obtained, Mr. Perera said that after going through the figures in detail he found that not more than Rs. 3,000 per annum could be saved if the motion were given effect to and therefore it did not seem to him to be equitable that any levy should be made in view of the fact that the present finances of the Council were not unsound.

He also stated that it was well understood at the meeting of the Committee that steps would be taken to reconsider the matter at some future date if this was found to be necessary.

Resolution.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to this item be adopted.

With regard to item (3) the Chairman moved as an amendment that the commuted travelling allowance to the Secretary be fixed at Rs. 45 per mensem. Mr. Durham seconded.

Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved that another officer be appointed for the purpose of conducting sales, inspections, &c., but there being no seconder the motion fell through.

Mr. P. R. Gunasekara moved as a further amendment that the allowance be reduced to Rs. 25 to have retrospective effect from March 1, 1932. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.

Mr. J. E. Perera said he opposed the recommendation *in toto* as he was of opinion that no allowance at all should be offered but that Council should pay for any expenditure incurred in travelling. He suggested that the matter be reconsidered at some future date.

Messrs. C. L. Wickremasinghe and C. E. de Vos also spoke on the recommendation.

Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel moved as a further amendment that an allowance of Rs. 40 be paid.

The Chairman thereupon withdrew his amendment.

Mr. Durham seconded the motion of Mr. Scharenguivel.

Mr. Scharenguivel's motion was put to the house and the voting being equal the Chairman gave his casting vote against the motion which was accordingly lost.

Mr. Gunasekara's motion was then put to the house and carried by the Chairman's casting vote.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

6. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of May 7, 1932.*

(2) To consider the report of Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe re the sale of property No. 11, Dangedera, purchased by Council for non-payment of rates.—Recommended that the conveyance be signed and forwarded to Council's Lawyer for due registration and that for the present no further action be taken.

(3) To consider an application from Mr. E. Jayasuriya asking for compensation for a 4 ft. strip of land acquired for widening the alley leading to the public latrine on Seabeach road.—Resolved that the matter be deferred for an inspection of the premises by the Committee on Friday, May 13.

(4) To consider draft regulation under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, to be added to the regulations dated January 10, 1929.—Recommended that in view of the provisions of section 41 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, the matter be dropped.

(5) To consider the draft by-laws relating to bakeries, eating-houses, tea boutiques, dairies, and aerated water factories.—The Committee considered clause by clause the general by-laws relating to licences and further consideration was deferred until the next meeting.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

7. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of May 7, 1932.*

(2) To consider the report and estimate of the Medical Officer of Health re the establishment of (a) an outdoor dispensary and (b) a portable dispensary for the benefit of the poorer residents of the Municipality.—(a) Recommended that as the cost of establishing an outdoor dispensary would be too great at the present time no action be taken to institute one. (b) Recommended that the matter be deferred for further investigation.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

At the conclusion of the other business before the meeting, the Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider certain matters which did not appear on the agenda.

Council in Committee.

8. The Chairman said he had received a letter from Messrs. Coates and Co. asking for a special rate for electric current used for mechanical power and suggested that a rate of 25 cents a unit be charged.—Recommended that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

9. The Chairman informed the Council that further complaints had been received about Inspector Haniffa and moved that his services be discontinued at the end of June.—Recommended that his services be discontinued accordingly.

10. Council in Committee next considered an application from the Director of Electrical Undertakings for special rates for lighting Galle Lighthouse.

The Chairman moved that 20 cents a unit be charged.

Mr. J. E. Perera moved as an amendment that the rate be fixed at 25 cents a unit. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara seconded.—Carried. Recommended that an offer be sent to supply current at 25 cents a unit.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.
