WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Mahena village in Munwattelage pattuwa of Rayigam korale, in the District of Kalutara, Western Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, exempt any cemetery either wholly or in part from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

PILGRIMAGE TO THE DEWUNDERA SRI VISHNU
MAHA DEWALE.

Rules made under Pilgrimages Ordinance, No. 13 of 1896.

1. The duration of the stay at Dondra of pilgrims to the Dewundera Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale shall be restricted to a period of eleven days, namely, August 3 to August 13, 1933. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period herein prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious, or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity before or during the pilgrimage or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the

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Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all visitors to leave Dondra at once, and return to their homes, and to prescribe the routes by which they shall travel. Any person disobeying the order of the Assistant Government Agent shall be guilty of an offence.

3. Any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, and not forthwith reporting the same to the Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police present at Dondra, and any personabetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be guilty of an offence.

4. Any person selling meat, fish, or fresh vegetables at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board and any person selling meat, food, or drink of any kind condemned as unwholesome by a Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Mudaliyar or senior officer of Police present at Dondra, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. All cakes, sweetmeats, and other foodstuffs exposed for sale at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases or other fly-proof receptacles. All such receptacles shall be kept clean.

6. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the erection of proper latrine accommodation on a site and of a type approved by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board sufficient, to last during the continuance of the pilgrimage, for which purpose he shall forward plans and specifications for the approval of the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman, Sanitary Board, at least ten days before the pilgrimage commences. He shall further be responsible for the supply of coir dust, or sand, and disinfectants of a quality approved by the Assistant Government Agent, and for the proper conservancy and cleaning of the latrines at least twice a day during the continuance of the pilgrimage. In the event of the proprietor or lessee contravening any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who shall during the pilgrimage use any other place for the offices of nature than that set apart for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Sanitary Board or the proprietor or lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the collection and removal of all straw, rubbish, cattle dung, or any kind of litter at least once every day during the continuance of the pilgrimage, and such rubbish and litter shall be burned or buried at a place approved by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board. Any proprietor or lessee failing to carry out or to cause to be carried out the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

9. No booth or other building for the purpose of the pilgrimage shall be erected at Dondra within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla and of the approach road to the dewale, and no stall-holder, vendor, or betel-seller shall expose any article for sale within such space. Any person contravening this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

10. No booth or other building shall be erected at Dondra on such portion of the ground as may be reserved by the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, for the accommodation of visitors or vehicles. Any person contravening the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situated within the administrative limits of the Council, or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council.

2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased;
- (2) the name and address of the mortgagor; and
- (3) a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.

3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at Re. 1, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.

4. In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses have been so registered a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws relating to dairies published by Notification in the Gazette of December 9, 1927, are hereby amended—

- (i.) by the deletion, from the heading of the part or chapter thereof numbered II., of the words "and for sale of milk"; and
- (ii.) by the insertion, immediately after the aforesaid part or Chapter II., of the following new part or chapter:—

III.—Regulations for Sale of Milk generally.

1. No person who is not a licensee of a dairy as aforesaid, shall himself, or by any agent or servant, sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, any milk within the administrative limits of the Council, save in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

2. (i.) Every such person, whether resident within or without the limits of the Council, who desires to sell or supply for money milk in any quantity to any person or persons within the limits of the Council, shall cause himself to be registered in the books of the Council as a purveyor or supplier of milk.

- (ii.) Such registration shall be free of all fees or charges.

3. Every such person shall, by proper application made for that purpose, further cause registration-cards to be issued annually by the Chairman to each servant, vendor, or agent, whether paid or unpaid, employed by him in the work of selling or delivering milk.

4. Any contravention of, or non-compliance with, the foregoing provisions shall be an offence.

5. (1) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to register as a purveyor or supplier of milk under the foregoing by-law 2, any person who has not been recommended for registration, after such inspection, as may be necessary, of his premises, his animals, and his utensils and equipment generally—

(a) if he is a resident within the administrative limits of the Council, by the Medical Officer of Health of the Council; or

(b) if he is resident in any area outside the limits of the Council, by the Chairman of any duly constituted local authority there may be in such area, or if there is none, by the Medical Officer of Health for the district in which such area lies.

(2) The Chairman may likewise refuse to issue any registration-cards, under the foregoing by-law 3, until a Medical Officer deputed by him has examined and found each such servant, vendor, or agent to be free from any infectious or contagious disease and from diseases of the skin.

6. The registration-cards so issued by the Chairman shall include the following particulars:—

(a) employer's name and number on register.

(b) name of vendor or servant or agent, and his thumb impression.

7. It shall be an offence for any person to deliver milk or to carry or hawk milk for sale within the limits of the Council, unless he has in his possession a registration-card for the current year duly issued as aforesaid.

8. (i.) It shall be an offence for any person delivering milk or carrying or hawking milk for sale within the limits of the Council, to refuse, or to fail for any reason, to produce for inspection a duly issued registration-card for the current year, when called upon to do so by a Sanitary Inspector or by any person specially or generally authorized by the Chairman in that behalf.

(ii.) In the event of any person so refusing or failing to produce such card, it shall be lawful for such Sanitary Inspector or other authorized person to exercise the powers given to peace officers by section 33 (1) of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

9. It shall be an offence for any person to sell or deliver or to expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, within the limits of the Council—

(i.) any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless such milk is contained in a vessel which is distinctly and conspicuously labelled "Skimmed milk" in English, and the equivalent term in Sinhalese and Tamil, and is sold as such.

(ii.) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid; provided that milk, to which tea, coffee, or cacao has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house, shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law.

(iii.) any milk contained in bottles of which the mouth is not covered with paper or other impermeable material.

10. If any person found guilty of an offence under the foregoing by-law 9 is proved to be the agent or servant, whether paid or unpaid, of any other person, such other person shall also be liable to be punished for the same offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the Court that he had given all necessary instructions and used due diligence to ensure compliance, and that the offence was due to an act or default of his agent, or servant without his own knowledge, consent, or connivance.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

In such a case, if the Council considers that the special circumstances of the case justify the grant of a retiring allowance, the officer so called upon to retire may with the approval of the Governor, be given such retiring allowance as the Council thinks just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which his length of service would qualify him."

(iii.) by the addition of the following new by-law at the end thereof :—

“ 16. If any case arises, which is not covered by these by-laws, and which in the opinion of the Council merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, a report on the circumstances of such case together with the recommendation of the Council shall be forwarded through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments for submission to the Governor, who will decide what award, if any, may be granted.”

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Meetings: Notice, Agenda, Quorum, &c.

1. (a) There shall be twelve General Meetings of the Council in every year for the transaction of business.

(b) The general meetings of the Council shall be held at the Badulla Town Hall at least once every month on such day and at such hour as the Council may from time to time resolve, or as soon after that hour as may seem expedient to the Chairman.

(c) A special meeting may be held at the place aforesaid on such date and at such hour as the Chairman shall for each such meeting specially appoint.

(d) Notice of every such meeting and of the business to be transacted at it shall be served on each member at least three days—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—before the meeting.

(e) No business shall be brought before or transacted at any meeting, general or special, other than the business specified in the notice of the meeting, without the permission of the Council.

(f) No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum of at least five members is present.

(g) If at any meeting there is not a sufficient number of members present to form a quorum, the Chairman shall adjourn the meeting to such date not more than fifteen days after the date of the meeting so adjourned as he thinks fit, and the business which would have been brought before the meeting so adjourned, if there had been a quorum present, shall be brought before, and disposed of, at such adjourned meeting.

Adjournment of Meetings.

2. (a) The Chairman of any meeting, general or special, at which a quorum of the Council is present may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the meeting from time to time; but no business shall be transacted without the permission of the Council at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which such adjournment took place.

(b) Notice of an adjourned meeting shall be served on members at least twenty-four hours before the time fixed for such meeting unless the original meeting decides to hold the adjourned sitting within twenty-four hours.

Presence of Strangers.

3. Strangers, including the Press, may be present at meetings in the places set apart for them, but must withdraw when called upon to do so by the Chairman, when in the opinion of the majority of the members of the Council present at the meeting, expressed by resolution, such exclusion is deemed advisable in the public interest.

Order of Business.

4. The business of the Council shall be transacted in the following order :—

(a) Confirmation of the minutes of the last preceding meeting.

(b) Memorials, petitions, complaints, and communications addressed to the Council shall be laid before the Council.

(c) Questions of which due notice has been given.

(d) Motions of which due notice has been given.

(e) Any other matter set down in the notice of the meeting in the order in which such matters are set out or in such order as the Council may for special reasons adopt.

(f) Monthly statements of receipts and disbursements, progress reports of works, and such other documents as are required by the Council, shall be submitted to the Council.

Order of Precedence.

5. For all purposes connected with the Council, the precedence and seniority of members shall be regulated as follows :—

After the Chairman shall rank the Vice-Chairman and then the members in order of the priority of their nomination by the Governor or election by the voters and in the case of former members re-elected or re-nominated, of the priority of their continuous membership of Council (such continuous membership being deemed to be unimpaired during the absence of a nominated member for whom a temporary successor has been nominated).

Minutes.

6. The minutes of each meeting shall be circulated. At the next or some subsequent meeting the question shall be put that the minutes be taken as read and confirmed. In the absence of objection or correction, the minutes as recorded shall be confirmed.

Memorials, Petitions, &c.

7. (a) A member presenting a petition or memorial to the Council may state concisely the purpose of the petition or memorial.

(b) No member shall present any petition or memorial or other communication which is not respectful in tone throughout.

(c) It shall be competent for any member to move that such petition or memorial be read. In making such motion he shall state concisely his reasons for wishing to have it read.

(d) No debate shall be permitted on such motion, nor shall any other member speak upon or in relation to such petition or memorial, except to second the motion formally.

(e) Such motion being seconded, the question shall be put whether the petition or memorial shall be read.

Questions.

8. (a) Questions relating to the affairs of the Council may be put to the Chairman.

(b) At least seven clear days' notice—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—shall be given of such questions.

(c) A written reply shall be read by the Chairman to each question.

(d) No member shall address the Council upon any question, nor shall the terms of any question contain any argument or expression of opinion or statement of fact, except in so far as may be necessary to explain such question.

(e) Any member may put a supplementary question for the purpose of further elucidating any matter of fact regarding which an answer has been given.

Provided that the Chairman may disallow any supplementary question if, in his opinion, it infringes the rules as to the subject matter of questions, and in that case the question shall not appear on the record of the minutes of the Council.

Motions.

9. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing signed by the member of the Council giving the notice. Unless such notice has been in the hands of the Secretary seven clear days—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—before the meeting of Council, the motion may not be included in the agenda.

(b) All notices of motions shall be dated and numbered as received, and shall be entered by the Secretary upon the agenda in the order in which they are received.

(c) Before any notice of motion is placed on the agenda paper, it shall be submitted to the Chairman, who, if he be of opinion that it is out of order, shall order that such motion shall not be included in the agenda and shall cause the giver of the notice to be so informed.

(d) Every motion of which notice is given shall be relevant to some question affecting the administration of the Council's affairs.

(e) No motion to rescind any resolution which has been passed within the preceding six months, nor any motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived within the preceding six months, shall be deemed to be

in order, unless notice thereof shall have been given and specified in the agenda, and the notice shall bear, in addition to the member who proposes the motion, the signatures of seven other members; and when such motion has been disposed of, it shall not be competent for any member to propose any similar motion within the period of six months next following.

(f) No motion shall be deemed to have been submitted for debate until it shall have been proposed and seconded.

(g) Any member may second a motion or amendment by rising in his place and bowing to the Chair, without prejudice to his right to speak at a later period of the debate.

(h) Before any motion of which previous notice has not been given, is moved in Council, it shall be reduced to writing signed by the mover and handed to the Secretary.

(i) When a motion has been moved and seconded and the debate thereon concluded, the question thereupon shall be put to the vote by the Chairman.

Withdrawal of Motion or Amendment.

10. A member who has moved a motion or amendment may withdraw the same by leave of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked for permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Reintroduction of Motion.

11. A motion which has been withdrawn may be moved again at any subsequent meeting; but no motion shall be proposed which is the same in substance as any motion which within the period of six months referred to in rule 9 (e) shall have been resolved in the affirmative or negative.

Amendments.

12. (a) Every amendment shall be in writing and handed to the Secretary by the member proposing it.

(b) Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion during the discussion of which it is moved.

(c) Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

(d) No amendment shall be discussed or put to the Council until it shall have been seconded.

(e) A member who has seconded an amendment in a formal manner shall be permitted afterwards to speak upon it.

(f) Whenever an amendment to any motion under discussion has been moved and seconded, no second or subsequent amendment shall be moved until the first amendment shall have been disposed of. If an amendment be carried, the motion as amended shall take the place of the original motion, and shall become the question upon which any further amendment may be moved.

Debate ceases when Question fully put.

13. No member may speak to any question after the same has been fully put by the Chairman. A question is fully put when the voting has been taken thereon.

Voting and Recording of Votes.

14. (a) The question shall be put by the Chairman, and the votes may be taken by a show of hands or by a secret ballot as the Council decides, and the result shall be declared by the Chairman; but in any case where the votes are taken otherwise than by secret ballot, any member may call for a division, and in that event the votes shall be taken by the Secretary asking each member separately, according to the order of precedence, how he desires to vote, and recording the votes accordingly.

(b) On any question being put, whether in Council or in Committee of the whole Council, every member present shall record his vote, either for the ayes or the noes.

Casting Vote of Chairman.

(c) The Chairman shall have an original vote in common with other members whether in Council or Committee of the whole Council, and also a casting vote if upon any question the votes are equal.

Members dissenting.

15. It shall be competent for any member, who is in a minority, to record the reasons for his dissent from the opinion of the majority, and such written dissent, if sent to the Secretary within one week of the meeting in question, shall be entered by the Secretary at the end of his minutes of the proceedings.

Order of the Day.

16. The "Order of the Day" shall include all business, arranged according to rule No. 4. Unless otherwise resolved the business shall be taken in the order printed.

Preservation of Order.

17. (a) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order, and his decision on all disputed points of order shall be final.

(b) Any member of the Council deviating from the rules may be immediately called to order by the Chairman of his own motion or on any other member of the Council rising to a point of order.

Decision of Questions of Order.

18. When the question of order has been stated, the member who raises it shall resume his seat, and no other member, except by leave of the Chairman, shall rise till the Chairman has decided the question, after which the member who was addressing the Council or Committee of the Council at the time the question was raised shall be entitled to proceed with his speech, if he conforms to the Chairman's ruling. If he does not conform, the Chairman may refuse to allow him to proceed with his speech.

Member not explaining or retracting.

19. Any member who fails to explain or to retract any objectionable words used by him, or to offer apologies for the use thereof to the satisfaction of the Council, may be censured or otherwise dealt with as the Council thinks fit.

Chairman speaking.

20. When the Chairman is addressing the Council or Committee of the Council, any member then standing shall immediately resume his seat.

Naming of Members.

21. (a) The Chairman may name any member immediately after the commission of the offence of disregarding the authority of the Chair, or of abusing the rules of the Council by persistently and wilfully obstructing the business of the Council, and the Chairman may forthwith put the question on a motion being made by any member or from the Chair (no amendment, adjournment, or debate being allowed) "that such member be suspended from the service of the Council".

(b) If any such motion be carried and any member be suspended under this rule, his suspension on the first occasion shall continue for one month, on the second occasion for two months, and on the third or subsequent occasion for three months.

(c) Not more than one member shall be named at the same time, unless several members present together have jointly disregarded the authority of the Chair.

(d) If any member or members acting jointly, who have been suspended under this rule from the service of the Council, shall refuse at any time during the period of suspension to obey the directions of the Chairman to withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber, the Chairman may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his decision.

Irrelevance or Tedious Repetition.

22. The Chairman after having called the attention of the Council or Council in Committee to the conduct of a member who persists in irrelevance or tedious repetition, either of his own arguments or of the arguments used by other members in debate, may direct the member to discontinue his speech.

Disorderly Conduct.

23. (a) The Chairman may order members whose conduct is grossly disorderly to withdraw immediately from the Council Chamber during the remainder of the meeting, and may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his order.

(b) If on any occasion the Chairman deems that his powers under this rule are inadequate he may name such member or members in pursuance of rule 21.

Duty to obey Order of Suspension or Withdrawal.

24. Members who are suspended under rule 21, or are directed to withdraw under rule 23, shall forthwith withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber.

Power to adjourn.

25. An adjournment of the discussion of any question may be moved by a member at any time, and, if seconded, shall be forthwith put to the vote.

26. In the event of grave disorder arising at any meeting of the Council or Committee of the Council, the Chairman may, if he thinks it necessary to do so, adjourn the meeting without putting the question of adjournment to the house, or suspend the meeting for a time to be named by him.

Rules for Members speaking.

27. In speaking to any proposition under consideration of the Council or a Committee of the whole Council, the following rules shall be strictly observed:—

- (a) Every member shall address his observations to the Chairman, and shall speak standing except in Committee.
- (b) He shall not be interrupted unless he is out of order.
- (c) When he has finished his observations he shall resume his seat, and any other member wishing to address the Council may rise.
- (d) A member shall not read his speech, but he may read extracts from written or printed papers in support of his argument.
- (e) If two members rise at the same time, the Chairman shall call on the member who first catches his eye.
- (f) Every member shall confine his observations to the subject under consideration.
- (g) No member shall impute improper motives to any other member.
- (h) All remarks of a personal nature shall be avoided.
- (i) A member may speak to the question before the Council or any amendment proposed thereto.
- (j) No member shall speak more than once on any proposition before the Council, except in explanation or to order, or when the Council is in Committee, or as is provided by rule 12 (e).
- (k) By the indulgence of the Council, a member may explain matters of a personal nature, although there be no question before the Council, but such matters may not be debated, and he must confine himself strictly to the vindication of his own conduct.
- (l) The mover of any resolution or motion may reply after all the members present have had an opportunity of addressing the Council and before the question is put, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. The right of reply shall not extend to the mover of an amendment.

Committee of Council.

28. The Council may at any time resolve themselves into a committee of the whole Council, and, on their resuming, the result of their deliberations shall be dealt with by the Council.

29. It shall be competent for any member at any stage of any discussion in a committee of the whole Council to move that the Council do resume. The question shall be put to the vote by the Chairman, and if the motion is carried, the Council will immediately resume from Committee.

Special Committees.

30. (a) The Council may from time to time appoint such special or standing committees, consisting of such number of members or partly of such members and partly of such other inhabitants of the district as the Council may think fit for the purpose of inquiring into and reporting upon any matters connected with the purposes of the Local Government Ordinance.

(b) No such committee shall take any proceedings after the close of the year during which it shall have been so appointed as aforesaid.

(c) The quorum for the meetings of every such committee shall be three, unless otherwise specially fixed.

(d) In the absence of the Chairman at a meeting of any Committee, the members present shall choose one of their own members to preside, and such member shall for that meeting have all the powers of the Chairman.

(e) When a committee shall have agreed to a report the same shall be signed by each of the members thereof and shall, together with the minutes of proceedings, be submitted to the Council.

(f) In the event of any division taking place in a committee, a record thereof shall be entered in the minutes together with the motion or resolution proposed, the name of the proposer, and the respective votes of the members present, and such minutes shall be submitted with the report of such committee.

31. Strangers, including the Press, shall be excluded from all meetings of special and standing committees.

REPEAL.

(a) The by-law regarding the time and place of meetings published by Notification dated February 17, 1933, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,969, of February 24, 1933, is hereby repealed.

THE CEYLON INCOME TAX ORDINANCE, 1932.

THE following rules made by the Board of Income Tax in accordance with the provisions of section 90 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1932, are hereby published for general information.

RULE I.—METHOD OF ASCERTAINMENT AND DETERMINATION OF THE PROFITS OF CEYLON BRANCHES OF NON-RESIDENT BANKERS.

(1) In this rule unless the context otherwise requires—

“bank” means any non-resident banker within the meaning of these expressions as defined in section 2 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1932;

“Ceylon branch” means the business carried on in Ceylon by any such bank;

“other branch” means the business carried on by a bank in any country outside Ceylon, including that carried on at its principal place of business.

(2) Where any accounts prepared by a bank for its own purposes disclose, in the opinion of the Commissioner, the true profits of the Ceylon branch, the profits of the Ceylon branch shall for the purposes of assessment be computed on the basis of such accounts.

(3) Where no accounts are prepared which in the opinion of the Commissioner disclose the true profits of the Ceylon branch, the following provisions shall apply to the determination of the said profits:—

(a) Where any security or investment of the Ceylon branch is realized, the difference between the sum realized and the original cost of such security or investment shall be treated as a profit or loss of the period in which the realization takes place.

(b) All interest and dividends arising on loans and investments of the Ceylon branch, other than interest or dividends arising on money owing by the other branches, shall be deemed to be profits of the Ceylon branch.

(c) In place of the interest credited or debited in the books of the Ceylon branch in respect of money which that branch owed to or was owed by other branches, there shall be taken into account interest arrived at in accordance with the following provisions:

(i.) There shall be calculated in respect of each accounting period as nearly as may be the average of the daily balances which the Ceylon branch owed to or was owed by other branches.

(ii.) There shall be ascertained as nearly as may be the average rate of interest which was or would have been allowed by the Ceylon branch during the accounting period on deposits for terms of not less than one year.

(iii.) Where the calculation under paragraph (i.) shows that the Ceylon branch was owed an average amount by other branches, there shall be credited interest on the said amount at the rate arrived at under paragraph (ii.).

(iv.) Where the calculation under paragraph (i.) shows that the Ceylon branch owed an average amount to other branches, the said amount shall be deemed to consist of—

(a) capital of the bank; and

(b) money lent to the bank,

in the proportion which, at the commencement of the accounting period in question, the paid up capital of the bank bore to the total sum lent to or deposited with the bank, excluding from such sum the amounts lent to or deposited with the Ceylon branch. No deduction shall be allowed for interest on the said amount, in so far as it is deemed to consist of capital of the bank; but there shall be allowed in respect of the said amount, in so far as it is deemed to consist of money lent to the bank, interest at the rate arrived at under paragraph (ii.).

(4) This rule shall apply to the determination of all assessment relating to non-resident bankers which, at the time when it comes into force, have not become final and conclusive within the meaning of section 75 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1932.

RULE II.—PROFITS OF NON-RESIDENT PERSONS FROM GOODS PRODUCED IN CEYLON.

(1) Where a non-resident person carries on in Ceylon an agricultural, manufacturing, or other productive undertaking, and the produce of such undertaking—

(i.) is not sold, or

(ii.) is sold to a person or persons with whom such non-resident person is closely connected within the meaning of section 36 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1932,

the profits which would have been obtained by such non-resident person if he had sold the said produce wholesale in the open market, shall be deemed for the purposes of assessment to be the profits arising in Ceylon from such undertaking.

(2) This rule shall apply to the determination of assessments relating to non-resident persons, which, at the time when it comes into force, have not become final and conclusive within the meaning of section 75 of the said Ordinance.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, May 17, 1933, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated May 8, 1933.

Present: Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. Aelian W. Pereira; Mr. A. R. A. Razik; Dr. S. T. Gunasekera; Mr. G. K. Thornhill; Mr. H. K. de Kretser; and Mr. T. W. Hockly.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 5, 1933, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of April 5, 1933, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah presented a petition on behalf of the Workmen's Resort at Slave Island, requesting a Municipal grant to carry on their work and increase their usefulness, and asked that it be placed before the appropriate Committee for consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal presented a petition from Mr. M. K. Seiyadu Mohammadu praying that he be granted a licence to resume work at Metal Quarry at 342/353, Alutmawata, and asked that it be placed before the appropriate Committee for consideration.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

(1) Q.—What is the annual loss to the Council as taxes in respect of the additions and alterations to Gas Company buildings in Gasworks street carried out by them without the permission of the Council? A.—The first quarters rates for the current year only, amounting to Rs. 25, have been lost.

(2) Q.—Why was action not taken against the Gas Company for repeated breaches of the provisions of the Building Ordinance? A.—It is not usual to prosecute where a building is permissible, the additions have since been permitted.

(3) Q.—How much has the Gas Company paid as annual assessment for their Pettah premises for the years 1929 and 1932, respectively? A.—Rs. 7,800 in 1929 and Rs. 7,800 in 1932.

(4) Q.—From which year has the Council been charged for mantles at 35 cents each, while private consumers paid only 25 cents for the identical size and brand? A.—I understand from the Gas Company that the Council has never been charged at a higher rate than the general public.

(5) Q.—Is it a fact that while Council was charged at the rate of Rs. 3 per 1,000 cubic feet of gas, Government paid Rs. 2.75 and certain hotels Rs. 2.70? A.—Yes, for heating purposes only, as the quantity used by the Council was very small, but not for lighting purposes.

(6) Q.—The Manager of the Gas Company having stated at the Gas Inquiry that he does 12-hour carbonization, is it possible to obtain a quality of gas 10-candle power in its illuminating value, as contracted to Council? A.—I really cannot say.

(7) Q.—Now that the Gas Company has recently imported a photometer to conform to contract conditions, will the Chairman please obtain from the City Analyst and table report on the candle power of gas, together with a fresh report on the calorific value of gas? A.—A monthly report is already tabled with a covering report from the Municipal Engineer that the gas supplied is up to contract requirements.

(8) Q.—Why did the Engineer, Mechanical, say at the Gas Inquiry that no pressures were read in the districts as he had no pressure gauge, when Gas Company's bill to Council disclose that a pressure gauge was supplied in June, 1928, for Re. 1.50? A.—The Mechanical Engineer denies having said so and there is no record of such a statement on his part.

(9) Q.—While gas main existed in Frances road, Wellawatta, when the Council took over the lane, why did Council pay for cost of laying the main? A.—As Council was to use the main for street lighting half cost of main had to be paid, as per an agreement approved by the Four Standing Committees.

(10) Q.—How much was paid to the Gas Company during 1929, 1930, and 1931, for gas fittings and all other services, excluding cost of gas supplied? A.—1929, Rs. 22,166; 1930, Rs. 33,028; 1931, Rs. 42,800. These figures are as close as can be obtained at present.

(11) Q.—As the leakage of gas through leaky mains, service pipes and meters is said to be great, and in consequence affecting the health of the City, will the Chairman obtain and table annual leakage figures, as furnished to the Company's head office, for the past 5 years? A.—There is no reason to believe that the health of the City has in any way been affected and as stated in reply to a previous question the figures are not obtainable.

(12) Q.—If the street lamp rate for January, 1929, was based on the 1928 contract (higher rate), was the price of gas for the same month to private consumers as well as public markets and latrines also based on 1928 contract; if not why? A.—I am afraid the question is too complex to be disposed of in the course of an ordinary reply and I am asking the Municipal Engineer to furnish a report which will be sent to the Member for New Bazaar.

(13) Q.—What are referred to as "all services" for which the Council paid still higher rates for street lighting in February, 1929? A.—A special payment of Rs. 100 per mensem for lighting and extinguishing lamps, and the special rate for lighting Galle Face drive.

(14) Q.—If the price of gas for street lighting was again increased in April, 1929, was the price for public markets and latrines, as well as private consumers increased, in terms of contract; if not, why? A.—Yes.

(15) Q.—Will the Chairman refer all payments to the Gas Company involved in my questions to the Auditor-General for verification and report? A.—As the Auditor-General has already passed all the payments in question, I do not propose to ask him to verify and report on them again.

(16) Q.—Why is renewal of gas contract being rushed through, in view of the following statements by the Chairman and the Director of Electrical Undertakings in 1928, and before particulars called for by me last year as to the possibilities of gas conversion to electricity are furnished me? Chairman, July 9, 1928, "The Electrical Department will be able to give us all the lights we require by January 1, 1930, if they have about nine months notice." Director of Electrical Undertakings, September 27, 1928, "It would be possible to convert certain areas entirely to electricity lighting at an early date." A.—As the draft contract has already been under consideration for about six months and is still under consideration the statement that it is being "rushed through" is not correct.

5. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of May 1, 1933, were considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider:—(a) The suggestion of the Medical Officer of Health to suppress a post of Sanitary Sub-Inspector in the Public Health Department, and in its place to create a new post on a lower scale of salary, i.e., Rs. 900 by Rs. 60 to Rs. 1,500 with motor cycle allowance of Rs. 480 a year. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 601.—Recommended—(a) That the post of Sanitary Sub-Inspector be abolished. (b) That a new post of Supervisor, Anti-pest and Cleansing, be created on a salary of Rs. 900 by Rs. 60 to Rs. 1,500 with motor cycle allowance of Rs. 480 per annum.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

(7) To consider the appointment of Dr. D. L. J. Kahawita to act for Dr. L. F. Hirst, City Microbiologist. Registered No. 626.—Recommended that the acting appointment of Dr. D. L. J. Kahawita, on the same remuneration as was paid to him when he acted before, be approved.

(9) To consider :—(a) A letter, dated March 24, 1933, from Miss L. Wambeek, Superintending Public Health Nurse, expressing her desire to join the permanent staff of the Council, in terms of para. 10 of the agreement. VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

Dodds, (6) Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, (7) Dr. S. Muttiah, (8) Mr. T. C. Dyball, (9) Mr. F. Dadabhoy, (10) Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, (11) Mr. Aelian W. Pereira, (12) Dr. S. T. Gunasekera, (13) Mr. G. K. Thornhill, (14) Mr. H. K. de Kretser, (15) Mr. T. W. Hockly. *Noes*.—(1) Dr. E. V. Ratnam, (2) Mr. A. R. A. Razik.

The amendment was then put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding the Public Library of May 13, 1933, were considered.

(4) To consider a report of the Librarian dated May 4, 1933, stating that the services of two clerks were provided temporarily for a period of three months to assist him in the compilation of stock registers and shelf lists and as the work is not yet completed, he requests permission to retain the services of the two clerks for another month on the expiration of their period of employment on May 9, 1933. Registered No. 777.—Recommended that the services of the two clerks be retained till the end of June and that supplementary provision of Rs. 135 be voted.

(5) To consider the report of verification of the class "Useful Arts."—Recommended that the following three books be written off :—(1) Macfadden—Colds, Coughs and Catarrh, (2) Macfadden—Hair Culture, (3) Harris—The A. B. C. of Wireless.

(9) To consider the question of filling up temporarily the vacancy caused on the Committee by Professor Marrs' absence on leave. Registered No. —.—Recommended that Professor S. A. Pakeman be appointed to fill the vacancy until Professor Marrs' return.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of May 13, 1933, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(4) To consider :—(a) Letter No. 14,828 dated March 18, 1933, from the Secretary, Automobile Association of Ceylon, recommending that Hospital street, Fort, be proclaimed a "one-way" street. (b) The views of the Superintendent of Police, Colombo. (c) A report of the Municipal Engineer suggesting that the following by-law be adopted :— "All vehicular traffic in that portion of Hospital street from Hospital lane to York street, Fort, within the Municipality of Colombo, shall proceed in the direction of York street only, and when halted shall halt facing that direction only." Registered No. 550.—Recommended.

(5) To consider :—(a) Letter No. 15,355 dated April 19, 1933, from the Secretary, the Automobile Association of Ceylon suggesting that the section of Reid avenue, south of the junction, i.e., up to the point where it meets Lauries road, should be restricted to one-way traffic flowing in a north to south direction; traffic flowing from this section of Reid avenue on to the junction being prohibited. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Engineer recommending that a by-law be made on the following lines :— "All vehicular traffic in that portion of Reid avenue lying between Buller's road and Lauries road, within the Municipality of Colombo, shall proceed in the direction of Lauries road only and when halted shall halt facing that direction only." Registered No. 736.—Recommended.

VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(11) To consider :—(a) A letter dated May 1, 1933, from Mr. T. Soby, an importer of African sheep and goats, requesting that the period of quarantine in respect of African sheep and goats be reduced for reasons stated by him. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon dated May 5, 1933. Registered No. 752.—Recommended that 4th line in regulation 2 of regulations framed under "The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance, No. 25 of 1909, as amended by Ordinance No. 26 of 1921," published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,448 of February 27, 1925, be amended to read "be detained at the Quarantine Station for a period of fifteen days in the case of Asiatic and seven days in the case of African importations respectively, from the date of arrival except as provided for in regulation 3."

6. The Chairman moved in Committee—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

7. The Chairman moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved, as an amendment, that the above motion be adopted, subject to the exclusion of item No. 17 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of May 3, 1933, which should be referred back to the Committees for re-consideration. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported.

The motion of the Chairman, subject to the amendment, was put to the meeting and carried.

ANNEXURE A.

Proposed Amendments to By-laws regarding Public Performances.

BUILDINGS TO BE LICENSED.

- By-law 2. Add the following at the end of by-law 2, "and a further key plan on a separate sheet showing the position of all adjacent premises, thoroughfares, roads, streets, and ways within 250 yards based on the latest town plan issued by the Surveyor-General and drawn to a scale of not less than 88 feet to an inch. The plans shall be in triplicate and shall remain the property of the Council".

"On completion of building if, in the opinion of the Chairman, extensive alterations to original plans have been carried out in course of erection, a fresh set of plans including all such alterations shall be submitted."

GRANTING OF LICENCES.

- By-law 3. In by-law 3, paragraph 3, substitute the words "and living rooms shall not be provided in such premises, except with the consent of the Chairman in writing," for the words "nor shall such premises contain living rooms".

- By-law 7. "Notice in writing shall be given to the Chairman of intention to carry out repairs or redecorations necessitating the use of scaffolding, cradles or plant involving risk of injury, obstruction, fire or panic, if it is intended that the public shall be admitted while such scaffolding, cradles or plant are in position or in use. If the Chairman so require, the premises shall be closed to the public until the work has been completed, and the scaffolding, cradles and plant removed."

- To be numbered 9. C. "All permanent decorations shall be of incombustible material, and no temporary decorations, hanging or curtains (exclusive of those on the stage) shall be used without permission of the Chairman."

PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FIRE.

- By-law 10A. Add the following as 10A. Fire appliances and equipment as approved by the Chairman shall be efficiently maintained. They shall be in the charge of a fireman, or if a fireman is not employed, of some other suitable person specially nominated for the purpose, who shall see that they are always available for use.

- By-law 11A. Add the following as 11A. If required by the Chairman fire hose shall be subjected to a water test once a year, and if a fireman is employed a record of such test and also of any other tests or repairs of such appliances and equipment shall be recorded in his log-book.

- By-law 12. Add the following at the end of by-law 12, "and where scenery is kept or used on or over the stage a fireman shall remain within the stage risk during the whole of the time that the premises are open to the public".

Add the following after 12. "In any premises licensed in accordance with by-law 1, the licensee shall have a sufficient number of employees, who shall have allotted to them specified duties to be performed in the event of fire or panic, and they or other persons definitely appointed to act as deputies must be available during the whole of the time that the premises are open to the public. Particulars of such duties shall be posted in positions approved by the Chairman, and such particulars shall be revised from time to time according as changes in staff or other circumstances require. Dry fire drill shall be held at least once a week under the direction of a fireman or the manager, and a record of such drill shall be entered in the fireman's log-book."

- By-law 16. Add the following under by-law 16. "The roof over the stage shall not be of fire resisting or heavy construction, and shall be provided with an opening, at the further end from the proscenium, equal at least in area to 1/10th of the area of the stage. Such opening shall be glazed at the top and sides with sheet glass not more than 1/12th inch in thickness, and be capable of being opened automatically by the action of lowering the fire-resisting screen, or by the cutting or burning of the cord employed in keeping it closed, or by some equally approved device, to an extent, equal at least to the superficial area required at the base of the opening. Suitable exhaust cowls shall also be provided on the stage roof."

CINEMATOGRAPH FIRE PRECAUTIONS.

- By-law 23. Add the following over by-law 23 (a). "The cinematograph machine shall be of approved construction, and embody the necessary provisions against the film taking fire, and in the event of this happening, provision to prevent the passage of flame into the film box."

ENTRANCES AND EXITS.

- By-law 33. Delete para 2 of this by-law.

- By-law 34. Add the following at the end of by-law 34. "A notice on the door 'PUSH TO OPEN' should appear on the auditorium side of the exit door when closed."

- By-law 39. Add the following sub-sections after by-law 39:—

"(1) The public may leave, at the end of the performance or exhibition, by all exit doors, and such doors must at the time be open.

"(2) All gangways, corridors, staircases and external passageways intended for exit, shall be kept entirely free from obstruction whether permanent or temporary.

“(3) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the gangways intersecting the seating, or to sit in any of the other gangways. If standing be permitted in the gangways, at the sides and rear of the seating, sufficient space shall be left for persons to pass easily to and fro, and to have free access to exits.

If a safety curtain is provided, the following additional notice shall be printed on the programme :—

“(4) The safety curtain must be lowered and raised in the presence of each audience.”

LIGHTING.

Delete the existing by-law 50, and insert the following new by-law therefor :—

By-law 50.

(a) Every premises licensed under these by-laws shall be provided with two separate systems of lighting from independent sources.

(b) The two systems must be either—

- (i.) Two separate systems of electricity, or
- (ii.) One system of electricity, and one of gas.

(c) Where two separate systems of electricity are desired, each of the following would be considered a source of independent supply :—

- (1) Supply from Government Mains.
- (2) A self contained Generating Plant.
- (3) A supply from accumulators, charged from either of the above sources; the battery should be of a capacity able to carry the full load on emergency circuit for the full time a show lasts or 3 hours.

Where (2) is adopted as the alternate source of supply (1) the plant must be working through out the show.

Where (2) is employed as the main supply, and (3) as the alternate supply, the capacity of (2) must be such as to charge (3) at normal rate while taking the full load of the installation. Emergency lighting circuits should be entirely separate, on an automatic switch that will bring the alternate source into action immediately on the failure of the main supply. A hand operated switch for the same purpose should also be employed in convenient position.

(d) Where it is desired that the independent systems shall be one for electricity and one for gas the electric power shall be obtained, either from a Government Power Station, or from an engine and generator in the manner described in sub-section (c).

The gas supply shall be from the Colombo Gas and Water Co. mains, or any other approved system.

(e) Where gas is used the piping shall be kept well away from any conductor. Where gas pipes and conductors must cross each other, there shall be no metallic contact between them. Combined gas and electric fittings shall not be used.

Delete the first sentence in by-law 54.

Delete the existing by-law 55 and insert the following new by-law therefor :—

By-law 54.
By-law 55.

Where electrical energy is used for lighting or other purposes within the building the following requirements shall be observed :—

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in these by-laws, the installation generally shall be in accordance with the Wiring Rules of the Institution of Electrical Engineers.
- (b) The main supply fuses and switches shall not be accessible to the public, they shall be located where there is ample space and headroom, and where there is no risk of fire resulting therefrom.
- (c) A separate circuit shall be taken from the source of supply for the projector circuit so that no accident to this circuit can affect the general lighting.
- (d) Each of the main circuits shall be separately protected by an efficient linked switch, and by a fuse on each pole.
- (e) All conductors used shall be of approved make and grade, and efficiently protected from mechanical injury. If metal conduits are used they shall be made mechanically and electrically continuous, and efficiently grounded. The passage of conductors through walls, floors, ceilings shall be protected by the use of armoured insulated conduits, glazed stoneware, porcelain tubes or other approved method.
- (f) All fuses and distribution boards shall be of completely protected type so constructed that the fuse holders can be handled for renewal of the fuse wires without risk of touching live metal.
- (g) Portable lamps, for the orchestra or similar lighting, shall be connected to a separate circuit or circuits from the distribution fuse boards.
- (h) The electrical installation shall be in charge of a competent person whether the operator or another, who shall have received an adequate electrical training for his duties.
- (i) The competent person shall satisfy himself, before the commencement of each performance that the electrical apparatus, including the projector circuits, is in proper working order.

Provided that paragraphs (a), (e), (f), and (g) of the above by-laws shall not apply to such parts of the electrical installation as were in use before the date of these by-laws, except in the event of such parts being altered and renewed.

Delete the existing by-law 64, and insert the following new by-law therefor :—

By-law 64.

Insulation Resistance.—The insulation resistance between conductors, and between conductors and earth of the whole or any part of the wiring, must not be less in megohms than 30 divided by the number of points under test.

In the case of lighting circuits, the whole of the lamps having been connected to the conductors and all switches and fuses being on, the insulation resistance of the whole or any part of the installation must not be less in megohms than 25 divided by the number of lamps.

LIMELIGHT.

In by-law 73, delete sub-sections (a) and (d) and substitute the following therefor :—

By-law 73.

(a) Cylinders containing gas under pressure other than acetylene gas shall be constructed, tested and filled in conformity with the recommendations either of the Committee on the manufacture of compressed gas cylinders appointed by the Home Office in 1895 or of the Committee on compressed gas cylinders appointed by the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research in 1918.

(d) The tubing shall be of sufficient strength to resist pressure from without and shall be properly connected up.

DISSENT.

At the meeting of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) held on May 12, 1933, it was recommended (Dr. E. V. Ratnam dissenting) “that Muhandiram D. J. G. Caldera, Chief Clerk, be appointed to act as Secretary in addition to his duties as Chief Clerk on a salary of Rs. 5,000 per annum for a period of one year with effect from July 1, 1933”.

2. When this recommendation came up for consideration at the Meeting of the Council held on Wednesday, May 17, 1933, Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Member for St. Paul's ward, moved “that the post of Secretary be abolished and that this Council do resolve that such duties as are required to be performed by the Secretary be performed by the Chief Clerk, in addition to his own duties.” The motion was seconded by Mr. A. R. A. Razik, the Member for New Bazaar.

3. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, the Member for Kotahena, then moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be adopted and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, the Member for Maradana, seconded it.

4. After discussion, the amendment was put to the meeting and carried by a majority of fifteen against two.

5. We regret to have to place on record our dissent from the decision of the majority for the following, among other, reasons :—

- (1) The duties of the post of Secretary have for some time now been of a purely routine or mechanical nature which can be performed by even a junior officer of average intelligence. They are specially at the present time not of such value as to need a separate officer.
- (2) They have been satisfactorily performed for over seven months by four clerks of the Secretariat without any one being appointed even to act as Secretary.
- (3) In the past these duties were carried out satisfactorily during long intervals when the Secretary was absent on leave without any one being appointed by the Council to act as Secretary.
- (4) The Chairman, Mr. W. L. Murphy, in his minute of May 2, 1933, stated in clear and unequivocal terms that "with over a year's experience as Chairman, I feel I can now claim to be fairly familiar with the work of all departments, and I am perfectly agreeable to the suggestion made by Dr. Ratnam last year, viz., that the post of Secretary should be suppressed temporarily at least". This was after carrying on the work of the Council without a Secretary for over seven months. He stated further that he put this suggestion mainly as a measure of economy by which the Council may effect a saving of the entire salary of the post and also in view of the impending change in the Constitution which makes a permanent appointment inadvisable.
- (5) Not only the present Chairman, but past Chairmen have given expression to the view that the business of the Council could be transacted without a Secretary.
- (6) The present is essentially a time for the strictest economy in disbursing the funds of the Council. A Committee has been investigating ways and means of effecting economy, but yet the Council refuses to profit by the opportunity presented to effect economy not only without causing loss or injury to any of its officers, but also without impairing the efficiency or disorganizing the service.

6. The arguments urged during the discussion by the majority fall under two heads :—

Firstly.—For the discharge of duties specified in certain by-laws of the Council a "Secretary" was legally essential.

Secondly.—The Chairman should not be saddled with tiring mechanical work of a routine nature.

7. It is desirable to consider these arguments. As regards the second argument, it will be seen that the Chairman had expressed his willingness, or rather readiness, to undertake any additional duties with whatever sacrifice of leisure they may involve at a time like the present when every reasonable economy in administration should be effected. It was the obvious duty of the majority of the Council to accept the Chairman's offer with gratitude. Instead, they chose to adopt a policy which has unnecessarily involved the Council in additional expenditure.

8. In regard to the legal aspect of the question it was urged that certain documents, like those of milk-vendors' cards, were required by law to be signed by the Secretary, but for the complete discomfiture of the advocates of this line of argument, the Member for New Bazaar Ward, produced several milk cards, signed by a clerk, who was not even the Head Clerk of the Secretary's Department, and the Chairman was obliged to confess that there was more than one Secretary functioning on certain days. It is incredible that for signing these vendors' cards, the Council should pay Rs. 61.66 per mensem or Rs. 740 a year. No business concern would do so.

9. Besides this by-law about milk-vendors' cards, of which so much was made, there are the following by-laws which appear to require a Secretary to perform the duties therein enumerated, viz., by-laws 6 (a), 8, 9 (b), 10 (a), 10 (b), 10 (I.), 13 (a), 15 (c), and 16, Chapter 11 and 7, Chapter XIV. of the Council's by-laws.

10. It will be seen on a careful perusal of these by-laws that the duties mentioned are purely formal and by no means arduous and do not involve much labour. Again, it will be seen that there can be no valid legal objection to the proposal to authorize a suitable person for carrying out the formal duties which the by-laws require to be performed by a Secretary.

11. The fact that the new Draft Ordinance for the reform of the Constitution of the Municipal Council has deliberately omitted to provide for the appointment of a Secretary is additional proof that the post of Secretary is not required.

12. The appointment to be made, as a result of the decision of the majority, is, therefore, not justified on grounds of necessity or, of expediency. It stands condemned on grounds of economy, especially at this time of acute financial distress.

13. The Member for Kotahena also sought to justify the appointment on the ground that a saving would be effected thereby. What he meant is not clear. He juggled in some figures to support his argument. But the fact is that the Council has to incur unnecessary expenditure. We maintain that the whole of the salary attached to or to be attached to the post of Secretary can be saved without any loss of efficiency, and that the decision of the majority is, therefore, not in the true interest of the ratepayers. If this appointment is not justifiable on grounds of economy or of necessity or of expediency, we wonder whether it can be justified even as a reward for long and exceptionally meritorious services rendered by the officer whom the majority had in view for the post.

14. To ascertain whether his past services have been so exceptionally meritorious, we have carefully examined Muhandiram D. J. G. Caldera's record as revealed in his personal file. All that it shows are (1) that in 1911 an appreciation is recorded of "valuable and willing help" rendered to Messrs. C. P. Dias and Hector Jayewardene, the then Members of this Council for San Sebastian Ward and New Bazaar Ward, in feeding the poor in connection with the Coronation of His Majesty, King George V.; (2) an acknowledgment from the Superintendent of 1911 Census that he performed census duties well and carefully; and (3) a few recommendations from Heads of Departments that he performed his duties well and efficiently.

15. This record can by no stretch of the imagination be considered to be exceptionally meritorious. On the other hand, the Member of New Bazaar Ward once pointed out that this officer was dismissed by the then Chairman, Mr. B. Horsbrough some time in 1907 for reporting, when he was a Sanitary Inspector, that a well was closed when in fact it was not, and was later re-employed in a minor capacity in the time of Mr. K. W. B. MacLeod, Chairman.

16. It is further found that in September, 1910, he was recommended to the post of Head Clerk of the Finance Department, but that instead of being appointed to the post, he was early in 1911 sent unofficially to the Works Department where he was placed in charge of the Bookkeeping section of that Department.

17. Again in 1924, Mr. Caldera, who was then the Head Clerk of the Works Department on receipt of a salary of Rs. 4,000 per annum, was transferred as Head Clerk of the Secretary's Department, which had just been brought into par with the Head Clerkship of the Works Department, the Financial Department, and Public Health Department.

18. There is no record of the reasons for these transfers, but they were discussed in Committees and the Member for St. Paul's is aware that the transfer of 1924 was not by way of promotion. This is further supported by the fact that the post of Head Clerk of the Secretary's Department has the same scale of salary as the Head Clerkship of the Works, the Finance and the Public Health Departments. We need hardly refer to the allegations that had been made that many documents of a nature unfavourable to the officer in question have been missing from his file.

19. The past record of Mr. Caldera cannot, therefore, be looked upon as of such character as to warrant a reward for "honest and meritorious" services on the eve of his retirement, as he is 58 years of age at the present time.

20. In these circumstances, we feel that in justice to the ratepayers and to the Council, the majority of the Members should not have adopted this resolution which was in conflict with recorded views of the Chairman as shown above, and altogether uncalled for by the needs of the Council.
