Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 6 of 1932.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 intitled "An Ordinance amending the Law relating to Indian Coolies employed on Ceylon Estates".

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Indian Labourers' Ordinance, 1932.

Amendment of section 9 of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 9 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is amended by substituting for the words "twenty rupees" in line 4 the words "forty rupees".

Amendment of section 10 of the principal Ordinance.

3 Section 10 of the principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end of the words "and it shall be lawful for the Controller of Labour also or for any other person authorized by him in writing for the purpose to institute in like manner on behalf of one or more labourers employed on an estate a similar suit to recover any wages which may be due to them".

**DRAFT ORDINANCE.****MINUTE.**

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance regulating the Temporal Affairs of the Presbyterian Church in Kandy.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Temporal Affairs of the Presbyterian Church Kandy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1932.

2 Section 3 of the Ordinance regulating the Temporal Affairs of the Presbyterian Church in Kandy is amended by the substitution of the word "Sunday" for the word "Monday" therein contained.

3 Sections 3 and 11 of the said Ordinance are amended by the substitution of the word "first" for the word "last" therein contained.

4 Section 14 of the said Ordinance is amended by the deletion of the words "a male of" in line 12 thereof.

*Objects and Reasons.*

The purpose of this bill is to alter the date of the Annual General Meeting of seat-holders from the last Monday in December as the majority of seat-holders are not in Kandy at that time; and to give all seat-holders, irrespective of their sex, the right to vote.
