Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

**No. 5 of 1933.****An Ordinance to amend the Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908.**

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Ceylon Post Office Amendment Ordinance, 1933.

Amendment of section 55 of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 55 of The Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908, is amended (a) by inserting the words " or placed on fixed deposit in any bank or banks in Colombo " between the word " Council " and the word " and " in line 6 ; and (b) by inserting the words " or placed " between the word " invested " and the word " and " in line 7.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

**No. 8 of 1933.**

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**An Ordinance to amend the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892.**

GRAEME THOMSON.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Small Towns Sanitary Amendment Ordinance, 1933.

Insertion of new section 7A in the principal Ordinance.

2 Between section 7 and section 8 of The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892, the following is inserted as new section 7A :—

Remission of rates in cases of non-tenancy.

7A (1) If any building is rendered untenanted, and is untenanted by reason of its being altered, repaired, or improved, a proportionate remission of all rates and taxes whatsoever payable in respect of such building may be allowed for each month of the year during which it is so rendered untenanted, but no remission shall be made for any broken period or part of any particular month.

(2) If any building is or remains untenanted for any reasons other than those mentioned in sub-section (1) hereof a proportionate remission of all rates and taxes whatsoever payable in respect of such building for each month of the year in which this occurs may be allowed, but no such remission shall be made unless such building has been untenanted during the whole of such a month.

(3) No such remission shall be allowed unless the person claiming such remission shall (a) have given to the Chairman, within seven days of the commencement of the period for which remission is claimed, a written notice of the fact that such building is untenanted, and shall in such notice have stated the date on which the building became untenanted and the reason thereof, and an address to which all communications in respect of such notice may be posted ; and also (b) have given to the Chairman a written notice of the fact that such building was re-occupied within seven days of the non-tenancy, and shall in such notice state the fact of such re-occupation and the date of the commencement thereof

(4) In the event of any dispute arising regarding the occupation of any such building during any particular period, the decision of the Chairman thereon shall be notified in writing to the address given in the notice required by sub-section (3) (a) hereof, and such decision shall be final, unless a written application for the revision of such decision be presented to the Chairman within seven days of the date upon which notice of such decision was posted or left at such address when such decision shall be subject to revision by the Board.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 10 of 1933.

**An Ordinance to amend the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924.**

GRAEME THOMSON.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Village Communities (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933.

2 The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended by the insertion of the following new section 6B immediately after section 6A thereof:—

6B (1) For the purposes of this Ordinance the Governor may from time to time with the advice of the Executive Committee of Local Administration, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette—

- (i) alter and define the limits of any subdivision;
- (ii) divide any subdivision into two or more subdivisions;
- (iii) amalgamate two or more subdivisions or portions thereof in the same Chief Headman's Division;
- (iv) constitute new subdivisions.

(2) Anything in this Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding the Governor may with the advice of the Executive Committee of Local Administration by Proclamation in the Government Gazette provide from time to time for all matters which he shall deem to be necessary to give effect to any alteration, definition, division, amalgamation or constitution made under the preceding subsection, including—

- (a) the dissolution of any Committee and the election of a fresh Committee;
- (b) the transfer, apportionment and adjustment of property rights, debts, liabilities and obligations;
- (c) the extension, curtailment and adjustment of the area within the jurisdiction of any Village Tribunal;
- (d) the collection and levy of taxes, tolls, penalties, fines and other sums of money which may be or become due;
- (e) pending contracts and legal proceedings.

3 Section 16 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following new sub-sections (10) and (11) at the end:—

"(10) In the absence of an elected or nominated Chairman at any meeting of a committee the members of the committee who shall be present may select and appoint a Chairman for such meeting.

Short

Insertion of new section 6B in the principal Ordinance.

Alteration of boundaries and areas of sub-divisions.

Amendment of section 16 of the principal Ordinance.

“(11) Where the elected or nominated Chairman of a committee is for any reason unable to perform the duties of his office for a period exceeding fifteen consecutive days it shall be lawful for the committee to elect any of their number to officiate as Chairman pending the resumption of duties by the Chairman: Provided however that no person elected under this sub-section shall so officiate for a longer period than such Chairman remains qualified to hold office.”

Insertion of new section 16A in the principal Ordinance.

4 The principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the following new section 16A immediately after section 16 thereof:—

Quorum.

16A If there is no rule fixing the quorum at meetings of any committee the quorum shall for all purposes be not less than one-third the number of the elected members of the committee.

Amendment of section 18 of the principal Ordinance.

5 Section 18 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) by deleting paragraph (d) thereof;
- (b) by renumbering paragraph (e) as paragraph (d); and
- (c) by renumbering paragraph (f) as paragraph (e).

Amendment of section 19 of the principal Ordinance.

6 Section 19 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) by the deletion of the word “the” before the word “office” in line 2 thereof; and
- (b) by the addition of the following proviso at the end thereof:
 

“Provided that no such committee shall hold office if for any reason it cannot function legally.”

Amendment of section 20 of the principal Ordinance.

7 Section 20 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following proviso at the end thereof:—

“Provided that no committee elected in place of a committee going out of office before the expiration of the said three years shall remain in office beyond the unexpired portion of such latter committee’s term of office.”

Amendment of section 22 of the principal Ordinance.

8 Section 22 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) by renumbering sub-section (2) as sub-section (3); and
- (b) by inserting the following as sub-section (2):

“(2) In respect of an election occasioned by a committee going out of office otherwise than by effluxion of time, the Government Agent shall within three months of the said event hold a meeting for the election of a committee for the unexpired portion of such former committee’s term of office.”

Amendment of section 24 of the principal Ordinance.

9 Section 24 (2) of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the following words between the words “(d) Vacates his office;” in line 17 and the words “the remaining members of the committee” in line 18:—

“and the term of office of such committee is not extinguished thereby”.

Amendment of section 56 of the principal Ordinance.

10 Section 56 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following new paragraph (c) at the end thereof:—

“(c) All other proceedings which may be instituted under the Cattle Trespass Ordinance, 1876, in any chief headman’s division or sub-division thereof, save where jurisdiction in respect of such proceedings has been specifically given to a Village Tribunal, and a Village Tribunal has been, or is deemed to have been, established in such chief headman’s division or part thereof.”

**DRAFT ORDINANCE.****MINUTE.**

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

**An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.**

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipal Councils (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933.

Short title.

2 Section 121 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Repeal of Section 121 of principal Ordinance and substitution of new section.

121 (1) If any building, other than a building containing furniture, is or remains untenanted, a proportionate remission of the rates and taxes payable in respect of such building may be allowed for the period during which the building is or remains untenanted.

Remission of rates in cases of non-tenancy.

(2) If any building containing furniture and registered with the Chairman as a building intended to be let as a furnished building is or remains untenanted a proportionate remission of one half of the rates and taxes payable in respect of such building may be allowed for the period during which such building is or remains untenanted.

(3) The period for which a remission is allowed under sub-sections (1) and (2) shall in respect of any building commence on the day on which the Chairman receives a written notice of its being untenanted and terminate on the date on which it is re-occupied: Provided that the said period shall terminate on a date one month prior to the said date of re-occupation if within three days of the re-occupation notice thereof was not given to the Chairman. Every notice under this sub-section shall contain an address to which all communications arising therefrom may be posted.

(4) When with reference to any claim for remission under this section a dispute arises regarding the period during which any building is or remains untenanted, a written notice of the decision of the Chairman thereon shall be posted to the last of the addresses given under sub-section (3); and such decision shall be final, unless a written application for its revision is presented to the Chairman within seven days of the date upon which such notice is posted and unless such decision is in consequence revised by the Council.

*Objects and Reasons.*

When a building within Municipal limits is untenanted the Chairman of the Municipality is empowered in the circumstances set out in section 121 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, to remit the rates and taxes payable in respect of it during the period of non-tenancy. As the scope of this section even as amended by the Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, 1931, is too narrow for present requirements, this Bill substitutes for it a new section which recognizes as a basis for remission the bare fact of having no tenant, and authorizes partial remission in certain circumstances even in the case of untenanted furnished buildings.
