THE following rules for the observance of Village Tribunals, made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the authority of the 45th and 50th sections of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," are published for general information.

Complaint, in either civil or criminal cases, may be made, verbally or in writing, to the President, who shall thereupon enter it in the Journal of Proceedings. (Forms A and B.)
 Every complaint shall state the names and residences of the parties complainant and defendant; the injury

done, specifying the time and place when and where it was done.

3. If the parties to a cause and their witnesses are present, or their presence can easily be secured, the matter may be investigated forthwith after complaint shall have been made. Otherwise summons and subpœnas may be issued, addressed to the village headmen, who shall thereupon cause the same to be served, and report the service to

If the defendant contumaciously refuse to attend, the President may hear and decide the case in his absence, or he may issue a warrant, upon which it shall be lawful for the village headmen to cause the defendant to be arrested and brought before the village tribunal. The President shall have like power to issue warrants against a plaintiff or witness failing to attend when summoned. (Forms C, D, and E.)

4. The President and the councillors shall endeavour, by all lawful means, to bring the parties to an amicable settlement of the case. If the parties will not agree to such settlement, the President and councillors shall then proceed to hear evidence on both sides, and to decide the case. The President shall take down in writing the defence, if any, offered by the defendant in answer to the complaint, and make short minutes of the evidence given by the witnesses. The councillors shall first express their opinion on the points arising for adjudication, and the President shall thereupon express his. The opinion of the President shall be the judgment; but the President must record every difference of opinion between him and his councillors.

5. A list shall be prepared of all persons in the subdivision qualified to serve as councillors. The persons so qualified shall be summoned in rotation as their names appear on that list. Provided that it shall be competent for the President to admit any such qualified man present at the sitting of the village tribunal to take his seat as councillor out of his turn for the hearing of any case in which such person is not interested.

All forms of process, registers of causes, and minutes of evidence shall be kept in the native language of the division.

7. Any complaint of a criminal nature, including breaches of rules, may be made either by a private party or

by a local headman.

- 8. Where a party does not offer any impediment to the due execution of the judgment of a village tribunal, the headman of the village may carry out such judgment. If otherwise, the writ (form G) must issue to the Fiscal for enforcement of execution. A register of fines (form H) and a civil register (form I) must be kept by the President.
- 9. Application for relief shall be addressed to the Government Agent in the first instance, who will then call for a record of the case. Failing relief from the Government Agent, the party aggrieved may apply to the Governor by petition.

10. It shall be the duty of the President to see that the judgment of the Government Agent or of the

Governor, as ultimately pronounced, is duly carried out.

- 11. Every declaration of mutual consent, under section 28, sub-section 2, by which jurisdiction shall be given in cases not ordinarily triable by village tribunals, shall be substantially in the form K; and where, by such consent of parties, a case has been brought under the jurisdiction of any village tribunal, the same shall not be withdrawn therefrom except on good cause shown to, and with the sanction of, the village tribunal.

 12. No person shall behave in a disorderly or unseemly manner before a village tribunal, so as to interrupt the regular and peaceable conduct of business before such tribunal. - in a proper manner; and if he shall fail to attend to the warning, he may be proceeded against for breach of this rule.

 13. Every person upon whom a summons or subpœna issued under rule 3 shall have been duly served, shall

duly attend in obedience to such summons or subpœna.

Where a person is arrested on a warrant issued under rule 3, such person should be forthwith taken before the President who issued the warrant. And the President may, in his discretion, admit him to bail to appear duly before the village tribunal. Such bail may be with or without security, but the amount thereof shall not

exceed Rs. 50.

Where a person is brought before a President under section 41 of the Ordinance, the President may, in his 15. Where a person is brought before a President under section 41 of the Ordinance, the President may, in his discretion, admit such person to bail to appear on a given date before the nearest Police Magistrate having competent jurisdiction. Such bail may be with or without security, but the amount thereof shall not exceed Rs. 500. And the President may also require the complainant to give bail, with or without security, but not exceeding in amount Rs. 100, to appear and prosecute before the same Police Magistrate, and in default of the complainant giving such bail, the President may cause the complainant to be taken before such Police Magistrate.

16. Where a criminal charge is referred under section 51 of the Ordinance to a Police Magistrate, the President may, in his discretion, require the accused and complainant, or either of them, to give bail to appear before such Police Magistrate on a given date. Such bail may be with or without security, but in the case of an accused shall not exceed 500 rupees in amount, and in the case of complainant shall not exceed 100 rupees in amount. Or the President may cause the accused and complainant, or either of them, to be taken before such Police Magistrate.

17. Bail bonds taken under these rules or under section 40, sub-section (h), and forfeited, should be forwarded 15.

17. Bail bonds taken under these rules or under section 40, sub-section (h), and forfeited, should be forwarded by the President to the Attorney-General with a statement of the grounds of forfeiture, for recovery of the penalty

in due course.

18. Any summons, subpœna, or warrant issued under rule 3 may be lawfully served or executed by the

headman to whom the same is addressed.

19. When a plaintiff is by a judgment of a village tribunal declared entitled to any land or immovable property, or to any share thereof, the President may, in writing, direct the headman of the village or division in which such property is situate to put and quiet the plaintiff in the possession thereof.

Appeal.

20. Whenever an application shall be made under the 52nd section of the Village Tribunal Ordinance for relief against the judgment of a village tribunal, such application shall not stay the execution of the judgment of the tribunal in criminal cases, unless the party applying shall deposit in court one-half of the amount of any fine or penalty which has been imposed by the tribunal; and in civil cases, unless the party applying shall enter into security to the party on the other side to the satisfaction of the President, in an amount not exceeding 20 rupees, to prosecute such application and to satisfy the judgment of the tribunal if it should ultimately be affirmed.
