WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish a general cemetery for the burial and cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby, under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial and cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

SCHEDULE A.

Lots 1 and 2 in preliminary plan No. 4,015.

Name of the Land: Tennenpitawatta.

Situation: Gomaduwa and Yatiyantota villages in Megodapota pattuwa, in Dehigampal korale of the Three Korales, Kegalla District, Province of Sabaragamuwa.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

0275/6 (SB)

IT is hereby notified that under section 11A of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 the State Council did at its session on May 27, 1932, pass the following resolution and that the resolution has been duly sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor:

"That under section 11A of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 the following words be added at the end of the Table of Prohibitions and Restrictions outwards contained in Schedule C of the said Ordinance, namely:—

No tea shall be exported which is declared by the Principal Collector of Customs or by any officer authorized by him to be, in the opinion of the officer making such declaration, unfit for export as being adulterated and therefore likely to damage the reputation of Ceylon tea in foreign markets. Provided that this prohibition shall not operate against any tea on account of its cheapness or inferiority in quality.

The exportation of tea shall be subject to the condition that the Principal Collector of Customs or any officer authorized by him may take samples thereof for the purpose of examination."

It is further notified that the said resolution has been submitted to and sanctioned by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, with effect from midnight of July 8/9, 1932.

"THE CEYLON POST OFFICE ORDINANCE, 1908."

RULES made by the Governor, under section 10 (d) of the Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908, by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, to take effect from the 15th day of July, 1932.

RULES.

Rules 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 published by Notification dated September 6, 1904, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,005 of September 9, 1904, are hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:—

(1) Official articles for the post (e.g., letters, printed matter, and parcels) shall be transmitted free of postage, provided that the weight of any single article does not exceed eleven pounds, and that it bears on the envelope or cover the words "On His Majesty's Service" or letters "O. H. M. S." with the signature, written or stamped, and the official designation of an officer authorized to frank such articles.

(2) Official communications from persons not authorized to frank such articles shall be transmitted through the post free, provided they are superscribed "O. H. M. S." and are on Government printed forms, or enclosed in covers franked and supplied by an officer authorized to frank such articles or posted in open covers that admit of the removal and inspection of the contents without injury to the cover.

(3) Officers authorized to frank such articles are not permitted to delegate the privilege of franking to any clerk or other person in their offices, and when franking stamps are used, such officers are held personally responsible for any improper use made of them. Where an officer has an authorized deputy or assistant, the latter may frank in his absence, provided that the name and signature of such deputy or assistant has been furnished to the Post Office of the District and to the Postmaster-General.

(4) Official articles for the post addressed and franked by officers authorized to frank such articles to places out of the Island, must fulfil the conditions of the foreign post as notified in the Post Office Guide, and the requisite action will be taken by the Postal Department to indicate prepayment of postage prior to their dispatch abroad.

(5) The above regulations notwithstanding, His Excellency the Governor and his personal Staff may send and receive free all official letters and letters to and from private individuals which are of an official nature or deal with matters of public interest.

(6) Official correspondence is exempt from the charge for redirection.

(7) All official postal articles, except articles for the post from such Naval and Military Officers as have been given the privileges of franking are exempt from the fee for registration, and shall be allowed registration when demanded.

BY-LAWS under section 6 of the Jaffna Markets Ordinance, 1891, made by the District Committee of the Jaffna District formed and constituted under "The Road Ordinance, 1861," and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Under Sub-section (1).

1. Whenever it shall be determined by the District Road Committee with the sanction of the Governor under section 10, to establish a public market, the Chairman shall give not less than ten days' notice of the time when the same will be opened, and shall publish it by posting a notice to that effect in the English and Tamil languages in a conspicuous place in such market, and by beat of tom-tom.

2. Every public market shall be open for use daily from 5 A.M. to 9 P.M.; and it shall be the duty of the Committee, or where it has been rented out, of the renter or lessee, to make provision for the proper lighting of the market.

3. The Committee may mark off in the covered space of each public market such spaces for stalls as to it may seem necessary.

4. It shall be an offence to erect huts or sheds or buildings in the spaces set apart under section 4 of the Ordinance except with the permission of the Chairman who may allow the erection of such huts or sheds or buildings along such lines as may appear to him necessary for ensuring the convenience of the public and the provision of proper passage and ventilation.

5. It shall be an offence for the occupier of a space set apart under section 4 of the Ordinance to neglect or fail or refuse to remove his building, hut, or shed within the time fixed by the Ordinance.

Under Sub-section (2).

6. The rents payable in respect of any stall or space in any building used as a public market shall be as follows, and shall be paid in advance from time to time on demand to the Committee or market renter or lessee, or other person authorized by the Committee or renter or lessee to recover the same:—

For occupation of the covered market area : Five cent per two square yards per diem.

For occupation of stalls : Terms to be mutually arranged.

The Committee shall have power to alter the scale of fees as may appear to it necessary from time to time.

7. No person shall demand or receive a higher rent or fee than that authorized to be levied by the Committee.

8. If any person liable to the payment of any rent or fee does not pay the same when demanded the Committee or the market renter or lessee may levy the amount due by seizure and sale of all or any of the articles in the market belonging to, or in the possession or custody of the person liable to pay such rent or fee; provided however that no steps for recovery by distress shall be taken unless in the immediate presence of a headman, and after demand for the amount due has been made to, and refused by, the defaulter in the presence of such headman.

9. No person shall hold, use, or occupy any stall or space, seat, or other place in any building used as a public market without a permit issued by the Chairman or lessee or renter where the market has been leased or rented out, or contrary to the tenor of such permit. Such permit shall be in the form in Schedule A annexed, and shall be obtainable at the market premises.

10. No person, other than the person holding a permit, shall use, or occupy, or sell in, any stall or space or other place in a building used as a public market, or any part thereof, unless such person shall be named in the permit as a person authorized to sell on behalf of the permit-holder, or unless with the special permission of the Chairman or market renter or lessee.

11. No person holding a permit under by-law 9 above shall under any pretence whatsoever suffer, permit, or allow any other person, excepting a person authorized as provided for in by-law 10 above, to use or occupy any stall or space or place or any part thereof, or to sell or expose for sale any goods, articles, or things of any description whatsoever therein.

12. No person holding a permit for any stall, space, or other place in a boutique or building used as a public market shall use or occupy or permit or allow any person on his behalf to use or occupy, and no agent or servant of a person holding such permit shall use or occupy any ground beyond the limits of the stall, or space or other place rented by him.

13. No person shall transfer to any other person a permit issued to him under these by-laws or shall sublet any stall, or space or other place rented by him, and no person shall hold, use, or occupy the same or any part thereof under any alleged transfer, without the permission of the Chairman or market renter.

Under Sub-section (3).

14. A fee of one cent per square yard per diem shall be charged for the occupation of spaces in any portion of land used as a public market which is outside any building, other than the spaces set apart under section 4 of the Ordinance, and shall be paid in the manner prescribed in by-law 6 above. And no person shall occupy such spaces or sell or expose any goods therein except under a permit issued by the Chairman or market renter or lessee, which permit shall be in the form in Schedule A hereto annexed.

The Committee shall have power to alter the fee from time to time as may appear to it necessary, subject however to the proviso contained in sub-section (3) of section 6 of the Ordinance.

15. No person other than the person holding a permit shall use or occupy, or sell in any space or other place in any portion of land used as a public market, unless such person shall be named in the permit as a person authorized to sell on behalf of the permit-holder, or unless with the special permission of the Chairman or lessee or renter.

16. The prohibitions contained in by-laws 11, 12, and 13 above shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to permits issued under sub-section (3) of the Ordinance.

Under Sub-section (4).

17. Every person applying for a licence to hold a private market under section 5 of the principal Ordinance shall pay in advance an annual licence fee of One Rupee.

Under Sub-section (5).

18. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any member of the Committee or the Health Officer, or any Medical Officer, or the Sanitary Inspector, or any person authorized by the Chairman at all times to enter into any private market or its premises, and inspect the same as well as all articles of food sold or exposed for sale therein, or kept or lying in the said market or premises.

Under Sub-section (6).

19. The Committee shall have power to set apart any spaces, stalls, or buildings in a public market for the exclusive sale of fish or meat or vegetables, and may mark off in each market spaces or stalls within which fish, meat, vegetables, or other articles may be sold.

20. No person shall keep, sell, or expose for sale, in any space, stall, or building set apart in accordance with the foregoing by-law, any article or thing other than that for the exclusive sale of which the stall, space, or building has been so set apart.

Under Sub-section (7).

21. No person shall keep, or sell, or expose for sale in any public or private market any kind or species of fish, meat, vegetables, or other articles which has been prohibited by notice signed by the Chairman of the Committee and posted in the market.

22. Whenever it shall appear to the Committee that the use or consumption by the public of any particular kind of fish or meat or vegetable is injurious, it shall be lawful for the Chairman by beat of tom-tom, and by a notice signed by him and posted in a market to prohibit for such time as the Committee may by resolution appoint, the sale of any such meat or fish or vegetable in any public or private market or premises appertaining thereto; and after such notice to cause the same whenever found in such market or premises to be seized and destroyed in such manner as the Committee or Chairman may direct; and no person shall sell or expose for sale, or introduce or keep any such meat, fish, or vegetable in such market after such prohibition.

Under Sub-section (8).

23. It shall be lawful for the Committee or Chairman, when the state of the public health renders it necessary to close temporarily any public or private market, and to prohibit the use or occupation of such market for any purpose whatsoever during such time; and no person shall act contrary to such prohibition. The period of such closing may be extended from time to time as may be found necessary.

Under Sub-section (9).

24. The market-keeper shall see that the buildings, huts, or sheds referred to in section 4 of the Ordinance are removed within the time fixed, and that the market is kept clean, and the by-laws and provisions of the Ordinance are observed by persons frequenting the market, and report any infringement thereof to the Chairman.

25. It shall be the duty of the market-keeper and every watcher and every other person employed by the Committee or renter to maintain order within the limits of a public market.

26. It shall be an offence for a market-keeper or renter or lessee or any person employed under him to cause any undue annoyance to, or behave in a vexatious manner towards, any person under pretence of performing any duty or exercising any authority imposed or conferred upon him.

Under Sub-section (10).

27. It shall be an offence for any person to do any of the following acts:—

- (a) Being a person holding a permit under these by-laws, or being a lessee or renter of a public market, or the licensee of a private market, or being the servant, agent, or employee of any such person, to subject any person resorting to any such market to undue annoyance, vexation, or delay;
- (b) To carry on in any public market any cooking except in tea or coffee boutiques.
- (c) To behave in a disorderly manner or beg, or commit nuisance in or about any public or private market or its premises.
- (d) To remain in, or use, sleep in, or otherwise occupy any part of a public market before or after the hours appointed for opening or closing, or to loiter about such market or its premises at any time without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself, or to be found at any time therein without lawful excuse.
- (e) To damage or in anywise deface any portion of the buildings, stalls, lamps, or any other property appertaining to any public or private market, or defile or pollute in any way or waste, or use for bathing, or washing any clothes or animals the water provided for use in any such market.
- (f) Being a person affected with or suffering from any loathsome, contagious, or infectious disease, or who had recently suffered from any such disease, or had recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, or being a person affected with any cutaneous disease to occupy any stall, seat, space, boutique, or other place or building in any public or private market, or to expose for sale, or carry about therein any article whatsoever, or to enter within the precincts of any such market. And no person shall employ in any capacity in any such market or building or boutique connected therewith any person affected with any such disease.
- (g) To spit or expectorate within any part of a public market or in any place appertaining thereto where articles are kept or exposed for sale.

28. Every occupant of a stall, space, or seat in any public market or boutique or other building in the said market premises, and every licensee of a private market shall keep such stall, space or seat or boutique or building, or market premises clean and free from filth and rubbish, and shall sweep or clean the same daily and shall thoroughly cleanse daily every table, bench, board, or other article used for keeping or exposing goods.

29. No person shall throw refuse, offal, bones, skins of animals, or other articles likely to be offensive or injurious to the public health in or upon any public or private market or its premises, or into any drain on or near the market premises, or on the high roads bordering the same except into covered receptacles provided for such purpose.

30. No person shall kill any animal or flay or disembowel any carcass within the limits of any public or private market, or on the high roads bordering the same.

31. No person shall leave any cart or vehicle of any kind within any part of a market premises, or at any entrance leading thereto for a longer period than is necessary for loading or unloading or to set down or pick up their fares.

32. No person shall bring a dog into a market, or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to be in any part of any market premises.

33. No person shall take any cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals into any part of a market except into such places as may be set apart therefor.

34. If any dispute arise concerning any stall, space, seat, boutique, or other building in a public market or as regards rents and fees leviable thereon, it shall be competent for the Chairman to determine the same, and make such order thereon as to him may seem proper.

35. No occupant of a stall or space or building, or any part of a public market, shall in any way enclose the same, or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind except with the permission of the Chairman.

36. Every renter or lessee of a market or of any building within its premises, and every occupant or permit-holder of a stall or space, and every person employed therein shall extinguish, or cause to be extinguished every fire or light in such market, building, or stall before leaving it; and no fire or light shall be permitted or used which is dangerous to the safety of such market building or stall or appurtenances thereof, or any goods or articles therein.

37. The by-laws dated December 22, 1892, and published in *Gazette* No. 5,195 of December 30, 1892, are hereby repealed.

REGULATIONS made by the Sanitary Board of the District of Mannar, Northern Province, under section 9 E (2) (a), (b), (c) of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

REGULATIONS.

Regulations numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 13, and 15 under the heading "Latrines" published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,479 of August 21, 1925, are hereby cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:—

2. (a) Upon any application for such permission under by-law 1, it shall be competent to the Chairman to require that any particular type of cesspit, approved by a resolution of the Board, and no other, shall be constructed.

(b) The Chairman may further prescribe the position in which such cesspit shall be constructed, and refuse permission to construct any cesspit in any other position.

(c) It shall further be competent to the Chairman to refuse permission to construct any cesspit at all upon any premises, if he is of opinion that such construction should not be permitted on sanitary grounds.

3. (a) It shall be competent to the Chairman to order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises, in which a cesspit has been constructed without permission or in any way contrary to the terms of any permission issued by the Chairman, to demolish and fill up the said cesspit within such reasonable time as may be prescribed in such order.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under paragraph (a) of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

4. (a) The Chairman may order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises to construct, within the time prescribed by such order, a privy or a latrine of such a type and size and in such a position and with such connecting drains as the Board may by special or general resolution from time to time prescribe.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under paragraph (a) of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

5. (a) The Chairman may order in writing the owner or occupier of the premises, upon which any privy, cesspit, or latrine exists either to repair, alter, or reconstruct the same in such manner and within such time as the notice may prescribe, or to demolish and fill up the same within such prescribed time, if in the opinion of the Chairman such privy, cesspit, or latrine is liable to give rise to a nuisance.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under paragraph (a) of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

7. (a) The Board may by resolution prohibit within any specified area the use of any cesspit of any kind whatsoever, and direct that all latrines and closets be conducted on the dry-earth system.

(b) The Board may by resolution further specify (1) the minimum distance relatively to all adjoining houses at which new latrines and closets may be built; (2) the materials to be used and the manner in which the work is to be carried out; and (3) the time within which the alterations and new works respectively should be completed.

8. Whenever such a resolution shall have been passed, and notice in writing shall have been given by the Chairman, setting out the directions given and the time prescribed by the resolution, to the owner or occupier of any house or building or land in or on which such cesspit or

cesspits are situated, to close such cesspit or cesspits and substitute a dry-earth closet or closets therefor, it shall be incumbent on such person or persons to comply with such notice within the time specified therein. Any owner or occupier failing within such time to comply with such notice shall be guilty of an offence. Provided that for the erection of any closet or latrine under this by-law the permission of the Chairman under by-law 1 shall always be necessary.

13. Any persons requiring the services of day labourers may apply to the Chairman therefor in writing, and such labourers will be supplied upon such terms as the Board may by resolution decide. Fees for the services of such labourers shall be paid before the 10th day of the month for which the service is being rendered.

15. Whenever the Chairman shall consider the construction of a new catchpit or the alteration, repair, or reconstruction or filling up of an existing catchpit to be necessary, he may require any owner or occupier of any land or premises, by notice in writing, either to construct a new catchpit or to alter, repair, or reconstruct or fill up any existing catchpit, and may further give directions as to the position, level, and size of such catchpit, the materials to be used, the manner in which and the time within which the work is to be carried out, and any other details connected with such works. Any such owner or occupier who shall fail within the time specified to carry out such requirements of the Chairman shall be guilty of an offence.

“THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE,
No. 11 of 1920.”

BY-LAWS made by the Moratuwa Urban District Council under sections 163, 164, and 168 (12) of “The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920,” and approved by the Local Government Board and confirmed by the Governor under section 164 by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

BY-LAWS.

1. The following areas are hereby declared to be the “market areas” of the Urban District Council, Moratuwa, and shall be called the Digarolla market area, the Rawatawatta market area, and the Moratumulla market area, respectively:—

Digarolla Market Area.

North by Mount road, De Mel's lane, and a line 18½ chains in length, drawn from the end of De Mel's lane westwards up to the sea; east by Panadure lagoon; south by a line 27½ chains in length, drawn from a point 20 chains to the south of the market on St. Peter's road, westwards up to the sea and a line 5½ chains in length drawn from the same point, eastwards up to the Panadure lagoon; west by sea.

Rawatawatta Market Area.

North by Rawatawatta road up to the bend near the culvert, a cart road 8 chains in length running to the west of Main street in line with Rawatawatta road, a line 3 chains in length drawn from the end of same cart road up to the main outlet drain, and the main outlet drain up to the Lunawa lagoon; east by Rawatawatta road from the bend near the culvert up to De Soysa road cart track 150 feet to the west of Rawatawatta road junction, running southwards from the De Soysa road up to the stretch of paddy fields and the northern and western boundaries of the same paddy fields up to the bend on Circular road (north) adjoining the general cemetery; south by the Circular road (north) from the bend adjoining the general cemetery, Church avenue, and the southern boundary of the Prince of Wales College premises; west by Lunawa lagoon.

Moratumulla Market Area.

North by Incinerator lane and Sudharamarama lane; east by a line 14½ chains in length drawn from Sudharamarama lane junction, southwards up to a point 20 chains to the east of the market on De Soysa road and the same line 22 chains in length produced southwards to meet the end of southern boundary on the eastern side of the stretch of paddy fields; south by a line 18 chains in length drawn from a point 20 chains to the south of the market on Moratumulla road eastwards up to a point on the eastern side of paddy fields and a line 18½ chains in length drawn from the

same point westwards up to St. Anthony's road-Puwakaramba road junction, and St. Anthony's road up to the Kadalana road junction; west by Kadalana road up to the bend near the second culvert a line 10 chains in length drawn from the same bend northwards up to a point 20 chains to the west of the market on De Soysa road and the village boundary of Moratumulla from De Soysa road.

2. Subject to section 163 (5) of the principal Ordinance, no person shall within the “market areas” aforesaid, sell any fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables at any place other than the public market of each such area or a duly licensed market.

3. (a) Any person may sell fresh fish on that portion of the seabeach lying between the railway line and the sea.

(b) No person shall sell fish within the “market area” otherwise than in accordance with a licence issued by the Chairman.

(c) A keeper of a licensed eating-house or tea and coffee boutique within the respective “market areas” may sell ripe plantains on the licensed premises.

(d) Any person may sell young coconuts anywhere within the market area.

4. It shall be lawful for an Inspector of the Council, duly authorized by the Chairman, to seize any fish, flesh, vegetables, fruits, or other articles of food exposed for sale within the respective “market areas” which is unwholesome or unfit for human food, and upon such seizure to convey the same to the Health Officer and if it appears to such Health Officer that such fish, fruits, vegetables, or other provisions are unfit for human food, the same shall be ordered to be destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for food.

5. Any person committing a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence and in the case of a continuing offence an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927.

REGULATION made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, under section 58 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, for the Urban area comprised within the administrative limits of the Local Board of Bandarawela.

(1) No omnibus or lorry shall be used on the following highways unless with the permission of the Chairman of the Board:—

(1) Grange road, (2) Circuit Bungalow road, (3) Upper road, (4) Esplanade road.

(2) This regulation shall come into operation fourteen days after the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

“THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE, 1899.”

REGULATIONS made by the Sanitary Board of the Kurunegala District, being the proper authority in that behalf, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 18 and 23 of “The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899,” in respect of the General Cemetery at Polgahawela.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. All applications for graves or for facilities for cremations shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than 6 hours before the time fixed for the burial or cremation in question.

2. No one shall be allowed to dig a grave except the persons employed or approved by the keeper.

3. The keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one party come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.

4. Should it be necessary for the purposes of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another and not otherwise, the keeper may require that one burial service or cremation should be concluded before another is commenced.

5. The keeper shall be entitled to maintain order within the cemetery and his commands in that behalf shall be obeyed.

6. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or a less distance than 4 feet from another.

7. No dead body shall be buried or cremated in the general cemetery without the permission of the cemetery-keeper; and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due have been paid.

8. No grave shall be opened within a year from the last interment therein except on an order of a Court of competent jurisdiction as provided by law.

Regulations.1. (a) These regulations shall come into operation on *July 8, 1932.*

(b) From and after the aforementioned date the regulations published in "Gazette" No. 7,888 of October 16, 1931, shall stand rescinded and all other by-laws, orders, rules and regulations relating to the use of highways by lorries and kept in force by and deemed to be regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations shall cease to have effect.

Highways I.

2. The highways *Outside Colombo* specified in *Schedule A* are hereby declared to be suitable for use by *Lorries other than Trailers*, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that:—

- (1) The maximum weight of the lorry when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled lorries and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled lorries; and

Regulations.

- (a) These regulations shall come into operation on **July 8, 1932.**
- (b) From and after the aforementioned date the regulations published in "Gazette" No. 7,888 of October 16, 1931, shall stand rescinded and all other by-laws, orders, rules, and regulations relating to the use of highways **By Motor Cars** other than lorries and trailers, and kept in force by and deemed to be regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations shall cease to have effect.

- Nothing in these regulations shall be construed so as to apply to lorries or the use of highways thereby.

Highways I.

3. The highways **Outside Colombo** specified in **Schedule A** are hereby declared to be suitable for use by all **Motor Cars other than Lorries and Trailers**, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that:—

- The maximum weight of the motor car when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled motor cars; and
- The maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and three tons in the case of six-wheeled motor cars.

In all cases the rate should include all handling charges as both ends, stacking, loading, and unloading.

2. Schedules of rates in respect of the foregoing services must be submitted on detailed schedule forms to be obtained from the respective District Engineer, in duplicate, duly signed and dated and forwarded in securely sealed envelopes, the originals addressed to the Provincial Engineer, Northern Province, Jaffna, and the duplicates to the respective District Engineers, endorsed in the left hand top corner of the envelope "Tender for the Transport of Stores, Public Works Department, District," so as to reach the offices of the fore-going officers on or before 12 noon on August 16, 1932.

3. Any alterations made in the tenders should be authenticated by the initials of the tenderers.

4. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 2, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 146 (2 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 85 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 16 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 26.3, as against 26.6 in the preceding week, 26.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 119 (3 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 23 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.5, as against 22.1 in the previous week, 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 119 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Kotahena North and New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 8 in the previous week and 17, the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 10 in the previous week and 10, the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 5 in the previous week and 5, the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 in Maradana North. The number registered during the preceding week was also 9 and the weekly average for last year was 12.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana Hospitals, as against 4 in the previous week and 3, the weekly average for last year.

4. Five deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 each in Pettah, and San Sebastian, and 1 in Wellawatta North, as against 1 in the previous week and 1, the weekly average for last year.

5. Five deaths each from *Enteritis*, *Worms*, and *Debility* were registered, 4 from *Accidents*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 55 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Twenty cases of *Chicken-pox*, 8 of *Whooping Cough*, 5 of *Plague*, and 2 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 19, nil, 2, and 7 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.3°, against 81.1° in the preceding week and 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.780 in., against 29.863 in. in the preceding week and 29.851 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.08 in., against 0.84 in. in the preceding week and 3.48 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE CEYLON MORNING LEADER NEWSPAPERS AND PUBLISHING COMPANY, LIMITED.

1. The regulations contained in the Table marked "C" in the schedule to the Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table "C"), shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far

as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa* and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. The following new regulations shall be inserted immediately before regulation 1 of Table "C", namely:—

BUSINESS.

(a) The Company may proceed to carry out the object for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted as soon as in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

CAPITAL.

(b) The nominal capital of the Company is Rupees One hundred thousand (Rs. 100,000) divided into 1,000 ordinary shares of Rupees One hundred (Rs. 100) each and the shares forming the capital of the Company shall be divided into two classes, 500 fully paid shares and 500 other shares, which latter shares be subdivided as follows: Rs. 50 on each share on allotment and the balance Rs. 50 when called for by the Directors with the sanction of a General Meeting of the Company.

(c) The payment of the purchase money due to Messrs. M. F. Abdul Caffoor, M. S. Marikar Bawa, A. H. M. Salman, and U. L. M. M. Mohideen shall be by allotting shares of the Company to the extent of the money due to them excluding however any money borrowed by them for the purpose of the said business.

(d) The Directors may, with sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

(e) Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

(f) The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

3. The following new regulation shall be added after regulation 10 of Table "C", namely:—

10 (a) The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien or otherwise; or in case of shares fully paid up or not fully paid up, to any person not approved of by them; and in no case shall a shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declination shall be absolute.

10 (b) Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and fee of Two Rupees and Fifty Cents or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 10 (a), shall register the transferee as a shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

10 (c) The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

10 (d) In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor

shall have no claim whatever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferee.

4. The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 20 of Table "C", namely:—

BORROWING POWERS.

20 (a) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's business, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending building, machinery, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees Ten Thousand.

20 (b) With the sanction of a General Meeting the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums, and at such rate of interest as such meeting or Special Meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of the two Directors and the Secretary, or of three Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

20 (c) For the purpose of securing the payment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purpose, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash, credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights and assets of the Company, both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or make may, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

20 (d) Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares or otherwise.

20 (e) Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assigned free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

5. Regulations 21 and 22 of Table "C" are expressly excluded.

9. Regulations 45 and 46 of Table "C" are expressly excluded and the following new regulations shall be added after regulation 44 of Table "C", namely:—
