GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

ORDINANCE No. 17 OF 1869.

RULES under section 48 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 regarding the shipping or transshipping of Petroleum for exportation from the Island made by the Principal Collector and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

1. The master, owner, or agents of every ship into which petroleum is to be loaded shall, before loading any petroleum or other cargo, declare in writing to the Collector of Customs—

- (a) What quantity of petroleum the ship is to export; and
(b) Whether any, and if so what part, is dangerous petroleum.

2. The master of any exporting vessel shall not receive any petroleum in cases, tins, or drums, until permission for that purpose has been obtained from the Collector of Customs or an officer specially authorized by him to grant such permission.

3. When permission has been granted for the loading of petroleum in cases, tins, or drums—

- (a) It shall be loaded only in cargo boats, barges, or lighters and after sunrise and before 3 P.M., and only from such place or places as the Collector of Customs shall direct. Every such cargo boat, barge, or lighter shall carry at its bows and stern a red flag not less than two feet square on a staff not less than six feet above the deck. When conveying petroleum such boat, barge, or lighter shall carry no other cargo.

- (b) No smoking, fire, lights, matches, or other means of ignition shall be allowed in any cargo boat, barge, or lighter during the time that the petroleum is on board such boat, barge, or lighter.

The tindal or other person in charge of any boat, barge, or lighter engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall be liable for any breach of this rule.

4. No boat, barge, or lighter shall be engaged in the shipping or transshipping of petroleum or any of its products to any vessel within any harbour until three hours' notice shall have been given by the lighterage company to the Inspector of Police of such port and an officer of the Police Force shall have been appointed by him for the purpose of supervising such shipping or transshipment.

The lighterage company engaged in the shipping, or transshipping of petroleum shall be liable for any breach of this rule.

5. The tindal or other person in charge of any boat, barge, or lighter into which non-dangerous petroleum has been loaded shall forthwith bring such boat, barge, or lighter by the most direct route to the ship in which the aforesaid petroleum is to be shipped, and such petroleum shall be shipped immediately; provided that at ports other than Colombo, all boats, barges, or lighters containing petroleum in cases, tins, or drums shall be removed at sunset to a mooring specially appointed by the Master Attendant, and shall be moored fore and aft by chains.

6. When permission has been granted for the conveyance of petroleum in boats, barges, or lighters, such boats, barges, or lighters shall be securely covered by hatches and tarpaulins as soon as the petroleum has been taken on board.

The tindal or other person in charge of such boats, barges, or lighters shall be liable for any breach of this rule.

7. The tindal of any boat, barge, or lighter into which petroleum for shipment or transshipment is being loaded shall not receive any damaged or leaking cases, tins, or drums of petroleum.

8. The tindal or other person in charge of any boat, barge, or lighter into which cases, tins, or drums of petroleum are loaded shall place or cause such cases, tins, or drums to be placed in an upright position with the cap or lid uppermost; provided, however, that any tin or drum found to be leaking after being received into a lighter may be placed with the leak uppermost.

9. No person shall smoke or take or light any fire or light or strike any match or cause ignition by any other means within 50 feet of any hatch into which dangerous petroleum in cases, tins, or drums is being received.

10. No case, tin, or drum shall be soldered on board any vessel in the harbour so long as any petroleum is

still on board such vessel. The contents of any damaged or leaking receptacle, however, may be decanted on board into sound containers.

The master of such vessel shall be liable for a breach of this rule.

11. Except in the case of exportation or transshipment in bulk all receptacles in which dangerous petroleum is exported shall bear the name of the exporter and the nature of the contents thereof with the addition of the words "highly inflammable."

The exporter shall be liable for any breach of this rule.

12. Should any vessel receiving petroleum commence to leak while in harbour, the master shall immediately report such leakage to the Master Attendant.

13. The Collector of Customs may exempt from any or all of these rules and of the rules applicable to Colombo the exportation of any consignment of petroleum not exceeding 100 gallons.

Rules applicable to Colombo only.

1. The master of any exporting vessel shall not receive any dangerous petroleum in cases, tins, or drums except at the Guide Pier and between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6 P.M. Petroleum, other than dangerous petroleum, which is conveyed in cases, tins, or drums shall be subject to the same restrictions, provided that the Collector may, on special application, permit it to be loaded elsewhere, within the hours specified above.

2. No petroleum shall in any circumstances be allowed to remain in any boat, barge, or lighter, for a longer time than may, in the opinion of the Principal Collector, be necessary for the proper loading or unloading of the petroleum.

3. The master of any vessel shall not receive any cases, tins, or drums of petroleum at the Guide Pier except in the presence of a representative of the exporter and of an officer appointed by the Collector to supervise the loading.

Order of The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,

IMPORTATION OF MEAT, &C. (WRAPPING MATERIALS),
ORDER OF 1932.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Imported Meat to be wrapped in cloths of prescribed pattern.

1. The landing in Great Britain from a prohibited country of meat or offals is hereby prohibited if they are packed or wrapped in cloths, bags, sacking or like material not being bags or wrappers wholly made of—

- (a) Jute, hemp, flax, or other cloth manufactured with three red threads woven together at intervals of twelve inches in the warp; or
(b) stockinette; or
(c) paper.

Prohibition of landing of feeding stuffs, fertilisers or horticultural produce packed in bags or sacks made from meat wrappers.

2. It shall not be lawful to land in Great Britain any feeding stuffs for animals, fertilisers, or any horticultural produce packed in bags, sacks or other receptacles wholly or partly made from any cloth mentioned in Article 1 (a) hereof or in the manufacture of which meat wrappers of any material whatsoever have been used.

Prohibition against packing, carrying, selling, feeding or using for animals of feeding stuffs or bedding, or of fertilisers or horticultural produce, in sacks made from meat wrappers.

3.—(1) It shall not be lawful—

- (a) to pack in Great Britain,
 (b) to carry by railway, water, road or air in Great Britain, or
 (c) to sell or offer for sale in Great Britain,

any feeding stuffs for animals or any material intended for use as bedding for animals (including straw, sawdust, peat-moss or other litter), or any fertiliser or horticultural produce, in any sack or receptacle wholly or partly made from any cloth mentioned in paragraph (a) of Article 1 of this Order.

(2) It shall not be lawful to feed to animals or to use as bedding for animals any such feeding stuffs or materials which have been packed or contained in any such sack or receptacle.

Powers of Entry.

4. An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may enter any premises, vessel, vehicle, aircraft or other place for the purpose of ascertaining whether this Order is being complied with.

Interpretation.

5. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Animals” includes cattle, sheep, swine, goats, horses, asses, mules, fowls, turkeys, geese, ducks, guinea-fowls and pigeons.

“Feeding stuffs for animals” means any feeding stuffs (including wheat, barley, oats, maize and other grains, beans, peas, dari, millers’ offals, meals, oilcakes, brewers’ grains, dried sugar beet pulp and chaff) intended for feeding to animals or capable of conversion after importation into Great Britain into food for feeding to animals.

“Fertilisers” means any article used as a fertiliser of the soil and includes basic slag, compound fertilisers, fish guano and fish manure, animal by-products containing bones, hoofs, horns or blood, lime and lime products, potassium salts, nitrate of soda, raw phosphate or phosphate rock (ground or otherwise), sulphate of ammonia and superphosphate.

“Horticultural produce” includes any plant, fruit, or vegetable and the seeds, tubers, bulbs, or other parts of a plant.

“Meat” and “offals” mean the meat and offals derived from any carcase of cattle, sheep, or swine and includes bacon and ham.

“Meat wrapper” means any cloth, bag, sack, sacking, hessian wrapper, or material which has been used for or in connection with the wrapping of meat, meat products, offals or other parts of the carcase of an animal.

“Prohibited country” means any country outside Great Britain except the following, namely, Northern Ireland, the Irish Free State, Channel Islands, Isle of Man, Commonwealth of Australia, Dominion of New Zealand, Dominion of Canada, the Union of South Africa (including the Mandated Territory of South West Africa), the United States of America, Iceland, and the Faroe Islands.

Offences.

6. If any person does any act in contravention of the provisions of this Order, or aids, abets, counsels or procures the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, he shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Saving of Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) Order of 1926 and Amending Orders.

7. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) Order of 1926 or any Order amending it.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall, except where it is otherwise provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the First day of November, 1932.

Short Title.

10. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTATION OF MEAT, & C. (WRAPPING MATERIALS), ORDER OF 1932.

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the services named in the schedule hereunder for the period of one year commencing from October 1, 1932.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, or be sent through the post under registered cover.

4. Tenders should be marked “Tender for _____” in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of Director of Medical and Sanitary Services not later than midday on August 23, 1932.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A cash deposit according to the schedule hereunder will be required to be made at any Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and

bond, after he has tendered, or fail to furnish the approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing of the acceptance of the tender, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature to the contract. No deposits for tender forms will be accepted at the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

7. The successful tenderer will be required to furnish cash security according to the schedule hereunder, and to sign the bond given in the tender for the due fulfilment of the contract; also to furnish with each tender a letter in duplicate signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become an additional security for the due performance of the contract. The amount deposited for tender forms will form part of the security.

8. Contracts may not be assigned, sublet, or otherwise transferred without the previous written sanction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. Sanction will not be given for any transfers, including powers of attorney in favour of persons in the defaulting contractors' list. No defaulting contractor should be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

9. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender or the whole of it for an year or any portion thereof.

11. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

12. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Head of the Department acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

13. Tenderers, who have not previously held Government contracts, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving their full names and permanent addresses, stating in which district or districts they own landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property, and the nature and the extent of other interests should also be given.

In the case of persons who have carried out contracts with the Medical Department, but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders, they should state in which division or district or divisions or districts they held contracts.

In the cases of persons who have carried out Government contracts with departments other than the Medical Department, the name of such Department and the district in which the service was rendered should be stated.

(d) Not less than 150 to 200 trees per acre belonging to the species of Palu, Ebony, Satin, and Weera that will be marked as standards should not be felled or otherwise damaged.

Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's licence in surveying and levelling (Ordinance No. 26 of 1909), will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 17, and the practical examination on November 14, 1932.

(ii.) *Arithmetic and Algebra*—one paper.—[*Arithmetic*.—The principles and process of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.]

Algebra.—Symbolical expression of general results in arithmetic algebraic laws and their applications. Factors of simple binomial or quadratic expressions; Equations of the first or second degree, and problems leading thereto. Square root. Graphs of simple rational integral algebraic functions. Arithmetical and harmonical progression. Geometrical progression. Theory of indices. Logarithms and the use of logarithmic tables. Binomial theorem for a positive integral index.]

(iii.) *Geometry and Trigonometry*—one paper.

[*Geometry*.—The subjects of Euclid I.-IV., with simple deductions, including easy loci and the areas of triangles and parallelograms, of which the bases and altitudes are given commensurable lengths. (All proofs of geometrical theorems must be geometrical. Euclid's proofs will not be insisted upon.) Similar figures. Mensuration of the circle, Mensuration of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.]

Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles, together with the practical solutions of triangles and applications, and numerical examples involving the use of logarithmic and other tables.]

(iv.) *Surveying*—one paper.—[Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolite and compass traverses. Curve ranging. Subtense methods and tachometry. Plane tables surveying. Plane triangulation. The determination of azimuth.]

(v.) *Levelling*—one paper.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Computation of earthwork. Road and railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom.]

The percentages of marks required for a pass will be: in papers (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) 40 per cent. in each paper and 50 per cent. in aggregate; in papers (iv.) and (v.) 60 per cent.

6. Candidates in surveying only will be required to pass in papers (i.)-(iv.) inclusive; and candidates in levelling only in paper (v.).

7. Candidates who fail in the written examination will not be required to present themselves for the practical examination.

8. Candidates who pass the written examination will be duly notified of the time and place of the practical examination, which will be sent on the syllabuses in surveying and levelling of the written examination.

9. Candidates will work in the field between hours fixed by the Examiner, and must produce instruments in good order. Defects in instruments will not be accepted as an excuse for bad work. Candidates found to be in communication with anyone during examination hours will be disqualified.

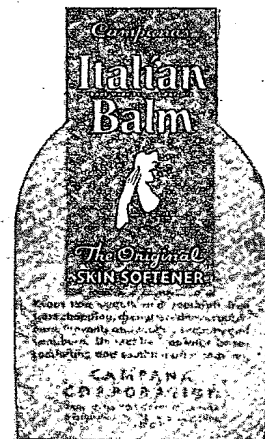

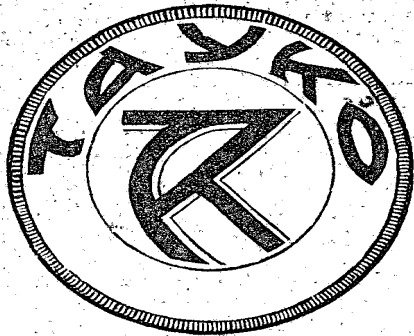

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 9, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 155 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 92 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 27.9, as against 26.3 in the preceding week, 24.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 132 (2 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 21 Moors, and 4 Malays). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.8, as against 21.5 in the previous week, 26.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 132 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 15 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar, and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 5 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered in Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 9 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.

5. Nine deaths from *Dobility* were registered, 8 from *Worms*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 3 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, *Suicide*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Homicide*, and 50 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-four cases of *Chickenpox*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 of *Measles*, 1 of *Whooping Cough*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 20, 2, nil, 8, and 5, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.6°, against 81.3° in the preceding week and 81.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.791 in., against 29.780 in. in the preceding week and 29.870 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.33 in., against 0.08 in. in the preceding week and 2.17 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
