A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME S. KEPPEL.

WHEREAS under section 3 of "The Seashore Protection Ordinance, 1911," the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any part of the seashore of this Island as an area from or over which no sand, stone, coral, or other substance shall be removed:

And whereas it is desirable to proclaim the area defined in the schedule thereto:

Know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby, under section 3 of "The Seashore Protection Ordinance, 1911," proclaim that part of the seashore of this Island, which is specified and defined in the schedule hereto, as an area from or over which no sand, stone, coral, or other substance shall be removed from and after the date hereof.

SCHEDULE.

That part of the seashore adjacent to the village of Mathakal in the Valikamam West division of the Jaffna District, and bounded as follows:—

On the south by a line drawn eastward from a point on the eastern bank of Kalikarai vaikal, where it touches the high water of the sea, along the said high watermark to a point on the western bank of Aladithurai vaikal near the 19th mile of the Point Pedro-Punnalai road.

On the west by a straight line drawn from the western end of the southern boundary due north for one mile.

On the east by a line drawn from the eastern end of the southern boundary due north for one mile.

On the north by a line joining the northern points of the eastern and western boundaries.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 20th day of September 1893, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 5,243 of September 22, 1893, the divisions of the Municipal town of Galle were defined as set forth in the Schedule B thereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to cancel the said Schedule B and to alter the number and limits of the divisions of the said Municipal town:

Now therefore, We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do, by this Our Proclamation under section 5 (c) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, cancel the said Schedule B of the Proclamation aforesaid, and do alter the number of the existing divisions of the Municipal town of Galle from five to seven, with effect from the first day of January, 1933, and further declare that from and after the said date the limits of the divisions of the said Municipal town shall be those set out in the schedule hereto.

And We do in all other respects affirm the aforesaid Proclamation of the 20th day of September, 1893.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of the Divisions or Wards into which the Municipality of Galle is divided.

Division No. 1.

North: From the centre of the western extremity of the northern ramparts of the Fort eastwards along the centre of the said ramparts to the Harbour.

East, south, and west: From the last mentioned point southwards, westwards, and northwards along the southern and south-western limits of the Municipality to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 2.

North: From the centre of the junction of Kumbalwella road and Kandewatta road eastwards along the centre of Kandewatta road to its junction with the centre of Wakwella road thence along the centre of Cripps road to its junction with the centre of Dickson road.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre of Dickson road to its junction with the centre of Sea street, thence in a straight line due south to meet the southern limit of the Municipality.

South: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the southern limit of the Municipality till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 1 thence westwards along the northern limit of Division No. 1 to meet the south-western limit of the Municipality.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the south-western limit of the Municipality till it meets the prolongation of the centre of Kumbalwella road, thence along the centre of Kumbalwella road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 3.

North: From the centre of the junction of Cripps road and Dickson road eastwards along the centre of Cripps road to its junction with the centre of Hirimbura road, thence along the centre of Circular road to its junction with the centre of Morris road.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the centre of the Circular road to its junction with the centre of Talapitiya Cross road, thence along the centre of Talapitiya Cross road to its junction with the centre of Matara High road, thence in a straight line in prolongation of the centre of Talapitiya Cross road to meet the southern limit of the Municipality.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Municipality till it meets the eastern limit of Division No. 2.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 2 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 4.

North: From the centre of the junction of Circular road and Morris road eastwards along the centre of Morris road to its junction with the centre of Haliwela road, thence along the eastern limit of the Municipality till it meets the eastern side of Dik-ela.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Municipality to the mouth of Lunuwila-ela.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Municipality till it meets the eastern limit of Division No. 3.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Division No. 3 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 5.

North: From the junction of Wakwella road and Kalegana road eastwards along the northern limit of the Municipality as far as the junction of Morris road and Hirimbura road.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Municipality till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 4, thence southwards along the northern limit of Division No. 4 till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 3.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the northern limits of Division Nos. 3 and 2 till it meets the centre of the junction of Cripps road and Elliott road.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the centre of Elliott road to its junction with the centre of Kumbalwella road, thence westwards along the centre of Kumbalwella road to its junction with the centre of Wakwella road, thence northwards along the centre of Wakwella road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 6.

North: From the centre of the junction of Wakwella road and Kumbalwella road, eastwards along the western limit of Division No. 5 to the centre of the junction of Kumbalwella road and Elliott road.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the western limit of Division No. 5 till it meets the northern limit of Division No. 2.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the northern limit of Division No. 2 to the centre of junction of Kandewatta road and Kumbalwella road.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the centre of the Kumbalwella road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 7.

North: From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Municipality eastwards along the said limit till it meets the western limit of Division No. 5.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the western limit of Division No. 5 till it meets the western limit of Division No. 6 thence westwards and southwards along the western limit of Division No. 6 till it meets the western limit of Division No. 2 thence along the western limit of Division No. 2 till it meets the south-western limit of the Municipality.

South and west: From the last mentioned point westwards and northwards along the south-western and western limits of the Municipality to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Dumbuluwawa village in Angomu korale in Dewamedi hatpattu of the District of Kurunegala, North-Western Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, either wholly or in part exempt any cemetery from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

Who, being hereto duly authorised, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

The countries to which the present Convention applies are constituted into a Union for the protection of the rights of authors over their literary and artistic works.

ARTICLE 2.

(1) The term "literary and artistic works" shall include every production in the literary, scientific and artistic domain, whatever may be the mode or form of its expression, such as books, pamphlets and other writings; lectures, addresses, sermons and other works of the same nature; dramatic or dramatico-musical works, choreographic works and entertainments in dumb show, the acting form of which is fixed in writing or otherwise; musical compositions with or without words; works of drawing, painting, architecture, sculpture, engraving, and lithography; illustrations, geographical charts, plans, sketches, and plastic works relative to geography, topography, architecture or science.

(2) Translations, adaptations, arrangements of music and other reproductions in an altered form of a literary or artistic work, as well as collections of different works, shall be protected as original works without prejudice to the rights of the author of the original work.

(3) The countries of the Union shall be bound to make provision for the protection of the above-mentioned works.

(4) Works of art applied to industrial purposes shall be protected so far as the domestic legislation of each country allows.

ARTICLE 2 bis.

(1) The right of partially or wholly excluding political speeches and speeches delivered in legal proceedings from the protection provided by the preceding Article is reserved for the domestic legislation of each country of the Union.

(2) The right of fixing the conditions under which lectures, addresses, sermons and other works of the same nature may be reproduced by the press is also reserved for the domestic legislation of each country of the Union. Nevertheless the author shall have the sole right of making a collection of the said works.

ARTICLE 3.

The present Convention shall apply to photographic works and to works produced by a process analogous to photography. The countries of the Union shall be bound to make provision for their protection.

ARTICLE 4.

(1) Authors who are nationals of any of the countries of the Union shall enjoy in countries other than the country of origin of the work, for their works, whether unpublished or first published in a country of the Union, the rights which the respective laws do now or may hereafter grant to natives, as well as the rights specially granted by the present Convention.

(2) The enjoyment and the exercise of these rights shall not be subject to the performance of any formality; such enjoyment and such exercise are independent of the existence of protection in the country of origin of the work. Consequently, apart from the express stipulations of the present Convention, the extent of protection, as well as the means of redress secured to the author to safeguard his rights, shall be governed exclusively by the laws of the country where protection is claimed.

(3) The country of origin of the work shall be considered to be: in the case of unpublished works, the country to which the author belongs; in the case of published works, the country of first publication; and in the case of works published simultaneously in several countries of the Union, the country the laws of which grant the shortest term of protection. In the case of works published simultaneously in a country outside the Union and in a country of the Union, the latter country shall be considered exclusively as the country of origin.

(4) By "published works" must be understood, for the purposes of the present Convention, works copies of which have been issued to the public. The representation of a dramatic or dramatico-musical work, the performance of a musical work, the exhibition of a work of art and the construction of a work of architecture shall not constitute a publication.

ARTICLE 5.

Authors who are nationals of one of the countries of the Union and who first publish their works in another country of the Union shall have in the latter country the same rights as native authors.

ARTICLE 6.

(1) Authors who are not nationals of one of the countries of the Union, and who first publish their works in one of those countries, shall enjoy in that country the same rights as native authors, and in the other countries of the Union the rights granted by the present Convention.

(2) Nevertheless, where any country outside the Union fails to protect in an adequate manner the works of authors who are nationals of one of the countries of the Union,

the latter country may restrict the protection given to the works of authors who are at the date of the first publication thereof nationals of the other country and are not effectively domiciled in one of the countries of the Union.

(3) No restrictions introduced by virtue of the preceding paragraph shall in any way affect the rights which an author may have acquired in respect of a work published in a country of the Union before such restrictions were put in force.

(4) The countries of the Union which restrict the grant of copyright in accordance with the present Article, shall give notice thereof to the Government of the Swiss Confederation by a written declaration specifying the countries in regard to which protection is restricted, and the restrictions to which rights of authors who are nationals of those countries are subjected. The Government of the Swiss Confederation will immediately communicate this declaration to all the countries of the Union.

ARTICLE 6 bis.

(1) Independently of the author's copyright, and even after transfer of the said copyright, the author shall have the right to claim authorship of the work, as well as the right to object to any distortion, mutilation or other modification of the said work which would be prejudicial to his honour or reputation.

(2) The determination of the conditions under which these rights shall be exercised is reserved for the national legislation of the countries of the Union. The means of redress for safeguarding these rights shall be regulated by the legislation of the country where protection is claimed.

ARTICLE 7.

(1) The term of protection granted by the present Convention shall be the life of the author and fifty years after his death.

(2) Nevertheless, in case such term of protection should not be uniformly adopted by all the countries of the Union, the term shall be regulated by the law of the country where protection is claimed, and must not exceed the term fixed in the country of origin of the work. Consequently the countries of the Union shall only be bound to apply the provisions of the preceding paragraph in so far as such provisions are consistent with their domestic laws.

(3) For photographic works and works produced by a process analogous to photography, for posthumous works, for anonymous or pseudonymous works, the term of protection shall be regulated by the law of the country where protection is claimed, provided that the said term shall not exceed the term fixed in the country of origin of the work.

ARTICLE 7 bis.

(1) The term of copyright protection belonging in common to joint authors of a work shall be calculated according to the date of the death of the author who dies last.

(2) Authors who are nationals of the countries which grant a term of protection shorter than that mentioned in paragraph (1) cannot claim a longer term of protection in the other countries of the Union.

(3) In no case may the term of protection expire before the death of the author who dies last.

ARTICLE 8.

The authors of unpublished works, who are nationals of one of the countries of the Union, and the authors of works first published in one of those countries, shall enjoy, in the other countries of the Union, during the whole term of the right in the original work, the exclusive right of making or authorising a translation of their works.

ARTICLE 9.

(1) Serial stories, tales, and all other works, whether literary, scientific or artistic, whatever their object, published in the newspapers or periodicals of one of the countries of the Union may not be reproduced in the other countries without the consent of the authors.

(2) Articles on current economic, political or religious topics may be reproduced by the press unless the reproduction thereof is expressly reserved. Nevertheless, the source must always be clearly indicated; the legal consequences of the breach of this obligation shall be determined by the laws of the country where protection is claimed.

(3) The protection of the present Convention shall not apply to news of the day or to miscellaneous information which is simply of the nature of items of news.

ARTICLE 10.

As regards the liberty of extracting portions from literary or artistic works for use in publications destined for educational purposes, or having a scientific character, or for

chrestomathies, the effect of the legislation of the countries of the Union and of special arrangements existing, or to be concluded, between them is not affected by the present Convention.

ARTICLE 11.

(1) The stipulations of the present Convention shall apply to the public representation of dramatic or dramatico-musical works and to the public performance of musical works, whether such works be published or not.

(2) Authors of dramatic or dramatico-musical works shall be protected during the existence of their right over the original work against the unauthorised public representation of translations of their works.

(3) In order to enjoy the protection of the present Article, authors shall not be bound in publishing their works to forbid the public representation or performance thereof.

ARTICLE 11 bis.

(1) Authors of literary and artistic works shall enjoy the exclusive right of authorising the communication of their works to the public by radio-communication.

(2) The national legislations of the countries of the Union may regulate the conditions under which the right mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall be exercised, but the effect of those conditions will be strictly limited to the countries which have put them in force. Such conditions shall not in any case prejudice the moral right (*droit moral*) of the author, nor the right which belongs to the author to obtain an equitable remuneration which shall be fixed, failing agreement, by the competent authority.

ARTICLE 12.

The following shall be specially included among the unlawful reproductions to which the present Convention applies: Unauthorised indirect appropriations of a literary or artistic work, such as adaptations, musical arrangements, transformations of a novel, tale, or piece of poetry, into a dramatic piece and *vice versa*, &c., when they are only the reproduction of that work, in the same form or in another form, without essential alterations, additions, or abridgments and do not present the character of a new original work.

ARTICLE 13.

(1) The authors of musical works shall have the exclusive right of authorising (1) the adaptation of those works to instruments which can reproduce them mechanically; (2) the public performance of the said works by means of these instruments.

(2) Reservations and conditions relating to the application of this Article may be determined by the domestic legislation of each country in so far as it is concerned; but the effect of any such reservations and conditions will be strictly limited to the country which has put them in force.

(3) The provisions of paragraph (1) shall not be retroactive, and consequently shall not be applicable in any country of the Union to works which have been lawfully adapted in that country to mechanical instruments before the coming into force of the Convention signed at Berlin on the 13th November, 1908, and in the case of a country which has acceded to the Union since that date, or accedes in the future, before the date of its accession.

(4) Adaptations made in virtue of paragraphs (2) and (3) of the present Article, and imported without the authority of the interested parties into a country where they would not be lawful, shall be liable to seizure in that country.

ARTICLE 14.

(1) Authors of literary, scientific or artistic works shall have the exclusive right of authorising the reproduction, adaptation and public presentation of their works by cinematography.

(2) Cinematographic productions shall be protected as literary or artistic works if the author has given the work an original character. If this character is absent the cinematographic production shall enjoy protection as a photographic work.

(3) Without prejudice to the rights of the author of the work reproduced or adapted, a cinematographic work shall be protected as an original work.

(4) The above provisions apply to reproduction or production effected by any other process analogous to cinematography.

ARTICLE 15.

(1) In order that the authors of works protected by the present Convention shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be considered as such, and be consequently admitted to institute proceedings against pirates before the courts of the various countries of the Union, it will be sufficient that their name be indicated on the work in the accustomed manner.

(2) For anonymous or pseudonymous works the publisher whose name is indicated on the work shall be entitled to protect the rights belonging to the author. He shall be, without other proof, deemed to be the legal representative of the anonymous or pseudonymous author.

ARTICLE 16.

(1) Pirated works may be seized by the competent authorities of any country of the Union where the original work enjoys legal protection.

(2) In such a country the seizure may also apply to reproductions imported from a country where the work is not protected, or has ceased to be protected.

(3) The seizure shall take place in accordance with the domestic legislation of each country.

ARTICLE 17.

The provisions of the present Convention cannot in any way derogate from the right belonging to the Government of each country of the Union to permit, to control, or to prohibit, by measures of domestic legislation or police, the circulation, representation, or exhibition of any works or productions in regard to which the competent authority may find it necessary to exercise that right.

ARTICLE 18.

(1) The present Convention shall apply to all works which at the moment of its coming into force have not yet fallen into the public domain in the country of origin through the expiration of the term of protection.

(2) If, however, through the expiration of the term of protection which was previously granted, a work has fallen into the public domain of the country where protection is claimed, that work shall not be protected anew in that country.

(3) The application of this principle shall take effect according to the stipulations contained in special Conventions existing, or to be concluded, to that effect between countries of the Union. In the absence of such stipulations, the respective countries shall regulate, each in so far as it is concerned, the manner in which the said principle is to be applied.

(4) The above provisions shall apply equally in case of new accessions to the Union, and also in the event of the term of protection being extended by the application of Article 7 or by abandonment of reservations.

ARTICLE 19.

The provisions of the present Convention shall not prevent a claim being made for the application of any wider provisions which may be made by the legislation of a country of the Union in favour of foreigners in general.

ARTICLE 20.

The Governments of the countries of the Union reserve to themselves the right to enter into special arrangements between each other, provided always that such arrangements confer upon authors more extended rights than those granted by the Union, or embody other stipulations not contrary to the present Convention. The provisions of existing arrangements which answer to the above-mentioned conditions shall remain applicable.

ARTICLE 21.

(1) The International Office established under the name of the "Office of the International Union for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works" shall be maintained.

(2) That Office is placed under the high authority of the Government of the Swiss Confederation, which regulates its organisation and supervises its working.

(3) The official language of the Office shall be French.

ARTICLE 22.

(1) The International Office collects every kind of information relative to the protection of the rights of authors over their literary and artistic works. It arranges and publishes such information. It undertakes the study of questions of general interest concerning the Union, and, by the aid of documents placed at its disposal by the different Administrations, edits a periodical publication in the French language on the questions which concern the objects of the Union. The Governments of the countries of the Union reserve to themselves the power to authorise by common accord the publication by the Office of an edition in one or more other languages, if experience should show this to be requisite.

(2) The International Office will always hold itself at the disposal of members of the Union with the view to furnish them with any special information which they may require relative to the protection of literary and artistic works.

(3) The Director of the International Office shall make an annual report on his administration, which shall be communicated to all the members of the Union.

ARTICLE 23.

(1) The expenses of the Office of the International Union shall be shared by the countries of the Union. Until a fresh arrangement be made, they cannot exceed the sum of 120,000 Swiss francs a year. This sum may be increased, if necessary, by the unanimous decision of one of the Conferences provided for in Article 24.

(2) The share of the total expense to be paid by each country shall be determined by the division of the countries of the Union and those subsequently acceding to the Union into six classes, each of which shall contribute in the proportion of a certain number of units, viz. :—

	Units.
1st class	25
2nd class	20
3rd class	15
4th class	10
5th class	5
6th class	3

(3) These coefficients are multiplied by the number of countries of each class, and the total product thus obtained gives the number of units by which the total expense is to be divided. The quotient gives the amount of the unit of expense.

(4) Each country shall declare, at the time of its accession, in which of the said classes it desires to be placed, but it may subsequently declare that it wishes to be placed in another class.

(5) The Swiss Administration prepares the Budget of the Office, superintends its expenditure, makes the necessary advances, and draws up the annual account which shall be communicated to all the other Administrations.

ARTICLE 24.

(1) The present Convention may be submitted to revisions in order to introduce therein amendments calculated to perfect the system of the Union.

(2) Questions of this kind, as well as those which are of interest to the Union in other respects, shall be considered in Conferences to be held successively in the countries of the Union by delegates of the said countries. The Administration of the country where a Conference is to meet prepares, with the assistance of the International Office, the programme of the Conference. The Director of the Office shall attend at the sittings of the Conferences, and shall take part in the discussions without the right to vote.

(3) No alteration in the present Convention shall be binding on the Union except by the unanimous consent of the countries composing it.

ARTICLE 25.

(1) Countries outside the Union which make provision for the legal protection of the rights forming the object of the present Convention may accede thereto on request to that effect.

(2) Such accession shall be notified in writing to the Government of the Swiss Confederation, who will communicate it to all the other countries of the Union.

(3) Such accession shall imply full adherence to all the clauses and admission to all the advantages provided by the present Convention, and shall take effect one month after the date of the notification made by the Government of the Swiss Confederation to the other countries of the Union, unless some later date has been indicated by the adhering country. It may, nevertheless, contain an indication that the adhering country wishes to substitute, provisionally at least, for Article 8, which relates to translations, the provisions of Article 5 of the Convention of 1886 revised at Paris in 1896, on the understanding that those provisions shall apply only to translations into the language or languages of that country.

ARTICLE 26.

(1) Any country of the Union may at any time notify in writing to the Government of the Swiss Confederation that the present Convention shall apply to all or any of its Colonies, Protectorates, territories under mandate or any other territories subject to its sovereignty or to its authority, or any territories under suzerainty, and the Convention shall thereupon apply to all the territories named in such notification. Failing such notification, the Convention shall not apply to any such territories.

(2) Any country of the Union may at any time notify in writing to the Government of the Swiss Confederation that the present Convention shall cease to apply to all or any of the territories which have been made the subject of a notification under the preceding paragraph, and the Convention shall cease to apply in the territories named in the notification given under this paragraph twelve months after the receipt of the latter notification by the Government of the Swiss Confederation.

(3) All notifications given to the Government of the Swiss Confederation in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of the present Article shall be communicated by that Government to all the countries of the Union.

ARTICLE 27.

(1) The present Convention shall replace, in regard to the relations between the countries of the Union, the Convention of Berne of the 9th September, 1886, and the subsequent revisions thereof. The instruments previously in force shall continue to be applicable in regard to relations with countries which do not ratify the present Convention.

(2) The countries on whose behalf the present Convention is signed may retain the benefit of the reservations which they have previously formulated on condition that they make a declaration to that effect at the time of the deposit of their ratifications.

(3) The countries which are actually members of the Union, but on whose behalf the present Convention is not signed may adhere to the Convention at any time. In that event they may enjoy the benefit of the provisions of the preceding paragraph.

ARTICLE 28.

(1) The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications deposited at Rome, not later than the 1st July, 1931.

(2) It shall come into force between the countries which have ratified it, one month after that date, nevertheless, if before that date, it has been ratified by at least six countries of the Union, it shall come into force between those countries one month after the deposit of the sixth ratification has been notified to them by the Government of the Swiss Confederation and, in the case of countries which ratify thereafter, one month after the notification of each of such ratifications.

(3) Until the 1st August, 1931, countries outside the Union may accede to the Union by adhering either to the Convention signed at Berlin on the 13th November, 1908, or to the present Convention. On or after the 1st August, 1931, they may adhere only to the present Convention.

ARTICLE 29.

(1) The present Convention shall remain in force for an indefinite period until the termination of a year from the day on which it may have been denounced.

(2) Such denunciation shall be made to the Government of the Swiss Confederation. It shall only take effect in regard to the country making it, the Convention remaining in full force and effect for the other countries of the Union.

ARTICLE 30.

(1) The countries which shall introduce in their legislation the duration of protection for fifty years contemplated by Article 7, paragraph (1), of the present Convention, shall give notice thereof in writing to the Government of the Swiss Confederation, who will communicate it at once to all the other countries of the Union.

(2) The same procedure shall be followed in the case of the countries renouncing the reservations made or maintained by them in virtue of Articles 25 and 27.

In faith whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention.

Done at Rome, the 2nd day of June, 1928, in a single copy, which shall be deposited in the archives of the Royal Italian Government. A copy, duly certified, shall be transmitted by the diplomatic channel to each country of the Union.

20A. The Director shall decide whether a school be organized as a single or a double school. For purposes of this clause, a double school is one in which all the pupils attending the school are taught by the same staff in two divisions. The normal period of work for each division shall be three hours. The Manager, in consultation with the Inspector, shall decide in what manner the school will be divided and in what respects the ordinary curriculum requires modification.

Clause 26A.—After clause 26 insert a new clause as follows:—

For the units of average attendance over 80 units, one teacher will be allowed for every 25 units of attendance for the first 100 units, and one teacher for every 30 units of the remainder.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

4. The vacancy must be filled by the appointment of a teacher who is already employed by the Manager in a school where the number of teachers eligible for grant is still governed by clause 31 and who has been eligible for grant in the past school year. Only when a suitable teacher is not available will the appointment of a teacher not already employed by the Manager be approved for purposes of grant. All private schools in a division will be regarded for purposes of this clause as being under one management.

Clause 39.—Add a note as follows:—

Note: The word "nineteenth" in clause 39 (a) may at the end of the first school year after this rule comes into force be altered to "eighteenth".

Salary Scales.—Add a note to the Salary Scales as follows:—

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

In a Bilingual Non-boarding school one extra teacher may be allowed. In a Bilingual Boarding school two extra teachers may be allowed.

3. The vacancy must be filled by the appointment of a teacher who is already employed by the Manager in a school where the number of teachers eligible for grant is still governed by clauses 37-39 and who has been eligible for grant in the past school year. Only when a suitable teacher is not available will the appointment of a teacher not already employed by the Manager be approved for purposes of grant. All private schools in a division will be regarded for purposes of this clause as being under one management.

Clause 53.—Add a note as follows :—

Note: The word "eighteenth" in clause 53 (a) may at the end of the first school year after this rule comes into force be altered to "seventeenth".

Clause 53 (g).—Delete.

Clause 60 (a).—Add a new paragraph as follows :—

Students who have not passed the Teachers Certificate examination and are admitted to Training Schools in and after 1935 will be ineligible for grant.

REGULATIONS.

Section 9 E (2) (i).

Wells.

1. No person shall sink a well or cause a well to be sunk within the limits of any Sanitary Board town, unless he shall have obtained a permit from the Chairman to sink such well or cause it to be sunk.

2. No well shall be sunk less than 50 feet from any existing cesspit, cesspool, pigsty, gala, cattle shed, manure heap, leaking drain, neglected privy, heap of decaying vegetable or animal matter, or any manured land.

3. No cesspit, cesspool, privy, pigsty, gala, or cattle shed shall be constructed within a distance of 50 feet from any well used for drinking or domestic purposes; nor shall any manure or decaying animal or vegetable matter be deposited, nor any land be cultivated with manure, nor any drain suffered to remain in a leaking condition within such distance.

4. All wells shall be lined as far as water level either with bricks set in cement with a backing of puddled clay or with cylinders of iron, cement, or clay, or shall be otherwise so constructed as to prevent the entrance of water except from the bottom.

5. A platform upon which to stand and draw water may be constructed over the top of a portion of the mouth of the well. This platform shall be so constructed as to be absolutely watertight, so that no water therefrom can trickle back into the well, but may flow on to the apron or pavement referred to in rule 6. The said platform shall have a slope downwards from the centre of the mouth of the well outwards so as to throw off water, and a watertight edge at least 6 inches high along its inner edge connected at both ends with the parapet wall. The remainder of the well mouth shall be surrounded by a parapet wall at least 2 feet 6 inches high.

6. The well shall be surrounded for a distance of 5 feet by a cement apron or pavement of stone or brick set in cement sloping away from the well.

7. The outer edge of such apron or pavement shall be surrounded by a cement gutter emptying into a leadaway drain not less than 10 feet long, so as to prevent the stagnation of water in the vicinity of the well.

8. No planks shall be placed across the mouth of the well to stand on when drawing water or for any other purposes.

9. Water from wells shall be drawn only in clean receptacles.

10. No one shall wash clothes within 20 feet of the mouth of a well used for drinking or domestic purposes.

11. Every owner or lessee of a well used as a public bathing place shall supply bathing tubs, and shall not allow persons who bathe to draw water, and no person shall draw water from such well while bathing.

12. Whenever any tree or branch of any tree overhangs a well and is deemed after inspection by the Chairman or any Sanitary Officer of the Board to be injurious to the water owing to the dropping of leaves or fruit into the water or by otherwise rendering the water unfit for use, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Sanitary Board to cause notice in writing to be given to the owner, lessee, or occupier of the ground on which such tree stands to cut down or remove such tree or branch, and if such notice is not complied with within 14 days, such person shall be guilty of an offence.

13. The Chairman may, whenever he deems such a course to be necessary, cause notice to be given in writing to the owner or lessee or occupant of any compound in which there is a well used for drinking or domestic purposes to bale out the water and clean the well and execute such repairs as the Chairman may consider to be necessary, and if such notice is not complied with within 14 days, such person shall be guilty of an offence.

14. Whenever it shall be decided by a resolution of the Sanitary Board that such a course is expedient in the interests of health, the Chairman may give notice in writing to the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land to fill up or disinfect any well on such land, and the owner, lessee, or occupier shall thereupon be bound to comply with such order within 8 days of the service of such notice. Any owner, lessee, or occupier so served with notice, failing within such time to comply with such order, shall be guilty of an offence.

15. It shall be lawful for the supervisor or Inspector of the Board or other person empowered in writing by the Chairman of the Board to inspect wells, or enter upon any land or premises for the purposes of inspecting proposed sites for wells or existing wells and their surroundings.

(2) No trees are to be felled at more than 6 inches from the ground. All felled or fallen trees whatsoever in the said area shall be split and converted into pieces of 3 feet in length and of 9 inches minimum girth; all wood over 12 inches in girth must be billeted either by hand-saw or cross-cut-saw. Billets over 2 feet in girth shall be split. Should the contractor fail to observe the conditions of this clause and leave unconverted logs lying about the area the Divisional Forest Officer, Central Division, Nuwara Eliya, shall in consultation with the Assistant Development Officer, Haputale, assess the amount of firewood so neglected and the royalty value of it shall be deducted from the contractor's security.

(3) The contractor shall cut and stack firewood ready for delivery at the Railway Line at the minimum rate of 1,250 cubic yards per month commencing from October 1, 1932. He shall complete these deliveries on or before July 15, 1933, provided always that the Divisional Forest Officer, Central Division, Nuwara Eliya, may, after 3 weeks' notice in writing, reduce the monthly quota to 500 cubic yards, and give a corresponding extension of time for completion of delivery. For each day after this date he shall delay to hand over the area or such portion of it as was felled by July 15, he shall forfeit the sum of Re. 1 per acre which sum shall be deducted from his security.

(8) The contractor shall supply 15 posts 10 feet long and 6 inches in diameter at the larger end for each chain length of boundary of the said area (approximately 84 chains), as and when required by the Assistant Development Officer, Haputale.

(9) The contractor shall refrain from felling any areas which the Assistant Development Officer, Haputale, may consider necessary to be left for stream reservations.

(27) To recommend under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 131·21 to Mariamma, B. T. 2,480 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on her service of 121 months and her average monthly pay of Rs. 19·52. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 14 months in all due to illness and they can be condoned under the Second Proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council leave By-laws which runs as follows:—

"It shall, however, be competent for the Council with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 768.—Recommended.

(28) To recommend under Rule 2B (1) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 2,880 to the widow of the late Mr. P. O'Connell, Conservancy Supervisor of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who died on April 25, 1932, after a service of 23 years. Registered No. 804.—Recommended.

(29) To recommend under Rule 2B (1) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 4,080 to the widow of the late Mr. E. F. Daniel, Prosecuting Surveyor, Municipal Engineer's Department, who died on April 11, 1932, after a service of 23 years. Registered No. 807.—Recommended.

(30) To recommend under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 1,200·96 to Mr. J. S. Silva, Conservancy Overseer, Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 247 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 87·52. Registered No. 808.—Recommended.

Application for an Advance.

(31) To consider:—(a) An application from W. D. Boteju, Bicycle Orderly, Public Health Department, for an advance of Rs. 93 to enable him to purchase a bicycle for official duties. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Treasurer that the advance be granted on the usual terms, viz., that the amount be repaid in twelve monthly instalments and that 5 per cent. per annum be charged as interest on the balances outstanding from time to time. Registered No. 809.—Recommended.

Write off of Arrears of Rates.

(32) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated May 13, 1932, recommending that arrears of rates, amounting to Rs. 175·14 be written off. (19 cases, all on ground of poverty). Registered No. 785.—Recommended.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved, as an amendment that photographs be required only in the case of milkers. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.—Lost.

The motion of the Chairman was put to the meeting and carried.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, and Mr. M. L. M. Reyal dissented.

Resolution of Council of May 4, 1932.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred to the next meeting. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam wished to record his objection to the recommendation of the Standing Committees. The recommendation of the Standing Committees was put to the meeting and carried.

Registered No. 161.—Recommended that the Council should admit no liability at present. If and when Mr. J. A. Perera's clients sue Mr. Abdul Cader's client in ejectment and the Council is called upon to warrant and defend title, then the Council should offer to pay the purchase money (Rs. 53,100) and the cost of the transfer to Mr. Abdul Cader's client.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted subject to the deletion of the words "offer : . . . Mr. Abdul Cader's client" and the substitution therefor of the following words "re-consider its position."

The amended recommendation to read as follows :—That the Council should admit no liability at present. If and when Mr. J. A. Perera's clients sue Mr. Abdul Cader's client in ejectment and the Council is called upon to warrant and defend title, then the Council should re-consider its position." Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader and Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke to the recommendation.

Mr. F. J. Soertsz gave the reasons on which the recommendation of the Committees had been based, but approved of the motion. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

(6) To consider a letter dated April 25, 1932, from the Chairman, Municipal Education District Committee, requesting that a sum of Rs. 650 be granted this year towards the cost of the treat on King's Birthday to the poor children attending the Government Free Schools in Colombo. FIRE BRIGADE.

Applications should be forwarded so as to reach the Secretary on or before June 15, 1932.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. H. L. Grocock seconded.—Carried.

BY-LAWS made by Chairman, Sanitary Board, Nuwara Eliya District, under the provisions of section 5 of the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, for all the Sanitary Board towns in the Nuwara Eliya District.

The Sanitary Board towns in the Nuwara Eliya District have been brought under the operation of the said Ordinance by Proclamation dated April 14, 1902, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,845 of April 18, 1902.

BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of any Sanitary Board town of the Nuwara Eliya District, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Rs. 1.50. For the purpose of of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the Collector) particulars required in the annexed Form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid Collector.

4. The Collector may (1) refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs or (b) which by reason of age, illness or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Sanitary Board, who may confirm, modify or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board—

(a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or (b) should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or (c) should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Sanitary Inspector's Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an Officer of the Sanitary Board authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

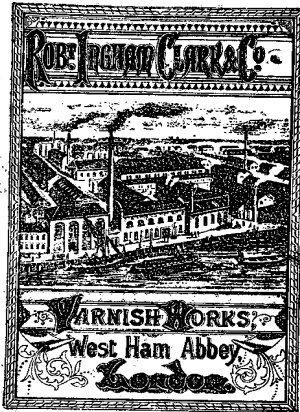

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 16, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 151 (12 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 27.2, as against 27.9 in the preceding week, 27.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 124 (6 Burghers, 70 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 21 Moors, and 8 Malays). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.4, as against 23.8 in the previous week, 27.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 124 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 15 in Maradana hospitals (including 10 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, as against 17 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island as against 8 in the previous week, and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana North and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the preceding week was also 2 and the weekly average for last year was 5.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* (of non-residents) were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Seven deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 from *Debility*, 4 from *Worms*, 3 each from *Dysentery* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Infantile Convulsions*, *Suicide* and *Homicide*, and 55 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Eighteen cases of *Chicken-pox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 each of *Measles* and *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 24, 4, 2, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

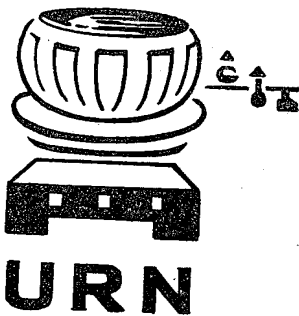
State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.8°, against 80.6° in the preceding week and 80.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.853 in., against 29.791 in. in the preceding week and 29.872 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.51 in., against 0.33 in. in the preceding week and 3.43 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
