KNOW Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby amend, under section 31. of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," with effect from the first day of January, 1933, the schedule to the Proclamation under the said section dated November 20, 1914, published in *Gazette* No. 6,687 of December 11, 1914, by substituting for the definition therein appearing and reproduced in column I. of the schedule hereto, the definition appearing in column II. of the schedule hereto.

Southern Province.—Galle District.

Ambalangoda Town.

## Column I.

Limits.—North by the Hujanagala and the limit of Randoomba village; east by rail road; south by Madampe lake; and west by the sea.

## Column II.

Watugedara-Wilegoda road; thence along this road eastwards and thence southwards as far as the south-eastern corner of lot n588 in preliminary plan No. 8,176; thence a line drawn south-eastward to the north-western corner of lot a130 in preliminary plan No. 483, and along the northern boundary of this lot, western and northern boundaries of b130, northern boundary of s 129, and northern boundary of r129 in preliminary plan No. 483 as far as the north-eastern corner.

East: From the last-mentioned point and along the eastern boundary of lot r129 in preliminary plan No. 483, western edge of the Goda-ela, western boundary of lot n128, northern boundary of m128; northern and western boundaries of l128, western boundaries of k123 and d128, northern boundary of c128, eastern boundary of b127, northern and eastern boundaries of c127, northern boundary of r127, northern and eastern boundaries of u127, eastern boundaries of w127 and r127, southern and western boundaries of q127, western boundaries of s 127 and r127, southern boundary of c127, eastern and northern boundaries of d127, eastern, northern, and western boundaries of y126, western boundaries of d127 and e127, western and southern boundaries of i 127 in preliminary plan No. 483; and thence along the Hin-ela as far as the south-western corner of lot n127 in preliminary plan No. 483; from this corner a line drawn south-westward to the north-eastern corner of title plan No. 74,983, thence a line drawn north-eastward to the north-western corner of title plan No. 264,063, along the northern boundary of this title plan eastward to the Madampe lake, thence along the edge of the Madampe lake southwards to a point 12 chains south of the landmark at the south-eastern corner of title plan No. 276,529.

West: The sea.

## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in the urban area of Kalmunai, in Karavaku pattu, Batticaloa District, Eastern Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead of the Hindu and Buddhist communities within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may, under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, exempt any cemetery either wholly or in part from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule "A" hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead of the Hindu and Buddhist communities within the limits specified and defined in Schedule "B" hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

## BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

Chapter XII. of the by-laws dated December 18, 1906, published in the *Gazette* of January 11, 1907, as amended by Proclamation in *Gazette* of August 22, 1924, is hereby amended by the insertion of the following as by-law No. 157 :—

By-law No. 157.—Whenever the Chairman is satisfied that water supplied to any house or premises from the Municipal Waterworks is unduly used or wasted, it shall be lawful for him to have a meter fixed to the pipe connecting such house or premises to the main ; and the owner or occupier shall pay one rupee for every thousand gallons shown by the meter to have been used or wasted during any one quarter, in excess of such permitted quantity as may be ascertained on the basis of 2,000 gallons for each rupee of the quarterly water rate due and payable in respect of the said house or premises.

The Chairman's decision as to the necessity for enforcing the foregoing regulation shall be final and conclusive.

No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, nor will forms of tender be issued to any person to whom the Provincial Engineer, Eastern Province, Batticaloa, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

14. ## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 13, 1932.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 167 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 24 Moors, 8 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 30.1, as against 26.9 in the preceding week, 30.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 141 (7 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 25 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.4, as against 25.8 in the previous week, 26.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 141 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Maradana South, and 1 in Wellawatta North, as against 22 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Sixteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in Slave Island, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 12 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 13 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents) and 1 in Maradana North, as against 7 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Thirteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 each from *Worms* and *Debility*, 3 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Tetanus*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Dysentery*, *Homicide*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 48 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Twenty-four cases of *Chickenpox*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, 1 each of *Measles* and *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 20, 3, 3, and 3 respectively of the preceding week.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 81.1°, against 81.5° in the preceding week and 80.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.832 in., against 29.858 in., in the preceding week and 29.862 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.20 in., against 1.26 in. in the preceding week and 1.43 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

#### General Meeting.

*Wednesday, July 6, 1932, at 3 p.m.*

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated June 29, 1932.

*Present* :—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Dr. E. A. Coorey, Mr. G. W. Dodds, Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. J. S. Collett; Mr. F. J. Soertsz; Lieut-Colonel N. W. Napier-Clavering, D.S.O., R.E.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. Aelian W. Pereira; Mr. H. L. Grocock; Mr. H. J. Hutchings; and Dr. S. T. Gunasekera.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 1, 1932, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 1, 1932, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from M. G. Cornelis Appuhamy of No. 250, Dematagoda, regarding a plot of Municipal Council land, adjoining the Maligakanda Pumping Station, which was leased out to him on a rental of Rs. 5 per mensem in August, 1923. He had improved and erected two buildings at a cost of Rs. 1,800. He was given notice to quit and the premises were sold by the Council at a public auction for Rs. 4,200. The petitioner prays that he may be paid back the amount Rs. 1,800 he spent for the improvement of the land. Mr. Goonesinha asked that the petition be referred to the appropriate Committee.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from the tenants of Garden No. 232, Temple road, Second Division, Maradana, belonging to the Council, praying for the reduction of rents, and asked that it be referred to the appropriate Committee.

4. Mr. A. R. A. Razik had given notice that he would present a petition from the licensed firewood depôt keepers praying that they be protected from the heavy loss they sustain in their trade, especially during this depressed time, by unlicensed hawkers carrying on this trade from house to house in double and single bullock carts with false weights and scales. In the absence of Mr. Razik, the petition was presented, on his behalf, by Dr. E. A. Coorey who asked that it be referred to the appropriate Committee.

5. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do record its deep regret at the death of Dr. Wm. Marshall Philip, M.B., C.M., D.P.H., C.B.E., who, as Medical Officer of Health of the Colombo Municipality from 1902, until his retirement in 1927, rendered at all times unsparringly of himself services of the highest value to the City.

The Chairman said that he felt that it was quite unnecessary for him to remind the Members of this Council of the deep debt of gratitude which the City owes to the late Dr. Marshall Philip for the eminent services rendered to it by him in the cause of public health and sanitation—services rendered with an unflinching devotion to duty and an enthusiasm which enabled him to transcend all obstacles in the attainment of the ideal which he set before him. He will be remembered not only for his lifework—the creation of the Municipal Department of Public Health—the department which he not only created and inspired, but raised to a very high level of efficiency; he would be remembered not only for that work, but also by all who came in contact with him—whether as an official or in his private capacity—for his singularly attractive nature and kindly unassuming disposition. His death will be deplored by none more than by his former colleagues and subordinates in the Municipal Service.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded and endorsed all that the Chairman had said.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam bore testimony to the valuable services rendered by the late Dr. Wm. Marshall Philip.

The motion was put to the Meeting and *carried in silence all present standing.*

6. With the permission of Council, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved the following motion which had been signed by five members as follows :—N. H. M. Abdul Cader, E. V. Ratnam, C. H. Z. Fernando, M. L. M. Reyal, and S. Muttiah, in addition to the signature of the mover, A. E. Goonesinha, according to the provisions of section 10 (e) of Chapter II. of the By-laws :—

“That in view of the fact that the decision of this Council to charge a water rate from Boarding Establishments entails a charge even on children in Boarding Schools of 50 cents per head and that the levy is calculated to work great hardship, especially in this time of depression and consequent distress, action to enforce this charge be suspended and the matter be referred back to the Committees concerned for reconsideration.” Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, which had been signed by five members, in addition to the signature of the mover, according to the provisions of section 10 (e) of Chapter II. of the By-laws, the following motion stood on the agenda.—That the salary of the post of Superintendent of Fire Brigade be fixed at Rs. 6,000 by Rs. 300 to Rs. 10,800 a year :—N. H. M. Abdul Cader, E. V. Ratnam, C. H. Z. Fernando, M. L. M. Reyal, F. Dadabhoy, H. L. Grocock. Mr. F. Dadabhoy moved the motion. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

8. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda, viz. :—Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

*Council in Committee—*

*The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding Relief to Ratepayers of June 14, 1932, was considered.*

(2) To consider the resolution of Council on May 4, 1932, on the following motion of Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.M.C. :—*Motion*.—“That in view of the complaints made against the assessment and valuation of properties by the Municipal Assessor, a Committee of this Council be appointed to investigate and report on the working of the Assessor’s Department.”

*Resolution*.—That the complaints referred to be submitted for investigation and report to the Special Committee regarding Relief to Ratepayers, and that Mr. A. E. Goonesinha be invited to attend the Meetings of this Committee.—Recommended that a Staff Officer from another Department, to be selected by the Chairman, should be temporarily attached to the Assessor’s Department for a period of three months, subject to extension if the Chairman considers it necessary, to assist in disposing of objections.

(approximately Rs. 33.23) which the London Agents have already confirmed. Registered No. 941.—Recommended.

(10) To consider a plan and a detailed estimate of Rs. 2,000 from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for extension of Hubert place to meet St. John's Way and for levelling up of ground and cost of plant for a small playground. *Note.*—Council's sanction may be obtained for a supplemental vote of Rs. 2,000 against a new head of expenditure. There were savings on Vote I. 80/1930, "Rajamalwatte North road construction." Registered No. 826.—Recommended and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 2,000 be approved.

(11) To consider a detailed estimate of Rs. 2,500 from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for the raising of the floor of the Cement Store at Suduwella two feet above present floor level to prevent damage to cement stored. *Note.*—Supplemental provision of Rs. 2,500 is required. There will be savings on estimate I.-54 at the end of the year and this amount at least will be covered. Registered No. 973.—Recommended and that supplemental provision of Rs. 875 be sanctioned.

The motion of the Chairman was put to the meeting and carried.

The Chairman declared Dr. S. T. Gunasekera duly elected.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that Dr. S. T. Gunasekera be appointed. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried.

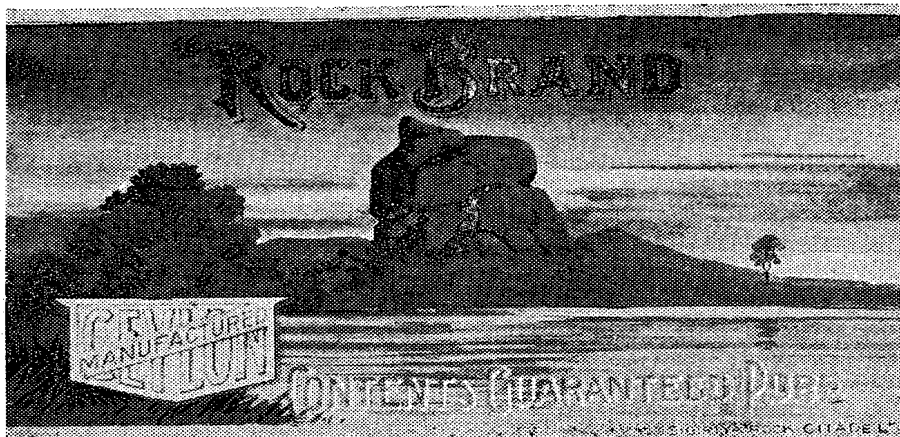

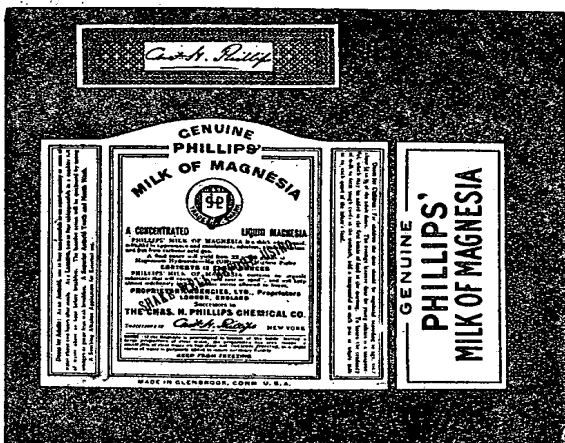

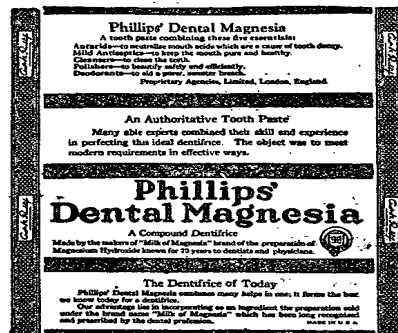
