KNOW Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby amend, under section 31 of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," with effect from the First day January, 1933, the schedule to the Proclamation under the said section dated June 24, 1899, published in *Gazette* No. 5,629 of July 1, 1899, as amended by Proclamation dated January 18, 1923, in *Gazette* No. 7,306 of January 26, 1923, by substituting for the definition therein appearing and reproduced in column I. of the schedule hereto, the definition appearing in column II. of the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Central Province—Kandy District.

Nawalapitiya Town.

Column I.

Limits as defined by Proclamation dated
January 18, 1923.

North, along the landmarked boundary in an easterly direction, starting from the landmark on the common limit between the Warakawa and Kahamana villages to the Galpeela-ela, along the said ela till it meets the western boundary of the Dolosbage road, thence along the said boundary in a northerly direction to a point $\frac{1}{2}$ a chain south of the 1st milepost on the Dolosbage road, and thence from the said point in a straight line eastwards crossing the Dolosbage road to the landmark on the eastern boundary of the said road, and thence along the landmarked boundary in a south-easterly direction to the landmark at a distance 11 chains from the landmark on the eastern boundary of the Dolosbage road, thence along the landmarked boundary in a northerly direction till it meets the Galpeela-ela and along the Galpeela-ela to the culvert on the western boundary of the railway line, thence along the said boundary to the culvert on the Galpeela-ela $\frac{1}{2}$ a chain and 10 links to the north of the $\frac{1}{4}$ milepost on the western boundary of the railway line, and thence along the Galpeela-ela till it meets the Mahaweli-ganga and to the centre of it; east, along the centre of the Mahaweli-ganga; south, along the centre of the Mahaweli-ganga to a point 2 chains west from the centre of the railway bridge; west from the western extremity of the southern boundary a line drawn northwards to meet the boundary defined with rail posts, and along the said boundary till it meets the ela, and along the ela to the landmarked boundary, and along the said boundary to Gansabhawa path, and along the Gansabhawa path 30 links towards north to the landmarked boundary and thence along the landmarked boundary to the 24th milestone on the Ambagamuwa road, thence along the landmarked boundary in a northerly direction to the landmark at a distance 31 chains and 20 links from the milestone on the Ambagamuwa road, and from the said landmark along the landmarked boundary in a north-easterly direction as far as the Tawalan road, and along the Tawalan road running northwards to Dolosbage till it meets the landmarked boundary, thence along the landmarked boundary in an easterly direction crossing the Peritumulla-oya till it meets the Gansabhawa path, and thence along the landmarked boundary in a north-easterly direction to the Nawalapitiya trigonometrical station, and thence along the landmarked boundary till it meets the northern boundary.

Column II.

Limits as defined by this Proclamation.

North.—From the junction of Dolosbage road and the Shamrock estate road otherwise called Lunuwane-gala road eastwards along the northern side of the Gansabhawa road to the second railway gate on the Hatton-Gampola road and across the said road and thence in a straight line to a point in the centre of the Mahaweli-ganga 132 yards south-east of the said railway gate.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of the Mahaweli-ganga to a point 60 yards north of the bridge on the Gampola-Kotmale road, thence eastwards in a straight line to a point 207 yards north of the Kotmale-Hyndford road junction, thence southwards through the said road junction to a point 92 yards south of the said junction, thence westwards for a distance of 57 yards, thence southwards to a point 175 yards south-east of the bridge over the Mahaweli-ganga on the Gampola-Kotmale road, thence due west to a point in the centre of Mahaweli-ganga 182 yards south of the said bridge.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of the Mahaweli-ganga across the railway bridge to a point 44 yards west of it.

West.—From the western extremity of the southern boundary a line drawn northwards to meet the river bank and from thence a line to meet the boundary defined with rail posts and along the said boundary till it meets the ela, and along the ela to the landmarked boundary and along the said landmarked boundary to the Gansabhawa path and along the northern side of the Gansabhawa path for 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards and from thence northwards to the landmarked boundary, thence along the said landmarked boundary to the 24th milestone on the Ambagamuwa road and thence crossing the said road along the landmarked boundary in a northerly direction to the landmark at a distance of 686 yards from the 24th milestone on the Ambagamuwa road, and from the said landmark along the said landmarked boundary in a north-easterly direction as far as the Tawalan road, and from thence along the northern side of the Tawalan road running northwards to Dolosbage till it meets the starting point of the northern boundary.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 24, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 196 (18 Burghers, 120 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 35.3, as against 31.0 in the preceding week, 32.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 122 (4 Burghers, 71 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 19 Moors, and 4 Malays). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.0, as against 20.6 in the previous week, 28.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 122 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as against 20 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 14 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St Paul's, Maradana North, and Slave Island, and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 12 in the previous week, and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana East, and Wellawatta South, as against 2 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Five deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, as against 15 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Maradana East and Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. (a) Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), and Slave Island, as against nil in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Plague*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Ten deaths from *Debility* were registered, 6 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Accidents*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Homicide*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Worms*, and *Tetanus*, and 49 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-two cases of *Chickenpox*, 20 of *Measles*, 7 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Plague*, and 1 each of *Diphtheria* and *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 31, 7, 4, 2, 1, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.1°, against 81.3° in the preceding week and 80.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.880 n., against 29.895 in. in the preceding week and 29.861 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.93 in., against 0.99 in. in the preceding week and 0.42 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
