Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 10 of 1932.

An Ordinance to amend The Supervision of Aliens Ordinance, No. 14 of 1917.

GRAEME THOMSON.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Supervision of Aliens Amendment Ordinance, 1932.

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

- 2 Section 3 of The Supervision of Aliens Ordinance, No. 14 of 1917, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is amended as follows:—
 - (a) By inserting in line 8 between the word "previously" and the word "and" the words "or unless he has in his possession documents proving that he is employed by a missionary society which is for the time being approved for work in the colonies by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies".
 - (b) By substituting in lines 11 and 12 for the words "that he is the person referred to in the permit" the words "or any police officer not below the rank of a sergeant that the said permit or documents are authentic and that he is the person referred to therein".

Amendment of section 8 of the principal Ordinance. 3 Section 8 of the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting in line 9 between the word "permit" and the word "mentioned" the words "or documents".

No. 11 of 1932.

An Ordinance to repeal the enactments relating to the tax commonly known as the Poll Tax.

GRAEME THOMSON.

Preamble.

W HEREAS the annual tax payable in labour, or by commutation in money, commonly known as the Poll Tax, Road Tax, or Commutation Tax, has ceased to be levied in the Island after the year 1926:

And whereas the various enactments relating to the imposition and the levy of the said tax are no longer necessary but have not heretofore been expressly repealed:

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Poll Tax Abolition Ordinance, 1932.

- 2 The several Ordinances enumerated in the first and second columns of the schedule hereto are hereby repealed to the extent specified in the third column of that schedule; and such repeals shall for all purposes be deemed to have been made on the 1st day of January, 1927.
- 3 Every Provincial Committee, and every District Committee, established under the provisions of the Road Ordinance, 1861, is hereby indemnified from and against any liability or other legal consequences whatsoever that may have arisen prior to the commencement of this Ordinance, by reason of any such Committee having failed to perform any duty or obligation cast on it by the Road Ordinance, 1861, and any rules made thereunder and by the Road Ordinance, 1861, Amendment Ordinance, 1884.

No. 12 of 1932.

An Ordinance to amend "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910".

GRAEME THOMSON.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:-

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, 1932.

Amendment of section 23 of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 23 of The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is amended in line 1 by substituting for the word "twenty" the word "ten".

Amendment of section 45 of the principal Ordinance. 3 Section 45 of the principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end of sub-section (1) (k) the words "and establishing and maintaining public libraries within the Municipality".

Amendment of section 110 of the principal Ordinance.

- 4 Section 110 of the principal Ordinance is amended as follows:—
 - (A) By adding at the end of sub-section (5) the following:-

"(g) The regulation and control of swine.

- (h) The prevention of malaria and the destruction of mosquitoes and other disease bearing insects.
- (i) The licensing, regulation, inspection and control of stables and cattle galas."
- (B) By adding at the end the following:—
- "(21) The regulation and control of advertisements displayed or exhibited so as to be visible from any street, road, canal or lake, and the charging of fees for the same.
- (22) The establishment, maintenance, working and supply, and the recovery of charges in connection therewith of the following:—

(a) Water supply.

(b) The lighting of streets, public places, and public buildings.

(c) The supply of electric light or power.

(d) Markets.

(e) Public baths and bathing places.

- (f) Any other form of public service which the Council is authorized to establish, maintain, or provide under any other provision of this Ordinance or under any by-laws to be made thereunder.
- (g) Any other form of public service which the Council may be specially authorized to establish, maintain, or provide for by the Executive Committee of Local Administration."

Amendment of section 120 of the principal Ordinance.

5 Section 120 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "and shall be liable on conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees" in lines 21 and 22 the words "and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees".

Insertion of new section 124A in the principal Ordinance.

6 Between section 124 and 125 of the principal Ordinance the following new section 124A is inserted:—

Revision of assessment on alteration of property affecting annual value. "124A Where physical alterations affecting the annual value of any house, building, land, or tenement are made after the assessment in respect of them for any year has become final by virtue of the preceding sections the Council may notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the said sections at any time prepare a new assessment for such premises which shall come into force from the first day of the month following that in which it is entered in the assessment book, provided always that such new assessments shall as far as possible be made in the manner prescribed by the said sections and be subject to the objections, investigations, actions, and appeals referred to therein".

7 Section 156 of the principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end the words "or from allowing the putting or from allowing the putting temporarily of sunshades and any other projections

8 Immediately after section 187 of the principal Ordsnance the following new section 187A is inserted:-

Insertion of new section 1874 in the principal Ordinance.

"187A (1) It shall be lawful for the Council to name or rename any street and to paint up or otherwise mark the name of any street and the number of any house or tenement on any private property and any person who without the authority of the Council removes or alters any such name or number shall be guilty of an offence.

Power to paint names of streets and houses on private property.

(2) For the purposes of this section and of section 45 (1) (e) the word "street" shall include any road, footway or passage used or intended to be used as a means of access to two or more houses or sites of houses whether the public have a right of way thereover or not and any side-walk and reservation at the side thereof."

 (b) In paragraph (g) by substituting for the letter "g" at

 - (c) Between paragraph (f) and paragraph (j) by inserting the following new paragraphs (g), (h) and (i):—

 "(g) the terms and conditions on which a cash certificate
 - may be purchased, transferred or surrendered by minors and trustees;
 - (h) the terms and conditions on which cash certificates purchased or obtained in Ceylon may be surrendered in the United Kingdom;
 - (i) the terms and conditions on which cash certificates may be tendered as security; and ".

An Ordinance to make Supplementary Provision for the Public and Colombo Electricity Supply Services for the Financial Year 1930-31.

E it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (1930-31) Ordinance, No. 17 of 1932.

Appropriation of Rs. 72,823 · 83 from revenue of the Island for financial year ending September 30, 1931.

- 2 In addition to the sum appropriated by the Appropriation Ordinance of 1930, the several sums appearing in Schedule I hereto and amounting in the aggregate to the sum of seventy-two thousand eight hundred and twenty-three rupees and eighty-three cents are hereby declared payable out of the revenue of this Island for the service of the financial year beginning on October 1, 1930, and ending on September 30, 1931, in respect of the several services mentioned in the said Schedule.
- 3 In addition to the sum appropriated by the Appropriation Ordinance of 1930, the several sums appearing in Schedule II hereto and amounting in the aggregate to the sum of thirty-three thousand five hundred and twelve rupees and one cent are hereby declared payable out of the revenue of the Colombo Electricity Supply for the service of the financial year beginning on October 1, 1930, and ending on September 30, 1931, in respect of the several services mentioned in the said Schedule.

An Ordinance to amend The Stamp Ordinance, 1909.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as The Stamp (Amendment) Ordinance, 1932, and shall come into force on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Gazette.

Short title and commencement.

- ${\bf 2}$ Schedule B of The Stamp Ordinance 1909 is amended as follows :—
 - (a) Part I is amended in item 15 by adding the words "Bail bonds in criminal proceedings" at the end of the portion thereof headed "Exemptions from the preceding and all other Stamp Duties" which occurs between sub-item 15 (i) and sub-item 15 (j).
 - occurs between sub-item 10 (i) and sub-item 15 (j).

 (b) Part III is amended in column 1 (i) by inserting the words "order absolute" at the end of line 6 between the words "order nisi" and the words "interlocutory order" therein and (ii) by adding the words "Bond—in the case of estates exceeding Rs. 5,000 in value: duty ad valorem as on a mortgage bond under Part I. In all other cases: free "at the end of the column.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:

An Ordinance to amend the Income Tax Ordinance, 1932.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:-

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Income Tax Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1932.

2 Section 7 (1) of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1932, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is hereby amended by the substitution of a comma for the colon immediately after the figures "1921" in the third line of paragraph (n) thereof and by the addition of the following words at the end of the said paragraph:

"provided that the majority of the members of any such society are resident in Ceylon and provided that in a case where a co-operative society is a member of another co-operative society so registered each of the members of the former society shall be deemed individually to be and shall be reckoned as a member of the latter society for the purpose of ascertaining whether a majority of the members of the latter society are resident in Ceylon:"

3 Section 20 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the repeal of sub-section (2) thereof and by the substitution of the following sub-section therefor:

"(2) Where for any year of assessment no tax is chargeable under sub-section (1) in respect of the income of an individual resident in Ceylon, or where for any year of assessment the tax chargeable under that sub-section upon the taxable income of an individual resident in Ceylon amounts to less than one per cent. of his assessable income, tax shall be charged for such year of assessment in respect of the income of either such individual at the rate of one per cent. upon his assessable income for that year: provided that tax charged under this sub-section shall be in lieu of and not in addition to the tax, if any, chargeable under sub-section (1)?

4 Section 27 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution of the word "executor" for the word "execution" in the seventh line thereof.

5 Section 30 (4) of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended-

(1) by the insertion of the following words between the word "excess" and the word "not" in the sixth

"or the total amount of such excesses where expenditure has been so incurred by any such person on more immature areas than one,";

(2) By the insertion of the words "in any case" between the word "exceeding" and the word "fifteen" in the sixth line thereof; and

(3) by the insertion of a comma between the word "period" and the word "shall" in the eighth line thereof.

6 The provisions of this Ordinance shall have effect as from the 9th day of February, 1932, notwithstanding anything in any written law to the contrary.

Objects and Reasons.

1. Clause 2. There are certain co-operative societies which derive substantial incomes from Ceylon though they are "non-resident" within the meaning of section 2 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1932. It appears to be equitable that the incomes of such co-operative societies should be transfer in the ordinary way and the chiest of this amendment. taxed in the ordinary way and the object of this amendment of section 7 is to exclude such societies from the category of those entitled to claim exemption from income tax and to prevent such societies from qualifying themselves for such exemption by seeking registration locally under the Co-operative Societies Ordinance, No. 34 of 1921.

2. Clause 3. The object of this amendment of section 20 (2) is to make it clear that a tax equal in amount to one

per cent. of the assessable income of a person is payable in a case where by reason of the allowances provided for in Chapter VI, no tax would be charged under the provisions of sub-section (1) of the same section. The opportunity

has also been taken to make it clear that the tax charged under sub-section (2) is in lieu of and not in addition to the tax chargeable under sub-section (1) of section 20.

Clause 4 corrects a mis-print in section 27 (1

Clause 5. Section 30 (4) may be construed to mean that a separate deduction, not exceeding 15 per cent. of the profits derived from the estates of a tax-payer, may be allowed in respect of each immature area belonging to such tax-payer. The section makes no specific provision for a case where the tax-payer is the owner of several immature areas and claims a deduction in respect of each such area. The object of this amendment is to make it clear that the maximum relief intended to be granted under this subsection is an aggregate allowance of 15 per cent. of the total of the profits derived from all estates of the tax-payer, irrespective of the number of immature areas in respect

of which deductions may be allowed.

5. Clause 6 of the Bill gives retrospective effect to the amendments introduced. The date mentioned (9th February, 1932) is the date on which the principal Ordinance came into

operation.

Besit enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:

- This Ordinance may be cited as the Education Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1932.
- Section 17 of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920", (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) is hereby amended as follows:

(a) by the deletion of paragraphs (b) and (c) thereof; and
(b) by the substitution of the letter "b" for the letter "d" within the brackets in the first line of para-

graph (d) thereof.

Section 18 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:

(1) by the substitution of the word "includes" for the words "is situated within" in the second line and by the deletion of the words "which has been declared to be an education district" in the third and fourth lines of paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) thereof; and

(2) by the substitution of the word "includes" for the words "is situated within" in the second line of paragraph (c) of sub-section (2) thereof.

Objects and Reasons.
Section 17 (b) of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920", provides that the area comprised within the administrative limits of a Local Board town shall become a separate Education district immediately such town is brought under the operation of that Ordinance by a Pro-clamation of the Governor. By reason of the provisions of section 17 (c) of the same Ordinance, a District Council constituted under "The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920", ipso facto becomes an Education district for the purposes of "The Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920", upon such constitution.

Experience has shown that the method of creating a new Education district by the mere proclamation of a Local Board town or by the constitution of a District Council

is unsatisfactory.

3. The object of this amendment is to enable areas emprised within Local Board or District Council limits comprised conveniently to be included in larger education districts

for the purposes of the principal Ordinance.
4. Clause 2 accordingly repeals these provisions of the law which make it necessary for every Local Board area, upon proclamation, and for every District Council, upon constitution, to become a separate education district and clause 3 effects other amendments consequential on the amendments introduced by clause 2.
