MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend “ The Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908 ”.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Post Office Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1932.

Amendment of section 11 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1908.

2 Section 11 of “ The Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908 ” (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Ordinance ”), is hereby amended by the repeal of sub-section (1) thereof and by the substitution therefor of the following :—

“ (1) The Governor may make rules providing for the registration of newspapers which are transmitted by inland post as registered newspapers and may in such rules prescribe the fees to be charged and paid for such registration and for the renewal thereof.”

Amendment of section 83 (6) of the principal Ordinance.

3 Sub-section (6) of section 83 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution of a comma for the full stop immediately after the word “ country ” in the sixth line thereof and by the addition of the following words immediately thereafter :—

“ and includes any such facsimile or imitation or representation of an international reply coupon or of an imperial reply coupon.”

Objects and Reasons.

1. The principal Ordinance provides for the registration of newspapers and for the transmission of registered newspapers by inland post at special rates. There is, however, no provision in the Ordinance which enables a fee to be charged for the registration of newspapers or for the renewal of such registration. The amendment introduced by clause 2 of this Bill enables the Governor to make rules for the registration of newspapers and to prescribe by rule the necessary fees for such registration and for the renewal thereof.

2. International reply coupons are supplied by the International Bureau of the Postal Union at Berne and were introduced by the Universal Postal Union to supply the public demand to provide the means of prepaying the reply to a letter sent abroad. An international reply coupon is exchangeable in any country which undertakes the sale of such coupons for a stamp or stamps representing the postage on a single rate letter originating in that country for abroad. At the request of the British Post Office, Ceylon has also undertaken the sale of imperial reply coupons which are similarly exchangeable in any British possession for a stamp of stamps representing the postage on a single rate letter originating in that possession for any country in the British Empire. At the Convention held at London in June, 1929, the contracting countries undertook to propose to their respective Legislatures the necessary measures for penalising the counterfeiting and fraudulent use of international reply coupons.

3. Clause 3 of the Bill accordingly makes the necessary provision for the protection of international reply coupons by including such coupons within the definition of a “ fictitious stamp ” in section 83 (6) of the principal Ordinance. The opportunity has also been taken to extend a similar protection to imperial reply coupons.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend the Land Settlement Ordinance, 1931.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Land Settlement Amendment Ordinance, No. _____ of 1932.

Short title.

2 Section 3 of the Land Settlement Ordinance, 1931, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended by the addition of the following sub-section immediately after sub-section (2) thereof :

Addition of a new sub-section to section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

"(3) It shall be lawful for any Settlement Officer appointed under this Ordinance to continue or to complete any action or proceeding taken or commenced under Ordinance No. 1 of 1897 by a Special Officer appointed under section 28 of that Ordinance or by the Government Agent of a Province or by the Assistant Government Agent of a District, where any such proceeding or action was pending or incomplete on the 23rd day of October, 1931 ; and for such purpose and from that date a Settlement Officer is hereby authorised to perform, execute and exercise the functions, duties and powers assigned to, imposed upon or vested in, any such Special Officer, Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent as the case may be".

3 Section 4 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the repeal of sub-section (3) thereof and by the substitution therefor of the following :

Amendment of section 4 of the principal Ordinance.

"(3) Whenever the extent of the land or the aggregate extent of all the lands included in a settlement notice exceeds ten acres, a notification substantially in Form No. 4 in the First Schedule shall be published once at least in any two of the newspapers of this Island in the language in which each such newspaper is ordinarily published, provided that one of such newspapers shall be a newspaper published either in Sinhalese or in Tamil".

4 Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :

Amendment of section 5(6) of the principal Ordinance.

(1) by the insertion of the word "substantially" between the word "be" and the word "in" in the eighth line of sub-section (5) thereof ;

(2) by the insertion of the word "substantially" between the word "thereto", and the word "in" in the seventh line of sub-section (6) thereof.

5 Sections 6, 11 and 26 of the principal Ordinance are hereby amended by substituting the word "Governor" for the words "Governor in Council" wherever the latter words occur in the said Sections.

Amendment of sections 6, 11 and 26 of the principal Ordinance.

6 The First Schedule of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :

(1) By substituting for Form No. 3 therein the following :—

Form No. 3. (s. 5 (6))

The Land Settlement Ordinance, 1931.
Certificate.

It is hereby certified that the Governor has consented to the settlement(s) embodied in the above settlement order in so far as such settlement(s), (other than settlements, if any, made in pursuance of or by decree of court), relate(s) to any land or to any aggregate of lands exceeding ten acres in extent.

Application of amendments introduced by this Ordinance.

7 Notwithstanding the provisions of any written law to the contrary and without prejudice to the legality of anything lawfully done or omitted to be done under the principal Ordinance before the date on which this Ordinance shall come into operation, the provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to any action or proceeding taken or commenced under the principal Ordinance.

Objects and Reasons.

1. *Clause 1.*—The Land Settlement Ordinance, 1931, which came into operation on October 23rd, 1931, did not give power to Settlement Officers appointed under that Ordinance to continue and complete proceedings which were commenced under the repealed Ordinance No. 1 of 1897 by Special Officers, Government Agents and Assistant Government Agents, and which were pending or incomplete on October 23rd, 1931. The object of this amendment is to give them that power.

2. *Clause 2.*—This amendment of sub-section (3) of section 4 of the principal Ordinance dispenses with the necessity for the publication of an entire settlement notice in the newspapers and enables a short notice to be published instead calling attention to the fact that a settlement notice has been published in a specified issue of the Government Gazette and informing the public that further particulars relating to the notice and to the lands included therein can be obtained at the Settlement Office.

The principal Ordinance provides ample safeguards for the due publication and service of a settlement notice and no such notice is, as a matter of practice, issued until after the Settlement Officer has made the most careful inquiries in the village as to the names of all claimants and interested persons.

A settlement notice often occupies many columns of print and refers individually to several hundreds of lands. Publication of entire settlement notices in the local newspapers costs the Government about Rs. 36,000 a year. It is anticipated that the abbreviated form of notice provided for in this amendment will ensure a saving to Government of about Rs. 33,000 a year.

3. *Clause 4.*—There is a danger that any slight though necessary variation in the wording of forms Nos. 2 and 3 in the first schedule may render a settlement order invalid. The addition of the word "substantially" will permit such modifications of the forms as may be necessary to meet the exigencies of any special situation that may arise.

4. *Clause 5.*—References to the Governor in Council in the principal Ordinance have become inappropriate by reason of the principal Ordinance not having come into force till after the election of the first Executive Committees under the new constitution. For the same reason, Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, cannot be used to provide for the devolution of the powers of the Governor in Council under the principal Ordinance. Clause 5 therefore substitutes "Governor" for "Governor in Council" wherever the latter expression occurs in the principal Ordinance.

5. *Clause 6.*—The reference to the lot and plan number in Form No. 3 in the First Schedule of the principal Ordinance entails a large amount of clerical labour.

The office of Colonial Secretary does not exist under the new constitution and the functions of the Colonial Secretary in connexion with this certificate have been assigned to the Land Commissioner.

6. *Clause 7.*—This clause enables the amendments introduced by this Ordinance to be applied with retrospective effect to all proceedings commenced under the principal Ordinance.
