Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 15, 1932.

The total births registered in the city of Colombo Buths.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 183 (2 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 21 Moors, 5 Malays, and 8 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 33 0, as against 29 9 in the preceding week, 37 9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31 1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 113 (I European, 5 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 17 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 20 4, as against 22 0 in the previous week, 22.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 113 total deaths, 16 were of infants under one year of age, as against 13 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twelve deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Maradana North, Maradana East, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South. The number registered during the preceding week was also 12 and the weekly average for last year was 17.

(1) Q.—Can dogs be effectively inoculated against rabies? A.—The Municipal Veterinary Surgeon reports as follows in reply to each question:—The experiments made from the vaccines so far prepared have not resulted in complete immunization of dogs against rabies. I should say that the inoculation of dogs against rabies is yet in an experimental stage. So far as I can learn nearly 28 countries have experimented with the inoculation of dogs. The following opinion expressed by Schoening and published in the Veterinary Bulletin of August, 1932, may be useful information:—"Reliable field information on the use of the vaccine is lacking. Vaccination, no matter how effective, cannot by itself control outbreaks of rabies. The stray dog will always remain a factor which must be considered."

Q.—(a) If so, how long does the effect of such inoculation last? A.—The effect of inoculation lasts about one year. Details concerning the persistance of immunity after vaccination are meagre, but one case is reported so late as July this year which resisted infection after vaccination more than one year afterwards.

Q.—(b) What would be the cost of inoculating a dog? A.—The cost for vaccine alone would be approximately 75 cents per dog. The establishment charges on account of the inoculation would depend largely upon the number of animals attended to.

(2) Q.—On what basis are dog seizers paid and on what terms are they employed? A.—Seizers are paid by

- (2) Q.—On what basis are dog seizers paid and on what terms are they employed? A.—Seizers are paid by results, i.e., Re. 1 for each dog seized. The terms of employment are based on good character certified by the Police. The seizer must employ an assistant under the above terms to push the cart and his wages are paid by the seizer.

 (3) Q.—How many dog seizers were employed by this Council during the months of January to July, inclusive, this year? A.—Three dog seizers were employed by this Council during the months of January to July, 1932.

 (4) Q.—What sum has been paid out to dog seizers from January 1, 1932, to July 31, 1932? A.—A sum of Rs. 1,693 has been paid for the 3 seizers from January to July, 1932.

The Chairman said he had very little to add to what he had said in his memorandum to the Four Standing Com-The Chairman said he had very little to add to what he had said in his memorandum to the Four Standing Committees regarding the Assessment rate, which was already in the hands of every member of the Council. He had made the statement that he had promised to make regarding the prospects of retrenchment in the near future. But there is one thing he would like to add. With regard to his memorandum he had a letter from a member recently suggesting the inclusion in the next year's Budget estimates of, at least, two lakhs for the relief of unemployment and he proposed to suggest to the Council that it should, at least, include that amount for the relief of distress during the coming year. The Council already this year voted two lakhs for that purpose and he could not see, at present, that the situations is likely to be appreciably better this time next year, although it was hoped it might. But he thought that it must be obvious to every one that in view of the difficult times that are ahead of them it was absolutely essential that they should husband their resources and maintain the present assessment rate. The Chairman moved that part (1) above be adopted. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded. Carried.

ANNEXURE A.

By-laws-Municipal Laundries.

(By-laws framed under Powers conferred by section 110, sub-section 17 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.)

Definition.

For the purpose of these By-laws, a Municipal Laundry shall include all land together with buildings thereon which has been set apart by the Council for the purpose of a laundry.

$Obstruction\ of\ Authorized\ Agents.$

1. Every person who shall resist, obstruct, hinder or molest any person appointed by the Chairman to superintend any Municipal Laundry or to collect rents and fees thereof, or to enforce order and cleanliness therein whilst in the execution of his duty, shall be guilty of an offence.

2. Any officer authorized by the Chairman to superintend any laundry may expel from the laundry premises any person found drunk, begging, misconducting himself or loitering about without sufficient reason in the laundry premises.

Acts forbidden.

- It shall not be lawful for any person to do any of the following acts:-
 - (1) No laundryman or other person shall enter or remain on the premises except during the hours prescribed by the Chairman.

(2) No laundryman shall misbehave or use abusive or obscene language, or create a disturbance or obstruct

any officer, or interfere with or cause any damage to the property of the Council.

(3) No laundryman shall permit the accommodation allotted to him to be in an insanitary or unclean condition

and the onus of proving that such condition was not permitted by him shall be upon the laundryman.

(4) No laundryman or other person shall keep any animal, or allow any animal to be kept, or cook or sleep in the laundry premises.

(5) No laundryman or other person shall enter or leave the premises except by the gateway provided.
(6) No laundryman or other person shall throw any refuse on laundry premises except into the receptacles

provided for the purpose.

(7) No person shall spit or otherwise commit nuisance within the laundry premises.

(8) No person affected with any loathsome or contagious or infectious disease shall enter or work in the laundry premises.

(9) No person shall erect any fixtures or screens or enclose any space within the laundry premises.

(10) No laundryman shall keep soiled and clean clothes together, but shall keep such clothes in the rooms

provided for such purposes.

(11) No laundryman or other person shall remove wet or partially laundered clothes from the laundry.

(12) Every laundryman shall always before leaving the laundry for the day extinguish every fire or light used by him, and no light or fire which is dangerous to the safety of any building or the clothes therein shall be at any time kindled or left alight.

(13) The laundry premises shall not be used for any other than laundry purposes.

General.

4. No person shall occupy or do any laundry work in the laundry premises without a permit from the Chairman.

Such permit may be granted, refused, suspended or cancelled at the discretion of the Chairman.

5. Every laundryman applying for a permit shall forthwith deposit a sum equivalent to 3 months' rent to be held in deposit by the Chairman as security for the due payment of the rent and due observance of all the conditions of the permit.

6. The lessee of a single tank will be allowed two assistants and the lessee of a double tank twice this number Permits for assistants above these numbers will be granted on payment of a monthly fee of Rs. 5 for each extra permit.

7. The rent shall be paid in advance on or before the 10th day of each month.

8. No laundryman shall transfer to any person the permit issued to him or his assistants.

9. No laundryman shall sublet the tanks or rooms.

10. Laundrymen shall forthwith bring to the notice of the Medical Officer of Health the occurrence of any infectious or contagious disease in their homes and shall not work in the laundry until such time as they are permitted by the Medical Officer of Health.

No person shall take or send to the laundry any cloths or other articles exposed to infection.

Every laundryman shall forthwith furnish a complete list of names and addresses of all or any of his customers

when so required by the Medical Officer of Health.

13. (1) No laundryman within the Municipal limits of Colombo shall wash, dry, iron, deposit or store clothes for any person or persons in any premises within a radius of half a mile from a Municipal Laundry.

(2) This by-law shall not, however, apply to laundrymen engaged by householders as private servants solely for the purpose of washing for them in their own private premises.

Penalty.

14. Any person committing a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 and in the case of a continuing breach to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10 for every day during which the breach continues after the conviction for the first breach.
