KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor, do hereby proclaim the rules set out in the schedule hereto framed and established by Us for the Port of Trincomalee under section 6 of the Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865, and direct that they shall be in force from and after December 1, 1932.

#### GOD SAVE THE KING.

#### SCHEDULE.

The Rules dated September 20, 1918, and February 14, 1922, published in *Government Gazettes* No. 6,969 of September 27, 1918, and No. 7,244 of February 17, 1922, respectively, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) by the deletion of rules numbered 13 and 14 and the substitution of the following therefor:
  - 13. Spitting or committing a nuisance upon or
  - otherwise dirtying the Jetty is prohibited.

    14. It shall be lawful for any Customs or Police Officer to call upon any person to state his reasons for entering or remaining on the Jetty and unless such person can give a satisfactory reason, such officer may order such person to leave the Jetty forthwith.
- (2) by the addition of the following new rules to be numbered as 17, 18, 19, and 20:-
  - 17. Hawking, trading, or loitering on the Jetty is prohibited.
  - 18. It shall be lawful for the Assistant Collector of Customs, after written notice to any person, to prohibit such person from entering the Jetty without a special

permit in writing and no such person shall enter the Jetty thereafter without such special permit in writing.

19. No boats plying for the conveyance of passengers or goods may lie or be moored alongside the Jetty except at such places as may be indicated by the Collector of

Customs from time to time by notice affixed to the Jetty.

20. For the purpose of the foregoing rules 13, 14,
17, 18, and 19 the word "Jetty" shall mean the Jetty
which is commonly called the Town Jetty in the Inner Harbour of the Port of Trincomalee and which is property of the Ceylon Government.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO CESSPITS AND LATRINES.

- No occupier or owner shall build or cause to be built on his land or premises any privy, cesspit, or latrine, without having first obtained the permission of the Chairman
- in writing.

  2. (a) The Chairman of the Board may prescribe the position in which such privy, cosspit, or latrine shall be constructed, and refuse permission to construct it in any

other position.
(b) It shall further be competent to the Chairman to refuse permission to construct any cesspit upon any premises, should the Chairman be of opinion that such construction should not be permitted on sanitary grounds.

3. (a) It shall be competent to the Chairman to order

in writing the owner or occupier of any premises, in which a privy, cesspit, or latrine has been constructed without permission or in any way contrary to the terms of any permission issued by the Chairman, to demolish and fill up the said privy, cesspit, or latrine within such reasonable time as may be prescribed by the Chairman of the Board.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

4. (a) The Chairman may order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises to construct within the time prescribed by such order a privy, or latrine of such a type and size and in such a position and with such connecting

drains as the Board may by resolution prescribe.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

5. (a) The Chairman may order in writing the owner or occupier of the premises upon which any privy, cesspit, or latrine exists either to repair, alter, or reconstruct the same in such manner and within such time as the Chairman may prescribe or to demolish and fill up the same within such prescribed time, if in the opinion of the Chairman such privy, cesspit, or latrine is liable to give rise to a nuisance.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.
6. The Board may by resolution prohibit within any specified area or portion of a specified area the use of any cosspit of whatever kind, and direct that all latrines

and closets be constructed on the dry-earth system.

7. (a) Whenever such a resolution shall have been passed, and notice in writing shall have been given by the Chairman to the owner or occupier of any house or building or land, in or on which such cesspit or cesspits are situated, to close such cesspit or cesspits and substitute a dry-earth person or persons to comply with such notice within such time as may be specified in such notice, or within a reasonable time if no period is specified in the notice, and in accordance with such directions as to the type and position of the building as the Chairman may of his own motion. or upon application issue.

(b) Any owner or occupier failing within the time specified or within a reasonable time if no time is specified. to comply with such notice shall be guilty of an offence.

8. It shall be the duty of the owner or the occupier of any premises upon which any privy or latrine stands, to keep the said privy or latrine in good repair and in a clean and sanitary state and to see that no nuisance is caused thereby. Any owner or occupier failing to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

9. In order to secure the efficient removal of the night.

soil, it shall be lawful for the Board by resolution to require the owners or occupiers of any houses, buildings, or lands in any specified area to provide and maintain at their

own expense a conservancy lane not exceeding 8 feet in width at the back of or running through the premises.

10. When the Board has undertaken the carrying out of all conservancy within any specified area, it shall not be leaved for any specified area, it shall not be leaved for any specified area. not be lawful for any person within such area, it shall not be lawful for any person within such area either to carry out such work himself or by means of any agent or servant without the written permission of the Chairman, which permission the Chairman is empowered at his discretion to refuse, if he is of opinion that all such service within the area can be adequately considered by the within the area can be adequately carried out by the Board.

11. All owners or occupiers of premises furnished with closets, or latrines within such specified area, shall pay monthly to the Board such conservancy fees as shall be fixed by the Board for the removal of their night soil. All such fees shall be paid before the 10th day of the month all such fees shall be paid before the 10th day of the month.

12. Any person requiring the service of day labourers may apply to the Chairman therefor in writing, and such labourers will be supplied upon such terms as the Boards

shall decide.

Any person outside such specified area who desires that the conservancy of any closet or latrine be under taken by the Board, or that he be given the services of a day labourer, may notify the Chairman in writing to that effect, and the Board may thereupon undertake such

conservancy.

The owner or occupant of any land or premises, upon which there is any catchpit into which dirty water flows and collects, shall be responsible for the daily removal of such water so that no nuisance is caused thereby. such owner or occupier failing to carry out such removal as above required shall be guilty of an offence.

#### KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 17, 1932, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with the Notice dated September 12, 1932.

Present: Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. H. P. G. Young; Mr. Walter Beven; Dr. L. C. Wijesinghe.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 27, 1932, having been previously submitted to the

Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

The following documents were submitted: -

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1931 to August 31, 1932, on account of Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to July 31, 1932.

(c) Health Officer's report for August, 1932.
(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of August, 1932.

(e) The reservoir readings for the week ended September 17, 1932.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83, of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the Commission in the Commission in the Commission in the Commissio cation in the Government Gazette.

3. (1) The following reports were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, hakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during August, 1932.

- 3. (2) With regard to water supply the Chairman stated that in spite of the restricted hours of supply and reduced consumption the level of the reservoir was 21 feet below spill that day, and that it would be necessary to supply lake water to the lower levels of the town as soon as the reservoir went down 25 feet. He pointed out that even then it would be possible to arrange to keep on the reservoir supply for the whole town for a short time to allow water for drinking purposes only.
  - Mr. Ismail suggested cutting off the supply daily at 9 P.M. instead of 10 P.M. to further reduce consumption.
- Mr. Beven drew attention to the tapping of streams above the reservoir for supplying bungalows in Hermitage road and Hotel Suisse as a possible explanation of the inflow to the reservoir being less than the draw off for the present reduced consumption. The Chairman explained that the water supply to the houses on Hermitage road was restricted exactly the same extent as water served to other areas and that the streams serving the Suisse Hotel were at a lower level than, and did not enter the reservoir. He suggested that the shortage was really due to the particularly small rainfall which up to September 15, was 39 inches only and very considerably below the average of the last five years.

He agreed however to ask the Municipal Engineer for a report on Mr. Beven's remarks.

4. (1) Petitions: Mr. Soysa presented a petition signed by K. M. Ally Mobideen and two others. Mr. de Silva presented two petitions, one signed by M. S. S. Hamid, and the other by M. Idroos and six others; and Mr. Wijayatilake presented six petitions signed by—(1) K. M. M. Meera Mohideen, (2) Agnes Bastian, (3) S. Abdul Rahaman, (4) M. Idroos and six others, (5) A. C. M. Haniffa, and (6) K. M. Ally Mohideen and two others—relating to tenancy of beef stall No. S6.

The Chairman undertook to place the petitions before the Markets Committee.

Mr. Wijayatilake also presented a petition from A. L. A. Rahim complaining of the excessive charges for house service connections: and Mr. de Silva presented another petition from Mrs. A. Wijegoonewardene asking for early improvement of the "Dewata road" in Mavilmada.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.

- 4. (2) Mr. de Silva gave notice of the following motion to be moved at the next meeting of Council:—"That immediate steps should be taken to supplement the water supply of Kandy town by undertaking the Mahaweliganga Pumping Scheme."
- 5. Papers relative to the proposed extension of the Municipal limits to include the following areas:—(1) Hudu-humpola-Mulgampola; (2) Eriyagama; (3) Kahala-Nawayalatenne.

  Resolved to consider the matter when the reform of the Municipal constitution comes up for consideration.
- 6. Papers relative to the surrender of the lease of the Young Women's Christian Association site and the proposed lease to the Kandy Social Service League the Chairman proposed the following resolution:—"In view of the fresh lease to be granted by the Council to the Kandy Social Service League for a term of 25 years with option of renewal for a like term, this Council concedes that their previous tenants, the Young Women's Christian Association, by whom the buildings on the leasehold premises were erected, have acquired an equitable interest in these buildings in the nature of a claim to compensation, and the Council has, therefore, no objection to this equitable interest being assigned and transferred by them to the new lessees, after the surrender of the existing lease." Mr. de Silva seconded.—Carried.
- 7. To fix the general office hours of business for the attendance of Municipal Officers and clerks from 8.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays, and 8.30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on other working days, the office to remain open for cash transactions till 1 p.m. on Saturdays, and 3 p.m. on all other working days, commencing from October 1, 1932.

Resolved that the hours be approved accordingly.

- 8. To fix the rates leviable in 1933: It was agreed to defer the matter for the next meeting to be considered with tentative figures of the budgetary position for 1933.

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#### GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council, Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, September 10, 1932, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated September 5, 1932.

Present —Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; Dr. S. P. Joseph; Mr. P. R. Gunasekara; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel; and Mr. A. M. Saheed.

The Minutes of the General Meeting held on August 20, 1932, a copy thereof having been furnished to each

Member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following questions:—(1) What anti-plague measures are being taken in the town apart from the rat trapping? (2) Has any definite work been undertakensinee the last plague epidemic and the re-occupation of houses which were treated and repaired to inspect insanitary and rat-infected houses in order to have them disinfected and rat holes closed up? (3) How many rats have been trapped; how many examined for plague germs and fleas during the current year? (4) Who is in charge of cutting and examining the spleens of rats trapped?

(5) What is the cost of a Clayton Fumigator?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Besides trapping of rats, ensuring that boutiques and houses and the drains attached to them are kept clean and in good repair, no other measures are being adopted. The staff provided is only for (2) On two or three occasions when dead rats were discovered, these measures were adopted in areas marked rat trapping. (2) On two or three occasions when dead rats were discovered, these measures were adopted in areas marked out around the houses in which the dead rats were found; but a staff had to be got together from the other branches of this Department to augment the staff of the Rat Campaign Department, so as to enable the M. O. H. to carry out this work. As a matter of routine, no such work can be done as there is no staff for it. (3) 8,600 rats were trapped from January 1, 1932, to August 31, 1932, up to the end of June, 1932, all rats trapped were examined microscopically by the Inspector in charge of this work on such days as he was not absent from duty. Since then, the Medical Officer of Health, who makes a microscopic examination of the rats trapped, was obliged to take on this work as well, and does so whenever he considers it necessary to make a microscopic examination. No rats were examined for fleas. (4) The dissection of rats is done by the overseer of the Rat Campaign Department, who has attended to this work since 1925. (5) I am informed by the Chairman

of the Municipal Council, Colombo, that they purchased one in 1925 for £90 sterling.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved:—(1) That effective and systematic anti-plague measures be taken in the town and that a qualified overseer or Inspector be entrusted with the work. (2) That a Clayton Fumigator be purchased by Council to smoke rat holes effectively. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.

purchased by Council to smoke rat holes effectively. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.

Mr. C. E. de Vos moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to the Standing Committees on Markets and Sanitation and Finance and Assessment for consideration and report. Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe seconded.

The mover and seconded agreed to the amendment which was put to the meeting and carried.

4. Assessment Rates for 1933:—The Chairman moved (a) to make and assess for the calendar year 1933, a rate

of 173 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Police limits; and a rate of 7 per cent of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever outside the Police but within the Municipal limits of Galle, as required by section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, payable by four instalments on or before the following dates:—First instalment on or before March 31, 1933, Second instalment on or before June 30, 1933, Third instalment on or before September 30, 1933, Fourth instalment on or before December 31, 1933. (b) To adopt the valuation of properties for the current year,

subject to such alterations as the Chairman may from time to time find necessary to make for the purpose of rating for the calendar year 1933. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded—Carried.

5. To consider the recommendation of Council in Committee of August 20, 1932, with regard to the question of writing off rates on the ground of poverty: Resolved that the recommendation of Council in Committee be adopted and that the rates due for the current year be "written off", but that no refund be made in the case of those premises which

have already paid rates.

6. To consider the craft by-laws relating to licences and the proposed new by-laws on bakeries:—Resolved that the general by-laws relating to licences and by the-laws on bakeries be adopted and submitted to the Hon. the Attorney-

General for approval.

7. To submit the Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1931:—Mr. D. I. Durham moved that, in terms

of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1931, be submitted to His Excellency the Governor. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.

Mr. P. R. Gunasekara said that the recommendations of the Retrenchment Committee were not fully set out in the report, but only those which were adopted by the Council. He suggested that this be done and moved that the relevant passage in the report be re-drafted accordingly, before the report was submitted to His Excellency the Governor. Mr. T. Amarasuriva seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

The Chairman undertook to make the necessary amendment.

8. To sanction the appointment of a temporary clerk for about three months to assist in the Assessment Department on a salary of Re. 1 per diem:—Resolved that the services of a temporary clerk be engaged for three months on a

salary of Re. 1 per diem.

9. To consider an application from the Galle Municipal Employees' Co-operative Society, Ltd., asking that the monthly contributions be deducted on the pay sheet and that a cheque for the total amount due be issued in favour of the

Society at the end of each month:—Resolved that sanction be given.

10. To submit, in terms of section 16 (ii.) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, a list of Municipal Officers and servants who are more than 60 years of age:—The Chairman moved that this matter be discussed by Council in Committee at the end of the meeting.—Carried.

To consider an estimate of Rs. 2,150 for constructing an outlet for Circular road drain:—Resolved that the estimate be passed and that a further sum of Rs. 650 be added to the vote of Rs. 1,500 sanctioned by Council on June 18, 1932, for this purpose. Resolved further that tenders be invited for the work.

1932, for this purpose. Resolved further that tenders be invited for the work.

12. To consider an application from the Superintendent of the Electricity Department requesting authority to pay each of the two unpaid apprentices employed in his Department 50 cents a day in order that they may be trained to inspect meters for testing purposes:—Resolved that sanction be given.

13. To consider 4 applications for water service:—

Resolved that the applications be allowed.

14. To consider tenders for services for the year 1933. The Chairman moved that this matter also be considered by Council in Committee at the end of the meeting.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

- (2) To consider papers relating to the proposed new rates to be offered to St. Aloysius College for current consumed Recommended that the following new rates be offered:—45 cents per unit for the first 200 units and 30 cents for every additional unit.

(3) To consider an application from the widow of the late H.L. Hinni Appu, Conservancy labourer, for a gratuity under section 24 of the Municipal Pension Rules.—Recommended that the widow be granted a gratuity of Rs. 76·50 being three months' pay of the office.

(4) Wiring of the Smell Proof Depôts at Jail road and Templars road, and the public latrines at Mahamodera for electric lighting.—Recommended that the work be done and that a sum of Rs. 150 be added to the present vote of Rs. 450 for "Electric lights for Public Latrines."

(5) To consider an application from W. S. Fernando, former tenant of Municipal Shop No. 15 asking that, in view of improvements effected by him, he be granted a set-off for arrears of rent due.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 132 · 50, being balance rent due after deducting the amount of the deposit, be written off as "irrecoverable."

With regard to item (2) it was resolved to defer consideration until the next meeting of Council.

At the conclusion of the other business before the meeting the Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider items 10 and 14.

#### Council in Committee.

10. The Chairman informed the Council that the following officers in the Municipal Services were over 60 years of age:—(1) W. W. J. Wijesinghe, Peon Aratchchy, 65 years; (2) O. L. Jansz, Cemetery Keeper, 65 years; (3) W. T. Hinni Appu, Peon, 65 years; (4) C. Wijewardena, Overseer, Night Soil Depôt, 63 years; and (5) D. J. Devasurendra, Town Clock

Keeper, 63 years.

Council in Committee recommended (a) that no action be taken as regards Nos. 2, 4, and 5, but that Nos. 1 and 3 be informed that they must retire on pension at the end of the current year; (b) that W. W. J. Wijesinghe, Peon Aratchy,

be allowed to continue as Process Server of the Council after retirement, on a monthly allowance of Rs. 10.

14. Council in Committee considered tenders for the following services for the year 1933:—(a) Supplying bulls and drivers for scavenging carts.—Recommended that the tender of L. O. E. de Silva be accepted for one year, viz., Rs. 55 per mensem per pair of bulls and a driver and Rs. 40 per mensem per single bull and a driver for scavenging carts.

(b) Supplying of gravels.—Recommended that, before the Council decide on the acceptance of the tender of E.D.P. de Silva at Rs. 7.50 per cube, a report be obatined from the Superintendent of Works as to the places from where the gravel will be obatined.

(c) Supplying of sea sand.—Recommended that the tender of E. D. P. de Silva at Rs. 2.70 per cube be accepted

for one year.

(d) Supplying of metal.—Recommended that tenders be invited again both for 2 in. and 3 in. metal, the same person

to tender for both.

(e) Coir Dust. -Recommended that the tender of E. D. P. de Silva of Rs. 13 for 100 bags containing 21 bushels

each be accepted for one year.

(f) White washing Municipal Buildings four times in the year.—Recommended that the tender of C. L. Mohamadu of Rs. 82 per quarter be accepted for one year.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 22, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 208 (1 European, 14 Burghers, 126 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 37.5, as against 33.0 in the preceeding week, 37.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly appeared for lest year. average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 162 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 96 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 22 Moors, 3 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·2, as against 20·4 in the previous week, 21·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·2 the weekly a warrage for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 162 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 16 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana South, Slave Island, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 12 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

preceding week.
