A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME THOMSON.

WHEREAS by Proclamations dated February 10, 1899, and February 8, 1912, published in the Gazettes No. 5,601 of February 17, 1899, and No. 6,489 of February 16, 1912, respectively, the Chief Headmen's divisions of Karachchi, Tenmaradchi, Vadamaradchi West, Vadamaradchi East, and Pachchilaippali were brought under the Village Communities Ordinance, 1889, and duly subdivided into villages or convenient groups of villages:

And whereas by Proclamations dated March 27, 1924, and November 25, 1930, published in the Gazettes of March 28, 1924, and November 28, 1930, respectively, and by a Proclamation bearing the date hereof published in the present number of the Gazette, effecting the redistribution of the component villages and subdivisions of the aforesaid divisions and the necessary amalgamation of the divisions themselves, the aforesaid divisions have been reconstituted into two Chief Headmen's divisions known as Vadamaradchi and Tenmaradchi-Pachchilaippali-Karachchi, respectively:

Now therefore know Ye, that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by sections 4 and 6 of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Our Proclamation (a) revoke the aforementioned Proclamations of February 10, 1899, and February 8, 1912, and all other Proclamations in that behalf issued at any time thereafter, so far as they relate to the five divisions set out in the first clause thereof; (b) declare that the Chief Headmen's divisions of Vadamaradchi and Tenmaradchi-Pachchilaippali-Karachchi reconstituted as aforesaid, shall from and after the 1st day of October, 1932, be brought within the operation of the said Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924; and (c) appoint that the said Chief Headmen's divisions of Vadamaradchi and Tenmaradchi-Pachchilaippali-Karachchi shall be subdivided into villages or convenient groups of villages as specified in the schedule hereto.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is expedient for administrative and revenue purposes to transfer the Udaiyar's division of Chempiyanpattu from the existing Chief Headman's division of Pachchilaippali-Karachchi in the Revenue District of Jaffna to the Chief Headman's division of Vadamaradchi and to amalgamate the remaining area of the Chief Headman's division of Pachchilaippali-Karachchi and the existing Chief Headman's division of Tenmaradchi into one Chief Headman's division to be called and known as Tenmaradchi-Pachchilaippali-Karachchi:

Now know: Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby declare (a) that the Udaiyar's division of Chempiyanpattu in the Chief Headman's division of Pachchilaippali-Karachchi shall be transferred to the Chief

Headman's division of Vadamaradchi, (b) that the remaining area of the Chief Headman's division of Pachchilaippali-Karachchi and the Chief Headman's division of Tenmaradchi shall be amalgamated and be called and known hereafter as the Chief Headman's division of Tenmaradchi-Pachchilaippali-Karachchi and (c) that the said divisions reconstituted as aforesaid shall consist of the villages specified in the schedule hereto.

WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Kottawa village in Palle pattuwa, Hewagam korale, of the District of Colombo, Western Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, either wholly or in part exempt any cemetery from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES, No. 13 of 1896.

REGULATIONS under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages" as amended by Ordinance No. 7.of. 1897, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Ilmaha Kachchi Festival, 1932.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Ilmaha Kachchi Festival, 1932, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to three days, namely, December 11 to 13, 1932, inclusive.

- (b) Rilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.
- 2. The camp shall be under the general control of the Government Agent, Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by a Medical Officer and by a Police Officer.
- 3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Supervising Officer to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads by which they have to travel.
- 4. The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama
 - (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking and for natural offices;
 - (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
 - (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of
 - pilgrims;
 (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims:
 - (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying any lawful order given for any of these purposes by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

- For the purpose of these rules camp shall mean the area within half a mile of the Maha Dewala in every direction.
- The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in the camp, by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer or in their absence by the chief officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be guilty of an offence.
- 7. Any person bringing any cattle or cart-bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be guilty of an offence.
- 8. The issue of such permits shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation, maintaining the health of the camp, and regulating traffic.
- 9. (1) (a) Any person exposing commodities of any description for sale in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.
- (b) Any person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police shall be guilty of an offence.
- (2) (a) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Supervising Officer.
- (b) No waste tea, coffee or milk, or remnants of food, cooking waste or refuse shall be thrown on the ground but shall be collected in a proper receptacle ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.
- (c) No foodstuffs shall be exposed to the contamination of flies.
- 10. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or shall fail to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spet appointed by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.
- 11. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease and not reporting the same to the Supervising Officer, to the Medical Officer or the chief officer of Police, and any person aiding or abetting in the concealment of such disease shall be guilty of an offence.
- All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Supervising Officer or the chief officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence.
- 13. Any person who, without the previous sanction of the Supervising Officer, constructs any booth or extend any building so as to encroach on the main streets of the camp shall be guilty of an offence.

- 1. In these regulations:—
- "Public Stand" means a defined space within the Urban area reserved for the parking of omnibuses and lorries and indicated as such by a notice exhibited by the "Licensing Authority".
- "Licensing Authority" for the Urban area between the 51st and 52½ mileposts on Akuressa-Viharahena road shall be the Chairman of the Village Committee, Deniyaya Subdivision, as appointed by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 7,932 of June 24, 1932.
- No vehicle other than an omnibus or lorry shall be parked in a public stand.
- 3. All omnibuses or lorries parked in a public stand shall be halted facing the same direction one behind the other and shall be moved up as vacancies occur in front.
- No omnibus or lorry shall enter a public stand save by the passage provided or indicated for its entrance, nor leave such stand save by the passage provided or indicated for its exit.
- 5. The driver of each omnibus or lorry parked in any public stand shall be in attendance of such vehicle.
- 6. The fees mentioned in the schedule hereto shall be payable to the Licensing Authority in advance by the owner or driver of any omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand.

Schedule.

(c) Each omnibus or lorry which plies from Akuressa and occupies a public stand shall pay Re. I per month for the use of the stand.

(b) Each omnibus or lorry plying between Galle-Deniyaya and Matara-Deniyaya, and vice versa, and occupying a stand shall pay 25 cents for over 5 minutes and up to 12 hours, and 5 cents for every additional 10 minutes thereafter. These charges may however be compounded on payment

of Re. I per mensem in (a) above.

(c) The person in charge of the bus or lorry shall produce the receipt for such payments if required to do so by any person authorized by the Licensing Authority to

demand it.

REGULATIONS.

No occupier or owner shall build or cause to be built on his land or premises any privy, cesspit, or latrine, without having first obtained the permission of the Chairman in writing.

2. (a) Upon any application for such permission under regulation 1, it shall be competent to the Chairman to require that any particular type of cesspit, approved by a resolution of the Board, and no other, shall be constructed.

(b) The Chairman may further prescribe the position in which such cosspit shall be constructed, and refuse permission to construct any cesspit in any other position.

(c) It shall further be competent to the Chairman to refuse permission to construct any cesspit at all upon any premises, if he is of opinion that such construction should not be permitted on sanitary grounds.

3. (a) It shall be competent to the Chairman to order.

in writing the owner or occupier of any premises, in which a cesspit has been constructed without permission or in any way contrary to the terms of any permission issued by the Chairman, to demolish and fill up the said cesspit within such resonable time as may be prescribed in such order.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under paragraph (a) of this regulation shall be guilty of an

offence.

4. (a) The Chairman may order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises to construct, within the time occupier of any premises to construct, within the time prescribed by such order, a privy or a latrine of such a type and size and in such a position and with such connecting drains as the Board may by special or general resolution from time to time prescribe.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under paragraph (a) of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

offence.

(a) The Chairman may order in writing the owner of occupier of the premises, upon which any privy, cesspit, or latrine exists either to repair, alter, or reconstruct the same in such manner and within such time as the notice may prescribe, or to demolish and fill up the same within such prescribed time if it is the contract of the cont prescribed time if in the opinion of the Chairman such privy cesspit, or latrine is liable to give rise to a nuisance.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order made under paragraph (a) of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

Definitions.—For the purpose of the following

regulations-

"Cesspit" shall mean and include all forms of closets or latrines other than those on the dry-earth system.

"Specified area" shall mean and include such area or areas within the limits of the Board as the Board may from time to time specify; such area may comprise the whole of such limits or a portion or portions thereof.

7. (a) The Board may by resolution prohibit within any specified area the use of any cesspit of any kind whatever and direct that all latrines and closets be conducted

on the dry-earth system.

(b) The Board may by resolution further specify (1) the minimum distance relatively to all adjoining houses at which new latrines and closets may be built, (2) the materials to be used and the manner in which the work is to be carried out, and (3) the time within which the alterations and new works respectively should be completed.

8. Whenever such a resolution shall have been passed,

and notice in writing shall have been given by the Chairman, setting out the directions given and the time prescribed by the resolution, to the owner or occupier of any house or building or land in or on which such cesspit or cesspits are situated, to close such cesspit or cesspits and substitute a dry-earth closet or closets therefor, it shall be incumbent on such person or persons to comply with such notice within the time specified therein. Any owner or occupier failing within such time to comply with such notice, shall be guilty of an offence. Provided that for the erection of any closet or latrine under this regulation the permission of the Chairman under regulation 1 shall always be

9. It shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of any premises upon which any privy or latrine stands to keep the said privy or latrine in good repair and in a clean and sanitary state, and to see that no nuisance is caused thereby. Any owner or occupier failing so to do shall be guilty of an

offence.

In order to secure the efficient removal of night soil it shall be lawful for the Board by resolution to require the owner or occupier of any house, building, or land in any specified area to provide and maintain at his own expense a conservancy lane not exceeding 8 feet wide at the back of or running through his premises.

11. Within any specified area all conservancy shall be

carried out by the Board, and it shall not be lawful for any person either to carry out such work himself or by means of an agont or servant without the written permission of the Chairman, which permission the Chairman is empowered at his discretion to refuse if he is of opinion that all such services within the area can be adequately carried out by the Board

12. All owners or occupiers of premises furnished with closets or latrines within any specified area shall pay monthly to the Board such conservancy fees as shall be fixed by the Board for the removal of night soil. All such. fees should be paid before the 10th day of the month for which the service is being rendered.

13. Any persons requiring the services of day labourers may apply to the Chairman therefor in writing, and such labourers will be supplied upon such terms as the Board may by resolution decide. Fees for the service of such labourers shall be paid before the 10th day of the month for which the service is being rendered.

14. Any person outside a specified area who desires that the conservancy of his closet or latrine be undertaken by the Board or that he be given the services of a day labourer shall notify the Chairman in writing to that effect and the Board may thereupon undertake such conservancy The fees due from such person shall be paid before the 10th day of the month for which the service is being rendered.

15. Whenever the Chairman shall consider the con-

struction of a new catchpit or the alteration, repair, or reconstruction, or filling up of an existing catchpit to be necessary, he may require any owner or occupier of any land or premises, by notice in writing, either to construct a new catchpit or to alter, repair, or reconstruct, or fill up any existing catchpit, and may further give directions as to the position, level, and size of such catchpit, the materials to be used, the manner in which and the time within which the work is to be carried out, and any other details connected with such works. Any such owner or occupier who shall fail within the time specified to carry out such requirements of the Chairman shall be guilty of an offence.

The owner or occupier of any land or premises upon which there is any catchpit into which dirty water flows and collects, shall be responsible for the daily removal of such water so that no nuisance is caused thereby. Any such owner or occupier failing to carry out such removal as

above required shall be guilty of an offence.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 5, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 198 (15 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 28 Moors, 11 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 35·7, as against 28·5 in the preceding week, 34·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 127 (4 Burghers, 71 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 16 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.9, as against 21.8 in the previous week, 23.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 127 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 16 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twelve deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 13 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta South, as against 5 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average

for last vear

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, as against nil in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

- 6. Reported Cases.—Twenty-one cases of Chickenpox, 19 of Measles, 5 of Enteric Fever, 2 of Diphtheria, 1 each of Whooping Cough and Plague were reported during the week, as against 10, 24, 2, nil, nil, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.0°, against 80.2° in the preceding week and 80.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.868 in., against 29.875 in. in the preceding week and 29.898 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.78 in., against 11.18 in. in the preceding week and 2.73 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
