### Convention between His Majesty, in respect of the United Kingdom, and the Federal President of the Republic of Austria, regarding Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial Matters.

London, March 31, 1931.

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the Federal President of the Republic of Austria:

Being desirous to render mutual assistance in the conduct of legal proceedings, in their respective territories, in civil and commercial matters which are being dealt with or which it is anticipated may be dealt with by their respective judicial authorities, have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Right Honourable Arthur Henderson, M.P., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

The Federal President of the Republic of Austria:

Herrn Georg Franckenstein, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in London;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

#### I.—PRELIMINARY.

##### Article 1.

(a) This Convention applies only to civil and commercial matters, including non-contentious matters.

(b) In this Convention the words:—

(1) "territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party," shall be interpreted as meaning at any time any of the territories of such High Contracting Party to which the Convention at that time applies;

(2) "subject of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India mean all subjects of His Majesty wherever domiciled.

#### II.—SERVICE OF JUDICIAL AND EXTRA-JUDICIAL DOCUMENTS.

##### Article 2.

When judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required by a judicial authority situated therein to be served on persons, partnerships, companies, societies or other corporations in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may be served on the recipient, whatever his nationality, in any of the ways provided in Articles 3 and 4.

##### Article 3.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the documents to be served emanate, to the competent authority of the country where the documents are to be served, requesting such authority to cause the documents to be served. The request shall be sent by such Diplomatic or Consular Officer to such authority.

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the language of the country where service is to be effected.

The request for service shall state the names and descriptions of the parties, the name, description and address of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the documents to be served in duplicate.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in the language of the country in which it is to be served, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document emanates.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent—

In England, to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Austria, to the Federal Ministry of Justice.

If the authority to whom a request for service has been sent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall of his own motion transmit the document to the competent authority of his own country.

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of the country where the document is to be served, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the municipal law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of that country.

(f) The execution of the request for service duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request for service is not established, or (2) the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be effected considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall furnish a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request for service was made. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicates or attached thereto.

## Article 4.

(a) Any of the following methods of service may be used in the territory of either High Contracting Party, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country where service is to be effected in connexion with judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of the other High Contracting Party:—

(1) Service by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document emanates;

(2) Service by an agent appointed for the purpose either by the judicial authority by whom service of the document is required, or by the party on whose application the document was issued;

(3) Service through the postal channel;

(4) Any other mode of service recognized by the law existing at the time of service in the country from which the documents emanate.

(b) It is understood,

(1) that in none of the methods of service provided for in this article shall any measures of compulsion be employed;

(2) that the validity and effect of any such service will remain a matter for the determination of the respective courts of the High Contracting Parties in accordance with their law.

(c) The High Contracting Parties agree that in principle it is desirable that documents served by any of these methods should, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country in which service is to be effected or accompanied by a translation into such language. Nevertheless, in the absence of any legislation in their respective territories making translations obligatory in such cases, the High Contracting Parties do not accept any obligation in this respect.

## Article 5.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Diplomatic or Consular Officer the request for service is addressed, shall pay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law of the country where the service is effected to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request was addressed when sending to him the certificate provided for in Article 3 (g).

(c) Except as provided above, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents.

## III.—TAKING OF EVIDENCE.

## Article 6.

When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken, whatever the nationality of the parties, in any one of the ways prescribed in Articles 7 and 8.

## Article 7.

(a) The judicial authority by whom the evidence is required may, in accordance with the provisions of its law, address itself by means of "Letters of Request" to the competent authority of the country where the evidence is to be taken, requesting such authority to take the evidence.

(b) The "Letter of Request" shall be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose judicial authority the request emanates. The "Letters of Request" shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, the names and descriptions of the parties thereto, and the names, descriptions and addresses of the witnesses. They shall also either be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses, or, as the case may be, by a description of the documents, samples or other objects to be produced and identified, and a translation thereof certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided or shall request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked *visà voce* as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.

(c) The "Letters of Request" shall be transmitted:—

In England by an Austrian Diplomatic or Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Austria by a British Consular Officer to the Federal Ministry of Justice.

In case the authority to whom "Letters of Request" are transmitted is not competent to execute them, he shall forward them without any further request to the competent authority of his own country.

(d) The competent authority to whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted or forwarded shall give effect thereto and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country except that, if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the "Letters of Request," such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of the country where the evidence is to be taken.

(e) The Diplomatic or Consular Officer, by whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date and place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties, who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented if they so desire by any persons competent to appear before the courts of either of the countries concerned.

(f) The execution of the "Letters of Request" can only be refused—

(1) if the authenticity of the "Letters of Request" is not established;

(2) if in the country where the evidence is to be taken the execution of the "Letters of Request" in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary;

(3) if the High Contracting Party in whose territory the evidence is to be taken considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) In every instance where the "Letters of Request" are not executed by the authority to whom they are addressed, the latter will at once inform the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the "Letters of Request" has been refused, or the judicial authority to whom they have been forwarded.

## Article 8.

(a) The evidence may also be taken, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country in which it is to be taken, by a person in that country directly appointed for the purpose by the court by whom the evidence is required. A Diplomatic or Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party whose court requires the evidence or any other suitable person may be so appointed.

(b) A person so appointed to take evidence may request the individuals named by the court appointing him to appear before him and give evidence, or to produce any document, sample or other object. He may take all kinds of evidence which are not contrary to the law of the country where the evidence is being taken and shall have power to administer an oath, but he shall have no compulsory powers. False testimony given before a person appointed to take evidence in accordance with this article shall be punishable in the courts of the country for which the evidence is required in the same manner as if such testimony had been given before a court of such country.

(c) Requests to appear issued by such person shall, unless the recipient is a subject of the High Contracting Party for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation into such language.

(d) The evidence may be taken in accordance with the procedure recognized by the law of the country for whose judicial authority the evidence is required and the parties will have the right to be present or to be represented by any persons competent to appear before the courts of either of the countries concerned.

## Article 9.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method laid down in Article 8 has failed, owing to the refusal of any witness to appear, to give evidence or to produce documents, samples or other objects, does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 7.

## Article 10.

(a) Where evidence is taken in the manner provided in Article 7, the High Contracting Party by whose judicial authority the "Letters of Request" are addressed shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and

expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act in cases where the law of his own country permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure being requested and followed. These expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the courts of the country where the evidence has been taken.

(b) The repayment of these expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the "Letters of Request" have been executed from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing their execution.

(c) Except as above provided, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

#### IV.—JUDICIAL ASSISTANCE FOR POOR PERSONS ; IMPRISONMENT FOR DEBT AND SECURITY FOR COSTS.

##### Article 11.

The subjects of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with subjects of that High Contracting Party as regards free judicial assistance for poor persons and imprisonment for debt; and, provided that they are resident in any such territory, shall not be compelled to give security for costs in any case where a subject of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled.

#### V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

##### Article 12.

Any difficulties which may arise in connexion with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

##### Article 13.

The present Convention, of which the English and German texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in Vienna. The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

##### Article 14.

(a) This Convention shall not apply *ipso facto* to Scotland or Northern Ireland, nor to any of the Colonies or Protectorates of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, nor to any territories under His suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories administered by His Government in the United Kingdom, but His Majesty may at any time, while the Convention is in force under Article 13, by a notification given through His Minister at Vienna extend the operation of this Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.

(b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service or for the taking of evidence are to be transmitted, and the language in which communications and translations are to be made. The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

(c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.

(d) The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, *ipso facto* terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph (a) of this Article.

##### Article 15.

(a) The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 13 or by virtue of any accession under this Article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected,

provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when the Federal President of the Republic of Austria has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Majesty to which the Convention applies. The provisions of Article 14 (b) shall be applicable to any such notification. Any such accession shall take effect one month from the date of its notification.

(b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving a six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.

#### RULES.

1. Rule 5 (2) of the rules published by Notification dated November 12, 1926, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,555

of November 12, 1926, is hereby revoked and the following rule substituted therefor :—

5 (2) Licences for transmitting stations shall be subject to the following further conditions :—

(i.) For transmitting stations capable of radiating energy, licences shall be issued only to British subjects. For stations using an artificial non-radiating type of aerial, licences may be issued at the discretion of the Postmaster-General.

(ii.) The power used shall not exceed 100 watts in any case.

(iii.) In the case of transmitters up to 5 watts Anode power measured in the final oscillator, the certificate of the applicant that he is able to send and receive satisfactorily messages in morse signalling at 10 words per minute, shall be sufficient.

(iv.) In the case of transmitters from 5 to 20 watts Anode power measured in the final oscillator, the certificate of the applicant that he is able to send and receive satisfactorily messages in morse signalling at 15 words per minute, shall be sufficient.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 12, 1932.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 171 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 118 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 30.8, as against 35.7 in the preceding week, 39.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 144 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 16 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.0, as against 22.9 in the previous week, 26.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 144 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 43 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 20.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 2 in Kollupitiya, as against 12 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana South, Slave Island and Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 2 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 1.

4. Twelve deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 from *Worms*, 5 from *Debility*, 4 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus* and *Measles*, and 78 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-two cases of *Measles*, 13 of *Chickenpox*, 3 each of *Enteric Fever* and *Whooping Cough* and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 19, 21, 5, 1 and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 78.2° against 80.0° in the preceding week and 79.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.881 in., against 29.868 in. in the preceding week and 29.927 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.77 in., against 1.78 in. in the preceding week and 3.40 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## General Meeting.

Wednesday, October 5, 1932, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 28, 1932.

*Present* :—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Dr. E. V. Ratnam ; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando ; Dr. E. A. Coorey ; Mr. N. R. Blande ; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal ; Dr. S. Muttiah ; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P. ; Mr. J. S. Collett ; Mr. F. J. Soertsz ; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha ; Mr. A. R. A. Razik ; Mr. H. J. Hutchings ; Dr. S. T. Gunasekera ; Mr. G. K. Thornhill ; and Mr. H. K. de Kretser.

1. The minutes of the General Meeting of September 7, 1932, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the minutes of the General Meeting of September 7, 1932, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey asked the following questions which the Chairman answered :—

Will the Chairman be pleased to state—

(1) *Q.*—What arrangements are made for censoring films that are screened in the picture houses in the city? *A.*—The censorship of films in Colombo lies in the sole and absolute discretion of the Chairman of the Municipal Council under rules 77-82 of the by-laws in the *Gazette* of July 12, 1918, made by the Municipal Council under section 110 (15) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, which empowers the Council to make by-laws for the regulation and inspection of places of public entertainment. By a long standing practice, the Police have been good enough to co-operate in this work by carrying out a preliminary inspection of the synopsis of all the films which the managers of theatres are required to send to them 3 days before the projected performance. If there appears to be nothing objectionable in the synopsis and if the film is not on the list of films prohibited in India, the Police pass the film for exhibition. If, however, the Police consider that the film is open to doubt, they refer the matter to me for decision after, in some cases, a preliminary inspection of the film themselves. It is my practice then to obtain a private view of the film before making my order.

(2) *Q.*—As it seem desirable that school children are not allowed to see these films unless they are considered to be specially suited to them, while at the same time it is felt that they should not be deprived of this valuable mental recreation, will the Chairman be pleased to consult the appropriate Committees as to what steps might be taken to arrange that films specially suited to these children be screened for their benefit? *A.*—The suggestion will be submitted to the appropriate Committees for consideration.

2A. The Chairman stated that before proceeding further with the agenda, he would wish, with the permission of the Council, to move a vote of appreciation of Col. Joseph's services, that being Col. Joseph's last Council meeting, in view of his impending retirement from the post of Secretary. He knew that it would be in accordance with their unanimous wish that he should do so. It was almost 20 years since Col. Joseph entered the Council's service and throughout his long term of office as Secretary not only had he worthily discharged the duties of the post in a manner acceptable to the Council and to the public, but his activities had embraced a wider sphere and both as a senior member of the Ceylon Defence Force in which he commanded the Ceylon Garrison Artillery from January, 1920, to December, 1923, and as an enthusiastic patron of sport he had won a prominent place in the regard and esteem of every section of the community. He was that day one of the best known, most popular and most respected of the citizens of Colombo and all alike would wish him long life and happiness in his retirement. He would also wish to take that opportunity of acknowledging his own indebtedness to Col. Joseph for the valuable assistance that he had received from him since his assumption of duties as their Chairman.

With the permission of Council, the Chairman then moved :—That the Council records its warm appreciation of the services of Col. E. H. Joseph, V.D., J.P., on his retirement after nearly 20 years service as Secretary. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, in cordially seconding the vote of appreciation, stated that successive Chairmen of the Council had expressed their high regard of Col. Joseph and of his services. Mr. Abdul Cader also referred to his arduous and conscientious work.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam, in supporting, stated that he occupied no mean place in the history of that Council during the last 20 years and referred to his incalculable assistance as a peacemaker when disputes arose between members and the Chairmen. The motion was carried by acclamation.

Col. E. H. Joseph then thanked the Chairman, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, and Dr. E. V. Ratnam for the extremely kind references made to him and to his services and the other members for so generously endorsing their remarks.

(36) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer dated September 15, 1932, recommending that arrears of rates amounting to Rs. 243.55 be written off (20 cases all on grounds of poverty). Registered No. 1,646.—Recommended.

*The following Extract from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of August 26, 1932, was considered.*

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider :—(a) The application of the Sanitary Inspectors that, owing to the hardship caused to them by the present arrangement under which they are compelled to live in their respective wards in which they work, they be allowed to live wherever they like and that one or two Health Stations with a telephone service be provided in each of which an Inspector be detailed for night duty. (b) The reports thereon of the Medical Officer of Health and the Municipal Treasurer. (c) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 902.—Recommended that the scheme be approved. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando dissented.

*Resolution of Council of September 7, 1932.*

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred to next meeting. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando and Dr. E. A. Coorey supported the motion. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the matter be referred back to Four the Standing Committees for re-consideration. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

*The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of September 23, 1932, were considered.*

SECRETARY'S DEPARTMENT.

(5) To consider :—(a) Letter dated September 3, 1932, from Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.M.C., regarding the question of the appointment of a Secretary to the Council from the Clerical Service, when the present Secretary retires on pension. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 1,543.—Recommended that acting arrangements be made by the Chairman for carrying on the duties of the Secretary up to the end of June, 1933.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

Dr. E. V. Ratnam dissociated himself from the recommendation of the Standing Committees.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that this matter be referred back to the Four Standing Committees for re-consideration, and in the meantime that the present Chief Clerk of the Secretariat be asked to act pending a decision of the Council. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

The Chairman explained the facts.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be accepted. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

Dr. E. A. Coorey stated that his reason for asking that the matter should be referred back to the Four Standing Committees was to enable the Committees to consider the three memoranda sent in by three Members after the meeting of the Four Standing Committees. The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam rose to move an amendment.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando rose to a point of order.

The Chairman ruled that the amendment of Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando was now before the meeting as the substantive motion and that Dr. E. V. Ratnam was in order in moving an amendment to it as such.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam then moved, as an amendment, that the acting arrangement be continued until the expiration of the period of leave granted to Mr. Joseph and the question of appointing a Secretary be considered in January next. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Lost.

Dr. E. A. Coorey called for a division and the Council divided as follows :—

The substantive motion was then put to the meeting and carried.

(b) A report thereon of the Medical Officer of Health, dated August 15, 1932. Registered No. 1,320.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adhered to and that, if possible, a central position be selected for the dispensary that is to serve both wards.

*Recommendation of the Finance Committee referred to.*—That the San Sebastian Dispensary be closed and that both areas (*i.e.*, the area served by this Dispensary and that served by the New Bazaar Dispensary) be served by one Dispensary.

8. To select from the applicants and submit to the Council the names of three candidates for the post of Dispensary Medical Officer of the Public Health Department, indicating, if the Committees think fit, the candidate whom they recommend the Council to appoint. Registered No. 1,415.—Recommended that in view of the preceding decision no appointment be made.

4. The Chairman moved in Committee :—
