CARNEGIE SCHOLARSHIPS.

THE following information regarding the inauguration of a scheme by the Trustees of the Carnegie Corporation of New York for giving assistance to officers of the Colonial Service who might with advantage be allowed to take a "refresher" year for the purpose of undertaking special studies, is published for general information.

A sum of sixty thousand dollars has been appropriated by the Trustees from the funds, which owe their existence to bequests by the late Mr. Andrew Carnegie, for the furtherance of the scheme over a period of 3 years from the present.

2. The Trustees contemplate that the period of study should be one year, but they do not propose to draw up any regulations either as to the place at which the studies should be taken or as to their nature, save that the time should be spent on work of a definite kind. They would be prepared to consider applications for assistance to study at a University or similar institution, or to travel or, again, proposals which included study in residence and travel. As instances of their object and the range of applications which they would be prepared to consider, the Trustees have mentioned courses of study in anthropology for administrative officers; scientific courses for medical, agricultural, veterinary, and forestry officers; courses in economics, banking, and currency for Treasury officers; visits to other British Colonies or to the Dependencies of other Colonial powers for the purpose of studying the methods adopted there. These suggestions are mentioned by way of illustration only, and do not exhaust the objects which the Trustees have in view. If it was desired to spend the "refresher" year in the United States, the authorities of the Corporation would do their best to make the visit as pleasant and profitable as possible. The essence of the scheme is, however, that no restriction will be placed on an applicant's choice of the place or manner in which the year will be spent.

3. The Trustees have not suggested any definite conditions of eligibility for officers who may seek to avail themselves of the scheme. They are, however, impressed by the benefits which an officer who has spent ten or more years in the Service may derive from a course of study, not only because of its educational value, but also from the point of view of his health and his interest in his work, and so of his advancement in the Service. Generally speaking, preference will be given to promising officers between thirty and forty years of age.

4. As regards the amount of the assistance which might be given, the Trustees would regard a sum of \$3,000 as on the average an appropriate grant, but would wish to adopt the principle that officers who are selected should neither lose nor gain financially. They suggest that the assistance should be of the amount which would cover the travelling and other expenses not provided by his Government and any loss in salary due to his absence from duty. The amount must therefore to some extent be dependent upon the terms upon which an officer is released.

5. The Secretary of State will be glad to receive any applications recommended by His Excellency the Governor. It would be convenient if the applications could be accompanied by as close an estimate as it may be possible to frame of the amount of assistance which would be required from the Fund, based on the suggestion mentioned in paragraph 4 above. Each application should also be supported by a full statement of the officer's career in the Colonial Service as well as of his academic and other qualifications in order that the selecting authorities may be enabled to form an opinion as to his ability to turn to good account the facilities which may be placed at his disposal.

6. Applications from officers in the Public Service desiring to avail themselves of the scholarships should be forwarded to the Chief Secretary through their Heads of Department as early as possible, giving the particulars required by paragraph 5 hereof.

7. Officers awarded scholarships will be granted whatever earned vacation and half pay leave they may have available and will thereafter, if necessary, be placed on no pay leave until the end of the course, the pension value for the period of absence being calculated as in the case of ordinary leave to Europe. No passage concessions will be granted beyond those to which an officer is entitled

under the leave passage regulations. These conditions should be borne in mind by applicants when framing the estimate required under paragraph 5 above.

8. No application will be recommended unless it is considered that the course of study proposed would be of use to this Government.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 19, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 189 (4 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 108 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 27 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others).

The birthrate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 34.1, as against 30.8 in the preceding week, 37.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 146 (11 Burghers, 85 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 22 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.3, as against 26.0 in the previous week, 25.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 146 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South and 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana East, as against 8 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twelve deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, and 2 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), as against 3 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North and 1 each in New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week and 12, the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.

5. Eleven deaths from *Debility* were registered, 9 from *Worms*, 5 each from *Dysentery* and *Enteritis*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 each from *Homicide* and *Accidents*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 64 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Twenty-seven cases of *Measles*, 21 of *Chickenpox*, 3 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 each of *Mumps* and *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 22, 13, 3, nil, and 2 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.2°, against 78.2° in the preceding week and 79.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.906 in., against 29.881 in. in the preceding week and 29.900 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.83 in., against 3.77 in. in the preceding week and 2.64 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 22, 1932, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated October 17, 1932.

Present : Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Walter Beven ; Dr. L. C. Wijesinghe ; Mr. T. H. Leader.

1. Before proceeding with the business, the Chairman moved—"That a vote of sincere condolence with the widow and family of the late Doctor George Powell Hay be recorded in the Minutes of this Council in appreciation of the valuable services rendered by him to this town, first in the capacity of Medical Officer of Health and afterwards as a nominated member of this Council for a period extending over 23 years, and also in recognition of the great public loss sustained by the town at his lamented death."—Ratwatte Adigar seconded the motion, and it was passed, all members standing.

1A. The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on September 17, 1932, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1931 to September 30, 1932, on account of Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to August, 1932.
- (c) Health Officer's report for September, 1932.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September, 1932.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended October 22, 1932.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during September, 1932.

4. Petitions:—(1) Mr. Wijayatilake presented a petition signed by Dr. G. W. Karunaratne and several other tax-payers suggesting the assessment of properties on the nett annual income, payment of compensation to those paying water rates and not having the benefit of water, &c., and asked that the petition be brought up at the November meeting of Council for consideration.

(2) Mr. Soysa presented a petition signed by Mr. A. B. Siriwardene asking for the deviation of a path in Bahirawakanda.

(3) Mr. Wijayatilake presented a petition signed by Mr. S. Witharana suggesting improvements to the bathing spout at Ampitiya.

(4) Mr. Wijayatilake presented a copy of a petition bearing the names of several space-holders of the Public Market asking that they be granted permission to store goods to a height of 6 feet.

(5) Mr. Ismail presented a petition from Muthu Menika, widow of Kiribanthu, asking for a gratuity on account of her husband's services.

The Chairman agreed to consider the matters referred to in the several petitions.

5. Correspondence:—Copy of letter No. D 319 of October 4, 1932, from the Secretary to the Minister of Local Administration to Mr. T. H. Leader stating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to nominate Mr. Leader to be a member of the Kandy Municipal Council in place of Mr. H. P. G. Young.—Read.

After having welcomed Mr. Leader, the Chairman proposed "That the Council do place on record its sense of appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Mr. Young as a nominated member of this Council." Mr. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva was to move:—"That immediate steps should be taken to supplement the Water Supply of Kandy Town by undertaking the Mahaweli-ganga Pumping Scheme."

This motion was not proceeded with.

With the leave of Council Mr. Wijayatilake moved:—"That in terms of the request made by the Director of Public Works, the Municipal Engineer be instructed to report on a Minor River (Mahaweli-ganga) Scheme as adumbrated by the Director of Public Works in his letter No. W. W. 9D of October 5, 1932, and the Director of Public Works be requested to report on this Scheme in due course." Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment:—"That in terms of the request made by the Director of Public Works, the Municipal Engineer be instructed to report on a Minor River (Mahaweli-ganga) Scheme as adumbrated by the Director of Public Works in his letter No. W. W. 9D of October 5, 1932, and the Director of Public Works be requested to report on this Scheme in due course, and that in addition the Municipal Engineer be instructed to supply the information requested in the Director of Public Works' letter as regards a revised Lake Scheme for pumping to filtration plant above Wace Park and supplying water by gravity therefrom and that the Director of Public Works be asked to report on this Scheme also in due course." Mr. Beven seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and lost by 6 to 3, the voting being:—

Ayes.—The Chairman, Mr. Beven, Mr. Leader.

Noes.—Mr. Wijayatilake, Mr. Usoof Ismail, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. de Silva, Mr. Soysa, Dr. Wijesinghe.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 6 to 3:—

Ayes.—Mr. Wijayatilake, Mr. Usoof Ismail, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. de Silva, Mr. Soysa, Dr. Wijesinghe.

Noes.—The Chairman, Mr. Beven, Mr. Leader.

7. To fix the rates leviable in 1933.

Mr. Usoof Ismail moved—"That the same rates be levied in 1933 as in 1932, viz., 16 per cent. within the water served area, and 8 per cent. outside this area, but that the properties be re-assessed for rates as early as possible with due regard to the fall in rents as a result of the trade depression." Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—Carried.

Mr. Wijayatilake also suggested the inauguration of Assessment Committees which the Chairman agreed to investigate.

8. To sanction the acceptance of the following tenders for the year 1933:—

(1) Public Market Daily Rents, Fair Day area and inside spaces, L. S. Fernando's tender, Rs. 23,646.

(2) Halloluwa Toll Rents, G. H. Fernando's tender for Rs. 1,332.

(4) Gonawatta Toll Rents, Charles Perera's tender for Rs. 25.

Resolved that sanction be given.

9. To sanction the appointment of Mr. A. K. Kaimal, Overseer, as Waterworks Inspector, in succession to Mr. V. Muthucumarage, promoted.

Resolved that the papers be re-circulated and brought up at the next meeting.

(15) Application from the Agent of Mr. Walter de Soysa for a water service connection to the garage at premises No. 92B, Brownrigg street.—Recommended a metered supply for trade purposes.

(16) Letter No. 962 of September 1, 1932, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer stating that the vote for materials for repairs and maintenance of public lamps is likely to be exceeded and asking that a sum of Rs. 1,000 be transferred from the vote for labour for public lamps—Maintenance, to meet the excess.—Recommended.
