- (2) Where such water is not measured by meter, an account of the amount payable in respect of each quarter shall be rendered, in the aforesaid Form E, in advance during the preceding quarter: Provided that where the amount cannot be determined in advance, the consumer shall deposit by way of security such sum as the Council may by resolution prescribe.
- (3) It shall be the duty of every consumer to pay the amount to the Council in full within 15 days of any account being so rendered.

THE PETROLEUM ORDINANCE, 1887.

RULES made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by sections 10 and 15 of the Petroleum Ordinance, 1887, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, to regulate the importa-tion, possession, and transport of the substance known as Acetylene or Calcium Carbide to which the provisions of the said Ordinance have been applied by Notification in the Gazette of June 2, 1927.

Rules referred to.

1. Acetylene when liquid or when subject to a pressure above that of the atmosphere capable of supporting a column of water exceeding 100 inches in height and whether or not in admixture with other substances shall be deemed

to be dangerous and shall be prohibited from being manufactured, imported, kept, conveyed, or sold subject to the following exceptions:

- (a) Acetylene in admixture with oil gas in a proportion not exceeding 20 parts by volume of acetylene in every 100 parts of the mixture, when subjected to a pressure not exceeding 150 lb. to the square inch, shall not be deemed to be dangerous, provided that the acetylene and oil gas shall be mixed together in a chamber or vessel before the gases are subjected to compression.
- (b) Acetylene when contained in a homogeneous porous substance with or without acetone or other solvent, shall not be deemed to be dangerous provided the following conditions are fulfilled, namely :-
 - (1) The porous substance shall fill as completely as possible the cylinder into which the acetylene is compressed.

(2) The porosity of the substance shall not exceed 80 per cent.

(3) Any acetone or other solvent used shall not be capable of chemical reaction with the acetylene gas or with the porous substance or with the metal of the cylinder, and the quantity of acetone or other solvent shall be such that when fully charged with acetylene it shall not completely fill the porosity of the porous substance at any temperature likely to be met with in ordinary practice or use.

(4) The pressure in the cylinder shall not exceed 255 lb. to the square inch at a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit:

Provided that no cylinder capable when empty of containing one cubic foot of water or more, which has the ends secured to the body by welding only, and no cylinder in which a porous substance is used without accord or other solvent shall be charged to a pressure exceeding 150 lb. to the square inch at a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit. This condition shall not apply to cylinders used exclusively for marine lighting by an officer appointed by the Government in that behalf.

The importation of calcium carbide, which contains impurities liable to generate phosphoretted hydrogen or siliciuretted hydrogen so as to render the gas evolved liable

to ignite spontaneously, is hereby prohibited.

3. The owner, master, or agents of every ship carrying a cargo any part of which consists of carbide of calcium shall, before entering the harbour, give notice in writing of the nature of such cargo to the Master Attendant and Collector of Customs, and shall place or moor his ship in such place as the Master Attendant may direct, and while any carbide of calcium remains on board shall not, except for the purpose of proceeding to sea, remove his ship without the written permission of the Master Attendant.

4. The hold of every vessel carrying carbide of calcium shall be efficiently ventilated from the time of entering the harbour until all the carbide of calcium has been

discharged or until the ship has left the harbour.

5. Carbide of calcium shall only be brought into the harbour in hermetically closed metal vessels having no copper in their construction, containing each not more than lb., and of such strength and construction as not to be liable to be broken or to become defective or insecure in conveyance otherwise than by gross negligence or extraordinary accident.

Every such vessel or, if packed, the case in which it is packed shall be distinctly labelled in red letters "CALCIUM CARBIDE DANGEROUS."

- 6. No such closed metal vessel containing calcium carbide shall be opened within the limits of the port or Customs premises except with the written consent of the Collector of Customs.
- Every reasonable precaution shall be taken to prevent the contact of water or moisture with the carbide of calcium, and where such contact may have occurred to prevent the gas evolved from being ignited.

 8. When carbide of calcium is discharged or shipped within the ports of Colombo, Galle, and Trincomalee—

(a) It shall be discharged or shipped only in cargo boats shall be discharged or simpled only in cargo poats and after surrise and before sunset and only at such place or places as the Collector of Customs shall direct. Every such cargo boat shall carry at its bows and stern a red flag not less than two feet square on a staff not less than six feet above the deal. The nature of the contents of survey correct the deck. The nature of the contents of any cargo boat carrying carbide of calcium shall be clearly described on the boat note and certified by the

ship's officer, and no calcium carbide shall be discharged or received into a cargo boat carrying any other cargo.

(b) No fire, smoking, or light shall be allowed in any boat during the time the calcium carbide is on board the boat.

(c) All barges containing calcium carbide shall be removed at sunset to the mooring specially appointed by the Master Attendant and such barges shall be moored fore and aft by chains.

- (d) The tindal of any cargo boat engaged in such discharging or shipping of calcium carbide shall, so long as the calcium carbide remains in the boat, (except during the process of loading or unloading) keep it under hatches or covered with double tarpaulins. He shall furthermore take every reasonable precaution to prevent the possible contact of water or moisture with the calcium carbide.
- No boat shall be engaged in the discharging, landing; shipping, or transporting of calcium carbide from any vess within the port of Colombo, Galle, or Trincomalee, until three hours notice shall have been given by the master, owner, or agents of the vessel to the officer in charge of the police at such port, and an officer of the Police Force appointed by him shall have occupied the boat to see the regulations carried out. The master of any vessel from which calcium carbide is discharged shall be liable for any breach of this rule.

10. All calcium carbide landed as aforesaid shall, without being deposited or stacked on the ground, be removed at once from the boat in which it has been con-

to be to premise in respect of which a licence for the storage of calcium carbide has been granted.

11. The owner, master, or agents of any ship in port with calcium carbide on board shall, when so required by the Collector of Customs or other officer of Customs authorized by the Collector, or by the Master Attendant, or by any Police officer of or above the rank of Sub-Inspector appointed in this behalf by order in writing by the Inspector-General of Police, show to such officer all calcium carbide on board such ship, and shall afford every reasonable facility to enable such officer to inspect and examine such

calcium carbide on board such ship.
12. The rules dated May 30, 1927, and published in Government Gazette No. 7,585 dated June 2, 1927, are hereby

repealed.

"THE CEYLON TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1908."

RULES made by the Governor under section 7 of "The Ceylon Telegraph Ordinance, 1908," by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, published in Government Gazette No. 7,954 of November 18, 1932, confirmed by resolution of the State Council on December 6, 1932, and declared to be in force from December 23, 1932.

Rules.

- 1. Rule 5 (2) of the rules published by Notification dated November 12, 1926, in Government Gazette No. 7,555 of November 12, 1926, is hereby revoked and the following rule substituted therefor:
 - 5 (2) Licences for transmitting stations shall be subject to the following further conditions:-
 - (i.) For transmitting stations capable of radiating energy, licences shall be issued only to British subjects. For stations using an artificial non-radiating type of aerial, licences may be issued at the discretion of the Postmaster-General.

- (ii.) The power used shall not exceed 100 watts in any
- (iii.) In the case of transmitters up to 5 watts Anode power measured in the final oscillator, the certificate of the applicant that he is able to send and receive satisfactorily messages in morse signalling at 10 words per minute, shall be sufficient.
- (iv.) In the case of transmitters from 5 to 20 watts
 Anode power measured in the final oscillator, the certificate of the applicant that he is able to send and receive satisfactorily messages in morse signalling at 15 words per minute, shall be sufficient.
- (v.) In the case of transmitters from 20 to 50 watts Anode power measured in the final oscillator, the applicant shall be required to pass a test in sending and receiving wireless messages at the rate of 18 words per minute.
- (vi.) In the case of transmitters from 50 to 100 watts Anode power measured in the final oscillator:
 - (a) the applicant shall be required to pass a test in sending and receiving wireless messages at the rate of 20 words per minute;
 (b) a diagram of the circuit shall be submitted to

- the Postmaster-General for approval;
 (c) the Postmaster-General may, if he considers it necessary, cause the equipment to be inspected, and withhold the licence until the equipment is declared to be satisfactory by an officer of his Department.
- (vii.) Every applicant shall satisfy the Postmaster-General that he is technically competent to work the apparatus.
- (viii.) Every person to whom a transmitting licence is issued, shall provide himself with an approved type of wave meter, or other suitable contrivance, to ensure that the frequencies are held definitely within the authorized band.

(ix.) The frequencies allotted shall be limited to one or more of the following bands :-

56,000 to 60,000 kilocycles.

28,000 to 30,000 b.

14,000 to 14,400

7,000 to 7,300

3,500 to 4,000 f. 1,715 to 2,000

Applicants shall specify the ranges they desire.

- (x.) Normally there shall be no restriction as to the hours during which the apparatus may be worked; but every station shall, upon receipt of any notice issued in that behalf by the Telegraph Department or the Naval or Military authorities, cease transmitting for such periods as may be specified therein.
- 2. Form B in the schedule attached to the aforementioned rules is hereby amended:
- (i.) by the deletion of condition 5 and the substitution of the following therefor :-
 - Normally there shall be no restriction as to the hours during which the apparatus may be worked; but every station shall, upon receipt of any notice issued in that behalf by the Telegraph Department or the Naval or Military authorities, cease transmitting for such periods as may be specified therein.
- (ii.) by the addition of the following at the end of condition 8, namely :-
 - This licence does not authorize the licensee to do any act, which is an infringement of any copyright which may exist in the matter transmitted.
- (iii.) by the deletion of the note in the "schedule annexure" and the substitution of the following there-
 - The power authorized must not exceed 100 watts, measured in the case of a valve transmitter in the anode circuit, and in other cases at the equivalent point, subject to the conditions laid down in rule 5 (2) of the Wireless Telegraph Rules.

THE MOTOR CAR (CONVENTION) ORDINANCE, No. 25 of 1932.

REGULATIONS under section 2 (1) of the Motor Car (Convention) Ordinance, No. 25 of 1932, made by the Executive Committee of Local Administration, approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Governor.

REGULATIONS.

I.—Preliminary.

1. In these regulations "the Convention" means the International Convention relative to Motor Traffic signed at Paris on April 24, 1926.
2. (1) The prescribed officer, for the purpose of granting

and authenticating passes, certificates, authorities and other documents issued under the Ordinance, shall be the Registrar of Motor Cars appointed under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927 (hereinafter called "the Registrar").

(2) The prescribed association for the aforesaid purpose

shall be the Automobile Association of Ceylon or any other association that may from time to time be nominated by the Executive Committee of Local Administration by Notification in the Gazette.

II.—Issue of International Certificates for Motor Vehicles.

Any person ordinarily resident in Ceylon may obtain in the manner hereinafter prescribed, international authorization to take abroad, for the purposes of travel, any motor vehicle of which he is the owner or of which he is otherwise in lawful possession.

2. An application for such authorization shall be forwarded to the Registrar or to the prescribed association, in the Form 1 set out in Schedule I. to these regulations, together with the Certificate of the registration of the vehicle, and proof of the payment of the licence duty due on the vehicle for the year in which such application is

made.
3. Every vehicle in respect of which such application is made, shall be examined by a special examiner, appointed for the purpose by the Registrar, or nominated by the prescribed association with the written approval of the Registrar.

Before the vehicle is examined an examination fee of Rs. 5 for a car or Rs. 2.50 for a motor cycle, shall be paid

to the examiner by the applicant.
5. If the vehicle is approved by the examiner and certified by him to be in conformity with Article 3 of the Convention, the applicant shall forward to the Registrar or to the prescribed association a fee of Rs. $2\cdot 50$ in revenue stamps.

(1) The applicant shall further cause a distinguishing mark, consisting of the letters CL of the size and description, set out in Annex C to the Convention, and reproduced in Schedule II. hereto, to be affixed to the rear of the vehicle, either on a special plate according to the specifications in Annex C or on the vehicle itself.

(2) Such mark shall remain so affixed throughout the

period during which the vehicle is abroad.

7. An International Certificate for the vehicle so approved and marked shall thereupon be issued in the Form set out in Annex B to the Convention under the hand and seal of the Registrar, or where the Certificate is issued by the prescribed association, authenticated with the seal and signature of the Registrar; and such Certificate shall, if the conditions laid down in the Convention continue in all respects to be fulfilled and observed, be valid for one year from the date thereof.

III.—Issue of International Driving Permits.

Any person ordinarily resident in Ceylon may obtain, in the manner hereinafter prescribed, an International Driving Pass, in these regulations to be called Permit,

authorizing him to drive a motor vehicle, whilst travelling abroad in any of the contracting states or the states or territories that have acceded to the Convention.

An application for such Permit shall be in the Form 2in Schedule I., and may be forwarded either to the Registrar

or to the prescribed association.

3. Every applicant shall be examined by a special examiner, appointed for the purpose by the Registrar, or nominated by the prescribed association with the written approval of the Registrar.

The applicant shall pay such examiner an examina-

tion fee of Rs. 5.

If the applicant is found after such examination to fulfil the conditions of Article 6 of the Convention, he shall forward to the Registrar or to the prescribed association a 6. An International Driving Permit, in the Form set

out in Annex E to the Convention, shall thereupon be issued to him under the hand and seal of the Registrar, or where the Permit is issued by the prescribed association, authenticated with the seal and signature of the Registrar.
7. Every such Permit shall specify the class or classes

of vehicles that the holder thereof is authorized to drive; and for the purposes of these regulations, the following shall be substituted for the classification of motor cars set out in section 37 (9) of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927:—

Class I.-Motor vehicles of which the total weight when loaded with the maximum load which it is officially declared to be capable of carrying does not exceed 7,700 lb.

Class II.-Motor vehicles of which the total weight made

up as above exceeds 7,700 lb. Class III.—Motor cycles with or without a side car.

IV.—Recognition of International Certificates and Driving Permits.

- 1. (1) The provisions of sections 18, 21, and 24, and of sections 30 and 32 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, relating to the registration of motor cars and the cancellation of such registration and to the payment of licence duty thereon, shall not apply to any motor vehicle in respect of which there is produced an International Certificate, issued by any of the contracting states or by any of the states or territories that have acceded to the Convention, and valid within the meaning of Article 4 of the Convention.
- (2) Any such vehicle may be used in Ceylon, free of licence duty, for a period not exceeding 90 days from the date of its arrival, if—
 - (a) the Certificate has been produced before the Registrar and duly endorsed by him for use in Ceylon; and
 - (b) the holder of the Certificate is proved to the satisfaction of the Registrar to be a bona fide visitor to Ceylon; and
 - (c) the vehicle conforms to the requirements of Article 3 of the Convention.
- 2. If the period during which any such vehicle is used in Ceylon exceeds 90 days, licence duty for the whole period, reckoned from the date of arrival, shall be paid in Ceylon revenue stamps at the following rates: Rs. c.

For a motor cycle, for each complete month 1 0 or any part thereof For a car or a trailer not exceeding 15 cwt., for each complete month or any part 2 50 For a car or a trailer exceeding 15 cwt., for each complete month or any part thereof.

- 3. (1) In lieu of the provisions of section 38 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, the provisions of this regulation shall apply to any International Driving Permit issued to any person who is a bona fide visitor to Ceylon by any of the contracting states or the states or territories that have acceded to the Convention.
- (2) Any such person shall be deemed to possess a Certificate of competence issued under the provisions of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and to be authorized to drive the class of vehicle specified in the Permit,
 - (a) if the Permit is valid within the meaning of Article 7
 - of the Convention; and
 (b) if before he drives any vehicle in Ceylon he produces the Permit for inspection by the Registrar; and
 - (c) if he fulfils in all respects the conditions set out in Article 6 of the Convention
- (1) The provisions of section 39 (1) of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, relating to the suspension, cancellation, and endorsement, by the Court, of the Certificate of competence held by any person convicted of an offence against the said Ordinance, shall not apply to any bona fide visitor to Ceylon holding an International Driving Permit.

PART I. (GENERAL) — CEYLON GOVERNMENT 2028 (2) In the event of any such visitor being convicted of an offence punishable in Ceylon with the suspension or cancellation of the Certificate of competence, the Registrar may in his discretion make an order, in the Form 4 in Annex E to the Convention, depriving such visitor of the right to drive in Ceylon. 5. Save as aforesaid, the provisions of Chapters I, II, IV, VI, VIII, VIII, and X of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, so far as they are not inconsistent with the tenor of these regulations and the purposes of the Convention, shall apply to every motor vehicle brought to Ceylon on the authority of an International Certificate, and to every person visiting Ceylon with an International Driving Permit. V.—Concessions to Visitors. 'The second schedule to the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, is hereby modified by the substitution in the last item thereof, relating to temporary Certificates of competence issued under section 37 (17), for the words "per month or part of a month", of the words "for the entire period of 3 months or for any part thereof". VI.—Supplementary. 1. It shall be the duty of the Principal Collector of Customs in Colombo and of the Sub-Collector of Customs

at Talaimannar, within one week of any motor vehicle, other than a vehicle imported by a recognized dealer, being passed for delivery to any person in Ceylon, to forward to the Registrar a complete description of such vehicle and the name and address of the person by or for whom it was brought to Ceylon.

2. No motor vehicle shall be permitted by the Customs

authority of any port in Ceylon, to be taken out of the Island without a Permit in that behalf issued under the

hand of the Registrar.

- 2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—
 - (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased;

(2) the name and address of the mortgagor;

- (3) and a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.
- 3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at 50 cents, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.
- 4. Such register shall be open for inspection at all times during the office hours of the Council; and a fee of 25 cents shall be paid by any person who desires to have such inspection.
- 5. In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising

such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

6. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 17, 1932.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 211 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 139 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 30 Moors, 9 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1932, viz., 289,961) was 38.0, as against 34.4 in the preceding week, 31.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 166 (1 European, 2 Burghers, 104 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 24 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.9, as against 28.7 in the previous week, 26.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 166 total deaths, 45 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Fort, St. Paul's, Kotabena North, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the preceding week was also 15, and the weekly average for last year was 17.

- (b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week and 10 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 4 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in San Sebastian, and I each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta South, as against 10 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.
- (b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.
- 3. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents). The number registered during the preceding week was also 2, and the weekly average for last year was 3.
- 4. One death from *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.
- 5. Fifteen deaths from Debility were registered, 13 from Enteritis, 6 each from Dysentery and Accidents, 5 from Worms, 3 from Infantile Convulsions, 2 each from Diarrhoea and Puerperal Septicaemia, 1 each from Homicide, Suicide, and Smallpox, and 70 from Other Causes.
- 6. Reported Cases.—Twenty-six cases of Measles, 23 of Smallpox, 12 of Chickenpox, 3 of Enteric Fever, and 1 each of Dphtheria and Plague were reported during the week, as against 25, 5, 8, 5, nil, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.6°, against 79.2° in the preceding week and 78.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.941 in., against 29.899 in. in the preceding week and 29.909 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.67 in., against 1.90 in. in the preceding week and 4.70 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Mr. de Silva having drawn the Council's attention to an incorrect report in a newspaper with regard to the water supply augmentation scheme, the Chairman stated that at his request the Director of Public Works came up to Kandy, on November 5, examined plans prepared by the Municipal Engineer to implement the Council's decision to augment supply by adopting a minor river scheme, visited the spot on the 6th instant and chose a point of intake and a suitable height in Peradeniya estate to which water might be pumped. The Director of Public Works was of opinion that these sites offered possibilities of a very feasible scheme.

The Chairman also added that the immediate permission of the Superintendent of the estate was obtained and a well was being dug at the point of intake and the Director of Public Works hopes, if the investigations are satisfactory, that this might serve as the actual well to be used in the scheme if and when adopted, and the Chairman assured the

Council that all steps are being taken to push the scheme forward without delay.

3B. On the suggestion of Messrs. Beven and Soysa the Chairman promised to see how far he could increase the present supply of reservoir water.

3c. Mr. Leader observed that if restrictions were imposed immediately the reservoir ceased to spill and the con-

sumption were limited to 600,000 gallons per diem, there would be no occasion to use lake water.

Arising from this observation Ratwatte Adigar moved:—"That the Chairman be authorized to restrict the supply in future immediately the reservoir stops spilling so that the daily consumption may not exceed 600,000 gallons during any period when the reservoir is below spill level." Mr. Leader seconded.—Carried.

- Petitions:—(a) Mr. Usoof Ismail presented a petition from the Principal of Dharmaraja College, applying for a lease of a portion of the Bogambara Green for use as a play ground for the College.

The Chairman agreed to consider the matters referred to in the petitions.

To sanction the appointment of Mr. A. K. Kaimal, Overseer, as Waterworks Inspector, in succession to Mr. V. Muthucumaroe, promoted.

Ratwatte Adigar moved:—"That the Council is of opinion that the post should be advertised by the Chairman and Mr. Kaimal's claims should be considered with those of other applicants." Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.

Mr. De Silva moved as an amendment:—"That the post be not filled and that Mr. Kaimal be asked to carry out the duties of a Waterworks Inspector while holding the position of an Overseer." Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, and the original motion was carried.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, in terms of section 98 of Ordinance No. 21 of 1929, on Saturday, December 10, 1932, at 8.30 a.m., to consider the Budget for 1933.

Present: Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail! Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. W. Beven; Dr. L. C. Wijesinha; Mr. T. H. Leader.

The Chairman submitted the draft budget for 1933, as tabled at the Meeting of Council held on November 19, 1932, and after a general explanation of the items under the main heads and a survey of the Council's financial position, moved the Council into Committee for its detailed consideration.

Messrs. De Silva, Wijayatilake, and Soysa offered comments of a general character, Mr. de Silva suggesting a cut

in salaries of officers.

Ratwatte Adigar seconded the Chairman's motion to go into Committee.

The Chairman in replying argued that in view of the Council's strong financial position a salary cut was uncalled for unless the budget could not be balanced, or the salaries of officers were shown to be disproportionately high. The Council then resolved into Committee and the following amendments were made in the Draft:-

GENERAL REVENUE ACCOUNT.—REVENUE.

(1) The item of Rs. 261,000 under Head 1, Consolidated Rates, was reduced to Rs. 259,920 owing to a sum of Rs. 1,570 included in the draft budget as rates on the railway track having been reported by Government as not payable in 1933, and a sum of Rs. 490 having become due as rates for 1933, on the hitherto unassessed area in Hewahetta-Talwatte.

- (2) The item of Rs. 4,400 under Head 2, Taxes on Vehicles and Animals, was reduced to Rs. 3,400 owing to the proposed reduction in the tax on pedal cycles from Rs. 3 to Re. 1 per annum.
- (3) The items of Rs. 60 and Rs. 1,900 under Head 4, Stamp Duties on Poison Licences and Firearms, were increased to Rs. 80 and Rs. 2,200, respectively.
- (4) The item of Rs. 600 under Head 7, Privilege Rents, was reduced to Rs. 400, and the items of Rs. 7,200, under Grain Shed Rents and Rs. 9,000 under Rents of Other Lands and Buildings were increased to Rs. 7,560 and Rs. 9,500, respectively.
 - (5) The item of Rs. 10,000 under Interest in Head 12, Miscellaneous Receipts, was increased to Rs. 11,400.

GENERAL REVENUE ACCOUNT.—EXPENDITURE.

- (6) The item of Rs. 125,425 · 63 was reduced to Rs. 124,429 · 63 by (a) deleting the item of Rs. 42 appearing as allowance to Mr. L. Don Lewis for attending sales, (b) deleting the item of Rs. 30 appearing as special allowance to ρeon Siyatu for overtime work, and (c) deleting item of Rs. 924 appearing as salary and allowance of Overseer, Works Department, the Council having agreed to abolish the post.
- 7) (a) The additional clerk in Grade III. applied for as a result of the amalgamation of the posts of Secretary and Accountant was sanctioned, (b) and the continuance of the allowance of Rs. 60 each to the Shroff and Accounts Clerk for Town Improvement work was considered and approved.
 - (8) It was resolved that no cut be made in the salaries of officers, Mr. de Silva dissenting.
- (9) (a) The item of Rs. 2,200 under Head la—Uniforms was reduced to Rs. 1,500, the Council having decided that hereafter each inspector should be supplied with only four suits of uniforms each year except in the first year of appointment when six suits may be supplied, (b) the item of Rs. 300 was increased to Rs. 350 to allow of the purchase of a bigger safe.
- (10) The present system of collection on a commission basis was considered. The Chairman pointed out that the item of Rs. 9,000 for commission to collectors under head 3 included Rs. 6,200 paid to the two rate collectors per annum, and, if the Council so desired a system of collection at the office could be organized at a cost of approximately Rs. 2,700 which would result in an immediate saving of Rs. 3,500. After due consideration, the Council resolved to continue the present system of Collectors owing to its convenience to the Ratepayers and the item of Rs. 9,000 was passed.


