SCHEDULE B.

1. The inhabitants of each of the new subdivisions set out in column 2 of the foregoing Schedule A, shall be the successors of the inhabitants of the original subdivision set out in column 1 of the said schedule, for all such purposes of the Ordinance as may relate to that new subdivision.

2. (i.) Any balance of the moneys deposited with the Government Agent and lying to the credit of the said original subdivision on June 30, 1934, shall be divided into two equal portions, and these portions credited to the respective accounts of the new subdivisions on July 1, 1934.

(ii.) All movable property of the inhabitants of the original subdivision, shall be deemed to be vested in two equal shares in the respective inhabitants of the two new subdivisions.

(iii.) All immovable property vested in the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall be deemed to be vested in the inhabitants of the new subdivision within which the property is situated.

3. All the rights, powers and duties, debts, liabilities, and obligations of the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall so far as they relate to any of the new subdivisions aforesaid be deemed to be transferred to the inhabitants of such new subdivision.

4. All rules now in force under the provisions of the Ordinance in the original subdivision, shall be in force in each of the new subdivisions aforesaid, as if they had been made by, or by virtue of the powers delegated by the inhabitants of the new subdivision.

5. The Committee now in office in the original subdivision shall not be deemed to have been dissolved by reason of the division of the said subdivision into new subdivisions as aforesaid, but shall remain in office until June 30, 1934, or until the respective fresh committees elected for the aforesaid new subdivisions come into office.

The committees now in office in the several subdivisions set out in column 1 of the said schedule shall not be deemed to have been dissolved by reason of the redefinition of the subdivisions set out in column 2 of the said schedule but shall remain in office until June 30, 1934, or until the respective fresh committees elected for the aforesaid redefined subdivisions come into office.

## "THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927."

REGULATIONS for the Urban area comprised within the administrative limits of the Local Board of Minuwangoda made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by sections 53 and 70 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

## REGULATIONS.

## 1. In these regulations—

"Board" means the Local Board of Minuwangoda.

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board.

"Public Stand" means any space within the administrative limits of the Board which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cars or omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries and indicated as such by a notice exhibited at the spot by or by the authority of the Chairman.

2. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing hiring cars or omnibuses or lorries to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

3. No vehicle other than a hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

4. No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall be parked in any public place except a public stand.

5. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

6. No hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

7. No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

8. The driver of every hiring car, omnibus, or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupies a public stand.

9. The driver of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupying a public stand shall when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman produce the permit issued in respect of such hiring car, omnibus, or lorry.

10. Every driver or other person in charge of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

For every motor car Re. 1.50 per mensem or 25 cents per diem.

For every omnibus or lorry Rs. 3 per mensem or 50 cents per diem.

## "THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892."

Ps. 210,878, 210,879, 210,505, 245,751, and of 210,507 as far as the south-eastern corner of the said T. P. 148,582; thence south-westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said T. P. 148,582 as far as the south-western corner of it; thence south-westwards in a straight line to the north-eastern corner of T. P. 51,173; thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said T. P. 51,173 crossing the Kirillapone-Padukka road to the south-eastern corner of the said T. P. 51,173; thence south-eastwards in a straight line to the north-eastern corner of T. P. 58,058; thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said T. P. 58,058 as far as the south-eastern corner of the said T. P. 58,058.

*South.*—From the above-mentioned point due west in a straight line through title plans 58,058, 58,057, 51,165 and through paddy lands crossing the Diyagama-Homagama road to a point about 19 chains west of the said Diyagama-Homagama road and about 4 chains south of the southern boundary of Kirillapone-Padukka road.

*West.*—From the above-mentioned point northwards in a straight line through paddy lands crossing the Kirillapone-Padukka road to the south-eastern corner of T. P. 51,178; thence northwards in a straight line through the said T. P. 51,178 and through Ketakalagahawatta and Kahatagahawatta crossing the Colombo-Homagama road and the railway line to the landmark on the south-western corner of T. P. 296,457; thence north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the road

to Aturugiriya as far as the landmark at the north-western corner of T. P. 296,455; thence due north in a straight line crossing the said road to Aturugiriya to the starting point of the northern boundary."

## "THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892."

IT is hereby notified that under the provisions of section 3 of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892, the following resolution was passed by the State Council at the public session held on February 14, 1934 :—

"That this Council resolves that the resolution of the Legislative Council dated July 13, 1910, bringing the town of Ulapane in the Kandy District of the Central Province under the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892, be amended by substituting for the limits set out in the said resolution, the following limits, namely :—

*North.*—From a point 83 yards due west from the centre of the Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road at culvert No. 18/10 eastward in a straight line crossing the Railway line and the said road at culvert No. 18/10 up to a point 200 yards due east from the centre of the road at the said culvert No. 18/10.

*East.*—From the last mentioned point southwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 200 yards to the east from the centre of the said Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road as far as the left bank of the Mahaweli-ganga; thence south-westwards along the left bank of the said Mahaweli-ganga crossing the Ulapane-oya up to a point where the right bank of the Ulapane-oya meets the left bank of the Mahaweli-ganga (the confluence of the Ulapane-oya with the Mahaweli-ganga).

*South.*—From the last mentioned point south-westwards in a straight line crossing the river side Public Works Department road at culvert No. 3 up to a point 200 yards to the south-east from the centre of the Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road and 316 yards to the south-west from the aforesaid point where the right bank of Ulapane-oya meets the left bank of the Mahaweli-ganga; thence south-westwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 200 yards to the south-east from the centre of the said Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road up to a point 200 yards to the south-east (and at right angles to the road) from the centre of the said road at culvert No. 19/11; thence north-westwards in a straight line crossing the said Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road at the said culvert No. 19/11 and continuing for 83 yards beyond the said culvert No. 19/11.

*West.*—From the last mentioned point north-eastwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the north-west from the centre of the said Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road up to a point 83 yards to the west from the centre of the said road (near 18th milestone); thence northwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the west from the centre of the above-mentioned road and crossing the Ulapane-oya as far as the point where it is also 83 yards to the south from the centre of the road leading to the Raja-ela estate; thence north-westwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the south from the centre of the said road leading to Raja-ela estate as far as a point which is 83 yards to the south and 50 yards to the south-east at right angles from the centre of the said road at the bend near the masonry steps to the Post Office; thence south-westwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 50 yards to the south-east from the centre of the said road leading to Raja-ela estate crossing the Galahetiyyaya-ela up to a point 116 yards to the south-west from the centre of the Galahetiyyaya-ela; thence north-westwards in a straight line up to the centre of the level crossing (a distance of 53 yards); thence westwards and south-westwards across the Railway line and along the centre of the said road leading to Raja-ela estate up to a point 50 yards

REGULATION.

The regulations published by Notification in the *Gazette* of August 21, 1925, are hereby amended by the deletion of regulations 11 and 12 of the regulations under section 9E (2) (a), (b), (c) relating to latrines, and the substitution of the following therefor:—

11. (1) Permission may be granted in writing by the Chairman to any householder to have night soil, from any dry-earth closet or cesspit on his premises, buried or otherwise disposed of in some place specified for that purpose.

(2) It shall be an offence for any householder, without such written permission from the Chairman, to cause or permit night soil to be buried or otherwise disposed of on his premises or in any other place.

(3) It shall be an offence for any householder whose premises are provided with a dry-earth closet or closets to pollute or to permit the pollution of any other part of such premises, or any land belonging to any other person or the Crown or any public or waste land or the seashore within the limits of any Sanitary Board town in this district.

12. (1) Every householder occupying premises provided with a dry-earth closet, who has not been granted permission under the last preceding regulation to have night soil buried or otherwise disposed of, shall pay to the Board each month a fee at the rate of half per cent. per month on the assessed annual value of such premises.

(2) Any default in the payment of such fee before the 10th day of the month following that in respect of which it is due, shall be an offence; and the amount of fee, in respect of which default has been made, shall in all such cases be included in the fine imposed by the court for such offence and shall on recovery be paid to the Board.

Provided that the occupier or the owner of any premises who has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that such premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month, and subsequently satisfies the Chairman that the premises have not in fact been occupied during such month, shall not be liable to pay the aforesaid fee in respect of such month.

BY-LAWS.

1. The following area is hereby assigned to the public markets established by the Council, and shall be called the Bandarawela Market area, viz:—

The area bounded on the north by the Dadamasketu-bokotuwa ambalam, situated about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile on the road to Welimada, a line along the well defined boundaries of title plans 124,063 and 118,037 as far as the junction of the latter with the road to Ettalapitiya, from the junction a straight line to the Circular road, from thence the Circular road with its 2-chain reservation until it leaves the Kabiliwela village boundary, and from that point a straight line to the bridge on the Badulla road over the Kabiliwelakandura.

*East.*—The Kabiliwelakandura and the smaller kandura named Etakehellanda alias Walasbeddekandura, which joins it, flowing along the eastern boundaries of title plans 114,303 and 121,082 (the latter being known as the Bush Bungalow), a line in continuation of the said kandura up to the bridge.

*South.*—Thence along the ridge westwards to the trigonometrical station known as Dambulkanda, thence along a trenched boundary so as to include the reservoir to the trigonometrical station called Bandarawela, thence a straight line to the 18th milepost on the main road to Haputale.

*West.*—Thence a straight line to the western limit of title plan 88,247 where it leaves Godapitawatta along the boundary of Godapitawatta to the junction of a cart road and footpath to Kahatawela, thence along a 1-chain

reservation to be marked on west of road to the boundary of title plan 115,979, along the eastern boundary of title plan 115,979 to the road leading to Welimada near the ambalam called Dadama ketubokotuwa.

2. No person shall sell or expose for sale within the Bandarawela Market area any meet, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables, except in the public market.

Provided that this by-law shall not be deemed to apply—

- (a) to the sale of poultry, fruit, or vegetables by itinerant vendors as defined in section 163 (5) of the Ordinance; or
- (b) to the sale by the licensee of an eating-house or tea or coffee boutique, of fruits for consumption on the premises; or
- (c) to the sale by any person of oranges and young coconuts within the market area.

3. Any person duly authorized by the Chairman, may sell at the Sunday Fair held within the administrative limits of the Urban District Council, Bandarawela, any article, except fresh fish, fresh meat, rice, bread, confectionery, and sweet drinks (exclusive of aerated waters).

6. Any person committing a breach of the foregoing by-law shall be guilty of an offence and where such offence is not punishable under section 162 of the Ordinance shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for each such offence.

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**"THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE,  
No. 19 OF 1915."**

THE following resolution passed by the State Council at a meeting held on February 14, 1934, is published for general information:—

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of "The Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915", that from and after the first day of December, 1933, the said Ordinance shall be in force in the portions of the villages of Opata and Tulhiriya of the Otara pattu in Beligal korale of the Kegalla District in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, defined by the following boundaries:—

*North.*—The southern bank of the Maha-oya starting from the confluence of the water-course (west of title plan No. 96,924) with the said Maha-oya north-eastwards as far as the confluence of the Ragala-oya with the said Maha-oya.

*East.*—The western bank of the Ragala-oya starting from the confluence of the said Ragala-oya with the Maha-oya southwards as far as the north-eastern corner of title plan No. 110,213.

*South.*—The northern boundary of the said title plan No. 110,213, the eastern and northern boundaries of Wedikandekumbura (the western boundary of title plan No. 110,212 and the southern boundary of title plan No. 106,055), the western boundary of Wedikandekumbura (the eastern and southern boundaries of title plan No. 96,926 and the eastern boundaries of title plans Nos. 96,927 and 96,930), the western boundary of Pahalakumbura (the eastern boundary of title plan No. 385,692), the northern boundary of Marikalawatta (the southern boundary of title plan No. 96,930), the northern boundary of title plan No. 96,931, the western boundary of the said title plan No. 96,931 as far as the Rock landmark on the north-eastern corner of lot 12 in P. P. 3,906, by a direct line from the said Rock landmark south-westwards through lots 12, 11, 10, 8, 7, and 14 in P. P. 3,906 (Paspolakandemukulana *alias* Wedikandemukulana) and lot 9 in P. P. 3,906 (Paspolakandemukulana) to the north-eastern corner of title plan No. 96,942, and by the northern boundary of the said title plan No. 96,942 westwards as far as the Paluwattelela.

*West.*—The eastern bank of the Paluwattelela (the western boundary of title plan No. 96,943) from the north-western corner of title plan No. 96,942 northwards as far as the point where it meets the water-course, the eastern bank of the water-course (the western boundary of title plan No. 96,943) from the above-mentioned point northwards as far as the point where it meets the eastern boundary of Kalukondiwakumbura, the eastern boundary of Kalukondiwakumbura (the western boundary of title plan No. 96,943) from the above-mentioned point northwards as far as the point where it meets the road from Colombo to Polgahawela near the

40th milestone, the southern boundary of the above road from the above-mentioned point westward as far as the point where the water-course crosses the above road, and the eastern bank of the said water-course (western boundary of title plan No. 96,924) from the above-mentioned point northwards as far as the confluence of the said water-course with the Maha-oya (the starting point of the northern boundary).

**RULES.**

*Rules relating to the Election of Members of  
Village Committees.*

1. (1) It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to depute any officer of Government other than a Chief Headman to conduct any election held under the provisions of these rules.

(2) In these rules the expression "presiding officer" shall mean the Government Agent conducting an election or any officer deputed by him for the purpose as aforesaid.

2. It shall be the duty of the Government Agent—

(1) to appoint one or more convenient places within each subdivision for the meeting of the inhabitants of the various wards thereof for the purpose of electing members, and

(2) to provide at each of the places so appointed such facilities as he may consider necessary for enabling voters to place ballot-papers in the ballot-boxes without being observed by any person.

3. (1) No person shall be permitted to vote at, or take any part in, any meeting held under these rules, who is not a duly qualified inhabitant of the ward for which the election is held.

(2) The presiding officer shall have power to inquire into and decide every question arising in the course of any meeting as to the identity or the qualifications of any person nominated as a candidate, or proposing or seconding the name of any candidate, or claiming the right to vote; and the decision of the presiding officer in any such matter shall, for all the purposes of that election and for those purposes only, be final and conclusive.

4. The candidate for election shall be nominated orally, each name being formally proposed and seconded by two duly qualified inhabitants of the ward.

5. The name of every candidate so nominated if he consents, whether orally or in writing, to stand for election, shall be recorded by the presiding officer together with the names of the proposer and the seconder.

6. If there is only one candidate whose name is so recorded, the presiding officer shall declare that candidate duly elected.

7. If there are two or more candidates whose names are so recorded, the presiding officer shall—

(1) announce their names, and direct a poll to be held, allotting to each of them the colour or combination of colours which is to distinguish the ballot-boxes for the receipt of ballot-papers in favour of that candidate;

(2) cause a notice to be posted up in a conspicuous position setting out the names of the candidates and the respective colours or combinations of colours allotted to them; and

(3) display the empty ballot-boxes to the meeting, and so place the boxes in any convenient room, enclosure, or the like, as to render it impossible for any person to observe any voter placing his ballot-paper in any of the boxes.

8. On the completion of the aforesaid arrangements or of such others as he may consider necessary, the presiding officer shall declare the poll open and proceed to issue

to each qualified inhabitant presenting himself as a voter, a ballot-paper bearing on its back the official mark previously selected by the presiding officer for the purpose of authenticating the ballot-papers.

9. (1) The voter shall thereupon place the ballot-paper without undue delay in the box bearing the colour or combination of colours allotted to the candidate of his choice.

(2) Where any voter is unable, through any physical incapacity or for any other reason to distinguish a ballot-box of any particular colour, it shall be lawful for the presiding officer to give him such explanation or such assistance as may be necessary to enable the voter to place his ballot-paper in the box allotted to the candidate of his choice; but in so doing the presiding officer shall not say anything or do any act which is capable of being construed by the voter as advice or direction to vote for any particular candidate.

10. When all the duly qualified inhabitants present at the meeting have been given an opportunity to record their votes, the presiding officer shall—

- (1) formally declare the poll closed; and
- (2) open the ballot-boxes in the presence of the candidates and count or cause to be counted the ballot-papers in the respective boxes of the candidates.

11. (1) The candidate whose box contains the largest number of authentic ballot-papers shall be declared duly elected.

(2) Where the same number of authentic ballot-papers is found in the boxes of two or more candidates, the matter shall be decided by the presiding officer by causing lots to be drawn in his presence in such manner as he may in his discretion specify, and the candidate on whom such lot falls shall be declared duly elected.

12. The presiding officer may take all such steps as may be necessary for the identification of voters and for the orderly conduct of the elections, and may, for the purpose of preventing undue delay in the recording of votes or the secretion, removal, or misuse of ballot-papers or any tampering with the boxes, at any time enter the room, enclosure, or place where the ballot-boxes are kept.

1. (1) It shall be lawful for any officer authorized by the Chairman of the Village Committee, to seize, if it appears to him to be unwholesome or unfit for human food, any meat, poultry, fish, game, flesh, vegetable, fruit, or other article of food introduced into or exposed for sale within any market, fair, bakery, eating house, tea or coffee boutique, provision boutique, or any other place within the subdivision and upon such seizure to carry the same to the nearest Medical Officer, or Government Apothecary, or to the Chairman of the Village Committee.

(2) If it is certified by the Medical Officer, or Government Apothecary or found by the Chairman of the Village Committee that such meat, poultry, fish, game, flesh, vegetable, fruit, or other article of food is unfit for human consumption, the Chairman may order the same to be destroyed or to be so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for food.

*Flesh of Dead Animals.*

2. No person shall sell, or expose for sale the flesh of any animal that has died of disease or by drowning or has been killed by the bite of a snake or by a wild beast.

**KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.****The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 20, 1934, at 8 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated January 16, 1934.**

Present: Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Ussoof Ismail; Mr. Walter Beven; Dr. L. C. Wijesinha; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. O. T. Nettelton.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on December 16, 1933, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

## 2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1932 to December 31, 1933, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to November 30, 1933.
- (c) Health Officer's report for December, 1933.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1933.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended January 20, 1934.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

## 3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

- (a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during December, 1933.
- (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(1) petition from Mr. T. J. Hassan dated January 18, 1934, asking the Council to grant him the concession of paying the arrears of rates due by him in instalments, which the Chairman had refused on a report from the Council's Lawyer; and Ratwatte Adigar presented (2) petition from Mr. T. M. Sarnelis and others dated January 19, 1934, praying that they be allowed to continue to carry on the business of laundrymen on the Municipal land in Torrington road.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.

4A. Dr. Attygalle having drawn Chairman's attention to the large number of cars used for hiring purposes with private-car number plates, the Chairman explained that he had already forwarded to the Police a list of cars suspected to be so used, and also had addressed the Municipal Magistrate, and that he would further consider addressing Government on the subject.

5. (1) Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijayatilake moved—"That a Playground Instructor be appointed by the Municipal Council to be in charge of the Municipal Playgrounds." Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

After some discussion the motion was withdrawn, the Chairman having undertaken to prepare a list of lands now available or could be made available for use as Playgrounds.

5. (2) The motion that stood in the name of Mr. Wijayatilake "that the conservancy rate added to the consolidated rate be charged only from those houses which are conserved, whatever the situation of such houses may be," was ruled by the Chairman as out of order under by-law 19A on the following grounds :—

On September 23, 1933, the following resolution was passed :—"That the present system of charging bucket fees be abolished as from January 1, 1934, and that a rate of 2½ per cent. be levied as part of the consolidated rates in lieu thereof in the areas served by Conservancy subject to the passing of the necessary enabling legislation before January 1, 1934."

The necessary legislation has been passed by Ordinance No. 33 of 1933, and provides for exemption from the 2½ per cent. rate of all houses, building, land, and tenements within areas not benefited by the Conservancy service.

Mr. Wijayatilake's motion proposes to exempt all houses not conserved within the areas served by conservancy.

The proposal is contrary to the motion adopted by Council in September, 1933, and to the legislation contained in the New Ordinance, No. 33 of 1933.

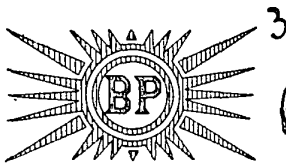

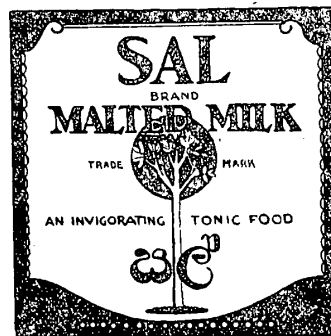
