Preferential Tariff Treatment of Goods consigned to India.

IT is hereby notified that, with a view to guarding against fraudulent claims for preference and to protect importers of genuine Empire goods against fraudulent competition, the Government of India has decided that in future a copy of the certified invoice tendered with the bill of entry should be surrendered for retention by the Customs House. This requirement will involve the preparation of an additional copy of the invoice, where a copy is intended to be retained by the importer.

2. The new procedure is to be brought into immediate operation, but for a period of three months from December 16, 1933, locally-prepared copies of invoices accompanying goods to be admitted into India at preferential rates of duty will be accepted by the Collectors of Customs in India in lieu of copies signed by the supplier or manufacturer, where these are not available.

Preliminary Report on the Vital Statistics of Ceylon, 1933.

(N.B.—Figures are subject to revision.)

The Vital Statistics of 1933 present the following features in relief:—

- the marriage rate, 10·0, is the lowest recorded during the last decennium with the exception of the year 1931 when it was 9·9;
- the birth rate, 38·6, was somewhat higher than in 1931 and 1932;
- the death rate, 21·2, was slightly higher than in 1932 but is one of the lowest recorded;
- the infant mortality rate, 157, is the lowest recorded in recent times.

Population.

2. The estimated population of the Island on December 31, 1933, was 5,463,200. The excess of births over deaths during the year was 94,347 and of emigrants over immigrants 58,170.

Marriages.

3. The number of General and Kandyan marriages registered during the year was 25,173 (19,721 under the General Marriage Ordinance and 5,452 under the Kandyan Marriage Ordinance), and corresponded to a rate of 10·0 per 1,000 of the population exclusive of Muslims as against 10·1 in 1932. Among the Muslims 1,294 marriages were registered, and the marriage rate was 7·1 per 1,000 of the Muslim population as against 6·9 in 1932. There were 126 divorces under the General and 501 under the Kandyan law.

Births.

4. The number of births registered was 209,039 (107,059 males and 101,980 females), which corresponded to a rate of 38·6 per 1,000 of the estimated population as against 37·0 in 1932. There were 1,050 male to every 1,000 female births. In the principal towns of the Island 25,899 births were registered during the year as against 22,758 in 1932. The birth rate in the city of Colombo was 32·6. On the estates 26,978 births were registered as against 27,036 in the previous year.

Deaths.

5. 114,692 deaths (57,893 males and 56,799 females) were registered in 1933. These were equivalent to a rate of 21·2 per 1,000 of the estimated population as against 20·5 in the previous year. There were 21,236 deaths in the principal towns as compared with 19,643 in 1932. The death rate in the city of Colombo was 27·1. 12,865 deaths were registered on the estates as against 13,723 in 1932.

Infant Mortality.

6. There were 32,866 deaths of infants under one year of age. This represents about 29 per cent. of the total deaths registered during the year. The infant death rate was 157 per 1,000 births registered as against 162 in the previous year. The rate for 1933 is the lowest recorded in recent times. In the principal towns the infant death rate was 177, and in the city of Colombo 173. The rate on the estates was 184 as against 194 in 1932.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Thursday, January 18, 1934, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated January 11, 1934.**

Present:—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting and the Special Meeting of December 2, 1933, copies thereof having been furnished to each Member were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Three petitions were presented by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka, two by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, and one each by Messrs. E. A. Paulas, Thomas Amarasuriya, and F. Magdon Ismail. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. The Chairman moved:—That a Committee of this Council consisting of the following members be appointed to report on the future development of the Esplanade:—The Provincial Engineer as convener, Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. E. M. Karunaratna.

Two shall form a quorum and the following points should be specifically considered:—(i.) the desirability of completely enclosing the esplanade with a fence; (ii.) the allocation of the grounds for the use of cricket, football, and hockey; (iii.) the desirability of procuring a motor mower; (iv.) the possibility of the Council gaining sufficient control over the grounds so that their use in unsuitable weather shall be preventible. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded.—Carried unanimously.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka:—That the new rating of properties belonging to Buddhist Temples, Mosques, and other religious bodies be postponed for another six months.

The motion was ruled out of order by the Chairman on the ground that it is *ultra vires* for the Council or for anyone to postpone the collection of rates from rateable properties.

Mr. Dahanayaka then asked the leave of Council to move the motion in the following amended form:—That the new rating of properties belonging to Buddhist Temples, Mosques, and other religious bodies be suspended for another six months. This motion was also ruled out of order by the Chairman for the same reason.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved:—That seven collectors be appointed for the seven wards of the Municipality. Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded. Mr. J. E. Perera opposed the motion. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the meeting and declared lost, the mover and seconder only voting for.

6. To elect, by ballot, members to form the Four Standing Committees for the year 1934:—A ballot was taken and the Chairman declared that the following members had been elected:—
