WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Pahala Neboda village in Iddagoda pattu, Pasdun korale west, of the Kalutara District, Western Province, a cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," establish as from the date hereof a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in the Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of section 11 of the said Ordinance.

ORDER.

WHEREAS the expenses, costs and charges of administering and carrying out the provisions of the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 24 of 1922, and the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 22 of 1927, up to and including the thirty-first day of October, 1928, and all other expenses authorized under section 3 (1) of the Rubber Restriction Repeal Ordinance, 1928, have been duly paid:

And whereas a surplus in excess of the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Rupees hereinafter mentioned now remains to the credit of the Rubber Restriction Fund established by the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 24 of 1922, after the payment of the aforesaid costs, charges and expenses and of such sums as may have been authorized by any Order heretofore made under section 3 (2) of the Rubber Restriction Repeal Ordinance, 1928:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by section 3 (2) of the Rubber Restriction Repeal Ordinance, 1928, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Reginald Edward Stubbs, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby order that a sum not exceeding Twenty-five Thousand Rupees out of the surplus now remaining to the credit of the Rubber Restriction Fund established by the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 24 of 1922, may be applied to the payment of such costs, charges and expenses as may be incurred in the investigation and preparation of such measures as may be or become necessary in the event of the establishment of a system of restricting or controlling the export or production of rubber.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

The following rule shall be added as rule No. 25 to the rules passed by the Local Board of Moratuwa, relating to pensions to officers of the Local Board, published in the *Government Gazette* of February 23, 1917, and deemed to be the rules of the Council under the provisions of section 247 of “The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920” :—

*Preaching or Holding Meetings on Thoroughfares
prohibited.*

No person shall preach or address any assembly or crowd or hold any meeting on any thoroughfare within the limits of the Nawalapitiya Urban District Council area, except in pursuance of a permit from the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within the times and limits specified in such permit. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

Ward No. 6. Muthur F.—Area bounded on the north by Muthur village road, south by Fourth Cross road, east by Muthur village road, and west by Kulathadi road.

Ward No. 7. Muthur G.—Area bounded on the north by Fourth Cross road, south by the southern boundary of Muthur village, east by the eastern boundary of Muthur village, and west by Kulathadi road.

Ward No. 8. Muthur H.—Area bounded on the north by Church road, south by Muthur village road, east by Village Tribunal Court road, and west by Kollan-aru road.

Ward No. 9. Muthur I.—Area bounded on the north by Trincomalee-Batticaloa road, south by Church road, east by Fifth Cross road, and west by Kollan-aru road.

RULES RELATING TO THE EXAMINATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY OF MASTERS OR MATES OF COASTWISE VESSELS OF LESS THAN 1,500 TONS' BURTHEN REGISTERED IN THE ISLAND.

1. Applications for examination should be made in writing to the Master Attendant, Colombo, and should be accompanied by a remittance of the prescribed fee (which is Rs. 10 for the Master's Certificate and Rs. 5 for the Mate's Certificate).

2. Every candidate should also annex to his application copies, and be prepared to produce the originals whenever called upon, of certificates and testimonials regarding service, sobriety, conduct, and ability from the Masters of vessels in which he has served the period of training herein-after prescribed.

3. Candidates will be informed in due course of the date and place appointed for the examination.

Mate's Certificate.

4. A candidate for a Mate's Certificate must be not less than 20 years of age and must have served 5 years at sea in the performance of deck duties in a seagoing vessel of a burthen of not less than fifty tons.

5. Every candidate will be required to undergo a medical examination to test his eyesight, hearing, and general physical fitness, and to satisfy the examiners of his proficiency in, or practical or working knowledge of, the following subjects of examination:—

- reading and writing legibly either English or one of the Indian or Ceylonese languages;
- elementary arithmetic, including both simple and compound processes;
- the use of a Mercator's Chart; reading the signs and laying a course from port to port on the Chart; taking bearings, correcting them for deviation of the compass, laying them on the Chart, and fixing the position of the ship by cross bearings and measuring distances on the Chart;
- the variation and the method of converting true bearings to Magnetic and *vice versa*;
- the use of the Indian tide tables;
- the International Code of signals and signals of distress and signals to be made by vessels requiring a pilot;
- the regulations for preventing collisions at sea;
- lead and log lines and the marking and use thereof;
- anchoring, mooring, and boat-work;
- the use of the barometer and the thermometer;
- the log-book and the entries to be made therein;
- the general requirements of practical seamanship, and the duties of a Mate generally.

Master's Certificate.

6. A candidate for a Master's Certificate must be not less than 22 years of age and must have served for one year as Mate in a seagoing vessel of a burthen of not less than fifty tons.

7. Every candidate for a Master's Certificate must possess a certificate of proficiency in First Aid to the Injured from the St. John's Ambulance Association.

8. Every candidate for a Master's Certificate will be required to satisfy the examiners of his proficiency in, or practical or working knowledge of, the subjects specified above in respect of the Mate's Certificate, and the following additional subjects:—

- the methods of correction of a vessel's course for current, of correction of soundings for use of tide, and of computing the error of the compass by amplitude or azimuth;
- methods of saving crew and passengers in the event of wreck, and the steps to be taken in the event of the vessel being disabled or in order to avoid a cyclonic storm;
- the weather conditions prevailing at various seasons of the year, and the different routes to be taken on the Indian coast during the various seasons;
- the elements of managing a vessel, and the duties of a Master generally.

9. The rules dated June 17, 1864, published in the *Gazette* No. 3,434 of June 18, 1864, are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

Preliminary.

1. In these regulations—

“Sanitary Authority” means the Medical Officer of Health of the Northern Province or other Medical Officer specially appointed by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, or any officer acting under the directions whether special or general of such Medical Officer.

“Camp” means any Chank Fishery Camp in the District of Mannar declared by Notification under section 7 of the Ordinance.

“Camp Superintendent” means the Assistant Government Agent, Mannar, or any officer acting under his directions whether special or general.

2. No person shall obstruct the Camp Superintendent or the Sanitary Authority or any member of their respective staffs acting under their directions whether special or general.

Sites.

3. No site within the camp limits shall be occupied for the erection of any boutique, hut, tent, or other building or enclosure, without a permit from the Camp Superintendent, obtained by the Sammaddi or other person in charge of the fishing crew proposing to use such site.

4. No person engaged in chank fishing shall reside or store chanks in any place other than the area appointed therefor by the Camp Superintendent from time to time.

Water Supply.

(5) No person engaged in chank fishing shall for any purpose use or attempt to use any private well or tank or any well or tank specially reserved for any religious institution.

6. (1) The Sanitary Authority may at any time inspect any vessel in which water is brought to the camp or any vessel in which water is stored in the camp.

(2) It shall be the duty of the owner or the person in actual possession of any such vessel to cause such vessel to be cleaned, scrubbed, or otherwise rendered fit for use as directed by the Sanitary Authority.

7. (1) It shall be lawful for the Camp Superintendent, by notice exhibited on the spot, to close any well or other source of water supply within the camp condemned as unfit or in any way harmful to the public health by the Sanitary Authority.

(2) It shall be an offence for any person to use any well or source so closed.

Latrines.

8. It shall be the duty of every Sammaddi to construct for the use of his crew at his own expense one or more latrines of such type as may be specified, and on such sites as may be selected for the purpose, by the Sanitary Authority.

9. (1) No person shall use for offices of nature any place other than a latrine so constructed and approved.

(2) All latrines shall be kept clean and in a sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Authority.

General Sanitation.

10. It shall be lawful for the Sanitary Authority to enter into or upon any building, yard, or premises within the camp for the purpose of ascertaining whether such building, yard, or premises are kept in a sanitary condition.

11. All refuse, rubbish, dirt, filth, sweepings, and the like shall be deposited in dust-bins or other suitable receptacles by the occupier of every building, and shall be removed daily beyond the limits of the camp and buried or otherwise disposed of to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Authority.

12. No hut or enclosure or any part of it used as a store house for chanks shall be used for cooking or sleeping.

Prevention of Disease.

13. Every person suffering from any infectious, contagious, or epidemic disease shall forthwith report the fact or cause it to be reported to the officer of the Sanitary Department stationed at the camp or to the nearest headman,

and it shall be the duty of every owner, occupier, tenant, lessee, or other resident of a building where such disease occurs to report such occurrence to the Sanitary Authority or the nearest headman.

14. Every medical practitioner or person professing to treat, or attending on, persons suffering from any of the above-mentioned diseases, shall forthwith report the fact to the Sanitary Authority or the nearest headman.

15. It shall be lawful for the Sanitary Authority, or the headman of the area at the request of the Sanitary Authority, to cause the responsible Sammaddi to remove any person suffering from any of the aforesaid diseases to the hospital or other place of observation for such period as may be deemed necessary.

16. It shall be lawful for the Sanitary Authority, or the headman of the area at the request of the Sanitary Authority, to cause any contact to be removed to any specified place for observation or to be kept under surveillance.

17. (1) It shall be lawful for the Sanitary Authority, or the headman of the area at the request of the Sanitary Authority, to cause any house or building, where any of the aforesaid diseases has occurred or is suspected to have occurred, to be disinfected together with all the contents thereof.

(2) No person shall remove any article from any such building or house until the aforesaid process of disinfection has been carried out.

18. It shall not be lawful for any person to conceal or remove, or aid in the removal of, or suppress information regarding, any person suffering from any infectious, contagious, or epidemic disease.

19. Whenever it is reported by the Sanitary Authority that an infectious, contagious, or epidemic disease is prevalent in an area, it shall be lawful for the Camp Superintendent to stop all chank fishing operations in that area, and in any case where he deems it necessary, to order all persons to leave all camps in that area and to prescribe the route and the mode of conveyance for their departure.
