The Ceylon Defence Force Regulations dated April 24, 1928 (*Gazette* No. 7,640 of April 27, 1928), as amended by the regulations dated August 30, 1928 (*Gazette* No. 7,661 of August 31, 1928); November 17, 1928 (*Gazette* No. 7,675 of November 23, 1928); February 2, 1929 (*Gazette* No. 7,692 of February 8, 1929); April 8, 1929 (*Gazette* No. 7,704 of April 12, 1929); July 1, 1929 (*Gazette* No. 7,721 of July 5, 1929); December 12, 1929 (*Gazette* No. 7,750 of December 13, 1929); December 18, 1929 (*Gazette* No. 7,751 of December 20, 1929); April 2, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,770 of April 4, 1930); April 8, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,771 of April 11, 1930); May 3, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,776 of May 8, 1930); May 23, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,780 of May 23, 1930); June 2, 4, and 5, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,783 of June 6, 1930); June 9, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,785 of June 13, 1930); October 9, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,809 of October 10, 1930); October 15, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,810 of October 17, 1930); October 28, 1930 (*Gazette* No. 7,812 of October 31, 1930); April 17, 1931 (*Gazette* No. 7,848 of April 24, 1931); June 10, 1931 (*Gazette* No. 7,860 of June 12, 1931); August 27, 1931 (*Gazette* No. 7,879 of September 4, 1931); January 30, 1932 (*Gazette* No. 7,904 of February 5, 1932); February 13, 1932 (*Gazette* No. 7,907 of February 19, 1932); March 29, 1932 (*Gazette* No. 7,916 of April 1, 1932); August 1, 1932 (*Gazette* No. 7,939 of August 12, 1932); October 31, 1932 (*Gazette* No. 7,951 of November 4, 1932); and September 6, 1933 (*Gazette* No. 8,003 of September 8, 1933) are hereby further amended as follows:—

1. In regulation 4, by the addition of the following new paragraph thereto:—

"The peace establishment of privately owned motor cycles and motor cars for which allowances may be paid,

is:—

Corps.	Motor cycles.	Light cars.	Medium cars.
C. E. .. .. .	6	—	—
C. M. R. .. .. .	12	13	6
C. P. R. C. .. .. .	12	—	—
C. A. S. C. .. .. .	4	—	—

*Definitions.*—In this regulation, the expression "light car" means any car of not more than 9 h.p.; and the expression "medium car" means any four seater car of more than 9 h.p."

2. By the addition of the following new regulations immediately after regulation 32:—

"32A. Except in the case of quartermasters, a lieutenant after at least six years' service, a captain, a major or a lieutenant-colonel may be promoted to the next higher rank by brevet in the C. D. F. for distinguished service in the field, or for meritorious or distinguished service of an exceptional nature rendered otherwise than in the field.

32B. Brevet rank is rank in the C. D. F. and in no way effects regimental seniority.

32C. Brevet rank does not absolve an officer from qualifying by examination for promotion to substantive rank.

32D. Except in the cases mentioned in regulation 33, promotions to brevet rank will normally be made once a year, on the Birthday of His Majesty the King."

3. In regulation 33, line 3, by the deletion of the words "honorary rank of Colonel" and the substitution thereof of the words "rank of brevet colonel".

4. In regulation 40, line 2, by the insertion after the word "sixty" of the words "or at such less age as may be prescribed in Corps Rules".

5. By the deletion of the sub-heading "(a) PAY" before regulation 188, and the substitution thereof of the words "(a) PAY AND ALLOWANCES—PERMANENT STAFF."

6. By the addition of the following new regulations immediately after regulation 193:—

"193A. The following motor car and motor cycle up-keep allowances will be paid, provided the officer and warrant officers concerned are in possession of motor vehicles suitable for military training:—

Adjutant C. M. R.—C. P. R. C. (for motor car)	Rs. 160 per annum.
Signal Instructor (for motor cycle)	Rs. 100 per annum.
C. M. R. Instructor (for motor cycle)	Rs. 100 per annum.
C. A. S. C. Instructor (for motor cycle)	Rs. 100 per annum.

193B. The following officers will be paid a horse allowance of Rs. 80 per mensem if in possession of a horse suitable for military purposes:—

Commandant.  
Staff Officer  
Adjutant, C. L. I.—C. C. B.

In addition the Adjutant, C. M. R.—C. P. R. C., will be paid the same allowance in respect of each of the Government horses in his charge."

7. By the deletion of regulation 200 and the substitution of the following thereof:—

"200. Mileage rates in the Defence Force are:—

For a motor car	.. .. .	30 cents a mile
For a motor cycle	.. .. .	10 cents a mile
Horse mileage	.. .. .	30 cents a mile
Half cart mileage	.. .. .	15 cents a mile

The mode of conveyance must be stated in the claim, and in the case of a motor car or motor cycle, the registered number must be given.

Only one person will be entitled to claim mileage in respect of one vehicle.

200A. Wherever possible, travelling on military duty must be performed by railway or other Government transport. Mileage for journeys actually performed, may be claimed subject to the following conditions:—

(a) When specially authorized by C. D. F. Headquarters, mileage may be claimed by members required to use their motor cars or motor cycles for military training. If the cars or cycles could be transported to and from the place of parade or camp by railway, half mileage only will be admissible for that portion of the journey.

(b) When a member is entitled under regulation 205A to a railway warrant for the conveyance of his motor car or motor cycle, he may instead of trucking his car or cycle, travel by road, both on the outward and the homeward journeys, and claim half mileage.

(c) When a member's station or home is 5 miles or more from the nearest railway station or place of parade, mileage may be claimed to and from the railway station or place of parade, provided in the latter case, the journey or any part of it could not have been performed by railway or other Government transport.

(d) Members who receive fixed allowances for the use of their motor cars or motor cycles for military training (see regulations 4, 193A, and 227B) will not normally be entitled to mileage. In special cases, however, C. D. F. Headquarters may authorize half mileage for travelling to and from the place of parade.

200B. The instructions contained in regulations 200 and 200A apply equally to officers and instructors of the Permanent Staff."

8. In regulation 204, by the deletion of the fourth sentence thereof.
9. In regulation 205, by the addition of the following at the end of line 11 thereof :—  
“ when specially authorized by C. D. F. Headquarters.”
10. By the addition of the following new regulation immediately after regulation 205 :—  
“ 205A. A railway warrant may be issued for the transport of an officer's or other rank's private motor car or motor cycle by rail, if certified by the Staff Officer that the vehicle is required to be used for military training or inspection at the end of the journey.”
11. In regulation 211 by the addition of the following at the end thereof :—  
“ Mob. Det. C. L. I. . . . . No. 11 ”
12. By the deletion of regulation 222 and the substitution of the following therefor :—  
“ 222. A daily forage allowance, to be fixed annually in consultation with the Colonial Storekeeper, and to be effective from 1st October, may be authorized by the Commandant for each C. M. R. horse attending parades and camps.”
13. By the deletion of regulation 227B and the substitution of the following therefor :—  
“ 227B. Subject to the provisions of regulation 227C, a member of the C. D. F. who uses a privately owned motor cycle or motor car for military training (see regulation 4) will be paid the following allowance for each parade performed at which he uses the motor cycle or motor car :—  

For a motor cycle	..	..	..	Rs. 5
For a light car	..	..	..	Rs. 6.50
For a medium car	..	..	..	Rs. 8”
14. By the renumbering of regulation 227C as regulation 227D and the insertion of the following as regulation 227C :—  
“ 227C. The total motor cycle and motor car allowances which will not be exceeded in any one training year, are :—  

In C. E., Rs. 600, and no individual may draw more than Rs. 100
In C. M. R., for motor cycles, Rs. 1,200, and no individual may draw more than Rs. 100; for light cars, Rs. 1,690, and no individual may draw more than Rs. 130; for medium cars, Rs. 960, and no individual may draw more than Rs. 160
In C. P. R. C., Rs. 1,200, and no individual may draw more than Rs. 100
In C. A. S. C., Rs. 400, and no individual may draw more than Rs. 100”
15. By the deletion of regulation 231A and the substitution of the following therefor :—  
“ 231A. O. C., C. M. R., will submit claims for forage allowance to C. D. F. Headquarters on the conclusion of the parade or camp for which the allowance is claimed. The claim will be accompanied by a certificate stating the number of horses per diem on parade or in camp.”
16. In regulation 236D by the deletion of the first three lines thereof and the substitution of the following therefor :—  
“ Claims for motor cycle and motor car allowances will be submitted to C. D. F. Headquarters on the conclusion of the parade or camp for which the allowance is claimed. Claims will show the members' name, the type of vehicle, and its registered number.”
17. In regulation 260, line 2, by the deletion of the words “ by the Governor ” and the substitution therefor of the words “ in Appendix B ”.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE,  
No. 9 OF 1924.

RULES under section 29 (1) (3) and (4) of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, made by the Village Committee of Dikwella Subdivision in Matara District in the Southern Province in pursuance of the powers delegated to the said Committee under section 14 (1) and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 30 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council.

RULES.

*Sub-sections (1) and (4), Village Markets.*

1. (a) The Committee may by resolution establish village markets where it considers such markets to be necessary.

(b) Every person using any stall, seat, or space in any village market established by the Committee shall pay for such use a fee according to the rates set out in the schedule hereto.

(c) Such fee shall be payable on demand to the Chairman or the person authorized by him to collect the fee.

(d) Any person failing or refusing without just cause to pay on demand as aforesaid any fees due from him in respect of the use of a village market shall be guilty of an offence.

2. The Committee may, by resolution, set apart any portion of a village market so established for the sale of specified articles, and no person shall expose for sale in any portion of the market so set apart any articles other than those specified.

3. No person shall hold, use, or occupy any stall in a village market without the permission of the Chairman, and no person shall keep or expose for sale in any such stall any article which has been prohibited by the Committee by notice posted in the market.

4. No occupant of a stall in a village market shall enclose in any way, any portion of the market or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind, nor shall he leave any goods in the market between the hours of 9 P.M. and 6 A.M. without having first obtained the sanction of the Chairman.

5. (a) Every occupant of a stall or seat in any village market shall keep such stall or seat clean and free from filth or rubbish.

(b) No person suffering from or afflicted with any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease shall occupy any stall, seat, or place in any village market or expose for sale thereat any provisions whatsoever.

6. No person using or occupying any village market shall—

(a) behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in the market or its premises;

(b) carry on any cooking in the market;

(c) remain or loiter about such market after the place is closed for business or after 9 P.M. without a lawful excuse;

(d) damage or in any way deface any portion of the buildings, stalls, lamps, or any property of the Committee in such market or its premises, or defile or pollute in any way the water provided for use in such market.

7. All village markets shall be open from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M. on the days on which such markets are held.

8. (a) It shall be the duty of the keeper of a village market to maintain order within the limits of the market.

(b) No person shall obstruct or resist any person appointed by the Committee to superintend any market, or to collect the rents or fees therefor, or to enforce order or cleanliness therein, whilst such person is engaged in the execution of his duty.

9. No cart or vehicle shall remain within the premises of any village market for a longer period than is necessary for loading and unloading.

10. Every person holding a stall in a village market shall keep on or near such stall a receptacle to be approved by the Chairman, in which shall be deposited all rubbish and refuse matter from the stall.

11. No person shall deposit any rubbish, or refuse, bones, skins of animals, or other such thing in any village market or its premises except in receptacles provided for such purpose.

12. If any person holding or occupying a stall in any village market wilfully neglects or refuses without just or reasonable cause to serve the public during two consecutive days, the Chairman may suspend or revoke the permission given to such person to hold or occupy that stall.

13. The scale of fees leviable under rule 1 in respect of any market shall be printed in Sinhalese and English and exhibited in a conspicuous place in the market, and it shall be unlawful for any person to demand or receive higher sums than those authorized by such notice.

*Sub-section 3, Private Fairs and Markets.*

14. (a) Within a radius of two miles of any village market established by this Committee as aforesaid, no market commodities shall, on any day on which such market is held be sold within this subdivision at any private market or fair other than a permanent boutique or by any person other than a hawk or itinerant vendor or the owner, agent, or lessee of a permanent boutique.

(b) It shall be an offence to sell or expose for sale, on such days and within such radius as aforesaid, any market commodities at any private market or fair, stall, or stand, other than a permanent boutique.

(c) No person shall establish or keep a private gala, fair, or market except on a permit from the Committee.

1. Conservancy fees at the following rates shall be paid by all occupiers of premises provided with dry-earth latrines:—

(1) Premises exempted under section 172 (a) and (b) of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, from the property rate imposed under section 171 (1) (a), Re. 1 per mensem per bucket and a further sum of Re. 1 per mensem in respect of every bucket exceeding one per day.

(2) Premises liable to the property rate imposed under section 171 (1) (a) of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920:—

(a) If the annual value is under Rs. 600, Re. 1 in respect of every bucket conserved exceeding one per day.

(c) If the annual value is Rs. 1,800 and above, Re. 1 per bucket in respect of every bucket conserved exceeding three per day.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Bandarawela Urban District Council without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. Subject to the provisions of by-law 1 and the following by-laws, every officer of the Bandarawela Urban District Council on the fixed establishment drawing a salary of

Rs. 360 per annum and upwards who shall have had service of ten years or more including any service which may be reckoned under the proviso to by-law 7 may be awarded a pension as follows:—

For the first one hundred and twenty months of such service a pension equal to 120/720ths of his annual salary and for each additional completed month of service an additional 1/720th of such salary, but no officer shall be entitled to draw more than 480/720ths of his final salary as pension.

3. The above-mentioned pensions shall only be granted in cases of faithful and meritorious service, but when the testimony as to fidelity, diligence, and merit is in any respect defective, a deduction from such rates may be made. Where there has been obvious negligence, irregularity, or misconduct, the grant of a pension may be altogether withheld.

Where service of peculiar and extraordinary merit has been rendered by an officer distinctly outside the duties in respect of which his salary is paid, a special rate of pension may be recommended for sanction, but in ordinary cases the maximum pension or retiring allowance grantable to an officer under these by-laws, or to an officer entitled to pension also in respect of service not under the Council from all services combined, shall not exceed two-thirds of the highest salary drawn by such officer at any time in the course of his service.

4. In the case of officers on the fixed establishment of the Council drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards retiring on account of illness or age before completing one hundred and twenty months' gross service a gratuity may be granted calculated at the rate of one-twelfth of a month's pay of the permanent office or offices held at the time of retirement, for each completed month of service.

5. Officers of the Bandarawela Urban District Council shall have no absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or long service allowance under these by-laws, and the Bandarawela Urban District Council retains power and authority to dismiss any such officer without any compensation.

6. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Bandarawela Urban District Council who shall be under fifty-five years of age except upon a certificate from the Chairman and two medical practitioners that he is incapable from infirmity of mind or body of discharging the duties of his office, nor unless he shall have discharged such duties theretofore with diligence and fidelity to the satisfaction of the Council.

7. The claim of an officer of the Bandarawela Urban District Council to pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be considered to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the fixed establishment of the Council after January 1, 1933, or its predecessor the Bandarawela Local Board.

Provided that an officer transferred from the provisional and temporary establishment to the fixed establishment may be allowed to count his provisional and temporary service when it has been continuous with his subsequent permanent service.

Service under sixteen years of age however will not count for pension.

8. The service in respect of which pensions, gratuities, or long service allowances are granted under these by-laws must in all cases be continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or other temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation of the officer.

9. The pension or gratuity shall be computed upon the salary of the permanent office held by the officer of the Council at the time of his retirement provided he shall have held such appointment for at least three years; otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of salaries attached to the permanent office held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension.

10. In case of abolition of office, if the officer has completed 120 months' gross service, he may be granted a pension of 1/720th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension with an addition to such service of one month for each completed period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 60 months.

If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of 1/12th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension, plus an addition of 50 per cent. thereon. In no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty.

11. If any person being in receipt of any pension or long service allowance from the Bandarawela Urban District Council shall be convicted of any offence in any Court of Justice in the Island for which he shall be sentenced to

death or to any terms of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding six months such pension or long service allowance shall forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction, receive free pardon or unless the Council shall otherwise order.

12. Officers on the fixed establishment of the Bandarawela Urban District Council may be required to retire on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect, but they may continue in office till sixty years of age with the consent of the Council.

13. (1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the aggregate amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided, however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under the Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from the Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the Council.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the expression "public service" includes employment under the Crown or any Local Government public body or bodies.

14. Should an officer who retires on pension find after such retirement an employment under the Council or under the Government or under another semi-official body on a salary equal to or higher than that which he drew from the Council at the time of his retirement, his pension shall be suspended so long as such employment continues. If he draws a less salary he shall be entitled to only so much of his pension as when added to the salary of the new appointment will make his total emoluments equal to the salary last drawn by him previous to his retirement.

15. Employees on the fixed establishment of the Bandarawela Urban District Council drawing salaries of less than Rs. 360 per annum and retiring on account of age or infirmity after serving continuously for a period of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Council be satisfied that they are unfit, owing to age or infirmity of body or mind, further to discharge efficiently the duties of their offices, be granted such long service allowances not exceeding Rs. 750 per mensem in each case as the Council may award. Persons in receipt of daily pay, who have completed a period of fifteen years of continuous service, retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

16. If any case not covered by these by-laws shall arise which in the opinion of the Council merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance or gratuity, the circumstances of such case should be reported together with the recommendation of the Council to the Commissioner of Local Government for transmission to the General Treasury (Establishments Division) for submission to the Governor, who will decide whether any and, if so, what award shall be granted.

#### REPEAL.

The rules relating to the grant of retiring pensions and gratuities to officers of the Local Board, Bandarawela, published by Notifications dated July 30, 1915, and May 2, 1918, in the *Government Gazette* of August 6, 1915, and May 3, 1918, respectively, are hereby repealed.

\* The term "aggregate" salary is to be interpreted as the amount of the aggregate salary of the substantive post held by an officer in the course of his career, disregarding extra emoluments such as duty allowances, and regarding leave on half pay or without pay as leave on full salary.

#### Oil Installations Scheme at Colombo.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the following charges will be levied from April 1, 1934, until further notice in connection with the Oil Installations Scheme at Colombo:—

Rs. 7 per 1,000 gallons on all petroleum, whether fuel oil, kerosene, or petrol imported in bulk or transhipped at Colombo.

Rs. 2 per 1,000 gallons, working and maintenance charge.

Half cent per ton on the gross tonnage of the vessel for every six hours or part thereof during which a vessel is berthed alongside the Oil Jetties for purposes other than discharging or bunkering petroleum in bulk.

Vessels discharging or bunkering petroleum in bulk at the Oil Jetties, and at the same time unloading or loading any other cargo on to, or from the jetties will be liable to an additional charge at the rate of 5 cents per package unloaded or loaded.

## Rule.

The Rules dated August 18, 1933, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,000 of August 19, 1933 are hereby rescinded, and the following substituted therefor:—

## RULES.

1. For the purpose of any calculation made under these rules, one hundred pounds of green leaf shall be deemed to be the equivalent of twenty-three pounds of made tea.

## A.—Estates.

2. The average annual output of made tea from the mature areas of an estate for the years 1931 and 1932, shall be ascertained by taking the arithmetical mean between the total quantity produced in 1931 and the total quantity produced in 1932 by the areas which were wholly mature on the first day of January, 1931.

3. (1) For the computation of allowances, every immature area shall be dealt with by sections according to age and elevation, all portions of the same age and elevation being treated as one immature section.

(2) Each such immature section shall be given, in accordance with the provisions hereinafter set out, such allowance as may be appropriate to its age and elevation and proportionate to its actual acreage.

4. The percentage in respect of each immature section shall be computed—

(a) where the immature section forms part of an estate containing mature areas, on the basis of the Average Per Acre ascertained by dividing the aforesaid average annual output by the number of acres in full maturity on the first day of January, 1931; and

(b) where the immature section does not form part of an estate containing mature areas, on the basis of the District Average as classified in Schedule II. hereto, for mature areas in the planting district in which such section is situated.

5. The allowance for any period of assessment in respect of areas, immature on the first day of January, 1931, and forming part of an estate containing mature areas, shall be either—

(a) a percentage of the Average Per Acre of such estate, for each acre of each immature section, in accordance with the tables set out in Schedule I. hereto; or

(b) for each immature section, the actual crop from it for the year 1932,

whichever is the greater.

6. The allowance for any period of assessment in respect of areas immature on the 1st day of January, 1931, and not forming part of an estate containing mature areas, shall be either—

(a) a percentage of the District Average as classified in Schedule II., for each acre of each immature section, in accordance with the tables set out in Schedule I.; or

(b) for each immature section, the actual crop from it for the year 1932,

whichever is the greater.

7. The allowance for any period of assessment, in respect of any area planted between the first day of January, 1931, and the date declared under section 30 (1) of the Ordinance, shall be—

(a) where the area so planted is part of an estate containing mature areas, a percentage of the Average Per Acre of such estate in accordance with the tables set out in Schedule I.; and

(b) where the area so planted is not part of an estate containing mature areas, a percentage in accordance with the table set out in Schedule I. of the District Average as classified in Schedule II.

8. In any case where the Controller is satisfied that correct figures cannot be obtained, or where for any other reason it is inequitable or impossible to assess the standard crop of an estate on the basis of the average annual output aforesaid, he may either—

(a) himself make an estimate, or cause an estimate to be made, of the average yield per acre which could reasonably have been obtained from the mature areas of the estate at the commencement of the period of control, and determine the standard crop of the estate for each period of assessment by applying that estimate to the mature areas and by adding percentages of that estimate as allowances for immature areas in accordance with the provisions of the foregoing rules relating to the computation of allowances for immature areas; or

(b) determine the standard crop of the estate by applying to the mature areas the appropriate District Average as classified in Schedule II. and by adding percentages of that District Average as allowances for immature areas in accordance with the provisions of the foregoing rules, relating to the computation of allowances for immature areas.

9. (1) In any case where the Controller decides, of his own motion or on proof furnished by the proprietor, that it is inequitable to determine the standard crop of any immature area forming the whole or any part of an estate in accordance with the provisions of the foregoing rules, he may himself estimate the standard crop or cause it to be estimated for the first period for which an assessment is required, and determine the standard crop for each period thereafter until the immature area reaches the age of maturity specified for that elevation in Schedule I. by ascertaining on the basis of the estimate so made the maximum crop obtainable from that area at maturity and adding to the estimate so made for the first period of assessment 25 per cent. of that maximum as the allowance for each successive period of assessment until the age of maturity is reached.

(2) Where the assessment of an immature area for the purpose of this rule is made by estimating the maximum crop to be expected from it at the age of maturity specified for that elevation in Schedule I., the Controller may determine the standard crop of that area for any period of assessment by deducting from the estimated maximum such percentage or percentages as are shown in Schedule I. to be appropriate to the age of the area in that period of assessment.

(3) In any case where the actual or potential yield of any immature area forming part of an estate and below the age limit entitling it to an allowance is not estimated during the first year for which an assessment is made, the Controller may determine the allowance for that area after it becomes entitled to an allowance on the basis of the average of the estimated maximum crops of the immature areas of that estate dealt with at the time of the first assessment, or where there are no other immature areas in that estate, by applying to the immature area percentages of the average annual output of the mature areas, in accordance with the provisions of the foregoing rules relating to the computation of allowances for immature areas.

(4) Every proprietor demanding a special assessment under the foregoing rules 8 or 9 shall, if the Controller decides to allow such assessment to be made, be liable to pay a fee in accordance with the rates set out hereunder:—

10. In any case where a proprietor proves to the satisfaction of the Controller that leaf can be harvested during any period of assessment from any portion of an estate—

- (a) which was not included in the first return furnished by that proprietor, or
- (b) which was included in that return, but from which no leaf was harvested during the years 1931 and 1932, and was for that or any other reason not taken into account for the purposes of assessment, the Controller shall determine the standard crop of that portion on the basis either (a) of an estimate made by him or under his authority of the average yield per acre which can reasonably be obtained from that portion for the first period for which an assessment is required, or (b) of the appropriate District Average, whichever of these is the less.

11. (1) In any case where a portion of land newly acquired is added to a registered estate, or to a small holding which subsequently becomes an estate—

- (a) if that portion was itself another registered estate or small holding or any part thereof, the standard crop of that portion shall continue to be determined for each successive period of assessment in the manner in which the standard crop of such estate or small holding was originally determined;
- (b) if that portion was not previously registered and is over 10 acres in extent it shall be assessed as a separate estate belonging to that proprietor and its standard crop shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of the foregoing rules applying to mature or immature areas or of the foregoing rule 10 as the case may be.

(2) In any case where a registered estate is divided into two or more portions, every portion of it which is an estate within the meaning of the Ordinance, shall be registered as a separate estate but the standard crop thereof shall continue to be determined on the basis or in the manner in which the standard crop of the original estate was determined, or in accordance with the provisions of the foregoing rule 10, as the case may be.

12. When the standard crop of any estate or part of an estate for the first period for which an assessment is required is determined in accordance with the foregoing rules 1 to 7, or is for any reason calculated on the basis of the District Average, or has been specially assessed, it shall continue to be determined in that manner and no special assessment under the foregoing rules shall be made of that area for any subsequent period.

13. In making any estimate for special assessment under any of the foregoing rules other than rule 10, no credit shall in any case be given for any improvements effected after the first day of April, 1933: provided that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to affect the provisions of the foregoing rules relating to the addition of allowances for immature areas in accordance with the tables set out in Schedule I.

14. The Controller may himself verify, or cause to be verified, the particulars given in any return relating to any estate before determining the standard crop thereof under any of the foregoing rules.

15. (1) Every assessment of the standard crop of an estate made by the Controller under the foregoing rules shall be set out and communicated to the proprietor concerned in Form A 1 prescribed for the Notice of Assessment of the Standard Crop of Estates.

(2) Any appeal preferred under section 17 against any such assessment shall be subject to the rules relating to appeals under the Ordinance published in the *Gazette* of July 21, 1933.
