KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 6 (1) of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation establish from the date hereof a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do further, under section 6 (3), wholly exempt the general cemetery so established from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 11 OF 1933.

IT is hereby notified that the following Resolution under sections 32 (1) and (3) of Ordinance No. 11 of 1933 passed by the State Council at its session on March 20, 1934, has been duly submitted to and sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor, and that it will take effect from midnight of March 28/29, 1934:—

“That this Council do resolve, under the provisions of sections 32 (1) and (3) of the Tea (Control of Export) Ordinance, No. 11 of 1933, that from and after the date on which the sanction of the Governor to this resolution is notified in the *Government Gazette*, the export duty now charged, levied and paid, for the purpose of providing an income for the payment of the expenses of the administration of the Ordinance and such other expenses as may be authorized under section 33 thereof, shall be reduced from twenty cents to fourteen cents per hundred pounds of tea exported from this Island.”

Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, approved under section 12 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on September 12, 1933, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Galkadawala irrigation work in the Trincomalee District, and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

1. Name and description of work: Completion of Galkadawala village tank.
2. Extent and nature of lands irrigable under the scheme:—

Private lands under cultivation	57 acres approximately.
Private lands not under cultivation

Crown lands under cultivation	.. Nil.
Crown lands not under cultivation	37 acres approximately.

3. Terms agreed upon—

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, (a) provision of a 117 ft. 3 in. clear overfall masonry skin type spill at R. B. peg 30-31 with crest level 108.00 as shown in plan No. 36/Y/3, (b) the cutting of a high level natural spill 100 ft. wide at the Left Bank between pegs 1 and 2 with crest level 108.75 gradient 1/100, up to the estimated cost of Rs. 2,900 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete earthworks in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent, as follows:—

in 1933 .. 74 cubes of earthwork
(being 1 cube per acre for 56 acres + 18 cubes to be done by S. Bairala).
in 1934 .. 200 cubes of earthwork
(being 3 cubes per acre for 56 acres + 32 cubes to be done by S. Bairala).

Total—274 cubes, to be completed as above before the end of September each year.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Friday, February 23, 1934, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated February 16, 1934.

Present :—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; and Mr. R. L. Ephraums.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 18, 1934, were amended as regards item 10 by the substitution of the letters "M. C. C." for "M. C. Club."

The minutes, as amended, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. A. Paulas moved—That the Committee appointed on October 14, 1933, to inquire and report to the Council whether the staff of the Council could be reduced, be re-appointed, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved—(1) That the Government authorities concerned in the matter be requested to open out an approach road to Richmond Hill Railway Station from Wakwella road. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried. (2) That new collectors be appointed to Wards one, two, three, and four on a salary of Rs. 540 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 60 to Rs. 720 with the prospect of receiving appointments in the Clerical Service of the Municipality whenever available. Mr. E. A. Paulas formally seconded. The motion was put to the meeting and declared lost, the mover and seconder only voting for it.

4. With the leave of Council the following motion which stood in the name of Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka was deferred till the next meeting :—That future entrants to the Clerical Service of all the Municipal Departments should be those who have passed either the E. S. L. C. or the Cambridge Junior Local, or a higher examination.

5. To consider a petition from the licensed stall holders of the Meat Market asking for a re-consideration of the rates for the sale of mutton fixed by Council on November 18, 1933.—Resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting and that in the meantime information be obtained as regards the prices ruling at Matara, Weligama, Ambalangoda, and Baddegama.

6. To consider the question of remedying the nuisance caused by the pollution of the sea beach at Magalle and Mahamodera.—Resolved that a supplemental vote of Rs. 350 be passed for the employment of two extra scavenging labourers for duty on the sea beach at 55 cents each per diem.

7. To sanction the appointment till the end of March, 1934, of a temporary office labourer at 50 cents per diem with effect from January 23, 1934.—Sanctioned.

8. To consider the question of paying a bicycle allowance to Mr. A. Wickremasinghe, Draughtsman, employed in the Works Department.—Resolved that consideration be deferred.

9. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 135 under "Anti-plague Measures" for a hand cart for the use of the Clayton Gang.—Sanctioned.

10. To consider an application from Mr. E. Nanayakkara, Clerk and Storekeeper, Works Department, for three months leave on full pay commencing from February 1, 1934.—Resolved that the application be allowed.

With the permission of Council the following four items which did not appear on the Agenda were next taken up for consideration :—

11. To consider tenders for constructing permanent sunshades at the Green Market.—Resolved that the only tender received, viz., 1715/-, from K. P. Hinniappuhamy, be accepted.

12. To consider a further letter from Messrs. Collin Thome & Co. regarding the supply of current for power at special rates.—Resolved (1) that the following amended rates be offered :—1 to 100 units at 14 cents per unit ; 101 to 200 units at 13 cents per unit ; 201 to 300 units at 12 cents per unit ; 301 to 400 units at 11 cents per unit ; 401 to 500 units at 10 cents per unit ; and over 500 units at 9 cents per unit ; (2) that no change be made as regards the period of the agreement, which should, as previously decided, be for a term of 3 years with the option of renewal on the part of the Company for a further period of 2 years on the same conditions ; and (3) that a minimum monthly charge of Rs. 75 be levied even in the event of a break down of the Company's Motor.

13. Publications in the *Government Gazette* :—The Chairman informed the meeting that legislation was being framed to amend sections 40 (2) and 83 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, so that it will no longer be necessary to publish in the *Gazette* the lists of voters and potential candidates and the minutes of meetings and statements of accounts. This meant that the Council would have to pay for any notices in the *Gazette* not required by Ordinance. But as the charges for *Gazette* publications were so high he suggested that it would be advisable for the Council to make its own arrangements for printing minutes and financial statements and the lists of voters, and Councillors. This suggestion was agreed to.

14. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of Council.—Resolved that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, March 17, at 9.30 A.M.

15. At the conclusion of the business of the meeting the Chairman said that Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel, one of their nominated members, had resigned his seat in the Council owing to his transfer to Colombo as Provincial Engineer, Western Province. It was the duty of the Council to express to Mr. Scharenguivel, its appreciation of the services he had always so readily rendered. His co-operation and sound advice had been of special value to them. He would always associate Mr. Scharenguivel's name with the Pettigalawatta Drainage Scheme, which he had so ably re-modelled. He moved that they do place on record their very sincere appreciation of all that Mr. Scharenguivel had done for the Council.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka, in seconding the motion, referred to Mr. Scharenguivel's keen interest in his work generally. He deserved thanks not only for the Pettigalawatta Scheme but also for much good advice given in his capacity as a member of the Works Committee.

The motion was carried unanimously.
