THE TEA (CONTROL OF EXPORT) ORDINANCE,
No. 11 OF 1933.

Notification No. 20.

RULES under sections 15 (2) and 35 of the Tea (Control of Export) Ordinance, No. 11 of 1933, made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands.

RULES.

1. The standard crop of every registered small holding which was specially assessed on the application of the proprietor for the period of assessment 1933-1934, shall be determined for the period of assessment 1934-1935, by adding to the final assessment approved for the former period the appropriate District Average, set out in the

schedule to these rules, for each acre of any portion of the holding that may have been planted between the first day of January and the twenty-third day of June, 1933.

2. The standard crop of every registered small holding which was not specially assessed for the period 1933-1934, and of every small holding which for any reason was unregistered and unassessed for the period of assessment 1933-1934, and is registered for the first time for the purposes of assessment for the period 1934-1935, shall, subject to the provisions of the rules following, be determined by applying to each acre of the holding, inclusive of any portion of it that may have been planted between the first day of January and the twenty-third day of June, 1933, the appropriate District Average set out in the schedule to these rules.

3. Immediately upon the publication of these rules the Government Agent shall, by beat of tom-tom and by written notices posted up in suitable places in each of the districts concerned, give information to the public:—

- (a) of the District Average applicable to that district;
- (b) of his intention to determine on the basis of that District Average the standard crop of all small holdings registered for the first time for the purposes of assessment for the period 1934-1935; and

(c) that on or before Tuesday, March 13, 1934, written application for a larger assessment, setting out the facts on which the claim is based, and accompanied by a remittance of an assessment fee of Rs. 5, may be made by the proprietor of any small holding which is to be registered and assessed for the first time for the period 1934-1935, or which although registered was not specially assessed for the period 1933-1934.

4. (1) If the Government Agent is of opinion that any application made under the foregoing rule should be allowed, he may himself inspect the holding or cause it to be inspected with special reference to what its condition and its productivity are likely to have been on the first day of April, 1933.

(2) Where the estimate so made of the condition and the productivity of a small holding on the first day of April, 1933, justify a larger assessment, the Government Agent may determine the standard crop of that holding by increasing the District Average applicable to that portion of the holding which was planted before the first day of January, 1933, by such percentage as he may consider just.

(3) In all other cases the Government Agent shall apply the District Average.

5. (1) Every assessment made by the Government Agent under any of the foregoing rules shall be set out, and communicated to the proprietor concerned, in the Form B. 1, prescribed for the Notice of Assessment of the Standard Crop of Small Holdings.

(2) Any appeal preferred under section 17 against any such assessment shall be subject to the rules relating to appeals under the Ordinance published in the *Gazette* of July 21, 1933.

6. The rules relating to the assessment of small holdings bearing Nos. 10 to 14 of the rules published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,000 of August 19, 1933, are hereby rescinded.
