BY-LAWS.

The by-laws relating to dairies published by Notification in the *Gazette* No. 8,022 of December 8, 1933, are hereby amended—

- (i.) by the deletion, from the heading of the part or chapter thereof numbered II., of the words “and for sale of milk”; and
- (ii.) by the insertion, immediately after the aforesaid part or Chapter II., of the following new part or chapter:—

III.—*Regulations for Sale of Milk generally.*

1. No person who is not a licensee of a dairy as aforesaid, shall himself or by any agent or servant, sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, any milk within the administrative limits of the Council, save in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

2. (i.) Every such person, whether resident within or without the limits of the Council, who desires to sell or supply for money milk in any quantity to any person or persons within the limits of the Council, shall cause himself to be registered in the books of the Council as a purveyor or supplier of milk.

(ii.) Such registration shall be free of all fees or charges.

3. Every such person shall, by proper application made for that purpose, further cause registration-cards to be issued annually by the Chairman to each servant, vendor, or agent, whether paid or unpaid, employed by him in the work of selling or delivering milk.

4. Any contravention of, or non-compliance with, the foregoing provisions shall be an offence.

5. (1) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to register as a purveyor or supplier of milk under the foregoing by-law 2, any person who has not been recommended

for registration, after such inspection, as may be necessary, of his premises, his animals, and his utensils and equipment generally—

- (a) if he is a resident within the administrative limits of the Council, by the Medical Officer of Health of the Council; or
- (b) if he is a resident in any area outside the limits of the Council, by the Chairman of any duly constituted local authority there may be in such area, or if there is none, by the Medical Officer of Health, for the district in which such area lies.

(2) The Chairman may likewise refuse to issue any registration-cards, under the foregoing by-law 3, until a Medical Officer deputed by him has examined and found each such servant, vendor, or agent to be free from any infectious or contagious disease and from diseases of the skin.

6. The registration-cards so issued by the Chairman shall include the following particulars:—

- (a) employer's name and number on register.
- (b) name of vendor or servant or agent, and his thumb impression.

7. It shall be an offence for any person to deliver milk or to carry or hawk milk for sale within the limits of the Council, unless he has in his possession a registration-card for the current year duly issued as aforesaid.

8. (i.) It shall be an offence for any person delivering milk or carrying or hawking milk for sale within the limits of the Council, to refuse, or to fail for any reason, to produce for inspection a duly issued registration-card for the current year, when called upon to do so by a Sanitary Inspector or by any person specially or generally authorized by the Chairman in that behalf.

(ii.) In the event of any person so refusing or failing to produce such card, it shall be lawful for such Sanitary Inspector or other authorized person to exercise the powers given to peace officers by section 33 (1) of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

9. It shall be an offence for any person to sell or deliver or to expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, within the limits of the Council—

(i.) any milk from which the cream has been removed unless such milk is contained in a vessel which is distinctly and conspicuously labelled "Skimmed milk" in English, and the equivalent term in Sinhalese and Tamil, and is sold as such;

(ii.) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid; provided that milk to which tea, coffee, or cocoa has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house, shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law;

(iii.) any milk contained in bottles of which the mouth is not covered with paper or other impermeable material.

10. If any person found guilty of an offence under the foregoing by-law 9 is proved to be the agent or servant, whether paid or unpaid, of any other person, such other person shall also be liable to be punished for the same offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he had given all necessary instructions and used due diligence to ensure compliance, and that the offence was due to an act or default of his agent, or servant without his own knowledge, consent, or connivance.

The by-laws regarding dairies made by the Local Board of Gampola and published in *Gazette* No. 6,538 of December 28, 1912, are hereby repealed.

RULES.

Appointment and Duty of Irrigation Headmen.

1. No person shall be elected or appointed under section 21 of the Ordinance to be an Irrigation Headman, unless he is a proprietor of land in the tract for which he is elected.

2. All village irrigation works and cultivation shall be under the supervision of the proper Ela- or Vel-Vidane, and any tampering or interference by any other person not specially appointed shall be considered a breach of this rule.

3. The Ela- or Vel-Vidane shall keep a register of all paddy fields under each ela or tank showing the names of owners, the area of fields owned by each, length of section of ela to be repaired and maintained by each owner, length of fence to be erected for each field, and the yield for each harvest. This register is to be amended yearly, and a copy of it to be sent to the Ratamahatmaya before January 10.

4. The Ela- or Vel-Vidane shall inspect at least once a week, and during the rainy months three times a week, all the elas, water-courses, amunu, and tanks which are in their divisions to distribute water and inspect the maintenance of the works. In the event of any accident to any of the elas or amunu that are in their charge, or theft of water taking place, or any breach of the rules they shall at once report the same to the Gansabhawa.

5. The Ela- or Vel-Vidane shall regulate the karamaru system, keeping a list of all karamaru fields and entering the names of all proprietors thereof according to their proper turn of cultivation, and all proprietors of such fields shall sign this list, which shall be attested by the Korala and the Irrigation Headman.

Huwandiram.

6. All lands under cultivation shall be liable to the Vel-Vidane for 4 kurunies per amunam of sowing extent for yala and maha as huwandiram and the Val-Vidane shall make over one-fourth of such huwandiram to the Ela-Vidane if such officer has been elected or appointed.

7. If any proprietor makes default in payment of huwandiram, the equivalent in money may be recovered in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Ordinance.

Repairing of Ela, Amunu.

8. All the cultivators shall, in proportion to the extent of land cultivated by each, contribute the quota of labour towards the usual repair and clearance of the elas, provided that amunu and pota shall be constructed and repaired as at present by the joint labour of all the cultivators.

9. When the time of cultivation arrives, the Ela- or Vel-Vidane shall give a week's notice to all the cultivators of the date appointed for commencing the work on the ela and amunu or wewa. On receipt of this notice the cultivators shall be bound to assemble together on the date appointed and work for as many days as may be required to complete the portion of work allotted for each person in a proper manner.

10. The proportion of labour due in respect of any cultivated Crown field in the tract shall be performed by the cultivator : if any such Crown field is uncultivated the labour due shall be performed by the joint labour of all the proprietors and the cultivators in the tract.

11. The proportion of each work of construction or repair to be performed by each proprietor shall be assigned by the Ela-Vidane.

12. No person shall be exempted from his share of labour under these rules on the ground that his land is not being cultivated.

13. It shall be the duty of the cultivators to clear and repair the ela in proportion to the extent cultivated by each, and they shall keep their portions of ela hewali and imaniyara always in good repair, free from silt, jungle, and weeds, and shall otherwise repair and keep in good condition the bund of the ela.

14. The repair of the ela amunu for the yala cultivation shall be commenced on July 1 and completed on July 14 each year.

15. The repairs of the ela amunu tanks for the maha cultivation shall be commenced on November 15, and completed on November 30 each year.

16. The repairs of the ela amunu for the cultivation of malan fields shall be commenced on December 1 and completed on December 14 each year.

Ploughing.

17. The ploughing of the fields for yala shall be commenced on June 15 and finished on July 30 each year.

18. The ploughing of fields for maha shall be commenced on December 1 and finished on January 31 each year.

19. The ploughing of malan fields shall be commenced as soon as the rain sets in.

20. The time allowed to each cultivator for ploughing shall be calculated according to the extent of each man's field, and if a cultivator neglects to plough in proper time he shall lose his turn of water.

Sowing.

21. The sowing of fields for yala shall be commenced on August 1 and finished on September 30 in each year.

22. The sowing of fields for maha shall be done in February each year.

23. The sowing of malan fields shall be done on or before February 28 each year.

24. Before the commencement of any sowing season, the majority of the cultivators shall decide on the kind or kinds of paddy that shall be sown for that season. If the cultivators neglect to decide as above, the Vel-Vidane or the Korala shall do so for them.

25. The Ratamahatmaya may grant an extension of time for sowing not exceeding 15 days in special cases in the maha season only.

Fence and Watch Huts.

26. The fence round the whole tract shall be measured off in proportion to the extent each person cultivates, and the portion assigned to each proprietor shall be completed within six days of the notice given in that behalf by the Vel-Vidane.

27. The aforesaid fence shall in like manner be maintained in good repair by the proprietors until the crop is reaped and gathered.

28. Each cultivator shall erect a proper watch hut adjoining the fence put up by him before sowing has commenced, and shall watch regularly until the crop is reaped and gathered whether his own paddy is reaped or not.

Threshing-floors.

29. For clearing and fencing threshing-floors, each proprietor stacking crops therein shall contribute labour proportionate to the extent of land cultivated by him.

30. No paddy shall be removed from the threshing-floor at the termination of the harvest until the huwandiram share has been paid.

31. Should a field in any tract ripen before the rest, the cultivator of that field shall be allowed by the Vel-Vidane to reap and store the crop, but he shall continue to contribute his usual amount of assistance towards the protection of the tracts until all the crop is reaped and stored; provided that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to prevent any cultivator from removing the paddy out of the limit of the tract and threshing it.

Distribution of Water.

32. The distribution of water from the ela shall be made by the Vel-Vidane, and no person shall issue, distribute, cut, off, divert, or use in any manner the water, except with the consent of the Vel-Vidane, and no cultivator under any pretence whatever shall block up the ela, water passage, or open a sluice or dam.

33. If any person shall wilfully prevent water flowing to the field below his own the Vel-Vidane shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and open the wakkadas himself.

34. Where water is carried in elas through paddy fields in transit for the purpose of irrigating fields below, no person shall divert the water from such elas to the fields through which it passes or obstruct or otherwise injure the same.

35. No person shall take water for any other purpose other than paddy cultivation without the consent of the Vel-Vidane.

36. Each cultivator shall be allowed water from the elas for his cultivation in proportion to the extent of the field.

37. In distributing water from the ela the water shall be first taken to the agawatha fields, and thence to the daranda fields, and no one shall in any way interfere to the prejudice of others with the distribution of water.

38. Water shall be obtained for the use of each particular field only through its proper wakkadas and at such time as may be fixed by the Vel-Vidane; no enlargement or alteration whatever in size or number of wakkadas shall be made without the consent of the Vel-Vidane. After a sufficient quantity of water has been obtained for the fields it shall be allowed to run into, and be taken for the use of, the adjoining fields.

39. The Vel-Vidane shall in consultation with the Ela-Vidane determine the proportion of water to be allowed to each tract irrigated by the principal ela. Stones on the same level with each other to regulate the supply shall be placed in the presence of the cultivators at the entrance of each wakkada through which water is turned off to the respective tracts, and the quantity of water thus determined upon shall on no account be increased at the will or pleasure of any individual cultivator; provided, however, that, in case of complaint as to the just and proper division of water, the matter of such complaint shall be determined by the Ratamahatmaya or Korala.

40. The distribution of water from any amuna shall be regulated by the Ela- or Vel-Vidane.

41. No wakkadas in any permanent dam shall be cut, but wooden pipes inserted where necessary by the Irrigation Headman. The cost to be borne by the proprietors depending on such outlets in proportion to the extents owned by them.

42. If owing to the drought or any unexpected accident to a dam the quantity of water available be found insufficient for the season, the Ratamahatmaya (or the Korala) shall make a division to the several tracts or fields by allowing the full volume of water to each tract or field for a given time, and such division shall be final, subject to appeal to the Government Agent.

43. If there be several amunu in a river or a stream, the Korala shall determine what proportion of water shall be allowed to the lower amunu.

44. (a) In the event of the supply of water in the wewa, ela, or spring being insufficient a majority of the proprietors of lands irrigated by such wewa, ela, or spring shall decide which lands are to be cleared and cultivated.

(b) Any proprietor aggrieved by any such decision of the majority shall have the right to appeal against it to the Government Agent.

(c) Where for any reason the proprietors are unable to come to a decision the matter shall be referred to the Government Agent.

(d) Any order made by the Government Agent under either of the foregoing paragraphs shall be final.

45. No person shall do any act which is likely to diminish the water supply of any tract or field, or which deprives any cultivator of his due share of water, or which causes wanton waste of water or in any way benefits one person to the detriment of another.

46. Cattle or goats found upon the bank of the ela shall be deemed to be committing trespass, and the owners thereof shall be dealt with accordingly.

47. No cattle shall be introduced into any paddy field which has been fenced and laid under cultivation until all the fields are reaped and paddy stacked.

48. The usual paths shall be preserved for taking cattle and agricultural implements to and from the paddy fields.

49. No person shall take or drive cattle or goats along the bund of the elas.

50. Any animal trespassing upon a cultivated land shall be seized and delivered to the Village Headman, who, after inspection and assessment of damages, shall require the owner to pay the amount forthwith; if he declines to do so, the Headman shall report the circumstances to the President who shall hold an inquiry regarding the trespass. The animal shall remain in the charge of the Headman pending final settlement, and shall be liable to sale for the recovery of damages and poundage.

Miscellaneous.

51. If the proprietor absents himself at the cultivation season or neglects to cultivate his field, such field may be cultivated by such one or more of the other proprietors as the majority of proprietors may specify; and the proprietor or proprietors so specified shall not be liable to pay the rent but shall perform all other duties and obligations arising under these rules.

52. The cultivation, ploughing, sowing, and turning of water shall be commenced from the agawatta to the daranda fields.

53. Fowls, ducks, geese, and pigs damaging paddy shall be shot and the carcasses delivered to the owner.

54. Where subsidiary elas are required for the purpose of leading water from the main elas, it shall be the duty of each proprietor to construct that portion of any subsidiary ela, which passes through his own land, along such lines or in such direction as the Vel-Vidane may mark out.

55. The proprietors of paddy lands shall give to the Vel-Vidane in writing one month before the commencement of work for each harvest a statement showing the names of the cultivators of their fields and the area they wish to cultivate.

56. No one shall throw any rubbish or other matter into the ela whereby passage of water may be impeded or polluted.

57. No person shall wash clothes, mats, pots, and pans, or bathe or wash cattle in the elas so as to pollute the water.

58. No boundary ridge or dam of any field shall be effaced, destroyed, altered, nor wilfully damaged, nor shall any other wanton or malicious injury either to a field, an ela, amuna, or fence be made.

59. Boundary ridges separating the fields of different proprietors, shall not be cleared, renewed, or repaired except in the presence of the parties concerned, or except in the presence of the Vel-Vidane after due notice to such parties.

60. No proprietor shall be considered entitled to exemption from any agricultural work under these rules on the ground of his lands not being cultivated.

61. No person shall open any drain from any high land into the ela or paddy field so as to damage the ela or field.

62. The proprietor of every land through which a field-path or road leads shall contribute such portion of his land as may be necessary to maintain a width of 4 feet throughout the length of such path or road.

(2) No person shall deface, damage, or cut or encroach upon any such path or road.

63. The proprietors shall construct and maintain all roads and paths by which access is obtained to the fields and other irrigation works.

64. After the sowing for any season is completed, the proprietors shall attend to the customary works of repair and maintenance of ela and amuna.

65. In any case of emergency or whenever the Government Agent or other duly authorized officer deems it imperative that any urgent work of repair or of prevention of impending damage, should be performed, and gives reasonable notice of the need of labour for such purpose, it shall be the duty of each proprietor to attend and contribute labour either in person or by substitute, and to continue such labour daily until the completion of the work.

66. No person shall interfere with the flow of water in any ela or amuna.

67. The Vel-Vidane and Ela-Vidane shall grant receipts in acknowledgment of the huwandiram.

68. After the reaping is over the fence sticks shall, if required for second cultivation, be removed by the cultivators and heaped in a place appointed by the Vel-Vidane. No one shall remove fence sticks without the consent of the Vel-Vidane.

69. Before commencement of ploughing the askanatu shall be cleared 6 feet wide, and shall be well weeded and kept in repair till the paddy is reaped.

70. The bunds of elas shall be kept 4 feet wide, and shall be divided in proportion to the extent of the field under them, and each cultivator shall keep the portion assigned to him always free from jungle, brushwood, overgrowth of every description, and from white ants' nests.

71. Six feet of jungle on either side of the ela shall be cleared, and all roots, silt, sand, and stones in the bed shall be removed, and the elas shall be kept in good repair always.

72. The cultivators of fields shall clear and repair the imaniyara and hewali adjoining their respective fields, and no person shall in any way alter or injure any imaniyara or hewali.

73. All trees growing on the borders of the elas which impede the free flow of water shall be cut down and such obstruction removed, and no person shall prevent the removal of such trees.

74. Owners of cattle and proprietors of paddy fields shall clear and maintain all paths, and roads (pitaparawal) outside the paddy fields which have been constructed or hereafter may be constructed to drive in and out cattle.

75. Trees or jungle likely to occasion damage by giving cover to wild animals or otherwise shall be removed by the proprietors of the land.

76. No person shall furtively lead water into his field by cutting or piercing the dam or take water given for another field or fields before his turn comes.

77. No new amuna or ela shall be made for the cultivation or irrigation of new lands or for other purposes which may in any way affect the taking of water to the existing fields without the permission of the Government Agent.

78. No jungle or trees growing near and protecting a spring and no trees protecting an ela or spring shall under any circumstances be cleared or felled, and no one shall plant any kind of trees on the bank of any ela or an amuna.

79. The cultivators of lands belonging to Devalas and Viharas shall be deemed to be proprietors for the purpose of these rules, and shall have all the rights and be subject to all the duties and liabilities of the proprietors.

80. Where any water-course or channel is crossed by a path or road, the proprietors requiring water to be led beyond such path or road shall contribute such labour and money as may be needed for the purpose of providing and fixing pipes or kumbahas of the specified size and description.

81. No road shall be fenced across without the leave of the Government Agent.

82. The Ela- or Vel-Vidane with the help of the Irrigation Officer shall divide the ela or tank bund among the cultivators. The cultivators will place stout numbered pickets at the commencement of the portion of ela or tank bund allotted to them. Particulars in respect of such allotments are to be noted in the ela or tank register to be kept by the Ela- or Vel-Vidane.

83. The fields under village tanks shall be treated as "malan" fields.

84. Except with the permission of the Government Agent or other authorized officer, no water from any tank or other irrigation work shall be allowed or used for any purpose other than that of irrigating paddy plants.

85. The rules for the aforementioned district of Bintenna published by Proclamation in the Gazette of October 20, 1916, and deemed to be in force heretofore by virtue of the provisions of section 2 of the Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

If a proprietor absents himself at the cultivation season or neglects to cultivate his field, such field may be cultivated by such one or more of the proprietors as the majority of proprietors may specify; and the proprietor or proprietors so specified shall not be liable to pay rent but shall perform all other duties and obligations arising under these rules.

52. The cultivation, ploughing, sowing, and turning of water shall be commenced from the agawatha to the daranda fields.

53. Fowls, ducks, geese, and pigs damaging paddy shall be shot and the carcasses delivered to the owners.

54. Where subsidiary elas are required for the purpose of leading water from the main elas, it shall be the duty of each proprietor to construct that portion of any subsidiary ela, which passes through his own land, along such lines or in such direction as the Vel-Vidane may mark out.

55. The proprietors of paddy lands shall give the Vel-Vidane in writing one month before the commencement of work for each harvest a statement showing the names of the cultivators of their fields and the area they wish to cultivate.

56. No one shall throw any rubbish or other matter into the ela whereby passage of water may be impeded or polluted.

57. No person shall wash clothes, mats, pots, and pans, or bathe or wash cattle in the elas so as to pollute the water.

58. No boundary ridge or dam of any field shall be effaced, destroyed, altered, nor wilfully damaged, nor shall any other wanton or malicious injury either to a field, an ela, amuna, or fence be made.

59. Boundary ridges separating the fields of different proprietors shall not be cleared, renewed, or repaired except in the presence of the parties concerned, or except in the presence of the Vel-Vidane after due notice to such parties.

60. No proprietor shall be considered entitled to exemption from any agricultural work under these rules on the ground of his lands not being cultivated.

61. No person shall open any drain from any high land into the ela or paddy field so as to damage the ela or field.

62. (1) The proprietor of every land through which a fieldpath or road leads shall contribute such portion of his land as may be necessary to maintain a width of 4 feet throughout the length of such path or road.

(2) No person shall deface, damage, or cut or encroach upon any such path or road.

63. The proprietors shall construct and maintain all roads and paths by which access is obtained to the fields and other irrigation works.

64. After the sowing for any season is completed, the proprietors shall attend to the customary works of repair and maintenance of ela and amuna.

65. In any case of emergency or whenever the Government Agent or other duly authorized officer deems it imperative that any urgent work of repair or of prevention of impending damage, should be performed, and gives reasonable notice of the need of labour for such purpose, it shall be the duty of each proprietor to attend and contribute labour either in person or by substitute, and to continue such labour daily until the completion of the work.

66. No person shall interfere with the flow of water in any ela or amuna.

67. The Vel-Vidane and Ela-Vidane shall grant receipts in acknowledgement of the huwandiram.

68. After the reaping is over the fence sticks shall, if required for second cultivation, be removed by the cultivators and heaped in a place appointed by the Vel-Vidane. No one shall remove fence sticks without the consent of the Vel-Vidane.

69. Before commencement of ploughing the askanatu shall be cleared 6 feet wide, and shall be well weeded and kept in repair till the paddy is reaped.

70. The bunds of elas shall be kept 4 feet wide, and shall be divided in proportion to the extent of the field under them, and each cultivator shall keep the portion assigned to him always free from jungle, brushwood, overgrowth of every description and from white ants' nests.

71. Six feet of jungle on either side of the ela shall be cleared, and all roots, silt, sand, and stones in the bed shall be removed, and the elas shall be kept in good repair always.

72. The cultivators of fields shall clear and repair the imaniyara and hewali adjoining their respective fields, and no person shall in any way alter or injure any imaniyara or hewali.

73. All trees growing on the borders of the elas which impede the free flow of water shall be cut down and such obstruction removed, and no person shall prevent the removal of such trees.

74. Owners of cattle and proprietors of paddy fields shall clear and maintain all paths and roads (pitaparawal) outside the paddy fields which have been constructed or hereafter may be constructed to drive in and out cattle.

75. Trees or jungle likely to occasion damage by giving cover to wild animals or otherwise shall be removed by the proprietors of the land.

76. No person shall furtively lead water into his field by cutting or piercing the dam or take water given for another field or fields before his turn comes.

77. No new amuna or ela shall be made for the cultivation or irrigation of new lands or for other purposes which may in any way affect the taking of water to the existing fields without the permission of the Government Agent.

78. No jungle or trees growing near and protecting a spring and no trees protecting an ela or spring shall under any circumstances be cleared or felled, and no one shall plant any kind of trees on the bank of any ela or an amuna.

79. The cultivators of lands belonging to Devalas and Viharas shall be deemed to be proprietors for the purpose of these rules, and shall have all the rights and be subject to all the duties and liabilities of the proprietors.

80. Where any water-course or channel is crossed by a path or road, the proprietors requiring water to be led beyond such path or road shall contribute such labour and money as may be needed for the purpose of providing and fixing pipes or kambahas of the specified size and description.

81. No road shall be fenced across without the leave of the Government Agent.

82. The Ela- or Vel-Vidane with the help of the Irrigation Officer shall divide the ela or tank bund among the cultivators. The cultivators will place stout numbered pickets at the commencement of the portion of ela or tank bund allotted to them. Particulars in respect of such allotments are to be noted in the ela or tank register to be kept by the Ela- or Vel-Vidane.

83. The fields under village tanks shall be treated as "malan" fields.

84. Except with the permission of the Government Agent or other authorized officer, no water from any tank or other irrigation work shall be allowed or used for any purpose other than that of irrigating paddy plants.

85. The rules for the afore-mentioned district of Wellassa published by Proclamation in the *Gazette* of May 19, 1916, and deemed to be in force heretofore by virtue of the provisions of section 2 of the Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

Sale of the Right to Exploit Forest Areas in the North-Central Province for extraction of Timber and Sleeper Conversion.

SEALED tenders for the right to exploit for a period of 5 years the Crown forests in the parts of Kalpe, Mahapotana, Udiyankulama, Kanadara, Ulagalla, Kalagam, Maminiya, and Matombuwa korales detailed in the annexed schedule, and situated in the North-Central Province, will be received by the Chairman, Tender Board, Colombo, up to midday on Tuesday, May 15, 1934.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover and should be addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, P. O. Box 500, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the General Treasury, Room No. 223, Second Floor, Galle Face Secretariat, Colombo, or be sent through the post under registered cover.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tenders for the right to exploit the Crown Forests situated in the North-Central Province for sleeper supply, timber in the log, and sawn timber" on the left hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the General Treasury, not later than midday on Tuesday, May 15, 1934.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms obtainable from the Office of the Conservator of Forests and no tender will be accepted unless it is in the recognized form.

6. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderer.

7. A deposit of Rs. 100 must be made either in the Office of the Conservator of Forests or in a Kachcheri, and a receipt produced therefor before any form of tender is issued.

8. A tenderer shall, before making his tender, examine in the Office of the Conservator of Forests the agreement he will be required to execute in the event of his tender being accepted and shall sign and deliver a statement to the effect that he has fully acquainted himself with the terms of such agreement and that in the event of his tender being accepted he will, within a time fixed by the Conservator of Forests, execute an agreement in terms of the said agreement.

9. A tenderer, who has not previously held a Government contract, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property, and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given. A tenderer who has carried out contracts with the Department, but not in the division or district in the notice calling for tenders should state in which division or district or divisions or districts he has held contracts. A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other Department should state the name of such Department and the District in which the service was rendered.

10. The tenderer should quote, both in words and in figures, the total premium which he is prepared to offer for 5 years' working rights. This premium shall not include the value of the material which the purchaser of the right shall pay to the Forest Department at the time of removal, at the rates specified in the schedule annexed. The premium will be payable in four equal instalments. The first instalment shall be paid within such time of notice of acceptance of tender as the Conservator of Forests may fix and subsequent instalments annually on or before the date corresponding to the date of first payment.

11. A tenderer shall, before tendering, satisfy himself as to the timber contents of the area of exploitation. No enumeration of the area has been carried out, but on a rough estimate 300,000 broad gauge sleepers can be extracted. No representations as to adequacy or quality of such contents will be entertained after an offer has been accepted for the right to exploit the area.

12. No tender will be considered unless it is in the approved form and unless all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

13. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by an agreement-holder to any person authorizing him to carry on the agreement on the agreement-holder's behalf.

14. The Tender Board does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

15. The tenderer whose tender is accepted will not be permitted to enter on the performance of the work for which he has tendered until he has executed a written agreement. The successful tenderer shall not assign, sublet, sub-contract, or enter into any agreement touching the work for which he has tendered without the previous authority of the Tender Board had and obtained in writing.

16. The Conservator of Forests may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the agreement-holder of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the agreement-holder.

17. The successful tenderer shall, on being informed in writing that his tender has been accepted, pay one-fourth of the amount of his offer and execute the necessary agreement within such time as the Conservator of Forests may fix. He shall also deposit with the Conservator of Forests or the Divisional Forest Officer before signing the agreement, a sum of Rs. 1,000 as security for the due and punctual performance of the agreement. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to or left at the address given by the tenderer.

18. The agreement shall be entered into by the successful tenderer with the Conservator of Forests acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

19. If the successful tenderer fails to comply with the requirements of clause 17, the Conservator of Forests shall be at liberty to terminate the contract. He shall also be entitled to forfeit for the use of the Crown the tender form deposit.

20. After execution of the agreement, the successful tenderer (hereinafter called the agreement-holder) may commence the felling and conversion of trees and the collection of timber at the wayside dépôt or dépôts established by him in the area with the consent of the Divisional Forest Officer and referred to in the agreement, where payment must be made at the rates referred to in the attached schedule, for the respective classes. Final removal will only be permitted on removal permits in the prescribed form, under the hand of a Forest Officer, and only in respect of timber which bears the Government hammer mark "S". Material transported outside the area of operation shall bear a distinctive property mark indicating ownership of such material by the agreement-holder who shall register such property mark with the Divisional Forest Officer at the time of signing the agreement.

The material found in the area will, for purposes of payment, be divided into the following classes:—

A.—Timber in the Log.

(i.) Ebony; satinwood over 5 ft. 6 in. in girth at butt end for supplies to Government Departments approved by the Forest Department.

(ii.) Palu, milla, ranai, halmilla, and na.

(iii.) Other species.

B.—Timber converted in the Forest.

(i.) Satinwood, palu, milla, ranai, halmilla, and na.

(ii.) Other species.

C.—Railway Sleepers.

(i.) Broad Gauge—Satinwood, palu, milla, ranai, and na.

(ii.) Narrow Gauge—Satinwood, palu, milla, ranai, and na.

Payment at rates laid down in the annexed schedule will be recovered on A (timber in the log) at a rate per cubic foot calculated by multiplying the square of the quarter girth (measured midway between the two ends of the log) by the length; on B (converted timber) at a rate per cubic foot calculated by multiplying the length, breadth, and thickness; and C (sleepers) at a rate per board or narrow gauge sleeper of the following dimensions:—

21. Special rules for felling, conversion, and removal of material which are to be observed by the agreement-holder, are more fully outlined in the special conditions given below. Nothing in these special conditions will exempt the agreement-holder from liability under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, or the rules made thereunder, should he be responsible for the commission of a Forest Ordinance.

Special Conditions.

(1) The exploitation of the area shall be mainly devoted to the conversion of sleepers for supply to the Railway Department; at least 95 per cent. of sleeper converted shall be broad gauge. That Department will buy direct from the agreement-holder all sleepers of the correct specification in respect of species, quality, and dimensions, brought from the felling area to the Railway Lineside or Station Yard. Payment is at present made by the Railway Department at the following rates:—

No guarantee is held out that payment will be made at the above rates throughout the period of exploitation of the area, and further no guarantee can be given that the Railway Department will accept any narrow gauge sleepers.

(2) The reduced royalties or amounts detailed in the attached schedule for timber in the log, converted timber and sleepers are fixed after taking into consideration the accessibility of the forest, and its estimated degree of stocking with valuable timbers.

(3) A Forest Department representative will pass all sleepers for species at the same time that the Railway Department's Inspecting Officer passes them for specification and payment; and the Forest Department will generally advise the agreement-holder during the course of the work as to the specification and standard of sleepers required.

(4) Reduced royalty will be recovered on timber in the log, converted material and sleepers at the wayside depot, as and when required by the Divisional Forest Officer, and in any case at intervals of not longer duration than one month. The time and place of recovery of reduced royalty on sleepers will be varied by the Conservator of Forests in exceptional circumstances; his decision on all aspects of this question shall be final. No sleepers which in the opinion of the Local Forest Officer are not up to specification will be allowed to be transported to the Railway Lineside or Station Yard; notwithstanding this, payment will be recovered on such sleepers.

(5) Sleepers should be delivered at an agreed point on the Lineside or Station Yards in batches or parcels of not less than 600, and as sufficient quantities become available for handing over, the Forest Department will periodically intimate the Railway Department to this effect.

(6) A plan will be attached to the agreement showing the working area delineated by a red outline. The boundaries of the area and such subdivisions of it as the Divisional Forest Officer may deem necessary, shall be demarcated by the agreement-holder and work shall be confined to such subdivisions as the Divisional Forest Officer may from time to time lay down. Annual working will be restricted to one-fifth of the area which is some 432 square miles in extent.

(7) The conditions regarding felling and sawing operations are as follows:—

(a) All trees exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height may be felled.

(b) All satin trees over 3 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height shall be felled. All felled satin trees over 3 ft. 6 in. and up to 5 ft. 6 in. in girth at butt end may be sawn into sleepers, or brought out in the form of sawn or squared material. It must be clearly understood that no satin log between these dimensions will be permitted to be removed except for approved supplies to Government Departments.

Felled satin trees over 5 ft. 6 in. in girth at butt end shall not be sawn into sleepers until passed by the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation lies.

The agreement-holder shall, if so required, supply to the Forest Department logs for Central Timber Depot or Government departments from trees selected by the Department. He shall supply such logs at the nearest railway station loaded into railway trucks and will receive payment at the following rates:—

(c) All cleaned ebony logs measuring 2 ft. and upwards in girth shall, if so required, be delivered to the Forest Department and the agreement-holder will be paid for such logs at a rate per cubic foot decided upon between him and the Divisional Forest Officer and approved by the Conservator of Forests at the time of delivery.

(d) The right is reserved to the Government Agent, North-Central Province, to issue, if necessary, however, grants for requirements of villages within or adjacent to the area, and for public purposes, in respect of trees of any species or girth; the agreement-holder shall not be entitled to any payment for any material thus granted.

(8) The Conservator of Forests may waive or reduce the amount due on timber which in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer is adjudged to be defective or of inferior quality.

(9) (i.) If an agreement-holder in the performance of his agreement does anything contrary to its terms or omits to do anything required thereby, the Conservator of Forests may—

(a) in any case in which he is of opinion that such act or omission is a serious irregularity, cancel the said agreement and forfeit for the use of the Crown the agreement-holder's security deposit and all timber in the area and the wayside depot whether paid for or not;

(b) in any case in which he is of opinion that such act or omission is a minor irregularity, fine the agreement holder.

(ii.) The Conservator of Forests may give the agreement-holder time to pay such fine. If such fine be not paid within the time allowed for its payment, it will be recovered from the security deposited under General Condition No. 17.

(10) The agreement-holder shall make good any deductions made from the security deposit within such time as the Conservator of Forests may fix. If he fails to do so the Conservator of Forests may cancel his agreement and forfeit the balance of the said deposit.

(11) The agreement-holder shall be liable to pay, at rates obtaining under the agreement for logs left lying in the area at the termination of the agreement, which in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer are marketable or capable of being converted.

Any trees which stand unfelled in the area at the termination of the agreement shall be the property of the Crown and the agreement-holder shall have no claim whatever to them.

(12) All produce removed by the agreement-holder or his agents may be stopped and examined by any Forest Officer anywhere and if there is reason to believe that money is payable to Government in respect of any portion of it, may be detained until such money is paid or until inquiry regarding it has been made.

(13) If the agreement-holder ceases to perform his agreement during the currency of the agreement and refuses to continue work on being requested to do so, the Conservator of Forests may terminate his agreement and forfeit his security deposit and all material lying in the area either felled or converted.

(14) The time allowed for the exploitation rights under this notice is for a period of five years from the date of signing the agreement. Extension of time beyond this period will be considered if the agreement-holder has in the period done his work to the entire satisfaction of the Conservator of Forests. Extensions of time will be granted on such terms and conditions as the Conservator of Forests may fix.

(15) In any dispute between the Conservator of Forests and the agreement-holder the decision of the Tender Board shall be final.
