REGULATION REFERRED TO.

The following regulation shall be added to rule under sub-head—A.—Markets, of rules under Chapter V., section $9\mathbf{r}(2)(d)$ of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," framed by the Sanitary Board, Matara District, Southern Province, in respect of the Small Town of Dondra and published in the Government Gazette No. 7,461 of May 8, 1925 :-

1. (a) After any such public market shall have been established and opened, no person shall, without a licence granted by the Board, expose for sale any meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruit, or vegetables in any boutique, private market, stall, or place within the limits of the Board, other than the public market; and it shall be lawful for an Inspector of the Board to seize any such meat, poultry, fresh fish, fresh fruit, and vegetables exposed for sale contrary to the provisions of this regulation, and to remove the same to the office of the Board, to be disposed of as the Chairman or the Magistrate may direct.

Provided that this regulation shall not apply to the auction of fish by fishermen on the seabeach immediately after the said fish have been caught by them.

"THE EXCISE OBDINANCE, NO. 8 OF 1912."



ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF GONA ADIKA ESTATES,

The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company provided such acceptance is properly legalized.

40. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder requiring him to pay the same together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at, which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid benot complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

41. Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, premia, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at nine per centum per annum, and the Directors more product the per pay thereof if there there bet Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

42. Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit. 43. The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and

also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents

are expressly saved.
44. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase ; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within 45. six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per centum per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share *bona fide* sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 42 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

46. The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder 'or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or any or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or ally of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or in respect of any other debt, liability or engagement whatsoever and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived ; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the

Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien. 47. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

48. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

49. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or
Secretaries that the power of sale given by Article 47 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares ; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolutions could have been effected without it.

53. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any members personally present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

· BORROWING POWERS.

54. The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees One hundred thousand (Rs. 100,000).

55. With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum, or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

56. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

57. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotments of shares, or otherwise.

58. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

59. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company and at such place as the Directors may determine.

60. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year, at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is so prescribed then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day in each year as may be determined by the Directors.

61. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding Article shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other Meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

62. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

63. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company.

Upon the receipt of such requisition, the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

64. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting.

 $65. \$ Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

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66. Seven days' notice at least of every Goneral Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the object and business of the meeting, shall be given to the Shareholders in manner hereinafter mentioned, or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently upon the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

67. The accidental omission to give notice of any meeting to or the non-receipt of such notice by any of the Shareholders shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting.

68. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors in place of those retiring by rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors ; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.
69. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be

69. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

70. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, expect the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented at the commencement of the business two or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

71. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

for which the meeting was called. 72. The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting, he shall not be present at the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

73. No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the Chair is vacant.

74. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice thereof shall be given.

75. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

76. At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such neeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some Shareholder, or in the case of a special resolution by five Shareholders, present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolutior has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or portion of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The power of demanding a poll conferred by this Article may be exercised by the proxy or attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf.

77. If at any meeting a poll be demanded by some Shareholder or his proxy or attorney or in the case of a special resolution by five Shareholders, or their proxies or attorneys present at the meeting and entitled to vote, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and place and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder or proxy or attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

78. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

79. No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

80. On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. Where a Shareholder is present by an attorney who is not a Shareholder such attorney shall be entitled to vote for such Shareholder on a show of hands. In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him up to one hundred and an additional vote for every one hundred shares beyond the first ten up to 100.

81. The parent or guardian or curator of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian or curator of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased Shareholder, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

82. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.

83. No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by proxy or attorney at any meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares have been paid, and no Shareholder, other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least three months previous to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

84. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder in the Company, but this rule shall not apply to a power of attorney.

85. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written and shall be signed by the appointor (whether a Shareholder or his attorney) or if such appointor be a company or corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such company or corporation.

96. Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

97. The Ordinary General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation, shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting.

98. Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors or provisional Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise, may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

99. A General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors and may also determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

100. No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for, the Company, or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or solicitors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract, work, or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

106. The Directors shall have power to lease, purchase, or acquire any lands, estates, or property they may think fit, or any share or shares thereof.

The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves 107. or through a Managing Director, or with the assistance of an agent or agents, and secretary or secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors subject to the provisions of Article No. 125 for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, lease or acquisition of the said estates and lands, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company. 108. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such rules or regulations for

the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and, in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, superintendents, assistants, clerks, artizans, labourers, and other servants, for such period or periods and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, treasurers, accountants, cflicers, clerks, or servants of the Company for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause for so doing.

The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers 109. of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting, and shall generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinances and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any Article in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any Article conferring any special or expressed power.
110. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company, on such terms as they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.
111. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company

any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

112. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by an extraordinary resolution of the Shareholders of the Company in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose ; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice, to the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding Article, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say) :----

- (a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle or abandon any action, suit, prose-cution, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company, and any claims or demands made by or against the Company.
- (b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or enforce the awards.
- (c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands by the Company.
- (d) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, or inspector or any similar office.
- (e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not to be immediately required for the purposes thereof upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or realize such investments.
- (f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on busine in Ceylon, or elsewhere, all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors; and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient, and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of, and in substitution for, all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and from time to time to revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or company to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

114. The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings at such places and times and in such manner as they may think fit, and determine the Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall quorum necessary for the transaction of business. be a quorum.

A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors. 115.

116. The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in

that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting. 117. Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.

The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member 118. or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee any such committee, either wholly or in part and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board. 119. The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are even in the such as the same are supposed by the approximate of such committees

applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board. 120. The acts of the Board or of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwith-

standing any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment or qualification of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if such person had been duly appointed or qualified, provided the same be done before the discovery of the vacancy cr defect. 121. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon shall be

as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

122. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the

123. All such minutes shall be signed by the person who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Bcard Meeting, or Committee Meeting, as the case may be; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Com-mittee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be *primd facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the purporting to have been metting. proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

124. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such Secretaries.

AGENTS AND SECRETARIES.

125. Bosanquet & Skrine, Limited, shall be the first Agent and Secretary of the Company.

ACCOUNTS.

126. The Agent or Secretary, or the Agents or Secretaries, for the time being, or, if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such sums were received and expended, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company. The accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company, as the Directors think fit.

127. The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

128. At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the previous financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the same period.

129. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income, distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other heads of expenditure. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting, and in case where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year the whole amount of such item shall be stated with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

130. The balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in Schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

131. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the amount if any which the Directors recommend should be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders.

A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

133. The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained, by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

AUDIT.

134. No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during the continuance in office be eligible as an Auditor.

135. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the first General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall, except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and the Auditor or Auditors appointed at such Meeting shall hold office only until the first Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.
136. The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in Company in the first for the remineration.

137. Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

138. If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor, is not supplied at the Ordinar General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.

139. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, after his appointment, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto and to report thereon to the meeting, generally, or specially, as he may think fit. 140. The Auditor or Auditors for the time being shall have a list delivered to him or them of all heads kent by the Company and he or they shall at all meanwhile hours in the deutime heads

of all books kept by the Company, and he or they shall at all reasonable hours in the daytime have access to all accounts, books and documents whatsoever of the Company for the purpose of audit.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

The Company in General Meeting (Ordinary or Extraordinary) may declare a dividend to be paid and/or pay a bonus to the Shareholders according to their rights and interests in the profits and may fix the time for payment, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of

net profits. No larger dividend or bonus shall be declared than is recommended by the Directors, but the Company in General Meeting as aforesaid may declare a smaller dividend or bonus. The declaration of the Directors as to the amount of the net profits of the Company shall be conclusive. 142. The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, or pay a bonus to the Shareholders provided the Directors are satisfied that the nett profits of the Company will be sufficient to justify such interim dividend or bonus.

144. Any General Meeting declaring a dividend may resolve that such dividend be paid wholly or in part by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of the Company, or paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of any other or debenture stock of the Company, or paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of any other company, or in any one or more of such ways; any General Meeting may resolve that any moneys, investments, or other assets forming part of the undivided profits of the Company standing to the credit of the reserve fund or in the hands of the Company and available for dividend be capitalized and distributed amongst the Shareholders in accordance with their rights on the footing that they become entitled thereto as capital and that all or any part of such capitalized fund be applied on behalf of the Shareholders in paying up in full any unissued shares of the Company and that such unissued shares so fully paid be distributed accordingly amongst the Shareholders in the proportion in which they are entitled to receive dividends and shall be accepted by them in full satisfaction in which they are entitled to receive dividends and shall be accepted by them in full satisfaction of their interest in the said capitalized sum. 147. The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding the fact that such sums or any of them are not payable until after the date when such dividend or bonus is payable.

Notice of any dividend that has been declared, or any bonus to be paid, shall be given 148 to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and any dividend or bonus unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Com-pany, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the Reserve Fund. 149. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to,

and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly autho ized to sign the name of the firm.

150. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

Notices.

151. Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or persons appointed by the Board to authenticate the same.

Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place 152. of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder, either personally or by 153. being sent through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode, and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless his executors, or administrators shall have given to the Directors, or to the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries of the Com-pany, their own or some other address in Ceylon to which notice may be sent. 154. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the backs of the Company and the law of the Company as a holder of the Company of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, and whether alone or jointly with any 158. other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

159. If the Company shall be wound up whether voluntarily or otherwise the liquidator or liquidators may with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company divide among the contri-butories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may with the like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator or liquidators with the like sanction shall think fit and if thought expedient any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the members of the Company and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights or may be excluded altogether or in part and the liquidator or liquidators shall be entitled to sell all or any of the assets of the Company in consideration of or in exchange for shares, ordinary, fully paid, part paid, or preference, in the purchasing company but in case any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on or any sale made of any or all of the assets of the Company of the contributories shall be determined on or any sale made of any or all of the assets of the Company in exchange for shares in the purchasing company either ordinary, fully paid or part paid or preference, any contributory who would be prejudiced thereby, shall have a right to dissent as if such deter-mination were a special resolution passed pursuant to the sections 234 and 243 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act of 1929 in England but for the purposes of an arbitration as in the sub-section 6 of the said section provided the provisions of the Ceylon Arbitration Ordinance, 1866, and of the Ceylon Ordinance, No. 2 of 1889, shall apply in place of the English and Scotch Acts referred to in the said sub-section 6 of section 234 of the aforewritten Companies (Consolidation) Act and the said reactions 234 and 243 save as horain excented shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these arcsent sections 234 and 243 save as herein excepted, shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these present Articles.



on March 24, 1934, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated March 20, 1984.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 17, 1934, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :-

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1933 to February 28, 1934, on account of the Municipal Fund.
 - (b) Progress report of works brought up to January 31, 1934.
- (c) Health Officer's report for February, 1934.
 (d) Statement of cases Instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February, 1934.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended March 24, 1934.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the Table :-

- (a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during February, 1934.
- (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3A. Mr. Beven having enquired whether any steps were being taken to improve the unsightly market area from which temporary boutiques were recently removed, the Chairman referred to the suggestion of the Superintendent of Police to have the Fair Day removed to this area, and agreed to bring the matter up before the next Works Committee, and in the meanwhile to remove the unsightly foundations and concrete slabs if the cost was not much.

4. Petitions :--Mr. De Silva presented--(1) petition from Mr. M. S. Buksh, complaining of the erosion caused by the Meda-ela to premises No. 15, Mulgampola, and asking the Council to take steps to avoid further damage. Ratwatte Adigar presented--(2) Letter addressed to him by Mr. D. A. Davendra enclosing a summary of Council's decisions regarding the opening of a footpath to Udamadapota village. Dr. Attygalle presented--(3) Undertaking signed by Mr. D. E. Gunawardene and 8 other land owners of Udamadapota offering to give free of compensation land for opening a road to Udamadapota ; and (4) Document bearing the name of Mendis Appuhamy and signed by R. P. Hinniappuhamy suggesting that traders in the small market be allowed to take an analysis. to trade in sundry goods.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented-(5) Letter from Mrs. E. Thomas addressed to the Medical Officer of Health asking that the unbuilt drain at the foot of the culvert near her premises No. 111, Peradeniya road, be built by the Council.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in the petitions, and also in connection with item (3), papers referred to by Ratwatte Adigar regarding the Council's failure to provide a gate to the path leading by the Poyage in the Asgiriya temple which the Council agreed to supply when land was gifted by the temple for opening Lady Manning's drive.

PART I. (GENERAL) - CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE - APRIL 27, 1934

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4A. At the request of Ratwatte Adigar, who stated that misunderstandings had arisen as to the true intentions underlying the proposal to bring Mulgampola-Bowela area within the operation of "The Housing and Town Improvements Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915," the Chairman made a statement to the effect that the proposal was calculated purely to control buildings that are erected in this area to preserve sanitary amenities with a view to prevent a legacy of slums being handed over to the Council if and when the area is brought within Municipal limits. He indicated that the control will be by the Medical Officer of Health of the District, and the proposal involves no taxation but will help the orderly development of the area along sanitary lines.

Mr. de Silva explained that the State Council was not opposed to the proposal but he got the matter deferred in that Council to allow him time to consult the people affected by the proposal as to the two alternatives open to them of bringing the area within Municipal limits or under the operation of the Housing Ordinance. 4B. With the leave of Council Ratwatte Adigar asked :--(i.) Will the Chairman kindly inform me whether he has

granted permission to any one to block the public path at Adanamaluwe by putting up two gates? (ii.) If not will the Chairman please have the gates removed ?

The Chairman replied as follows :--(i.) Am not aware of any such permission having been granted. (ii.) The matter will be looked into.

In this connection Dr. Attygalle remarked that a public footpath existed here so far back as 1876 and 1877. 5. To consider the report of the Municipal Engineer on the Minor River (Mahaweli-ganga) Pumping Scheme and the report thereon by the Director of Public Works.

Before proceeding to the consideration of the scheme, Mr. de Silva moved that the Council do place on record a vote of thanks to the Municipal Engineer, Chairman, and the Director of Public Works for the expeditious manner in which this matter has been dealt with by them.

The Chairman acknowledged the Council's indebtedness to the Municipal Engineer, the Director of Public Works, and Mr. Mahadewa and agreed to a record being made of the Council's appreciation of their services in the Minutes.

The Council then moved into Committee and having considered the scheme in detail the following resolution was adopted :

Resolved—(1) To adopt the Minor River (Augmentation) Scheme as set forth in the Municipal Engineer's reports of February 26, 1934, and March 2, 1934, subject to certain modifications detailed below based on the Director of Public Works' report No. WW9D of March 20 and to adopt the revised estimate based on the above and prepared by the Municipal Engineer dated March 21, 1934.

2) Resolved as regards the modifications suggested by the Director of Public Works :—(a) To decide that the wells should be inter-connected; (b) to sink 15 foot diameter wells; (c) to base scheme on a 14 hours pumping day; (d) to adopt suggestion of one-stage pumping but to leave method of housing pumping plant to the Municipal Engineer's discretion; (e) to instal Filtration plant at low level with the scheme ; (f) to instal reservoir at 1,760 level ; (g) reservoir to be of 250,000 gallons capacity.

(3) Resolved to finance scheme as follows:-(a) to vote from General Revenue Surplus Funds Rs. 50,000; (b) to loan from the Council's Electricity Surplus Funds an amount not to exceed Rs. 114,000 at 4 per cent. interest repayable in 15 equal annual instalments, to be drawn as and when required.

(4) To authorize immediate acquisition of the land required, the construction of 3 additional wells and-if necessary a dry well, and the construction of approach roads and erection of fencing. Expenditure on these items to be met from

the vote of Rs. 50,000. The Council having resumed, the Chairman moved that the resolution made in Committee beadopted. Ratwatte Adigar seconded.-Carried.

It was agreed to entrust the work on wells, fencing and roads to a selected Contractor on a carefully prepared schedule of rates

On behalf of the Council Mr. Wijayatilake wished that the Council should also place on record its thanks (1) to the Chairman for the great deal of pains and interest he had taken in bringing the scheme to a successful issue on the eve of his departure on furlough, (2) to Mr. de Silva as the originator of the idea of a pumping scheme and for having pushed the idea through, in spite of opposition, and (3) to Mr. D. H. Karunaratne who deserved great credit for drawing up the plans and collecting data connected with the scheme.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, March 17, 1934, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated March 12, 1984.

Present :---Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; Mr. A. C. Mohammado; and Mr. C. H. Bradley.

The Minutes of the General Meeting held on Friday, February 23, 1934, a copy thereof having been furnished 1. to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka :---That future entrants to the clerical service of all the Municipal Departments should be those who have passed either the E. S. L. C. or the Cambridge Junior Local

of all the Municipal Departments should be under the final product of a higher examination. With the permission of Council the mover amended the motion by adding the letters "J. S. C." after the letters "E. S. L. C." Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded. The Chairman moved as an amendment that, in filling vacancies in the clerical service of the Council, preference should generally be given to candidates between the ages of 18 and 25 who have passed either the E. S. L. C., J. S. C., Cambridge Junior Local, or any other higher examination. The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment which was put to the meeting and carried.

Pursuant to notice Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved :---(a) That the authorities concerned be requested to continue the widening of the Colombo-Galle high road from Kaluwella junction to the Galle Railway Station. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded, and Mr. D. I. Durham supported the motion, which was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.
(b) That the proposed new road starting from the Galle Esplanade and passing through Ooruppewatta and falling into the Kottubapalliya road be constructed to meet the Colombo-Matara high road. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.--

Carried unanimously.

3.

To consider the Supplemental Budget for 1933.—Resolved that the Supplemental Budget for 1933 be passed. To consider a petition from the licensed stall-holders of the meat market asking for a reconsideration of the 4. rates for the sale of mutton fixed by Council on November 18, 1933 :- Mr. A. M. Saheed, moved that in the case of local goats the price of mutton without bones be fixed at 80 cents per pound and mutton with bones at 67 cents per pound. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.

Messrs. F. Magdon Ismail, J. E. Perera, S. H. Dahanayaka, E. M. Karunaratna, and A. C. Mohammedo opposed the motion. The mover replied.

The motion was then put to the meeting and declared lost, only the mover and seconder voting for it. **Resolved** that no change be made and that the rates fixed by Council on November 18, 1933, be adhered to. 5. To consider tenders for supplying and erecting a new 32 · 5 kilowatt engine set at the Power Station :--Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the Council do purchase a 42.5 kilowatt engine set instead of the 32.5 kilowatt set previously decided Mr. R.-L. Ephraums seconded.-Carried. on.

6. Retirement of the Superintendent of Works :—The Chairman moved that under section 11 of the Municipal Leave By-laws full pay leave of 45 days in respect of 1933 and 1934 be granted to Mr. F. B. Toussaint, Superintendent of Works, preparatory to his retirement from service with effect from July 1, 1934. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried. The Council then proceeded to discuss what steps should be taken to fill the vacancy.—Resolved that (1) 28 to 40 years should be the limits of age; (2) preference should be given to candidates who are Associate Members of the Institution of Civil Engineers or who hold the diploma of the Institution of Municipal and County Engineers or have some equivalent qualification; (3) the salary of the post should be Rs. 3,600 rising to Rs. 7,200 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 240 subject to a temporary levy of 7½ per cent.; (4) a motor car allowance of Rs. 1,200 per annum should be paid;
(5) the appointment should be on probation for one year; (6) the selected candidate should furnish security in Rs. 5,000;
(7) applications to be received up to noon on April 4, 1934; (8) the appointment to be with effect from May 1, 1934; and
(9) candidates to be warned that attempts to interview or otherwise canvas the support of any member of the Council will be considered a disqualification. The draft notice calling for applications for the post was duly approved for insertion

With the permission of Council the following two items which did not appear on the agenda were next taken up for consideration :—

8. Fire protection at Galle :--Mr. J. E. Perera moved that a supplemental vote of Rs. 350 be sanctioned for the purchase of 3 lengths of "Camel" Fire Hose (with couplings) and two spindle hydrant stand posts for the use of the Galle Town Police. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.--Carried.

9. To consider papers relating to improvements to public latrines in the town :--Resolved that consideration be deferred and that in the meantime the papers be circulated to members. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :---


