- (1) divide the subdivision set out in column 1 of Schedule A hereto into two new subdivisions set out and defined in column 2 of the said schedule; and
- (2) provide in the manner set out in Schedule B hereto for the matters necessary to give effect to the division so effected.

SCHEDULE B.

1. The inhabitants of each of the new subdivisions set out in Column 2 of the foregoing Schedule A shall be the successors of the inhabitants of the original subdivision set out in Column 1 of the said schedule for all such purposes of the Ordinance as may relate to that new subdivision.
2. (i.) The accumulated balance of the moneys lying with the Assistant Government Agent of Mannar to the credit of the said original subdivision on June 30, 1934, shall be divided into four equal portions, and three of these portions together with the amounts of the Village Committee tax collected by Police Vidanes of Periyakaddaikkadu, Nanaddan, and Naruvilikkulam during the year 1934, and deposited with the Assistant Government Agent of Mannar shall be credited to the new Nanaddan West subdivision now divided and separated by this Proclamation and the other one portion together with the amount of Village Committee tax collected by the Police Vidane of Vankalai during the year 1934, and deposited with the Assistant Government Agent of Mannar shall be credited to the Vankalai subdivision mentioned under Column 2 above.
- (ii.) All movable property of the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall be deemed to be vested in the two new subdivisions in proportion of 3 to 1.
- (iii.) All immovable property vested in the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall be deemed to be vested in the inhabitants of the new subdivision within which the property is situated.
3. All the rights, powers and duties, debts, liabilities, and obligations of the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall so far as they relate to any of the new subdivisions aforesaid be deemed to be transferred to the inhabitants of such new subdivision.
4. All rules now in force under the provisions of the Ordinance in the original subdivisions shall be in force in each of the new subdivisions aforesaid, as if they had been made by, or by virtue of the powers delegated by the inhabitants of the new subdivision.
5. The Committee now in office in the original subdivision shall not be deemed to have been dissolved by reason of the division of the said subdivision into new subdivisions as aforesaid, but shall remain in office until June 30, 1934, or until the respective fresh committees elected for the aforesaid new subdivisions come into office.

RESOLUTION REFERRED TO.

REGULATIONS.

1. The regulations made for the urban area of Akuressa, regarding the appointment of a "licensing authority" and the establishment of public stands for omnibuses and lorries, and published in the *Government Gazette* of December 15, 1933; and October 16, 1931 (as amended by the regulation published in the *Government Gazette* of July 22, 1932), are hereby repealed.

2. In these regulations—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Village Committee of Akuressa.

"Public Stand" means any space within the urban area which is defined and reserved for the parking of omnibuses and lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

3. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing omnibuses and lorries to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

4. No vehicle other than an omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

5. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in any public place except in a public stand.

6. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of any particular class of omnibus or lorry, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

7. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

8. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

9. The driver of every omnibus or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the omnibus or lorry occupies a public stand.

10. The driver of any omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such omnibus or lorry.

11. Every driver or other person in charge of any omnibus or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

12. All omnibuses and lorries parked in a public stand shall be halted facing the same direction one behind the other and shall be moved up as vacancies occur in front.

13. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any omnibuses or lorries entering or leaving such stand.

Schedule.

(a) Each omnibus or lorry which plies from Akuressa and occupies a public stand shall pay Re. 1.25 per month for the use of the stand.

(b) Each omnibus or lorry plying along the Galle-Deniyaya and Matara-Deniyaya roads shall when it uses the stand pay 15 cents for any period over five minutes and less than six hours in duration, and five cents for every additional hour thereafter. These charges may, however, be compounded on payment in advance of Re. 1.25 per mensem as in (a) above.

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Village Committee of Deniyaya.

"Public Stand" means any space within the urban area which is defined and reserved for the parking of omnibuses and lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

3. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing omnibuses and lorries to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

4. No vehicle other than an omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

5. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in any public place except in a public stand.

6. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of any particular class of omnibus or lorry, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

7. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

8. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

9. The driver of every omnibus or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the omnibus or lorry occupies a public stand.

10. The driver of any omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such omnibus or lorry.

11. Every driver or other person in charge of any omnibus or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

12. All omnibuses and lorries parked in a public stand shall be halted facing the same direction one behind the other and shall be moved up as vacancies occur in front.

13. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any omnibuses or lorries entering or leaving such stand.

Schedule.

(a) Each omnibus or lorry which plies from Akuressa and occupies a public stand shall pay Re. 1 per month for the use of the stand.

(b) Each omnibus or lorry plying between Galle-Deniyaya and Matara-Deniyaya, and vice versa, and occupying a stand shall pay 25 cents for over 5 minutes and up to 12 hours, and 5 cents for every additional 10 minutes thereafter. These charges may, however, be compounded on payment of Re. 1 per mensem as in (a) above.

All householders shall deposit or cause to be deposited the dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, and other refuse from their premises in galvanized wrought iron bins which they shall provide and they shall place these bins daily on the edge of the road outside their premises between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6.30 A.M., and remove them or cause them to be removed within the space of half an hour after the same shall have been emptied by the scavengers.

2. The bins shall—

- (a) be constructed in such manner and be of such weight that the whole receptacle with its contents can be easily lifted and emptied into the scavenging cart;
- (b) they shall be provided with covers and convenient handles;
- (c) they shall have the owner's name or tenement number painted outside, and
- (d) they shall be kept clean by the owners.

3. No person shall place or cause to be placed dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, or refuse on any part of a road except in bins as aforesaid, and at the times specified.

Provided that the Chairman may authorize a householder to use instead of a bin as aforesaid such other covered receptacle as may be approved by him, if he is satisfied that owing to poverty, the immediate provision of such a bin would press harshly on the householder.

4. Any person committing a breach of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10 and, in the case of a continuing offence, to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 5 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

 2. (a) Cultivation shall take place between November 1 and August 31 each year.
(b) The first ploughing of the fields shall be completed by December 31 each year.
(c) The ridging and second ploughing of the fields shall be completed by March 31 each year.
(d) The sowing of fields shall be completed by April 30 each year.
 3. The following intervals are required for general repairs and maintenance of the works, viz., from January 1 to January 7, inclusive, and from September 1 to October 31, inclusive, each year. No water will be issued through any sluice or canals for distribution to the fields during these periods.
 4. No person other than the officer in charge of the work or some person deputed by him shall open or interfere with the sluices of the irrigation work or channels or issue water therefrom.
 5. The manager of the fields shall furnish the irrigation headman, within 15 days before commencing cultivation, with a list of persons who have been employed as goiyas, showing the extent which each goiya cultivates.
 6. It shall be the duty of the Vel-Vidanees to make written application to the irrigation officer for water stating the area requiring water, and they shall take action to prevent any waste of the water issued thereupon.
 7. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors whose lands are irrigable from any Government channel to construct, in accordance with the directions and specifications given in that behalf, such part of the subsidiary channels required to irrigate the lands as may be marked out by the officer in charge of the work as the share proportionate to the holding of such proprietor.
 8. All field channels shall be maintained in good order by the proprietors whose lands are irrigable thereby, and it shall be their duty to have their channels cleared before every cultivation, and to maintain them clear during the cultivation, and in the event of any default it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to cause the work to be done and to recover the cost thereof from the defaulter in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Ordinance.
 9. No person shall construct any dam across any channel except on instructions from the officer in charge of the work.
 10. Ploughing shall be commenced from the agavata to the mulata fields and sowing in like manner, and no mulata proprietor shall plough his field before the agata proprietor, if the latter ploughs in time.
 11. The fence round the whole tract shall be measured off in proportion to the extent each person cultivates, and the portion assigned to each proprietor shall be completed within six days of the notice given in that behalf by the Vel-Vidane.
- The aforesaid fence shall in like manner be maintained in good repair by the proprietors until the crop is reaped and gathered.
12. Each proprietor shall erect a proper watch hut adjoining the field cultivated by him before the sowing commences, and shall keep watch regularly until the crop is reaped and gathered although his own paddy may have been reaped earlier.
 13. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors and cultivators of the lands irrigated by any water-course to which any sudden or unforeseen damage has accidentally been caused, on being given reasonable notice thereof by the officer in charge of the work through the Vel-Vidane, by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, to attend at the place indicated and to contribute labour towards the repair of such damage in person or by substitute, until the work is completed.

14. It shall be the duty of the irrigation headmen elected or appointed under section 21 of the Ordinance to regulate the use of any water issued by the irrigation officer from the Government channels or other sources, to supervise the cultivation of lands under the work, and generally to enforce the observance of these rules.

15. All lands under cultivation shall be liable to the Vel-Vidane for four kurinies per annum of sowing extent, for yala and maha as huwandiram and the Vel-Vidane shall make over one-fourth of such huwandiram to the Ela-Vidane if such officer has been elected or appointed.

Provided that in any case where the Government Agent has disallowed any portion of the huwandiram due to any Vel-Vidane or Ela-Vidane who has been guilty of neglect of duty, only the remaining portion shall be payable by each proprietor to such Vel-Vidane, or by the Vel-Vidane to such Ela-Vidane.

16. Such huwandiram shall be paid and a receipt obtained therefor by each proprietor before any part of his harvest is removed from the threshing-floor.

17. If any proprietor makes default in payment of huwandiram, the equivalent in money may be recovered in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Ordinance.

18. The question of constructing any new channel that may be required shall be decided by the majority of the proprietors, subject to the right of the minority to appeal to the village council; and in the event of such an appeal, the decision of the council shall be final.

19. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid has to pass through the field of one or more of the proprietors, it shall be the duty of each such proprietor to open and construct that part of the channel which falls within his field.

20. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid falls outside the fields under cultivation, it shall be the duty of each of the proprietors to contribute, towards the construction of such channel or part labour proportionate to his holding.

21. Except with the permission of the Government Agent or other authorized officer, no water from any tank or other irrigation work shall be allowed or used for any purpose other than that of irrigating paddy plants.

6. It shall be the duty of the Vel-Vidanes to make written application to the irrigation officer for water stating the area requiring water, and they shall take action to prevent any waste of the water issued thereupon.

7. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors whose lands are irrigable from any Government channel to construct, in accordance with the directions and specifications given in that behalf, such part of the subsidiary channels required to irrigate the lands as may be marked out by the officer in charge of the work as the share proportionate to the holding of such proprietor.

RULES.

Membership of the Fund.

1. All employees (not being pensionable officers of the Government seconded for service with the Scheme) of the Board of Management of the Research Scheme drawing a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem or over shall as a condition of their employment by the Board become members of the Fund as from the date of their joining the service of the Board.

Members' Contributions.

2. (i.) Each member shall contribute monthly to the Fund from the date on which he is admitted a member thereof a sum equivalent to 5 per cent. of his salary. "Salary" for this purpose includes personal allowance equivalent to salary, but no other emolument whatever.

(ii.) The recovery shall be made by way of abatement on pay-sheets and any abatement so made shall be deemed for purposes of computing the interest due upon such contributions to have been credited to the Fund on the last day of the month for which the salary was due.

(iii.) In the event of such abatement not being made the member shall pay to the Secretary of the Board the sum due from him as his contribution within 15 days after the receipt by him of his salary, and for the purpose of computing the interest due upon such contribution, it shall be deemed to have been paid on the last day of the month in which it was received by the Secretary.

(iv.) The contribution shall be computed on the actual salary payable, whether the member shall be on full pay, half pay, or otherwise; but no contribution shall be due in respect of any period of leave without pay.

(v.) Any member who may be temporarily transferred or lent to a Government department or local public body (including a Research institution) may continue to contribute to the fund at the same rate as he would have contributed if he had not been so transferred or lent. No bonus under rule 3 shall be payable in respect of any contribution made under this rule.

Contributions of the Board of Management.

3. (i.) On the first day of the Board's financial year there shall be placed to the credit of each member a bonus equal to the sum contributed by such member during the preceding 12 months.

(ii.) In the event of a member ceasing to contribute on death or retirement the bonus shall be placed to the member's credit on the date on which he so ceases to contribute and shall be equal to twice the sum contributed by such member in the Board's current financial year.

For the purpose of this rule retirement shall include, in the case of officers who are employed on contracts having effect for a defined term—

- (a) The quitting of service on satisfactory completion of the full term of the officer's contract, and
- (b) The quitting of service before the expiry of the officer's contract, when such quitting is necessitated by ill-health for which the officer is not responsible, and in the case of an officer not serving on a written contract effective for a defined term,
- (c) The quitting of service on or after the completion of his 55th year of age, and
- (d) The quitting of service before he completes his 55th year of age, when such quitting is necessitated by ill-health for which the officer is not responsible.

Investment of Contributions.

4. (i.) All money at the credit of a member whether on account of his own contributions or of bonus, shall be invested with the Board of Management and shall bear interest at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum.

(ii.) The interest shall be made up on the first day of the Board's financial year and shall be computed on the minimum sum standing at the credit of each member throughout each month of the year. No interest shall be payable in respect of broken periods of a month.

(iii.) The sum accruing as interest shall be added to the capital sum standing at the credit of each member on the first day of the Board's financial year.

(iv.) The interest accruing under this rule shall be payable from the revenue and other funds of the Scheme.

Member's Accounts and closing thereof.

5. (i.) A separate account shall be kept for each member and shall be divided into two parts. The first part shall show the amount of the member's own contributions to the Fund with interest thereon as it accrues. The second part shall show the bonus credited to the member with interest thereon as it accrues.

(ii.) As soon as possible after the close of each financial year of the Scheme the Secretary to the Board of Management shall furnish each member with a statement of his account.

(iii.) When a member leaves the service of the Board the amount standing to his credit shall be paid to him or if he dies to the person legally entitled thereto, subject to the provisions of rules 5 (iv.), (v.), and (vi.) below.

(iv.) On quitting the service of the Board by voluntary resignation after giving the notice required by the terms of his appointment before the expiry of the term of a written

contract or before the completion of the 55th year of age, as the case may be, a member shall be entitled to receive the whole sum standing to his credit, with interest thereon, but not including any bonus not yet credited to his account. In the event of such premature termination of a member's appointment by the Board other than on discharge for misconduct or negligence in the performance of his duties, a member shall be entitled to receive the whole sum standing to his credit, with interest thereon, together with a bonus equal to the sum contributed by such member in the Board's current financial year.

(v.) In the event of dismissal of a member from its service on the ground of misconduct or negligence in the performance of his duties, the Board shall have power to declare forfeited that part of the sum standing to his credit which represents the bonus payable under rule 3 with interest thereon, or any part thereof; and on the Board making such declaration the sum so forfeited shall be repaid to the funds of the Scheme.

(vi.) Any sum or sums due to the Board by a member at the time when his account is closed shall, on the orders of the Board, be recovered from the sum standing to his credit.

(vii.) No member or the legal representative of any member shall have any right or vested interest in the Fund or any part of it so as to be able to assign, transfer, mortgage, charge, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the amount standing to his credit, and if he shall do so, or purport to do so, or shall become bankrupt or either voluntarily or involuntarily do or suffer some act or thing whereby such account standing to his credit shall or may become due or payable to any other person, the Board may by resolution annul his membership and declare the amount standing to his credit to be forfeited or may apply the same or any part of it for the benefit of his wife or children or other dependants as the Board may determine.

Custody of Accounts and Audit.

6. The books, accounts, and vouchers of the Fund shall form part of the accounts of the Scheme and shall be subject to the same audit and publication as the accounts of the Scheme.

TODDY RENT SALE CONDITIONS, 1934-35.

THE Governor has, under sections 18 and 31 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," directed that in addition to the general conditions published by Excise Notification No. 186 of April 12, 1929, the following shall be the special conditions for the grant of the exclusive privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail within any local area :—

1. (i) *Periods of Privilege.*—

(a) The privilege shall be granted for the period from July 1, 1934, to June 30, 1935, in the Northern and Eastern Provinces (except in the case of Alampil, Valayanmadam, Maruthoddai, Vavuniya, Parantan, and Kandavalai taverns in the Northern Province) and from October 1, 1934, to September 30, 1935, in all other provinces, or for any shorter period within these 12 months, on application by way of tender or by auction in the form and manner prescribed in these conditions.

(b) In the case of Alampil and Valayanmadam toddy taverns in the Mullaivivu District of the Northern Province, the privilege shall be granted for the period from March 1, 1935, to September 30, 1935, or for any shorter period within these seven months on application as aforesaid.

(c) In the case of Maruthoddai and Vavuniya toddy taverns in the Mullaivivu District of the Northern Province, the privilege shall be granted for the periods from July 1, 1934, to September 30, 1934, and from February 1, 1935, to September 30, 1935, or for any shorter period within these eleven months on application as aforesaid.

(d) In the case of Parantan and Kandavalai toddy taverns in Jaffna District of the Northern Province, the privilege shall be granted for the period from January 1, 1935, to August 31, 1935, or for any shorter period within these eight months on applications as aforesaid.

(ii.) *Introduction of Tree Tax System in Valikamam North.*—

In the Jaffna District any privilege granted will be subject to the condition that in the event of the Tree Tax System being put into operation in the Maniagar's Division of Valikamam North, the licensee of a tree under that system will be entitled to sell the fermented toddy produced from that tree within the premises licensed therefor.

(iii.) *Areas for which Privilege granted.*—

The privilege may be granted for the local area of an individual tavern, or for the respective local areas of each of a group of taverns as the Government Agent may decide.

(iv.) *Tapping areas.*—

Tapping areas, particulars of which may be obtained from the Superintendent of Excise of each circle, will be allotted for all taverns other than those situated within the limits of the Colombo Municipality or in the Chilaw District, and licences to tap trees outside the tapping area allotted to a tavern will not ordinarily be issued.

2. *Disqualifications against Acceptance of Tender.*—

No tender will be accepted from any person—

- (a) whose name appears on the list of defaulting contractors, or on the list of defaulters in respect of toll, arrack, or toddy rents, or on the list of persons precluded for other reasons from having any concern in any Government rent; or
- (b) whose name is on the Excise Register of offenders; or
- (c) who is a registered criminal within the meaning of the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, No. 2 of 1926, or who has been convicted of any crime or of any Excise offence; or
- (d) who at any time held a licence which has been cancelled under section 26 of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912.

3. *Tender Form.*—

Every tender shall be made on the prescribed form which may be obtained from the Treasury or any Kacheheri.

4. *Restrictions against Hidden Tenders and Plurality of Tenders.*—

(i.) Every tender or bid shall be made by the tenderer or bidder in his own name. No tender or bid will be accepted which is made through an agent.

(ii.) No person shall send in more than one tender for any one tavern, or group of taverns.

5. *Tender Deposit.*—

(i.) The Government Agent may, if he considers it necessary, require the deposit of a sum not exceeding Rupees Five hundred (Rs. 500) by the tenderer in respect of each tender.

(ii.) Every tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kacheheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of the sum required by the Government Agent under the foregoing paragraph of this condition, and the number and date of the receipt shall be entered on the face of the tender form.

6. *Delivery of Tenders.*—

Every tender shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked in the top left hand corner with the name of the tavern in respect of which the tender is made and its number on the list of sanctioned taverns. The envelope shall be (a) deposited in the Kacheheri Tender Box, or (b) handed to the Government Agent or to the Assistant Government Agent or to his Office Assistant, or (c) sent by registered post so as to reach the Kacheheri before the time fixed for closing the tenders.

7. (i.) *Power of Rejection of Tender.*—

The Government Agent may in his discretion reject any or all of the tenders received; and in the event of his so rejecting all tenders, he may either call for tenders again or put up the privilege for sale by auction.

(ii.) *Restriction of Bidding at Auction.*—

At such auction no person shall be allowed to bid, unless he shall have either—

- (a) submitted a tender accompanied by the Treasury or Kacheheri receipt prescribed in the foregoing condition 5, whether such tender be for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege; or,
- (b) produced the receipt prescribed in the foregoing condition 5, notwithstanding his failure to submit a tender for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege.

Provided that no person who is duly declared the purchaser of any privilege, whether by way of tender or of auction, shall use or be permitted to use the same receipt for the purpose of a tender or a bid for any other privilege, until he has completed in respect of the privilege already granted to him the steps prescribed hereinafter in condition 8 (i.) (a).

(iii.) *Power of Rejection of Bid.*—

Subject to the proviso that the Government Agent shall have discretion to reject any or all of the bids the privilege shall be granted to the highest bidder at such auction.

(iv.) *Power to grant Privilege to Approved Person.*—

In the event of the rejection of all bids as aforesaid the privilege may be granted to any person who is approved by the Government Agent and who agrees to pay by way of rent such amount as the Government Agent may fix.

8. (i.) (a) *Security Deposit.*—

The grantee shall, immediately on being granted the privilege, sign these conditions and pay to the Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege.

(b) *Signing of Bond.*—

The grantee shall also within fourteen days of the sale of the privilege enter into a bond with the Government Agent for the full amount for which he has purchased it, and he shall specially hypothecate by such bond the said security deposit.

(c) *Consequences of Breach of Conditions of Bond.*—

The said security deposit shall be liable to be confiscated by the Government Agent for breach of any of these conditions or for non-payment of any instalment, and such confiscation shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed in these conditions for such breach.

(ii.) *Banking of Security Deposit.*—

Security money so paid will be deposited in a bank only on the grantee's application and only at his risk, and when such deposit is made, no withdrawal will be allowed till the date of maturity.

(iii.) *Warrant of Attorney to confess Judgment.*—

If the highest bid or tender under the foregoing condition 3 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the time of the execution of the bond as aforesaid execute, if so required by the Government Agent, a power of attorney in the form sanctioned by law, to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege, and shall also furnish to the Government Agent within fifteen days of the date of the execution of such power of attorney a duly certified copy thereof for filing in the District Court under section 32 of the Civil Procedure Code.

(iv.) *Registered Postal Address.*—

The grantee shall, on signing these conditions, elect and signify under his hand a post office or postal address to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the privilege may be addressed under registered cover: and all such notices or processes so addressed to such post office or to such postal address, and posted in due course shall be deemed to have been duly served and be as effectual for all purposes, as if they had been served upon the grantee in person upon the day on which such notice or process was so posted.

9. *Failure to complete Purchase of Privilege.*—

If any tenderer or bidder, on being declared to be the purchaser of the privilege, declines or fails to sign these conditions of sale or fails to furnish the security prescribed in the foregoing condition 8 (i.) (a) when called upon to do so, the deposit made under the foregoing condition 5 may be declared forfeited, and the defaulter will render himself liable to have his name entered in the list of defaulters in respect of all arrack or toddy rents. Subject to this exception, the deposits of all tenderers or bidders will be returned after the conditions of sale have been signed and the aforesaid security given by the successful tenderer or bidder.

10. (i.) *Payment of Rent.*—

The grantee shall pay the purchase money or rent to the Government Agent in twelve equal monthly instalments.

(ii.) *Due date of Instalment.*—

The first instalment of the rent shall be deemed to be due and payable on ———, and succeeding instalments shall be deemed to be severally due and payable on the last day of each succeeding month.

(iii.) *Interest.*—

Interest at the rate of 9 per centum per annum shall be payable in respect of all arrears.

11. (i.) (a) *Cancellation of Licences and Privilege for Non-payment of Rent, &c.*—

If any instalment or part of any instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, or other sum due to the Crown from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after fifteen days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process of law, to cancel the licence or licences issued to the grantee, and to resell the privilege at the risk of the grantee.

(b) *Notice of Cancellation.*—

Such notice may be served personally on the grantee, or addressed to the post office elected under the foregoing condition 8 (iv.), as the Government Agent thinks fit.

(c) *Regrant of Privilege after Cancellation.*—

In the event of the cancellation of a licence, the Government Agent shall have power to grant the privilege to any person approved by him for any period intervening between such cancellation and the resale of the privilege, and for this purpose may issue to such approved person a temporary licence upon such terms as he may think fit.

(ii.) *No Remission of Rent.*—

No remission of the rent payable in respect of the privilege will be granted on any plea of the grantee's having overestimated the value of any tavern or on any other ground.

(iii.) *No Compensation for Losses.*—

The grantee shall not have, or make any claim to any reduction or to the remission of any sum due and owing by him to the Crown by reason of any loss alleged to have been sustained by him, whether on account of any closing of the tavern or taverns during the passage of troops or during the encampment of troops in the vicinity of the tavern or taverns, or during the holding of any poll, or through any other cause whatsoever.

12. (i.) *Payments not valid without Kachcheri Receipt.*—

No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be deemed to have been duly made, unless the grantee produces a Kachcheri receipt in respect thereof.

(ii.) *Money left with Officers not reckoned as Money Paid.*—

No money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of any Shroff or any other officer of any Kachcheri shall be deemed to be money paid under this contract.

13. (i.) *Application for Licensing of Trees.*—

The grantee shall, at least twenty-one days before the date on which the privilege commences to run, furnish to the Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form showing the numbers and the situation of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern and the situation and numbers of the collecting stations for toddy which he proposes to establish; and no trees shall be tapped or toddy drawn in pursuance of this privilege otherwise than under cover of a tapping licence setting forth the numbers and the situation of such trees, the name of the drawer, the name of the owner or possessor of such trees, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended.

(ii.) *Licences for Additional Trees.*—

Any application for a licence to tap additional trees for any tavern shall be made to the Superintendent of Excise in like manner three weeks before the grantee intends to commence to tap such trees.

(iii.) *Tapping Areas for Taverns.*—

Except in cases where the Excise Commissioner's previous sanction has been obtained, the Superintendent of Excise shall not issue any licence to tap any tree situated outside the tapping area allotted to that tavern.

(iv.) *Power to refuse or cancel Licences.*—

Subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, whose decision shall be final, the Superintendent of Excise shall have power to refuse any application for a licence to tap additional trees for any tavern, and to cancel any tapping licence, the continuance of which appears to him to be unnecessary or open to objection.

14. (i.) *Establishment of Collecting Stations.*—

If toddy is to be transported in pursuance of this privilege by lorry, cart, or railway, the grantee shall establish collecting stations on the main road in places approved by the Circle officer.

(ii.) *Accounting at Collecting Stations.*—

The grantee shall keep at each collecting station a book, and shall cause the following particulars to be entered therein daily:—

- (a) The quantity of toddy received from each tapper;
- (b) The quantity of toddy in each consignment despatched to the tavern, with the time of despatch; and
- (c) The number of the transport pass covering each such consignment, the method of transport, and the registered number of the cart or motor vehicle employed.

(iii.) *Number of Vehicle or Transport Pass.*—

The grantee shall further cause the registered number of the cart or motor vehicle conveying each such consignment to be noted on the transport pass covering that consignment.

(iv.) *Times for Collection of Toddy.*—

The grantee shall cause the morning yield of all trees to be lowered before 8.30 A.M. daily, and the afternoon yield of all trees to be lowered before 4.30 P.M. daily. He shall cause all such yield to be removed at once to the tavern or to the proper collecting station. He shall not allow any toddy to be kept at any place other than a collecting station after 10 A.M. in respect of the morning yield or after 5.30 P.M. in respect of the afternoon yield.

(v.) *Times for Transport of Toddy.*—

The grantee shall cause all toddy from the morning yield to be delivered at the tavern before 11 A.M. daily, and all toddy from the afternoon yield to be delivered at the tavern before 6 P.M. daily.

Provided that in any case in which toddy is transported to any tavern from any place more than 20 miles distant therefrom, the Excise Commissioner may, if he thinks fit, extend the time, whether in respect of the morning yield or of the afternoon yield, within which such toddy may be delivered at the tavern.

(vi.) *Marking of Capacity on Vessels and Dip-rods.*—

The grantee shall cause the correct capacity of every storage vessel used for storing toddy at any collecting station to be marked upon such vessel, and shall provide an accurate dip-rod for use therewith.

(vii.) *Advice Note for Toddy sent to Tavern.*—

Every consignment of toddy from a collecting station to a tavern shall be accompanied by an advice note containing the particulars set forth in the foregoing paragraphs (ii.) (b) and (ii.) (c) of this condition, and signed and dated by the collecting station manager. Such advice notes shall be filed in the tavern until ordered to be destroyed by an Excise Officer, not below the rank of Inspector.

15. (i.) (a) *Marking of Trees.*—

The grantee shall not—

permit any tree to be tapped or toddy to be drawn from any tree for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at any tavern, unless such tree has first been marked for the purpose in the manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner; or

(b) *Transport Passes.*—

permit any toddy to be transported to any tavern otherwise than under cover of a pass issued to him under the hand of the Superintendent of Excise, and setting forth the name of the person who is to transport the toddy.

(ii.) *Separate Pass for each Carrier.*—

The grantee shall obtain separate passes for the transport of toddy by pingo carrier from the tree tope to the tavern or collecting station and for its transport by cart, lorry, or other vehicle from the collecting station to the tavern, and shall deliver the appropriate pass to such pingo carrier or to the person in charge of such cart, lorry, or other vehicle.

(iii.) *Separate Passes for each Person at Collecting Station.*—

The grantee shall obtain a separate pass for each person employed in the collection or in the handling of toddy at topes, collecting stations, or taverns.

16. (i.) *Vinegar Licence.*—

If the grantee wishes to make vinegar from toddy, he shall obtain a vinegar licence from the Government Agent.

(ii.) *Conditions of Vinegar Licence.*—

The Government Agent hereby reserves to himself the right to issue a licence to any person for making vinegar within the area to which this privilege relates on such terms and subject to such conditions as the Governor may approve.

(iii.) *Vinegar Store to be approved and Accounts kept.*—

If a licence to make vinegar from toddy has been issued to the grantee, he shall store such vinegar in premises approved by the Government Agent, and shall keep a true account in the form prescribed by the Excise Commissioner of all toddy converted into vinegar and of all sales of vinegar.

(iv.) *Inspection by Excise Officers.*—

The grantee shall cause such vinegar store to be opened for inspection at the request of any Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, and shall produce the accounts kept therein whenever called upon to do so.

17. *Grantee to have no Interest in Arrack Sales.*—

The grantee shall have no concern or interest, direct or indirect, in the sale of arrack, or in the purchase of any privilege for the sale of arrack, within the area of his rent.

18. (i.) *Opening of Tavern on due Date and Approval of Site.*—

(a) The grantee shall open the tavern or taverns on the day on which the privilege commences to run.

(b) The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site.

(c) The grantee shall not open a tavern on any site otherwise than with the approval of the Government Agent, such approval being obtained from the Government Agent at least 14 days before the privilege commences to run.

(ii.) *Obtaining of Licences for Sale of Toddy.*—

The grantee shall, not less than five days before the date on which the privilege commences to run, obtain from the Government Agent a licence or licences for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the taverns within the area covered by this privilege.

19. *Conviction of Grantee or Agents.*—

If the grantee, or any agent or other person authorized or employed by the grantee for the purpose of this privilege is, during the continuance of the privilege, convicted of an offence under Chapter XIII. of the Ceylon Penal Code, the Government Agent may take any of the steps prescribed by section 50 of the Ordinance.

20. *Grantee responsible for Agent's Acts.*—

The grantee shall be responsible for all acts of his agents or employees in relation to the privilege.

21. *Non-transferability of Rent.*—

The privilege shall not be transferable otherwise than with the sanction of the Governor first had and obtained.

22. *Bottling of Toddy.*—

The Excise Commissioner may, in his absolute discretion and subject to such conditions and restrictions as he may impose, authorize the issue of a licence to the grantee to bottle toddy for sale.

23. *Limit of Sale.*—

The limit of sale by retail, with respect to the whole Island and as regards purchasers generally, shall be one-third of an imperial gallon, and no toddy in excess of that quantity may be transported except under the pass prescribed for that purpose by the Ordinance.

24. *Prohibition of Possession of Toddy in certain Dry Areas.*—

The transport or possession of toddy in any quantity whatsoever is entirely prohibited within the areas specified in Excise Notification No. 261, published in *Gazette* No. 8,046 of May 4, 1934.

(31) To recommend that, under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the excess leave of 3 days over 42 days granted to James Soysa, Compositor, Printing Department, be sanctioned. Registered No. 72.—Recommended.

(32) To recommend:—(a) That, under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the excess leave of 15 days over 42 days granted to Mr. P. D. Martin, Clerk, Division II., Municipal Engineer's Department, be sanctioned. (b) That, under section 10 (i.) of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, he may be granted 91 days accumulated vacation leave. (c) That, under section 10 (iii.) he may be granted excess leave of 2 days over 91 days to be appropriated out of the lapsed vacation leave of 6 days available in respect of 1930 and 1931. Registered No. 103.—Recommended.

(33) To recommend that, under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the excess leave of 21 days over 42 days granted to Mr. C. C. V. Welikala, Sub-Inspector, Waterworks Department, be sanctioned. Registered No. 214.—Recommended.

WRITE OFF OF ARREARS OF RATES.

(34) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer recommending that arrears of rates amounting to Rs. 230·76 be written off (24 cases—all on grounds of poverty). Registered No. 221.—Recommended.

GENERAL.

(35) To reconsider:—(a) An application from Division II. Clerks of the Municipal Clerical Service, who have qualified for promotion to Division I. of the Municipal Clerical Service, requesting that they be given preference in filling up vacancies that are in hand and that may occur in the near future as against those not in the permanent service of the Council. (b) The comments of the Acting Municipal Treasurer. (c) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 1,569.—Recommended that vacancies in the First Division posts in the Municipal Clerical Service be filled, as suggested in the Acting Secretary's memorandum dated February 5, 1934, and that any resulting vacancies in Division II., be filled temporarily by those in the waiting list for Division II. appointments.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted subject to the substitution of the words "in the first instance by the appointment of the seven departmental candidates in the "A" list together with those in the "B" list and "Merit" to their usual 4th and 5th vacancies respectively" for the words "as suggested in the Acting Secretary's memorandum dated February 5, 1934". Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

The following item having been unanimously approved of by the Finance Committee and by the Relief of Distress Committee in circulation, is submitted for sanction of Council:—

(36) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated March 6, 1934, regarding Unemployment Relief Works, stating that the work of levelling Crown land at Kolonnawa will come to an end about the middle of this month leaving a balance of Rs. 16,000 unexpended and that it is suggested that this unexpended balance of Rs. 16,000 (half of which is Government contribution) be used to improve and extend the work carried out sometime ago at Peter's lane (constructing a road to serve Wanathamulla) and that men now working at the Kolonnawa Relief Works be employed on this work. Registered No. 336.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement of February 26, 1934, was considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider:—(a) The draft By-laws under section 27 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, regarding dairies. (b) The suggested boundaries of the Pesbeta Area. (c) The draft amendments to By-laws 2 (d) and 5 (a) of the Zoning By-laws. Registered No. 193.—Recommended, as per annexure "A" attached at the end of these minutes.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of February 28, 1934, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEERS' DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider:—(a) The correspondence with Government on the proposal for conversion of all gas lights in the streets of Colombo to Electricity. (b) The report of the Municipal Engineer, dated January 26, 1934.—Recommended that the Council enter into a street lighting contract with the Department of Electrical Undertakings on the terms set out in the annexure hereto attached "B."

(4) To consider the correspondence and reports regarding the provision of Maternity Homes in the City. Registered No. 010,000.—Recommended that the Council accept the principle of gradually providing, where necessary, small Maternity Homes attached to its Child Welfare Centres for the treatment of normal cases of labour where the patients cannot be suitably attended to in their own homes.

(5) To consider :—(a) A proposal for converting the present Apothecary's Quarters at St. Paul's Dispensary into a Maternity Home with 6 beds and providing the Apothecary with new quarters on the bare land at present available at the northern end of the Apothecary's quarters. (b) A plan and an estimate of Rs. 7,500 from the Municipal Engineer. Registered No. 01,240.—Recommended.

The following item having been unanimously approved of by the Four Standing Committees in circulation is submitted for sanction of Council :—

(5A) To recommend the acceptance of the offer of a sum not exceeding Rs. 20,000 for the purpose of building and equipping a Maternity Home for the benefit of the inhabitants of Grandpass and adjoining localities, subject to the conditions stated in the letter to the Chairman, dated March 2, 1934, with an expression of the Council's thanks to the donors for their generous donation.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

The Chairman stated that he was sure the Council would agree that their acceptance of that generous offer should be accompanied by a warm appreciation of the public-spiritedness shown by the donors, Messrs. Adamjee Lukmanjee Bros.

The Council concurred.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam said he thought that one of the brothers was formerly a member of the Municipal Council.

The Chairman stated that Mr. G. Adamjee Lukmanjee was a member of the Council for 6 years, from 1922 to 1928

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(6) To consider the draft notice submitted by the Medical Officer of Health regarding the post of Lady Medical Officer-in-Charge of Maternity and Child Welfare. Registered No. 2,085.—Recommended that the notice, as per annexure "C" be approved.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted subject to the condition that the officer appointed be debarred from private practice and that she should be able to speak colloquial Sinhalese and Tamil.—Mr. A. R. A. Razik seconded.

Dr. S. Muttiah suggested that if the officer selected did not know both Sinhalese and Tamil she should be given time to acquire a knowledge of the language of which she was ignorant.

The Council accepted the suggestion.

The motion, as amended, *i.e.*, "that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted subject to the condition that the officer appointed be debarred from private practice and that she should be able to speak colloquial Sinhalese and Tamil; provided that if the officer selected did not know both Sinhalese and Tamil she should be given time to acquire a knowledge of the language of which she was ignorant," was put to the meeting and carried.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(7) With reference to the resolution of Council on November 1, 1933, relating to the previous Municipal service of Mr. C. Stewart Orr, Municipal Assessor, to consider :—(a) An application from Mr. G. H. N. Saunders, Municipal Treasurer, for the formal sanction of Council to have his name placed in the list of transferred officers for the purposes of section 18 (i) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, as his case is similar to that of Mr. Orr. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman, dated February 14, 1934. Registered No. 22.—Recommended.

(*Vide* resolution of Council in Committee on page 294 of these minutes in connection with item No. 17 of the extracts from the minutes of the Finance Committee of February 21, 1934.)

VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(10) To consider :—(a) The desirability of legalising the monthly charge of Rs. 5 now levied for animals admitted to the cattle markets. (b) The reports thereon of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon and the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 252.—Recommended, as per annexure "D".

(11) To consider the reports dated February 6, 1934, and February 13, 1934, from the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon and the Municipal Treasurer, respectively, on the subject of housing local cattle by owners in the sheds situated in the corner space between Mart road and Mart lane for sale to butchers for purposes of slaughter. Registered No. 250.—Recommended, as per annexure "D".

4. The Chairman moved in Committee—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

ANNEXURE A.

That under section 27 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, the following by-law be adopted :—

1. "It shall not be lawful for any person after the date of publication of this by-law to establish a dairy in any part of the city, save in the Pasbatal area bounded as follows :—North by the Kelani river ; west by the Kelani river, and the eastern boundary of Crow Island ; east by the Kelani river ; and south by a straight line drawn along the north limit of St. Mary's road and continued east and west until it meets the river on the east and the eastern boundary of Crow Island on the west".

2. By-law 5 (a) of the Zoning by-laws relating to the Mattakkuliya "offensive and dangerous trades area" published in *Gazette* No. 7,607 of September 23, 1927, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor :—

"The Mattakkuliya 'offensive and dangerous trades area' shall be bounded as follows :—North by a straight line drawn along the north limit of St. Mary's road and continued east and west until it meets the river on the east and the eastern boundary of Crow Island on the west ; east by the Kelani river ; south by Prince of Wales' avenue and Madampitiya road ; west by Vine street south, Alutmawatta road, Vine street north, Ferguson road to Kelani river, and by the Kelani river".

3. "By-law 2 (d) of the Zoning by-laws dated September 22, 1927 (*Gazette* No. 7,607 of September 23, 1927), as amended by notification dated February 22, 1928, published in *Gazette* No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928, is further amended by the deletion of the word "dairy" in lines 3 and 7 thereof".

ANNEXURE B.

(1) All street lamps in excess of 2,000 to be converted to electricity ; the Council to select the streets and to guarantee a minimum of 1,000 lamps exclusive of those already lighted by the Department ; as the Municipality is not in a position to hand over 1,000 lamps immediately owing to its contract with the Gas Co. as many as are available are to be handed over at once and the balance made up as new streets require to be lighted.

(2) The rates charged for all night and half night electric lamps to be the same as at present obtaining for similar gas lamps, the basis of comparison being as follows :—(a) A 50 watt electric lamp—a single Bijou mantle of 470 lumens ; (b) A 100 watt electric lamp—a two mantle lamp of 1,100 lumens ; (c) A 150 watt electric lamp—a three mantle lamp of 1,800 lumens ; (d) A 250 watt electric lamp—a five mantle lamp of 2,600 lumens.

(3) The Municipality to pay half the estimated cost of conversion of each lamp from gas to electricity, the full cost being estimated at Rs. 50 per lamp ; provided that no payment shall be made by the Municipality on account of any lamp until the lamp has been completely converted by the provision of a new lantern of modern type approved by the Municipal Engineer, and provided further that the total payments by the Municipality on this account shall not in any event exceed the sum of Rs. 5,000 in any one year.

(4) The Council to allow the Electrical Department free use of its existing gas standards, which will remain the property of the Council. No charge to be made by the department on account of new lamp standards where lamps can be installed on the department's posts ; in all other cases the Municipality to pay the department for standards and fittings at prices to be arranged from time to time.

(5) No charge to be made to the Municipality on account of existing electric mains or for the provision of new mains where required provided the extension is justified by the probable load.

(6) A clause to be inserted in the agreement similar to that in the Council's existing contract with the department as to future revision of rates.

ANNEXURE C.

Notice.

Wanted a Lady Medical Officer for Maternity and Child Welfare Work in the City on a salary of Rs. 4,800 to Rs. 8,400 by annual increments of Rs. 300 and a motor car allowance of Rs. 1,200 per annum.

Preference will be given to candidates who possess the following qualifications, viz., a Diploma in Public Health, a Diploma in Midwifery and a good practical knowledge of Obstetrics, Gynaecology, Pediatrics, and Child Welfare Work. Applicants who must be under 30 years of age should apply on forms which may be had from the Medical Officer of Health, Town Hall, and should be forwarded to reach him before 12 noon on May 31, 1934.

Candidates who do not possess the requisite qualifications should state whether they are prepared to proceed to United Kingdom and acquire the above qualifications stating also whether they are prepared to do so at their own expense or whether they would require assistance from the Council, and if so, to what extent.

ANNEXURE D.

That By-law 3 of the by-laws relating to cattle markets published in *Gazette* No. 7,483 of September 4, 1925, be repealed and the following by-law be substituted therefor :—

3. Owners shall pay the following scale of fees for animals admitted to the cattle market :—For cattle and buffaloes for slaughter for each day or part thereof 25 cents each ; for sheep and goats (local) for each month or part thereof 50 cents each ; for cattle and buffaloes for each month or part thereof Rs. 5 each.

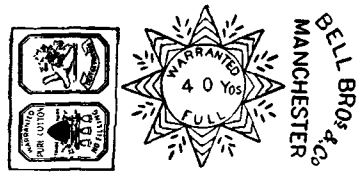

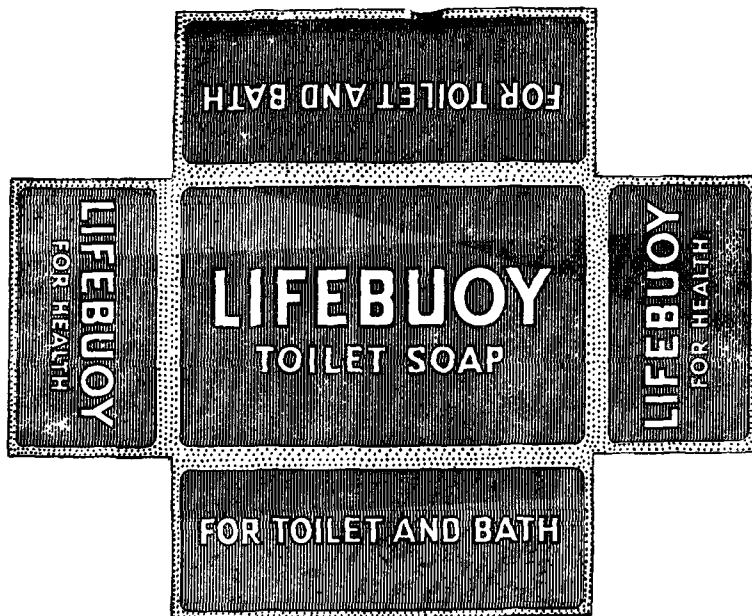

3. Terms agreed upon—

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, a clear overfall spill in cement concrete at the right bank up to the estimated cost of Rs. 400 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to clear jungle and to complete earthworks in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent, and for this purpose each of the proprietors agrees—

(a) to clear 0.1 acres of jungle and to complete 26.8 cubes of earthwork, in respect of each acre owned by him under the aforesaid irrigation work ;

(b) to contribute the necessary labour in person, free of all charges ; or in commutation of such labour, to contribute money, on or before June 30 of the year in which such labour is due at the rate of Rs. 15 for each acre of jungle and of Rs. 2 for each cube of earthwork, for the clearing or the completion of which he is liable ; and

(c) to clear all the specified jungle within 6 months and to complete all earthworks within 24 months.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.
