STATE MORTGAGE BANK PROVIDENT FUND RULES.

1. *Membership of the Fund.*—All monthly paid employees of the Bank (not being pensionable officers of the Government seconded for service with the Bank) in receipt of a salary of Rs. 40 per mensem and over shall, as a condition of their employment by the Bank, become members of the Fund, established by these rules, from the date of their joining the service of the Bank or attaining that salary as the case may be.

2. (1) *Members' Contributions.*—Each member shall contribute monthly to the Fund from the date on which he becomes a member thereof a sum equivalent to 5 per cent. of his salary. "Salary" for this purpose includes personal allowance equivalent to salary, but no other emolument whatever.

(2) The contribution shall be levied by way of abatement on paysheets, and any abatement so made shall be deemed for purposes of computing the interest due upon such contributions to have been credited to the Fund on the last day of the month for which the salary was due.

(3) In the event of such abatement not being made, the member shall pay to the Manager of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank the sum due from him as his contribution within 15 days after the receipt by him of his salary, and for the purpose of computing the interest due upon such contribution, it shall be deemed to have been paid on the last day of the month in which it was received by the Manager.

(4) The contribution shall be computed on the actual salary payable, whether the member be on full pay, half pay, or otherwise; but no contribution shall be due in respect of any period of leave without pay.

(5) Any member who may be temporarily transferred or lent to another public institution may continue to contribute to the Fund at the same rate as he would have contributed if he had not been so transferred or lent.

3. (1) *Contributions of the Bank.*—On the first day of the Bank's financial year there shall be placed to the credit of each member a bonus equal to the sum contributed by such member during the preceding 12 months.

(2) In the event of a member ceasing to contribute on death or retirement, the bonus shall be placed to the member's credit on the date of his death or retirement, and shall be equal to the sum contributed by the member in the Bank's current financial year.

(3) No bonus shall be payable in respect of any contribution made by any member temporarily transferred or lent to another public institution, but a sum equivalent to the bonus which would have been payable shall be recovered from the institution to which the member is so transferred or lent, and credited to the member's account with the Fund in the same manner as the bonus payable under this rule.

4. *Investment of Contributions.*—All moneys standing to the credit of members, whether on account of their own contributions or of bonus, or interest thereon, shall be invested in debentures of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank.

5. (1) *Interest.*—Interest shall be made up on the first day of the Bank's financial year and shall be computed on the minimum sum standing to the credit of each member throughout each month of the year. No interest shall be payable in respect of broken periods of a month.

(2) The sum accruing as interest shall be added to the capital sum standing to the credit of each member on the first day of the Bank's financial year.

(3) The rate of the interest to be credited to a member's account at any time shall be the rate of interest at which the last preceding issue of debentures was made by the Bank.

6. (1) *Members' Accounts and the Closing thereof.*—A separate account shall be kept for each member, and shall be divided into two parts: the first part showing the amount of the member's own contributions with interest thereon as it accrues, and the second part showing the bonus credited to the member with interest thereon as it accrues.

(2) As soon as possible after the close of the Bank's financial year the Manager shall furnish each member with a statement of his account.

(3) When a contributor leaves the service or dies, his account shall be closed from the end of the last preceding

month. Interest shall accrue up to the end of the month before that in which payment is tendered.

7. (1) *Repayment.*—The amount standing to the credit of a member, shall, subject to the deduction of such sum as may be ordered by the Board of Directors on account of any moneys due from him to the Bank, be paid—

(a) in the event of his service being terminated by death, to the person or persons entitled in law to receive it; and

(b) in the event of his service being terminated by due notice given by himself or by the Bank in accordance with the terms of his employment, or otherwise than by his dismissal or discharge on the ground of misconduct or negligence in the performance of his duties, to the member himself.

(2) In the event of the dismissal or discharge of a member from the service of the Bank on the ground of misconduct or negligence in the performance of his duties, the Board of Directors shall have power by resolution to declare forfeited that portion of the sum standing to his credit which represents the bonus payable under rule 3 and the interest thereon, or any part of such portion; and on the Board of Directors making such declaration, the sum so forfeited shall be repaid to the Funds of the Bank, and the portion representing his own contribution and the interest thereon shall be repaid to him subject to such deduction as the Board may order on account of moneys due from him to the Bank.

8. (1) *Forfeiture.*—No member or the legal representative of any member shall have any right or vested interest in the Fund or any part of it so as to be able to assign, transfer, mortgage, charge, or otherwise deal with the amount standing to his credit or any part thereof.

(2) In the event of any member doing or purporting to do any act in contravention of the foregoing paragraph (1), or becoming bankrupt, or voluntarily or involuntarily doing or suffering any act or thing whereby the amount standing to his credit becomes or is likely to become due or payable to any other person, the Board of Directors of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank may by resolution annul his membership and declare the amount standing to his credit to be forfeited, or may apply the same or any part of it for the benefit of his wife or children, or other dependants as the Board may determine.

9. *Custody of Accounts and Audit.*—The books, accounts, and vouchers of the Fund shall form part of the accounts of the Bank and shall be subject to the same audit and publication as the accounts of the Bank.

1. Conservancy fees at the following rates shall be paid by all occupiers of the following premises provided with dry-earth latrines:—

(1) Premises exempted under section 172 (a) and (b) of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, from the property rate imposed under section 171 (1) (a) and premises exempted from the payment of the special conservancy rate—

Re. 1.50 per mensem per bucket and a further sum of Re. 1 per mensem in respect of every bucket exceeding one per day.

(2) Premises liable to the property rate imposed under section 171 (1) (a) of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920—

(a) If the annual value is under Rs. 300, Re. 1 in respect of every bucket conserved exceeding one per day.

(b) If the annual value is Rs. 300 and under Rs. 900, Re. 1 in respect of every bucket conserved exceeding two per day.

(c) If the annual value is Rs. 900 and under Rs. 1,800, Re. 1 in respect of every bucket conserved exceeding three per day.

(d) If the annual value is over Rs. 1,800, Re. 1 in respect of every bucket conserved exceeding four per day.

2. All such fee shall be paid at the office of the Council before the 10th day of the month following that during which the service was rendered.

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 of 1917.

RULES under section 11 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the Buttala-ela Irrigation District, at a meeting held on November 20, 1933, and approved by His Excellency the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

1. The cultivation of fields under Buttala-ela irrigation work shall be confined to maha and yala harvests, and the fields shall be divided into two ranges, as follows, to regulate the cultivation for maha and yala, viz.:—

First Range.

1st Tract.—Udagama, Ratmaella, Pitamulla, Unapotuwela, Unapotuwela-arawa, Etakumbura, Alutwela, Kanuketiya, and Nindagangama.

2nd Tract.—Pettaganwela, Migahawela, Pahalapanguwa, Daha-amunupattuwa.

3rd Tract.—Gerandibakine, Gerandibakinearawa, Bakamunawa, Ettalawela, Hakurusiyambalawa, and Deiyannebeta.

Second Range.

4th Tract.—Udumulla, Happortuwa, Medagandeka, Yonamulla, Paranagama-arawa, Egodapanguwa, and Alukolawita.

5th Tract.—Mahawela, Deiyannewela, Obedakumbura, Mailadana, Waguruwela, Pahalakella, Naranwana, Deiyannearawa, and Menadena.

The first range should be cultivated for maha and the second range for yala.

2. The cultivation for maha shall take place between January 1 and February 28, and cultivation for yala between August 1 and 31 each year.

3. The following intervals between cultivation seasons are required for general repairs and maintenance of the work, and no water will be issued through any sluice or canals for distribution to the fields during these periods, viz.:—

Maha from December 1 to 31.

Yala from July 1 to 31.

4. The issue of water from the sluice and Government channels shall be regulated by the officer in charge of the work or some person deputed by him and from the ela by the vel-vidane. No other person shall open or interfere with the sluice of the irrigation work or channels or the issue of water therefrom.

5. The Manager of fields shall furnish the irrigation headmen within 15 days before commencing cultivation, with a list of persons who have been employed as goiyas, showing the extent which each goiya cultivates.

6. It shall be the duty of the vel-vidanes to make written application to the irrigation officer for water stating the area requiring water, and they shall take action to prevent any waste of the water issued thereupon.

7. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors whose lands are irrigable from any Government channel to construct, in accordance with the directions and specifications given in that behalf, such part of the subsidiary channels required to irrigate the lands as may be marked out by the officer in charge of the work as the share proportionate to the holding of such proprietor.

8. The Government channel, Maha-ela, and all field channels shall be maintained in good order by the proprietors whose lands are irrigable thereby, and it shall be their duty to have the channels cleared before every cultivation, and to maintain them clear during the cultivation. The work to be done by each proprietor shall be in proportion to the area of land held by him. In the event of any proprietor failing to clear or maintain his share of the channels, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to cause the work to be done and to recover the cost thereof from the defaulter in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Ordinance.

9. No person shall construct any dam across any channel except on instructions from the officer in charge of the work.

10. Ploughing shall be commenced from the agawata to the mulata fields and sowing in like manner, and no mulata proprietor shall plough his field before the agawata proprietor, if the latter ploughs in time.

11. The fence round the whole tract shall be measured off in proportion to the extent each person cultivates, and the portion assigned to each proprietor shall be completed within six days of the notice given in that behalf by the vel-vidane.

The aforesaid fence shall in like manner be maintained in good repair by the proprietors until the crop is reaped and gathered.

12. Each proprietor shall erect a proper watch hut adjoining the field cultivated by him before the sowing commences, and shall keep watch regularly until the crop is reaped and gathered, although his own paddy may have been reaped earlier.

13. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors of the lands irrigated by any water-course to which any sudden or unforeseen damage has accidentally been caused, on being given reasonable notice thereof by the officer in charge of the work through the vel-vidane, by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, to attend at the place indicated and to contribute labour towards the repair of such damage, in person or by substitute, until the work is completed.

14. It shall be the duty of the irrigation headmen elected or appointed under section 21 of the Ordinance to regulate the use of any water issued by the irrigation officer from the Government channels or other sources to supervise the cultivation of lands under the work, and generally to enforce the observance of these rules.

15. All lands under cultivation shall be liable to the vel-vidane for four kurinies per amunam of sowing extent for yala and maha as huwandiram and the vel-vidane shall make over one-fourth of such huwandiram to the elavidane if such officer has been elected or appointed.

Provided that in any case where the Government Agent has disallowed any portion of the huwandiram due to any vel-vidane or elavidane who has been guilty of neglect of duty, only the remaining portion shall be payable by each proprietor to such vel-vidane, or by the vel-vidane to such elavidane.

16. Such huwandiram shall be paid and a receipt obtained therefor by each proprietor before any part of his harvest is removed from the threshing-floor.

17. If any proprietor makes default in payment of huwandiram, the equivalent in money may be recovered in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Ordinance.

18. The question of constructing any new channel that may be required shall be decided by the majority of the proprietors, subject to the right of the minority to appeal to the village council; and in the event of such an appeal, the decision of the council shall be final.

19. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid, has to pass through the fields of one or more of the proprietors it shall be the duty of each such proprietor to open and construct that part of the channel which falls within his field.

20. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid, falls outside the fields under cultivation, it shall be the duty of each of the proprietor to contribute, towards the construction of such channel or part labour proportionate to his holding.

21. Except with the permission of the Government Agent or other authorized officer, no water from any tank or other irrigation work shall be allowed or used for any purpose other than that of irrigating paddy plants.

22. The rules for the afore-mentioned district of Buttala-ela published by Proclamation in the *Gazette* of February 19, 1915, and deemed to be in force heretofore by virtue of the provisions of section 2 of the Ordinance, are hereby repealed.
