"THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE,
No. 9 OF 1924."

RULES made under section 29 (5) of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, by the Village Committees of the Naimana-Makawita, Madihe-Godagama, Dondra, Dickwella, Kekanadure, Godapitiya, Kamburupitiya, Molodduwa, Weligama, Akuressa, Malimmada, Morawaka, Beralapanatara, Hakmana-Walakada, and Kandapita-Walakada subdivisions in the Matara District, Southern Province, in pursuance of the powers delegated to the said Committees under section 14 and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 30 of the Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULES.

I.—Bakeries.

1. No person shall establish any bakery, or carry on business at any existing bakery, otherwise than on a licence issued by the Chairman of the Village Committee.
2. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or for any headman thereto authorized by him in writing, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of baking is carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or any place used for the preparation of bread or pastry; and the proprietor, lessee, or person in charge of such bakery or place used for the preparation of bread or pastry shall permit such officer to make such inspection and shall assist him therein as required.
3. No person shall use for a bakery any building or room not ventilated and lighted with windows which are so placed in two or more of its walls as to provide through ventilation and which are of such area as to be not less when added to the area of the door or doors, than 1/7th of the floor area of such building or room.
4. No person shall open or keep a bakery within fifty feet of any cess pit, manure heap, open sewer, or privy.
5. No person shall store furniture or any articles other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry in any bakery.
6. No person shall keep any animal in any bakery for any purpose whatever.
7. The licensee of every bakery shall cause—

- (1) the troughs and all utensils used in the making of bread and pastry to be so constructed as to be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor, and to be kept clean at all times;
- (2) the tops of the tables to be made of well seasoned closely fitting planks or of some non-harmful impervious material, and shall further cause them to be scraped and cleaned daily;

- (3) the floor to be swept clean at least once in every twenty-four hours, the sweepings to be placed immediately in an impervious covered receptacle, and removed from the bakery daily ;
- (4) all refuse on or about the premises of such bakery to be removed daily, and shall also cause the drains to be well flushed daily ;
- (5) the bakery to be kept clean and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cess pit, or other nuisance.

8. (1) No person shall expose for sale any bread, biscuits, confectionery, or sweetmeats otherwise than in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(2) All such cases shall be kept clean at all times.

9. (1) No person engaged in the manufacture of bread or pastry shall use any flour, water, or other materials which are not good and wholesome.

(2) The licensee of every bakery shall keep the flour used in such bakery on a platform raised three feet above the ground.

10. No licensee of any bakery shall employ in such bakery any person who is suffering, or who to his knowledge has recently suffered, from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, until he is completely cured or until the period of infection or incubation is over.

II.—Eating-houses, Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

1. No person shall keep any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique otherwise than in a clean and sanitary state to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Village Committee.

2. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or for any headman thereto authorized by him in writing, at all reasonable times to enter and inspect any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique and the proprietor, lessee, or person in charge of such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall permit such officer to make such inspection and shall assist him therein as required.

3. The proprietor, lessee, or manager of every eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall cause—

(1) the walls thereof to be plastered and limewashed, and shall provide that the rooms thereof are ventilated and lighted with windows which are so placed in two or more of its walls as to provide through ventilation and which are of such area as to be not less when added to the area of the door or doors, than $\frac{1}{7}$ th of the floor area of such building or room ;

(2) all refuse and dirt in or about the premises of such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique to be removed twice daily ;

(3) all utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique to be kept clean ;

(4) all cakes, sweets, and other foodstuffs exposed for sale therein to be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases and all such cases to be kept clean at all times.

4. No proprietor, lessee, or manager of any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall permit any waste, tea, coffee, or milk, remnants of food, or cooking waste to be thrown on the ground, but shall cause such waste, tea, coffee, or milk, remnants of food, or cooking waste to be collected in an impervious covered receptacle and to be removed daily.

5. No licensee of any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall employ in such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique any person who is suffering, or who to his knowledge has recently suffered, from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, until he is completely cured or until the period of infection and incubation is over.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO

(a) Whenever any tree within the administrative limits of this Council or the branch, fruit, or leaf of such a tree is in the opinion of the Chairman either likely to fall upon any house or building or likely to be dangerous to its occupants, and whenever such tree, branch, fruit, or leaf overhangs any street, the Chairman may, by a notice in writing served on the owner or the occupier of the land upon which the tree stands, require him to cut down the tree, branch, fruit, or leaf, as the case may be ; and if such owner or occupier fails within twenty-four hours of receiving the notice to comply with its requirements, any officers or workmen authorized in writing by the Chairman may enter upon such land and at the expense of the owner or occupier do what the owner or occupier was required to do by the notice.

(b) The owner or occupier who fails to comply with the requirements of a notice issued under paragraph (a) above shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the construction of the remaining 98 chains of road in completion of the Kandapola Service road in the Nuwara Eliya District, as described in the annexed schedule.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover and addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, P. O. 4. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Divisional Forest Office, Nuwara Eliya. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

5. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers, otherwise the tenders will be treated as informal and rejected. A tender form can be issued in the name of one person only.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the Office of the Conservator of Forests or a Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. 7. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons whose addresses must be given engaging to become sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract.

8. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. A further security in cash of 5 per cent. of the value of the contract will be required of the contractor when entering into a bond.

9. Tenderers are required, before tendering, to inspect and initial a draft copy of the contract in the Divisional Forest Office, Nuwara Eliya, and to state in writing that they have inspected the site of work concerned and thoroughly acquainted themselves with the conditions and nature of work.

10. The whole work will be divided into two parts (A and B) as shown in the schedule below. (A) A rate per square of foundation, and (B) a rate per cube of metalling including consolidation should be quoted written both in words and figures. Payments will be made only for such quantity of work as may be measured and taken over by the Divisional Forest Officer, Nuwara Eliya.

11. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

12. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

13. No contract may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board previously obtained. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

15. 16. SCHEDULE.

To lay the remaining 98 chains of foundation on Kandapola Forest Service road, commencing from iron bridge end 130th chain totalling approximately 259 squares as specified below:—

- (a) Foundation to be laid for the wheel tracks only;
- (b) Each track to be 2 feet wide, the space between the tracks 3 feet, and the space on the outer side of each track 1 foot;
- (c) The foundations to be 6 inches deep;
- (d) The size of paving metal to be not less than 6 inches deep.

2. The contractor must do at his own expense all further cutting and blasting necessary to enable the foundation to be evenly and properly laid so as to allow 2½ feet on either side of the portion of the road which is to be metalling.

3. The contractor shall commence work within ten days after signing the contract and complete work by August 20, 1934.

B.

To metal and consolidate the remaining 98 chains of Kandapola Forest Service road as follows:—

- (a) Metalling to be done to a breadth of 9 feet;
- (b) Depth of metal to be 6 inches;
- (c) Size of metal to be 2 inches;
- (d) Metal must extend to 1 foot on the outer side of foundation;
- (e) Total quantity of metal required approximately 294 cubes.

2. All metal must be piled in one continuous heap along the road before being spread. The heap should be 4½ feet wide at the base and 2 feet high.

3. No metal may be spread until passed by the Divisional Forest Officer, Up-country Division, Nuwara Eliya, or the

Forest Management Officer, Nuwara Eliya. Metal must be so spread as to leave $1\frac{1}{2}$ feet on the inside of the road metalled.

4. Work should commence within reasonable time of signing the contract and must be completed by September 20, 1934.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF J. D. Mc LAREN AND COMPANY (COLOMBO), LIMITED.

The regulations contained in the Table marked C in the schedule to the Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table C) shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender, and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa*, and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. Regulation No. 2 of Table C is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely :—

“ The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they may think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all monies unpaid on their shares and not by the conditions of allotments made payable at fixed times, provided that 30 days notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed, for payment of each call and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the person and at the time and place appointed by the Directors ”.

3. Regulation 24 of Table C is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely, “ Subsequent General Meetings shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors ”.

4. Regulation No. 32 is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely :—

“ No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting except the Declaration of a Dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or the election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented by proxy or attorney, at the commencement of the business two or more Shareholders entitled to vote ”.

5. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor, namely:—

(a) On a show of hands every Shareholder present or represented by proxy or attorney in person shall have one vote. On a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.

(b) No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any General Meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.

(c) On a poll votes may be given either personally, by proxy or by attorney.

(d) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing or if the appointor is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized.

(e) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.

(f) An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form or in any other form which the Directors shall approve :—

6. Regulations 45 and 46 of Table C are expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely :—

45A. Unless otherwise determined by a General Meeting the number of Directors shall not be less than two or more than five.

45B. The names of the first Directors shall be John Duncan Mc Laren (Junior), Pieter Cornelius Ebeling, William Reeves Brook Jackson, and Thomas Hunt.

45C. The qualification of a Director shall be the holding of at least one share in the Company.

45D. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Five thousand Rupees annually, to be divided among them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration for special or extra services hereinafter referred to nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Director or Managing Directors of the Company.

45E. The Directors shall have power at any time, and from time to time, to appoint any other person as a Director, either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the Board, but so that the total number of Directors shall not at any time exceed the maximum number fixed. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following ordinary General Meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

45F. One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors on such terms as the Directors may determine or fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office : and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors and the Directors may impose and confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be imposed or conferred on the Manager of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

46A. A Director may with the consent of his co-Directors be absent from the meetings of the Directors for such period or periods as he shall think fit.

46B. Each Director shall have the power to appoint in writing any person whether a Shareholder of the Company or not to act as a Deputy Director in his place during his absence or inability to act as Director and at his discretion to remove such Deputy Director.

46C. A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers, and discretions by or under the Regulations of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally.

46D. A resolution in writing signed by a majority of the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted, and every such resolution shall be as soon as practicable entered on the minutes of the Directors' meeting.

46E. The Directors shall provide for the safe custody of the seal, and the seal shall never be affixed to any document except by the authority previously given of the Board or of a Committee of Directors empowered by the Board to affix such seal.

7. Regulation 48 of Table C is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

48. No Director shall be disqualified by reason of his holding office from contracting with the Company either as vendor, purchaser or otherwise, nor shall any such contract or any contract or arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director or with any company or partnership of or in which any Director shall be a Director or a member or be in any way interested be avoided nor shall any Director so contracting or being such a Director or member or so interested nor any company or partnership of or in which he shall be a Director or member or be in any way interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement by reason of such Director holding that office or of the fiduciary relation thereby established. Any Director or any company or partnership of which a Director is or hereafter may be a Director or member or in which he is or hereafter may be in any way interested may enter into contracts or arrangements with this Company and any Director of this Company may vote as a Director or Shareholder in respect of any contract or arrangement mentioned in this Article and retain for his own use or for the use of such company or partnership profits made by him under any such contract or arrangement. Provided always that he must disclose his interest to his co-Directors before the contract or arrangement is entered into by the Directors unless the nature of the Director's interest appears on the face of the contract or arrangement.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or solicitors of the Company; nevertheless he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract, work or business in which he may be personally interested.

8. Regulation 64 of Table C is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

64A. The Directors may at such times as the circumstances of the Company warrant the same, declare dividends to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the number of their shares and the amount paid up or deemed to be paid up thereon respectively.

64B. The Directors may if they shall think fit declare from time to time such interim dividends on account as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.

9. Regulation 66 of Table C is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

66. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend set aside out of the profits of the Company such sums as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for special dividends, or for repairing, improving, and maintaining any of the property of the Company, and for such other purposes as the Directors shall in their absolute discretion think conducive to the interests of the Company, and may invest the several sums so set aside upon such investments (other than shares of the Company) as they may think fit, and from time to time to deal with and vary such investments, and dispose of all or any part thereof for the benefit of the Company, and may divide the reserve fund into such special funds as they think fit (and employ the reserve fund or any part thereof in the business of the Company and that without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets).

66A. Any General Meeting declaring a dividend and resolve that such dividend be paid wholly or in part by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of the Company, or paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of any other company, or in any one or more of such ways.

66B. Any General Meeting may resolve that any moneys, investments or other assets forming part of the undivided profits of the Company standing to the credit of the reserve fund or in the hands of the Company and available for dividend (or representing premiums received on the issue of shares and standing to the credit of the share premium account) be capitalized and distributed amongst such of the Shareholders as would be entitled to receive the same if distributed by way of dividend and in the same proportions on the footing that they become entitled thereto as capital and that all or any part of such capitalized fund be applied on behalf of such Shareholders in paying up in full any unissued shares of the Company

which shall be distributed accordingly or in or towards payment of the uncalled liability on any issued shares, and that such distribution or payment shall be accepted by such Shareholders in full satisfaction of their interest in the said capitalized sum.

66C. For the purposes of giving effect to any resolution under the two last preceding Articles, the Directors may settle any difficulty which may arise in regard to the distribution as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates and may fix the value for distribution of any specific assets, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any members upon the footing of the value so fixed or that fractions of less than one rupee may be disregarded in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such cash or specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or capitalized fund as may seem expedient to the Directors.

10. The first Auditors of the Company shall be elected by the Directors who shall also fix their remuneration and Regulations 77 and 78 are modified accordingly. Regulation No. 80 is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely:—

“A casual vacancy in the office of Auditor may be filled by the Directors”.

11. Regulation 85 of Table C is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely:—

85. (a) A notice may be served upon any Shareholder whose registered address is in Ceylon either personally or by posting it in a post office to such address in a prepaid envelope.

(b) Each holder of registered shares whose registered place of address is not in Ceylon may from time to time notify in writing to the Company an address which shall be deemed his registered place of address within the meaning of these Articles of Association.

Specification for the Construction of Motor Launches.

THE Notification dated November 1, 1933, published in Gazette No. 8,017 dated November 10, 1933, is repealed and the following amended specification for the construction of motor launches under Rule II, Section IX., of the Rules

of the Port of Colombo is hereby notified for general information:—

1. All motor launches constructed to carry up to and including 12 passengers shall comply with the following specification:—

SPECIFICATION.

(1) *General Requirements.*—The vessels should be of sound construction and material and the scantlings of sufficient strength for the service they are intended to perform.

(2) *Free Board.*—When the vessel is loaded with the crew, licensed number of passengers, full equipment and fuel, the free board, *i.e.*, the clear height of the side above water at the lowest point, must not be less than 15 inches for any vessel up to and not exceeding 20 feet in length nor less than 22 inches for vessels of 40 feet; for lengths intermediate between 20 and 40 feet the height must be in proportion.

Height of sides: The top of the covering board or of the wash strake should not be less than 30 inches above the flooring boards, in the case of vessels not exceeding 20 feet in length nor less than 36 inches in the case of vessels of 40 feet in length. For lengths intermediate between 20 and 40 feet, the height should be in proportion. The Surveyor must satisfy himself that the vessel has sufficient stability to carry, with safety, the licensed number of passengers, crew, fuel, and equipment.

(3) *Life Saving Appliances.*—Life saving appliances are required to comply with the Port Rules.

(4) Vessels not fitted with bilge pumps must be provided with a bailer of approved material and design.

(5) *Means of Extinguishing Fire.*—Vessels not exceeding 40 feet in length must be supplied with one tetrachloride fluid extinguisher of approved type and not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon capacity, together with one Foam or Froth type fluid extinguisher of not less than 1 gallon capacity.

(6) *Machinery.*—(a) The engines and reversing gear must be securely bolted down to fore and aft bearers of ample strength, and fitted truly in line with the propeller shaft.

The propeller shaft must be sufficiently supported with intermediate bearings as required.

(b) An oil-tight copper or brass tray must be fitted under the engine and reversing gear in such a way that all oil and grease from the engine will be caught therein, and be so arranged that it can be easily and effectively swabbed out and cleaned.

The starting handle must be so arranged that the engine can be easily and safely started.

(c) A tray of approved pattern and material must be permanently fixed under the carburettor in such a way that petrol, &c., leaking from the carburettor will be caught effectively therein, and proper means be provided for draining this tray.

(d) Petrol pipes must be of solid drawn copper or brass tube of substantial gauge, so led from the fuel tank to the carburettor as not to be exposed to risk of damage, and they must be well secured to the hull of the boat in approved manner.

(e) A petrol cock of approved pattern must be provided at the engine close to the carburettor and another at the fuel tank, both in positions that will permit of their being manipulated with ease. Petrol pipes to have brased joints only, no soft solder being permitted.

(f) The controls of the engine must be so arranged as to be handy to the driver, and such that the boat can be properly manoeuvred and reversed. The engine and machinery must be protected in such a way that no moving parts are exposed so as to constitute a danger to those in the vessel.

Provided that boats not exceeding 22 feet 6 inches in length and fitted with outboard motors having a total piston area not exceeding 10 square inches shall not be required to be fitted with reversible engines.

(g) The fuel tank must be of strong construction, of approved material and securely fixed in a position or a compartment of the boat reserved for this accommodation, and the arrangements for filling must be such that no petrol, &c., can be spilled into the bilges or other compartments of the boat. The fuel pipe fitting must be of the flange type securely rivetted and sweated to the bottom of the fuel tank. An expansion pipe, or pressure release fitting of approved design must be provided.

(h) *Exhaust Pipe.*—The exhaust pipe must be well protected and water cooled so that no exposed part of the pipe exceeds 400°F.

2. All motor launches constructed to carry over 12 passengers shall comply with the full Board of Trade requirements.

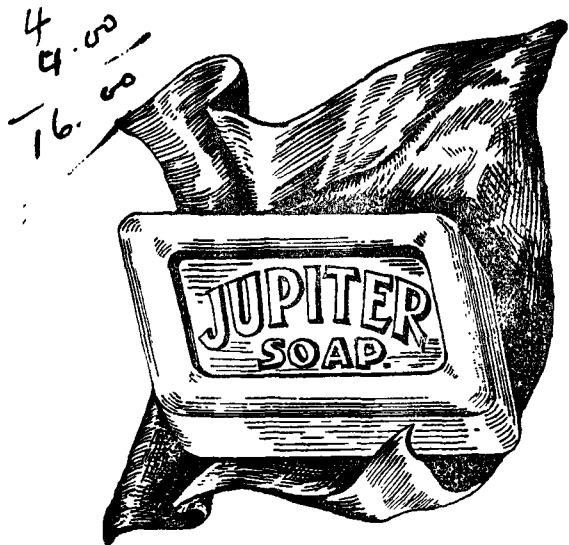

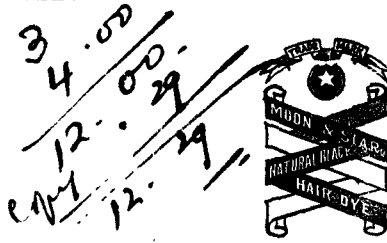

REGULATIONS.

Appeals.

1. (i.) Every appeal under the Ordinance shall be made by a written statement in English substantially in the form A set out in the schedule to these regulations.

(ii.) Every statement of appeal relating to a small holding shall bear on the face thereof stamps to the value of one rupee; every other statement of appeal shall bear on the face thereof stamps to the value of five rupees.

2. Every statement of appeal shall be sent by registered post to the Rubber Controller within fourteen days (exclusive of Sundays and public holidays) of the service of the notice communicating the assessment, decision, or order against which the appeal is preferred.

3. Appeals shall be listed and heard as far as possible in the order in which the statements of appeal are received.

4. The appellant and the Rubber Controller shall be entitled to appear at the hearing of an appeal in person or by a representative authorized in writing for that purpose.

5. The appellant or his representative shall be entitled to be heard in support of the appeal and the Rubber Controller or his representative to be heard against the appeal; and where any argument is heard against the appeal the appellant or his representative shall have the right of reply.

6. The Board of Appeal may, during the hearing of any appeal, call for such evidence, oral or documentary, as to it may seem necessary for the purpose of adjudicating on any matter or matters at issue.

7. The decision of the Board of Appeal, whether it be given at the close of the hearing or on some day thereafter, shall be reduced to writing and dated as of the date on which it is given, and formal notice thereof shall be served on the appellant within three days of such date by the Rubber Controller in the manner prescribed in section 54 of the Ordinance.

8. The Board of Appeal shall not be deemed to be properly constituted at the hearing of any appeal unless at least two members are present.

9. The Chairman, who shall be elected at the first meeting of the Board, shall preside at all meetings at which he is present; and in the absence of the Chairman from any meeting any one of the other members present may be elected to preside at such meeting.

10. (i.) All matters, brought up in appeal, or preliminary to or connected with any appeal, shall be decided by a majority of the members of the Board of Appeal present at the hearing.

(ii.) If the Board of Appeal at the hearing consists of two members only, in the event of an equality of votes on any matter, the decision shall be taken at a meeting when all three members are present.

(iii.) Every decision of the Board of Appeal shall, when reduced to writing, be signed by the Chairman or the member presiding at the hearing, as the case may be.

11. The remuneration payable to each member of the Board of Appeal shall be Rs. 50 for a working day of over two hours, and Rs. 25 for a working day of two hours or under.

REGULATIONS.

1. The register of estates, the register of small holdings, and the register of dealers required to be kept by the Controller under section 16 shall respectively be in the forms F, G, and H set out hereunder.

2. A registered proprietor of an estate or a small holding shall notify to the Controller any change of his address or of the name, extent or ownership of the estate or small holding, or the occurrence of any circumstance affecting the accuracy of the particulars contained in any return furnished by him to the Controller or to the Rubber Investigating Officer.

3. A registered dealer shall notify to the Controller any change in his registered address or in the location of his licensed premises, or the occurrence of any circumstance affecting the accuracy of the particulars contained in any return furnished by him to the Controller or to the Rubber Investigating Officer.

4. Any notification required by Regulation 2 or Regulation 3 shall be made to the Controller in writing within a period of ten days from the date of the change or the occurrence of the circumstance, as the case may be, referred to in either of those regulations.

5. The Controller may at any time either on his own initiative or as a result of any notification received by him under Regulation 2 or Regulation 3 amend any entry in any register kept for the purposes of the Ordinance if he is satisfied that such entry is incorrect after such enquiry as he may deem necessary.

6. Before amending any entry in any register, the Controller shall give notice in writing of his decision to amend that entry and particulars of the proposed amendment to the registered proprietor or dealer or other person who in his opinion may be affected by such amendment.

7. If any appeal is preferred against any decision of the Controller notified under Regulation 6, the register shall not be amended until the order of the Board of Appeal is communicated to the Controller, and the amendment, if any, shall be made in conformity with the order of the Board of Appeal.

8. If no appeal is preferred against any decision of the Controller notified under Regulation 6, the register may be amended by the Controller in accordance with his decision at any time after the expiry of the period allowed for preferring the appeal.

REGULATIONS.

Assessment of Standard Production.

1. In these regulations—

“mature area” means that area of an estate or small holding which is planted with fully mature rubber plants;

“immature area” means that area of an estate or small holding which is planted with rubber plants which are not fully mature.

2. The age at which a rubber plant shall be deemed to be fully mature shall be eight years reckoned from the date on which that rubber plant was first planted in any estate or small holding: provided that the age of a rubber plant which has been transplanted from a nursery to an estate or small holding, or from one part of an estate or small holding to another part of the same estate or small holding, or from one estate or small holding to another estate or small holding, shall be reckoned from the date on which it was so transplanted.

3. Where rubber plants are interplanted with other cultivation, two hundred rubber plants shall be taken as the equivalent of, and capable of producing as much rubber as one acre of an area on which rubber plants of an equivalent age are the only cultivation.

4. For the purpose of ascertaining the standard production of a registered estate or small holding, the mature and the immature areas of that estate or small holding shall be separately assessed.

5. The standard production of an estate or small holding for the period of twelve months beginning on the first day of January, 1934, shall be the sum of—

- (a) the amount of dry rubber which, in the opinion of the Controller, can be produced from the mature areas of that estate or small holding for that period, and
- (b) the amount of the allowance in respect of the immature areas, if any, of that estate or small holding determined for that period in the manner hereinafter provided.

6. The amount referred to in paragraph (a) of regulation 5 shall be determined by the Controller by any one of the following methods, hereinafter called method A, method B, and method C, respectively:—

Method A—by taking as the basis of assessment the total amount of dry rubber produced by an estate or small holding in the most productive year of that estate or small holding during the period 1929–1933, such amount being ascertained from the figures furnished to the Controller by the proprietor of that estate or small holding for that period.

Method B—by an assessment based on the district average specified in the second column of the Schedule to these regulations for the planting district in which the estate or small holding is situate.

Method C—by inspection and special assessment of the mature areas of that estate or small holding.

7. For the purpose of enabling the Controller to use method A in the determination of the amount referred to in paragraph (a) of regulation 5 in the case of a small holding, the proprietor of a small holding may furnish to the Controller on or before the fifteenth day of June, 1934, a special return in the Form S hereinafter set out showing the total amount of dry rubber produced by that small holding in each of the years 1929 to 1933.

8. If no return in Form S is received from the registered proprietor of any small holding on or before the date mentioned in regulation 7, the amount referred to in paragraph (a) of regulation 5 shall be determined by the Controller by method B or method C.

9. Method A shall not be used by the Controller unless he is satisfied that the production figures for the years, 1929 to 1933, furnished by the registered proprietor of an estate or small holding are accurate and reliable.

10. Method C shall be used by the Controller if an application for the inspection and special assessment of an estate or small holding by that method is received by him from the proprietor of that estate or small holding on or before June 15, 1934, together with a remittance for the fee prescribed in regulation 12.

11. If the Controller decides to use method C in a case where no application has been made under regulation 10 by the proprietor of a registered estate or small holding no fee shall be chargeable for the inspection and special assessment of that estate or small holding.

12. The fees payable for the inspection and special assessment of an estate or small holding shall be determined in accordance with the rates set out hereunder:

(1) <i>Small holding</i>	Rs. 5.

10 to 25 acres in extent	Rs. 10.
26 to 50	Rs. 15.
51 to 100	Rs. 30.
101 to 300	Rs. 50.

13. For the purpose of determining the allowance to be granted in respect of the immature areas of an estate or small holding, each immature area shall be dealt with by sections according to the age of the rubber plants planted thereon and all areas of the same age shall be regarded as one immature section.

14. The allowance for any year of control in respect of an immature section of an estate or small holding which is situated in any planting district mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be determined in accordance with the scale set out in the third column of that Schedule for that planting district: provided that the amount so determined in respect of an immature section shall in each case be appropriate to the age and proportionate to the acreage of that immature section.

15. No allowance shall be granted in respect of any immature section comprised of rubber plants which are five years old or less than five years old.

16. The age of any rubber plant for the purpose of the application of any scale set out in the third column of the Schedule hereto shall be the age of that plant on the first day of June in any year of control.

17. The Governor may appoint a Board of Assessors consisting of three members for the purpose of assisting the Controller to assess the standard production of any estate or small holding which is wholly or partly planted with budded rubber plants.

18. Notwithstanding anything contained in regulations 1 to 16, the standard production of any estate or small holding, or any area of either, which is planted with budded rubber plants shall be specially assessed by the Controller with the assistance of the Board of Assessors.

19. The productivity of an area planted with budded rubber plants whether it be an entire estate or small holding or a part of either shall be assessed by method C only.

20. The fees payable for the assessment of the productivity of an area planted with budded rubber plants shall be double those prescribed in regulation 12 in respect of a small holding or an estate of the same extent as that area and shall be recovered from the proprietor of the estate or small holding to which that area belongs.

21. Where an estate or small holding is partly planted with budded rubber plants, the area planted with rubber plants other than budded rubber plants shall be separately assessed under regulations 1 to 16 for the purpose of determining the standard production of that estate or small holding.

22. The proprietor of an estate or small holding who does not desire the productivity of any area of that estate or small holding which is planted with budded rubber plants to be specially assessed as an area planted with budded rubber plants, may apply to the Controller that such area shall for the purposes of the determination of the standard production of that estate or small holding be treated as though it were planted with rubber plants other than budded rubber plants.

REGULATIONS.

Determination of Exportable Maximum.

1. If in any year of control the total amount (hereinafter in these regulations referred to as the first amount) of the standard production of all registered estates and small holdings for that year exceeds the amount (hereinafter in these regulations referred to as the second amount) of the Ceylon quota of export for the same year, the difference between the two amounts shall, when expressed as a percentage of the first amount, be the percentage of reduction.

REGULATIONS.

Authorized Stocks of Dealers.

2. If in any year of control the first amount is equal to the second amount, there shall be no percentage of reduction for that year.

3. If in any year of control the first amount is less than the second amount, the difference between the two amounts shall, when expressed as a percentage of the first amount, be the percentage of appreciation.

4. Subject to the provisions of regulations 7 and 10, the exportable maximum of any estate or small holding for any year of control shall be the amount of the standard production of that estate or small holding for that year reduced by an amount ascertained by taking a percentage of such standard production equal to the percentage of reduction.

5. If there is no percentage of reduction for any year of control, the amount of the exportable maximum of any estate or small holding for that year shall, subject to the provisions of regulations 7 and 10, be the standard production of that estate or small holding for that year.

6. If there is a percentage of appreciation for any year of control, the amount of the exportable maximum of any estate or small holding for that year shall, subject to the provisions of regulations 7 and 10, be the standard production of that estate or small holding increased by an amount ascertained by taking a percentage of such standard production equal to the percentage of appreciation.

7. For any year of control it shall be lawful for the Controller to deduct from the standard production of every estate and small holding, in addition to the amount, if any, authorized to be deducted under regulation 4, a further amount not exceeding three per centum of such standard production for the purpose of making such adjustments or alterations as may be or become necessary by reason of—

- (a) the correction of errors in assessments or in accounts ; or,
- (b) the rectification or verification of any particulars stated in any return furnished by a proprietor to the Rubber Investigating Officer or to the Controller, or of any entry in any register kept for the purposes of this Ordinance ; or,
- (c) any decision of the Board of Appeal ; or,
- (d) any order made by the Executive Committee under section 56.

8. Any surplus out of the amount deducted under regulation 7 shall, after the application of that amount for all authorized purposes, be allocated *pro rata* by the Controller among registered proprietors of all estates and small holdings from the standard production of which such amount was so deducted.

9. Any amount allocated by the Controller under regulation 8 to the registered proprietor of any estate or small holding shall, upon such allocation, be deemed to form part of the exportable maximum of that estate or small holding, as the case may be, for the year of control for which the authorized reduction was made.

10. For the first year of control it shall be lawful for the Controller to deduct from the aggregate amount of the standard production of all estates and small holdings an amount equivalent to the quantity of dry rubber exported by dealers on stock export coupons.

REGULATIONS under section 34 and 50 of the Rubber Control Ordinance, No. 6 of 1934, made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands.

1. The "normal stock" of a registered dealer for a year of control shall be the amount of rubber which the Controller shall estimate as necessary for the normal requirements of the business of that dealer for that year after consideration or verification of the particulars stated by that dealer in any return furnished by him to, or accepted by, the Controller under section 13.

2. If in any year of control the total amount (hereinafter in these regulations referred to as the first amount) of the normal stocks of all registered dealers for that year of control exceeds an amount (hereinafter in these regulations referred to as the second amount) equivalent to 12½ per centum of the Ceylon quota of export for that year of control, the difference between the two amounts shall, when expressed as a percentage of the first amount, be the percentage of reduction for the purpose of determining the authorized stocks of registered dealers for that year.

3. If in any year of control the first amount is equal to the second amount, there shall be no percentage of reduction for that year.

4. If in any year of control the first amount is less than the second amount, the difference between the two amounts shall, when expressed as a percentage of the first amount, be the percentage of appreciation for that year.

5. Subject to the provisions of regulation 8, the authorized stock of any registered dealer for any year of control shall be the amount of the normal stock of that dealer for that year reduced by an amount ascertained by taking a percentage of such normal stock equal to the percentage of reduction.

6. If there is no percentage of reduction for any year of control, the authorized stock of any registered dealer for that year shall, subject to the provisions of regulation 8, be the normal stock of that registered dealer for that year.

7. If there is a percentage of appreciation for any year of control, the authorized stock of any registered dealer for that year shall, subject to the provisions of regulation 8, be the normal stock of that registered dealer increased by an amount ascertained by taking a percentage of such normal stock equal to the percentage of appreciation for that year.

8. For each year of control it shall be lawful for the Controller to deduct from the normal stock of every registered dealer, in addition to the amount, if any, authorized to be deducted under regulation 5, a further amount not exceeding three per centum of the second amount referred to in regulation 2 for the purpose of making such adjustments, allocations, or alterations as may be or become necessary by reason of—

- (a) the correction of errors in accounts or in estimating or determining the amounts of normal or authorized stocks ; or
- (b) the rectification or verification of any particulars entered in the register of dealers ; or
- (c) any decision of the Board of Appeal ; or
- (d) any order made by the Executive Committee under section 56 ; or
- (e) the registration under this Ordinance of any new dealer in that year of control and the special assessment by the Controller under regulation 11 of the amount of rubber which that new dealer may hold as his authorized stock for that year of control.

9. Any surplus out of the amount deducted under regulation 8 shall, after the application of that amount for all authorized purposes, be allocated *pro rata* by the Controller among registered dealers from whose normal stocks such amount was so deducted.

10. Any amount allocated by the Controller under regulation 9 to any registered dealer shall, upon such allocation, be deemed to form part of the authorized stock of that registered dealer for the year of control for which the authorized reduction was made.

11. The authorized stock of any new dealer registered in any year of control shall be fixed by the Controller ; but the total amount of the authorized stocks of all new dealers registered in any year of control shall not exceed one per centum of the second amount referred to in regulation 2.

12. No new dealer shall be registered in any year of control unless he has furnished to the Controller a return in Form D before the twenty-fifth day of May in the first year of control or before the date prescribed for the purposes of section 13 for any other year of control.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations,—

37 "curly scrap" means scrap rubber coagulated on a rubber plant and removed direct therefrom and not from any receptacle affixed to or placed near that plant;

30 "shell scrap" means scrap rubber removed in a coagulated state from the shell, cup or other receptacle in which latex is collected from a rubber plant;

"earth scrap" means scrap rubber in a coagulated state collected on the ground at the foot of a rubber plant and intermixed with earth and other substances.

2. Rubber to be exported on stock export coupons shall be graded as follows:—

1. Sheet.
2. Crepe.
3. Curly scrap.
4. Shell scrap.
5. Earth scrap.

3. For the purposes of section 39 (2), scrap of the grade and quantity mentioned in the first column shall be deemed to be the equivalent of the corresponding quantity of crepe mentioned in the second column.

Grade of Scrap.	Crepe.
100 pounds curly scrap ..	85 pounds
100 pounds shell scrap ..	75 pounds
100 pounds earth scrap ..	10 pounds

33 1. A registered dealer who has in his possession any coupon which ceased to be valid on the thirty-first day of December in any year of control may surrender that coupon to the Controller not later than on the tenth day of January in the next succeeding year of control and shall be entitled to receive from the Controller in exchange therefor a coupon authorizing the export of a like amount of rubber in such succeeding year of control:

30 Provided that a registered dealer shall not be entitled so to exchange any coupon in any year of control unless he satisfies the Controller that on the thirty-first day of December of the immediately preceding year of control he had in stock an amount of rubber equivalent to that mentioned in the coupon so surrendered.

2. If the aggregate amount of rubber represented by the coupons surrendered by dealers under regulation 1 is less than the amount of the deficiency notified under section 41, coupons representing an amount equal to the difference between that deficiency and that aggregate amount shall be issued to registered proprietors in the year of control next succeeding that in which the deficiency occurred; and, for such purpose only, the amount of that difference shall be added to the Ceylon quota of export for such succeeding year of control.

1. For the purposes of the Ordinance and of the regulations made thereunder, one gallon of fluid latex shall be deemed to be equivalent to three and a half pounds of dry rubber and one and a half pounds of coagulated latex shall be deemed to be equivalent to one pound of dry rubber.

2. Coupons and provisional coupons authorizing the export of rubber from the Island shall be issued in the following denominations:—

- 1, 2, 5, 10, 50, 100, 500, 1,000, 2,000, 5,000, 10,000, and 50,000 pounds.
