GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE SCHOOL TEACHERS' PENSION ORDINANCE, NO. 6 OF 1927.

RULES made by His Excellency the Governor under section 4 (1) of the School Teachers' Pension Ordinance, No. 6 of 1927, by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULES.

The School Teachers' Pension Rules, 1927, published in *Gazette* No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928, are hereby altered by the following amendments:—

Title.

Add the following words to the Title "as amended by Ordinances No. 29 of 1931 and No. 13 of 1933".

Rule 1.

Delete "1927" in rule 1.

Rule 2.

Delete rule 2 and substitute the following therefor:—

In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

(i.) "School" means a school maintained wholly or partly from the public funds of the Island;

(ii.) "Assisted School" means a school the staff of which is appointed by the Manager of such school or a school administered under the Code of Regulations for Assisted Schools;

(iii.) "Recognized School" means a school recognized by the Department as providing adequate and suitable education but not in receipt of any aid from the public funds of the Island;

(iv.) "Government Teacher" means a teacher appointed by the Education Department to a school administered under the Code of Regulations for Government Schools;

(v.) "Department" means the Department of Education as created under the provision of the Education Ordinance, No. 1 of 1920;

(vi.) "Director" means the Director of Education;

(vii.) "Financial Secretary" means the Financial Secretary or his authorized agent;

(viii.) "Salary" means—

(1) the salary approved by the Director for the purpose of calculating grants, provided that such salary is actually received by the teacher;

or (2) the salary paid to the teacher under the Code of Regulations for Assisted Schools;

or (3) the salary paid to a Government teacher;

(ix.) "Recorded Service" means full-time service, recorded by the Education Department, in the capacity (within the meaning of the Education Code) of principal or assistant teacher in a school. Provided that the following shall not be counted as recorded service:—

(A) Service by a teacher under 18 years of age;

(B) Service exceeding 35 years;

(C) Service in night schools;

(D) Service in estate schools.

Provided, however, that the following shall be counted as recorded service:—

(a) A period of attendance not exceeding 2 years for which any teacher who has been in full-time service in a school for at least 12 months has been granted leave to attend a Training College or University in order to improve his qualifications as a teacher; provided that the teacher has, during such period of attendance, made contributions towards a pension in accordance with rule 5 on the salary last received by him;

(b) A period of service not exceeding 2 years for which any teacher is employed in a Recognized (but not Assisted) School; provided (1) that such teacher has previously been employed in a school, and (2) that such teacher has, during the period of service in such Recognized School, continued to make contributions towards a pension in accordance with rule 5 on his salary according to the scales approved for schools;

(c) A period of unemployment, not exceeding 12 months, for which any teacher, who has been discontinued by the management of a school, continues to make contributions towards a pension in accordance with rule 5 on the salary last received by him.

Rule 4.

Delete the words "at the time these rules came into force" in line 2 of rule 4 (1) and substitute therefor the words "before 1st March, 1928."

Delete the words "after these rules came into force" in line 2 of rule 4 (2) and substitute therefor the words "on or after 1st March, 1928."

Rule 6.

Add the words "or the date of retirement whichever is later" after the words "pensionable age" in proviso (c) to rule 6.

Delete the words "during the period of recorded service as required by rule 5" in proviso (e) to rule 6 and substitute therefor the words "in accordance with rule 5."

Rule 9.

Delete the words "these rules came into force" in line 2 of rule 9 and substitute therefor the words "1st March, 1928."

Delete the words "during the period of recorded service as required by rule 5" in rule 9 (4) and substitute therefor "in accordance with rule 5."

Insert the following note between rules 9 (5) and 9A:—

Note.—When a teacher is responsible, or mainly responsible, for the illness which leads to his retirement, some reduction (e.g., about 12 per cent.) will, as a general rule, be made in the pension or gratuity which would otherwise be awarded.

Rule 9A.

Delete the words "these rules came into force" in line 2 of rule 9A and substitute therefor "1st March, 1928".

Rule 11.

Delete the word "Assisted" wherever it occurs in rule 11.

Add the following new sub-section (v.) to rule 11:—

"In applying the provisions of this section to any person who held the post of a Teacher in a Government School prior to 15th June, 1934, the word 'School' shall be read as not including a Government School."

Schedule to Rule 11.

Add the words "appointed prior to 15th June, 1934" after the word "Education" in the first item in the schedule following rule 11.

Rule 16.

Add the words "unless otherwise provided in these rules" after the word "shall" in line 1 of rule 16 (1).

Rules 16, 17, and 18.

Delete the word "Treasurer" wherever it occurs in rules 16, 17, and 18 and substitute therefor "Financial Secretary".

WHEREAS the expenses, costs and charges of administering and carrying out the provisions of the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 24 of 1922, and the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 22 of 1927, up to and including the thirty-first day of October, 1928, and all other expenses authorized under section 3 (1) of the Rubber Restriction Repeal Ordinance, 1928, have been duly paid:

And whereas a surplus in excess of the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand rupees hereinafter mentioned now remains to the credit of the Rubber Restriction Fund established by the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 24 of 1922, after the payment of the aforesaid costs, charges and expenses and of such sums as may have been authorized by any Order heretofore made under section 3 (2) of the Rubber Restriction Repeal Ordinance, 1928:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by section 3 (2) of the Rubber Restriction Repeal Ordinance, 1928, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Reginald Edward Stubbs, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby order that a sum not exceeding two hundred and fifty thousand rupees out of the surplus now remaining to the credit of the Rubber Restriction Fund established by the Rubber Restriction Ordinance, No. 24 of 1922, may be applied to the payment of such costs, charges and expenses as may be incurred in the investigation and preparation of such measures as may be necessary for the establishment of a system of restricting or controlling the export or production of rubber and in the administration of the Rubber Control Ordinance, No. 6 of 1934.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situate within the administrative limits of the Council, or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council.

2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased ;
- (2) the name and address of the mortgagor ; and
- (3) a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.

3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at 50 cents for the first land and 10 cents for every additional land, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.

In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.
