WHEREAS it is enacted by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the Railway may cross to be a "minor crossing" and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

1. All the property of the inhabitants of the subdivisions set out in each item in column 1 of the foregoing Schedule A (hereinafter called the old subdivisions) and all the rights powers, duties, debts, liabilities, and obligations of such

inhabitants, shall be deemed to be transferred to the inhabitants of the subdivision set out in the corresponding item in column 2 of that schedule (hereinafter called the new subdivision), and the inhabitants of the new subdivision shall for all the purposes of the Ordinance be deemed to be the successors of the inhabitants of the old subdivisions.

2. All rules now in force in the old subdivisions shall be in force in the new subdivision, as if they had been made by or by virtue of the powers delegated by the inhabitants of the new subdivision.

3. The wards into which the old subdivisions were divided by Order under section 14A of the Ordinance, published in the *Gazette* of March 9, 1934, shall be deemed to be the wards of the new subdivision; and the members elected for the several wards of the old subdivisions at any time during the months of May and June, 1934, for the term of office commencing on the 1st day of July, 1934, shall be deemed to have been duly elected for the wards of the new subdivision for that term of office.

[23 & 24 Geo. 5.] *British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1933.* [Ch. 49.]

CHAPTER 49.

An Act to amend the law relating to the national status of married women so far as is necessary for giving effect to a Convention on certain questions relating to the Conflict of Nationality Laws, signed on behalf of His Majesty at the Hague on the twelfth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty, and for purposes incidental to the matter aforesaid. [17th November, 1933.]

A.D. 1933.

Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1.—(1) The following section shall be substituted for section ten of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914 (hereafter in this Act referred to as "the principal Act") :—

"10.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this section, the wife of a British subject shall be deemed to be a British subject, and the wife of an alien shall be deemed to be an alien.

National status

(2) Where a woman has (whether before or after the commencement of this Act) married an alien, and was at the time of her marriage a British subject, she shall not, by reason only of her marriage, be deemed to have ceased to be a British subject unless, by reason of her marriage, she acquired the nationality of her husband.

(3) Where a man has, during the continuance of his marriage, ceased (whether before or after the commencement of this Act) to be a British subject, his wife shall not, by reason only of that fact, be deemed to have ceased to be a British subject unless, by reason of the acquisition by her husband of a new nationality, she also acquired that nationality.

(4) Where a man ceases, during the continuance of his marriage, to be a British subject and, by reason of his acquisition of a new nationality, his wife also acquires that nationality, she may, whether her marriage is still continuing or not, at any time within the period of twelve months from the date on which she so acquired that nationality, or at such later time as the Secretary of State may in special circumstances allow, make a declaration that she desires to retain British nationality, and thereupon she shall be deemed to have remained a British subject.

(5) Where, after the end of the year nineteen hundred and thirty-three, a certificate of naturalisation is granted to an alien, his wife, if not already a British subject, shall not be deemed to be a British subject, unless, within the period of twelve months from the date of the certificate, or within such longer period as the Secretary of State may in special circumstances allow, she makes a declaration that she desires to acquire British nationality.

(6) Where an alien is a subject of a state at war with His Majesty, it shall be lawful for his wife, if she was at birth a British subject, to make a declaration that she desires to resume British nationality, and thereupon the Secretary of State, if he is satisfied that it is desirable that she be permitted to do so, may grant her a certificate of naturalisation."

(2) In paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section nineteen of the principal Act (which section empowers the Secretary of State to make regulations with respect to the form and registration of declarations of resumption or retention of British nationality) there shall be inserted after the word "retention" the words "or acquisition."

2.—(1) This Act may be cited as the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1933, and the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Acts, 1914 to 1922, and this Act may be cited together as the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Acts, 1914 to 1933.

(2) Subsection (3) of section three of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1922, (which relates to the construction, and the printing of copies, of the principal Act) shall apply in relation to amendments made in the principal Act by this Act as it applies in relation to amendments so made by the said Act of 1922.

(i.) "90/720ths" in sub-section (1) (i.) (a) shall be read as "60/720ths".

(ii.) The age limit of "58" in sub-section (1) (i.) (b) shall be read as "53".
(iii.) The age limit of "55" in sub-section (1) (ii.) shall be read as "50".

Provided that the number of years' purchase for European Matrons, Assistant Matrons, and Nursing Sisters retiring at any age shall be 10.

THE EXCISE ORDINANCE, No. 8 OF 1912.

Excise Notification No. 264.

BY virtue of the powers vested in him by sections 4 and 12 of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912, the Governor by this Notification—

- (1) rescinds with effect from the first day of October, 1934, the provisions of paragraph 2 of Excise Notification No. 1 published in *Gazette* No. 6,536 of December 13, 1912, and Excise Notifications Nos. 5, 7, 196, 197, and 250 published in *Gazette* Nos. 6,545 of January 31, 1913, 6,548 of February 14, 1913, 7,797 of August 8, 1930, and 8,001 of August 25, 1933, respectively;
- (2) declares that from and after the said date the limit of sale by retail, with respect to the whole Island and as regards purchasers generally, shall be one-third of an imperial gallon in the case of either arrack or toddy; and
- (3) prescribes generally for the whole Island, one-third of an imperial gallon as the quantity in excess of which no arrack or toddy shall be transported, from and after the said date, except under a pass issued under section 13 of the said Ordinance.

ORDINANCE, No. 19 OF 1915.”

THE following resolution passed by the State Council at a meeting held on May 17, 1934, is published for general information:—

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of “The Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915,” that from and after the first day of June, 1934, the said Ordinance shall be in force within the suburbs of the Kandy Municipality, defined by the following boundaries:—

The Suburb of Iriyagama.

Where inaccuracies are discovered, the timber shall be detained pending enquiry. Only properly marked timber covered by a permit may be stacked in such depôts, and intimation of intention to stack should be furnished to the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent, or the Chief Headman of the place, or the Forest Officer not below the rank of a Forest Ranger.

3. No such timber, &c., may be stacked in such depôts for a period exceeding three months, unless on payment of 50 cents per log per week or portion of a week, nor will removal be permitted till such dues are paid. No payment will be required for the first three months' period of stacking.

4. Any extension granted must be under the authority of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or the Divisional Forest Officer, and the circumstances should be exceptional for seeking such extension, and is only admissible on payment of 25 cents per log per week or portion of a week.

5. Timber or other forest produce not removed after three months, where no extension has been applied for, or not removed after the period of extension granted, may be removed by the Revenue Department, or the Forest Department inland for half a mile at the owner's expense. Such expenses if not paid within a week shall be recovered by the sale of the timber or other produce at owner's risk, and the Government dues shall be a first charge on such sale.

6. Outbay depôts will be inspected quarterly by a Revenue Officer duly authorized in writing by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or by a Forest Officer not below the rank of a Forest Ranger, who will verify all accumulated stock.

7. The property of different owners must be stacked separately for easy identification, as must supplies covered by the permits of one owner, and if this is not done, the Revenue Department or the Forest Department will do it at the expense of the owner, and no removal will be permitted till such expenses are paid.

8. No timber shall be recovered from outbay depôts for transport by sea, unless covered by a shipping permit obtained from the Customs authorities. _____ of _____ (hereinafter called "the Licensee") is hereby licensed to sell arrack at the premises known as _____ or bearing number _____ in _____ street, and situated at _____ in _____ District (hereinafter called "the Licensed Premises") subject to the General Conditions applicable to all Excise Licences, set out in Excise Notification No. 186 and the notifications issued from time to time in amendment thereof and the following special conditions applicable to this licence :—

1. The sale of arrack shall be by bulk only. Sale by the bottle and the breaking open of sealed bottles is prohibited.
2. No bottled arrack and no arrack bottle or cork bearing the Government label or seal, and no Government capsule for arrack bottles, shall be kept in the licensed premises or any outhouses thereof.
3. The arrack shall be obtained only from the _____ tavern, situated at _____ in _____ District, at a price to be mutually agreed upon between the licensee and the renter of the said tavern (hereinafter called "the Renter").
4. (a) No arrack shall be removed from the said tavern to the licensed premises, except on a pass issued by the Superintendent of Excise. No pass will be issued for less than five gallons at a time, or made available for use at a later hour than 6 P.M. on the date of issue.
(b) All such passes shall be filed of record in the licensed premises, and shall be available for inspection for a period of 12 months from the date of issue.
5. (a) The cask or other container for arrack shall be kept padlocked, in such manner that no arrack or other liquor can be introduced without unlocking, and the padlock and two keys shall be supplied by the licensee at his own expense. One key may be kept by the renter, unless the renter agrees in writing to leave it with the licensee, and the other shall be kept by the Superintendent of Excise. In any case the renter or his representative shall have the right to be present, whenever the cask is opened for replenishment or testing.
(b) The licensee or Inspecting Officer shall give at least one hour's notice to the renter or his representative of his intention to replenish the cask or other container or to test the arrack, as the case may be.
(c) No arrack shall be kept in stock by the licensee, except in the cask or other container so padlocked, and no arrack shall be sold except from such cask or other container.
6. The possession by the licensee of a key to the padlock of the cask is prohibited, unless the renter has agreed to it in writing.
7. Excise Officers not below the grade of Inspector shall at all times when the premises are open for sale of arrack, be given access to the cask, or other container, and allowed to check the strength and quantity of arrack contained therein.
8. The licensee shall not sell arrack in excess of one-third of an imperial gallon at any one time to any one person. Provided, however, that, if the maximum limit of sale for removal prescribed in the Foreign Liquor Licence held by the licensee is less than one-third of an imperial gallon, or if the sale for removal is prohibited in the said licence, such maximum limit or prohibition shall be equally applicable to the sale of arrack by the licensee for removal, notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing clause of this condition.
9. The sale of arrack shall be subject to the same restrictions, if any, as the sale of foreign liquor prescribed in the Foreign Liquor Licence held by the licensee as regards the hours of sale, the class of customer, and the nature of business permitted.
10. All arrack exposed or kept for sale under this licence shall be of a strength not below 29 degrees under proof according to Sykes' hydrometer test. No water, and no colouring, flavouring, or other matter whatsoever shall be added to the arrack.
11. The licensee shall at all times keep a stock of not less than two gallons of arrack.
12. Arrack shall not be sold by the dram or glass at a lower rate than Rs. 15·12 a gallon, or 31½ cents a dram, at 27 degrees under proof.
13. Standard measures approved by the Superintendent of Excise, viz., 1¼ dram, ¾ dram, ½ dram, and ¼ dram shall be kept, and shall on demand by any customer be used for measuring the arrack he has purchased.
14. The licensee shall affix in a prominent place within the licensed premises, so as to be capable of being easily read by the customers, a card displaying in bold printed figures and English, Sinhalese, and Tamil letters the selling price of the arrack offered for sale by the dram.

16. The sum of Rs. 50 deposited by the licensee with his application for this licence shall be held by the Excise Commissioner as security for the due observance of the general and special conditions of this licence, and shall be liable to forfeiture, in whole or in part, at the sole discretion of the Excise Commissioner, for any breach of the said conditions, in addition to the penalties provided for such breach by the Ordinance.

17. The licensee shall be responsible for all acts of his agents and employees in relation to this licence.

18. No cask or other container shall be used for the storage of arrack, unless it bears clearly engraved and painted on it its correct capacity in terms of gallons, and is provided with a correct dip-rod with engraved marks showing gallons and half gallons.

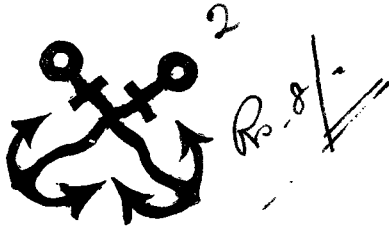
