BY-LAW.

By-law No. 2 of the by-laws regarding "Regulation of Public Markets and Regulations dealing with Unwholesome Food," published in *Gazette* No. 8,057 of June 8, 1934, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor :—

2. The following fees and rents shall be leviable at each public market for the use of the market premises or any part thereof :—

Cents 5 per day or cents 21 per week or cents 84 per month in respect of every stall or any part thereof in the vegetable and fish markets. These rates shall apply also to wholesale dealers and traders keeping wooden or other boxes in the market buildings.

Cents 2 per day for a space of 3 feet square or less from every person selling vegetables, fruits, straw, coconuts, rice, paddy, dry grains, Indian corn, yams, sugar cane, earthenware, eggs, crabs, dry fish, and other marketable articles in the market compound in places set apart for the purpose.

THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
No. 13 OF 1896.

REGULATIONS under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," as amended by Ordinance No. 7 of 1897, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Talavillu for St. Anne's Festival, 1934.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, May 16, 1934, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated May 9, 1934.

Present:—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Dr. S. T. Gunasekera; Mr. W. J. Price; Mr. D. Doig; and Mr. R. W. E. Ruddock.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 11, 1934, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

The Minutes of the Special Meeting of Council of May 15, 1934, were read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved:—(1) That the Council do record its deep regret at the death of Mr. N. R. Blande in whom it has lost a valued colleague and its grateful appreciation of the services rendered to the citizens of Colombo by the late Mr. N. R. Blande as a member of the Colombo Municipal Council from October, 1925, till his death on April 25, 1934. (2) That the Chairman do convey to the relatives of the deceased a copy of this resolution with an expression of the sincere sympathy of the Council. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried in silence, all present standing.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando asked the following questions which the Chairman answered.

(1) Q.—Has the Chairman's attention been drawn to an interview in the local press recently with a prominent Australian resident, Mr. W. P. Burrows, who refers to propaganda issued by a Shipping Company, warning Australians against eating Ceylon fruit and drinking local water? A.—Yes.

(2) Q.—Will the Chairman take the necessary steps to obtain a copy of the notice in question after circularising Shipping Agents of vessels on the Colombo-Australian Lino? A.—I have communicated with the various Shipping Companies concerned, but I was not successful in tracing the notice warning passengers against eating Ceylon fruit and drinking local water. However, in the copy of a notice which I received from Messrs. Whittall & Co., the following note appears under the heading "Hints to Visitors":—"Fruits—Passengers are warned against the purchase at Colombo of soft fruits such as bananas and pineapples. In tropical weather soft fruits quickly become unfit for consumption and the eating of over-ripe fruit is attended with great danger."

(3) Q.—After obtaining the said information will the Chairman kindly place the papers before the Four Standing Committees so that the Committees may consider the question of imposing a passenger tax on passengers from vessels of the Shipping Company referred to in the interview who land in Colombo, or taking any other suitable retaliatory measures? A.—As requested the papers will be placed before the Four Standing Committees at their next meeting.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved:—In view of the reasons set out by the importer of goats from Aden, in his letter to the Chairman and Members of the Council, dated May 1, 1934, this Council now decides that when an importer from Aden establishes to the satisfaction of the Chairman that he has *bond fide* good and valid reasons for his inability to import his full quota for the month from Aden, the Chairman be authorized to permit such importer to make up the deficiency by importing from India. *Note*.—In terms of the provision of section 10 (e) of Chapter II. of the Municipal by-laws, the notice of above motion bears, in addition to the signature of Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, the signatures of the following five members:—Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Dr. E. A. Coorey, Dr. S. Muttiah, Mr. F. Dadabhoy, Mr. Aelian W. Pereira. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

Dr. E. A. Coorey suggested an alteration to the wording of the motion.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal explained that the intention of Dr. E. A. Coorey would be met without the suggested alteration. The Chairman stated that he had no objection to the motion being accepted.

Dr. S. Muttiah spoke to the motion.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey moved:—"In view of the fact that great hardship is caused to all religious bodies in the city, particularly to the Buddhists and the Hindus by assessment of properties in terms of section 115 (i.) of the Municipal Council Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, which only provides that all school buildings and buildings exclusively appropriated to religious worship, &c., shall be exempted from the payment of such rate or rates, this Council is of opinion that this section of the Ordinance should be so amended as to bring the assessment of such properties into line with provision made in section 172 of Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, which provides that there shall be exempt from any such rate or acreage tax all lands or buildings wholly or mainly used for religious, educational, or charitable purposes, &c., and urges on the Central Government the desirability of amending the said section of the Municipal Council Ordinance accordingly." Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The Chairman suggested that the matter might be referred to the Standing Committees concerned to consider the implications involved in accepting the motion.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando spoke to the motion.

The mover and the seconder having agreed to the suggestion of the Chairman, it was resolved that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration and report.

6. The permission of Council having been obtained, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, moved:—In view of the fact that several stall-holders in certain markets are called upon to pay increased rates as per Municipal Treasurer's report dated February 21, 1934, that where such increase is contemplated no action be taken. *Note*.—In terms of the provision of section 10 (e) of Chapter II., of the Municipal by-laws, the notice of above motion bears, in addition to the signature of Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, the signatures of the following five members:—Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Dr. E. A. Coorey, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, Dr. S. Muttiah. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

Dr. E. A. Coorey suggested that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration and report.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved as an amendment, that the question of rents of fish stalls in the Dean's road Market be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration and report. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.

The amendment having been accepted by the mover and the seconder of the motion was put to the meeting and carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved:—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee.—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of May 2, 1934, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(2) To reconsider:—(a) Letter No. C 3235/33 dated January 11, 1934, from the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, forwarding a draft of the new by-laws which he suggests should be adopted in place of the existing by-laws dealing with trams. (b) Comments thereon of the Acting Secretary, Municipal Council, the Municipal Engineer, and the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 47.—Recommended that the by-laws, as further amended (*vide* annexure A attached to these minutes) be adopted.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that section 11 (3) of the by-laws be deleted. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.—Lost.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that section 20 (2) of the by-laws be adopted subject to the deletion of the words "unless the licence expressly permits it." Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam inquired whether the Council did not authorize the Tramway Company to carry a certain number of passengers standing, after the members of the Works and Finance Committees inspecting a car constructed according to a new design.

The Chairman explained the position.

Mr. M. L. M. Royal and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha spoke.

Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke to the motion.

The motion was put to the meeting and lost.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that section 22 (1) be adopted subject to the deletion of the words "offensive or quarrelsome or gestures" occurring in (i). Mr. M. L. M. Royal seconded.—Lost.

Resolved that the by-laws (as per annexure "A") be adopted.

(3) To consider:—(a) The quotations received locally as well as through the Council's Agents for the supply of Plain Blue Cork, Linoleum Curtain Material, and Railway Action Curtain Runners. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) that the quotations for the materials grouped under 1, 2, and 3 of his report of March 20, 1934, be accepted. *Note.*—The total cost of materials for this particular service is £96. 4s., F.O.B. approximately Rs. 1,315). Purchase to be made through Council's London Agents and cost will be met from vote 176/1932, "Improvements to Council Chambers." Registered No. 413.—Recommended.

(4) To consider a detailed estimate for Rs. 1,750 from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for erecting 5 illuminated pillars on refuges for pedestrians. *Note.*—Supplementary provision of Rs. 1,750 is necessary. Registered No. 470.—Recommended, and that supplementary provision of Rs. 1,750 be sanctioned.

9. The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

10. The Chairman moved that Mr. F. J. Soertsz, K.C., and Lieut.-Colonel N. W. Napier Clavering R.E., D.S.O., who have been absent from the two previous General Meetings, and thereby ceased to be members in consequence of having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings be restored office, under the provisions of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha dissented regarding by-laws Nos. 11 (3), 20 (2), 21 (3), 22 (1), 22 (2), 23, and 24.

DRAFT BY-LAWS RELATING TO TRAM CARS.

1. No tram car, for which a licence from the Chairman of the Municipal Council is not in force, shall be used or ply for hire.

2. The owner or owners shall cause every tram car and every trailer plying for hire to conform to the following requirements :—

(1) Every car and every trailer shall be properly constructed, appointed, and equipped, and shall at all times be maintained in good working order, and shall be kept clean and varnished or painted and varnished internally and externally to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Municipal Council.

(2) Every car and every trailer shall be provided with a bell, whistle, or other device to enable the conductor to communicate with the driver when it is necessary to stop or to start the car.

(3) The wheels shall be fitted with brake blocks, capable of being applied by a screw or treadle or other suitable device, and there shall be in addition an adequate emergency or reversing brake.

(4) Every car shall be fitted with a suitable fender, which shall be approved by the Chairman, and with a special bell or whistle or other device capable of being sounded when necessary. The approval of the fender by the Chairman shall not relieve the Tramway Company from any liability that may legally attach to them under any provision of law other than these by-laws.

(5) Every car shall be free from any noise or clatter of machinery that may cause annoyance to the passengers or is likely to be a public nuisance, and any machinery under the carriage shall be concealed from view at all points at a height of not less than four inches from the level of the rails.

3. (1) Any tram car in which any one of the hand brakes, the electric brakes, the motors, or controllers is out of order, shall be deemed to be a disabled tram car.

(2) No passengers shall be allowed to ride in a disabled tram car or trailer.

(3) Any disabled tram car or trailer towed by another tram car, shall be attached thereto securely and as rigidly as is practicable.

(4) No disabled tram car shall be self-propelled in any public thoroughfare. Provided that this rule shall not apply to any disabled tram car which may be self-propelled, for the sole purpose of reaching its depôt or repair-shed, if it carries no passengers, and if at least one of the brakes, motors, and controllers is in perfect working order, and the defective brake, motor, or controller is not used, or relied upon for use.

4. The owner or owners of every tram car and trailer shall cause a distinguishing number to be painted on it, in a conspicuous place, in letters not less than one foot high.

5. There shall be attached to each car or trailer in a conspicuous place, on the front and rear, a painted label, with letters not less than two inches high, showing the route and destination of the car.

6. The owner or owners of every tram car shall cause such car when plying for hire between the time of sunset and sunrise to carry a lighted lamp at either end thereof, namely, a white head-light and a red rear-light, and shall also cause the interior of every such car to be sufficiently lighted.

7. Every tram car plying for hire shall carry a conductor, and if any such car be found without a conductor, the driver and the owner or owners of such car shall be guilty of an offence.

8. Every driver and conductor of a tram car plying for hire shall wear in some place, where it can be readily seen, a distinguishing badge, such badges shall bear separate numbers, and the Tramway Company shall keep a register from which it can be discovered who was the wearer of a certain badge on any given day. The manager of the owner or owners of tram cars shall, on the demand of any person during business hours, and on his furnishing the number of a badge, the date and time, and number of the car on which it was worn, inform that person who was the driver or conductor, as the case may be, who wore that particular badge.

9. (1) The owner or owners of tram cars plying for hire shall cause to be affixed and keep affixed in a conspicuous place externally on every car a placard or ticket notifying the number of passengers which the car is licensed to carry. A label with the word "full" shall be suspended in a conspicuous place externally on every car when the car is full. No person shall enter or attempt to enter a compartment in which a label "full" is suspended, and any such person may be removed from the car by any officer of the owner or owners of tram cars.

(2) It shall be an offence for the conductor of any tram car or trailer to admit, or to permit the entry, into the car or trailer, of more persons than such car or trailer is licensed to carry.

(3) It shall be an offence for any person to enter or attempt to enter any tram car or trailer, where the label announcing that such car or trailer is full is suspended, or when he is informed of that fact by the conductor and requested not to enter such car or trailer.

10. No owner, driver, or conductor, or person acting on behalf of the owner, driver, or conductor of a tram car plying for hire shall—

- (1) speak, make any noise, or sound any instrument in order to attract the attention of the public or of a possible passenger; or
- (2) act so as to cause annoyance or inconvenience to any person.

11. (1) Whenever the owner or owners of tram cars adopt the ticket system of collecting fares, then, so long as that system is continued, every passenger travelling in a tram car shall upon payment of his fare be furnished with a ticket, which shall be punched so as to denote the section to which the passenger is entitled to travel.

(2) The tickets shall contain a printed notice, showing with reference to the punch, how far the passenger is entitled to travel.

(3) Every passenger shall whenever called upon to do so, show the ticket to any tramway official authorized to examine the same; and on leaving the car he shall deliver such ticket on demand to any tramway official duly authorized to collect tickets.

(4) The owner or owners of tram cars shall give immediate notice to the Chairman of the Municipal Council of any change in their system of collecting.

12. The owner or owners of tram cars shall cause a printed copy of these by-laws to be posted up in some conspicuous part in their office in Colombo, and printed copies of by-laws 8, 9, and 10, in each separate compartment of every car owned or used by them.

13. No driver of a tram car shall smoke while driving the tram car.

14. The driver of any tram car on a road shall obey all directions, given verbally or by signal by a Police Officer in the execution of his duty, to stop such vehicle, or to make it slow down, and obey also all traffic signs and notices for regulating the movements of traffic.

15. (1) The speed at which any tram car is driven or propelled along the tramways shall not exceed the rate of 15 miles an hour; provided, however, that it shall not exceed 5 miles an hour in the Maradana road between its junctions with Symond's road and Temple road, in New Moor street between its junctions with Dam street and Kuruwe street, in Main street between its junctions with Gasworks street and Front street, and in such other congested places as the Chairman of the Municipal Council may from time to time specify.

(2) The speed of any car passing through facing points, whether fixed or movable, shall not exceed the rate of four miles an hour.

16. (1) Every tram car shall be brought to a stop at least thirty feet before arriving at any of the following junctions, and such other junctions as the Chairman may from time to time specify:—

- (a) Junction of Messenger street with Kuruwe street and Hulftsdorp street.
- (b) Junction of Grandpass road with Madampitiya road.
- (c) Junction of Grandpass road with Armour street and Skinners road south.
- (d) Junction of Maradana road with Maligakanda road.
- (e) Junction of Maradana road with Regent street and Jail road.

(2) No tram car shall pass any of the aforesaid junctions at a speed exceeding 4 miles an hour.

17. Except at a siding or a place appointed by the Chairman of the Municipal Council as a stand for tram cars, no tram car shall be so driven as to be at any time at a less distance than thirty yards from any tram car preceding it on the track.

18. (1) The Chairman of the Municipal Council may, with the consent of the owner or owners of tram cars, prescribe halting places for tram cars along their routes.

(2) It shall be the duty of the driver and of the conductor of every tram car plying for hire to stop the car at any such prescribed halting place when required to do so by any passenger who desires to leave the car, or by any person at or near such halting place who desires to enter the car, and for whom there is room.

(3) Except at such prescribed halting places, no driver of any tram car plying for hire shall stop the car for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers.

19. (1) No person shall enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave any tram car or trailer while it is in motion.

(2) The tram cars and trailers shall be constructed in such a way or provided with such a device as to prevent passengers from entering or alighting on the off side.

20. (1) No person shall ride or attempt to ride on the footboard of a tram car or trailer, or on any part of the outside of a tram car or trailer.

(2) No person other than the driver or conductor or a tram car inspector shall travel standing inside a tram car, unless the licence expressly permits it; and no person shall so stand inside a tram car as to obstruct any of the entrances to the car.

21. (1) No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in or upon a tram car, and any such person found in or upon a tram car, shall immediately leave the tram car on being requested to do so by the driver or conductor.

(2) No conductor of a tram car shall permit any such person to be carried in the tram car.

(3) Any such person may be removed by any of the tramway officials from any such car.

22. (1) No person, while travelling in or upon a tram car shall—

- (i.) Spit on the floor of any part thereof, or use obscene, indecent, offensive, or quarrelsome language, or gestures, or behave in any manner calculated to insult or annoy any other passengers.
 (ii.) Wilfully interfere in any way with the comfort of any passenger; or
 (iii.) Wilfully obstruct or impede the driver or conductor or other tramway official in the exercise of his duty; or
 (iv.) Wilfully damage the tram car.

(2) Any such offender may be removed by any tramway official from the tram car, and his fare shall be forfeited.

23. Except in cases where a whole car has been specially engaged, no person shall, while travelling in any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any tramway official in the lawful execution of any duty connected with any tram car or the tramway.

25. The conductor of every tram car shall enforce the foregoing by-laws relating to passengers and prevent the breach of the same to the best of his ability.

26. No conductor of a tram car shall demand or take from any person travelling therein, any sum in excess of the authorized fare indicated in the list of fares exhibited on or in such car.

27. The conductor of a tram car shall, after the completion of a journey, carefully search for any property left in the car and shall, without undue delay take such property, if it is not claimed by the owner thereof, to the nearest Police Station.

28. (1) The Chairman, Municipal Council, may appoint an officer who shall from time to time inspect the cars used on the tramways and the working arrangements on the tramway lines, and report any defects he finds in either of them or any unsatisfactory or dangerous condition to the Chairman of the Municipal Council.

(2) It shall be the duty of the owner or owners of every tram car to effect such repairs, alterations, or improvements as may consistently with the provisions of the agreement made and entered into on November 25, 1896, between the Municipal Council, Colombo, and the Firm of Boustead Brothers, be therefore ordered by the Chairman.

29. Efficient guard wires shall be erected and maintained by the owner or owners of tram cars, at all places where telegraph or telephone wires cross above the electric conductors of the tramway.

30. When any accident resulting in or likely to result in loss of life or personal injury has occurred in connection with any tram car or the working of the tramways it shall be the duty of the owner or owners of such car or tramways or of their authorized Agent or Manager, to report such accident forthwith to the nearest Police Station and to the Chairman of the Municipal Council.

31. Any tramway official or other person who wilfully or negligently commits a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws, shall, unless the penalty for such breach is expressly provided for in these by-laws, be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100, or in the case of a second subsequent conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 200.

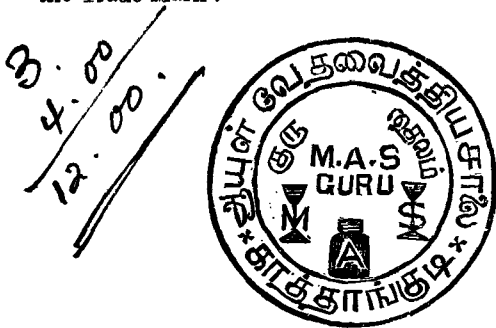
