DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend the Weights and Measures Ordinance, 1876.

No. 8 of 1876.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Weights and Measures Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1934.

Short title.

2 Section thirteen of "The Weights and Measures Ordinance, 1876," (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended by the substitution of the words "by this Ordinance or by any regulation made thereunder," for the words "by this Ordinance," where those words occur in that section.

Amendment of section 13 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1876.

3 The following section shall be added at the end of the principal Ordinance and shall have effect as section 17 thereof :

Addition of a new section 17 to the principal Ordinance.

" 17 (1) The Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce may make regulations for the purpose of carrying out or giving effect to the principles and provisions of this Ordinance.

Regulations.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the powers conferred by sub-section (1), the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce may make regulations for or in respect of all or any of the following matters :—

- (a) the verification and stamping of weights and measures, including the prohibition of stamping in cases where the shape, size, nature, denomination, material, or principle of construction of the weight or measure appears likely to facilitate the perpetration of fraud ;
- (b) the tests to be applied for the purpose of ascertaining the accuracy and efficiency of weights and measures ; and,
- (c) the limits of error to be allowed on verification and to be tolerated on inspection either generally or as respects any trade.

(3) No regulation made under this section shall have effect unless it has been approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor. Notification of such approval and ratification shall be published in the Gazette.

(4) Every regulation made by the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce shall, upon the publication of a notification of the approval and ratification of that regulation as provided for in sub-section (3), be as valid and effectual as if it were herein enacted.

Objects and Reasons.

The object of this Bill is to enable the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce to make regulations generally for all matters incidental to the administration of the Weights and Measures Ordinance, 1876, and particularly for the matters specified in sub-clause (2) of clause 3.

2. The principal Ordinance provides for the appointment of examiners of weights and measures, and section 9 requires such examiners to stamp all weights and measures which correspond with the copies of the standard weights and measures provided under the authority of that Ordinance. This Bill, *inter alia*, enables the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce to frame regulations authorising an examiner of weights and measures to refuse to stamp a weight or measure in specified cases where the nature or construction of the weight or measure appears likely to facilitate the perpetration of fraud.

3. The powers sought to be conferred on the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce by this Bill are identical with those enjoyed by the Board of Trade under section 5 of the English Weights and Measures Act, 1904, (4 Ed. 7, c. 28).

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend the Tea Cess (Temporary Increase) Ordinance, No. 12 of 1930.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Tea Cess (Temporary Increase) Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1934.

Duration of Ordinance No. 12 of 1930, extended to 31st March, 1938.

2 Notwithstanding anything contained in the Tea Cess (Temporary Increase Continuation) Ordinance, No. 36 of 1933, and without prejudice to anything done under or by virtue of that Ordinance—

- (1) the provisions of section 3 of the Tea Cess (Temporary Increase) Ordinance, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1938 ;
- (2) section 2 of the principal Ordinance shall have effect as though there were substituted for the words and figures "31st day of December, 1933" the words and figures "31st day of March, 1938".

Objects and Reasons.

In order to provide an annual income for the Tea Research Institute of Ceylon, section 11 of the Tea Research Ordinance, 1925, authorised an addition of 10 cents per 100 pounds to the export duty on tea. In 1930 it was found that the income from this cess and from the Institute's estate was insufficient, after meeting the loan charges on the loan of Rs. 1,000,000 from Government, to provide the necessary facilities for the conduct of the scientific investigations for which the Institute was founded. By the Tea Cess (Temporary Increase) Ordinance, 1930, the cess was accordingly increased, for a period of three years from 1st January, 1931, to 14 cents per 100 pounds of tea exported.

2. The matter was reviewed at the end of 1933, and owing to the fall in tea prices, which had affected the Institute's income from its estate, and owing to the introduction by international agreement of a measure of regulation and control of the export of tea under the Tea (Control of Export) Ordinance, No. 11 of 1933, it was considered that it would be necessary to maintain the cess at 14 cents per 100 pounds for about 5 years from 1934.

The Executive Committee for Agriculture and Lands, however, proposed to maintain the increased cess for only one year in the first instance, and the Tea Cess (Temporary Increase Continuation) Ordinance, No. 36 of 1933, accordingly provided for the continuance of the cess of 14 cents per 100 pounds until the 31st December, 1934.

3. The position has now been reviewed, and the Board of the Tea Research Institute has applied to the Minister and Executive Committee for Agriculture and Lands for the continuance of the cess at the existing rate of 14 cents per 100 pounds, and the Executive Committee has concurred in the maintenance of the cess at this rate for a further period from 1st January, 1935, to 31st March, 1938. This Bill seeks to give effect to the Executive Committee's decision.
