IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve the creation of an additional rank for Tamils to be designated "Muhandiram", and to order that the total number of appointments to be made to that rank shall not exceed twenty.

WITH reference to the notification of to-day's date regarding the creation of the rank of Tamil Muhandiram, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order that all persons holding that rank shall be entitled to wear the dress specified below when appearing at State functions:-

- (1) White turban with silver lace 1 inch wide.
  (2) Long coat of white silk or white broad cloth with gold loops and buttons.
  (3) Sword, hilt and scabbard of silver, hilt only inlaid with gold.
  (4) Sword belt of plain gold lace, not spangled, to be worn over the right shoulder.
  (5) Such colour options!

- (5) Sash—colour optional.
- (6) White trousers, or white veddi cloth worn as Taru.
  (7) With trousers, boots or shoes (black or white), with socks to match, will be worn.
  With veddi cloth, if foot-wear is used, jutas without socks, or shoes (black or white), with socks to match, will be worn.

Jutas must be removed in the presence of the Governor.
