KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers in Us vested by section 37 of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation amend the Proclamation of January 18, 1899, published in the Gazette of January 27, 1899, whereby a Village Tribunal was established in a part of the Chief Headman's division of Giruwa pattu west, by deleting the schedule thereto as amended or varied by the Proclamations of April 3, 1929, and January 22, 1934, published respectively in the Gazettes of April 5, 1929, and of January 26, 1934, and substituting for that schedule the schedule set out hereunder.

#### IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 of 1917.

RULES under section 11 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the Soraborawewa Irrigation District, at a meeting held on January 20, 1934, and approved by His Excellency the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931. #### RULES.

1. The cultivation of fields under Soraborawewa irrigation works shall be confined to maha and yala harvests.

2. The cultivation of Koruppe fields under the Soraborawewa shall be confined to maha and that of Sorabora fields shall be confined to yala, and the cultivation seasons shall be as follows:—

#### Koruppe Fields

Maha—From September 1 to November 30 for cultivation and to finish sowing.

#### Sorabora Fields.

Yala—From February 1 to April 30 for cultivation and to finish sowing.

3. The following intervals between cultivation seasons are required for general repairs and maintenance of the works, and no water will be issued through any sluice or canals for distribution to the fields during these periods, viz.:—

Maha—From January 1 to 30, 30 days. Yala—From August 1 to 30, 30 days.

- 4. No person other than the officer in charge of the work or some person deputed by him shall open or interfere with the sluices of the irrigation work or channels or issue water therefrom.
- 5. The Manager of the fields shall furnish the irrigation headman, within 15 days before commencing cultivation, with a list of persons who have been employed as goiyas, showing the extent which each goiya cultivates.

6. It shall be the duty of the vel-vidanes to make written application to the irrigation officer for water stating the area requiring water, and they shall take action to prevent any waste of the water issued thereupon.

7. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors whose lands are irrigable from any Government channel to construct, in accordance with the directions and specifications given in that behalf, such part of the subsidiary channels required to irrigate the lands as may be marked out by the officer in charge of the work as the share proportionate to the holding of such proprietor.

8. All field channels shall be maintained in good order

8. All field channels shall be maintained in good order by the proprietors whose lands are irrigable thereby, and it shall be their duty to have their channels cleared before every cultivation, and to maintain them clear during the cultivation, and in the event of any default it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to cause the work to be done and to recover the cost thereof from the defaulter in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Ordinance.

9. No person shall construct any dam across any channel except on instructions from the officer in charge of the work.

10. Ploughing shall be commenced from the Agawata to the Mulata fields and sowing in like manner, and no Mulata proprietor shall plough his field before the Agata proprietor, if the latter ploughs in time.

11. The fence round the whole tract shall be measured, off in proportion to the extent each person cultivates, and the portion assigned to each proprietor shall be completed within six days of the notice given in that behalf by the

The aforesaid fence shall in like manner be maintained in good repair by the proprietors until the crop is reaped and gathered

and gathered.

12. Each proprietor shall erect a proper watch hut adjoining the field cultivated by him before the sowing commences, and shall keep watch regularly until the crop is reaped and gathered although his own paddy may have been reaped earlier.

13. It shall be the duty of each of the proprietors of the lands irrigated by any water-course to which any sudden or unforeseen damage has accidently been caused, on being given reasonable notice thereof by the officer in charge of the work through the vel-vidane, by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, to attend at the place indicated and to contribute labour towards the repair of such damage, in person or by substitute, until the work is completed.

14. It shall be the duty of the irrigation headmen elected or appointed under section 21 of the Ordinance to regulate the use of any water issued by the irrigation officer from the Government channels or other sources, to supervise the cultivation of lands under the work, and generally to enforce the observance of these rules.

15. All lands under cultivation shall be liable to the vel-vidane for four kurinies per amunam of sowing extent for yala and maha as huwandiram and the vel-vidane shall make over one-fourth of such huwandiram to the ela vidane if such officer has been elected or appointed.

Provided that in any case where the Government Agent has disallowed any portion of the huwandiram due to any vel-vidane or ela vidane who has been guilty of neglect of

- duty, only the remaining portion shall be payable by each proprietor to such vel-vidane, or by the vel-vidane to such ela vidane.
- 16. Such huwandiram shall be paid and a receipt obtained therefor by each proprietor before any part of his harvest is removed from the threshing-floor.

17. If any proprietor makes default in payment of huwandiram, the equivalent in money may be recovered in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Ordinance.

- 18. The question of constructing any new channel that may be required shall be decided by the majority of the proprietors, subject to the right of the minority to appeal to the village council; and in the event of such an appeal, the decision of the council shall be final.
- 19. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid, has to pass through the fields of one or more of the proprietors, it shall be the duty of each such proprietor to open and construct that part of the channel which falls within his field.
- 20. If any new channel or any part thereof, decided upon as aforesaid, falls outside the fields under cultivation, it shall be the duty of each of the proprietors to contribute, towards the construction of such channel or part labour proportionate to his holding.

21. Except with the permission of the Government Agent or other authorized officer no water from any tank or other irrigation work shall be allowed or used for any purpose other than that of irrigating paddy plants.

22. The rules for the afore-mentioned district of Soraborawewa published by the several Proclamations in the Gazettes of June 27, 1913, and May 20, 1927, and deemed to be in force heretofore by virtue of the provisions of section 2 of the Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

- (1) by the deletion of rule 17 under the heading "Passengers" and the substitution of the following therefor:—

- (2) by the deletion of rule 18 under the heading "Passengers" and the substitution of the following therefor:—
  - "18. Tickets, Conditions of Issue.—(a) Tickets given to passengers on payment of their fares are not transferable; they are the property of the Government, and must be produced or delivered up whenever demanded by the railway servants. Special attention is directed to sections 8, 9, 10, and 11 of the Ordinance (No. 9 of 1902).
  - (b) The single journey tickets are available only on the day of issue or by a through train starting on the day of issue, except as provided in the case of a break of journey in paragraph (j) of this rule.
  - (c) Single journey tickets entitle the holders to travel once only in one direction, and return tickets once only in each direction between the points marked thereon.
  - (d) Tickets will not be issued to passengers at an intermediate station for the train by which they have travelled or are travelling; but passengers desirous of travelling beyond the station to which they have booked must, before passing that station, hand their tickets to the Guard, at the same time informing him, to which station they wish to travel. The Guard will then see to the collection of the excess fare at the proper point, but under no circumstances can the advantage of a return ticket be obtained by the payment of excess fare.
  - (e) Passengers having once booked are not allowed to change their tickets for those of a lower class.(f) The return halves of tickets are not transferable.
  - (g) First, Second, and Third Class return tickets for distances 50 miles and under are available for return within three days inclusive of the day of issue and the day of return (i.e., a ticket issued on Monday is available for return not later than Wednesday). Return tickets for distances over 50 miles are available for return within ten days inclusive of the day of issue and the day of return
  - (h) Should a passenger with a return ticket apply to travel in a carriage of a higher class than that for which the ticket was issued, he will be required to pay the difference between the fares of the two classes, respectively for the single journey. Should a passenger apply to travel in a higher class both journeys, he will have to pay such difference for each journey.
  - (i) Except under the circumstances stated in paragraph (j) of this rule a passenger leaving the train at a station short of that to which he has booked must deliver up his ticket, and cannot be allowed to resume his journey except by obtaining a fresh ticket.

(j) Holders of single tickets for distances over 50 miles are allowed to brake journey once at any station en route provided the journey is resumed within 24 hours.

Holders of return tickets for distances over 50 miles are allowed to break journey at an intermediate station once on the outward and once on the homeward route, provided that they do not travel more than once in each direction over the same section of the line, and that the return journey is completed within the time for which the return ticket is available.

When a passenger breaks journey, he must, on alighting from the train, produce his ticket to the Station Master who will endorse on it 'Broke journey at 'the name of the station being inserted) and initial and date, the endorsement, time being inserted in addition in the case of single tickets.

(k) Passengers are not allowed to use tickets on any day for which such tickets are not available.

(l) Passengers are booked at intermediate stations only on condition that there is room in the train by which they intend to travel.

(m) Should there not be room in the class of carriage for which passengers are booked, temporary accommodation may be found for them in a higher class whenever it is possible to do so without inconvenience to

- other passengers, but they will be required to change as soon as room is available in the class for which they hold tickets
- (n) Tickets issued at specially reduced rates can only be used between the stations specified thereon. If used to or from any other stations, the whole ticket will be forfeited and full fares charged.
- (o) Return tickets issued to naval and military officers, sailors, and soldiers (and their wives and children), on certificates, are available on the return journey without any limitation of time."
- (3) by the deletion of rule 22 under the heading "Passengers" and the substitution of the following therefor:—
  - "22. Excess Fares.—(a) Passengers travelling with wrong halves of return tickets will be charged excess fares, unless they can show good reason for being exempted.

(b) When excess fare is due on either half of a return ticket such half ticket will be considered as an ordinary single journey ticket and excess charged accordingly.

- (c) When a passenger before commencing his journey wishes to change his ticket for one of a higher class and pays the difference of fare, the original ticket issued will be taken back and a fresh one for the higher class issued instead.
- (d) When a passenger in the course of his journey wishes to change to a higher class of carriage than that for which he holds a ticket, he must inform the Guard of the train, who will see that he pays the excess fare and obtains an excess fare ticket, either at the station at which the change is made or at the first station at which this can be conveniently done. Care should be taken to obtain a printed and numbered excess fare ticket for the payment made, otherwise the fare may be demanded again at any other station at which tickets are examined or collected.
- (e) Every passenger who pays excess fare should demand and at once receive a receipt for the amount paid.
- (f) All claims for refund of excess charges must be made within six days of the date of payment, otherwise they may not be entertained. Claims should be addressed to the General Manager, Colombo, and should be written on forms which can be obtained free of charge from any Station Master. Claimants should carefully note the numbers printed on their tickets, as claims cannot be entertained unless the numbers are given."
- (4) by the deletion of rule 23 under the heading "Passengers" and the substitution of the following therefor:—
  - "23. Refund on Tickets.—(a) The Government is not bound to make any return to passengers who may have been called upon to pay fares a second time in consequence of their failure, from neglect or any other cause, to produce their tickets on demand made by any officer of the railway.
  - (b) Refunds will not be allowed on Platform Tickets, Rail Motor Tickets, and return halves of Excursion or Concessionary and Week-end Tickets.
  - (c) All refunds on tickets will be subject to a deduction of 10 per cent. and in no case less than 10 cents, for each full or half ticket, except in the case of passengers who were unable to complete their journey owing to accidents on the railway or any default on the part of the railway.
  - (d) Applications for refund on single tickets or outward halves of return tickets fully or partially unused must be supported by a certificate from the Station Master, at the issuing or intermediate station at which the journey was terminated. Applications for refund on unused halves of return tickets must be made not later than three days after the date of expiry of the returnable period; otherwise they may not be entertained.
  - (c) In special circumstances the General Manager may at his discretion allow a refund on any ticket."
- (5) by the deletion of paragraphs (f) and (h) of rule 33, under the heading "Passengers' Luggage" and the substitution of the following therefor:—
  - "(f) Each adult passenger will be allowed, free of charge, the following weight of luggage, viz.:—

A free allowance of half these quantities will be made for each child travelling with half ticket.

No luggage will be conveyed free for children under three years of age who travel free.

Any excess over these weights will be charged full parcels rates. All excess luggage charges must be paid to the Booking Clerk at the time of booking and receipts

obtained for payment, otherwise they are liable to be charged for again. The free allowance referred to above is granted only on the luggage booked at the starting is broken under rule 18 (j). If the luggage in excess of the free allowance is found unbooked, either en route or at destination, the whole of the luggage will be weighed and charged for without making any free allowance on the tickets held. Passengers who wish to book part of their luggage to an intermediate station in order to break journey under rule 18 (j) will be given free allowance in terms of paragraph 1 above, and any excess charged to the ultimate destination. The luggage required for the break of journey will be separately weighed and noted on the labels affixed to same, and if on resumption of the journey the luggage is found to be over the weight noted thereon, the weight in excess will be charged for at ordinary parcels rates. The luggage presented for booking at such intermediate stations without labels of the starting station will be charged for at ordinary parcels rates.

Luggage in bulk will be convoyed, by special arrange-

ment, by passenger train, at owner's risk, at eleventh class goods rates."

(h) Articles which are not the property of a passenger by the same train, and luggage for a station beyond that to which a ticket is held or to an intermediate station except in the case of a break of journey under rule 18 (j)

will be charged as parcels at parcels rates.

No passenger shall convey or endeavour to convey by train as part of his own luggage, either in the luggage van of the train or in the compartment with him, any article not his own property without paying parcels rates therefor.

Passengers are not allowed to pick up or give out en route any package or part of their luggage. All such packages must be paid for at ordinary parcels rates."



Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, May 26, 1934, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated May 22, 1934.

The Minutes of this meeting, as amended, and of the General Meeting of April 7, 1934, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka, and a letter by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, regarding the closing of the meat stalls on Wesak Days. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive attention.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka asked:—(1) "Will the Chairman be pleased to convey to the stall holders that the closure of the meat stalls in the Municipal Market on Wesak Day (May 28) is not contrary to the by-laws and other regulations laid down by the Municipality to regulate the sale of meat and the meat stalls?"

The Chairman replied as follows:—"I regret that I am unable to comply with this request. I consider that such closure would contravene by-law of Chapter VI. of our by-laws".

Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. M. Karunaratne asked:—(1) "Will the Chairman be pleased to state why the work in connection with the construction of the proposed new road through Bope branching off from Richmond Hill road and Humes road has not been undertaken as yet. (2) Is the Chairman aware that the occupants of the houses situated on by the absence of drains as a result of which the rain water in several instances, flows into the verandahs and even to the either side of the Main Trunk road between Kaluwella junction and the Mahamodera bridge are greatly inconvenienced by the absence of drains as a result of which the rain water in several instances, flows into the verandahs and even to the rooms of the said buildings? (3) Is the Chairman in a position to state when the construction of these very necessary drains will be taken up? (4) Has the Medical Officer of Health written or mentioned to the Chairman that the construction of public latrines at the Gintota and Kalegana junctions and at the busy market place at Piyadigama is highly desirable? (5) Is the Chairman aware that owing to the washaways from the adjoining gardens and other preventible causes the public path to Heenpendola, branching off from Humes read, is impassable and practically converted to a drain; (6) If the answer to question No. 5 be in the affirmative, what steps does the Chairman propose to take to abate this

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) I think the member refers to two roads. As regards the one branching off from Richmond Hill road a serious set back has been encountered by the inability to obtain from the Principal of the College a free grant of the small strip of land needed for the widening of the road. Unless lands can be got free I am not prepared to go on with the work of improvement. Ferhaps the member could do something to help in this matter. As regards the one branching off from Humes road investigations are still proceeding with a view to deciding on the best deviation which will have to be made. (2) I have heard that inconvenience is sometimes felt when very heavy rain falls (3) No. The road concerned is in charge of the Public Works Department and I do not anticipate that anything will be done in the near future. (4) Yes. (5) Yes. (6) Reference is requested to the second part of my answer to the first question.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) Whilst thanking the Minister of Communications and Works and His Committee for the small concession granted for certain roads within the Municipality, this Council is further of opinion that the said Committee be pleased to consider our demand. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that this Council thanks the Hon. the Miniter of Communications and Works for the concession conveyed in letter No. C. W. 271/33 of March 21, 1934, from the Clerk to His Executive Committee, but urges that the whole question be reconsidered. As the road to Baddegama is a trunk road it is submitted that the portion of it which falls within the Municipal limits should be maintained by the Public Works Department. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded. The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment which was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

Mr. Thomas Amârasuriya then moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment for consideration. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded. The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment which was put to the meeting and carried.

Final consideration of applications for the post of Superintendent of Works.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item and also items 10 and 11 on the agenda.

Mr. J. E. Perera said that before Council went into Committee there was one point in this connection which he would like to have cleared up. An article had been recently published in a local newspaper to the effect that he and another member of the Council had at a previous meeting of the Council unduly pressed the claims of a candidate for the post of Superintendent of Works. That report, he thought, was quite untrue and he inquired whether the Chairman would be pleased to state whether he had any personal recollection of the matter.

The Chairman replied that beyond the fact that some members had asked him to read out the qualifications of

certain candidates, he had no personal recollection that any member had unduly pressed the claims of any particular candidate, nor did he think that any member had on the occasion referred to said anything beyond making reasonable

inquiries about the qualifications of all the candidates.

Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya said that he was the other member referred to. He entirely associated himself with the remarks made by Mr. J. E. Perera and added that he thought it was a reflection on the whole Council that proceedings of the Council in Committee should be made public.

The Chairman agreed that it was very unfortunate that happenings in Committee should appear in the press.

#### Council in Committee-

Council in Committee interviewed applicant No. 1, Mr. M. S. Gunasekara. Council in Committee recommended that Mr. M. S. Gunasekara be appointed to the post with effect from June 1 1934, the appointment, however, to be considered a pensionable one with effect from July 1, 1934, only. Mr. Gunasekara gave a verbal undertaking to remain in the service of the Council for at least ten years.

7. To consider what steps should be taken to fill the vacant post of Chief Clerk and Accountant.

Council in Committee recommended that Mr. M. A. Marikar, Third Clerk, be appointed to act in the post of Chief Clerk and Accountant with effect from June 1, 1934, till the end of the year and that meanwhile he should qualify himself to keep accounts by double entry from January 1, 1935. His salary till the end of the year to be calculated on the basis that he will receive in addition to his substantive salary half the difference between that substantive salary and Rs. 1,800 per annum which is the initial salary attached to the post of Chief Clerk and Accountant.

Council in Committee recommended, further, that the Chairman be authorized to employ a temporary clerk on a

salary of Rs. 40 per mensem pending the receipt of the report of the Special Committee on the reduction of the Municipal

Staff and the decision of the Council thereon.

8. To consider what steps should be taken to fill the post of Accounting Clerk, Fish Auction Shed, which will become vacant from July 1, 1934.

Council in Committee recommended that consideration be deferred pending the receipt of the report of the Special

Committee on the reduction of the Municipal Staff.

Council in Committee recommended, further, that the services of Mr. Nallawangsa be retained for such longer time as may be considered necessary by the Chairman.

Council resumed and the chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.

Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. Retirement of the Superintendent of Works:—The Chairman moved the grant of a pension of Rs. 3,226.58 in terms of rules 2 and 18A of the Municipal Pension Minute, with effect from July 1, 1934, to Mr. F. B. Toussaint, Superintendent of Works, this amount being subject to amendment depending on the proportionate pension payable to this Officer by Government. Mr. J. E. Ferera seconded.—Carried by 11 votes to 1, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka alone voting against.

10. Retirement of K. A. Sadiris, Market Master:—The Chairman moved the grant of a pension of Rs. 310.65 in terms of rule 2 of the Municipal Pension Minute to K. A. Sadiris, Market Master, with effect from July 1, 1934. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

11. To consider papers relating to improvements to public latrines in the town:—Resolved that for the current year a sum of Rs. 1,000 be voted for improvements to existing public latrines in the town and that the Chairman be authorized to put the work in hand according to the degree of urgency.

12. To submit the report of the Auditor-General for the year ended December 31, 1933:—Resolved that the

report be submitted at the next meeting.

13. To sanction the excess leave of 4 days granted in 1933 to K. A. Sadiris, Market Master, owing to ill-health:— Sanctioned.

14. To sanction the payment to the Inspector of Works of the Superintendent of Work's motor car allowance for the month of May.—Sanctioned.

15. To sanction the payment to Dr. Marker of a sum of Rs. 142 50 for acting for the Medical Officer of Health during the absence on leave of the latter from April 21 to May 13, at the rate of Rs. 7 50 per working day.—Sanctioned. 16. To sanction the purchase from Messrs. Hoare & Co., Colombo, of 396 asbestos sheets at a cost of Rs. 2,127.68 in connection with repairs to the cart shed roof.—Sanctioned.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:-

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 5, 1934.

(2) To consider 9 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed.
(3) To consider what steps should be taken to relieve the congestion of traffic on (a) Templar's road, (b) Main street.—Recommended with regard to (a) that all traffic along Templar's road from its junction with Jail road up to its junction with Abeysundera road be directed one-way, i.e., North-westwards only and that the necessary notice board

be put up at the latter junction.

With regard to (b) that consideration be deferred and that in the meantime the Superintendent of Police be requested to report on the feasibility of directing all traffic one-way along Main street from its junction with Dickson's road up to its junction with Sea street near the bus stand, i.e., North-westwards only.

(4) To consider the question of providing electric lights for all public latrines in the town.—Recommended that consideration be deferred and that in the meantime the Medical Officer of Health be requested to report what latrines

consideration be deferred and that in the meantime the Medical Officer of Health be requested to report what latrines are most used at night and the order of urgency in which lights should be installed therein.

(5) Replacement of poles in the Bazaar area.—Recommended that consideration be deferred pending the results of experiments now being carried out by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department.

(6) To consider the question of providing an underground duplicate cable to the Fort area from the Old Police Station to the New Fort Gate.—Recommended as a safety measure, that an underground duplicate main be installed and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 3,000 be sanctioned for this purpose under "Capital Expenditure" the works to be carried out departmentally.

(7) To consider tenders for building smell proof depôts at (a) Sea street, (b) Havelock road.—Recommended that the tenders of R. W. H. Robert, being the lowest, be accepted, viz., Rs. 395 75 for (a) and Rs. 409 for (b).

(8) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 70 under Head 50—New Carts.—Recommended.

#### Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

18. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of May 22, 1934.

(2) List of demolished buildings in Wards 2, 5, and 6.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(6) To consider the question of amending Regulation No. 31 of the Water Service By-laws in order to validate the free supply of water to Mosques and other places of religious worship.—Recommended that the draft amendment be approved.

(7) To consider the question of "writing off" rates for 1934 on the ground of poverty of the gwners.—Recommended that the rates due for 1934 on the properties mentioned in the annexed lists, amounting to Rs. 321 62 be "written off" on the ground of poverty of the owners.

#### Resolution.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of May 22, 1934.

(2) To consider papers relating to the absence of latrine accommodation in several houses situated in Dangedera.—

Recommended that the matter be considered by the Council at the next meeting.

(3) Application from the Joint Secretaries of the Child Welfare Association for an additional grant from the Council for the purpose of employing a Health Visitor.—Recommended that an additional grant be given which will enable the association to employ a Health Visitor for the town, on condition that the latter do keep a diary which should be absociation to the Visitor of Health at least constant and that for the association are additional grant for the association to employ a Health Visitor for the town, on condition that the latter do keep a diary which should be Recommended, further, that the Council do express a wish that the association should pay more attention to the educational side of Child Welfare work rather than to the administration of relief in individual cases.

Resolution.

With regard to item (2) it was resolved that the matter be considered at the Special Meeting of Council to be held on Saturday, June 9, 1934.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to item (3) was adopted.

20. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of Council and also for a Special Meeting to consider "New Drainage" and the Report of the Special Committee on the working of the Electricity Department.—Agreed that a Special Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, June 9, 1934, at 9.30 a.m. and the monthly General Meeting on Saturday, June 23, 1934, at the same time.

The following documents were laid on the table:—
(1) Statements of receipts and disbursements to end of April, 1934.
(2) Progress report of works done on estimates during April, 1934.
(3) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on carriages plying for hire during April, 1934.
(4) Diaries of (a) the Medical Officer of Health, (b) the Superintendent of Works, (c) the Inspector of Works, and (d) the Manager, Health Department.

- 22. In connection with item 9 of the Minutes Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka at the Special General Meeting of the Council held on Saturday, June 9, 1934, submitted, in terms of By-law 26 of Chapter II., the following dissent from the opinion of the majority of the Council:—
- (1) At the monthly meeting of the Galle Municipal Council held on May 26, 1934, the Chairman moved that a pension be granted to Mr. F. B. Toussaint, Superintendent of Works. I called for a division and cast my vote against the Chairman's motion. The Chairman's motion, however, was carried. I now submit the following dissent in terms of By-law 26 of the Galle Municipal Council:

(2) I am of opinion that the decision to grant a pension to the Superintendent of Works violates the rules set down in the Municipal Pension Minute, and further, sets at nought the interests of the ratepayers.
(3) In 1932 the Council appointed a Retrenchment Committee. This Committee discovered that in 1930 and (3) In 1932 the Council appointed a Retrenchment Committee. This Committee discovered that in 1930 and 1931 the Superintendent of Works had spent 55 cents per square for the tarring and metalling of roads. This sum of 55 cents per square had been spent by the Superintendent of Works in spite of a lower rate, namely, 30 cents per square, which had been previously supplied by the Provincial Engineer. The extra expenditure on this item amounted to about Rs. 33,060, the whole of which was lost to the Councils coffers.

(4) The Retrenchment Committee questioned the Superintendent of Works on this huge loss of money. His sole explanation was that the Municipal roads of Galle have no foundation, and therefore extra expenditure was found recessary.

The Provincial Engineer then made it plain that this explanation was no explanation at all; the rate of 30 cents per square stipulated by him he said, was the figure for the Galle-Akuressa road, which is a road having no foundation. The Superintendent of Works had no answer to give, and driven into a corner as he was, he promised to do the work in future

at the rate of 30 cents per square.

(5) It is significant that the findings of the Retrenchment Committee containing the above facts were signed by the members of the Committee without any dissentient voice. The facts, therefore, are above challenge.

(6) The above facts clearly show that the Superintendent of Works admitted the possibility of doing the work at 30 cents per square. Why then did he not do so, especially when the lower rate supplied by the Provincial Engineer stared him in the face? The Provincial Engineer with his superior knowledge of engineering matters acts in an advisory capacity to the Council, and here is a case in which his considered judgment was cast to the winds by an employee of the Council, resulting in a loss of over Rs. 30,000. Has not the Councils employee been guilty of gross and even wilful negligence?

(7) I am of opinion that such misconduct as the above facts reveal, falls within the terms of section 10 of the Municipal Council Pension Minute, which is as follows:—

"The rates of Pension above set forth will only be granted in cases of faithful and meritorious service. Where

the testimony as to good conduct is in any way defective, a reduction will be made from the pension, and where the misconduct of a Municipal Officer or servent has been of a serious nature, he shall forfeit all claim to Pension.'

(8) I may point out that when my amendment to the effect that the Superintendent of Works should forfeit all claim to pension, fell through, I moved other amendments to the effect that a reduced pension should be granted. I acted thus strictly in conformity with the rules set down in the Municipal Pension Minute, but the rest of the Council refused to see eye to eye with me in my contention.

(9) The pension to Mr. Toussaint would never have been sanctioned if the Council thought it proper to learn a lesson from a similar mistake made in the past. When Mr. Toussaint's predecessor in office retired in 1918 the Council passed the following resolution:—"The retiring Superintendent of Works is guilty of gross neglect of duty which has resulted in a loss to the Council." Even so, the Council awarded him his full pension. The Auditor-General in his report dated April 9, 1918, paragraph 20, comments as follows:—"This officer ought to have been dealt with in terms of section 10 of the Municipal Pension Minute" I may add that this particular officer died recently, having drawn nearly Rs. 38,000 as pension up to the time of his death. as pension up to the time of his death.

# Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, June 9, 1934, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated June 5, 1934.

Present:—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; and Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. In connection with item 9 of the Minutes of the General Meeting of the Council held on May 26, 1934, and the resolution of the Council contained therein, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka submitted, in terms of By-law 26 of Chapter II. a written dissent from the opinion of the majority of the Council. This was tabled, and the Chairman directed the Secretary to make an entry of the same in the Minutes of the Meeting to which the dissent referred.

The Chairman then moved Council into Committee to consider the following items:-

#### Council in Committee.

- 2. Acquisition of land for new roads.—Council in Committee recommended, after discussion, that a supplemental vote of Rs. 5,000 be passed under Head 49 (acquisition of land) in order to meet the cost of acquisition for—
  - (a) the proposed new road through Kanampitiya, and
  - (b) the proposed new approach road through Heenpendola.

Council in Committee recommended, further, that immediate steps be taken to initiate acquisition proceedings with regard to (b).

Schemes for new drainage.—Council in Committee recommended, after discussion, that in connection with new drainage, the following order of priority be observed:—(1) Dangedera road on the eastern side from Sarenthukade junction to Kong Tree road; (2) Wakwella road; (3) Dewatta Market (side drains); (4) Dickson's road; (5) Talapitiya road; (6) Kong Tree road; (7) Halls road up to stand post No. 57; (8) China Garden Cross road No. 1; (9) Circular road; (10) Galle-Matara road from the Kachchiwatta bridge to culvert No. 74/4.

Council in Committee recommended, further, that for the current year the drainage of Nos. 1 to 5 be put in hand at a total approximate cost of Rs. 8,600 the expenditure to be met from the sum of Rs. 10,000 provided in the Budget for "New Drainage."

Absence of latrine accommodation at Dangedera.—An informal discussion took place, and it was eventually decided that the matter be brought up again at a later date.

5. Small tenements in China Garden.—This matter was also informally discussed, and the Chairman was requested to take the necessary steps to remedy the existing state of affairs by enforcing the provisions of the Housing Ordinance and dealing with the area in question block by block.

Consideration of the report of the Special Committee appointed to inquire into the working of the Council's

Electricity Department was deferred for want of time.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Council in Committee set out in items 2 and 3 above be adopted. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded.—Carried.
