KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers in Us vested by Article 7 of the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates, and Mandated Territories) Order in Council, 1927, and Schedule VI. to that Order, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare that on and after the first day of September, 1934, the area defined in the schedule hereto shall be a prohibited area within the meaning of paragraph (1) of Article 31 of the Order.

"THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927."

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Village Committee of Elpitiya.

"Public Stand" means any space within the urban area which is defined and reserved for the parking of omnibuses and lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

2. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing omnibuses and lorries to use a public stand, and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

3. No vehicle other than an omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

4. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in any public place except in a public stand.

5. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of any particular class of omnibus or lorry, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

6. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

7. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

8. The driver of every omnibus or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the omnibus or lorry occupies a public stand.

9. The driver of any omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such omnibus or lorry.

10. Every driver or other person in charge of any omnibus or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

11. All omnibuses and lorries parked in a public stand shall be halted facing the same direction one behind the other and shall be moved up as vacancies occur in front.

12. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any omnibuses or lorries entering or leaving such stand.

Schedule.

(a) Each omnibus or lorry which plies from Elpitiya and occupies a public stand shall pay Re. 1 per month for the use of the stand.

(b) Each omnibus or lorry, except omnibuses and lorries plying from Elpitiya, shall when it uses the stand pay 15 cents for any period over five minutes and less than six hours in duration, and five cents for every additional hour thereafter. These charges may, however, be compounded on payment in advance of Re. 1 per mensem as in (a) above.

4. No person is permitted to send in more than one tender.

5. No tender will be considered unless the person making such tender is present in person at the Vavuniya Kachcheri. Tenders may be sent in by post or delivered at the Vavuniya Kachcheri, but the envelope must be sealed and marked on the left hand top corner with the name and number of the tavern.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, June 13, 1934, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated June 6, 1934.

Present :—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Lieut.-Col. N. W. Napier-Clavering, D.S.O., R.E.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. Aelian W. Pereira; Mr. A. R. A. Razik, J.P.; Dr. S. T. Gunasekera; Mr. W. J. Price; Mr. T. A. Owles; Mr. R. W. E. Ruddock; and Mr. F. A. Bond.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of May 16, 1934, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik presented a petition signed by certain residents of garden No. 50, Dewas lane, Grandpass, praying that the notice served on V. V. Achu ordering him to dismantle the shop at No. 50/5, Dewas lane and to discontinue the business carried on there be withdrawn, and moved that it be placed before the appropriate Committee for consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following questions which the Chairman answered :—

(1) Q.—Is the Chairman aware that in filling up vacancies in the Municipality, notice has to be published in the press or circulated to all departments stating the qualifications required for the post under Standing Order No. 20, sanctioned by this Council? A.—Yes.

(2) Q.—Why was this procedure not followed in the appointment of Mr. Gilbert Caldera, as Secretary? A.—The Council adopted the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees that the acting Secretary be appointed to the substantive post of Secretary. The Council is not bound to follow the procedure laid down in Standing Order No. 20 and there is precedent for its not doing so.

(3) Q.—In view of the Chairman's letter dated May 19, 1933, addressed to me in which it is stated that "I can only repeat that in accordance with by-law 6 of the Pension By-laws, Mr. Caldera's pension will be calculated on the salary attached to his permanent office of Chief Clerk, viz., Rs. 4,260 per annum and not upon the salary attached to his temporary appointment as Acting Secretary in addition". Will the Chairman state what the ultimate pension is? A.—In view of the fact that this officer is still in service it is not possible to say what his ultimate pension may be on his retirement.

(4) Q.—How many gas lights have been constructed in New Bullers road? A.—Eight.

(5) Q.—What has been the cost of same? A.—Inclusive of main, Rs. 4,850.

(6) Q.—Will the Chairman please ascertain what a similar number of electric lights would cost? A.—Under the recent agreement with Government the cost would be under Rs. 25 per lamp, but at the time the laying of a main which would also have been necessary and the provision of 8 electric lamps would probably have cost the same amount as gas.

(7) Q.—Could not the same number of electric lights be erected for Rs. 750? A.—Rs. 200.

(8) Q.—Will the Chairman please state the cost to Council for the improvements to street lamps for the years 1928, 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932, and 1933?

(9) Q.—What would be the cost of fixing Lewisham lanterns in Galle road from Galle Face Hotel to Lauries road junction? A.—I understand from the Electrical Department that the cost would be Rs. 200 per lamp or Rs. 8,400 for the 42 lamps.

(10) Q.—What has been the cost of converting the Bombay lanterns to arc gas lamps between the same points? A.—Approximately Rs. 6,300 in all since 1923.

(11) Q.—Will the feasibility of lighting some of the more important roads in Colombo with electricity be considered? A.—The question of the streets to be lit by electricity under the proposal for converting 1,000 lamps from gas to electricity is under consideration.

(12) Q.—Will the Chairman in conjunction with the Police take steps to introduce a system of controlling traffic by lighting signals? A.—This was considered and the proposal was abandoned on the ground of expense some time ago. The electro-matic system of control is being considered by the Department and the Police now.

(13) Q.—Will the Chairman consider the desirability of laying out (with some seats and booths) the triangular plot of land, which is an eye-sore now, opposite the Dewatagaha Mosque in Alexandra road? A.—The laying out of this plot is already under consideration.

(14) Q.—Will the Chairman take steps to prevent Municipal plots of land such as near the Temple off Hunupitiya road and ground between Norris Canal road and Stafford place from being made use of as Municipal depôts? A.—Municipal depôts are necessary at convenient spots in different wards for efficient and economical maintenance of Municipal services. Sites for these depôts have been selected after due consideration of all circumstances.

Arising out of the Chairman's answer to question (2) above Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following question :—Why was the procedure laid down in by-law No. 31A, of Chapter II., of the Municipal Council by-laws not followed?

The Chairman answered :—There is precedent for not doing so.

The following motion stood in the name of Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando :—That a Special Committee of the Council be appointed to report on—(1) The Cadre of the Council's service. (2) Scales of pay for future entrants and also to report on any anomalies in the 1924 scheme, with instructions to report to Council before its next General Meeting?

With the permission of Council, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando amended the motion to read as follows :—That a Special Committee of the Council be appointed to report on the Scales of Pay for future entrants and also to report on any anomalies in the 1924 scheme, with instructions to report to Council before its August General Meeting. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

Dr. E. A. Coorey suggested that the report of the Committee be submitted to the General Meeting in September, 1934.

The mover and the seconder of the motion agreed to the suggestion of Dr. E. A. Coorey.

Dr. S. Muttiah and Mr. M. L. M. Reyal spoke to the motion.

The motion, as amended, viz. :—That a Special Committee of the Council be appointed to report on the Scales of Pay for future entrants and also to report on any anomalies in the 1924 Scheme, with instructions to report to Council before its General Meeting in September, 1934, was put to the meeting and *carried*.

Resolved that the following Members be appointed to constitute the Special Committee :—(1) The Chairman; (2) Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; (3) Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; (4) Dr. E. A. Coorey; (5) Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; (6) Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; (7) Mr. A. E. Goonesinha.

At this stage Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked for permission, under the provisions of section 10 (i.) of Chapter II. of the Municipal Council by-laws, to move the following motion :—"That the resolution passed by the Council at its General Meeting held on May 16, 1934, relating the appointment of Mr. D. J. G. Caldera to the post of Secretary is contrary to the provisions of Standing Order No. 20, and by-law No. 31A, Chapter II., and that the resolution be not given effect to without further report of the Law Committee and decision of this Council".

The Chairman said that effect had already been given to the resolution passed by the Council and that moreover any motion not to give effect to a resolution must comply with section 10 (e). He suggested that if the mover would amend the motion so as to ask only that legal opinion be obtained, the motion would be admissible. As the mover was unwilling to amend the motion, the Chairman ruled it out of order.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committees and moved that it be not accepted. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

Mr. F. Dadabhoy moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be accepted. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Dr. S. Muttiah, and Mr. M. L. M. Reyal spoke again.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha spoke to the amendment.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

The amendment was thereupon put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

GENERAL.

(8) To consider letter No. XA 2271 of May 4, 1934, from the Government Agent, Western Province, requesting the views of the Excise Advisory Committee of the Colombo Municipal Council area on the application for a foreign liquor wholesale licence in respect of premises No. 129, Bankshall street, Pettah, Colombo, which is situated in a wet area. Registered No. 587.—Recommended.

(9) To consider the application for liquor licence for a Restaurant at Wellawatta. Registered No. 04,043.—Recommended that the application be refused.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. E. A. Coorey explained his attitude regarding this matter and moved that the Chairman and Members of the Colombo Municipal Council having considered the objections already received to the granting of a Restaurant Licence in the Wellawatta Ward to Mr. G. P. Silva, in terms of *Gazette* Notification of April 20, 1934, are of opinion that no further objections are necessary and that the application should be refused. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

The Chairman read a copy of the resolutions forwarded to him through the Ward Member, by the Honorary Secretary of the Executive Committee of the protest meeting of the residents of the District, protesting against the grant of a foreign liquor licence for a Restaurant in the Ward.

Mr. Aelian W. Pereira moved, as an amendment, that the application be allowed. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and lost.

The motion of Dr. E. A. Coorey was then put to the meeting and carried.

BY-LAWS.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch over six months of age kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Nuwara Eliya the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Rs. 3. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the Town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the Collector) particulars required in the annexed form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid Collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness or injury, is, in his opinion, unfit to live; or (2) the Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz. :—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council—

- Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it

to an Officer of the Urban District Council, authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

REGULATIONS.

- All applications for graves shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial of a person for whom the grave is wanted.
- No one except the persons employed or approved by the cemetery-keeper shall dig a grave.
- The cemetery-keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one party come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.
- Should it be necessary for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the cemetery-keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.
- The cemetery-keeper shall maintain order within the cemetery and every one shall obey his commands in that behalf.
- No grave shall be less than five feet in depth, or at a less distance than four feet from another.
- No grave shall be reopened within three years of the burial of any dead body therein, and no vault shall be reopened within six months of any interment therein, except upon the orders from an authority competent to order the disinterment of any corpse.
- No person shall bury a dead body without the permission of the cemetery-keeper, and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due have been paid and a certificate of registration of death produced.
