Regulations for Munnassaram Festival.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled an Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages.

REGULATIONS.

- In these regulations the expression “camp area” shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,
and “Assistant Government Agent” shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.
- No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.
- No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.
- No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.
- (a) No cattle shall be kept in the camp area, and no cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.
(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.
- All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.
- No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.
- In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.
- (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

Boundaries of Munnessaram Festival Camp Area.

North by Palakulam, Kohombagaspitiya, Muttaran-daluwa, and Munnessaramkulam; south by Munnessaramvela and Nallanayagamakulam; east by Munnessaramkulam, main road from Chilaw to Kurunegala and Nallanayagamakulam; west by Munnessaramvela main road from Chilaw to Kurunegala and Palakulam.

Examination for Admission to Class III. of the General Clerical Service, August, 1934.

AN examination for candidates wishing to enter Class III. of the General Clerical Service will be held in Colombo on August 31, 1934. The examination will be competitive and will be confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon.

2. Candidates must have been born on or after August 1, 1911, and not later than July 31, 1917, and must have passed at least (a) the Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation Examination or (b) the Senior School Certificate Examination (English).

3. Forms of application may be obtained from the Education Office, Colombo, from August 1 to 8 inclusive.

4. Applications duly filled in and with stamps of the value of Rs. 5 affixed to each must be forwarded so as to reach the Director of Education not later than 3 P.M. on August 14, 1934.

Candidates are requested to see that the forms are accurately filled in. Those whose applications contain inaccurate information may be disqualified from the competition.

5. Proofs of age need not accompany the applications. They will be called for later, if necessary, and candidates must be prepared to forward them immediately after they are asked to do so.

6. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of $\frac{3}{5}$ the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

(b) Except in cases referred to in paragraph 6 (a) no refund will be made. Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers, provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Education Office before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the perfected entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

7. The examination will consist of (1) *English Composition and Language*, a one and a half hour paper which will include a precis, (2) *General Paper*, a two hour paper in three sections which will contain questions testing general and local knowledge, intelligence and accuracy with figures and (3) a *Vivá Voce* test. In both written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be disqualified.

8. Candidates who attain a satisfactory standard in (1) and (2) above will be summoned to Colombo for the *Vivá Voce* test on a date to be notified later to the candidates concerned.

9. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

10. Appointments will be made, as vacancies occur, on two years' probation in the first instance.



The Chairman agreed to refer the petition to the Markets Committee.

The Chairman read the Council's Lawyer's report dated June 13, 1934, on the subject, and moved the Council into Committee to consider the application.

After the Chairman and members had expressed their views in Committee, the Council resumed and Dr. Attygalle moved—That the file of papers relating to Mr. Garment's appointment be referred to a Counsel in Colombo—Mr. Hayley or Mr. Samarawickrema—for legal opinion on the question whether his conditions of employment imply a claim for passage allowances for himself and family. 
