KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 6 (1) of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation establish from the date hereof a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do further, under section 6 (3), wholly exempt the general cemetery so established from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17 and 24 of the Ordinance.

SCHEDULE A.

An allotment of land called Angommanapatana *alias* Raxawa estate (lot 1 in preliminary plan No. 9,161, part of T. (1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, a reinforced concrete headwall; a mass concrete retaining wall on the oya side and a steel flume 13 feet long up to the estimated cost of Rs. 750 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to clear jungle and to complete earthworks in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent, and for this purpose each of the proprietors agrees—

(a) to complete $\frac{1}{4}$ cube of earthwork, in respect of each acre owned by him under the aforesaid irrigation work;

(b) to contribute the necessary labour in person, free of all charges; or in commutation of such labour, to contribute money, on or before June 30 of the year in which such labour is due at the rate of Rs. 2 for each cube of earthwork, for the clearing or the completion of which he is liable; and

(c) to complete all earthworks within 2 months.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situate within the administrative limits of the Council, or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council.

2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased;
- (2) the name and address of the mortgagor; and
- (3) a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.

3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at Re. 1, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.

4. In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses have been so registered a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE PRINCE OF WALES TAILORING ESTABLISHMENT, LIMITED.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. IN the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context:—

The word "Company" means "The Prince of Wales Tailoring Establishment, Limited," incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

"Ordinance" means and includes "Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

"These Presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company.

"Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

"Shareholder" means a shareholder of the Company.

"Presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by attorney.

"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled at a Board.

"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration as well as individuals.

"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

"Month" means a calendar month.

"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and *vice versa*.

Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and *vice versa*.

"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy (in cases where by these presents proxies are allowed) at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

BUSINESS.

2. The business of the Company shall include the several objects expressed in the Memorandum of Association and all matters incidental thereto.

3. The business shall be carried on by or under the management of the Directors subject only to such control of General Meetings as is provided in these presents.

CAPITAL.

4. The nominal capital of the Company is Rupees Fifty thousand (50,000) divided into Five thousand shares of Rs. 10 each.

5. The Directors may with the sanction of the Company previously given in General Meeting increase its capital by the issue of new shares, which shall be considered as part of the original capital and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects whether with reference to the payment of calls or forfeiture of shares on non-payment of calls or otherwise, as if it had been part of the original capital.

6. The Directors may with like sanction and in like manner reduce the capital.

7. The shares shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors and the terms shall be decided by them.

8. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

9. The Company may from time to time make such calls upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, as they think fit, and not by the terms of allotment made payable at fixed times, provided that one month's notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders, of the time and place appointed for payment of each call.

10. If any Shareholder fails to pay the amount of any calls due by him on or before the day appointed, he shall be liable to pay interest for same at the rate of 9 per centum per annum from the day appointed for payment to the time of actual payment.

11. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution authorizing such call was passed.

12. The Directors may, if they think fit, receive from any of the Shareholders willing to advance the same all or any part of the moneys due upon their respective shares beyond the sums actually called for.

13. Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons not in partnership.

14. Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate under the common seal of the Company specifying the number of shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

15. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death, bankruptcy or insolvency of any Shareholder or in any way other than by transfer may be registered as a Shareholder upon such evidence being produced as from time to time be required by the Company.

FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

16. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call due on the appointed day, the Company may at any time thereafter during such time as the call remains unpaid, serve a notice on him requiring him to pay such call together with any interest that may have accrued by reason of such non-payment.

17. The notice shall name a further day and a place at which calls of the Company are usually made payable on and at which such calls are to be paid. It shall also state that in the event of non-payment at the time and place appointed the share in respect of which such call was made will be liable to be forfeited.

18. If the requisitions of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with any share in respect of which such call was made and notice has been given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Directors to that effect.

19. Any Shareholder whose share has been forfeited shall, notwithstanding be liable to pay to the Company all calls owing upon such shares at the time of forfeiture.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

20. The first General Meeting shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company and at such place as the Directors may determine.

21. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Directors.

22. The General Meetings above mentioned shall be called ordinary meetings, all other meetings shall be called extraordinary meetings.

23. The Directors may whenever they think fit, and they shall upon a requisition made in writing by any number of Shareholders in the aggregate five-eighth parts of the shares of the Company, convene an extraordinary General Meeting.

24. Any requisition so made by the Shareholders shall express the object of the meeting and shall be left at the registered office of the Company.

25. Upon receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene a General Meeting; on failure to do so within 14 days the requisitionists or any other Shareholders holding the required number of shares may themselves convene a meeting.

26. Seven days' notice, at the least, specifying the date and place and hour of meeting and the purpose of the meeting shall be given by advertisement in such manner as may be prescribed by the Directors.

27. Any Shareholder may on giving not less than fifteen days' notice of any resolution submit the same to a meeting.

28. No business except the declaration of a dividend shall be transacted unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business. Five Shareholders entitled to vote shall form a quorum.

29. The first business to be discussed at a meeting at which the chair is vacant shall be the election of a Chairman.

30. The Chairman may with the consent of the meeting adjourn any meeting from time to time, but no business other than that which is left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place shall be discussed at the adjourned meeting unless due notice thereof had been given.

31. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting whether ordinary or extraordinary shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting or by the Chairman of the subsequent meeting and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTES OF SHAREHOLDERS.

32. Every Shareholder shall have one vote for every five shares up to ten shares, he shall have an additional vote for every ten shares up to hundred shares, and a further additional vote for every twenty-five shares above hundred.

33. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote unless all dues upon the share held by him have been paid at the time of the meeting.

34. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy.

35. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder.

DIRECTORS.

36. No one shall be eligible to be appointed a Director unless he holds at least ten shares in his own right.

37. The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than five.

38. The first Directors shall be Hikkaduwegamage Hinni Appuhamy, Ganegedera Ratnayakemudiyanselage Tikiri Banda Ratnayake, Tikiri Banda Sakalasureiya Godanunne, Don Philip Epa and Telge Bertram Pieris.

39. One or more of the Directors shall be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary or Managing Director or Directors for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

40. The Managing Director shall not while he continues to hold that office be subject to retirement by rotation.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

41. The Directors shall have the power to acquire and take over as a going concern the business now carried on in Kandy by Hikkaduwegamage Hinni Appuhamy under the name, style and firm of "THE PRINCE OF WALES TAILORING ESTABLISHMENT" and all or any of the assets and liabilities of the said Hikkaduwegamage Hinni Appuhamy in connection therewith.

42. The Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses as well preliminary as otherwise paid or incurred in and about the formation of the Company and the registration thereof and in or about the working and business of the Company.

43. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director.

44. 46. Any question that may arise at any meeting shall be decided by a majority vote; in case of equality the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

47. The Board may elect a Chairman and determine his term of office and all meetings shall be presided over by the Chairman.

48. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book to be provided for that purpose—

- (a) Of all appointments ;
- (b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of Directors ;
- (c) Of all orders made by the Directors
- (d) Of all resolutions at proceedings; of all general meetings of the Company ; and
- (e) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of Directors.

49. All such minutes shall be signed either by the Chairman then presiding or by him who presides at the subsequent meeting.

ACCOUNTS.

50. Once at least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure for the preceding year.

51. A balance sheet shall be made out in every year and laid before the General Meeting of the Company and such balance sheet shall contain a summary of the income and the liability of the Company.

52. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the account of the Company and as regards the amount which the Directors recommend should be paid out of the profits by way of dividend to the Shareholders.

AUDIT.

53. The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined and the correctness of the statements shall be from time to time ascertained by the Auditor.

54. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor and determine his remuneration. He shall hold office till the first General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the ordinary General Meeting of the Company each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and he shall hold office for one year or for such longer period as may be ordered by the General Meeting.

55. If, however, any vacancy occurs in the office of the Auditors, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person in the office of Auditor until the next ordinary General Meeting after his appointment.

56. Every Auditor shall have a balance sheet supplied to him, and he shall examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto.

57. Every Auditor shall have a list supplied to him of all books kept by the Company and he shall at all reasonable times have access to them and accounts of the Company.

58. The Auditor shall make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts ; in every such report he shall state whether the balance sheet is a full and fair one and whether it exhibits the true state of the Company's accounts and affairs.

59. If and whenever the Auditor discovers or apprehends any error or irregularity, whether wilful or accidental, in any of the accounts or books of account of the Company it shall be their duty at once to make and deliver to the Board of Directors a report in writing thereon.

60. Every balance sheet or statement of accounts when audited shall after adoption by a General Meeting be conclusive.

DIVIDEND, BONUS AND RESERVE FUND.

61. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting from time to time declare a dividend or bonus or both a dividend and bonus to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares.

62. No dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of the profits arising from the business.

63. The Directors may before declaring a dividend or bonus set apart such a proportion out of the profits as they think fit as a reserve or guarantee fund.

64. Such reserve fund shall be used by the Directors in such a manner as they shall think proper, provided that such use is conducive to the interest of the Company.

65. No dividend exceeding ten per centum shall be paid until such reserve fund shall amount to one-fifth of the other paid up capital.

66. The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to the Shareholders all sums of money due to the Company from the Shareholders on any account.

67. Notice of all interest, dividend or bonus payable shall be given to every Shareholder entitled thereto, and if such is not claimed within three years after such notice it may be forfeited by the Board for the benefit of the Company.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLVING THE COMPANY.

68. If at any time the Directors find that the losses of the Company have exhausted the reserve fund and also twenty-five per cent. of the paid up capital, they shall forthwith call an extraordinary meeting and submit a full statement of the affairs of the Company.

69. If the Company Directors recommend a dissolution of the Company or that it shall discontinue its business and wind up its affairs either in contemplation of or in connection with, or in order to effect a transfer of its business, property and liabilities to any other Company and the continued prosecution of its business by such other Company or without reference to or independently of any such objects, and the Company shall by special resolution adopt such recommendation, or if all the members shall in writing under their hands agree thereto, thereupon the affairs of the Company shall be wound up by the Directors as the liquidators of the Company and they shall continue in office for that purpose anything hereinbefore contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

70. Any Shareholder may, either alone or jointly with any other whether a Shareholder or not, become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of the winding up or dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

ARBITRATION.

71. Every matters which in accordance with these presents and every difference between the Company on the one hand and any of the Shareholders on the other hand or between any of the Shareholders in any matter relating to the subject matters of these presents or any claim or demand arising out of or relating to the same shall be referred to and determined by arbitration under the provisions of the "Civil Procedure Code", 1889, in that behalf contained or under the provisions of any other Ordinance for the time being in force relating to arbitrations and awards.

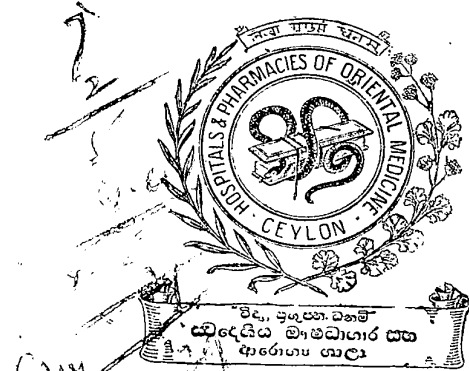
