5. The purchaser of the right shall keep the depot sites and buildings in a tidy and sanitary condition and hand them back to the Department at the termination of his agreement in the same condition as that in which he takes them over.

6. The following acts will be deemed an infringement of the terms and conditions of the agreement and any such

acts will render this contract liable to cancellation or a fine under clause 12 of this notice or both, viz. :—

- (i.) Failure to maintain adequate stocks of suitable material in the depots available for purchase by the public.
- (ii.) Retailing firewood to the public within depot premises at rates in excess of those quoted in condition 4 above.

9. The successful tenderer shall pay the amount so tendered to the Divisional Forest Officer, Up-country Division, Nuwara Eliya, in a lump sum within one week of receiving notice of the acceptance of tender. This amount shall be credited to revenue.

10. The successful tenderer will be required to execute an agreement with the Divisional Forest Officer, Up-country Division, Nuwara Eliya, and all tenderers should read and initial a copy of the agreement at the Office of the said Divisional Forest Officer before or at the time of obtaining tender forms.

11. The successful tenderer shall deposit Rs. 200 as security for the due fulfilment of the service.

12. The Divisional Forest Officer, Up-country Division, Nuwara Eliya, shall have the power to impose a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any breach of the conditions.

13. In the event of the service not being carried out to the satisfaction of the Divisional Forest Officer the successful tenderer will be liable to have his security forfeited and his agreement cancelled without compensation.

10. Every tenderer shall before tendering inspect a copy of the draft agreement at the Office of the Conservator of Forests or any Divisional Forest Office. Every tenderer shall sign and deliver to the Officer issuing the tender form before such is issued a statement to the effect that he has read the contents of the draft agreement and that he undertakes to sign such an agreement in the event of his tender being accepted.

11. Should the successful tenderer decline or fail to enter into the agreement within 10 days of receiving notice in writing from the Conservator of Forests or his duly authorized representative to the effect that his tender has been accepted, the deposit already made on account of tender form shall be forfeited and the right to collect the produce concerned shall be resold at the risk of the original purchaser who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such resale; on the other hand he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by such resale.

12. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, resold or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.

13. Should the purchaser or his employees cause any damage to trees in the forest or commit any forest offence the purchaser shall be held liable to pay compensation for all such damage or loss, and on his failure to pay any compensation demanded, he shall be liable to prosecution.

14. The collection of Avarampattai or Ranawara bark and Kandalpattai or Kadol bark (Mangrove) should cease on August 31, 1935, to admit of the bark collected being transported to the central store before September 30, 1935.

15. The Government reserves to itself the right without question of ejecting the purchaser's employees from the areas specified in clause 1 above and of rescinding the agreement if the above conditions are not adhered to.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on June 16, 1934, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

Dr. Attygalle pointed out that the drains in Cemetery road were in an insanitary condition and required attention. The Chairman undertook to look into both matters.
