KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers in Us vested by section 6 (1) of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation establish from the date hereof a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do further, under section 6 (3), wholly exempt the general cemetery so established from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the Ordinance.

“THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE,
No. 11 of 1920.”

BY-LAWS made by the Weligama Urban District Council under sections 164 and 168 (2) (a) of “The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920,” and approved by the Local Government Board and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section 164 and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Urban District Council without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. Subject to the provisions of by-law 1 and the following by-laws, every officer of the Urban District Council on the fixed establishment drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards who shall have had service of ten years or more including any service which may be reckoned under the proviso to by-law 7 may be awarded a pension as follows:—

a. For the first one hundred and twenty months of such service a pension equal to 120/720ths of his annual salary and for each additional completed month of service an additional 1/720th of such salary, but no officer shall be entitled to draw more than 480/720ths of his final salary as pension.

3. The above-mentioned rates shall only be granted in cases of faithful and meritorious service, but when the testimony as to fidelity, diligence, and merit is in any respect defective, a deduction from such rates may be made. Where there has been obvious negligence, irregularity, or misconduct, the grant of a pension may be altogether withheld.

Where service of peculiar and extraordinary merit has been rendered by an officer distinctly outside the duties in respect of which his salary is paid, a special rate of pension may be recommended for sanction, but in ordinary cases the maximum pension or retiring allowance grantable to an officer under these by-laws, or to an officer entitled to pension also in respect of service not under the Council from all services combined, shall not exceed two-thirds of the highest salary drawn by such officer at any time in the course of his service.

4. In the case of officers on the fixed establishment of the Council drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards retiring on account of illness or age before completing one hundred and twenty months' gross service a gratuity may be granted calculated at the rate of one-twelfth of a month's pay of the permanent office or offices held at the time of retirement, for each completed month of service.

5. Officers of the Urban District Council shall have no absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or long service allowance under these by-laws, and the Urban District Council retains power and authority to dismiss any such officer without any compensation.

6. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Urban District Council who shall be under fifty-five years of age, except upon a certificate from the Chairman and two medical practitioners that he is incapable from infirmity of mind or body of discharging the duties of his office, nor unless he shall have discharged such duties theretofore with diligence and fidelity to the satisfaction of the Council.

7. The claim of an officer of the Urban District Council to pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be considered to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the fixed establishment of the Council after January 1, 1933, or its predecessor the Sanitary Board, Matara District.

Provided that an officer transferred from the provisional and temporary establishment to the fixed establishment may be allowed to count his provisional and temporary service when it has been continuous with his subsequent permanent service.

Service under sixteen years of age however will not count for pension.

8. The service in respect of which pensions, gratuities, or long service allowances are granted under these by-laws must in all cases be continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or other temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation of the officer.

9. The pension or gratuity shall be computed upon the salary of the permanent office held by the officer of the Council at the time of his retirement provided he shall have held such appointment for at least three years: otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of salaries attached to the permanent office held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension.

10. In case of abolition of office, if the officer has completed 120 months' gross service, he may be granted a pension of 1/720th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension with an addition to such service of one month for each completed period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 60 months.

If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of 1/12th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension, plus an addition of 50 per cent. thereon. In no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty.

11. If any person being in receipt of any pension or long service allowance from the Urban District Council shall be convicted of any offence in any Court of Justice in the Island for which he shall be sentenced to death or to any terms of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding six months such pension or long service allowance shall forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction, receive free pardon or unless the Council shall otherwise order.

12. Officers on the fixed establishment of the Urban District Council may be required to retire on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect, but they may continue in office till sixty years of age with the consent of the Council.

13. (1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the aggregate* amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided, however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under the Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from the Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the Council.

* The term “aggregate” salary is to be interpreted as the amount of the aggregate salary of the substantive post held by an officer in the course of his career, disregarding extra emoluments such as duty allowances, and regarding leave on half pay or without pay as leave on full salary.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the expression "public service" includes employment under the Crown or any Local Government public body or bodies.

14. Should an officer who retires on pension find after such retirement an employment under the Council or under the Government or under another semi-official body on a salary equal to or higher than that which he drew from the Council at the time of his retirement, his pension shall be suspended so long as such employment continues. If he draws a less salary he shall be entitled to only so much of his pension as when added to the salary of the new appointment will make his total emoluments equal to the salary last drawn by him previous to his retirement.

15. Employees on the fixed establishment of the Urban District Council drawing salaries of less than Rs. 360 per annum and retiring on account of age or infirmity after serving continuously for a period of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Council be satisfied that they are unfit, owing to age or infirmity of body or mind, further to discharge efficiently the duties of their offices, be granted such long service allowances not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem in each case as the Council may award. Persons in receipt of daily pay, who have completed a period of fifteen years of continuous service, retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

16. If any case not covered by these by-laws shall arise which in the opinion of the Council merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, the circumstances of such case should be reported together with the recommendation of the Council to the Commissioner of Local Government for transmission to the General Treasury (Establishments Division) for submission to the Governor, who will decide whether any and, if so, what award shall be granted.

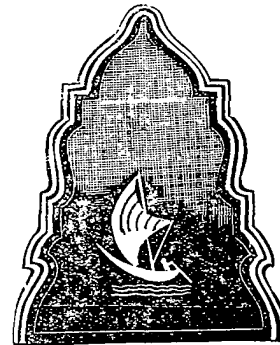

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 25, 1934, pursuant to notice dated August 21, 1934.**

Present:—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; and Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The minutes of the meeting held on July 26, 1934, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Four petitions and a letter were presented by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka, one petition and a letter by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, and one petition by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to hold an inquiry into the complaints made to the Member for Ward No. 2 by certain consumers of meat that stall-holders of the meat market refused to sell them meat and mutton at rates fixed by the Council? (2) Will the Chairman be pleased to table all papers relating to his inquiry into the death of Girigoris by electrocution? (3) Will the Chairman be pleased to procure for the information of this Council the report made by Mr. P. C. Fernando of the Government Electrical Department in connection with the electrocution of Girigoris? (4) Will the Chairman be pleased to table all quarterly and annual reports made by the Government Electrical Department since its inception?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) I am quite prepared to arrange an inquiry by the Secretary or myself into any complaints made to me. The Secretary of a body calling itself the Galle Electoral Association wrote and made a general statement that the fixed prices were not being adhered to, and the butchers were written to and informed that serious notice would be taken if this fact is satisfactorily proved by any member of the public. No specific complaint has yet reached me. (2) The member will see from the agenda that the proceedings at the inquest and at my inquiry are being tabled at to-day's meeting. (3) Mr. Fernando made no report, but his statement to me will be found in my notes of inquiry. (4) Yes. The reports are being tabled to-day. I ordered this to be done after receiving notice of this question.

Arising out of the replies to questions (2), (3), and (4) Mr. E. M. Karunaratna suggested that all the papers in this connection should be treated as confidential. The Chairman agreed, and stated that he wished it to be clearly understood that the papers were tabled confidentially for the information of the members alone.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya asked the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to state whether an inquiry has been held by the Manager, Electrical Undertakings, in connection with the recent electrocution tragedy? (2) Has the Manager of Electrical Undertakings submitted a report of his inquiry to the Chairman? If so, will the Chairman be pleased to circulate the report for the information of the members of this Council? The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) No. (2) The member is referred to my answer to the 3rd question of Mr. Dahanayaka.

5. The following motions stood in the name of the Chairman:—(1) That for the purpose of providing conservancy service within the Police area a rate of 4½ per cent. be levied with effect from January 1, 1935, on the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the said area, in lieu of the present system of charging fees.

(2) To make and assess for the calendar year 1935, a rate of 22 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Police limits, and a rate of 7 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever outside the Police but within the Municipal limits of Galle, as required by section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, payable by four

instalments on or before the following dates:—First instalment on or before March 31, 1935; second instalment on or before June 30, 1935; third instalment on or before September 30, 1935; fourth instalment on or before December 31, 1935.

(3) To adopt the valuation of properties for the current year subject to such alterations as the Chairman may, from time to time, find necessary to make for the purpose of rating for the calendar year 1935.

After a few remarks on the subject, the Chairman moved the first motion standing in his name. Mr. A. C. Mohammed formally seconded.

Messrs. Thomas Amarasureiya, J. E. Perera, F. Magdon Ismail, E. M. Karunaratna, S. H. Dahanayaka, and A. C. Mohammedo spoke against the motion. The points made by them were:—(a) that the total rate of 22 per cent. which would have to be levied if the motion was passed, was too high when compared with the present rates levied in Colombo and Kandy. (b) that a total rate of 20 per cent. would be reasonable if ways and means could be devised to permit of such a rate being levied without a crippling loss to the Council. (c) that the present was not an opportune time to introduce such a serious increase of rates, and (d) that the matter should be postponed until such time as an increase of rates to 20 per cent. coupled with the cancellation of conservancy fees would be practical politics.

Mr. A. M. Saheed supported the principle enunciated and said that he was looking at the matter from the point of view of sanitation alone. He was of opinion that the substitution of an increased rate for conservancy fees should be put through at once, even if a 20 per cent. rate would be a loss to the Council, and suggested that a loan be raised if necessary, which he could not support a rate greater than 20 per cent.

The Chairman in reply stated that the chief object of the motion was to improve the sanitary conditions of the town, and he noted with gratification that the idea put forward by him had been so favourably considered. He was also of the opportunity afforded them of discussing the whole matter, and he fully appreciated the views expressed by the members. However, a rate of 20 per cent. to include conservancy was quite out of the question at the present time. He thought the Council could ill afford to lose such a large sum as Rs. 15,000. Therefore, the motion must either be passed as it stood, or defeated. He regretted that he had found it necessary to suggest such a large increase, but under existing conditions there was no alternative. The present assessments of the town were very low when compared with assessments in Colombo and Kandy, and perhaps within the next year or two, when the Council decided to have a reassessment of all the properties in the town, it might be possible to attain the object in view by levying a conservancy rate of 2½ per cent. only. In these circumstances, and as he had now obtained the feeling of the house on the matter, he asked the permission of Council to withdraw the motion. Permission having been granted, the motion was accordingly

Mundrawn.

1. The Chairman then moved that the second motion standing in his name be amended by substituting "17½ per cent." for "22 per cent." This was agreed to, and the motion, as amended, was put to the meeting and carried.

The third motion was also put to the meeting and carried.

6. The Chairman moved:—(1) That Chapter IV. of the by-laws dated January 21, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 5,901 of January 23, 1903, be amended by the addition thereto of the following new by-law immediately after the existing by-law No. 8:—"No tenements or small shops of the class commonly known as boutiques shall be erected or re-erected nor shall any existing building be converted into tenements or small shops without the permission of the Chairman, and no such permission shall be granted by the Chairman if the site selected for such tenements or small shops is, in the opinion of the Committee for Finance and Assessment, in close proximity to residential property, or is in a prominent position, or is likely in any other way to mar the amenities of the area.

(2) That Chapter X. of the by-laws dated January 21, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 5,901 of January 23, 1903, as amended by by-law published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,425 of February 17, 1911, be further amended by the addition thereto of the following new by-law immediately after the existing by-law No. 32:—"No workshop, stable, gala, or cattle-pen, at which more than five horses or bulls or more than five goats and sheep are kept, shall be established, added to, or extended without the permission of the Chairman, and no such permission shall be granted by the Chairman if the site for such workshop, gala, stable, or cattle-pen is, in the opinion of the Committee for Finance and Assessment, in close proximity to residential property, or is in any other way likely to mar the amenities of the area.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka suggested that the words "Four Standing Committees" be substituted for the words "Committee for Finance and Assessment" in both motions. This was agreed to, and the motions, as amended, were then put to the meeting and carried.

7. The Chairman next moved the adoption of certain by-laws to be added to Chapter XVI. of the existing by-laws in lieu of the regulations made under sections 4 and 5 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,991 of July 7, 1933, which regulations were adopted by the Council on September 16, 1933. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

8. To submit, in terms of section 16 (ii.) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules a list of Municipal Officers and servants who are more than 60 years of age:—

Resolved that the services of Mr. O. L. Jansz, Cemetery-keeper, and D. J. Devasurendra, Town Clock-keeper, be discontinued at the end of the current year on the ground of age, but that the services of C. Wijewardena, Overseer, Bataduwa Night Soil Depôt, be retained for a further period of one year.

9. To consider tenders received for the following Low Tension Extensions:—(a) Along the Galle-Matara road from Circular road junction to the Railway Crossing on the Akuressa road; (b) Along Hirimbura road from Sarenthukade junction up to its intersection with Steele road; and (c) Along Steele road.

Resolved that a sum of Rs. 6,900 be expended on these three items, and that the tender of Walker and Greig, Ltd., being the lowest, be accepted.

10. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 200 under Head 64 (Markets Contingencies):—Sanctioned.

11. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 350 under Head 18 (Sanitation—Milk Analysis):—Sanctioned.

12. To consider the question of the issue of Holiday warrants (Railway) to new entrants to the Municipal service:—Resolved that consideration be deferred.

13. To sanction the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 30.02 being overtime paid to the late Mr. F. de S. Abeyratna, Mr. M. A. Marikar, and Peon, W. T. Peter, in connection with the preparation of accounts for November, 1933.—Sanctioned.

14. To consider the question of providing electric lights on the lane leading to the Seabeach latrine:—Resolved that the work be put in hand and that the cost amounting to Rs. 55 be met from anticipated savings under one or other of the Electricity Department Votes 27 to 32.

15. To consider the question of acquiring a small portion of land at the Circular road end of the new road to Kachchiwatta for the purpose of widening the said road:—Resolved that steps be taken to acquire the portion of land in question at an approximate cost of Rs. 325.

16. To consider tenders for the Fish Auction Shed for 1935:—The Chairman informed the meeting that only two tenders had been received and that both tenderers had tendered on the understanding that they would not be called upon to comply with conditions 7 (g), 8, and 10, of the rules and conditions of tender, and also on the understanding that they would be allowed the lease of four stalls in the Fish Market.

Resolved (1) that the closing date for tenders be extended for a further period of two weeks, (2) that condition 8 be strictly enforced, but as regards conditions 9 (g) and 10 that these be amended so as to give the successful tenderer the concession of making the deposits monthly and liquidating the balance amount due by such monthly deposits in not more than 8 months, and (3) that the two tenderers be informed accordingly.

17. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on Saturday, September 15, 1934, at 9.30 A.M.

18. To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed to inquire into the working of the Council's Electricity Department: The Report was considered by the Council in Committee, and further consideration was deferred.
