THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,  
No. 13 of 1896.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages" and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Illmaha Kachehi Festival commencing in November, 1934.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Illmaha Kachehi Festival, 1934, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to three days, namely, November 20 to 22, 1934, inclusive.

(b) Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. The camp shall be under the general control of the Government Agent, Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by a Medical Officer and by a Police Officer.

3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Supervising Officer to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads by which they have to travel.

4. The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking and for natural offices;
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying any lawful order given for any of these purposes by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

5. For the purpose of these rules camp shall mean—

- (a) the area within half a mile of the Maha Dewala at Kataragama in every direction.
- (b) the area within a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama in every direction.

6. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in the camp, by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person bringing any cattle or cart-bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The issue of such permits shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation, maintaining the health of the camp, and regulating traffic.

9. (1) (a) Any person exposing commodities of any description for sale in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

(b) Any person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) (a) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Supervising Officer.

(b) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(c) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or refuse shall be thrown on the ground, but shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(d) Every building, structure, or premises used as a place of trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  cubic feet in capacity in which shall be stored all the garbage and waste matter of the said premises; and except when garbage or waste matter is being deposited or taken from the said bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

10. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or shall fail to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease and not reporting the same to the Supervising Officer or to the Medical Officer or the chief officer of Police, and any person aiding or abetting in the concealment of such disease shall be guilty of an offence.

12. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Supervising Officer or the chief officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person who, without the previous sanction of the Supervising Officer, constructs any booth or extends any building so as to encroach on the main streets of the camp shall be guilty of an offence.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

1. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the Urban area or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in the form supplied by the Council for that purpose and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such form is addressed.

2. (1) If any person, after having filled up and returned such return acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such return, he shall within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

(2) Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish information as required by the foregoing paragraph of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance every person who has furnished the return referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of every vehicle or animal entered in such return, to pay the tax for the year for which such return is furnished and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on every vehicle or animal referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicle or animal was acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Any person who has furnished the return required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2 may by written notice given to the Chairman claim to be exempted from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such return or notice.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all



vehicles, other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used within the administrative limits of the Panadura Urban District Council.

6. The annual tax aforesaid shall be paid by the persons liable to pay the same at the Office of the Panadura Urban District Council whether the same shall have been demanded or not; and any person failing or neglecting to pay such tax after it shall have become due from him shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued. Provided that when any plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate; and provided further that the Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by him of 50 cents.

8. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the administrative limits of the Panadura Urban District Council the owner or person in charge of that vehicle shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

The by-laws relating to the market area published by Notification in the *Gazette* of June 9, 1933, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) in by-law 2, by the deletion of the word “fruits,” from line 3 thereof;
- (2) by the repeal of by-laws 3 and 4 and the substitution of the following new by-laws therefor:—

“3. Within the market area no person shall sell fruits at any premises other than the public market unless the sale of fruits therein is authorized by an annual licence under the hand of the Chairman: Provided however that this by-law shall not apply—

- (1) to the sale of any fruit by an itinerant vendor as defined in section 163 (5) of the Ordinance; or
- (2) to the sale, by the licensee of an eating-house or tea or coffee boutique situated within the market area, of any fruits for consumption on the premises; or
- (3) to the sale of young coconuts by any person at any place within the market area.

“4. The fee for every licence or renewal of a licence for the sale of fruits at authorized premises shall be Rs. 10 per annum, payable at the time of the issue or renewal of the licence.”

BY-LAWS.

1. No animal shall be slaughtered in any slaughter-house within the administrative limits of this Council unless 48 hours' notice of the proposed slaughter shall have been given, and until such animal has been approved as fit for slaughter in writing by the Medical Officer of Health, Anuradhapura, or any other officer appointed for the purpose by this Council.

2. Any animal rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.

3. If after the slaughter of any animal which has been approved as aforesaid, the carcass shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the said Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council, shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human food.

4. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the directions of the said Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council, any meat which has been declared to be unfit for human food.

5. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of other animals, or until the carcass of any animal previously slaughtered shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleansed.

6. The following fees shall be paid in advance to the Council for the use of any slaughter-house established by the Council:—

	Rs. c.
For cattle ..	0 50 each
For sheep, goats, or pigs ..	0 25 each

These rates shall cover exposure in the proper place for 24 hours. An additional fee at one half the above rates shall be paid for each further period of 24 hours' exposure or any part thereof.

7. No licensee of a butcher's stall shall transport or permit any person to transport any meat from a slaughter-house except in a covered zinc-lined cart.

8. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

## REPEAL.

The by-laws of the Local Board of Anuradhapura, relating to the slaughtering of cattle, published by Notification in *Gazette* No. 5,824 of December 20, 1901, and deemed to be in force within this area by virtue of the provisions of section 247 of the Local Government Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

“Mr. G. E. de Silva stated that his vote had been cast for the Noes in item II.

The Chairman stated that he would in that case have given his casting vote for the Ayes. The motion, therefore, remains carried. The Council accepted this position”.

(2) whether the rate for conservancy could be restricted to premises that are actually conserved and others exempted.

7. To elect a member to serve on the Standing Committee on "Markets and Sanitation" in place of Dr. L. C. Wijesinha, resigned.

Dr. de Kretser was duly elected.

8. To elect a member to serve on the Special Committee on reconstruction of Public Market, in place of Dr. L. C. Wijesinha, resigned.

Dr. de Kretser was duly elected.

9. Letter from the Director of Public Works dated September 11, 1934, submitting proposals for laying an independent main to the Kandy Hospital for water supply purposes.

Resolved that the proposal be approved subject to the supply being metered.

10. To consider further arrangements in connection with the visit of H. R. H. the Duke of Gloucester.

Resolved—(1) That the sum of Rs. 500 voted for feeding the poor be paid to the unofficial committee and the committee be requested to expend half the sum in treating school children in consultation with the Divisional Inspector of Schools, (2) That the sum of Rs. 300 voted for the address be expended on the arrangements connected with the reception at the Esplanade, and (3) That a further sum of Rs. 500 be voted for illuminations.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, September 15, 1934, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated September 11, 1934.

*Present* :—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; and Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on Saturday, August 25, 1934, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Three petitions were presented by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka and one by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo. These were tabled, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following questions :—(1) (a) How many cases of Phthisis, Continued Fever, Pneumonia, and other lung diseases have been registered within the Municipal limits for the years 1931, 1932, and 1933? (b) How many deaths have been registered from the said diseases during the said period? (2) In what wards are the above diseases mostly prevalent? (3) (a) What are the infant and maternal mortality rates per 1,000 in the town? (b) What are the causes for such a high mortality? (4) (a) How many cases of births have been attended to by the two Municipal midwives for the years 1933 and 1934? (b) Is the Medical Officer of Health satisfied with the number of cases conducted by the midwives? (c) What is the cause for their services not being appreciated to a greater extent? (d) Are two midwives sufficient for a town of 38,000 inhabitants?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) (a) *Phthisis*.—62 in 1931, 76 in 1932, and 84 in 1933; *Continued Fever*.—68 in 1931, 51 in 1932, and 37 in 1933; figures of the number of cases for Pneumonia and other lung diseases cannot be given as these diseases are not notifiable and are not reported to the Medical Officer of Health; (b) *Phthisis*.—44 in 1931, 42 in 1932, and 61 in 1933; *Continued Fever*.—10 in 1931, 8 in 1932, and 6 in 1933; *Pneumonia and other lung diseases*.—113 in 1931, 108 in 1932, and 123 in 1933.

(2) *Phthisis*.—Wards 5, 7, 3, and 4 in the order named; *Continued Fever*.—Wards 2, 4, 6, and 7 in the order named. A reply cannot be given as regards Pneumonia and other lung diseases.

(3) (a) *Infant Mortality Rates* (per 1,000 births).—157 in 1931, 150 in 1932, and 133 in 1933; *Maternal Mortality Rates* (per 1,000 births).—31.9 in 1931, 32.2 in 1932, and 25.8 in 1933; (b) ignorance, poverty, the employment of quacks and unqualified midwives, the absence of ante-natal and post-natal clinics, the lack of appreciation of the services of the free qualified Municipal midwives and of hospital attention and treatment.

(4) (a) 152 in 1933, and 70 in 1934 to the end of August; (b) No; (c) I regret I cannot answer this question definitely; (d) No, but judging by the poor appreciation by the public of the free services of two trained midwives in two congested areas of the town, it seems hardly worth-while employing more, until there can be some certainty that additional midwives would have work to perform.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera moved :—(1) That a sum of money not exceeding Rs. 1,200 be voted in the year 1935 budget for the opening of a Ayurvedic Dispensary to serve wards 3 and 4. (2) That the Board of Management of the Jayasinghe Free Ayurvedic Dispensary be asked whether they would undertake to run such a dispensary in the place mentioned with an annual vote of Rs. 1,200. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded the motion and Messrs. E. M. Karunaratne and S. H. Dahanayaka also spoke.

The Chairman suggested that both motions be amalgamated, and moved as an amendment that the Board of Management of the Jayasinghe Free Ayurvedic Dispensary be asked whether they would undertake to establish and conduct an additional Ayurvedic Free Dispensary within the Municipal limits, on condition that an annual vote of Rs. 1,200 be granted by the Council for the purpose, and that this sum be included in the budget for 1935. The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment which was then put to the meeting and carried.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the new Maitipe road be given a suitable name. Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka seconded.—(1) Carried. (2) Resolved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works to decide what name should be given.

6. To consider a further letter from the Auditor-General (No. I.M. of August 30, 1934) regarding the contribution payable for the audit of the accounts of the Council :—Resolved that the contribution payable for the audit of the accounts of the Council be increased to Rs. 2,250 per annum with effect from July 1, 1934, and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 250 be passed under Head 10 for the fee payable for the second half of the current year.

7. To consider an application from the Manager of the Galle Advertising Co., for permission to put up large notice boards at important junctions in the town. Mr. J. E. Perera moved that permission be refused. Mr. C. H. Bradley seconded.—Carried.

8. To consider tenders for the fish auction shed for 1935 :—The Chairman informed the meeting that no new tenders had been received and that the two persons who had previously submitted tenders had again intimated that they were unable to accept condition No. 8 relating to the lease of stalls in the Fish Market. In the circumstances the matter would have to drop.—Resolved that the matter be dropped and that no further action be taken.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

9. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of September 8, 1934.*

(2) To consider 12 applications for water service. Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(6) To consider an estimate of Rs. 1,340 for installing electric lights in the public latrines at Talbot Town, China Garden, Walawwatta, Havelock place, Jakotuwa, and Wellaboda.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that the work be carried out departmentally.—Recommended also that a further sum of Rs. 60 be voted for the purpose of providing one light on the approach road to the Wellaboda latrine and that the estimate be increased accordingly.

(7) To consider the question of providing 36 special brackets, at an approximate cost of Rs. 575, for the purpose of keeping the electric mains at certain places in Dagedera, Kaluwella, and Fort, further away from buildings than they are at present.—Recommended that a supplemental vote of Rs. 575 be passed under "Capital Expenditure" for this purpose.

(8) To consider tenders for constructing side drains on (a) Wakwella road, (b) Hirimbura road, (c) Talapitiya road, (d) Upper Dickson's road.—Recommended, with regard to (a), that the tender of K. P. Hinniappuhamy for Rs. 1,504.20, being the lowest, be accepted; with regard to (b), that the tender of K. P. Hinniappuhamy for Rs. 905, being the lowest, be accepted; with regard to (c), that the tender of D. S. Fernando for Rs. 1,967.10, being the lowest, be accepted; and with regard to (d), that the tender of R. W. H. Robert for Rs. 429.75, being the lowest, be accepted.

(9) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 500 under Electricity, Head 25—"Alterations to Service Mains".—Recommended.

(10) To consider tenders for the following services for the year 1935 :—

(a) *Supplying of Metal.*—Recommended that the tender of M. H. James Appu at Rs. 7 and Rs. 13 per cube of 2 in. and  $\frac{3}{4}$  in. metal respectively be accepted.

(b) *Supplying of Gravel.*—Recommended that the tender of E. D. P. de Silva at Rs. 7.50 per cube be accepted provided he undertakes to supply screened gravel only.

(c) *Supply of Sea Sand.*—Recommended that consideration be deferred till the General Meeting of Council on the 15th.

(d) *Supply of Coir Dust.*—Recommended that the tender of E. D. P. de Silva at Rs. 15 per 100 bags of 2½ bushels each be accepted.

(e) *White washing, Municipal Buildings, four times a Year.*—Recommended that the tender of B. M. A. Azeez of Rs. 64 per quarter be accepted.

(f) *Purchase of House and Street Rubbish.*—Recommended that the tender of W. L. K. Handy of Rs. 250 be accepted.

(g) *Supply of Ekels, Baskets, Coir Yarn, Coconut Oil, and Coconuts.*—Recommended that the tender of W. V. Ginasena be accepted at the following rates :—Ekels, Re. 1.50 per 100 bundles of 50 ekels each; baskets, Rs. 2.16 per dozen; coir yarn, 10 cents per lb.; coconut oil, 15 cents per bottle; and coconuts, Rs. 3.50 per 100.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (10) (b) it was resolved, in view of the high rate quoted for screened gravel by E. D. P. de Silva, that no contract be entered into.

With regard to item (10) (c) it was resolved to accept the offer of the present contractor (R. Perera) to supply sea sand for two years, i.e., 1935 and 1936, at the present rate of Rs. 2.40 per cube.

With regard to item (10) (g) it was resolved, as regards the supply of baskets, that large baskets be paid for at the rate of Rs. 2.16 per dozen and small baskets at the rate of Re. 1.92 per dozen.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of September 8, 1934.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in wards 1, 2, 4, 5, 5A, and 7.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) To write off as irrecoverable a sum of Rs. 303.35 being arrears of electricity dues outstanding for 1933.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 303.35 be written off as irrecoverable.

(4) To write off as irrecoverable a sum of Rs. 24 being arrears of water rents for 1933.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 24 be written off as irrecoverable.

(5) To confirm the purchase on behalf of the Council of property No. 547, Galupiadde sold by public auction for non-payment of rates.—Recommended that the sale be confirmed and that steps be taken to have the property vested in the Council.

(6) To write off as irrecoverable a sum of Re. 1.13 being a deficit of assessment rates for 1933 in respect of wards 4, 5, and 7.—Recommended that the sum of Re. 1.13 be written off as irrecoverable.

(7) To consider what action should be taken with regard to the lease of Market stalls, Municipal shops and boutiques, betel sheds, and fruit trees for 1935.—(1) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation. (2) Recommended with regard to the Markets (a) that all stalls in the Green Market, Fish Market, Fruit Market, Dewata Vegetable Market, and Dewata Fish Market be offered to the present lessee at the same rentals as in 1934, and that, in the case of those who renew their leases, the security deposits be dealt with in the same manner as last year; (b) that in the case of the Meat Market the stalls be sold one by one at an upset price of Rs. 100 each for the first seven nearest the Fish Market and at Rs. 50 each for the remaining seven stalls, and that, after the sale of the stalls separately, the first six stalls nearest the Fish Market be put up for auction jointly at an upset price representing the sum total of the individual offers received, it being understood that the Council will be at liberty to lease the remaining eight stalls for purposes other than the sale of meat; (c) that in the case of the Offal Market the stalls be put up for auction separately at an upset price of Rs. 25 for each and that the room in this market be also put up for auction at an upset price of Rs. 80; and (d) that in the case of the Kaluwella Markets the six stalls in the Vegetable Market be put up for auction separately at an upset price of Rs. 25 for each and the two stalls in the Meat Market at an upset price of Rs. 20 for each.

With regard to the Municipal shops and boutiques, that these be offered to the present tenants at the same rentals as in 1934.

With regard to the betel sheds, that these be sold by public auction—the one in the Fort at an upset price of Rs. 250 and the one in the Bazaar at an upset price of Rs. 50.

With regard to fruit trees, that those in Victoria Park and the Bataduwa Night Soil Depôt premises be offered to the present lessees at the same rentals as in 1934, and that those situated in the Fort, Wakwella road, Katugoda, Elliott road, and Maitipe road, be sold by public auction.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (7). Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved as an amendment that the following words be deleted from the recommendation of the Committee with regard to the lease of stalls in the Meat Market :—"and that, after the sale of the stalls separately the first six stalls nearest the Fish Market be put up for auction jointly at an upset price representing the sum total of the individual offers received, it being understood that the Council will be at liberty to lease the remaining eight stalls for purposes other than the sale of meat." Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.—Carried.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved as a further amendment that each butcher should not be allowed to obtain the lease of more than two stalls. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded.—Carried.

The recommendations of the Committee with regard to the lease of the stalls in the other markets, the lease of Municipal shops and boutiques, betel sheds, and fruit trees, were adopted.

The recommendations of the Committee with regard to the remaining items were also adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of September 8, 1934.*

(2) To consider what action should be taken with regard to the lease of Market stalls, Municipal shops and boutiques, betel sheds, and fruit trees for 1935 :—(1) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, (2) Recommended, with regard to the markets (a) that all stalls in the Green Market, Fish Market, Fruit Market, Dewata Vegetable Market, and Dewata Fish Market be offered to the present lessees at the same rentals as in 1934, and that in the case of those who renew their leases, the security deposits be dealt with in the same manner as last year, (b) that in the case of the Meat Market the stalls be sold one by one at an upset price of Rs. 100 each for the first seven nearest the Fish Market and at Rs. 50 each for the remaining seven stalls, and that, after the sale of the stalls separately the first six stalls



nearest the Fish Market be put up for auction jointly at an upset price representing the sum total of the individual offers received, it being understood that the Council will be at liberty to lease the remaining eight stalls for purposes other than the sale of meat, (c) that in the case of the Offal Market the stalls be put up for auction separately at an upset price of Rs. 25 for each and that the room in this market be also put up for auction at an upset price of Rs. 80, and (d) that in the case of the Kaluwella Markets the six stalls in the Vegetable Market be put up for auction separately at an upset price of Rs. 25 for each and the two stalls in the Meat Market at an upset price of Rs. 20 for each.

With regard to the Municipal shops and boutiques, that these be offered to the present tenants at the same rentals as in 1934.

With regard to the betel sheds, that these be sold by public auction, the one in the Fort at an upset price of Rs. 250 and the one in the Bazaar at an upset price of Rs. 50.

With regard to the fruit trees, that those in Victoria Park and the Bataduwa Night Soil Dépôt premises be offered to the present lessees at the same rentals as in 1934, and that those situated in the Fort, Wakwella road, Katugoda, Elliott road, and Maitipe road be sold by public auction.

#### Resolution.

With regard to this item Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved as an amendment that the following words be deleted from the recommendation of the Committee with regard to the lease of stalls in the Meat Market:—"and that, after the sale of the stalls separately, the first six stalls nearest the Fish Market be put up for auction jointly at an upset price representing the sum total of the individual offers received, it being understood that the Council will be at liberty to lease the remaining eight stalls for purposes other than the sale of meat." Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.—Carried.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved as a further amendment that each butcher should not be allowed to obtain the lease of more than two stalls. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded.—Carried.

The recommendations of the Committee with regard to the lease of the stalls in the other markets, the lease of Municipal shops and boutiques, betel sheds, and fruit trees, were adopted.

12. At this stage the Chairman informed the meeting that an action had been instituted against the Council in the District Court of Galle by the widow and son of the late Dombagoda Liyanage Girigoris Appuhamy for the recovery of a sum of Rs. 5,000 as damages sustained by them by reason of the death by electrocution of the said Dombagoda Liyanage Girigoris Appuhamy. He moved that the Council's Lawyer be instructed to take the necessary steps to defend the action. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded.—Carried.

13. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 200 under Head 61—Legal Expenses:—Sanctioned.

14. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of Council:—Agreed that the next General Meeting of Council be held on Saturday, October 20, 1934, at 9.30 A.M.

15. To consider the report of the Special Committee appointed to inquire into the working of the Council's Electricity Department:—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider the report.

#### Council in Committee.

*Staff.*—Recommended that the suggestions contained in paragraph (a) be adopted with the following amendments:—(1) that the Superintendent should pay a surprise visit to the Power Station once every night after 8.30 P.M., (2) that the Superintendent be not required to keep a record of mileage performed.

As regards paragraph (b) the Chairman said that the Inspector must be regarded as an outdoor officer. He did not see why the Superintendent and he should both be in the Power Station at the same time in the morning. He suggested that the Inspector's hours of work should be from 7.30 A.M. to 5 P.M. with a break of 1½ hours for his mid-day meal. This was agreed to, and Council in Committee recommended accordingly.

Recommended that paragraph (c) be adopted with the following amendments:—(1) that the increase in security should be by hypothecation of property, (2) that the first increment be paid to the Storekeeper with effect from January 1, 1934.

The contents of paragraphs (d), (e), and (f) were noted.—Recommended that the suggestions contained in paragraphs (g) to (n) be adopted with effect from October 1, 1934, but as regards night patrolling it was recommended that the Superintendent be not restricted to employing only the two apprentices and one assistant wireman for this purpose, although normally these persons would be employed.

As regards the suggestion that all daily-paid hands should be put on a monthly basis with incremental scales of salary, it was recommended that no change be made in the present system.

*Loss of Current.*—As regards recommendation, (1) the Chairman said that meters were tested once a year under present conditions and he thought that this was quite sufficient. If tests were carried out once in 8 months it would place too much work on the Superintendent.

Recommendation (2) was adopted but with a register of 7 columns instead of 13.

As regards recommendation (3) the Chairman said that this might be adopted provided that the new seal is fixed to meters only when they are replaced after having been tested. This was agreed to.

Recommendation (4) he said could not be accepted as it was too expensive and complicated.

Recommendation (5) was adopted.

*Bulbs.*—The Chairman said that the recommendation of the Committee was actually being carried out. Only indelibly marked bulbs were being ordered now and there have been no losses since. A register, however, would be kept to show any losses.

*Aerial Fuzes.*—The suggestion made had already been carried out in the majority of cases, and as the new consignment of fuzes had just arrived, the remainder would receive attention very soon.

*Distribution Service.*—The danger of overhanging trees had been greatly lessened as many of them have now been removed. As regards the scheme suggested for extinguishing lights after 9 P.M., the Chairman said that this would only save a little in bulbs, and besides he was not in favour of darkening the streets. Therefore, he thought the recommendation made should not be accepted.

Council in Committee recommended further that in the case of disconnection the service mains be removed after the expiration of six months.

*Business Management.*—The Chairman said that this question would shortly be discussed with the Inspecting Engineer of the Electrical Undertakings Department and suggested that consideration be deferred for the present.

*Quarterly Reports.*—Recommended that the suggestion made be adopted.

*Stores.*—Recommended that the suggestion of having tally boards be adopted.

As regards stock books the Chairman said that these were being compiled now on lines similar to those followed in the Electrical Undertakings Department. They are very similar to the lines laid down in the report.

The suggestion about waybills was being carried out.

As regards tools he thought there was no need to make any change as the Audit Department had made no complaints about the present system.

Recommended that the suggestion made with regard to unserviceable stores be adopted.

*Accommodation.*—Recommended (1) that estimates be prepared for erecting an office for the Superintendent, a properly covered shed for outside stores, plant, and unserviceable articles, and for a smithy; and (2) that inquiries be made with a view to purchasing the Public Works Department labour lines, and failing that to consider building new lines on the land recently vested in the Council.

*Technical Literature.*—The recommendation made was adopted.

Council resumed and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations and resolutions of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried. He thanked the members of the Special Committee for their very valuable report.

16. At the conclusion of the business of the meeting Mr. J. E. Perera said that as that was the last occasion on which the Chairman would preside he desired to express on behalf of the Council and the rate-payers their high sense of appreciation of the valuable services rendered to the town by Mr. Brown during his tenure of office. He mentioned, among other things, the extension of the franchise, the construction of the Pettigalawatta Canal, the extension of the Electric Lighting Scheme, the improvements to the Esplanade, the relief given to the unemployed, and the construction of many new roads and drains, and stated that they were all very grateful to the Chairman for all that he had done. He moved that they do place on record their appreciation of the valuable services of the Chairman during his tenure of office and their sincere regret at his retirement.

Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded the motion which was supported by Messrs. D. I. Durham, S. H. Dahanayaka, E. M. Karunaratna, F. Magdon Ismail, Thomas Amarasuriya, and E. A. Paulas, all of whom paid warm tributes to the excellent services rendered to the town by the Chairman.

Mr. J. E. Perera also read out a letter received from Mr. A. M. Saheed, who was unavoidably prevented from attending the meeting, in which he (Mr. Saheed) referred to the good work done by the Chairman.

The Chairman in reply said that he felt quite overwhelmed by the extraordinarily kind remarks made about him by all the members who had spoken. It had been a pleasure for him to work among them and he would carry away with him very pleasant recollections of the meetings of the Council and of his stay in Galle. He thanked them again very sincerely for their kind references to him.
