REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENTS AS CLERKS AND DRAUGHTSMEN.

An examination for candidates wishing to enter Classes II. and III. of the Clerks and Draughtsmen's Scheme will be held annually, on a date to be notified in the local newspapers. This examination will be confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in the Island.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not in the Survey Department must be sent in addressed to the Surveyor-General, bearing a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and on the prescribed form (Schedule A), which can be obtained at the Surveyor-General's Office on application. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to be not less than 17 nor more than 23 years of age on the first day of the examination, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General, must be attached to the form of application. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition from the name by which the candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, as amended by Ordinance No. 23 of 1900; and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

3. Candidates other than those eligible under paragraph 5 must also furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed either—

- (a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or higher examinations of the University of London; or
- (b) The Senior School Certificate Examination (English); or
- (c) The Junior School Certificate Examination (English) formerly known as the English School-Leaving Certificate Examination, First Division, or the Cambridge Junior with honours; or
- (d) The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate Examination (English) formerly known as the English School-Leaving Certificate Examination, and either (i.) the examination for the Commercial Certificates of the Government Technical Schools or of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, or (ii.) the examination for the London Chamber of Commerce Junior Certificates in English, Arithmetic, and either Bookkeeping or Shorthand and Typewriting.

4. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of $\frac{2}{3}$ the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

(b) (i.) Except in cases referred to in paragraph 4 (a) no refund will be made, but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office fifteen days before the date of commencement of the examination, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

(ii.) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (i.) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the perfected entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer.

* If the candidate has been educated at a Government or assisted school, the certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or assisted school which he has attended.

5. Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department, who joined subsequent to 1919 and who have completed three years' service and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age and preliminary educational qualifications referred to in paragraph 3 and without fee.

6. The Surveyor-General will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved, as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Surveyor-General, and be prepared to prove they are the persons mentioned on their forms. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

7. The examination will be held in Colombo, by the Education Department, at places which will be notified to the candidates in due course.

8. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for general competition will be announced in the local newspapers.

9. Successful candidates will be required to produce a health certificate from the Government Medical Officer testifying to the candidate's sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island.

10. Candidates, on selection, will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve on probation for a period of three years in the Department. Each candidate will during such period diligently and efficiently discharge all duties which he may be required to do and shall enter into a bond for the payment of (Rs. 450) Rupees Four hundred and Fifty, in the event of leaving the Department before the expiration of three years. He shall be bound by all rules and regulations applicable for the time being to the Department. The appointments are pensionable; officers do not however acquire pension rights until they are confirmed on the satisfactory completion of their period of probation.

11. Appointments to Class II. for new entrants to the Survey Department will be on the salary scale recommended by the Select Committee on the Salaries and Cadres Commission, 1932, Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934, viz., Rs. 720 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 108 to Rs. 2,448 per annum.

12. Appointments to Class III. will be on the salary scale recommended by the Select Committee on the Salaries and Cadres Commission, 1932, Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934, viz., Rs. 480 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 30 to Rs. 1,200 per annum.

13. Clerks and Draughtsmen, who are new entrants to the Survey Department, will be eligible for leave and Holiday Warrants in terms of Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934.

14. Clerks and Draughtsmen are required to pass a test in Draughtsmanship before they are eligible for their first increment. Facilities for training in draughtsmanship are provided by the Department.

15. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B of this notice. The examination will be in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper. The papers of any candidate failing to obtain half the marks allowed for each of the subjects, Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper will not be considered for the second part of the examination. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 25 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. *Candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be disqualified.*

16. Clerks and Draughtsmen admitted under paragraph 5 will be allowed to compete amongst themselves, and will be eligible for promotion, in order of merit, to fill the places assigned for Departmental competition, if in the first part of this examination they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in each of the subjects, Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper. The papers of any Departmental candidate failing to obtain the minimum marks required for each of the subjects, Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper will not be considered for the second part of the examination.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

"THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE,
No. 11 OF 1920."

BY-LAWS made by the Moratuwa Urban District Council under sections 164 and 168 (2) (a) of "The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920," and approved by the Local Government Board and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section 164 and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Colombo, October 24, 1934.

1. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Urban District Council without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. Subject to the provisions of by-law 1 and the following by-laws, every officer of the Urban District Council on the fixed establishment drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards who shall have had service of ten years or more including any service which may be reckoned under

the proviso to by-law 7 may be awarded a pension as follows:—

For the first one hundred and twenty months of such service a pension equal to 120/720ths of his annual salary and for each additional completed month of service an additional 1/720th of such salary, but no officer shall be entitled to draw more than 480/720ths of his final salary as pension.

3. The above-mentioned rates shall only be granted in cases of faithful and meritorious service, but when the testimony as to fidelity, diligence, and merit is in any respect defective, a deduction from such rates may be made. Where there has been obvious negligence, irregularity, or misconduct, the grant of a pension may be altogether withheld.

Where service of peculiar and extraordinary merit has been rendered by an officer distinctly outside the duties in respect of which his salary is paid, a special rate of pension may be recommended for sanction, but in ordinary cases the maximum pension or retiring allowance grantable to an officer under these by-laws, or to an officer entitled to pension also in respect of service not under the Council from all services combined, shall not exceed two-thirds of the highest salary drawn by such officer at any time in the course of his service.

4. In the case of officers on the fixed establishment of the Council drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards retiring on account of illness or age before completing one hundred and twenty months' gross service a gratuity may be granted calculated at the rate of one-twelfth of a month's pay of the permanent office or offices held at the time of retirement, for each completed month of service.

5. Officers of the Urban District Council shall have no absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or long service allowance under these by-laws, and the Urban District Council retains power and authority to dismiss any such officer without any compensation.

6. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Urban District Council who shall be under fifty-five years of age, except upon a certificate from the Chairman and two medical practitioners that he is incapable from infirmity of mind or body of discharging the duties of his office, nor unless he shall have discharged such duties theretofore with diligence and fidelity to the satisfaction of the Council.

7. The claim of an officer of the Urban District Council to pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be considered to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the fixed establishment of the Council after January 1, 1930, or its predecessor the Local Board, Moratuwa.

Provided that an officer transferred from the provisional and temporary establishment to the fixed establishment may be allowed to count his provisional and temporary service when it has been continuous with his subsequent permanent service.

Service under sixteen years of age however will not count for pension.

8. The service in respect of which pensions, gratuities, or long service allowances are granted under these by-laws must in all cases be continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or other temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation of the officer.

9. The pension or gratuity shall be computed upon the salary of the permanent office held by the officer of the Council at the time of his retirement provided he shall have held such appointment for at least three years: otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of salaries attached to the permanent office held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension.

10. In case of abolition of office, if the officer has completed 120 months' gross service, he may be granted a pension of 1/720th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension with an addition to such service of one month for each completed period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 60 months.

If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of 1/12th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension, plus an addition of 50 per cent. thereon. In no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty.

11. If any person being in receipt of any pension or long service allowance from the Urban District Council shall be convicted of any offence in any Court of Justice in the Island for which he shall be sentenced to death or to any terms of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding six months such pension or long service allowance shall

forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction, receive free pardon or unless the Council shall otherwise order.

12. Officers on the fixed establishment of the Urban District Council may be required to retire on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect, but they may continue in office till sixty years of age with the consent of the Council.

13. (1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the aggregate* amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided, however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under the Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from the Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the Council.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the expression "public service" includes employment under the Crown or any Local Government public body or bodies.

14. Should an officer who retires on pension find after such retirement an employment under the Council or under the Government or under another semi-official body on a salary equal to or higher than that which he drew from the Council at the time of his retirement, his pension shall be suspended so long as such employment continues. If he draws a less salary he shall be entitled to only so much of his pension as when added to the salary of the new appointment will make his total emoluments equal to the salary last drawn by him previous to his retirement.

15. Employees on the fixed establishment of the Urban District Council drawing salaries of less than Rs. 360 per annum and retiring on account of age or infirmity after serving continuously for a period of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Council be satisfied that they are unfit, owing to age or infirmity of body or mind, further to discharge efficiently the duties of their offices, be granted such long service allowances not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem in each case as the Council may award. Persons in receipt of daily pay, who have completed a period of fifteen years of continuous service, retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

16. If any case not covered by these by-laws shall arise which in the opinion of the Council merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, the circumstances of such case should be reported together with the recommendation of the Council to the Commissioner of Local Government for transmission to the General Treasury (Establishments Division) for submission to the Governor, who will decide whether any and, if so, what award shall be granted.

Repeal.

The rules relating to pensions to officers of the Local Board of Moratuwa published by Notification in the *Gazette* of February 23, 1917, as amended by Notification in the *Gazette* of March 16, 1934, and deemed to be the rules of the Council under the provisions of section 247 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, are hereby repealed.

* The term "aggregate" salary is to be interpreted as the amount of the aggregate salary of the substantive post held by an officer in the course of his career, disregarding extra emoluments such as duty allowances, and regarding leave on half pay or without pay as leave on full salary.

An improved tank for coagulating caoutchouc of rubber and like trees in bulk.

Abstract.—The latex is bulked in a tank constructed of cement and brick having its inner surfaces lined with sheets of glass. The tank is then divided into a number of compartments by glass partitions which are slid through slots in a detachable wooden frame supported on the top of the tank. When coagulation is complete the wooden frame and the glass partitions are removed leaving the coagulum in the form of slabs.
