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

Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917 approved under section 12(1)(b) at a meeting duly held on September 20, 1934, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Bulatwatta anicut irrigation work in the Matale District, and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931,

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete earthworks in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent, and for this puroose each of the proprietors agrees

(a) to complete 8.6 cubes of earthwork, in respect of each acre owned by him under the aforesaid irrigation work:

(b) to contribute the necessary labour in person, free of all charges; or in commutation of such labour, to contribute money, on or before September 30 of the year in which such labour is due at the rate of Rs. 2.50 for each cube of earthwork, for the completion of which he is liable; and (c) to complete all earthworks within six months.

(3). The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

#### BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

1. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the Urban area or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in the form supplied by the Council for that purpose and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such form is addressed.

2. (1) If any person, after having filled up and returned such return acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such return, he shall within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

(2) Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish information as required by the foregoing paragraph of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence punishable

with a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance every person who has furnished the return referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of every vehicle or animal entered in such return, to pay the tax for the year for which such return is furnished and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on every vehicle or animal referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicle or animal was acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Any person who has furnished the return required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2 may by written notice given to the Chairman claim to be exempted from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such return or

The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before March 31 in every year in respect of all vehicles, other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used within the administrative limits of the Chilaw Urban District Council.

6. The annual tax aforesaid shall be paid by the persons liable to pay the same at the office of the Chilaw Urban

liable to pay the same at the office of the Chilaw Urban District Council whether the same shall have been demanded or not; and any person failing or neglecting to pay such tax after it shall have become due from him shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees

- 7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued. Provided that when any plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents, to receive a fresh plate; and provided further that the Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by him of 50 cents.
- 8. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the administrative limits of the Chilaw Urban District Council the owner or person in charge of that vehicle shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

#### Rules.

Definitions.—In these rules unless the context otherwise requires-

"the Committee" means the Village Committee of the Palle pattu subdivision elected in accordance with section 14 of the Ordinance.
"The Chairman" means the Chairman of the aforesaid

Village Committee elected in accordance with section 16 (4) or nominated under section 16 (8) of the Ordinance.

#### SECTION 29.

#### Sub-section (1)—Communal Works.

1. Charge of Village Property.—All village paths, edandas, ambalam, bridges, wells, bathing places, schools, village tribunals and village committee buildings, and other village properties, shall be in charge of the village headman of the wasama.
2. Paths through Paddy Fields.—No person shall cut or

encroach upon any village path passing across a paddy field or in any way make it narrower than its customary width.

3. Village Paths through Paddy Fields.—When a range of paddy fields through which any village path passes is under cultivation the cultivators of that range shall have power

to place sticks across the path (an idikada) when such a course is necessary to prevent cattle from trespassing in the

paddy fields and cattle being taken along the path.
4. Village Paths through Private Lands.—It shall be the duty of any person through whose land any village path

passes to keep such path free from overgrowth of jungle.

5. Obstruction of Village Paths.—No person shall obstruct or negligently or wilfully damage any village path: Provided, however, that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to prohibit the erection of a stile with "padandas," of a type approved by the Chairman, at the point where the

line of any fence crosses any such path.

6. Protection of Wells.—The chief occupier or the proprietor of any land on which any well exists or is dug, shall cause such well to be surrounded with a secure fence to a height of 2 feet 6 inches above the level of the ground.

- 7. (1) Should any occupier or proprietor, convicted of a breach of the foregoing rule 6, fail within thirty days of the date of such conviction to comply with the said rule the President of the Village Tribunal, or the Chairman may cause the fence to be erected, and recover the cost thereof as provided by section 72 of the Ordinance out of such fine as may lawfully be imposed for the breach of this rule.
- (2) The person liable for any breach of this rule shall be the occupier whether such occupier is or is not the proprietor of the land, and if there is no one in occupation of such land, then the proprietor of the land if he is in the

Island, and if he is absent from the Island, the duly authorized agent or attorney of such proprietor.

8. Wells for Drinking Water.—No person shall bathe or wash clothes at any well or spout set apart by the Committee for the supply of water solely for drinking purposes and indicated as such by a notice or sign posted up by the Chairman.

9. No person shall defile any well, ela, spout, or public bathing place or obstruct the supply of water from any

well, ela, spout, or any other water-course.

10. No person infected with any contagious disease shall wash himself or his clothes or cause his clothes to be washed in any spring, water-course, or public bathing place.

#### Sub-section (3)—Restriction or Prohibition of Private Galas, &c.

11. (1) Every private gala shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

(2) Every such gala shall be thoroughly swept daily, and dung and refuse removed daily, to a distance of at least 6 fathoms from any dwelling house, or to a place approved by the Chairman.

# Sub-section (5)—Regulation, Supervision, and Control of Bakeries, Eating-houses, &c.

- Control of Bakeries.—Bakery shall mean any place in which bread, biscuit, or confectionery is baked for sale as food for man, and also include any premises on which such food is prepared for baking or on which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.
- 13. (1) The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 180 square feet and a minimum width of 12 feet.
- (2) There shall be a free external air space not less than 7 feet wide on at least two sides of the kneading room so as to permit of through ventilation.
- (3) The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room.
- (4) Every kneading room shall be provided with a ceiling. 14. (I) Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted.
- (2) The walls in every part shall be not less than 7 feet in height and be built of brick, stone, or cabook, and the inside thereof limeplastered, and once at least in every six months limewashed.
- (3) The roof shall be of some permanent material.
  (4) The ceiling shall be either of masonry and plaster and whitewashed four times yearly, or of close fitting boards varnished or painted.
- (5) The floor shall be cemented throughout and adequate drainage provided.
- (6) Every room shall be provided with windows, capable
- of being opened, and having a superficial area of not less than 1/16th of the superficial floor space.

  15. The floor shall be carefully scraped and swept at least once every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings shall be immediately placed in a covered fly-proof receptacle and removed from the bakery daily.
- 16. The troughs and all the utensils used in the making of bread and pastry, shall be kept scrupulously clean and shall be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning
- 17. Every bakery shall be kept in a cleanly state and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cess-pit, or other nuisance.

- 18. No furniture or articles other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry shall be stored in the
- bakery.

  19. The tops of the tables shall be made of well-seasoned impervious closely fitted planks or some non-harmful impervious material and shall be scraped and cleaned daily.

  20. No animal shall be kept in the bakery for any purpose
- whatsoever.
- 21. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of the bakery, has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by the person in charge of the bakery to enter the bakery or take part in the manufacture or sale of bread, buscuits, or confectionery until the periods of infection and of incubation have elapsed.

22. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread-making and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body and also a white cap or turban.

- All bread, biscuits, confectionery, and sweetmeats exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases and such cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

  24. The flour, water, and other materials used in the
- manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome, and the flour shall be kept on a platform raised 3 feet above the ground.
- 25. The premises of every bakery shall be carefully swept and all refuse removed daily; and all drains shall be well flushed daily.
- 26. (1) No person shall use, or be permitted by the person in charge of a bakery to use, as a sleeping place, any room or place on the same floor as the bakery or forming part of the same building, unless such room or place is effectively separated from the bakery by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling.

(2) No water-closet, earth-closet, privy, or ashpit shall be within, or communicate directly with, the bakery.

- 27. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.
- 28. (1) No person shall keep a bakery without a licence under the hand of the Chairman
- (2) Every such licence shall be renewed on or before January 1 of each year.

  29. A copy of these rules shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.
- 30. Eating-houses.—All eating-houses and tea or coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and in a sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Chairman.
- 31. All utensils, furniture, and other equipment, used in or belonging to any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique,
- shall always be kept clean.

  32. The walls of all eating-houses and tea or coffee boutiques shall be plastered, and shall be limewashed twice a year, and the rooms shall be well ventilated and lighted.

33. All refuse and dirt in or about the premises of any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall be removed

- twice daily.

  34. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of an eating-house or tea or coffee boutique has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by the person in charge of the eating-house or tea or coffee boutique to be employed in or about any such eating-house, tea or coffee boutique until the periods of infection and of incubation have elapsed.
- 35. (1) All cakes, sweetmeats, and the like, exposed for sale, shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.
- (2) No foodstuffs shall be exposed to the contamination of flies.
- (3) The glass cases used shall be kept scrupulously clean.
- 36. The sugar used in every such place shall be kept in glass-stoppered, wide-mouthed bottles.
- 37. No waste tea, coffee, or milk, or remnants of food or cooking waste, shall be thrown on the ground, but shall be collected in a covered fly-proof receptacle and removed from the premises daily.
- 38. No adulterated milk shall be sold or offered or, exposed for sale or kept on the premises of any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique. For the purpose of this rule, adulterated milk shall mean milk to which water or any foreign liquid or substance has been added for the purpose of augmenting its quantity or enhancing its apparent quality, and shall not be deemed to apply to the milk used in beverages such as tea, coffee, or cacao.

(1) No person shall keep an eating-house or a tea or 39. coffee boutique without a licence under the hand of the Chairman.

(2) Every such licence shall be renewed on or before

January 1 of each year.

40. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every licensed eating-house or tea or coffee boutique.

#### Sub-section (6)—Seizure, Forfeiture, Removal, and Destruction of Unwholesome Articles of Food and Drinks.

41. Unwholesome Food.—It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or any headman, upon seizure by him as un-wholesome or unfit for human consumption, of any meat. poultry, fish, game, fissh, vegetables, fruit, or other article of food introduced into or exposed for sale within the limits of the subdivision, to convey the article to the nearest Medical Officer, or in his absence, or if there is no such officer to the President of the Village Tribunal; and if it appear to such Medical Officer or President that any article seized is unfit for human food, he shall order it to be destroyed or to be disposed of so as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used as food.

# Sub-section (7)—Conservancy of Springs and Water-courses.

42. No person shall fell or destroy any timber or underwood on any land within the subdivision reserved for the conservancy of forests, springs, or water-courses.

#### Sub-section (9) -- Waste and other Land set apart for Pasturage.

Communal Pasturage Lands.—Where any communal 43 pasture land is set apart by the Crown for the grazing of the cattle in the subdivision, the labour called out under these rules shall be contributed from time to time, (a) for clearing the land of all jungle growth and trees other than clearing the land of all jungle growth and trees other than those measuring one cubit and more in circumference; (b) for digging any ditch or erecting any fence that may be necessary around the land, and for keeping such ditch or fence in proper order; (c) for keeping the land properly weeded; and (d) for digging such number of water-holes as may be necessary for the use of the cattle.

44. Specifying Pasture Lands for certain Villages.—After the publication by the Committee of a list specifying the portions of communal pasture lands set apart for the grazing of the cattle of each village in the subdivision, and the date from and after which such portions will be so set

the date from and after which such portions will be so set apart, no person shall permit his cattle to trespass on any portion of a communal pasture land not assigned in such

list to the cattle of his village.

#### Sub-section (12)—Prevention of Diseases amongst Animals.

- 45. The owner or person in charge of any animal attacked with any contagious or infections disease shall give immediate notice to the headman of the village in which the animal is kept at that time.
- Where no officer has been appointed under section 46. Where no officer has been appointed under section 36 of the Ordinance to carry out any of the following duties, it shall be lawful for the Chairman to authorize the headman of a village-
  - (a) to cause to be constructed or set apart a well ventilated hospital shed for the housing of diseased animals:
  - provide such disinfectants and medicines as may be necessary for the treatment of such animals;
  - (c) to appoint suitable persons to tend, feed, and treat
  - animals removed to the said hospital shed;
    (d) to remove or cause to be removed all diseased animals to the hospital shed, and for that purpose to enter any premises on which he has reason to believe that diseased animals are to be found;
  - (e) to cause all animals dying in the hospital shed to be buried at least 6 feet below the surface of the ground; and
  - (f) to cause the hospital shed, and all appliances used for feeding or treating diseased animals therein, to be burnt as soon as the Chairman declares the village to be free from disease.
- 47. All expenses incurred by the headmen either with the approval of the Chairman, or for any purpose previously sanctioned by the Committee, shall be defrayed out of the funds of the Committee.

  48. The keeper of the hospital shed shall clean it twice
- daily and shall carefully remove all excreta therefrom.
  The excreta removed shall be buried or burnt immediately.
  49. No animal shall be removed from the hospital shed
- until the Chairman certifies that it is free from disease.

- 50. It shall be an offence for the owner or person in charge of any animal to let it loose while it is suffering from any infectious disease.
- 51. It shall be an offence for the owner or person in charge of healthy animals to suffer such animals to approach
- the hospital shed.

  52. It shall be the duty of owners or persons in charge of cattle belonging to an infected herd or village to have their cattle inoculated or subjected to such treatment at such spot as may be specified by the Chairman in consultation with the Government Veterinary Surgeon or his subordinate.

53. Cattle which have recovered from infectious or contagious disease shall not be allowed to mix with other healthy cattle until fourteen days have elapsed after

complete recovery.

54. No person shall remove or cause to be removed any animal suffering from a contagious or infectious disease from the village in which the animal was, when first attacked

by such disease, to any other village.

55. In every village in which cattle disease exists or has within ten days immediately preceding existed, and in every village within a radius of 3 miles therefrom, every cattle owner and person in charge of cattle shall keep his animals tethered or securely penned so as to prevent them from straying.

56. No person shall disinter the carcase of any animal which has died of any infectious or contagious disease or remove or keep the flesh or hides or horns of any such

- 57. (1) It shall be the duty of the owner or person in charge of any cattle dying of disease in an infected area, to burn or bury, or to cause to be burnt or buried, within six hours after the death, the carcase of the cattle so dying, the grave in the case of burial being at least 6 feet deep and the carcase being first covered with quicklime wherever possible.
- (2) If any owner or person in charge fails to comply with the foregoing paragraph of this rule the village headman may cause the carcase to be burnt or buried, and recover the cost in the manner provided by section 72 of the Ordinance out of such fine as may be imposed upon the owner or person in charge for the breach of the rule.

(3) Every person who finds the carcase of any cattle

- lying unburied, shall report the fact to the nearest headman.

  (4) The dung of diseased cattle shall be collected and buried by the owner or occupier of the land on which it is found.
- 58. No person shall expose diseased or suspected cattle in any market, gala, garden, or other place open to the
- public.
  59. No person shall carry or cause to be carried along any road, or river, or in any cart track, vessel, or boat, any diseased or infected cattle, or the dung, hide, or horns of such cattle.
- 60. No person shall carry, drive, or lead, or cause to be carried, driven, or led along any thoroughfare, road, or highway any diseased or infected cattle, or allow them to drink or bathe at any running stream or at any pond or

#### Sub-section (13)—Prevention of Trespass by Animals.

61. No owner or person having charge of any ox, horse, sheep, goat, or pig shall allow any such animal to stray on any village path, public road, or thoroughfare.

62. No cattle shall be tethered upon any village path

or public road or thoroughfare, or in such manner as to

permit of their straying thereon.

63. All cattle shall be penned or kept tethered at night by the owners or caretakers. This rule shall apply to cattle remaining at night on such communal pasture lands as are not provided with ditch or fence.

#### Sub-section (14)—Preservation of Land Boundaries and Fences

64. The boundaries of all private gardens shall be marked by fences, ditches, stones, or posts.

65. No person shall knowingly and wilfully destroy or injure or deface or without lawful authority in that behalf remove, any fence, ditch, stones, posts, or trees set up as boundary marks on any private land.

#### Sub-section (15)—Nuisances.

- 66. It shall be the duty of the chief occupier of every house to keep clear of jungle a space of 10 fathoms on each side of his house: provided that trees more than a cubit in girth and trees or plants of any size planted for use or ornament need not be cut down.

  67. It shall be the duty of the chief occupier of every
- house or land, or of the owner of every unoccupied house or land, to keep such house or land clean.

68. No person shall put filth, refuse, rubbish, manure, timber, mats, garden produce, or other obstructive matter on any part of any village path or public road or any

69. No person shall commit a nuisance by answering a call of nature in any public place other than a public latrine, or in any place where he may be visible to the

70. Boutiques and market places, as well as the portions of the path or road opposite to them, shall at all times be

kept clean by the occupiers thereof.
71. It shall be the duty of every householder to remove and to burn or bury all refuse lying on his premises and all tins, coconut shells, and other similar discarded receptacles which are likely to form breeding places for mosquitoes.

72. No person shall throw refuse, empty tins, coconut shells, and other similar discarded receptacles into another's compound.

73. (1) It shall be the duty of every householder within fourteen days of the receipt of a written notice issued by the Chairman in that behalf, to fill up all pits, trenches, holes, or hollows whether natural or artificial within 20 yards of his or her dwelling house so as to prevent water collecting and stagnating therein: provided that such householder shall have the right to appeal against the order contained in such notice to the Government

Agent.

(2) In the event of any householder failing to comply with such notice or to lodge an appeal within fourteen days or to comply with such order as may be made by the Government Agent on the appeal, it shall be lawful for the Chairman to cause the necessary work to be done and to recover the cost of the work together with reasonable cost of supervision as provided by section 72 of the Ordinance out of such fine as may be lawfully imposed on such householder for the breach of this rule.

#### Sub-section (17)—Preventing Accidents connected with Toddy Drawing.

The scaling bamboo tied to any kitul tree for tapping purposes shall be renewed by the tapper at intervals of

75. (1) Every person employing others to draw toddy, and every person on whose account toddy is drawn, shall, for the purpose of coupling trees, use or cause to be used at first six distinct new ropes for the feet and three ropes for the hand, each rope consisting of six strands, and at the end of every four months shall add or cause to be added two such new ropes for the feet and two for the hands.

(2) Every such person shall allow the village headman once a month to inspect the couplings and bamboos, and render all such assistance as the headman may require

for the inspection.

# Sub-section (19)—Gambling, Cock-fighting, and Cart Racing.

76.

No person shall gamble for stakes of any kind. No person shall allow or suffer any building, vehicle, vessel or the like, over which he has control, to be used as a gaming place.

78. No person shall race with carts on any village path or public road or thoroughfare.

79. No person shall train cocks for fighting, or take part in cock-fighting in any place whatever within the subdivision.

## Sub-section (21)—Determining, imposing, and enforcing of Penalties incurred by Officers appointed under Section 36.

Any Gansabha Officer found guilty of neglect or breach of duty shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five

81. Every Gansabha Officer shall be entitled to receive such commission or fee as the Committee may determine not exceeding 9 per cent. for collecting taxes and not exceeding 10 cents per head for supervision of works.

#### Sub-sections (25) to (28)—Annual Labour.

82. List of Works.—(1) Before the end of December of each year the Committee shall hold a meeting, at which it shall consider all proposals submitted by the headmen, and others for such works of construction, maintenance, or conservation as are enumerated in section 29 (1), (2), (7), (9), (20), (23), and (24), and shall make a list of those which it considers desirable to undertake during the ensuing year, specifying the village or villages interested in each such work.

(2) This list, together with a summary of all the proposals submitted to the Committee, and a statement setting out the number of days' labour which it is proposed to impose in respect of works included in the list, shall be sent to the Government Agent for approval.

- (3) On receipt of the Government Agent's approval, the Chairman shall at once publish in the subdivision a notice specifying the number of days' labour which it has been decided to impose, and the dates on or before which the various works are to be commenced or carried out.
- (4) In the month of June of each year the Committee shall hold a further meeting, and may at any time thereafter hold additional meetings, to amend the list of works

submitted at the end of the preceding year.
(5) All such amendments shall be sent to the Government Agent for approval, and on receipt of such approval the Chairman shall forthwith fix and publish in the subdivision the dates on which or before which the various additional

works are to be commenced or carried out.

83. Subject to the exceptions set out in the rules next following, every person who may be deemed to be an inhabitant, within the meaning of the Ordinance, of the village or villages specified in the aforesaid list as interested in each work so selected and approved, shall contribute labour, either in person or by payment of money in commutation, for such number of days not exceeding ten in any one year, as the committee may in respect of each such work specify: provided that no person shall be required to attend for the performance of labour at any

distance exceeding 7 miles from his residence.

84. The following classes of inhabitants shall be exempted from the liability to perform labour:—

- (1) All officers, non-commissioned officers, and soldiers belonging to the staff or to any regiment or corps of His Majesty's Army serving in Ceylon or of the Defence Force.
- (2) Buddhist Priests.
- (3) Indian labourers employed by the Public Works Department or Irrigation Department.
- (4) Inhabitants who are over 55 years of age.

(1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman, upon proof to his satisfaction that any inhabitant liable to contribute labour is by reason of disease or bodily infirmity incapable of performing labour, to exempt such inhabitant from the performance thereof either for life or for such period as may in the circumstances of each case be necessary.

(2) Any person not already exempted for life or other specified period by the Chairman, and desiring to obtain exemption from the performance of labour on any of the above grounds, or on the ground that he is above the age of 55 years, shall, on or before April 30 in the year for which exemption is claimed, make application in that behalf to the Chairman: provided however that the Chairman may in his discretion consider any application presented after the said date.

86. Management.—Where no officer has been appointed under section 36 to carry out any of the following duties the Chairman may authorize (1) the headmen of any village (a) to collect the commutation money, (b) to call out labour, and (c) to supervise the performance of communal labour; and (2) the headman of each wasama to prepare a full list in triplicate of all persons liable under the Ordinance to perform labour on communal works.

The Chairman shall certify the correctness of each list so prepared and shall forawrd one copy thereof to the Kachcheri not later than January 15 of each year. One copy shall be retained by the Chairman and the third copy shall be returned to the headman.

88. On his copy of the list the village headman may enter the number of days' labour performed by each individual as it is carried out, or may note that such person has been exempted by the Chairman of the Village Committee, or if he has paid money in commutation of labour the number of the receipt issued to him.

89. Any person may commute the labour due from him by paying to the headman on or before April 30 of each year such sum not exceeding 32 cents for each day's labour as may be fixed annually by the committee, and

obtaining a receipt therefor.

90. Any person who fails to commute the labour in the manner provided by rule 89 but who may still be desirous of commuting such labour shall be allowed to do so up to May 31 at double the rate fixed for commutation under

91. Any person who has failed to commute his labour either at the single rate or at the double rate as provided for in the two preceding rules shall be liable to perform labour, and the headman shall give to such person eight days' written notice specifying the date, time, and place at which he should perform such labour.

92. No person liable to perform labour shall fail to perform such labour or to commute the same in the manner

provided or having attended for the performance of labour shall fail to do a full day's work each day, a full day's work being defined for these purposes as work from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. with one hour's interval, or work for eight complete hours.

#### Sub-section (29).

- 93. It shall be an offence for any person to be found drunk, or behaving in a disorderly manner, in or near any tavern or any village path or road or public place.
- 94. No person shall use obscene or abusive language likely to provoke a breach of the peace.
- 95: No person shall sing, use, or recite, in or near any public place any obscene song, ballad, or words.
- 96. No person shall loiter in a thoroughfare or public place after 9 o'clock at night without a light or without sufficient cause.

#### Sub-section (30).

97. No holder of a licence under the Excise Ordinance, No. 12 of 1912, or any keeper of a tavern shall sell, or allow any person to sell, to boys under 16 years of age or to females any description of spirits or other intoxicating liquor, or the juice of the coconut or any other palm or of the sugar cane.

#### Sub-section (33).

- 98. Meetings.—(1) Meetings of the Committee shall be held at least once in two months and shall be convened by the Chairman for a day, time, and place to be fixed by him.
- (2) At least five clear days' notice of the day, time, and place of meeting shall be given in writing to each member together with a copy of the agenda, for such meeting.
- (3) The notice shall be signed by the Chairman, and shall be deemed to have been duly served, if in any case where it is not delivered to any member personally, it is left at the usual place of residence of that member.
- Any duly convened meeting may be adjourned to a specified day, time, and place, if a majority of the members present and voting so decides.
- 100. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in rule 98, the Chairman shall, if thereto requested in writing by any seven members of the Committee, summon a meeting of the Committee for a date not later than fourteen days after the receipt of such requisition. The requisition shall state the business to be transacted at such meeting.
- 101. The Chairman shall preserve order at meetings of the Committee and his decision on any disputed point of order shall be final.
- 102. The quorum shall be one-fourth of the total number of the Committee, or six, whichever is greater.
- 103. Commencement of Meetings.—(1) As soon after the hour appointed for any meeting as a quorum shall assemble, the business of the day shall commence. (2) Should a quorum not be present at the expiration of forty-five minutes from the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall not be held.
- Motions.-No member shall bring before the Committee at any meeting any motion which is not set down in the agenda for that meeting: Provided however that any member may, with the permission of the Chairman, bring up a motion of which no notice has been given previously.
- 105. No motion shall be set down in the agenda for any meeting unless written notice of such motion has been received by the Chairman at least ten clear days before the date of such meeting.
- 106. No motion negatived at a meeting shall again be brought forward until after the expiration of at least three months; and no motion, in any way contrary to one already passed by the Committee at any meeting, shall be brought forward until after the expiration of the same period after that meeting.
- 107. Voting.-All questions and resolutions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present and voting. The Chairman shall have the right to vote; and in the event of an equality of votes in any matter he shall have a casting vote in addition.
- 108. Minutes.—(1) A minute book shall be kept by the Chairman and the proceedings of the Committee during each sitting minuted therein in the order in which they occur.
- (2) The minutes of each meeting shall be read and confirmed at the next subsequent meeting.
- 109. Duty of Retiring Chairman.—(1) It shall be the duty of the retiring Chairman to hand over charge of all minute books, accounts, records, furniture, and other property of the Committee, either personally or by a duly authorized person to the new Chairman within twenty-four hours of his receiving a notice from the new Chairman.

(2) If a new Chairman is not elected within fourteen days of the occurrence of the vacancy, the retiring Chairman shall hand over the charge of such articles as aforesaid to the Government Agent, or his representative at the expiration of that period.

#### Sub-section (34).

- 110. (1) The owner or owners of any tree overhanging any building, public road, or path, or field, or well, shall cause such tree or the branches of such tree to be cut down when directed to do so by notice in writing by the Chair-
- (2) In default of compliance with any such notice the Chairman may cause the work to be done and recover the cost thereof as provided by section 72 of the Ordinance out of such fine as may lawfully be imposed upon such defaulting owner for the breach of this rule.
- 111. The owner or occupier of any land on which the carcase of any animal is found shall bury the carcase.
- 112. In the case of the death of any person, the occupier of the premises where the death took place, or in his absence the nearest adult male relative of the deceased, shall be responsible for the proper burial of the corpse.
- 113. No person shall disturb the public repose after 9 P.M. by singing songs, beating tom-toms, or creating any other noise, or disturbance: Provided however that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to affect the existing rights of the people in the matter of religious ceremonies and other customary gatherings.
- 114. No person shall wilfully set fire to any patana or land set apart for the pasturage of cattle, without permission in writing from the Chairman.
- 115. When the jungle in a range of chenas is felled in common, no person shall set fire to it until (a) the time of firing has been settled by a majority of the cultivators, (b) the headman of each of the surrounding village has been notified of the intended date and approximate time, and (c) each such headman has given the fullest possible notice of the time so fixed, by heat of tom-tom or otherwise, so as to prevent the villagers from going into the chena or sending in their cattle at that time.
- 116. No person shall drive a cart, or any other vehicle on any village path or public road within the subdivision at night without a lighted lantern attached to the vehicle.
- 117. All villagers shall whitewash their houses with makulu lime or any other suitable substance at least once a year and at any other time appointed by the Chairman by written notice, if by reason of an outbreak of epidemic disease or on any other similar grounds the Committee resolves that such a step is necessary.
- 118. Every Gansabha Officer appointed by the Committee shall perfect a security bond to the value of Rs. 500 in immovable property by himself or by a surety on his behalf to the satisfaction of the Committee and the Government Agent.

#### SECTION 36.

- The office of "Gansabha Officer" is hereby created for each wasama of the subdivision for the purpose of carrying into effect, or supervising the working of the rules relating to the following matters and the enforcement of the rules generally :
  - (a) the collection of the tax and supervision of works.
  - (b) the preparation of lists of house-holders and Division Officer's rolls.
  - (c) the protection of the village properties.
  - 120. The following rules are hereby repealed:—

THE MEDICAL ORDINANCE, 1927.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor, with the advice of the Medical Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by section 45 (1) (c) of the Medical Ordinance, 1927, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

#### By His Excellency's command,

The Ministry of Health, T. B. PANABOKKE, Colombo, November 5, 1934. Minister for Health.

#### REQUIATIONS.

- 1. For the purposes of the registration of dentists after the date on which these regulations come into force, a certificate, obtained in the manner hereinafter prescribed from the Board of Examiners appointed for that purpose by the College Council, shall be recognized as a sufficient guarantee of the possession by the holder of the requisite knowledge and skill for practice as a dentist.
- 2. Every applicant for the aforesaid certificate shall produce or forward to the Board of Examiners with his application-
  - (a) a certificate of good conduct;

(b) a certificate of general education up to the Oxford or Cambridge Senior Local Standard;

(c) a certificate of 5 years' competent work as assistant in all branches to a Dental Surgeon or a Surgeon Dentist: Provided that no such certificate shall be entertained unless the commencement of such work has been notified to the Registrar, within one month thereof, by that Dental Surgeon or Surgeon Dentist.

- 3. Every applicant will also be required to satisfy the Board of Examiners that he possesses
- (1) a sufficient knowledge of the anatomy of the teeth, mouth, accessory sinuses and associated parts;
- knowledge of respiration and (2) an elementary circulation;
- (3) an elementary knowledge of the processes of inflammation, suppuration, ulceration, and wound infection, and the healing of wounds
- (4) a knowledge of the nature of syphilis and its manifestations in the mouth;
- (5) an elementary knowledge of new growths commonly
- met with in the mouth; sufficient knowledge of the instruments, tools, appliances, drugs, and materials commonly employed in the practice of dentistry;
- (7) a knowledge of the practical means of sterilizing instruments and other appliances, and the use of antiseptics in dental practice;
- (8) a knowledge of anaesthetics local and general, their administration, and the dangers incidental to their use ;
- (9) a degree of knowledge and skill sufficient to warrant the performance of the ordinary operations of dentistry, and the giving of treatment, advice, and
- attendance in simple dental cases;
  (10) a sufficient degree of knowledge and skill in the practice of dental mechanics.
- 4. The regulation under section 12 (4) of the Dentists Registration Ordinance, No. 3 of 1915, published in the Gazette of June 12, 1925, as last amended by Notification in the Gazette of August 11, 1933, and deemed to be a regulation under this Ordinance by virtue of the provisions of section 69 (2) of this Ordinance, is hereby repealed.
