### BY-LAWS.

1. By-law 12 of the "Municipal Leave By-laws" published by Proclamation dated October 26, 1914, in the *Government Gazette* of November 20, 1914, is hereby repealed.

2. The amended by-law 25 of the "Municipal Leave By-laws" published by Proclamation dated September 21, 1933, in the *Government Gazette* of September 29, 1933, is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (1) In paragraph (3) (a) thereof, by the deletion of the words "or do not stand to one another in any immediate relation of superiority or subordination"; and
- (2) In paragraph (3) (b) thereof, by the addition of the following words at the end:—

"or a reasonable allowance in lieu of overtime, as the Council may decide on the recommendation of the Head of the Department, having regard to the circumstances of each case."

#### The Sale of the Right to transport Shed Horns and to export same from the Island of Ceylon.

TENDERS are invited for the purchase of the right to transport within the Island shed horns of spotted deer and sambhur purchased from villagers, or collected, and to export the same from the Island, free of Customs duty during a period of one year commencing from January 1, 1935.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the Office of the Conservator of Forests or a Kachcheri, and a receipt forwarded or produced before any form of tender is issued.

7. A lump sum offer for the full period advertised should be made and be written both in words and figures.

8. No tender form will be issued to any person whose name appears on the list of defaulting contractors or on the list of persons to whom permits to fell and remove timber and fuel from Crown forests should be refused.

9. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and of accepting any portion of a tender. The successful tenderer shall within ten days of receiving notice from the Conservator of Forests or his duly authorized representative that his tender has been accepted, pay the Conservator of Forests the full amount in the tender and in addition a cash security of Rs. 150. He shall also enter into an agreement relative to the right.

10. Should the successful tenderer decline or fail to pay the amount of his tender or the security, or to enter into the agreement as required in the preceding clause his tender from deposit (*vide* clause 6) shall be forfeited and the right shall be resold. He shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such resale but he shall not be entitled to any claim on any increase in price.

11. The right to transport and export shed horns shall not be assigned or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing; nor shall the purchaser issue a power of attorney to any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors, published from time to time, for the carrying on of any work under the agreement.

12. As soon as the agreement is completed, the purchaser will be issued permits by the Divisional Forest Officers for transport of shed horns within the provinces under the jurisdiction of the respective Divisional Forest Officers. He or his accredited agents shall concentrate all shed horns transported by him under the permit at a store or stores the situation of which he shall notify the respective Divisional Forest Officers, as soon as the agreement is signed. The horns so concentrated shall always be subject to inspection by Forest Officers as also when they are in transit in any part of the Island. Separate permits should be obtained to transport the shed horns to Colombo from a provincial centre from the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction such centre lies.

13. The purchaser shall submit a list of names of his agents for approval to the different Divisional Forest Officers. Any changes of agents should be similarly reported to the Divisional Forest Officers for their approval. If the Divisional Forest Officers disapprove of the employment of particular persons or agents the purchaser shall immediately discontinue such agents.

*The Sub-section referred to :—*Lapsed leave is not intended to be granted to officers who do not return thereafter for a reasonably long period of further service under Government. If an officer to whom lapsed leave has been granted retires, or is for any reason compulsorily retired, without returning to duty, or after returning to duty for a period less than the period of the lapsed vacation leave granted, the grant of lapsed leave shall become subject to revision and may be converted into a grant of half pay leave, or, if no period of duty intervenes between the lapsed leave and the officer's retirement, the Governor may order that the officer's retirement, shall be retrospective with effect from the date on which the period of lapsed leave commenced. Heads of Departments should obtain instructions on all such cases from the Deputy Chief Secretary before submitting the pension papers of the officers concerned. When lapsed leave is converted into half pay leave under this sub-section the half salary to be refunded may be deducted from any pension or retiring allowance for which the officer retiring may be eligible, by such instalments as the Treasury may direct.

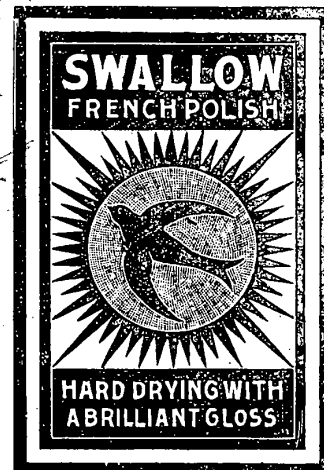
