KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers in Us vested by section 6B of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, as amended by the Village Communities (Amendment) Ordinance, 1933, We, the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice of the Executive Committee of Local Administration do by this Proclamation—

REGULATIONS made by the Governor under Article 10 of the Ceylon Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Order in Council, 1934.

Regulations.

1. It shall be lawful for the Collector to issue at any time a licence, in Form G of the schedule to these regulations, authorizing the reimportation of any specified quantity of any class of regulated textiles, if the fact of the exportation from the Island, and the identity, of that specified quantity are established, by proof of registration at the Customs Office prior to exportation or by any other adequate proof, to the satisfaction of the Collector.

2. Regulated textiles of any class reimported under a licence in Form G, shall not be taken into account for the purpose of determining whether any quota in respect of that class of regulated textiles has been attained.

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.*Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.*

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, approved under section 12 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on December 19, 1933, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Polpitiya Pidiwillewewa irrigation work in the Kurunegala District, and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

3. Terms agreed upon—

(1) The construction of the following item of the necessary work, namely, a 70 feet clear overfall spill in cement concrete up to the estimated cost of Rs. 1,900 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete earthworks in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Government Agent, and for this purpose each of the proprietors agrees—

- (a) to complete six cubes of earthwork, in respect of each acre owned by him under the aforesaid irrigation work ;
- (b) to contribute the necessary labour in person, free of all charges ; or in commutation of such labour, to contribute money, on or before June 30 of the year in which such labour is due at the rate of Re. 1.50 for each cube of earthwork, for the completion of which he is liable ; and
- (c) to complete all earthworks by September 30, 1935.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

“On assuming office every Vel-Vidane shall by the hypothecation either of a cash deposit of Rs. 250 or of lands of that value, give security to the Assistant Government Agent for the proper disposal of Government moneys advanced to him or in his charge and for the payment of any compensation that may be awarded by the Assistant Government Agent in respect of any damage caused to any proprietor through any malicious act of the Vel-Vidane.”

(II.) by the deletion of rule 5 and the substitution of the following therefor :—

“5 (a) The cultivation of lands under the schemes shall be confined to the yala and maha harvests.

THE text of the Exchange Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the German Government signed at Berlin on August 10, 1934, is set out hereunder for general information.

TEXT.

Exchange Agreement for Commercial Payments between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the German Government.

Berlin, August 10, 1934.

THE Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the German Government, desiring to facilitate commercial payments, have agreed as follows :—

ARTICLE 1.

(a) German firms, which hold a general exchange permit under paragraph III, 3 of the German Exchange Control Regulations of the 23rd June, 1932, as revised on the 7th December, 1933, (hereinafter called “the Regulations”), and which purchase goods falling under this Agreement within the scope of the business which they have hitherto carried on, may, in so far as the sums in foreign exchange allotted to them monthly under the German Exchange Control are insufficient to pay for these goods, make payments in reichsmarks for the account of their British creditors in respect of the amounts remaining due into a Special Account to be opened at the Reichsbank in the name of the Bank of England, subject to the provisions of this Agreement. Such Special Account is hereinafter called “the Special Account.”

(b) Firms established in the United Kingdom, to which a general exchange permit has been issued under paragraph III, 5-8 of the Regulations for the collection and transfer of sums due from German firms for the delivery of goods, may pay in reichsmarks the amounts, which they may not dispose of under the German Exchange Control, into the Special Account, subject to the provisions of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 2.

The payments into the Special Account provided for in Article 1 of this Agreement may only be made in respect of the transactions defined and subject to the conditions laid down in Articles 3 and 4. Further, the Reichsbank may suspend payments into the Special Account at any time at which the total unsold amount in the Special Account exceeds 5 million reichsmarks. As soon as the amount in the Special Account has again fallen below 5 million reichsmarks the Reichsbank shall permit the resumption of payments into the Special Account in accordance with this Agreement.

ARTICLE 3.

(a) Payments may be made into the Special Account in respect of purchases of goods produced or manufactured in the United Kingdom or goods which have been processed in the United Kingdom (hereinafter called “United Kingdom goods”).

(b) In the case of a holder of a permit under paragraph III, 3 of the Regulations, proof that the payment is in respect of United Kingdom goods shall be furnished by the production of the original invoices. The holder shall at the same time declare that, according to the best of his knowledge, the payment is in respect of United Kingdom goods.

(c) In the case of a holder of a permit under paragraph III, 5-8 of the Regulations, the German buyer may make payment without special permit to an account kept at a bank in Germany under paragraph III, 5-8 of the Regulations. In order to furnish proof that the payment is in respect of United Kingdom goods the German buyer shall furnish the bank with the original invoices of the supplying firm in the United Kingdom. The latter firm shall in each case send a duplicate of the invoices to the bank where the above account is kept and shall state on these invoices that to the best of its knowledge the goods are United Kingdom goods.

(d) Subject to the conditions set out above and to the provisions of Article 2, the holder of a permit under paragraph III, 3 of the Regulations has the right to make payments without limit into the Special Account; and the holder of an account under paragraph III, 5-8 of the Regulations has the right to make transfers without limit from this account to the Special Account.

ARTICLE 4.

(a) Payments may be made into the Special Account in respect of purchases of goods other than United Kingdom goods, if it is proved that the German buyer of these goods had purchased the like goods before the 1st January, 1933, through a firm established in the United Kingdom, in appreciable quantities and regularly, even though there may have been intervals of time between his purchases. In order to furnish proof that these conditions are complied with—

- (i) the holder of a permit under paragraph III, 3 of the Regulations shall produce invoices relating to the period before the 1st January, 1933, or other proofs;
- (ii) the holder of a permit under paragraph III, 5-8 of the Regulations shall produce the certificate of a Chamber of Commerce in the United Kingdom.

(b) Goods produced or manufactured in any British Colony or overseas territory, any territory under British protection or any mandated territory in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom and not falling under paragraph (a) of this Article shall nevertheless be regarded as falling under the said paragraph (a) when purchased direct by a German firm from a firm established in any of the said territories. Proof that the payment is in respect of such goods shall be furnished in a manner corresponding to that provided for in paragraph (b) of Article 3.

(c) For goods falling under this Article payments or transfers to the Special Account shall, without prejudice to the provisions of Article 2, be permitted only to the extent of 10 per cent. of the basic amount assigned to the firm concerned in its general permit under paragraph III, 3 or paragraph III, 5-8 of the Regulations. In the calculation of this amount, namely 10 per cent. of the basic amount, payments already made in foreign exchange during the same month to firms in the United Kingdom or in any of the territories mentioned in paragraph (b) of this Article shall not be taken into account.

(d) In the event of an increase in the percentage up to which the general permits under paragraph III, 3 and paragraph III, 5-8 of the Regulations may be utilised from time to time, the 10 per cent. referred to in the preceding paragraph may be increased by twice the amount of the increase in respect of the general permits.

(e) The German Government is prepared to examine sympathetically the possibility of granting special permits for payments into the Special Account in respect of goods to be specified later by the Government of the United Kingdom, having regard to the German exchange position at the time.

ARTICLE 5.

The Government of the United Kingdom will ascertain, in suitable cases and as far as it is able to do so, whether the payments made into the Special Account do in fact relate to transactions falling within this Agreement.

ARTICLE 6.

The Bank of England may at any time dispose of the amounts paid in reichsmarks into the Special Account for

the purpose of making payments in Germany for goods exported from Germany to the United Kingdom or for effecting other payments in Germany approved by the Reichsbank. The disposal of these amounts and the detailed working of the Special Account shall be subject to such conditions as may be agreed between the Bank of England and the Reichsbank.

ARTICLE 7.

The Bank of England may also, after the date of the termination of this Agreement, dispose, under the provisions of Article 6, of any sums remaining in the Special Account until they are exhausted.

ARTICLE 8.

Exchange losses or losses of interest arising in connection with payments through the Special Account may be made good to the creditor by subsequent payments into the Special Account by the German debtor, in cases where the debtor and creditor have agreed that this method of payment shall be used.

ARTICLE 9.

Permits already given by the competent German authorities for direct setting-off of debts between German and United Kingdom firms shall not be affected by this Agreement. With the approval of these authorities, permits may also be given in future for such direct setting-off of debts.

ARTICLE 10.

If, as the result of future exchange measures taken by the German Government, a diversion should occur of trade in particular articles in handling which United Kingdom firms have habitually played the part of intermediaries, the German Government will be prepared to enter into immediate negotiations at the request of the Government of the United Kingdom, with a view to ensuring the maintenance of the proportional share of such intermediaries in the supply of these goods to Germany.

ARTICLE 11.

The contracting Governments recognise that the additional facilities, outside the general exchange control provisions, afforded by this Agreement for the export of goods from the United Kingdom to Germany, are not intended to lead to any substantial alteration in the existing proportion between exports from the United Kingdom to Germany and exports from Germany to the United Kingdom. Should any such substantial alteration occur, the present Agreement shall forthwith be reconsidered by both parties.

ARTICLE 12.

If difficulties should arise in the application of this Agreement, the contracting Governments will immediately consult together.

ARTICLE 13.

This Agreement shall come into force on the 20th August, 1934. It may be terminated by either contracting Government after two weeks' notice.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorised by their respective Governments, have signed this Agreement.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 20, 1934, at 9 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated October 15, 1934.

Present :—Mr. E. T. Dyson, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. Walter Beven ; Mr. O. T. Nettleton ; Dr. D. T. de Kretser.

Before proceeding with the business of the meeting, Ratwatte Adigar moved—

“ That the Council place on record its sense of sorrow at the death of Mrs. W. L. Kindersley, who was connected with various movements seeking the welfare of the poorer classes of this town for several years and express its sympathy with Mr. W. L. Kindersley on his sad bereavement ”.

The motion was passed, all members standing.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 15, 1934, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1933 to September 30, 1934, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for September, 1934.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September, 1934.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended October 20, 1934.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of “ The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910 ”, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during September, 1934. (b) Report of the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3A. Mr. de Silva referred to the New Water Scheme and desired the Chairman to take steps as Government Agent for taking possession of the land required for the Water Scheme pending acquisition.

4. Petitions :—Ratwatte Adigar presented (1) petition from Mr. S. M. Mohideen dated October 15, 1934, applying for a beef stall at the market ; and

Mr. Usoof Ismail presented (2) petition from Mr. J. A. E. Rogers asking the Council to open a road through Bahirawakanda.

The Chairman agreed to refer (1) to the Markets Committee, and (2) to the Works Committee for consideration.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail asked the following questions, which the Chairman replied :—
Will the Chairman be pleased to state—

(a) Q.—How far the work connected with the Mahaweli-ganga pumping scheme has progressed ? A.—In addition to the trial well, 3 intake wells are in course of construction. These have been sunk to a depth of 26 feet below ground level. Maximum depth will be 36 feet. According to contract the 3 wells should be completed by January 31, 1935. The owners of the land have granted permission for the Council to carry out work on wells pending acquisition. The

application for acquisition was made on June 2, 1934, and the matter is now in the hands of the Government Agent. The Council has sanctioned for the present acquisition of land, construction of 3 wells, dry well, road and fencing only. The execution of the rest of the Scheme is deferred until the 3 wells are completed.

(b) Q.—Is there any inordinate delay in securing the crane and grab from the Government for well excavation work? A.—No inordinate delay. A heavier type of crane and grab was originally arranged for but on account of inaccessibility to site without a proper approach road a smaller grab and a steam winch have been borrowed instead. A sum of Rs. 200 was remitted to the Director of Public Works on the 10th instant to meet the cost of putting the winch and grab into order and loading them on rail. The plant is daily expected.

(c) Q.—Is it true that work has been suspended by the contractor in the absence of necessary machinery? A.—Yes, from the 10th instant. This is due to the well excavations having reached water level and the difficulty to employ manual labour for further excavations. The use of the pulsometer for pumping water and crane and grab for excavation at this stage are very necessary.

(d) Q.—Is the absence of the Engineer interfering with expeditious carrying out of the work on the Scheme? A.—No.

(e) Q.—How long will it take for the Scheme to be completed? A.—(1) The initial scheme of sinking 3 wells will be completed by January 31, 1935, according to the terms of contract. (2) Dry well, road and fencing, will be completed within 6 months of acquisition of land. (3) The rest of the Scheme, i.e., erection of pumping set, filtration plant, pipe line, storage tank, &c., should be completed within 18 months of its being undertaken. More definite information could be had on the Municipal Engineer's return in January next.

(f) Q.—In the eventuality of the drought continuing, would it be possible to supply water by lorry from the experimental well to Peradeniya area? A.—Water is available in the well, but the site is inaccessible to our lorry until the road is opened.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on September 15, 1934.

(1) To consider arrangements for a Legal Adviser and Proctor to the Council in succession to Mr. Chas. Vanderwall, deceased.—Recommended appointment of either Messrs. Liesching & Lee, or Mr. Banning de Vos.

(2) Letter dated August 24, 1934, from Mrs. Holland Vanderwall applying for a gratuity in consideration of the services rendered to the Council by her husband, Mr. Chas. Vanderwall, deceased, as the Council's lawyer.—Recommended a gratuity of 3 months' pay, viz., Rs. 500.

(3) To consider estimate for Rs. 650 from the Municipal Engineer for preparing a portion of the area evacuated by temporary boutiques for the purpose of shifting the Fair Day thereto, and to arrive at a decision on the connected question of the removal of the Fair Day to Mahaiyawa, consideration of which was deferred for one year at the last Budget meeting.—Recommended vote for Rs. 130, i.e., omitting the item for gravelling. Recommended to have the fair at the proposed market area commencing from January 1, 1935.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on September 15, 1934.

(4) To obtain sanction for the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 81·30 out of the saving of Rs. 330 from the vote allowed for extending retaining wall in Gregory road on the erection of a retaining wall on the opposite side of this road facing Miss Fleming's bungalow.—Recommended.

(5) To obtain sanction for the employment of a substitute in place of nuisance watcher Amith during the absence of the latter on sick leave on the basis of the substitute's wages being paid out of Amith's available salary.—Recommended.

(6) To obtain a vote for Rs. 1,500 for meeting the expenditure connected with the preliminary arrangements for the supply of chlorinated lake water to the public.—Recommended.

(7) To obtain sanction for the employment of one day watcher and one night watcher at a wage of 75 cents each per diem at the site of the Minor River Pumping Scheme to watch over the tools and materials belonging to the Council and the Public Works Department, left there.—Recommended.

(8) To obtain a vote for Rs. 61·25 representing the claim and costs payable by Council in the action against it in C. R., Kandy, case No. 13,814 and sanction to write off Rs. 83·50 incurred by Council as legal expenses.—Recommended.

(9) To sanction the appropriation of the saving of Rs. 125 on the estimate provided for improvement of Mahaiyawa cattle shed for the purpose of purchasing 15 dust bins for the model tenements and labourers' lines at Mahaiyawa.—Recommended.

(10) To consider the desirability of restoring to normal the rents on markets stalls and spaces, which were reduced by 10 per cent. in 1931 in consideration of the prevailing trade depression, as from January 1, 1935.—Recommended.

(11) To consider the question of asking Government to pay water rate on bungalows and buildings connected with the Peradeniya Royal Botanical Gardens, exempted from the rate in 1923, in view of the obligation to do so implied in the acceptance of the Financial Regulations Commission's recommendations by Government in 1926.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on September 15, 1934.

(12) To consider the suggestion of the Municipal Engineer as regards the desirability of adopting a definite system for the dredging of Kandy lake and removal of silt outside the water-shed area of the lake. (C 148).—Recommended the adoption of the Municipal Engineer's suggestion.

(13) To obtain sanction for the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 25,000 out of Loan Funds for the completion of the Deyannawela Model Dwelling Scheme.—Recommended application for loan. Meanwhile details of expenditure on the sanctioned estimate of Rs. 249,000 to be prepared and papers to be re-circulated.

(14) Tenders received for the erection of a building to provide housing accommodation for Miss Fernando and other members of her family in lot A of the land proposed to be leased to her at the head of the lake on the basis of the Council meeting this expense out of compensation of Rs. 250 provided to her for the purpose as an act of grace.—Recommended to accept James' tender for Rs. 230.

(15) To obtain a vote for Rs. 30 to meet the expenditure required for fencing the Meda-ela at its entrance into the Jail road culvert to prevent its pollution.—Recommended.

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on September 15, 1934.

(16) Further explanation from Mr. D. W. Calugama, Chief Meter Inspector, Electricity Department, in regard to his alleged failure to report the unauthorized connection of the private installation at the Imperial Motor Garages, Ltd., with the Municipal Installation.—Recommended to stop Mr. Calugama's increment for one year.

Resolutions of Council on the Standing Committee recommendations.

Item (1)—(a) Resolved that the fee payable to the Council's Legal Adviser and Proctor be fixed at Rs. 1,200 per annum, payable monthly.

(b) Three candidates were voted upon by ballot, viz., Messrs. Liesching & Lee, Mr. Banning de Vos, and Mr. C. N. D. Jonklaas, and Mr. de Vos was duly elected as the Council's Legal Adviser and Proctor.

Item (3)—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted subject to the conditions that—(a) no buildings are allowed in the new area; and (b) that the occupation of areas other than roads in the present Fair Day area are permitted for use on Fair Days.

Item (6)—Resolved that a vote of Rs. 2,500 be allowed.

Items (2), (4), (5), and (7) to (16)—Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

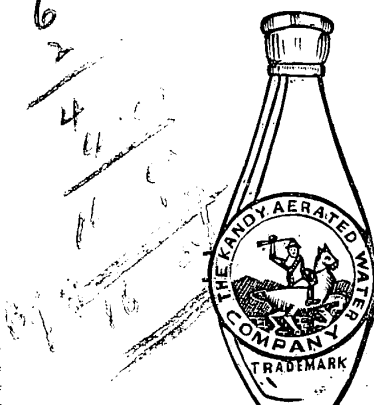

An improved match-stick cutting machine.

Abstract.—The machine is driven by hand and comprises means by which the piece of timber to be cut first passes over a roller in which knife blades are set for the purpose of marking it into match stick lengths, then over a splitter comprising twenty knife blades which make deeply impressed cuts lengthwise and finally it meets two horizontally placed knives which separate off the match sticks.
