BY-LAW.

By-law 10 of the by-laws relating to leave of the Municipal Council of Colombo published by Proclamation dated October 26, 1914, in the *Gazette* of November 20, 1914, as amended by Proclamations dated June 15, 1921, February 28, 1927, and August 13, 1930, published in the *Gazette* of June 17, 1921, of March 4, 1927, and of August 15, 1930, respectively, is hereby further amended by the addition of the following at the end thereof :—

(iv.) Lapsed leave is not intended to be granted to officers who do not return thereafter for a reasonably long period of further service under Council. If an officer to whom lapsed leave has been granted retires, or is for any reason compulsorily retired, without returning to duty, or after returning to duty for a period less than the period of the lapsed vacation leave granted, the grant of lapsed leave shall become subject to revision and may be converted into a grant of half pay leave, or, if no period of duty intervenes between the lapsed leave and the officer's retirement, the Council may order that the officer's retirement, shall be retrospective with effect from the date on which the period of lapsed leave commenced.

When lapsed leave is converted into half pay leave under this paragraph the half salary to be refunded may be deducted from any pension or retiring allowance for which the officer retiring may be eligible, by such instalments as the Council may direct.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE KEEPING OF PIGS.

1. No pig shall be kept within the limits of the Council except in a sty or enclosure situated, if land is available, at a distance of not less than 50 feet, and in every other case, at a distance of not less than 20 feet from any dwelling house or place of human habitation or from any well, spring, or water supply.

2. Every pigsty or enclosure shall be subject to inspection by the officers of the Council and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.

3. Every pig found straying outside the sty or enclosure in which it should be kept shall be liable to seizure by any person thereto authorized by the Chairman in writing.

4. Every pig so seized shall be placed in a pound, and the following charges shall be paid before the removal of any pig so impounded, viz :—

For occupation, 50 cents a head for a day or part of a day.
For food, if supplied, 15 cents a head for a day or part of a day.

5. Every pig seized and not claimed and removed within three days may be sold by public auction and the charges and costs recovered from the proceeds.

BY-LAW.

The by-laws published by Notification in the *Gazette* of July 14, 1933, are hereby amended with effect from January 1, 1935, as follows :—

- (a) by the insertion of the words "hair dressing saloon, barber's shop," after the word "factory" and before the word "or" in line 5 of by-law 2; and
- (b) by the addition of the following by-laws after those regarding "Public Bathing Places" :—

HAIR-DRESSING SALOONS OR BARBERS' SHOPS.

I.—Conditions of Issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to keep a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions :—

1. That the building is of permanent materials, well lighted and well ventilated, with a floor space of not less than 120 square feet. The walls shall be lime-plastered and lime-washed; the roof provided with a wooden or other similar ceiling painted white; and the floor shall be cemented, with rounded corners at its junction with the walls.

2. That it is provided with adequate drainage and latrine accommodation.

3. That the living quarters, if any, attached to a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop conform to the requirements of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.

4. That a sufficient supply of water is available at all times on the premises.

5. That the saloon or shop is provided with means for securing a supply of boiling water adequate for the purpose of sterilizing implements and washing the appliances in daily use.

6. That a sufficient supply of towels and overalls is available for the use of the customers.

7. That facilities are provided for the barbers to wash their hands during the course of their work.

8. That the saloon or shop is provided with a sufficient number of spittoons which shall be kept by the seats readily available to customers and employees.

9. That for the reception of hair and sweepings a movable sanitary bin made of galvanized iron of other equally suitable and impervious material is provided and kept covered with a close-fitting lid.

10. That each washstand is provided with a vessel for a disinfectant for sterilizing razors, scissors, clippers, or other instruments.

11. A tray with disinfectants shall be kept in the saloon for keeping the instruments and combs after use.

II.—Regulations for Licensed Hair-dressing Saloons.

1. Every licensee of a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the

outside of his premises a board with the words "Licensed Hair-dressing Saloon" or "Licensed Barber's Shop."

2. Every licensee of a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall cause a copy of these regulations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil to be framed and hung up in a prominent place on the premises.

3. The walls of every Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall be lime-washed and the ceiling painted twice a year in the months of June and December.

4. No Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall be used as a place for sleeping or eating during the night or day.

5. No person suffering from or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop or be employed therein in any capacity. Every person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall submit himself for examination by the Medical Officer of Health and obtain a certificate from him to the effect that such person is free from any infectious or contagious disease. The certificate will be issued free of charge.

6. Every person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall observe the utmost cleanliness in his work. He shall keep his person and his wearing apparel clean and in a sanitary condition. He shall keep his finger-nails short and clean and shall wash his hands with soap and water immediately before attending each customer.

7. The floor, walls, ceiling, furniture, and fixtures of every Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall be kept clean at all times.

8. The razors, scissors, and other implements shall be disinfected immediately after each occasion on which they are used and before they are employed for another customer by dipping them in boiling water or by any other method approved of by the Medical Officer of Health.

Such razors, scissors, and other implements, when not in use, shall be kept in the tray with disinfectants provided for the purpose.

9. All spittoons shall always be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Each spittoon shall be emptied and cleansed once daily, or more frequently if necessary, with a disinfectant approved by the Medical Officer of Health, and a small quantity of disinfectant left in the spittoon.

10. Hair-brushes and combs shall be thoroughly washed, cleaned, and sterilized every day before use and kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.

11. Shaving mugs, cups, and shaving brushes shall be thoroughly rinsed in hot water after each occasion on which they are used.

12. The use of styptic pencils, powder puffs, and sponges is forbidden. Alum or other material used to stop bleeding shall be applied in powder or liquid form.

13. Every licensee shall supply each customer with fresh clean towels and overalls. All towels or overalls shall be boiled and laundered after each occasion on which they are used.

14. No person shall expectorate within the premises except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

15. No person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall attend on any customer who is suffering from an infectious skin disease or any other infectious ailment.

16. If it so happens that a customer with any visible skin disease has been attended to, the hands of the barber shall be immediately cleansed and the instruments used sterilized.

17. After attention to each customer all hair cuttings shall be gathered and deposited in the sanitary dust bin provided. Such cuttings shall on no account be allowed to lie about in the premises.

MARKETS.

1. Within a radius of 2 miles of any village market or fair established by the Committee, no market commodities shall, on any day on which such market or fair is held, be sold at any private market or fair other than a permanent boutique or by any person other than a hawk or itinerant vendor or the owner, owner's agent, or lessee of a permanent boutique.

2. (1) Rents or fees in accordance with the rates set out in Schedule A shall be paid by every holder of a stall, space, or seat in a village market or fair, in advance or on demand, to the Chairman or to such person as may be authorized by the Chairman to recover the same.
(2) The Chairman or other authorized person shall furnish a receipt for any rent or fee paid to him.

3. (1) A notice in English and in Sinhalese setting out the table of the aforesaid rents and fees shall be posted up in a conspicuous place at each village market or fair.
(2) It shall be an offence for any person to demand or recover sums higher than those authorized by such notice.

4. Every occupant of a stall, space, or seat in any village market or fair shall keep such stall, space, or seat clean and free from filth or rubbish.

5. No person using or occupying any portion of a village market or fair shall—

- (a) behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market or fair; or
- (b) carry on any cooking in any such market or fair;
- (c) damage or in anywise deface or pollute any portion of the building or any property of the inhabitants in or about such market or fair.

6. (1) It shall be the duty of the keeper or person appointed by the Chairman to superintend a village market or fair to maintain order within the limits of the market or fair.

(2) No person shall obstruct or resist any person appointed by the Chairman to superintend any village market or fair or to collect the rents or fees or to enforce order or cleanliness therein, in the lawful execution.

7. No occupant of a stall, space, or seat in any village market or fair shall enclose in any way any portion of such market or fair or erect any permanent awning or screen or fixture of any kind without the written permission of the Chairman.

8. No person suffering or who has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall occupy any stall, space, or seat in any village market or fair, until the periods of incubation and of infection have elapsed.

9. No cart or vehicle shall remain within the premises of any village market or fair for a longer period than is necessary for loading or unloading.

10. (1) No private market or fair shall be established, held, used, or occupied except on an annual licence.

(2) Such licence shall be issued by the Chairman in the form set out in Schedule B and shall expire on the 31st day of December each year.

(3) The issue of every such licence and the refusal to issue or to renew a licence shall be subject to the approval of the Committee.

1. A table of rents and fees leviable at the private fair or market written in the Sinhalese and English languages shall be placed on a conspicuous place in the fair or market.

2. No person shall be allowed to have or to expose for sale in any stall or elsewhere within the premises of any private fair or market any article the possession or sale of which therein has been prohibited by the Village Committee by notice under the hand of the Chairman posted in such fair or market.

3. No person suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease shall be permitted to occupy any stall or place in any private fair or market, or to expose any article for sale therein.

4. The licensee of every private fair or market shall keep the premises of such fair or market clean and free from filth and rubbish; he shall not dispose of or deposit any filth, rubbish, sweepings or debris whatsoever on any Government or other road or in any roadside drain or in any other premises whatsoever, or permit them so to be disposed

of or deposited, but shall cause them to be so buried or burnt as to avoid the breeding of flies or the creation of any other nuisance.

5. The licensee of every private fair or market shall render assistance to the headman and police in maintaining order within the premises of such fair or market.

6. The licensee of every private fair or market shall provide a separate portion of land within the premises of such fair or market, or in the vicinity thereof, for the parking of carts.

7. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Village Committee to suspend this licence during the continuance of any epidemic of disease, on the certificate of the Medical Officer of Health for the District that such suspension is necessary in the interest of the public health, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such suspension.

8. Any licensee contravening any of the foregoing conditions or permitting gambling or disorderly conduct on the premises of the fair or market, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on his second or any subsequent conviction thereof, be liable in addition to such fine as may be imposed to have his licence cancelled without any compensation or refund of any part of the fees paid by him.

RULES.

Village Markets.

1. In these rules the expression "Village market" shall mean any market heretofore maintained and controlled by the Village Committee of this subdivision and any market that may hereafter be established by the Committee.

2. (1) Information of every proposal to establish or to close down a village market shall be given by the Chairman by beat of tom-tom or by written notice exhibited at conspicuous places, and two weeks' time shall in every case be allowed for the public to lodge any objection they may have to urge against the proposal.

(2) No such proposal shall be discussed or voted on by the Committee, until the two weeks so allowed have elapsed and the objections received have been considered.

3. Any land required for the establishment of a village market may be purchased or taken on lease by the Committee with the sanction of the Government Agent.

4. Any agreement or other document necessary for the purpose of any purchase or lease under the foregoing rule 3, and any security given by the inhabitants of this subdivision in respect of any loan, may be signed by the Chairman.

5. Every village market shall be open from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M. on the days on which the market is held.

6. Every person bringing in any vehicle and using the premises and the roads and approaches of any village market for the purpose of loading or unloading goods, or using a stall seat or space in a village market, shall pay for such use a rent or fee according to the rates set out in the schedule to these rules.

7. For the purpose of collecting fees and rents at any village market the Committee may appoint such number of market-keepers as may be necessary; and every such market-keeper may be paid a fee not exceeding Rs. 5 a month.

8. No member of the Committee shall be eligible for appointment as market-keeper.

9. (1) The rent or fee payable in respect of the use of the premises or of any stall seat or space shall be paid in advance on demand to the Chairman or to any market-keeper appointed for the purpose or to any person authorized by the Chairman to collect such rent or fee.

(2) The market-keeper or authorized person shall furnish a receipt for any rent or fee paid to him.

10. Every occupant of a stall, space, or seat in any village market shall keep such stall, space, or seat clean and free from filth or rubbish.

11. No person using or occupying any portion of a village market shall—

- (a) behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about the market, or
- (b) carry on cooking in the market, or
- (c) damage or in any way deface or pollute any portion of the building or any property of the Committee in or about the market.

12. No person shall sell or expose for sale any cooked food at any village market except in such portions of the market as are set apart for the purpose and indicated by notice or sign exhibited on the spot by or under the authority of the Chairman.

13. No occupant of a stall in a village market shall enclose in any way that stall or any other portion of the market, or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind without the permission of the Chairman.

14. No person suffering or who has recently suffered from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease shall occupy any stall seat or place in a village market or expose for sale thereat any provisions whatsoever until the period of infection or of incubation is over.

15. No cart or vehicle shall remain within the premises of any village market for a longer period than is necessary for loading and unloading.

16. Within a radius of 1 mile of any village market, no market commodities shall, on any day on which the village market is held, be sold within this subdivision at any private market, or fair or stall other than a permanent boutique or by any person other than a hawk or itinerant vendor or the owner, agent, or lessee of a permanent boutique.

17. (1) It shall be the duty of the market-keeper to maintain order within the limits of the market.

(2) No person shall obstruct or resist the market-keeper or any person appointed by the Chairman to superintend any village market or to collect the rents or fees or to enforce order or cleanliness therein, whilst in the execution of his duty.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, October 20, 1934, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated October 15, 1934.**

Present:—Mr. C. J. D. Lanktree, Acting Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. M. Saheed Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; and Mr. C. H. Bradley.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 15, 1934, were amended as regards item 16 by the addition of the following sentence at the end of paragraph 2 thereof:—"Mr. J. E. Perera also read a letter received from Mr. A. M. Saheed, who was unavoidably prevented from attending the meeting, in which he (Mr. Saheed) referred to the good work done by the Chairman.

The Minutes, as amended, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Four petitions were presented by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka, one by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, and two by Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya. These were tabled, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) How many houses have become uninhabitable owing to the recent floods? (2) How many of them are occupied by the owners (in each ward)?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Thirty houses have totally collapsed and 52 houses have partly collapsed as a result of the recent floods. (2) In the case of houses which have totally collapsed 2 in Ward 4, 5 in Ward 5, 1 in Ward 6, and 3 in Ward 7. In the case of houses which have partly collapsed: 1 in Ward 2 (which is still occupied), 13 in Ward 4 (8 of which are still occupied), 12 in Ward 5 (8 of which are still occupied), 2 in Ward 6 (which are still occupied), and 8 in Ward 7 (6 of which are still occupied).

4. The following questions stood in the name of Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya:—(1) How many landlords have been served with notices by the Medical Officer of Health during the years 1933 and 1934 to convert pit latrines into dry-earth latrines? (2) Of these how many outside the Police area have been served with notices? (3) Is the Chairman aware that the owner-occupiers residing outside the Police area are unable to undergo the expense of converting their existing latrines into dry-earth latrines on account of poverty? (4) Will the Chairman be pleased to suspend the service of notices, outside the Police area, until conditions improve?

The Chairman stated that the replies to these questions were not ready and that they would be answered at the next meeting.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) That this Council respectfully appeals to His Excellency the Governor to order that the Sinhalese Crown and Throne be exhibited in Galle. Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka seconded. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo spoke against the motion. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 6 votes to 1.

(2) That this Council is of opinion that the houses which were occupied by the owners and damaged by the floods and rendered unfit for human habitation be rebuilt at the expense of the Municipal Council. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, but suggested that the motion be amended to read as follows:—"That the owner-occupiers of houses within Municipal limits damaged by the recent floods be given financial assistance to rebuild them if the Council is satisfied that such

assistance is necessary." This was agreed to. It was then resolved, on the suggestion of the Chairman, that the motion, as amended, be referred for consideration to the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance and Assessment—with Mr. A. C. Mohammedo as co-opted member.

6. To consider an application made to the Government Agent, Southern Province, by the Galle Gymkhana Club for the lease of a plot of land on the Ramparts behind the Tennis Pavilion for the purpose of erecting a Billiard Room:—Resolved that the Government Agent be informed that the Council has no objection to the lease of the plot of land in question to the Galle Gymkhana Club for the purpose mentioned in the application.

7. To consider the results of the sales of market stalls, betel sheds, and fruit trees for 1935:—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee.

Meat Market.—Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved that the sales of stalls 7, 13, and 14 be confirmed, that stalls 1 to 6 be reserved for other purposes, and that stalls 8 to 12 be resold at an upset price of Rs. 105 for each. Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo moved as an amendment that the sales held on September 25, 1934, be confirmed. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded. The amendment was first put to the meeting and carried by 6 votes to 4. The motion was then put to the meeting and declared lost. Mr. A. M. Saheed moved, further, that stalls 3, 4, 6, and 8, for which there were no bids, be resold at an upset price of Rs. 60 for each. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.—Carried.

Offal Market.—Resolved that the sales of stalls 3 and 6 and Room No. 2 be confirmed and that the remaining stalls for which there were no bids be resold at the upset price fixed by Council.

Kaluwella Markets.—Resolved that the two stalls in the meat market and the six stalls in the vegetable market be resold at the upset prices fixed by Council.

Betel Sheds.—Resolved that the sale of the betel shed in the Bazaar to M. M. A. Samad be confirmed and as regards the betel shed in the Fort that the offer made by the present lessee to renew the lease at the same rental be accepted.

Fruit trees.—Resolved that the sales be confirmed.

Green Market.—Resolved that the sales of stalls 42, 48, and 50 for Rs. 24, 23, and 33, respectively, be confirmed.

Fish Market.—Resolved that the sale of stalls 10 and 11 for the remaining period of the current year for Rs. 5.50 be confirmed, and that stalls 10, 11, and 17 for which there were no bids for 1935, be resold.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above resolutions of the Councils in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

8. To sanction the following supplemental votes for the current year:—Rs. 250 under Head 15, Holiday warrants, Rs. 200 under Head 73, Upkeep and lighting of Town Clock:—Sanctioned.

9. To consider the question of appointing a temporary clerk to assist in the Assessment Department for 2 months on a salary of Re. 1 per working day:—Resolved that the services of a temporary clerk be engaged for 2 months on a salary of Re. 1 per diem.

With the permission of Council the following three items which did not appear on the agenda were next taken up for consideration.

10. To consider a letter received from the Board of Management of the Free Ayurvedic Medical Hall regarding the establishment of an additional free dispensary within Municipal limits:—Resolved that the matter be considered with the budget for 1935 and that meanwhile the papers be circulated to members.

11. To consider the question of acquiring a portion of land 3 perches in extent and house No. 96, Kaluwella, for the purpose of providing a proper approach road to the public latrine at Kaluwella:—Resolved that steps be taken to acquire the portion of land in question and house No. 96, Kaluwella, at a total approximate cost of Rs. 700.

12. To sanction, in connection with the construction of side drains along Wakwella road, the expenditure of an additional sum of Rs. 275 from vote 46 for the purpose of building a new culvert:—Sanctioned.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

13. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on October 13, 1934.*

(2) To consider 13 applications for water service:—Recommended that 12 applications be allowed, and, as regards the application from the owner of house No. 15, Elliott road—which is outside the water area—that this be referred back to the Superintendent of Works for further report.

(4) To consider Mr. J. E. Perera's motion at the General Meeting of Council of September 15, 1934, viz.:—"That the new Maitipe road be given a suitable name":—Recommended that new road through Maitipe be called "Brown's road" in remembrance of Mr. J. D. Brown, the late Chairman of the Council.

(5) To consider the question of improving and adopting as a Municipal road the public path leading from Dandegedera road to Mahaduwa for a distance of 350 feet at an approximate cost of Rs. 350:—Recommended (1) that the papers be referred back to the Superintendent of Works for a detailed estimate of the work including the provision of a culvert at the entrance if this is considered necessary; and (2), that the matter be considered with the budget for 1935.

(6) To consider the question of chlorinating the water mains:—Recommended that the work of chlorinating the water be put in hand at an early date and that the Superintendent of Works be requested to submit a detailed estimate of the total cost involved after correspondence direct with the Government Sanitary Engineer.

(7) To consider the question of acquiring a portion of land approximately 3 perches in extent at an approximate cost of Rs. 500 for the purpose of widening the Bope road where it starts at Richmond Hill road:—Recommended that, with a view to obtaining an acquisition survey, the Superintendent of Works be requested to submit a sketch showing the full length of road required leading to Bope at a uniform width of 25 feet throughout.

(8) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 1,200 for constructing a 10-foot span bridge over the Heen-ela in place of the existing damaged masonry culvert. (b) Rs. 425 for improvements to the minor road off Hill Side road leading to the Kanampitiya village:—(a) Recommended (1) that the estimate be increased to Rs. 1,500 for the construction of a 15-ft. instead of a 10-ft. span bridge and that a supplemental vote be passed for this purpose, (2) that tenders be invited for the work. (b) Recommended.

(9) To consider Mr. E. A. Paulas' motion at the General Meeting of Council on July 26, 1934, viz.:—"That a swamp at Kandewatta adjoining the Railway line to Colombo and the Kandewatta road be acquired for the purpose of reclaiming the ground with the sweepings of the town":—Recommended that in view of the fact that the last valuation report was received so far back as 1931, a fresh valuation report of the land proposed to be acquired be now obtained from the Government Agent, Southern Province.

(10) To consider Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka's motion at the General Meeting of Council on July 26, 1934, viz.:—"That the block of land between the Awasa and the property of the late Collector Jayasinghe, situated at Minuwangoda and bordering on the Wakwella road be acquired for a playground:—Recommended that consideration be deferred pending investigations as regards the present assessment of the block of land in question.

(11) To consider the question of providing additional stands for rickshaws and hackeries:—Recommended, as regards rickshaws that additional stands be provided at the following places:—(a) at Lighthouse street opposite Messrs. Ephraums Store, (b) at Mahamodera on the Galle-Colombo road on the portion of green nearly opposite Humes road; and, as regards hackeries, that consideration be deferred until the suggested site in Ward street bordering the Jubilee Madam premises has been inspected by the Chairman and members of the Committee.

(13) To consider the advisability of introducing prepayment meters in Galle:—Recommended that 25 meters be obtained and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 750 under Capital Expenditure be passed for this purpose.

(14) To consider the question of opening up a new road by acquiring the "Kamba Band" or "Rope Walk" in China Garden:—Recommended that the matter be considered with the budget for 1935 and that meanwhile steps be taken to ascertain the cost of acquisition of the site on which the "Esplanade Motor Works Garage" now stands.

(15) Repairs to Esplanade Pavilion:—Recommended that a supplemental vote of Rs. 450 be passed under Head 40, Maintenance of Buildings—for the purpose of carrying out complete repairs—urgently needed to the roof of the Esplanade Pavilion.

Resolution.

With regard to item (15) it was resolved that the question of using asbestos sheets be considered by the Chairman and that the vote be increased to Rs. 600 to meet the extra cost should the Chairman decide on the use of asbestos sheets. The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

14. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on October 13, 1934 :—

(2) To consider a letter from the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services requesting that water be supplied free of charge to the Galle Hospital with effect from October 1, 1934, on the ground that the consumption is for domestic purposes only :—Recommended that the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services be informed that as the present charge made is only in respect of water supplied to the paying wards of the Hospital, the Council does not see its way to withdrawing it as the Council considers that such a charge is justifiable in the circumstances.

(3) To write off on the ground of poverty of the owners the rates due on the following properties for the current-year :—No. 61, Millidduwa from 3rd quarter amounting to 50 cents and 670b, Galupiadde from 2nd quarter amounting to 78 cents :—Recommended that the rates be written off.

(4) To recommend the payment of a sum of Rs. 22.04 to Mr. B. E. Mendis, Apothecary, Segregation Camp, a "Risk Allowance" during the outbreak of smallpox in 1933 :—Recommended.

(6) Floods in Municipal area :—Recommended that a supplemental vote of Rs. 500 be passed for the issue of food in deserving cases.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

15. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council—Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on Saturday, November 24, 1934, at 9.30 A.M.

16. At the conclusion of the meeting the Chairman moved that, in terms of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, Mr. R. L. Ephraums who, having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings of the Council, had *ipso facto* ceased to be a member, be restored to office. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.
