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PASSED ORDINANCE.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 15 of 1934.

An Ordinance to provide for the establishment of the Ceylon Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

R. E. STUBBS.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:

Short title and commencement.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Ceylon Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Ordinance, No. 15 of 1934, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette shall appoint.

Governor may raise body of officers and men.

- In accordance with the provisions of the Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931, of the Imperial Parliament, and with the approval of His Majesty in Council as therein provided the Governor may by proclamation raise a body of officers and men to be entered on the terms of being liable-
 - (a) to serve as ordered in any vessel provided and maintained for the purposes of this Ordinance;
 - (b) to perform such other duties as the Governor by regulation may prescribe;
 - (c) to general service in the Royal Navy in emergency.

Body to form part of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

3 Such body of officers and men shall form part of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve constituted under the Naval Forces Act, 1903, of the Imperial Parliament under the designation of the Ceylon Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and the Governor may offer to place the whole or any number of such officers and men at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy.

Reserve to be maintained at expense of this Island. Period of

service.

- 4 The Reserve shall be maintained at the expense of the Island of Ceylon out of such moneys as may be provided by the State Council.
- 5 Every member of the Reserve shall be entered for a term of three years, and shall during such term be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, and at the expiration of every third year of the period of his service as a volunteer he shall be entitled to claim his discharge: provided that if he is then in actual service his right to claim his discharge shall be suspended until the cessation of such service.

Instruction.

The Governor may cause any member of the Reserve to be instructed, trained and exercised on shore or on board any ship or vessel, or partly on shore and partly on board any ship or vessel, within or without the limits of this Island, whether belonging to this Island or not.

consist of units.

7 The Reserve shall consist of such units as the Governor may by notification in the Gazette appoint.

Member to be British subject

8 Every member of the Reserve must be a British subject between the ages of eighteen and fifty domiciled in Ceylon or resident in Ceylon for a period of not less than twelve months in the eighteen months next preceding the date of enrolment in the Reserve.

Constitution of Reserve.

9 The Reserve shall consist of such numbers of officers, warrant officers, petty officers, and men as the Governor may $\mathbf{decide}.$

The officers of the Force shall receive either commissions or warrants from the Governor and such commissions or warrants shall not be deemed to be vacated by the death or retirement from office of the Governor by whom the same were issued.

10 The Governor may at any time dispense with the

Governor may dispense with services.

Enactments and Regulations in force in Royal Navy to apply to Reserve

(1) All enactments and regulations for the time being in force for the enforcement of discipline in the Royal Navy shall apply to the officers and men of the Reserve during such period as they are under instruction, training or exercise, whether afloat or ashore, within or without the limits of this

services of any officer or member of the Reserve.

Organization, conditions of service, &c., to be prescribed by Regulations Island, or during such periods as they are in actual service. (2) The government, organization, administration and

training of, and the conditions of service in the Reserve shall be prescribed by regulations made by the Governor. Such regulations may in particular provide for the appointment of commissioned, warrant and petty officers to train and command, or to serve as officers with the men of the Reserve, whether ashore or afloat, and for the calling into actual service of the officers and men of the Reserve.

12 The whole or any part of the Reserve shall at all times be liable to be employed on active service against an enemy anywhere within or without the limits of this Island, or for the prevention or suppression of internal disorder within this Island.

Liability for active service.

13 (1) In time of war the Governor may issue orders and instructions—

(a) forbidding or restricting in any way he may think fit all entrance to or egress of vessels from a port;

(b) forbidding or restricting in any way he may think fit the movement of vessels when within the limits of a port;

(c) for the examination of all vessels seeking to enter or leave a port or being within a port;

(d) for the taking of such other steps as may be thought necessary or desirable for securing the safety of a port, or otherwise, for the purposes of defence.

(2) For the purposes of this section the term "port" shall include in addition to the ordinary limits of the port, such other area, by land or sea, as the Governor may assign to any port for the said purposes.

(3) The Governor may delegate to any person or persons the execution or furtherance of any orders or instructions

issued under this section.

14 Any person who wilfully obstructs any portion of the Reserve or any officer or man thereof in the proper performance of any service or duty under this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence.

15 Any person who-

(a) agrees with, or induces or attempts to induce any officer or man of the Reserve to neglect or to act in conflict with his duty as an officer or man of the Reserve; or

(b) who is a party to, or aids or abets, or incites to the commission of, any act whereby any lawful order given to any officer or man of the Reserve or any law or regulation with which it is the duty of any officer or man of the Reserve to comply may be evaded or infringed; or

(c) who supplies or is a party to supplying any officer or man of the Reserve with intoxicating liquor when such officer or man is on duty and prohibited under regulations or instructions from receiving or taking intoxicating liquor; shall be guilty of an offence.

16 Any officer or man of the Reserve who fails without just cause (the proof whereof shall lie upon him) to attend at any time or place appointed for instruction, training or exercise shall be guilty of an offence.

17 Any officer or man of the Reserve who, without proper authority and permission, gives, sells, pledges, lends, or otherwise disposes of any arms, amunition, accountrements, clothing, supplies or any other article entrusted to or held by him for the service of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence and, in addition to any other penalty which may be imposed under this Ordinance he may be ordered by the court convicting him to make good the loss or deficiency caused by such gift, sale, pledge, loan or other disposition.

18 Any person who on discharge from the Reserve fails or neglects to render up any arms, amunition, accourrement, clothing, supplies or other article supplied to him as an officer or man of the Reserve on demand being made to him by the proper authority shall be guilty of an offence, and in addition to any other penalty which may be imposed under this Ordinance he may be ordered by the court convicting him to make good the loss or deficiency caused by such failure or neglect.

19 (1) Any person who is guilty of an offence against the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees, and in default of payment, to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months.

(2) Any officer or man of the Reserve who is convicted of an offence under section 16 of this Ordinance may, in addition to or in lieu of any other penalty, be committed to detention Governor may issue orders and instructions in time of war, &c.

Penalties.

at any depôt, training camp or station of the Reserve, for the purpose of undergoing instruction, training or exercise during such detention; and any officer or man of the Reserve who, having been committed to detention under this sub-section escapes therefrom or fails to return thereto or fails properly to carry out the instruction, training or exercise given under such detention, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month: Provided that in the committal of an offender to detention under this sub-section the period of detention shall not necessarily be continuous, nor shall it exceed in any one sentence of commitment, a total number of days' detention in excess of twice the total number of days on which the instruction, training or exercise should originally have been attended by such officer or man.

Regulations.

- 20 The Governor may make regulations relating to all or any of the following matters or things, namely :
 - (a) the numerical establishments of units of the Reserve, and the grades, ranks and appointments therein;
 - (b) the training and inspection of the Reserve, the formation of training camps, the establishment of depôts or stations of the Reserve, and the holding of manœuvres for the Reserve;
 - (c) the attendance at courses of instruction of officers or men of the Reserve;
 - (d) the seniority of officers of the Reserve, and the appointment to, promotion to and tenure of commissioned or non-commissioned rank in the Reserve
 - (e) the conditions as to physical fitness and efficiency on which officers and men of the Reserve may continue to serve in the Reserve after completing their first term of service;
 - (f) the issue and care of arms, accoutrements, ammunition, supplies, clothing, and equipment for officers or men of the Reserve;
 - (g) returns, books, forms and correspondence relating to the Reserve;
 - (h) the establishment and conduct of institutions for providing recreation and refreshment to officers or men of the Reserve;
 - (i) generally for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance.

Interpretation.

21 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires-

DRAFT ORDINANCE.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:

An Ordinance to amend the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Housing and Town Improvement Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1934.

Amendment of section 13 (1) of Ordinanc No. 19 of 1915.

- 2 Sub-section (1) of section 13 of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended-
- (1) by the omission of the word "or" occurring at the end of paragraph (d)
- (2) by re-lettering paragraph (e) as paragraph (f); and

- (3) by the insertion of the following as paragraph (e) between paragraph (d) and re-lettered paragraph (f) :=
 - "(e) fail to remove or pull down any building or alteration to any building erected or made for a temporary purpose under a permit issued by the Chairman, within the time specified in such permit; or ".
- 3 The following section is hereby inserted immediately after section 16 of the principal Ordinance, and shall have effect as section 16A of Chapter I. of that Ordinance:—

"16a (1) Anything in this Ordinance or any other written law to the contrary notwithstanding, it shall be lawful for the Chairman in his discretion to grant to any person, on his depositing as security such sum of money as the Chairman may direct, a permit in writing to erect any building or make any alteration in any building, which may otherwise conflict or cause any building to conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, on condition that such building or alteration shall be erected or made for a temporary purpose only and shall be removed or pulled down by the holder of the permit within such time not exceeding one year from the date of the permit as may be specified therein:

Provided that the Chairman may, if he thinks fit, grant such a permit without any deposit of security.

- (2) If the holder of a permit granted under sub-section (1) shall remove or pull down the building or alteration referred to in that permit within the time specified therein, any sum of money deposited by him as security shall be returned to him.
- (3) If the holder of a permit shall fail to remove or pull down the building or alteration referred to in that permit within the time specified therein, the Chairman may, without prejudice to the remedy provided by section 13, himself remove or pull down the building or alteration, and the expenses thereby incurred shall be deducted from any sum of money deposited by the holder of the permit as security and the balance, if any, returned to him.
- (4) (a) Where no sum has been deposited as security, the expenses incurred by the Chairman under sub-section (3) shall be paid by the holder of the permit and may be recovered in the same manner and by the same process as a rate
- (b) Where the expenses incurred by the Chairman under sub-section (3) exceed the sum deposited as security, the amount of the excess shall be paid by the holder of the permit and may be recovered in the same manner and by the same process as a rate."

Objects and Reasons.

- 1. A local authority has at present no statutory power to permit the erection of temporary buildings for such purposes as weddings, alms-givings, &c., and to enforce their demolition when they have served the purpose for which they were put up. The object of this Bill is to amend the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915, so as to place temporary buildings of this nature on a statutory basis by prescribing the procedure for their erection and demolition.
- 2. Clause 3 of this Bill inserts in the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915, a new section the effect of which is to give the Chairman of a local authority the power to grant a permit for the erection of a temporary building, including a structure which may under that Ordinance be termed "an alteration" to a building, even though it may not conform to the existing law regulating the erection of permanent buildings. The procedure proposed is that the Chairman should be empowered to take a deposit in cash of an amount to be fixed by him and to issue a permit subject to the condition that the building is to be demolished by the person who erects it within a period to be specified in the permit, not exceeding one year. Provision is made for the refund of the deposit where this condition is complied with. If this condition is not complied with, the Chairman has the power to demolish the building, and the expenses incurred in the demolition are to be paid by the person who erected the building. Where a deposit has been made, those expenses are to be deducted from the deposit and the balance, if any, returned to the person who put up the Where there has been no deposit, or where those building.

New section

Power of Chairman to permit erection of buildings, &c., for temporary purposes.

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expenses exceed the amount of the deposit, the expenses or the amount of the excess, as the case may be, will be paid by the person who erected the building, and, on his failure to pay, can be recovered in the manner provided in the principal Ordinance for the recovery of a rate.

The purpose of clause 2 of the Bill is to supplement the scheme set out in clause 3 by adding to section 13 of the principal Ordinance a provision making the failure to demolish a temporary building within the time prescribed in the permit an offence. The effect of the proposed amendment of section 13 will be that the exercise by the Chairman of his right to demolish a building will not affect the liability of a defaulter to prosecution for the offence created by clause 3, or the power of a Magistrate when convicting a person of that offence to make a mandatory order for the demolition of the building.
