WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance for such of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence.

For the Eastern Circuit twice at least at Batticaloa and such other place or places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such sessions commencing at Batticaloa in the month of February and the month of July in every year.

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to cancel the above Sessions in view of the fact that there are not sufficient cases committed for trial at the July sessions of the Supreme Court on its Second Eastern Circuit.

Now, therefore, know Ye, that We, the Governor after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do cancel the above sessions in pursuance of the last proviso to section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," as amended by section 2 of the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, and direct that the cases in question be tried at the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court commencing at Jaffna on Monday, July 24, 1933.

In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

> and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall came in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that perpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the tamp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept in the learny area, and no cattle shall be kept in the wicinits of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall wause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from different states.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area. of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudically the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the

camp area

In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance

(a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary

Officer in charge of the camp area.

When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be ment Agent, permitting him to do so. issued free of charge.

No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth,

the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, cr within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

Every appeal under the provisions of the Ordinance shall be mide by a written statement in English (a) substantially in the form set out in the collection to these rules, and (b) bearing on the face of it a same to the value of Rs. 5 in the case of appeals preferred in relation to estates and a stamp to the value of Re. 1 in the case of appeals preferred in relation to small holdings.

2. / Every statement of appeals preferred about the Tea Controller within founteen days (exclusive of Sundays and public holidays) of the service of the notice communicating the assessment, decision or order against which the appeal is preferred.

The appellant or his representative shall be entitled to be heard in support of the appeal, and the Tea Controller or the Government Agent as the case may be, or his representative shall be entitled. sentative, to be heard against the appeal; and where any argument is heard against the appeal, the appellant or his representative shall have the right of reply.

6. The Board of Appeal may, during the hearing of any appeal, call for such evidence oral or documentary as to it may seem necessary for the proper adjudication of any

matter or matters at issue.

The decision of the Board of Appeal, whether it be given at at the close of the hearing or on some day thereafter, shall be reduced to writing and dated as of the date on which it is given, and formal notice thereof shall be served on the appellant within three days of such date by the Tea Controller in the manner prescribed by Ordinance

CONDITIONS.

1. The licensee may tap the trees and draw the toddy himself or may employ for the purpose the tapper whose name is given in the licence.

2. All toddy drawn under this licence for the supply of a distillery, tavern, or vinegar store shall be delivered at a collecting station named in the licence, provided that toddy drawn for the supply of a tavern or vinegar store and transported otherwise than by cart or motor vahicle may be delivered at the tavern or vinegar store direct.

No toddy shall be disposed of in any other manner.

3. No trees shall be tapped between 6 P.M. and 6 A.M.

4. No toddy shall be kept in the garden in which it is

drawn after — of the day on which it is drawn.

5. No toddy shall be taken into any house or shed, but shall either be taken direct from the garden to the collecting station or be poured into a transport cask placed in the open in such garden.

The toddy drawn shall not be diluted or adulterated

in any manner.

All vessels in which the toddy is collected or trans-

ported shall be kept scrupulously clean.

8. No trees shall be tapped under this licence, nor shall fermented toddy be drawn from any tree, nor shall any pot be attached to any toddy-producing tree, until the tree has been marked as prescribed by the Excise Commissioner nor shall the licensee tap any tree but

those which he is hereby licensed to tap.

9. The licensee shall be bound to bring down the pots

attached to any of the trees for inspection on the demand of any Excise Officer or Village Headman.

10. No toddy drawn under this licence shall be given or distributed free.

Within the administrative limits of this Council, no new well shall be sunk in any residential area or for the supply of water for drinking or domestic purposes in any other area, within a radius of 50 feet from any existing cesspit, cesspool, pigsty, gala, cattle shed, leaking drain, neglected or disused privy, any refuse heap which is not cleared and removed at regular intervals not exceeding one week, or any land which is regularly manured each season

for the purposes of any cultivation.

2. No cesspit, cesspool, privy, pigsty, gala or cattle shed shall be constructed within a distance of 50 feet from any well used for drinking or domestic purposes, nor shall any manure or decaying animal or vegetable matter be deposited, nor any land be cultivated with manure, nor any drain suffered to remain in a leaking condition within such

distance.

3. It shall be an offence for the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land on which any well in actual use is situated, to fail to keep such well in such condition or in such state of repair, as to prevent surface water of any kind from flowing or percolating into it.

4. No receptacle that is not clean shall be used to draw

water from any well.

5. No clothes shall be washed within 10 feet of the mouth of a well used for drinking or domestic purposes.
6. (1) Every owner or lessee of a well used as a public

bathing place shall supply bathing tubs.

(2) No person shall draw, or be permitted to draw, water

from any such well while bathing.

7. Whenever any tree, or a branch of any tree, overhangs a well, and is in any way injurious to the water, the Chairman may cause notice in writing to be given to the owner, lessee, or cocupant of the land on which such tree stands, to cut down of remove such tree or branch; and if such notice is not complied with within 14 days of the service thereof, such owner, lessee, or occupant shall be guilty of an offence.

The Chairman may, whenever he deems such a course to be necessary, cause notice to be given in writing to the owner or lessee or occupant of any land in which there is a well used for drinking or domestic purposes, to bale out the water and clean and disinfect the well; and if such notice is not complied with within the specified time, such owner, lessee, or occupant shall be guilty of an offence.

It shall be lawful for the Inspector of the Council, or other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, to inspect existing wells and their surroundings at any reason-

able hour during the day.

10. Any person committing a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

PENSION RULES.

(a) No officer shall be deemed to have an absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or allowance under these rules, and the Board reserves to itself the power to dismiss an officer without compensation.

(b) No pension, gratuity, or retirng allowance shall be granted on retirement to any officer without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. (1) Subject to the provisions and exceptions hereinafter contained every officer holding a permanent office in the service of the Board and drawing a salary of not less than Rs. 400 per annum may be granted a pension calculated at the rate of 1/720th of the salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service counting for pension, provided that he has completed not less than 120 months' gross service, and provided further that no pension awarded under these rules shall exceed 480/720ths of the salary upon which the pension is computed.

(2) If such an officer retires on account of illness or age before completing 120 months' gross service, he may receive a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/12th of a month's salary of the office or offices held by him at retire-

ment for each month of service.

3. Any officer may be required to retire from the service of the Board on or after attaining the age of fifty-five years; but retirement shall be compulsory on his attaining the age of sixty years, unless the Governor decides that his services shall be retained.

- 4. No pension shall be granted to an officer retiring before he attains the age of fifty-five years, unless a Medical Board, consisting of two Medical Practitioners nominated by the Chairman, certifies that the officer is unfit to discharge the duties of his office owing to infirmity either of mind or body, and unless he shall have theretofore discharged such duties to the satisfaction of the Chairman.
- 5. The Chairman may call upon an omcer, who is beauther limit of age entitling him to retire on pension, to retire from the service on the ground of his inability to duties of his office. In such a The Chairman may call upon an officer, who is below discharge efficiently the duties of his office. In such a case the Board may by special resolution, subject to the approval of the Governor, grant such retiring allowance or gratuity as is considered just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which the length of service of the officer would qualify him.
- 6. In the case of the abolition of any pensionable office, the pension or gratuity grantable to the officer holding such office will be that which would have been payable to him had he retired on grounds of ill-health.
- 7. No pension or gratuity granted under these rules shall be assignable or transferable.
- 8, (1) The service to be reckoned for pension shall be calculated from the date on which the officer commences to draw salary in respect of his first permanent appointment, whether pensionable or not. Acting service in an office carrying claims to pension shall, when continuous with permanent employment, count as service for pension, provided no other officer was earning pension for the same period in respect of the same office. The service of an officer under 16 years of age shall not in any case count for

(2) An officer is entitled to reckon as service for pension the whole period of absence on vacation leave and half the period of absence on leave with half salary. Absence without salary will not count as service for pension.

9. (1) The pension or gratuity awarded to an officer shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him, at the time of his retirement, in respect of the permanent office or offices then held by him, provided that he shall have held such office or offices, to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached, for at least three years, otherwise the pension or gratuity shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such officer during the three years next preceding the date of his retirement.

(2) For the purposes of these rules, salary will include in addition to the salary of the permanent office or offices held by him, any allowance voted to him by resolution of the Board as a pensionable allowance, but no other emolu-

ment whatsoever.

10. The rates of pension, retiring allowance, and gratuity above set forth shall be granted only in cases of faithful and meritorious service. Where the testimony faithful and meritorious service. Where the testimony as to good conduct is in any way defective, a deduction may be made from the pension or gratuity, and where the misconduct of an officer has been of a serious nature, the pension or gratuity may be entirely withheld.

11. The service in respect of which pensions or gratuities are granted ought in all cases to have been continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or by temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation. Service prior to a break of service may, however, be allowed to count for pension together with service subsequent to such break, if the whole of the intervening period has been spent in some employment under Government or under another statutory Authority.

- 12. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance is convicted of any offence in any Court in the Island and sentenced to death, or to any term of rigorous imprisonment exceeding six months, the payment of such pension or allowance shall be forthwith discontinued, unless such person shall within three months of such conviction receive an unconditional pardon, or unless the Board with the approval of the Governor in any case for special reasons otherwise decides.
- 13. If any person to whom a pension, annuity, or allowance has been granted under these rules becomes a bankrupt, such pension, annuity, or allowance shall forthwith cease; but it shall be lawful for the Board, with the approval of the Governor, from time to time during the remainder of such person's life or during such shorter period or periods continuous or otherwise as may be necessary, to pay all or any part of such pension, annuity, or allowance to, or to apply the same for the maintenance and personal support or benefit of such person and his wife and children jointly or any one or more of them exclusively, as may in the circumstances of each case be necessary or expedient.
- 14. (1) Every officer who is transferred to a post under Government or under another statutory Local Authority with the approval of the Board, shall be entitled on ultimate retirement to pension for the service rendered to the Board, provided that he retires from the latter service in circumstances which would entitle him to pension under these rules. In all such cases the amount contributed by the Board by way of pension shall be based only on the service under the Board and the final salary drawn from the Board.

(2) An officer who has been transferred to the service of the Board from some other employment under Government or under another statutory Local Authority may, if he retires from the service of the Board after completing ten years' public service in all, but before completing ten years' service under the Board, be awarded, in lieu of a gratuity, an annuity based on service and salary under the Board calculated in the manner prescribed by rule 2 (1).

15. No person may at any time draw from the funds of the Board an amount of pension which, when added to the amount of any pension or pensions drawn in respect of other public service, exceeds two-thirds of the highest pensionable emoluments drawn by such person at any time in the course of his service under the Board or in such other public service.

- 16. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance from the Board returns to the service of the Board, he may be allowed to retain his pension or retiring allowance during the period of his re-employment, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement no award whatever under these rules; or he may be required to forego the pension or retiring allowance then drawn by him, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement a pension or retiring allowance based on his aggregate service and the highest salary drawn by him at any time during that service. The Chairman shall decide the terms on which a former servant of the Board may be re-employed in any particular case.
- 17. Any employee of the Board drawing a salary of less than Rs. 400 per annum, retiring on account of illness after serving continuously for a period of 15 years and upwards may; if the Board be satisfied from the report of a Medical Board that he is unfit to discharge efficiently the duties of his office owing to infirmity of body or mind, be awarded such long service allowance not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem as the Board may think just and proper. In the case of employees who retire after attaining the age of 55 years or over, no Medical Board need be appointed. Any employee in receipt of daily pay, who has completed not less than 20 years' service, retiring in similar circumstances, may be awarded a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/36th of a month's pay for each month's service.
- 18. In the event of any officer or servant, whether in a pensionable or non-pensionable office or on daily pay dying while in the service of the Board, it shall be com-petent to the Board, subject to the approval of the Governor, to grant to the widow or next-of-kin of such officer or servant a gratuity not exceeding three months' pay, and in addition one month's pay for each minor child.
- 19. If any case not covered by these rules shall arise which in the opinion of the Board merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, a report setting out the circumstances of such case, together with the recommendation of the Board, shall be forwarded through the Commissioner of Local Government and the Controller of Establishments, General Treasury, to the Governor for his decision as to the nature and the amount of the compensation, if any, that may be awarded.

- "Public stand" means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.
- 2. No vehicle other than a motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in or enter a public stand.
- 3. When a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall be parked in it or enter it.

- 4. All motor cabs and omnibuses in a public stand shall be parked
 - (a) in accordance with the orders of either the Police Officer on duty at the spot, or the person authorized for this purpose by the Chairman, and (b) so as to cause no obstruction to other motor cabs or
 - omnibuses entering or leaving the public stand.
- The driver of the motor cab or omnibus or a person capable of driving it shall be in charge while the motor cab or omnibus occupies a public stand.
- No motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in any public place except a public stand; and no motor cab or omnibus shall enter or remain in a public stand—
 - (a) unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under regulation 7, and
 - (b) unless he produces it when required to do so by a Police Officer, or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman.
- 7. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing motor cabs or omnibuses to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.
- 8. The driver of a lorry shall not allow it to stand on any highway declared by regulation to be suitable for lorry traffic except-
 - (a) In the event of a breakdown and then only so long as may be necessary to enable essential repairs to be effected:
 - (b) For the purpose of loading or unloading goods and then only so long as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose.

Convention between His Majesty, in respect of the United Kingdom, and the President of the Polish Republic, regarding Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial Matters.

Warsaw, August 26, 1931.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, May 31, 1932.]

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India,

The President of the Polish Republic,

Being desirous to render mutual assistance in the conduct of legal proceedings in civil and commercial matters which are being dealt with or which it is anticipated may be dealt with by their respective judicial authorities;

Have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India;

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Right Honourable Sir William Forbes Erskine, G.C.M.C., M.V.O., His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Polish Republic, and

The President of the Polish Republic:

- M. Auguste Zaleski, Minister for Foreign Affairs for the Polish Republic;
- M. Stefan Sieczkowski, Under-Secretary of State Ministry of Justice for the Polish Republic;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:

I.—PRELIMINARY.

Article 1.

- (a) This Convention applies only to civil and commercial matters, including non-contentious matters.
 - (b) In this Convention the words
 - (1) "Territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted (a) in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, as meaning at any time England and Wales and all territories in respect of which the Convention is in force by reason of extensions under Article 15 or accessions under Article 17; (b) in relation to the President of the Polish Republic as meaning at any time, without prejudice to the provisions of Article 16, Poland;
 (2) "Persons" shall be deemed to mean individuals and

artificial persons;
"Artificial persons" shall be deemed to include partnerships, companies, societies, and other companies, societies, corporations;

(4) "Subjects or citizens of a High Contracting Party" shall be deemed to include artificial persons consti-tuted or incorporated under the laws of the territory of such High Contracting Party;

(5) "Subjects of one (or of the other) High Contracting
Party" shall be deemed (a) in relation to His
Majesty to mean all subjects of His Majesty
wherever domiciled, and all persons under His
protection; (b) in relation to the President of the
Polish Republic to mean, without prejudice to the
provisions of Article 16, all Polish citizens;
(6) "Consular officer" shall be deemed to include
diplomatic officer.

II.—Service of Judicial and Extra-Judicial DOCUMENTS.

Article 2.

(a) When judicial or extra judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required by a judicial authority situated therein to be served on persons in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may be served on the recipient, whatever his nationality, by any of the methods provided in Articles 3 and 4.

(b) In Part II. of this Convention, the expression "country

of origin" means the country from which the documents to be served emanate, and the expression "country of execution" means the country in which service of documents

is to be effected.

Article 3.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed and sent by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin to the competent authority of the country of execution, requesting such authority to cause the document in question to be

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the (6) The request for service shall be drawn up in the language of the country of execution and shall state the names and descriptions of the parties, the name, description and address of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the document to be served in duplicate. Where the document is of considerable length, a duplicate of the material parts sufficient to identify

it will be accepted.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in the language of the country of execution, or be accom-panied by a translation into such language. Such transla-tion shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin or an official or sworn translator

of one of the two countries concerned.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent :-In England to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Poland to the Ministry of Justice in Warsaw.

If the authority to whom a request for service has been the authority to whom a request for service has been sent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall (except in cases where execution is refused in accordance with paragraph (f) of this Article) of his own motion forward the request to the competent authority of the country of execution.

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of the country of execution, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the municipal law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in

the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of that country.

(f) The execution of a request for service, duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article, shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request for service is not established, or (2) the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be executed considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) In every instance where a request for service is not executed by the authority to whom it has been sent, the latter will at once inform the Consular Officer by whom the

request was sent, stating the ground on which the execution of the request has been refused or the competent authority

to whom it has been forwarded.

(h) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall furnish a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Consular Officer by whom the request for service was sent. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicates or attached thereto...

Article 4.

(a) Service may be effected, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country of execution, by any of the following methods:

 By a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin;
 By an agent appointed for the purpose either by the judicial authority of the country of origin or by the party on whose application the document was issued:

(3) Through the post; or

(4) By any other method of service which is not illegal, under the law existing at the time of service, in the country of execution.

(b) All documents served in the manner provided in (1) of the preceding paragraph shall, unless the recipient is a subject or citizen of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country of execution or be accompanied by a translation into such language, certified as correct as prescribed in Article 3 (c).

(c) The High Contracting Parties agree that in principle (c) The High Contracting rarties agree that in principle it is also desirable that the provisions of paragraph (b) of this Article should apply to documents served in the manner provided in (2), (3), and (4) of paragraph (a) of this Article. Nevertheless, in the absence of any legislation in their respective territories making translations obligatory in such cases, the High Contracting Parties do not accept any obligation in this respect.

Article 5.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Consular Officer the request for service was addressed, shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law of the country of execution to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the courts of that country.

usually allowed in the courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Consular Officer by whom the request was addressed, when sending to him the certificate provided for in Article 3 (h).

(c) Except as provided above no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents.

other in respect of the service of any documents.

III .- TAKING OF EVIDENCE.

Article 6.

(a) When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken, whatever the nationality of the parties or witnesses may be, in any one of the ways prescribed in Articles 7, 8, or 9.

(b) In Part III. of this Convention, the expressions—

(1) "Taking of evidence" shall be deemed to include the taking of the statements of a plaintiff, defendant, expert, witness or any other person on oath ant, expert, witness or any other person on oath or otherwise; the submission to a plaintiff, defendant, expert, witness or any other person of any oath with regard to any legal proceedings; and the production, identification, and examination of documents, samples or other objects.

- (2) "Witness" shall be deemed to include any person from whom any evidence, as defined above, is required to be taken.
- (3) "Country of origin" shall be deemed to mean the country by whose judicial authority the evidence is required, and "country of execution," the country in which the evidence is to be taken.

Article 7.

- (a) The judicial authority of the country of origin may, in accordance with the provisions of the law of his country, address himself by means of a Letter of Request to the competent authority of the country of execution, requesting such authority to take the evidence.
- (b) The Letter of Request shall be drawn up in the language of the country of execution, or be accompanied by a translation into such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer acting for the country of origin or by an official or sworn translator of one of the two countries concerned. The Letter of Request shall state brifly the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, the names and descriptions of the parties thereto, and the names, descriptions and addresses of the witnesses. They shall also either (1) be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses, or, as the case may be, by a description of the documents, samples or other objects to be produced, identified or examined, and a translation thereof, certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided; or (2) shall request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked viva voce as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.
 - (c) Letters of Request shall be transmitted-
 - In England by a Polish Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.
 - In Poland by a British Consular Officer to the Ministry of Justice.

In case the authority to whom any Letter of Request is transmitted is not competent to execute it, such authority shall (except in cases where execution is refused in accordance with paragraph (f) of this Article) of his own motion forward the Letter of Request to the competent authority of the country of execution.

- (d) The competent authority of the country of execution shall give effect to the Letter of Request and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country, except that if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the Letter of Request, such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of the country of execution.
- (e) The Consular Officer, by whom the Letter of Request is transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date when and the place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties, who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented if they so desire.
- (f) The execution of a Letter of Request which complies with the preceding provisions of this Article can only be refused—
 - (1) If the authenticity of the Letter of Request is not established;
 - (2) If, in the country of execution, the execution of the Letter of Request in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary;
 - (3) If the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be executed considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.
- (g) In every instance where a Letter of Request is not executed by the authority to whom it is addressed, the latter will at once inform the Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the Letter of Request has been refused, or, in the case provided for in Article 7 (c), the competent authority to whom it has been forwarded.
- (h) When a Letter of Request has been executed, the competent authority to whom it was transmitted or forwarded shall send to the Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted the necessary documents establishing its execution.

Article 8.

- (a) The judicial authority of the country of origin may, in the Letter of Request addressed to the competent authority of the country of execution, request such authority to appoint to take the evidence an individual specially designated in the Letter of Request.
- A Consular Officer acting for the country of origin or any other suitable individual may be so designated.
- (b) Where this procedure is adopted, the provisions of paragraphs (b), (c), (f), (g) and (h) of Article 7 shall apply, but the following paragraphs shall be substituted for paragraphs (d) and (e) of that Article.
- (c) The competent authority of the country of execution shall give effect thereto and shall appoint the individual designated to take the evidence, unless such individual shall be unwilling so to act. In addition, if necessary, such authority shall make use of such compulsory powers as it possesses under its own law to secure the attendance of and the giving of evidence by the witnesses before the individual so appointed.
- (d) The individual thus appointed shall have power to administer an oath, and any person giving false evidence before him shall be liable in the courts of the country of execution to the penalties provided by the law of that country for perjury.
- (e) The evidence shall be taken in accordance with the law of the country of origin, provided such method is not contrary to the law of the country of execution, and the parties shall have the right to be present in person or to be represented by barristers or solicitors or by any other persons who are competent to appear before the courts of either the country of origin or of execution.

Article 9.

- (a) The evidence may also be taken without any request to or the intervention of the authorities of the country of execution, by an individual in that country directly appointed for the purpose by the court of the country of origin. A Consular Officer acting for the country of origin or any other suitable individual may be so appointed.
- (b) An individual so appointed to take evidence may request the persons named by the court appointing him to appear before him and to give evidence. He may take all kinds of evidence which are not contrary to the law of the country of execution, and shall have power to administer an oath. The attendance and giving of evidence before any such individual shall be entirely voluntary and no measures of compulsion shall be employed.
- (c) Requests to appear issued by such individual shall, unless the recipient is a subject or citizen of the High Contracting Party for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, be drawn up in the language of the country of execution or be accompanied by a translation into such language.
- (d) The evidence may be taken in accordance with the procedure recognized by the law of the country of origin, and the parties will have the right to be present in person or to be represented by barristers or solicitors of that country or by any representatives who are competent to appear before the courts either of the country of origin or of the country of execution.

Article 10.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method laid down in Article 9 has failed owing to the refusal of any witness to appear or to give evidence does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 7 or 8.

Article 11.

(a) Where evidence is taken in the manner provided in Article 7 or 8 the High Contracting Party, by whose judicial authority the Letter of Request was addressed, shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act, in cases where the law of the country of execution permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure being requested and followed. These charges and expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the courts of the country of execution.

- (b) The repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the Letter of Request has been executed from the Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing its execution as provided in Article 7 (h).
- (c) Except as above provided no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

IV.—JUDICIAL ASSISTANCE FOR POOR PERSONS, IMPRISONMENT FOR DEBT AND SECURITY FOR COSTS.

Article 12.

The subjects or citizens of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with subjects or citizens of that High Contracting Party as regards free judicial assistance for poor persons and imprisonment for debt; and, provided that they are resident in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, shall not be compelled to give security for costs in any case where a subject or citizen of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled.

V.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Article 13.

Any difficulties which may arise in connexion with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

Article 14.

The present Convention, of which the English and Polish texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in London. The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

Article 15.

- (a) This Convention shall not apply ipso facto to Scotland or Northern Ireland, nor to any of the Colonies or Protectorates of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, nor to any territories under His suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Government in the United Kingdom, but His Majesty may at any time, while this Convention is in force under Article 14, by a notification given through His Ambassador at Warsaw, extend the operation of the Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.
- (b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service under Article 3 or Letters of Request under Article 7 or 8 are to be transmitted, and the language in which communications and translations are to be made. The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.
- (c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.
- (d) The termination of the Convention under Article 14 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, ipso facto terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph (a) of this Article.

Article 16.

(a) The High Contracting Parties agree that the Government of the Republic of Poland, acting in virtue of Article 104 of the Treaty of Peace signed ar Verseilles on the 28th June, 1919, and of Articles 2 and 6 of the Convention concluded between Poland and Dantzig on the 9th November, 1920, may at any time while the present Convention is in force, under Article 14 or by virtue of any accession under Article 17, declare that the present Convention shall apply to the Free City of Dantzig, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel.

- (b) Upon such notification being made, the provisions of the present Convention shall apply to the territory of the Free City of Dantzig and the citizens of the Free City.
- (c) Either High Contracting Party may terminate the application of the Convention to Dantzig at any time after the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of the notification referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, by giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.
- (d) The termination of the Convention under Article 14 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, terminate it in respect of the Free City of Dantzig.

Article 17.

- (a) The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Artiele 14 or by virtue of any accession under this Artiele, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when the President of the Polish Republic has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Majesty to which the Convention applies. The provisions of Artiele 15 (b) shall be applicable to such notification. Any such accession chall take effect one month after the date of its notification.
- (b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 14 shall not affect its application to any such country.
- (c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.



VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 15, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 176 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 31 2, as against 28 3 in the preceding week, 27 2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30 3 the weekly average for last year. average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 177 (7 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 27 Moors, 7 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per anum was 31 4, as against 29 4 in the previous week, 22 4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24 5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 177 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-seven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 18 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Wellawatta North, and I each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 19 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seventeen deaths from Influenza were registered, 4 in Slave Island, 3 in Kotahena North, 2 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, and 1 each in Pettah and St. Paul's, as against 18 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last vear.

(c) Six deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena, South, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana North, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last

Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7. in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents) 2 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Six deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 2 in New Bazaar, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

Eleven deaths from Enteritis were registered, 7 from Debility, 6 from Worms, 4 from Diarrhoea, 3 from Infantile Convulsions, 2 from Accidents, 1 each from Dysentery, Tetanus, Homicide, and Puerperal Sepficaemia, and 68 from Other Causes.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF "COLOMBO FINANCE. COMPANY, LIMITED.

1a. The Chairman stated that before the Council proceeded with the Agenda, he knew it would be in accordance with the desire of the bouse that Council should record its sincere regret at the death of the late Mr. D. H. Rylands.

with the desire of the house that Council should record its sincere regret at the death of the late Mr. D. H. Rylands, Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, and its sympathy with his widow in her bereavement, Mr. Rylands, who entered the Council's service on agreement in September, 1930, was an officer who, by his own personality, keen sense of duty, zeal and efficiency in his profession, fully earned for himself the confidence of his employers, and his death was a severe loss to the Council's Service and to the latepayers. He moved that a record of this be made in the Minutes and conveyed to Mrs. Rylands with an expression of the Council's sympathy. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried in silence all the members standing standing.

Rustomjee, Proctor, Alfred House Gardens, Colpetty, might not have met with his death in a lorry accident: Such was the opinion of Mr. R. L. Bartholomuesz, City Coroner." A.—Yes.

(2) Q.—Does the Chairman agree that these remarks were justified? A.—The Chairman does not agree that

these remarks were justified.

(3) Q.—If so, will the Chairman take early steps to have this road better lighted? A.—The section of road where the accident occupred is comparatively well lit, as the lamps are 50 yards apart, whereas the usual distance apart of street

lamps is 70 yards.

(4) Q.—Will the Chairman take necessary steps to investigate what other streets on which there is heavy traffic, require better lighting arrangements whereby calamities, similar to the present one, may be avoided? A.—Street lighting is constantly being improved, but I am afraid no amount of lighting will prevent such accidents from happening.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:— 4.—Street lighting

(1) Q.—Will the Chairman please obtain and table a written statement from the Manager of the Gas Company to the effect:—(a) That Council has never been charged for mantles a higher rate than the general public? (b) As to whether a quality of gas 10 candle power, as contracted to Council, could be obtained by 12 hour carbonization? A.—A letter from the Manager of the Gas Company is tabled.

(2) Q.—Why was loss to Council in respect of assessment rates only Rs. 25 (1st quarter, 1933), when Company's Reports disclose extensive building operations during recent years? A.—The Company reports that the buildings Annual Reports disclose extensive building operations during recent years?

were only completed in January, 1933.

(3) Q.—In terms of clause 19 of gas contract, will the Chairman obtain and table City Analyst's test report on gas, as specified in clause 15? A.—The Mechanical Engineer's monthly report of tests specified in clause 15 of the contract is tabled. This report includes a report from the City Analyst on the chemical purity of the gas. I do not propose to ask the City Analyst for a report on illumination and heat equivalent.

(4) Q.—Arising out of answer to my question No. 9 of May 17, 1933, is the agreement, approved by the Four Standing Committees in respect of existing mains, or is it in respect of mains to be laid for street lighting? A.—The

resolution does not specify.

(5) Q.—How much during the past 10 years has Conneil paid for mains which existed in streets and lanes before public lamps were erected? A.—As the information cannot be obtained without a disproportionate expenditure of time and labour I regret I am unable to furnish it.

(6) Q.—As the annual payment of Rs. 2,000 under the heading "All services" is contrary to the terms of the contract, will the Chairman be pleased to refer all such payments for approval to the Council? A.—These payments which ceased in 1928 were specifically approved by the Council and therefore the question of referring them for approval to the Council does not arise.

(7) Q.—What were the gas rates per 1,000 c. feet for street lamps and to the general public in January and April, 1929, respectively, for lighting? A.—January, 1929, Rs. 3 for 1,000 c. feet for the Municipality and Rs. 5 for 1,000 c. feet for the general public. April, 1929, Rs. 3 25 for the Municipality and Rs. 5 25 for the general public.

feet for the general public. April, 1929, Rs. 3.25 for the Municipality and Rs. 5.25 for the general public.
(8) Q.—The Council having paid Rs. 9,000 to Rs. 10,000 per annum from 1918 to 1921 for not lighting the number of lamps contracted owing to retrenchment, was provision made in later contracts to protect the Council against such a

(9) Q.—Does the Chairman consider it safe to allow a petrol depôt in Gasworks street adjoining the Gas Company's

(10) Q.—Arising from answers to my questions No. 13 of April 5, 1933, and No. 12 of May 17, 1933, re overpayments to Gas Company in 1929, why were 1928 (higher) rates paid when 1929–1933 contract clause 1 reads "This contract shall come into force and operation as on and from January 1, 1929, inclusive"? A.—There was no overpayment. On the other hand the payment was less than it would have been if calculated according to the contract subsequently entered into. (11) Q.—In view of the long delay in procuring estimate for the street light conversion to electricity from the Government Electrical Department, will the Chairman be pleased to place this matter before the Minister of Communi-

cations and Works? A.-No.

I have not had a reply as regards the small quarry scheme, but I have yesterday received from the Controller of Labour a letter in which he informed me that the Executive Committee approves of the proposed construction of a road along the bank of the Dehiwala canal, provided the Municipality contributes two-thirds of the cost instead of one-third, as suggested. It is pointed out that the work will be of advantage to the Municipality, because it will result in increasing the ratable value of adjoining property within Municipal limits. It might also be pointed out that the road, when completed, will automatically vest in the Council and that in the case of the new section of the Liveramentu road the Council contributed two-thirds. ANNEXURE B.

Proposed New By-law 25.

- (i.) If any office be vacated by the death, removal, or absence on long leave of the holder, the person appointed to act in that office shall be remunerated as follows
 - (1) If the person appointed is not in the Municipal Service he shall be remunerated at such rate, as may be decided in terms of Municipal Leave By-law 13.

 (2) If he is the holder of another office, but is not performing the duties of it—

(a) If his salary in his substantive office is not less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting he shall continue to draw the former.

- (b) If his salary in his substantive office is less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting. he may, while so acting, receive half the initial salary of the office in which he is acting, half the initial salary of his substantive office and all the increments he has earned in his substantive office, provided that he shall not receive in all more than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting or more than his substantive salary increased by one-third if this amounts to less
- than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting.

 (3) If he is the holder of another office and is required to discharge the duties of that office while acting, he may receive
 - (a) If the offices are distinct and separate offices in different Departments or do not stand to one another in any immediate relation of superiority or subordination, half the initial salary of the office in which he is acting together with the whole of his salary in his substantive office.

(b) In any other case the salary which he would receive if his case fell under (2) above.

(4) When an officer acts in a post to which a higher commuted allowance than that which he normally draws is attached he may draw the higher allowance while it is available.

(ii.) For the purposes of this by-law, absence on long leave shall mean absence on leave for a period amounting to or exceeding sixty days.

(iii.) An officer appointed to act in an appointment other than his own cannot draw "acting" or "officiating" pay while he himself is on leave. This rule does not apply to casual leave granted under Municipal Leave By-law No. 14.

Method and device for drying tea and the like.

A method of drying tea and the like characterised by the feature that a mixture of air and moisture evaporated from the material contained in a drum as well as separated aromatic substances and gases, is maintained in continuous circulation through a mass of material which is preferably kept stirred. The air mixture passes through a heating element and through a filter to arrest dust and other undesirable bodies. On removal of part of the air mixture, cooler compensating air is introduced in such a way that it first passes through the dried part of the material.

There are thirteen claims and one sheet of drawings.
