“THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of “The Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915,” that from and after the first day of August, 1933, the said Ordinance shall be in force within the limits of the town of Alawwa, in Udukaha korale south of the Dambadeni hatpattuwa of the Kurunegala District, in the North-Western Province, defined by the following boundaries:—

*North.*—From the Rock landmark at the north-western corner of title plan No. 315,925 (lot 3A in final village plan No. 463) across the ela to the northern bank of the said ela, thence eastwards along the village limit of Hapugaha-gedera up to the point where it meets the western boundary of the paddy fields (lot 8 in final village plan No. 463).

*East.*—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the western boundary of paddy fields (lots 8 and 59 in final village plan No. 463) up to the point where it meets the northern boundary of the Railway reservation (lot 124 in final village plan No. 463), thence south-eastwards along the eastern bank of the ela to the point where the said ela crosses the Railway line under the bridge, thence south-eastwards along the eastern bank of the said ela to the point where it meets the southern boundary of the Railway reservation (lot 124 in final village plan No. 463), thence eastwards along the southern boundary of the said Railway reservation as far as the korale boundary of Udukaha korale east and thence southwards along the said korale boundary to the point where it meets the northern bank of the Maha-oya (lot 125 in final village plan No. 463).

*South.*—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern bank of the Maha-oya (lot 125 in final village plan No. 463) up to the confluence of Katukumbura-ela with the said Maha-oya.

*West.*—From the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the eastern bank of the Katukumbura-ela, crossing the Railway line from Colombo to Kandy, up to the point where it crosses the Alawwa-Giriulla road at culvert No. 9/9, thence northwards along the eastern bank of the said ela (lot 92½ in final village plan No. 463) until it meets the southern boundary of title plan No. 327,035 (lot 89A in final village plan No. 463), thence eastwards along the southern boundary of the said title plan No. 327,035 to the southern boundary of title plan No. 159,468 (part of lot 34 in final village plan No. 463), thence north-eastwards and northwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of the said title plan No. 159,468 until it meets the southern boundary of title plan No. 314,242 (lot 36 in final village plan No. 463), thence eastwards and northwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of the said title plan No. 314,242 up to the Rock landmark at the north-eastern corner of the said title plan No. 314,242, thence northwards along the eastern boundaries of lots 2AG, 2AE, and 2AD up to the Rock landmark at the north-eastern corner of the said lot 2AD, thence westwards along the northern boundary of the said lot 2AD to the Rock landmark at the south-eastern corner of lot 2z, thence northwards along the eastern boundaries of lots 2z, 2y, 2x, and 2q in final village plan No. 463 up to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of the said lot 2q, thence eastwards and northwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of lot 2 in final village plan No. 463 up to the starting point of the northern boundary.

RULES under section 29 of “The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924,” made by the Village Committee of the Habaraduwa subdivision of the Talpe pattu in the Galle District, Southern Province, in pursuance of the powers delegated to the said Committee under section 14 (1) of the Ordinance by the inhabitants of the subdivision, and approved by the

Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 30 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

Rules.

Village Committee Rules for the Habaraduwa Subdivision.

SECTION 29 (1)—VILLAGE PATHS, &C.

1. *Paths and roads.*—The expression “village path or road” shall include all public village paths or roads now in existence or hereafter to be constructed by the Village Committee.

2. No person shall block up, obstruct, damage, deface, injure, or encroach upon any public village path or road whether constructed or in course of construction.

3. When a range of paddy fields through which any public village path passes is under cultivation, the cultivators of such range shall be entitled to place sticks across the path (an idikada) when necessary, to prevent cattle from trespassing in the paddy fields and cattle being taken along such path.

4. *Stiles to be placed across both ends of public paths passing through chenas under cultivation.*—When any chena is cultivated through which a public path passes, it shall not be lawful to divert or in any way change such path, but proper stiles may be placed across the path, when necessary, and the path through the chena shall be kept clear: Provided that it shall be competent for the Chairman of the Village Committee to allow a temporary deviation of the path if he sees any objection to people going through a cultivated chena.

5. *Interference with public rights of way.*—No person shall interfere with the use of, or injure, damage, obstruct, or encroach upon, or without the permission of the Village Committee divert any road or path over which there is a public right of way.

6. *Defacing or blocking up private paths.*—No person shall deface or block up a private village path or road that has been in existence for ten or more years, or in any other way cause damage to such path or road.

7. *Injury to village property.*—No person shall destroy, damage, pollute, deface, or injure in any way, any bridge, edanda, ambalama, spout, well, watering and bathing place, market, or any other village property whatsoever.

8. *Wells.*—(1) The Village Committee may after giving due notice thereof set apart certain wells to be used for obtaining water, for drinking purposes only.

(2) No person shall bathe or wash clothes at, or in any way foul or pollute, any well so set apart.

9. *Protection of wells and artificial pits.*—(1) The occupier of any land, in which any well or artificial pit is situated, shall cause such well or artificial pit to be surrounded with a wall or a secure fence, to a height of not less than 2 feet 6 inches above the level of the ground.

(2) Such wall or fence shall be maintained in a state of repair by the occupier of the premises for the time being.

10. Should any occupier, after conviction of a breach of the above rule, fail within ten days of the date of such conviction to erect or repair the wall or fence in respect of which he was convicted, the Chairman of the Village Committee may order the wall or the fence to be erected or the necessary repairs to be carried out, and such occupier shall be liable to pay the cost thereof.

11. The expression “occupier” in rules 9 and 10 above shall mean the person in actual occupation of the land on which any well or artificial pit may be, whether such person is or is not the proprietor of the land, and if there be no one in actual occupation of such land, then the proprietor of such land if in the Island, and if such proprietor be absent from the Island, then the duly authorized agent or attorney of such proprietor.

SUB-SECTIONS (3) AND (11).

12. *Galas.*—The owner of every gala, or halting place for cattle, shall keep the same in a clean and sanitary state. He shall cause it to be thoroughly cleaned daily, and remove all dung and refuse daily to a place at least 50 yards away from any dwelling house.

13. *Slaughter places.*—No person shall slaughter cattle, goats, or sheep, or expose any meat for sale, except in place, assigned or approved by the Government Agent or the Chairman of the Village Committee.

## SUB-SECTIONS (4) AND (1).

14. *Markets.*—It shall be lawful for the Village Committee, to recover fees for the occupation of stalls in existing markets and those established under the provisions of the Ordinance, or to sell the lease of such markets by public auction.

15. The several rents and fees, payable in respect of a Village Committee market, shall be paid in advance on demand to the Chairman of the Village Committee, or the lessee or other person authorized by the Chairman or the lessee to recover the same. The lessee or person authorized shall furnish a receipt for any fees paid to him.

16. Every occupant of a stall, space, or seat in any market and every lessee thereof shall keep such market, stall, space, or seat clean and free from filth or rubbish.

17. No person using or occupying any portion of a market shall—

- (a) Behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market.
- (b) Carry on any cooking in any such market.
- (c) Damage or in anywise deface or pollute any portion of the building or any property of the Village Committee in or about such market.

18. It shall be the duty of the market-keeper, or of the lessee of a market, to maintain order within the limits of the market; and no person shall obstruct or resist any person appointed by the Chairman of the Village Committee, to superintend any market, or to collect the rents or fees, or to enforce order or cleanliness therein, whilst in the execution of his duty.

19. No person shall sell or expose for sale at any market cooked food, except in such portions of the market as are set apart by the Chairman of the Village Committee, for the purpose.

20. No occupant of a stall shall enclose in any way such stall or any other portion of a market, or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind, without the permission of the Chairman of the Village Committee.

21. No person suffering, or who has recently suffered from any contagious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall occupy any stall, seat, or place in such market or expose for sale thereat any provisions whatever, until the period of infection or of incubation is over.

22. No cart or vehicle shall remain within any market premises for a longer period than is necessary for loading or unloading.

## SECTION 29 (5)—BAKERIES.

23. Bakery shall mean any premises in which bread, biscuits, or confectionery are baked for sale as food for human consumption, and shall also include any premises in which such food is prepared, or in which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.

24. Every person who shall carry on the baking of bread, biscuits, or confectionery, in any bakery which does not comply with the following conditions, shall be guilty of an offence:—

- (a) The windows of all bakeries shall be glazed to admit light, and shall be made in such a manner as to be capable of being opened to admit air, and the areas of such windows shall not be less than one-fifth of the area of the floor space. The walls shall be plastered with lime mortar and white-washed, the floor cemented and drainage sufficiently provided. A ceiling shall also be provided capable of preventing dirt and dust falling from the roof.
- (b) The bakery shall not be within thirty feet of any cesspit, manure heap, latrine, open sewer, or privy.
- (c) The bakery shall be kept clean and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cesspit, or other nuisance.
- (d) No part of the bakery shall be used as a sleeping place.
- (e) A copy of the Village Committee rules regarding bakeries, in Sinhalese, shall be exhibited in some conspicuous place on a wall in the bakery.
- (f) A certificate shall be obtained from the Chairman of the Village Committee that the bakery conforms to the above requirements.

25. (1) The owner, or the person carrying on the business of a bakery, shall keep clean all utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to the bakery.

(2) He shall remove daily the dirt and refuse in and about the premises of the bakery, and shall flush the drains well.

26. No person in a bakery shall, in the manufacture of bread, biscuits or confectionery, make use of flour, water, or other material which are not good and wholesome.

27. No person suffering, or who has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease or who has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of a bakery to enter the bakery or to take part in the manufacture and sale on the premises of bread, biscuits, or confectionery, until the period of infection or incubation is over.

28. All persons employed in the preparation and baking of bread, shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread-making, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and the body and also a white cap or turban.

29. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Village Committee, or any Sanitary Inspector, or any person authorized by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.

## SECTION 29 (5)—TEA AND COFFEE BOUTIQUES.

30. The owner of every eating-house, or tea or coffee boutique, shall keep the same clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Village Committee.

31. The owner shall see that all utensils, furniture, and other requisites, used in or belonging to such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique, are kept clean.

32. No person shall carry on the business of an eating-house, or tea and coffee boutique, in any premises which do not comply with the following conditions, viz.:—

- (a) The walls shall be plastered and limewashed.
- (b) The rooms shall be well ventilated and lighted.
- (c) The rooms shall be provided with a ceiling capable of preventing dirt and dust falling from the roof.

33. No person suffering, or who has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of an eating-house or tea or coffee boutique to enter the eating-house or tea or coffee-boutique or to take part in cooking or sale, until the period of infection or incubation is over.

## SECTION 29 (6)—UNWHOLESOME FOOD.

34. *Unwholesome foodstuffs.*—No person shall expose for sale any articles of food which are unfit for human consumption.

35. It shall be lawful for any person authorized by the Chairman, to seize any meat, poultry, fish, fruit, and vegetables exposed or hawked about for sale within the subdivision, which he has reason to believe to be unfit for human food, and to convey the same to the Chairman; and if it appears to the Chairman that such meat, poultry, fish, vegetable, fruit, or other provisions are unfit for human food, he shall order the same to be destroyed.

## SECTION 29 (7)—SPRINGS AND WATER-COURSES.

36. *Felling or destroying timber or underwood on lands reserved for the preservation of springs and water-courses.*—No person shall fell or destroy any timber or underwood on land reserved for the preservation and conservancy of springs, or on the bed or on the banks of water-courses.

## SECTION 29 (8)—FISHING.

37. *Kraals.*—No fish kraals or akulvetiyas shall be erected, nor shall any existing kraals or akulvetiya be continued, in any river, lake, or canal, without the permission of the Committee and payment of such fee as the Committee may from time to time determine.

38. Fishing by rod and line in lakes, streams, rivers, and oyas is permitted throughout the year.

39. No person shall fish by kraals in such waters during February, March, and April.

40. No person shall fish in pools or waters, near viharas, pansalas, or similar places, in which it has hitherto not being the custom to fish.

41. No person shall at any time use any madel, kud-del, ippli-del, or other similar net with destroys ova or makes a clean sweep of the fry in rivers, streams, lakes, and oyas.

42. A clear space, of not less than 16 yards, shall be left for the waterway between the ends of kraals or akulvetiyas on either bank of a lake, river, stream, or oya.

43. *Disputes to be settled by the Chairman, Village Committee.*—In case of any dispute with regard to the nature, description, or class of nets which have been or are about to be used, the matter shall be decided by the Chairman and such decision shall be final.

#### SECTION 29 (11)—SLAUGHTERING OF ANIMALS.

44. (1) No person shall slaughter any animal in the presence of other animals.

(2) No person shall bring any animal for slaughter into any slaughtering place until the carcass of any animal previously slaughtered has been removed, or screened off.

#### SECTION 29 (12)—DISEASE AMONGST ANIMALS.

45. *Segregation of diseased cattle.*—The owner or the person in charge of any animal attacked with any contagious or infectious disease, shall segregate it and give immediate notice to the Headman of the village in which the animal may then be.

46. *Removal of affected animals to hospital sheds.*—The owner or person in charge of cattle, if directed so to do by the Village Headman, shall at once have any animal affected with any contagious disease removed to a well ventilated shed and leave it in charge of a person appointed by the Headman to tend, and treat it.

47. *Cattle in infected areas to be kept tethered.*—(1) In every village in which cattle disease exists or has within ten days previously existed, and in every village within a radius of three miles thereof, all cattle owners and persons in charge of cattle shall keep their animals tethered or securely penned.

(2) No animal shall be tethered near a road or near any public place in any such village.

48. No person shall bring any animal into or remove any animal from, any village in which cattle disease exists or has within ten days previously existed.

49. *Burial of infectious matter.*—It shall be the duty of every owner or person in charge of diseased cattle to burn or bury at a depth of six feet the dung, litter, &c., of any diseased animal, and also to disinfect the spot with disinfectants, and to disinfect himself thoroughly before he approaches healthy cattle.

50. *Disposal of carcasses found unburied.*—Every person who, within an infected area, finds the carcass of any cattle lying dead and unburied, shall report the same to the nearest Headman, who shall forthwith cause them to be buried in the manner aforesaid.

51. *Disinterring carcasses.*—No person shall disinter the carcass of any animal which died from an infectious or contagious disease, or remove the flesh or hide or other parts of the carcass of such animal.

52. *Segregation after recovery.*—Cattle, which have recovered from an infectious or contagious disease, shall not be allowed to mix with healthy cattle until fourteen days have elapsed after complete recovery.

#### SECTION 29 (13)—TRESPASS BY ANIMALS.

53. *Tying cattle.*—No owner of cattle, or person in charge of any cattle, shall fail to keep his animals penned or securely tethered.

54. *Tying cattle in thoroughfares.*—No person shall tie or tether cattle so as to obstruct a public thoroughfare.

#### SECTION 29 (14)—BOUNDARIES.

55. *Boundaries of private lands.*—(1) The boundaries of all private lands shall be marked by fences, ditches, or stones, according to the custom of the subdivision in which they are situated.

(2) Such boundaries shall be put up by the owners of both sides thereof.

(3) Upon a resolution in that behalf being passed by the Committee, any owner may be requested by the Chairman, by a notice in writing, so to mark the boundary within a reasonable time not less than fourteen days.

(4) If such owner shall fail to comply with the request, the Chairman may cause the necessary work to be done, and the expense incurred shall be recoverable as a debt due from such owner.

56. *Injury to boundaries.*—No person shall alter, deface, or wilfully injure any such boundary.

#### SECTION 29 (15)—SANITATION, NUISANCE, &C.

57. *Compounds.*—The owner, occupier, or tenant of every house or land, shall keep his premises clean and free from all weeds or rank or noisome vegetation, as well as from all refuse or rubbish or receptacles likely to form

breeding places for mosquitoes, for a distance of 30 yards from such house or up to the boundary of his premises, whichever is less.

58. *Rubbish on roads.*—No person shall put dirt, refuse, rubbish, or any other obstructive matter on any road or into any roadside drains.

59. *Halting of carts on roads.*—No person shall halt any cart on the road except for such time as may be reasonably necessary for loading or unloading.

60. *Obscene drawings and writings, &c.*—(1) No person shall publish any obscene writing, or make any obscene writing, or make any obscene drawing in public places, likely to cause annoyance to any individual or to any section of the public.

(2) No person shall sing or recite in or near any public place any obscene song or ballad.

61. *Throwing stones or filth.*—No person shall throw stones or filth at another's house or into another's compound.

62. No person shall commit nuisance by urinating or defecating in any public place other than a public latrine, or in any place where he may be visible to the public.

63. (1) Whenever it shall appear to the Chairman of the Village Committee that any land or premises within 30 yards of any dwelling house is in an insanitary condition by reason of the growth of weeds or rank or noisome vegetation upon it or by reason of accumulations of manure, filth or rubbish or of stagnant water, or of receptacles likely to contain rain water, the Chairman may request the owner or occupier of such land by a notice in writing to do, within a reasonable time not less than fourteen days to be specified in such notice, such work as is necessary to put the said land into a sanitary condition.

(2) The owner or occupier aforesaid shall have the right to appeal within ten days against the order contained in such notice, to the Government Agent, who may rescind or vary the order in any way he considers fit.

(3) If no appeal be forwarded within the time specified, or if the owner or occupier shall fail to carry out the said work, or if having appealed he shall fail to comply with the orders made in appeal by the Government Agent, the Chairman may cause the necessary work to be done, and for that purpose shall have the power to enter into and upon such land with such labourers, implements, and things as may be required, and the expense incurred shall be recoverable as a debt due from the owner of the land or premises.

64. *Burial of dead animals.*—(1) No owner or tenant of any premises shall fail to bury the carcass of any dead animal found upon his premises.

(2) The owner of the animal shall be liable to pay the cost of such burial.

65. *Prohibition of burial or cremation near dwelling houses.*—No dead body shall be buried or cremated in any place, other than a duly established burial ground, within 100 yards of any dwelling house or well.

66. *Duty of burial by nearest relations.*—In the case of the death of any person, the occupier of the premises where the death took place, or in his absence, the nearest adult male relative of the deceased, shall be responsible for the proper burial of the corpse.

67. *Defilement of wells, &c.*—No person shall defile a well, or any public bathing place or obstruct the supply of water from a well, spout, or any other water-course.

68. *Diseased persons prohibited from using public bathing places.*—No person infected with any contagious or infectious disease shall wash himself or his clothes in any public bathing place.

69. *Removal of overhanging trees.*—(1) The owner of any trees, overhanging any public road or path or any field or any building, shall cause such trees or the overhanging branches thereof to be cut down, when directed to do so by the Chairman of the Village Committee.

(2) In the event of default, the Chairman shall cause the work to be done, and any officer or workman authorized by the Chairman in writing may enter upon such ground and cause the work to be done, and the expense thereby incurred shall be paid by such owner or occupier and shall be recoverable as a debt due from him to the Village Committee.

70. If any house, building or wall or anything affixed thereon, be deemed by the Chairman of the Village Committee to be in such a condition as to be dangerous to the neighbouring houses or buildings or occupiers thereof or to passers-by, he shall immediately, if it appears to be necessary, cause a proper hoarding or fence, to be put up for the protection of passers-by, and shall cause notice in writing to be given to the owner or occupier directing him within three days after the service of the notice, to take down, secure, or repair such house, building, wall, or thing affixed thereon, as the case may require.

71. Any person failing to comply with any such notice shall be guilty of an offence, and if after conviction he fails to comply within fourteen days, the Chairman of the Village Committee may employ any person to do the work which ought to have been done, and the expenses thereby incurred shall be paid by such owner or occupier, and shall be recoverable as a debt due from him to the Village Committee.

#### SECTION 29 (15).

72. No kraals for soaking coconut husks shall be erected nor shall any existing kraals be continued, in any river, lake, canal, or piece of water, without the permission of the Committee and payment of such fee as the Committee may from time to time determine.

#### SECTION 29 (17)—TODDY DRAWING.

73. *Tappers shall place new scaling bamboos at intervals of six months.*—(a) The scaling bamboo tied to a kital tree for purposes of tapping shall be renewed by the tapper at intervals of six months.

(b) It shall be an offence for any person to use any such scaling bamboo for a longer period than six months.

74. *Coupling trees.*—(1) It shall be the duty of every person employing others to draw toddy, and every person on whose account toddy is drawn, to use or cause to be used in coupling trees six distinct new ropes for the feet and three ropes for the hands, and at the end of every four months to add two new ropes for the feet and two for the hands, each rope consisting of six strands.

(2) The Chairman of the Village Committee, or any person authorized by him, may once a month inspect the couplings and bamboos within his jurisdiction.

#### SECTION 29 (18)—SPRING GUNS AND TRAPS.

75. *Spring guns.*—No person shall set spring guns, or make pitfalls, within the subdivision.

#### SECTION 29 (19)—GAMBLING, COCK-FIGHTING AND CART-RACING.

76. *Gambling.*—All gambling with dice or cards, all games of chance played for money or stakes, and betting of any kind in any public place are prohibited.

77. *Cart-racing.*—No person shall engage in cart-racing in any public thoroughfare within the subdivision.

78. *Reckless driving.*—No person shall drive a hackery or any vehicle recklessly or negligently, or in a manner endangering the safety of the public, on a public thoroughfare.

79. *Cock-fighting.*—No person shall train cocks for fighting, or take part in cock-fighting in any place within the subdivision.

#### SECTION 29 (21)—NEGLECT OR VEXATIOUS CONDUCT.

80. (1) *Hindrance and vexatious conduct.*—No headman or officer of the Committee or other authorized person shall be guilty of any negligence, or of malicious or vexatious conduct, in the performance of any duty under the Village Committee rules.

(2) Any headman officer or authorized person, who shall be guilty of negligence or of malicious or vexatious conduct under colour of his office, shall on conviction before a President of the Village Tribunal, be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

#### SECTION 29 (25) TO (28)—ANNUAL TAX.

81. *Construction and upkeep.*—The construction, maintenance, and improvements of village works mentioned in section 29 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1924, and of all others for which the inhabitants of any subdivisions may by any law at present in force or hereafter to be enacted, be empowered to make provision, shall be effected by all inhabitants, bound or liable to perform labour who reside within the subdivision and the Committee may under rule 83 determine the number of days of labour that each inhabitant liable shall contribute towards it, either in person or by substitute or by money payment.

82. *Exemption.*—(1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Village Committee, upon proof to his satisfaction, that any person resident within the subdivision and liable to the performance of labour, is owing to disease or bodily infirmity, incapable of performing labour, to exempt such person from the performance thereof either for life or for such period as the Chairman may think fit.

(2) Any person not already exempted for life or other specified period by the Chairman, and desiring to be exempted from the performance of labour on any of the grounds in this rule already mentioned, or on the ground that he is above the age of 55 years, shall on or before March 31, in the year for which exemption is claimed

apply to the Chairman for exemption. The Chairman may in his discretion refuse in respect of the current year any application not presented within the time so limited.

83. *Village Lists.*—(a) It shall be the duty of the person authorized thereto in writing by the Chairman of the Village Committee, to prepare annually before February 1, a list of the names of all the males residing within each Police Headman's division who are bound or liable to perform labour under the Village Communities Ordinance and forward a copy thereof to the Chairman. Any such authorized person guilty of negligence in preparing the list shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

(b) Every such person, so authorized in writing, shall within two weeks from the time of such appointment, give security to the Village Committee for the due and faithful execution of his office, in such amount as shall be determined by the Committee; and such security may be given by way of mortgage of immovable property, or by deposit of money in such manner as the Committee may decide; and such bond shall in the case of immovable property be made in favour of the Chairman, and in the case of money be deposited to the credit of the Chairman in a bank to be chosen by the Chairman.

(c) Every householder shall, whenever required by such duly authorized person, supply information as to the number of inmates and the name, age and nationality of every male person, including the householder himself if a male, resident in his house; and any householder, refusing or neglecting to do so, or giving any false information to such authorized person, shall be guilty of an offence.

84. *Liability.*—(1) Whenever it is necessary to repair or construct any village work, any inhabitant in the subdivision may bring the fact to the notice of the Committee.

(2) On receiving such information, the Committee shall make such inquiry as it thinks necessary and if it approves of the work, shall prepare a list setting out the nature of the work and the names of the villages interested in it, and may make such subsequent alterations in the list as may be deemed expedient; and the decision of the Committee as set forth in such list or amended list, shall be final on the question as to what villages are interested.

85. *Supervision and completion reports.*—The officer or officers, appointed under section 36 of the Ordinance, shall cause such approved work to be done, and shall report to the Committee the completion of the work, the names of the defaulters, if any, and the expenses incurred in consequence of their default.

86. *Double labour in case of default.*—(1) Such defaulters shall be liable to perform increased labour not exceeding double the number of days originally fixed.

(2) The Committee may allow them to commute such labour at the increased rate.

87. *Penalty.*—All persons failing to perform such increased or double labour or to commute the same, shall be guilty of an offence.

#### SECTION 29 (29).

\* 88. *Loitering.*—No person shall loiter in a thoroughfare or a public place after 9 o'clock at night without a light and without sufficient cause.

89. *Disorderly behaviour.*—No person shall behave in riotous or disorderly manner in any thoroughfare or other public place or building.

90. *Behaviour within precincts of Village Tribunals.*—No person shall expectorate within any building used as the court-house of a Village Tribunal.

91. *Obscene language.*—No person shall use obscene or abusive language in a public place in a manner calculated to provoke a breach of the peace.

92. *Disturbing the public repose.*—No person shall make any noise, sing songs, or otherwise disturb the public after 9 P.M. Provided that nothing in this rule shall be deemed to affect the existing rights of the public in the matter of religious ceremonies and other customary gatherings.

#### SECTION 29 (30)—SALE OF LIQUOR.

93. No person shall sell or allow any person to sell, to any female or to a boy under the age of 16 years, any description of spirits, or other intoxicating liquor or toddy.

#### SECTION 29 (33)—VILLAGE COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

94. Meetings of the Village Committee shall be held on the second Saturday of every month. Provided that it shall be lawful for the Committee to adjourn any meeting to any other day or hour, or to fix any other date for such meetings in an emergency or for any other special reason.

95. The quorum for the transaction of business shall be six members in addition to the Chairman.



96. As soon after the hour appointed for any meeting as a quorum shall assemble, the Chairman shall take the Chair and the Committee shall proceed to business. Should a quorum not be present, at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned.

97. The meetings shall be held at such convenient place within the subdivision as may be approved by the Committee.

98. A Minute book shall be kept by the Chairman in which shall be minuted during each sitting, in the order in which they occur, the proceedings of the Committee.

99. A motion negated at a meeting, shall not again be brought forward, until after the expiration of at least six months; and no motion, in any way contrary to one already passed by the Committee at a meeting, shall be entertained until after the expiration of the same period.

100. (a) All questions and resolutions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present.

(b) In the event of the members present being equally divided on any matter, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

101. On points of order at meetings the ruling of the Chairman shall be final.

102. The Chairman may order the immediate withdrawal of any member whose conduct is, in the opinion of the Chairman, disorderly, and such member may not take any further part at that meeting.

#### SECTION 29 (34)—VILLAGE AFFAIRS, &C.

103. *Driving carriages, &c., at night without lights.*—No person shall drive a cart, carriage, or other vehicle on any public road within the subdivision at night without two lighted lanterns being attached to the front of the vehicle, one on each side.

104. *Houses to be whitewashed.*—All villagers shall whitewash their houses with makulu-lime or other suitable substance at least once a year and at any other time appointed by the Chairman of the Village Committee, if by reason of an outbreak of epidemic, disease or any other similar grounds he considers it necessary.

105. The rules dated October 29, 1903, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 5,958 of December 4, 1903, are hereby repealed.

#### BY-LAWS.

1. The following area is hereby assigned to the Public Markets established under the control of the Urban District Council, Beruwala, and shall be called the Beruwala Market area, viz:—

The area bounded on the west by the sea; on the south by an imaginary straight line drawn from the Siliya-ela where it meets the sea to a point on the railway track where it meets the southern boundary of Division No. 3; on the east by the railway track from the last mentioned point to the point where it meets the Nallahena road, and along an imaginary line drawn from this point to the junction of Deenagoda-Aekkaragoda road and along and including Aekkaragoda road to the point where it meets Polkotuwa road; on the north by Polkotuwa road from the last mentioned point to its imaginary extension in a straight line to the sea and including the said road.

2. No person shall sell or expose for sale within the Beruwala Market area any meat, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables, except in the public market or except as herein-after provided in by-law No. 3.

3. (a) Any person may sell by public auction at any spot on the seabeach any fresh fish which may be landed thereat by fishing boats.

(b) Every itinerant vendor duly licensed by the Chairman may sell fresh fish within the market area in terms of such licence.

(c) Every itinerant vendor may sell poultry, fruit, or vegetables within the market area provided he does not sell at a fixed place or does not for the purpose of such sale establish himself on the public roads or other public places.

(d) Every keeper of a licensed eating-house or tea and coffee boutique may sell fruits on the licensed premises.

(e) Any person may sell young coconuts anywhere within the market area.

4. No private market for the sale of meat, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables shall be established within the Urban District Council area without a licence from the Chairman.

5. Within the Beruwala Market area the Chairman may, on payment to the Council of a fee of Rs. 3 for each year, payable half-yearly, issue a licence to itinerant vendors for the sale of fresh fish.

6. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

This clause shall not apply to persons punishable under section 162 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

*Meetings: Notice, Agenda, Quorum, &c.*

1. (a) There shall be twelve General Meetings of the Council in every year for the transaction of business.
- (b) The general meetings of the Council shall be held at the Office of the Urban District Council, Nawalapitiya, at least once every month on such day and at such hour as the Council may from time to time resolve, or as soon after that hour as may seem expedient to the Chairman.
- (c) A special meeting may be held at the place aforesaid on such date and at such hour as the Chairman shall for each such meeting specially appoint.
- (d) Notice of every such meeting and of the business to be transacted at it shall be served on or left at the residence of each Councillor at least three days—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—before the meeting.
- (e) No business shall be brought before or transacted at any meeting, general or special, other than the business specified in the notice of the meeting, without the permission of the Council.
- (f) No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum of at least six Councillors is present.
- (g) If at any meeting there is not a sufficient number of Councillors present to form a quorum the Chairman shall adjourn the meeting to such date not more than fifteen days after the date of the meeting so adjourned as he thinks fit, and the business which would have been brought before the meeting so adjourned, if there had been a quorum present, shall be brought before, and disposed of, at such adjourned meeting.

*Adjournment of Meetings.*

2. (a) The Chairman of any meeting, general or special, at which a quorum of the Council is present may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the meeting from time to time; but no business shall be transacted without the permission of the Council at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which such adjournment took place.
- (b) Notice of an adjourned meeting shall be served on or left at the residence of members at least twenty-four hours before the time fixed for such meeting unless the original meeting decides to hold the adjourned sitting within twenty-four hours.

*Presence of Strangers.*

3. The Public, including the Press, may be present at meetings in the places set apart for them, but must withdraw when called upon to do so by the Chairman, when

in the opinion of the majority of the members of the Council present at the meeting, expressed by resolution, such exclusion is deemed advisable in the public interest.

*Order of Business.*

4. The business of the Council shall be transacted in the following order:—
  - (a) Confirmation of the minutes of the last preceding meeting.
  - (b) Memorials, petitions, complaints, and communications addressed to the Council shall be laid before the Council.
  - (c) Questions of which due notice has been given.
  - (d) Motions of which due notice has been given.
  - (e) Any other matter set down in the notice of the meeting in the order in which such matters are set out or in such order as the Council may for special reasons adopt.
  - (f) Monthly statements of receipts and disbursements, progress reports of works, and such other documents as are required by the Council, shall be submitted to the Council.

*Order of Precedence.*

5. For all purposes connected with the Council, the precedence and seniority of Councillors shall be regulated as follows:—

After the Chairman shall rank the Vice-Chairman and then the Councillors in order of the priority of their nomination or election and in the case of former Councillors re-elected or re-nominated, of the priority of their continuous membership of Council or its predecessor (such continuous membership being deemed to be unimpaired during the absence of a nominated member for whom a temporary successor has been nominated).

*Minutes.*

6. The minutes of each meeting shall be circulated. At the next or some subsequent meeting the question shall be put that the minutes be taken as read and confirmed. In the absence of objection or correction, the minutes as recorded shall be confirmed.

*Memorials, Petitions, &c.*

7. (a) A member presenting a petition or memorial to the Council may state concisely the purpose of the petition or memorial.
- (b) No member shall present any petition or memorial or other communication which is not respectful in tone throughout.
- (c) It shall be competent for any member to move that such petition or memorial be read. In making such motion he shall state concisely his reasons for wishing to have it read.
- (d) No debate shall be permitted on such motion, nor shall any other member speak upon or in relation to such petition or memorial, except to second the motion formally.
- (e) Such motion being seconded, the question shall be put whether the petition or memorial shall be read.

*Questions.*

8. (a) Questions relating to the affairs of the Council may be put to the Chairman.
- (b) At least seven clear days' notice—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—shall be given of such questions.
- (c) A written reply shall be read by the Chairman to each question.
- (d) No member shall address the Council upon any question, nor shall the terms of any question contain any argument or expression of opinion or statement of fact, except in so far as may be necessary to explain such question.
- (e) Any member may put a supplementary question for the purpose of further elucidating any matter of fact regarding which an answer has been given.

Provided that the Chairman may disallow any supplementary question if, in his opinion, it infringes the rules as to the subject matter of questions, and in that case the question shall not appear on the record of the minutes of the Council.

*Motions.*

9. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing signed by the member of the Council giving the notice. Unless such notice has been in the hands of the Secretary seven clear days—exclusive of Sundays and Government holidays—before the meeting of Council, the motion may not be included in the agenda.
- (b) All notices of motions shall be dated and numbered as received, and shall be entered by the Secretary upon the agenda in the order in which they are received.

(c) Before any notice of motion is placed on the agenda paper, it shall be submitted to the Chairman, who, if he is of opinion that it is out of order, shall order that such motion shall not be included in the agenda and shall cause the giver of the notice to be so informed.

(d) Every motion of which notice is given shall be relevant to some question affecting the administration of the Council's affairs.

(e) No motion to rescind any resolution which has been passed within the preceding six months, nor any motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived within the preceding six months, shall be deemed to be in order, unless notice thereof shall have been given and specified in the agenda, and the notice shall bear, in addition to the member who proposes the motion, the signatures of seven other members; and when such motion has been disposed of, it shall not be competent for any member to propose any similar motion within the period of six months next following.

(f) No motion shall be deemed to have been submitted for debate until it shall have been proposed and seconded.

(g) Any member may second a motion or amendment by rising in his place and bowing to the Chair, without prejudice to his right to speak at a later period of the debate.

(h) Before any motion of which previous notice has not been given but for the introduction of which permission of the Council has been obtained under by-law 1 (e) is moved in Council, it shall be reduced to writing signed by the mover and handed to the Secretary.

(i) When a motion has been moved and seconded and the debate thereon concluded, the question thereupon shall be put to the vote by the Chairman.

#### *Withdrawal of Motion or Amendment.*

10. A member who has moved a motion or amendment may withdraw the same by leave of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked for permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

#### *Re-introduction of Motion.*

11. A motion which has been withdrawn may be moved again at any subsequent meeting; but no motion shall be proposed which is the same in substance as any motion which within the period of six months referred to in rule 9 (e) shall have been resolved in the affirmative or negative.

#### *Amendments.*

12. (a) Every amendment shall be in writing and handed to the Secretary by the member proposing it.

(b) Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion during the discussion of which it is moved.

(c) Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

(d) No amendment shall be discussed or put to the Council until it shall have been seconded.

(e) A member who has seconded an amendment in a formal manner shall be permitted afterwards to speak upon it.

(f) Whenever an amendment to any motion under discussion has been moved and seconded, no second or subsequent amendment shall be moved until the first amendment shall have been disposed of. If an amendment be carried, the motion as amended shall take the place of the original motion, and shall become the question upon which any further amendment may be moved.

#### *Debate ceases when Question fully put.*

13. No member may speak to any question after the same has been fully put by the Chairman. A question is fully put when the voting has been taken thereon.

#### *Voting and Recording of Votes.*

14. (a) The question shall be put by the Chairman, and the votes may be taken by a show of hands or by a secret ballot as the Council decides, and the result shall be declared by the Chairman; but in any case where the votes are taken otherwise than by secret ballot, any member may call for a division, and in that event the votes shall be taken by the Secretary asking each member separately, according to the order of precedence, how he desires to vote, and recording the votes accordingly.

(b) On any question being put, whether in Council or in Committee of the whole Council, every member present shall record his vote, either for the ayes or the noes.

#### *Casting Vote of Chairman.*

(c) The Chairman shall have an original vote in common with other members whether in Council or Committee of the whole Council, and also a casting vote if upon any question the votes are equal.

#### *Members dissenting.*

15. It shall be competent for any Councillor, who is in a minority, to record the reasons for his dissent from the opinion of the majority, and such written dissent, if sent to the Secretary within one week of the meeting in question, shall be entered by the Secretary at the end of his minutes of the proceedings.

#### *Order of the Day.*

16. The "Order of the Day" shall include all business, arranged according to rule No. 4. Unless otherwise resolved the business shall be taken in the order printed.

#### *Preservation of Order.*

17. (a) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order, and his decision on all disputed points of order shall be final.

(b) Any member of the Council deviating from the rules may be immediately called to order by the Chairman of his own motion or on any other member of the Council rising to a point of order.

#### *Decision of Questions of Order.*

18. When the question of order has been stated, the member who raises it shall resume his seat, and no other member, except by leave of the Chairman, shall rise till the Chairman has decided the question, after which the member who was addressing the Council or Committee of the Council at the time the question was raised shall be entitled to proceed with his speech, if he conforms to the Chairman's ruling. If he does not conform, the Chairman may refuse to allow him to proceed with his speech.

#### *Member not explaining or retracting.*

19. Any member who fails to explain or to retract any objectionable words used by him, or to offer apologies for the use thereof to the satisfaction of the Council, may be censured or otherwise dealt with as the Council thinks fit.

#### *Chairman speaking.*

20. When the Chairman is addressing the Council or Committee of the Council, any member then standing shall immediately resume his seat.

#### *Naming of Members.*

21. (a) The Chairman may name any member immediately after the commission of the offence of disregarding the authority of the Chair, or of abusing the rules of the Council by persistently and wilfully obstructing the business of the Council, and the Chairman may forthwith put the question on a motion being made by any member or from the Chair (no amendment, adjournment, or debate being allowed) "that such member be suspended from the service of the Council".

(b) If any such motion be carried and any member be suspended under this rule, his suspension on the first occasion shall continue for one month, on the second occasion for two months, and on the third or subsequent occasion for three months.

(c) Not more than one member shall be named at the same time, unless several members present together have jointly disregarded the authority of the Chair.

(d) If any member or members acting jointly, who have been suspended under this rule from the service of the Council, shall refuse at any time during the period of suspension to obey the directions of the Chairman to withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber, the Chairman may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his decision.

#### *Irrelevance or Tedious Repetition.*

22. The Chairman after having called the attention of the Council or Council in Committee to the conduct of a member who persists in irrelevance or tedious repetition, either of his own arguments or of the arguments used by other members in debate, may direct the member to discontinue his speech.

#### *Disorderly Conduct.*

23. (a) The Chairman may order members whose conduct is grossly disorderly to withdraw immediately from the Council Chamber during the remainder of the meeting, and may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his order.

(b) If on any occasion the Chairman deems that his powers under this rule are inadequate he may name such member or members in pursuance of rule 21.

#### *Duty to obey Order of Suspension or Withdrawal.*

24. Members who are suspended under rule 21, or are directed to withdraw under rule 23, shall forthwith withdraw from the precincts of the Council Chamber.

*Power to adjourn.*

25. An adjournment of the discussion of any question may be moved by a Councillor at any time, and, if seconded, shall be forthwith put to the vote.

26. In the event of grave disorder arising at any meeting of the Council or Committee of the Council, the Chairman may, if he thinks it necessary to do so, adjourn the meeting without putting the question of adjournment to the house, or suspend the meeting for a time to be named by him.

*Rules for Members speaking.*

27. In speaking to any proposition under consideration of the Council or a Committee of the whole Council, the following rules shall be strictly observed:—

- (a) Every member shall address his observations to the Chairman and shall speak standing except in Committee.
- (b) He shall not be interrupted unless he is out of order.
- (c) When he has finished his observations he shall resume his seat, and any other member wishing to address the Council may rise.
- (d) A member shall not read his speech, but he may read extracts from written or printed papers in support of his argument.
- (e) If two members rise at the same time, the Chairman shall call on the member who first catches his eye.
- (f) Every member shall confine his observations to the subject under consideration.
- (g) No member shall impute improper motives to any other member.
- (h) All remarks of a personal nature shall be avoided.
- (i) A member may speak to the question before the Council or any amendment proposed thereto.
- (j) No member shall speak more than once on any proposition before the Council, except in explanation or to order, or when the Council is in Committee, or as is provided by rule 12 (e).
- (k) By the indulgence of the Council, a member may explain matters of a personal nature, although there be no question before the Council, but such matters may not be debated, and he must confine himself strictly to the vindication of his own conduct.
- (l) The mover of any resolution or motion may reply after all the members present have had an opportunity of addressing the Council and before the question is put, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. The right of reply shall not extend to the mover of an amendment.

*Committee of Council.*

28. The Council may at any time resolve themselves into a committee of the whole Council, and, on their resuming, the result of their deliberations shall be dealt with by the Council.

29. It shall be competent for any member at any stage of any discussion in a committee of the whole Council to move that the Council do resume. The question shall be put to the vote by the Chairman, and if the motion is carried, the Council will immediately resume from Committee.

*Special Committees.*

30. (a) No committee appointed by the Council under section 25 of the Ordinance shall take any proceedings after the close of the year during which it is appointed.

(b) The quorum for the meetings of every such committee shall be three, unless otherwise specially fixed.

(c) In the absence of the Chairman at a meeting of any Committee, the members present shall choose one of their own members to preside, and such member shall for that meeting have all the powers of the Chairman.

(d) When a committee shall have agreed to a report the same shall be signed by each of the members thereof and shall, together with the minutes of proceedings, be submitted to the Council.

(e) In the event of any division taking place in a committee, a record thereof shall be entered in the minutes together with the motion or resolution proposed, the name of the proposer, and the respective votes of the members present, and such minutes shall be submitted with the report of such committee.

31. The Press shall be excluded from all meetings of special and standing committees.

## REPEAL.

The by-law regarding the time and place of meetings of the Council published by Notification dated February 21, 1933, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,969 of February 24, 1933, is hereby repealed.

## "THE MEDICAL ORDINANCE, 1927."

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 22, 1933.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 173 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 19 Moors, 8 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 30.6, as against 31.2 in the preceding week, 27.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 146 (4 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 23 Moors, 1 Malay, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.9, as against 31.4 in the previous week, 22.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 146 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta North and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 27 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in San Sebastian and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 17 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident). The number registered during the preceding week was also 6 and the weekly average for last year was 3.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, and 1 each in Kotahena South and Kollupitiya, as against 16 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 each in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and Maradana East, as against 6 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Ten deaths from debility were registered, 8 from *Dysentery*, 7 from *Worms*, 5 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Enteritis*, 3 from *Accidents*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Tetanus*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 55 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Ten cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 7, 6, and 2 respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80.1°, against 81.4° in the preceding week, and 79.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.843 in., against 29.857 in. in the preceding week and 29.853 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.50 in., against 0.05 in. in the preceding week, and 0.51 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

**KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**

**The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 17, 1933, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated June 12, 1933.**

*Present* :—Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle ; Dr. L. C. Wijesinha ; Mr. O. T. Nettelton.

Before proceeding with the business for the day, the Chairman moved—That this Council place on record its sense of loss to the public caused by the death of Mr. E. L. Goonewardene, Proctor, Supreme Court, who was a Member of this Council from February, 1919, to December, 1920, and convey to the widow and children an expression of its sympathy in their sad bereavement". Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—The motion was carried all Members standing.

2. The Chairman tabled a telegram received from Mr. Geo. E. de Silva regretting his inability to attend the meeting owing to illness.

3. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 20, 1933, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

4. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1932 to May 31, 1933, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for May, 1933.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May, 1933.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended June 17, 1933.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

5. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, stand-pipes, and house-service taps inspected during May, 1933.

6. Petitions :—Dr. Attygalle presented—(1) petition from Mr. E. de Alwis Senewiratne and several other owners of property in Peradeniya requesting the Council to move Government to take steps for preventing soil erosion and damage to their properties caused by the Mahaweli-ganga at Peradeniya ; (2) petition from several owners of property on which closing orders are applied for praying that steps be not taken to enforce closing orders owing to the present economic situation.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(3) petition from dhobies living at the Deyannawela Dhoby tenements suggesting that the rents be reduced and the public latrine opposite their tenements be removed ; (4) letter from the Hon. Secretary, Peradeniya Road Ratepayers Association forwarding copies of resolutions and other decisions passed at its meeting on June 8, 1933 ; (5) letter from the Hon. Secretary, Peradeniya Road Ratepayers Association addressed to Mr. Wijayatilake directing him to move a motion in Council to compensate sufferers in the recent floods and enclosing 53 lists from householders specifying articles, &c., lost in the floods.

Mr. Ismail presented—(6) petition from S. N. Segu Abdul Cader, occupier of the rice shed and boutique at the Mahaiyawa tenements applying for a further reduction in rent.

The Chairman agreed to consider the matters referred to in the various petitions.

7. Letter No. H. 56 of June 5, 1933, from the Commissioner of Local Government stating that the Governor has sanctioned under section 45 (1) (j) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Council's request to spend up to Rs. 250 out of its funds in giving relief to those affected by the recent floods at Getambe and other areas within Municipal limits.—Tabled.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Ismail asked the following questions which the Chairman replied :—

Q.—(a) What sum has already been spent on the experimental well at Peradeniya ? A.—Rs. 3,909.27.

Q.—(b) How long it will be necessary to continue work at this well before the necessary data for framing a water scheme is obtained ? A.—In the absence of any unusual or unforeseen difficulties it is expected that the well will be completed in six to eight weeks.

The following data required by the Director of Public Works has already been collected :—(1) Population in areas ; (2) maps shewing all water mains, valve connections and levels including site of well ; (3) levels and sections of proposed water mains in the new scheme ; (4) plan of site for storage tank ; (5) plan of site for filters and chlorinators ; (6) section of proposed reinforced tank for storage ; (7) plans and sections of new building for filter plant.

The following data required by the Director of Public Works remain to be collected :—(1) Condition of the existing pipe line in Peradeniya road ; (2) final plans for the whole scheme and estimates.

It is anticipated that (1) will be dealt with during the period of gauging the well. The additional data that will be required after the completion of the well include :—Gauging inflow of water available during the drought months. Analysis of water during drought months : the collection of this data must await the dry months.

Q.—(c) What would be the approximate total cost of the experiments to decide the several points on which information is necessary before a water scheme is designed? A.—The total approximate cost of the well is estimated at Rs. 6,327.77 which sums has already been voted. The cost of chemical analysis of a sample of water taken in 1932, amounted to Rs. 38.69. Cost of bacteriological analysis of a sample of water taken in 1933, amounted to Rs. 18.69. The total cost of analysis of well water will depend on the number of analysis considered necessary.

Q.—(d) The experimental well being under flood level, what precautions were taken to prevent damage by floods? A.—During last month when it appeared that flood water was likely to rise above ground level at the well site the precaution was taken of mooring the boiler and collecting tools, &c., to prevent loss of property. No damage to the well was anticipated and none occurred, save the silting up of sand in the incompleting well which could not be avoided.

Q.—(e) What the extra cost would be for repairing the damage done? A.—The cost of removing silt in the well amounted to Rs. 200. No damage occurred to the well.

Q.—(f) Whether work at the experimental well has been restarted? If so, what precautions have been taken against damage by floods again? A.—Yes. Work (removing silt) was restarted on June 5, 1933. All silt was removed by June 13, 1933. The depth of the well before the flood was 30½ feet. The present depth is 31 feet and the ultimate depth to be reached is 35 feet. The height to which the well steining had been built before the flood was 10 feet. The present height is 10 feet. It is proposed to continue to build the steining to a height of 35 feet and to seal the well. If another abnormal flood occurs within the period of finishing off the well, no damage to the well beyond silting is to be anticipated. As soon as the well is completed and tests recorded it is proposed to seal it. This will preclude the entrance of flood water or silt in the event of flood.

Q.—(g) How the work in connection with the work at the experimental well is done, whether by day labour or by contract? If by the latter, on what basis is the contract paid? A.—Up to the time of the flood the work was carried out on agreement paid by measurements taken daily of work done. Excavation in sinking the well, timbering and strutting, &c., are paid according to the usual practice at different rates relative to the footage in depth of the works executed. After the flood excavation of silt has been done by daily labour paid on check roll. Throughout, the Fireman, Boiler Driver, and watcher being employees of the Works Department have been paid on check roll. The contract basis for the completion of the well will be resumed for skilled labour, now that all silt has been removed.

9. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle asked the following questions which the Chairman replied:—(1) Q.—What is the total number of labourers on the check roll of the Health and Works Departments respectively? A.—Health Department 260, Works Department 211, including Kanganies.

(2) Q.—How many Overseers are employed in the Health and Works Departments respectively? A.—Health Department 5 including 1 on permanent establishment. Works Department 6.

Arising from these replies Dr. Attygalle asked the following supplementary question:—Why women sweepers paid at 30 cents per diem were replaced by men sweepers paid at 60 cents per diem?

The Chairman desired notice before he could reply.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake asked the following questions which the Chairman replied:—(1) Q.—Will the Chairman be pleased to state on whose information it was stated at the meeting held on February 18 last that levels were taken and that the experimental well at Peradeniya was situate above the flood levels? A.—The information was supplied by the Works Department through the Municipal Engineer.

(2) Q.—Since this information is incorrect, if it was supplied by an officer of the Council, what steps does the Chairman propose to take in regard to the conduct of such officer? A.—In accordance with recognized and established practice, the data on which the engineering department worked were the 1913 flood figures. The well site is 1.88 feet above the 1913 flood level as recorded on the gauging stone at Getambe bridge. The well which was not completed at the time of the 1933 flood was to be built 3.50 feet above ground level or 5.38 feet above the 1913 flood level. The 1933 flood rose 3.15 feet above the highest recorded 1913 flood level at Getambe bridge, and owing to the water banking up between the railway bridge and the main road bridge at Peradeniya, it is estimated to have risen considerably higher at this point. The above statement, figures and levels have been verified by the Provincial Engineer. It is considered that in allowing a margin of safety of over 5 feet above the hitherto highest recorded flood figures, the Department acted with all reasonable caution. In view of the above, the second part of the question does not arise.

(3) Q.—Will the Chairman be pleased to state what balance, if any, is left out of the collections made in connection with the Flood Relief Fund, and if he proposes to give any pecuniary assistance to those ratepayers who have lost all their belongings as a result of the floods? A.—A sum of Rs. 56.91 remains unexpended out of the vote of Rs. 250 voted by Council. A sum of Rs. 355.14 contributed by private parties remains for allocation. In all Rs. 412.5 is available. If members of Council agree, it is suggested that the above sum be spent on the relief of poor persons in assisting them to rebuild their houses, &c., in terms of the Medical Officer of Health's recommendation. Vide Circular No. 327 of June 15, 1933. Any balance remaining, it is proposed to spend in supplying poor persons with essential household utensils where these have been lost in the flood and in supplying dustbins free to householders.

11. With regard to the allotment of funds among sufferers from the floods the Council approved of the proposals contained in the answer to question 10 (3) subject to the Chairman considering before such allotment the claims submitted at this meeting referred to in item 6 (5) above.

12. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva was to move:—“That a sum of Rs. 40,000 be voted out of the surplus revenue of this Council to construct a Maternity Ward and an Outdoor Dental Surgery for the benefit of the inhabitants of the town. The said premises be constructed in the Kandy Hospital grounds and the said buildings be handed to the Central Government for management after their construction.”

In the absence of Mr. de Silva, the motion was deferred for the next meeting.

13. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle was to move:—“With a view to reduce local unemployment, the Council is of opinion that its future policy should be to give preference to local material in all construction works undertaken by this Council.”

With the leave of Council, Dr. Attygalle moved the motion amended as follows:—“With a view to reduce local unemployment, the Council is of opinion that its future policy should be to give preference to local material in all construction works undertaken by this Council, except where this involves additional cost in capital expenditure or in maintenance charges, or where outside material is considered more suitable.” Mr. Soysa seconded.—Carried.

14. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake moved:—“That the Municipal Engineer be asked to submit a report in regard to the soil erosion caused by the Mahaweli-ganga at Getambe and Peradeniya, and that Government be communicated with, with a view to take such remedial measures as may be necessary.” Dr. Attygalle seconded.

On the Chairman's suggestion the motion was adopted amended as follows:—“In regard to the soil erosion caused by the Mahaweli-ganga at Getambe and Peradeniya, that Government be communicated with, with a view to take such remedial measures as may be necessary.”

15. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

(File O 432).—Recommended.

(8) To consider whether the Accountant, who has given security of Rs. 2,000 through a Guarantee Association for the due performance of his duties as Accountant, should be asked to furnish increased security for the performance of the duties of Secretary and Accountant which have been amalgamated into one post. (AQ 111/22-4-33).—Recommended to ask him to furnish security of Rs. 5,000 through a Guarantee Association.

(9) To obtain sanction for changing the designation of "Market Night-watcher" into "Third Assistant Market-keeper" and for the payment to the peon transferred to the post from the office of annual increments of Rs. 12 on the peon's salary scale. (File O 125).—Recommended.

(10) To sanction the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 225 to the widow and six minor children of the late Ponnusamy, Sheep-slaughter House-keeper. (File G 214).—Recommended.

(11) To consider whether the Council should pay half cost of the sum of Rs. 93.96 required for the purpose of advertising the Kandy Museum by means of a sign plate affixed to an electric light standard in the locality, in terms of the request made by the Chairman of the Kandy Museum Committee of Management. (File F 155).—Not recommended.

(12) To obtain sanction for—(a) writing off a sum of Rs. 81.75 representing charges for the storage and removal of certain distrained articles which are irrecoverable, and (b) the adoption of the proposal to charge the maximum rate laid down in section 139 (b) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance as charges for seizure and removal of goods, and to limit the storage charges in respect of such goods to ten days only, except where Council employs special watchers to look after them. (File A 18).—Recommended.

(13) Further letter dated March 16, 1933, from Mr. G. F. Buultjens asking the Council to reconsider its previous decision and refund to him the sum of Rs. 202.87 appropriated by the Council from the fee of Rs. 405.73 paid to him by the Municipal Education District Committee for supervising the building of the Lady Gordon's Road Tamil school in 1927. (File O 61).—Recommended to inform Mr. Buultjens that the Council whilst being in full sympathy with him, is of opinion that it is not competent to revise a decision of Council taken in 1928.

(14) To obtain sanction for the excess of expenditure on votes for 1932 amounting to Rs. 2,675.64. (File G 58).—Recommended.

(15) To approve of three months vacation leave and 19 days lapsed vacation leave being allowed to Mr. F. V. de Alwis, Revenue Inspector, who is in hospital as a result of a motor cycle accident he met with whilst on duty on April 27, to cover the full period of the leave recommended for him by the Medical Superintendent, and to approve of the transfer of Mr. S. S. M. Mohideen, 2nd Assessment Clerk to act as Revenue Inspector during Mr. de Alwis' illness, a temporary clerk being employed in Mr. Mohideen's place on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem. (File O 117).—Recommended.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on June 10, 1933.*

(16) Estimate for Rs. 2,495 from the Municipal Engineer for fencing the Wagolla burial ground and carrying out other sanitary improvements considered necessary by the Medical Officer of Health. (File O 240A).—Recommended to consider the estimate with the 1934 budget.

(17) Estimate for Rs. 1,280 from the Municipal Engineer for building 27 feet and 6 inches length of retaining wall in Heerasagalla road. (File W/M 199).—Recommended.

(18) To obtain a supplementary vote for Rs. 1,250 under estimate 13—Sundry Works—to meet the expenditure on this vote during the next six months of this year.—Recommended.

(19) To obtain a vote for Rs. 65 to meet the cost of making a container for measuring all liquids taken into stock by the Works Department.—Recommended.

(20) To obtain a vote for Rs. 1,400 to meet the cost of making 400 concrete blocks to be used for affixing number plates to paddy fields for assessment purposes. (File A 68).—Recommended.

(21) Estimate for Rs. 437.50 from the Municipal Engineer for repairing the broken culvert in Old Matale road.—Recommended.

(22) Estimate for Rs. 344 from the Municipal Engineer for diverting water main from "Gun Fire" bungalow premises. (File W/PW 76).—Recommended.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on June 10, 1933.*

(23) Letter No. OC 4424 of May 12, 1933, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, stating that his Department is unable to agree to meet the expenditure connected with the erection and lighting charges of the public lamp standard to be erected at Mavilmada level crossing. (File F 261).—Recommended to complete the work at the cost of the Council.

(24) To sanction a vote for Rs. 50 to meet the cost of raising the high tension switch gear at the Getambe Transformer Sub-station above flood level. (File F 28).—Recommended.

(25) To sanction the adoption of record cards suggested by the Municipal Electrical Engineer for use at the Power Station and printing of 200 copies of the card. (File F 118).—Recommended.

*Resolution of Council.*

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted with the exception of items (9), (13), and (20).

Item (9) to recirculate papers and bring up at the next meeting.

Item (13) to refer back to the Law Committee.

Item (20) to refer for next meeting, meanwhile to investigate the possibility of a cheaper method of affixing numbers.

In regard to item (6), the Chairman mentioned that the inspection of the Fire Brigade will take place on June 19 and 20, commencing at 6.30 A.M. on the 19th.

16. Accountant's memo dated June 8, 1933, making proposals towards the introduction of the system of collecting rates and taxes at the Municipal Office, in place of the present system of having them collected by collectors on a commission basis. (File A 56).

Resolved to convene a special meeting of Council on Saturday, July 1, at 8 A.M. to consider the proposals.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, June 10, 1933, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated June 5, 1933.

*Present* — Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

1. The Minutes of the Special General Meeting held on Saturday, May 27, 1933, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya presented a petition from the Gramaraksaka Jayawardena Samitiya, Dangedera, in Ward No. 5 protesting against the introduction of expensive schemes and the probable increase of rates consequent thereon. The petition was tabled and the Chairman said that it would receive consideration.

3. The Chairman moved that, in terms of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, Mr. D. I. Durham, who, having failed to attend three consecutive meetings of the Council, has *ipso facto* ceased to be a member, be restored to office. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Mr. D. I. Durham thanked the members for restoring him to his seat in the Council.

4. Lease of the old Kachcheri premises at Magalle:—The Chairman moved that the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture and Lands be informed that the Council considers that the lease to Mr. Thome should expire before the land is utilized for any other purpose. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded the motion which was supported by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

In reply to Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya the Chairman stated that he was unable to say for how long the lease to Mr. Thome would be granted.

Messrs. S. H. Dahanayaka, Thomas Amarasuriya, J. E. Perera, and E. M. Karunaratna opposed the motion.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 8 votes to five, the division being as follows:—*For*.—The Chairman, Mr. D. I. Durham, Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel, Mr. A. M. Saheed, Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka, Mr. F. Magdon Ismail, Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, and Mr. R. L. Ephraums. *Against*.—Messrs. J. E. Perera, S. H. Dahanayaka, E. M. Karunaratna, Thomas Amarasuriya, and E. A. Paulas.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. M. Karunaratna moved:—(a) That in the opinion of this Council the site of the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Dadalla is highly undesirable and even positively dangerous to the health of the town and its suburbs. (b) That if it is a fact that the Sanitation Department of the Government has absolute control of the said Infectious Diseases Hospital this Council requests the Government to abolish the said Infectious Diseases Hospital and to establish one instead in a suitable locality outside the Municipal limits of Galle. (c) That if the Government desires to maintain an Infectious Diseases Hospital within the Municipal limits of Galle, such an institution should be either under the absolute control of the Municipal Council, or at least, under the joint control of the Sanitation Department and the Municipal Council. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded and Mr. F. Magdon Ismail supported the motion.

Mr. A. C. Mohammedo moved as an amendment that the 3rd part of the motion be deleted, as he thought it was unnecessary, and with regard to the second part that the words "if it is a fact that the Sanitation Department of the Government has absolute control of the said Infectious Diseases Hospital" be deleted and also that the word "remove" be substituted for the word "abolish". The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment.

Mr. J. E. Perera moved as a further amendment that the matter be referred to a Special Committee for further investigation and report. Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel seconded. Messrs. S. H. Dahanayaka and Thomas Amarasuriya also supported the further amendment.

The mover replied. He was not in favour of the further amendment proposed by Mr. Perera.

The Chairman stated that the question had already been raised officially by the Provincial Surgeon and was being considered at present. Early action in the matter would be taken by him in his capacity as Government Agent and he thought that it would be sufficient if the Council merely passed the motion now and awaited developments.

Mr. J. E. Perera's amendment was first put to the meeting and declared lost. The motion as amended was then put to the meeting and carried.

6. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka:—That the Minister of Local Administration and his Committee be requested to formulate a scheme of Reforms for the Municipal Council of Galle for the consideration of the State Council along with the Reforms of the Colombo Municipal Council.

Mr. Dahanayaka asked the leave of Council to defer this motion for consideration at the next meeting of the Council. The leave of Council having been granted the motion was accordingly deferred.

7. To consider tenders for: (a) Clearing the trace of the proposed new road at Maitipe. (b) Supplying materials for repairs to the cart shed roof, and in this connection to consider also the schedule of rates of pay. Resolved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works for consideration and report.

8. To sanction the employment of the unemployed on the proposed new road from Kumbalwella to Kitulapitiya.—Resolved that consideration be deferred for three months.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee were laid before the Council:—

## 9. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 27, 1933.

(2) To consider an application for water service.—Recommended that the application be allowed.

(3) To consider the question of replacing existing service mains of bare copper wire by insulated cables and to sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,000 for the purpose.

(4) To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 3,250 for improvements to the Fort Electric Mains.

(5) To consider an estimate of Rs. 850 for building side drains along Upper Dickson's road.—Recommended that consideration of the above three items be deferred for the present and that in the meantime additional items be collected of the most urgent improvements necessary to the Electrical System and drainage of the town with a view to the Council obtaining a loan to carry out these works.

(6) To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 500 for the survey and acquisition of a site in Hall's road for the purpose of erecting a latrine and smell-proof depot.—Recommended.

(7) To consider the question of obtaining an acquisition survey of the proposed new road at Kanampitiya.—Recommended that an acquisition survey be applied for, the expenditure to be met from vote 50 (New Roads).

With regard to item (3) the Chairman moved that, in view of the urgency of the matter, a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,000 be passed. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

so upon being requested by the resthouse-keeper, whose duty it is to consult the comfort and convenience of the occupants of the resthouse. Resthouse fees at the rates specified in the tariff appended hereto are payable by all persons using the resthouse and garage.

2. Every person, other than infants, using the resthouse or garage is separately chargeable for occupation, provided that—

(a) The servant of a traveller who occupies the resthouse may be allowed to sleep within the resthouse without the payment of any occupation fees.

(b) A chauffeur, whose car or whose master's car is garaged in the resthouse premises, may be permitted to sleep in the car or in the garage without the payment of the said fees.

3. Each visitor must sign his or her name in the resthouse book on entering the resthouse, and until this is done a visitor shall not be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments.

4. No person shall occupy any portion of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days, without the special authority in writing of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

5. Travellers shall note in the resthouse book only those resthouse charges which are payable to the Urban District Council.

6. The resthouse fees and charges shall be in accordance with the tariff appended hereto, and shall be paid in cash on demand. In default further supplies will be refused. The attention of visitors is invited to Ordinance No. 33 of 1908, a copy of which shall be exhibited, together with these rules, in some conspicuous place in the resthouse.

7. No room shall be reserved unless engaged at least one day in advance, but when so engaged shall be paid for whether occupied or not provided that until the arrival of the person or persons engaging accommodation, the accommodation shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

8. The resthouse-keeper is authorized to take no notice of telegrams asking him to prepare meals, when the name and address of the sender are not given.

9. Beds, sofas, or couches in the resthouse shall not be used for the purpose of sleeping without sheets. A breach of this rule will involve a charge of Rs. 5.

10. The value of all articles damaged or broken by visitors is to be paid in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

11. Visitors shall be entitled to call upon the resthouse-keeper to attend on them personally. The resthouse-keeper is a paid servant of the Council and is expected to wear a white coat and to be neatly dressed when attending on visitors.

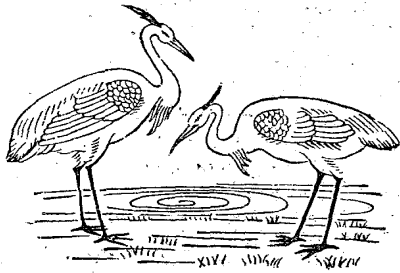
