### Convention between His Majesty, in respect of the United Kingdom, and the President of the Portuguese Republic regarding Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial Matters.

London, July 9, 1931.

[Ratifications exchanged at Lisbon, April 13, 1932.]

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the Portuguese Republic,

Being desirous to render mutual assistance in the conduct of legal proceedings, in their respective territories, in civil and commercial matters which are being dealt with or which it is anticipated may be dealt with by their respective judicial authorities;

Have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland,  
The Right Honourable Arthur Henderson, M.P., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

The President of the Portuguese Republic:  
His Excellency General Thomas Antonio Garcia Rosado, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Portuguese Republic in London;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

#### I.—Preliminary.

##### ARTICLE 1.

(a) This Convention applies only to civil and commercial matters, including non-contentious matters.

(b) In this Convention the words—

(1) "Territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall be interpreted as meaning at any time any of the territories of such High Contracting Party to which the Convention at that time applies;

(2) "Persons" shall be deemed to mean individuals and moral persons;

(3) "Moral Persons" shall be deemed to mean partnerships, companies, societies and other corporations;

(4) "Subjects or citizens of a High Contracting Party" shall be deemed to include "moral persons" constituted and incorporated in accordance with the laws of the territory of such High Contracting Party;

(5) "A subject of one (or of the other) High Contracting Party" shall in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India be deemed to mean all subjects of His Majesty wherever domiciled.

#### II.—Service of Judicial and Extra-Judicial Documents.

##### ARTICLE 2.

When judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required by a judicial authority situated therein to be served on persons in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may be served on the recipient, whatever his nationality, in the manner provided in Article 3.

##### ARTICLE 3.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed by a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates to the competent authority of the country where the document is to be served, requesting such authority to cause the document to be served. The request shall be sent by such Consular Officer to such authority.

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the language of the country where service is to be effected. The request for service shall state the names and descriptions of the parties, the name, description and address of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the document to be served in duplicate.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in the language of the country in which it is to be served, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document emanates.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent:

In Portugal to the President of the Court of Appeal in the district of which the document is to be served;

In England to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

If the authority to whom a request for service has been sent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall of his own motion transmit the document to the competent authority of his own country.

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of the country where the document is to be served, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the Municipal law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of that country.

(f) The execution of the request for service duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article shall not be refused unless:

(1) The authenticity of the request for service is not established; or

(2) The High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be effected considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall furnish a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Consular Officer by whom the request for service was made. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicates or attached thereto.

##### ARTICLE 4.

(a) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 in no way prejudice the right to use in the territory of either High Contracting Party, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country where service is to be effected, any of the following methods of service in connexion with judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of the other High Contracting Party:—

(1) Service by a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document emanates;

(2) Service by an agent appointed for the purpose either by the judicial authority by whom service of the document is required or by the party on whose application the document was issued;

(3) Service by registered post, with notice of receipt;

(4) Service by any other method which is not illegal under the law existing at the time of service in the country where it is to be effected.

(b) The methods of service referred to in (1) and (2) of paragraph (a) of this Article may not be used for service on persons, who are subjects or citizens of the High

Contracting Party, in whose territory the documents are to be served, unless such persons are willing to accept service; and, when these methods of service are employed, the documents to be served shall, unless the recipient is a subject or citizen of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country in which service is to be effected or accompanied by a translation into such language certified as correct as prescribed in Article 3 (c).

(c) It is understood that the validity of any service effected by the use of any of the methods referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article will remain a matter for the determination of the respective Courts of the High Contracting Parties in accordance with their law.

#### ARTICLE 5.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Consular Officer the request for service was addressed, shall pay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law of the country where the service is effected to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the Courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Consular Officer by whom the request was addressed when sending to him the certificate provided for in Article 3 (g).

(c) Except as provided above, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents.

### III.—Taking of Evidence.

#### ARTICLE 6.

(a) When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken in any of the ways prescribed in Articles 7 and 8.

(b) For the purposes of the present convention the words—

(1) "Taking of evidence" shall be deemed to include the taking of the statements of a Plaintiff or Defendant, on oath or otherwise, the submission to a Plaintiff, Defendant, expert or any other person of any oath with regard to any legal proceedings and the production, identification and examination of documents, samples or other objects;

(2) "Witness" includes any person (whether Plaintiff, Defendant, expert or other person) from whom any evidence as defined above is required to be taken.

#### ARTICLE 7.

(a) The judicial authority by whom the evidence is required may, in accordance with the provisions of his law, address himself by means of "Letters of Request" to the competent authority of the country where the evidence is to be taken, requesting such authority to take the evidence.

(b) The "Letter of Request" shall be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation in such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party from whose judicial authority the request emanates. The "Letters of Request" shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, giving all necessary information in regard thereto, the names and descriptions of the parties thereto, and the names, descriptions and addresses of the witnesses. They shall also either be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses, or as the case may be, by a description of the documents, samples or other objects to be produced, identified or examined, and a translation thereof certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided or shall request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked *vivá voce* as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.

(c) The "Letters of Request" shall be transmitted—

In England by a Portuguese Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature:

In Portugal by a British Consular Officer to the President of the Court of Appeal in the district in which the evidence is to be taken.

In case the authority to whom "Letters of Request" are transmitted is not competent to execute them, the "Letters of Request" shall be forwarded without any further request to the competent authority of his own country.

(d) The competent authority to whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted or forwarded shall give effect thereto and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country, except that, if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the "Letters of Request," such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of the country where the evidence is to be taken.

(e) The Consular Officer, by whom the "Letters of Request" are transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date and place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented if they so desire.

(f) The execution of "Letters of Request" which comply with the preceding provisions of this Article can only be refused—

(1) If the authenticity of the "Letters of Request" is not established;

(2) If in the country where the evidence is to be taken the execution of the "Letters of Request" in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary;

(3) If the High Contracting Party in whose territory the evidence is to be taken considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) In every instance where the "Letters of Request" are not executed by the authority to whom they are addressed, the latter will at once inform the Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the "Letters of Request" has been refused, or the judicial authority to whom they have been forwarded.

#### ARTICLE 8.

(a) The evidence may also be taken, without any request to or the intervention of the authorities of the country in which it is to be taken, by a person in that country directly appointed for the purpose by the court by whom the evidence is required. A Consular Officer of the High Contracting Party whose court requires the evidence or any other suitable person may be so appointed.

(b) A person so appointed to take evidence may request the individuals named by the court appointing him to appear before him and give evidence. He may take all kinds of evidence which are not contrary to the law of the country where the evidence is being taken and shall have power to administer an oath.

(c) Requests to appear issued by such person shall, unless the recipient is a subject or citizen of the High Contracting Party for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, be drawn up in the language of the country where the evidence is to be taken, or be accompanied by a translation into such language.

(d) The evidence may be taken in accordance with the procedure recognized by the law of the country for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, and the parties will have the right to be present or to be represented by barristers or solicitors of that country or by any persons competent to appear before the courts of either of the countries concerned.

(e) It is understood that where the method of taking evidence referred to in this Article is employed, the procedure must be entirely voluntary and no measures of compulsion can be employed and the admissibility of evidence so taken remains a matter for the determination of the respective courts of the High Contracting Parties in accordance with their law.

#### ARTICLE 9.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method laid down in Article 8 has failed owing to the refusal of any witness to appear or to give evidence, does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 7.

#### ARTICLE 10.

(a) Where evidence is taken in the manner provided in Article 7, the High Contracting Party, by whose judicial authority the "Letters of Request" are addressed, shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters, or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act in cases where the law of his own country permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure

being requested and followed. These expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the courts of the country where the evidence has been taken.

(b) The repayment of these expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the "Letters of Request" have been executed from the Consular Officer by whom they were transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing their execution.

(c) Except as above provided, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

IV.—*Judicial Assistance for Poor Persons, Imprisonment for Debt and Security for Costs.*

ARTICLE 11.

The subjects or citizens of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territory of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with subjects or citizens of that High Contracting Party as regards free judicial assistance for poor persons and imprisonment for debt; and, provided that they are resident in any such territory, shall not be compelled to give security for costs in any case where a subject or citizen of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled.

V.—*General Provisions.*

ARTICLE 12.

Any difficulties which may arise in connexion with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

ARTICLE 13.

The present Convention, of which the English and Portuguese texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in Lisbon.

The Convention shall come into force one month after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force.

If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

ARTICLE 14.

(a) This Convention shall not apply *ipso facto* to Scotland or Northern Ireland, nor to any of the Colonies or Protectorates of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, nor to any territories under his suzerainty, nor to any mandated territories administered by His Government in the United Kingdom, but His Majesty may at any time, while the Convention is in force, under Article 13, by a notification given through His Ambassador at Lisbon, extend the operation of this Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.

(b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service or for the taking of evidence are to be transmitted, and the language in which communications and translations are to be made.

The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be one month from the date of such notification.

(c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.

(d) The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, *ipso facto* terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under paragraph (a) of this Article.

ARTICLE 15.

(a) This Convention shall not apply *ipso facto* to any of the Colonies of the Portuguese Republic, but the President of the Portuguese Republic may at any time while the Convention is in force under Article 13 extend this Convention to any of such Colonies by a notification given through his Ambassador in London.

(b) The provisions of paragraph (b) of Article 14 shall apply to any such notifications.

(c) The provisions of paragraph (c) and (d) of Article 14 shall apply to any Colonies of the Portuguese Republic to which this Convention has been extended.

(d) This Convention shall apply *ipso facto* to Madeira and the Azores and requests for service or for the taking of evidence in these territories shall be transmitted to the President of the Court of Appeal at Lisbon.

ARTICLE 16.

(a) The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 13 or by virtue of any accession under this Article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when the President of the Portuguese Republic has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Majesty to which the Convention applies.

The provisions of Article 14 (b) shall be applicable to such notification. Any such accession shall take effect one month after the date of its notification.

(b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving a six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 13 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification of accession in respect of that country.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Convention, in English and Portuguese texts, and have affixed thereto their seals.

BY-LAWS REGARDING THE TAX ON VEHICLES  
 AND ANIMALS.

1. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the urban area or outside and liable or supposed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.

2. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule, shall acquire, keep, or use any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish such information as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty-five Rupees.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance any person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished and any person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Any person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all vehicles, other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used for the purpose of drawing vehicles within the limits of the Beruwala Urban District Council.

6. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued. Provided that when any plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate; and provided further that the Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by him of 50 cents.

7. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the limits of the Beruwala Urban District Council the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle in respect of which the prescribed plate should have been so affixed shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifteen Rupees.

## BY-LAW.

**Regulations.**1. (a) These regulations shall come into operation on **August 11, 1933.**

(b) From and after the afore-mentioned date the regulations published in "Gazette" No. 7,934 of July 8, 1932, shall stand rescinded and all other by-laws, orders, rules, and regulations relating to the use of highways by lorries and kept in force by and deemed to be regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations, shall cease to have effect.

2. The highways *Outside Colombo* specified in *Schedule A* are hereby declared to be suitable for use by *Lorries other than Trailers*, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that:—

- (1) the maximum weight of the lorry when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled lorries and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled lorries; and
- (2) the maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of four-wheeled lorries and three tons in the case of six-wheeled lorries.

3. The highways *Outside Colombo* specified in *Schedule B* are hereby declared to be suitable for use by *Lorries other than Trailers or six-wheeled Lorries*, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the first column of the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that:—

- (1) the maximum weight of the Lorry when fully loaded and equipped shall not in any case exceed the weight specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of the said schedule; and
- (2) the maximum axle load shall not exceed three tons.

4. The highways *Outside Colombo* specified in *Schedule C* are hereby declared to be suitable for use by *Lorries other than Trailers or six-wheeled Lorries*, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the first column of the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular Highway or part thereof, and provided that the maximum weight of the lorry when fully loaded and equipped shall not in any case exceed the weight specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of the said schedule.

## The Motor Car Ordinance, 1927.

**Regulations** for the respective areas enumerated in the schedules hereto made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by sections 6 and 58 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

## Regulations.

1. (a) These regulations shall come into operation on August 11, 1933.

(b) From and after the afore-mentioned date the regulations published in "Gazette" No. 7,934 of July 8, 1932, shall stand rescinded and all other by-laws, orders, rules, and regulations relating to the use of highways by Motor Cars other than lorries and trailers, and kept in force by and deemed to be regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations shall cease to have effect.

2. Nothing in these regulations shall be construed to apply to lorries or the use by them of highways.

3. The highways *Outside Colombo* specified in *Schedule A* are hereby declared to be suitable for use by all Motor Cars other than Lorries and Trailers, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that:—

- (1) the maximum weight of the Motor Car when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled motor cars; and
- (2) the maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and three tons in the case of six-wheeled motor cars.

4. The highways *Outside Colombo* specified in *Schedule B* are hereby declared to be suitable for use by all Motor Cars other than Lorries, Trailers, and six-wheeled Motor Cars, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the first column of the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that:—

- (1) the maximum weight of the motor car when fully loaded and equipped shall not in any case exceed the weight specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of the said schedule; and
- (2) the maximum axle load shall not exceed three tons.

5. The highways *Outside Colombo* specified in *Schedule C* are hereby declared to be suitable for use by all Motor Cars other than Lorries, Trailers, and six-wheeled Motor Cars, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the first column of the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that the maximum weight of the motor car when fully loaded and equipped shall not in any case exceed the weight specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of the said schedule.

6. No motor omnibus shall be used or driven on any of the highways *Outside Colombo* other than those mentioned in either *Schedule A, B, or C* provided that an omnibus not carrying passengers or goods may, for the purpose of entering or leaving a garage, use any highway which affords the only means of access to such garage.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 5, 1933.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 133 (9 Burghers, 73 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population, on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 23·6, as against 29·6 in the preceding week, 26·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 133 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 19 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23·6, as against 27·3 in the previous week, 25·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 133 total deaths, 21 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana East, and Wellawatta North, as against 28 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Maradana East, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 6 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 6 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana North, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar, as against 14 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Eleven deaths from *Dysentery* were registered, 7 from *Debility*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 3 each from *Worms* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Tetanus*, *Suicide*, and *Accidents*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Six cases of *Chickerypoix*, 2 each of *Measles* and *Enteric Fever*, and 1 each of *Diphtheria*, *Mumps*, and *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 4, 1, 6, 2, 2, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 79·7°, against 79·7° in the preceding week and 81·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·858 in., against 29·892 in. in the preceding week and 29·858 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·35 in., against 0·82 in. in the preceding week, and 1·26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

REGULATIONS made by the Sanitary Board of the Hambantota District, being the proper Authority in that behalf, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 18 and 23 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," in respect of the general cemeteries at Tangalla and Hambantota and the Christian cemetery, Hambantota.

## REGULATIONS.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the cemetery-keeper at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial.

2. The cemetery-keeper shall at all times keep order in the cemetery and all lawful direction given by him in that behalf shall be obeyed by every person entering the cemetery.

3. No grave shall be less than four feet in depth or at a distance of less than four feet from any other grave.

4. No grave shall be reopened within a year, and no vault within six months, from the date of the last interment therein, except upon the order of a court of competent jurisdiction.

5. (1) No dead body shall be buried or cremated in the cemetery without the permission of the cemetery-keeper.  
(2) Such permission shall not be granted till all fees due have been paid.

6. The following fees shall be paid in advance:—

- (a) For the purchase of space for a grave: Re. 1 per sq. ft. (surface).  
(b) For the purchase of space for a vault: Re. 1.25 per sq. ft.  
(c) Fees for cremation: Rs. 5.  
(d) Fees for digging a grave: Rs. 2 for an adult and Re. 1 for a child under 12 years of age.

7. Paupers dying in the Government Civil Hospital shall be buried free of charge all necessary work being done by the Hospital contractor or servants under the direction of the cemetery-keeper.

8. On the production of a certificate from a Christian Minister or the Mudaliyar of the Pattu or a Justice of the Peace, that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees herein prescribed for the burial of the dead body, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the body to be buried therein free of charge.

9. Any site not purchased for exclusive use within one year from the date of the burial, shall be regarded as available for further burials at the discretion of the cemetery-keeper.

10. Cremations shall take place only on such sites as may be indicated by the cemetery-keeper; and the ashes, unless removed within six days of cremation, shall be disposed of by the cemetery-keeper.

11. The cemetery shall be open daily to the public from 6 A.M. till sunset.

12. Should it be necessary for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, the cemetery-keeper may require that one burial service shall be concluded before another is commenced.

13. The regulations published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,590 of December 9, 1898, and regulations published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,429 of March 10, 1911, are hereby cancelled.

It was resolved, on the motion of the Chairman, that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 14, 1933, be confirmed subject to the substitution of the words "Gazette No. 7,979 of April 28, 1933" for the words "Gazette No. 7,958 of December 16, 1932" occurring in item No. 13 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of May 29, 1933, and item No. 16 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of May 31, 1933, on pages 119 and 200 respectively, as the wrong Gazette Number was inadvertently quoted.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

*Council in Committee—*

*The following Extract from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of June 17, 1933, was considered.*

(2) To consider :—(a) Letter No. P. 9/M. 33, dated June 5, 1933, from the Hon. the Minister for Labour, Industry and Commerce regarding Unemployment Relief Works. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registry No. 956.—Recommended that the Council should offer to contribute half the cost up to a maximum contribution of Rs. 200,000 of Government scheme for improving the Colombo Flood Protection Works so as to afford increased security to the city, if the scheme is undertaken now for the relief of unemployment.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

It was resolved that the matter be considered in connection with the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of June 28, 1933.

*The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of June 19, 1933, were considered.*

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(2) To re-consider :—(1) The representations received in response to the notification in the Press regarding the recommendation of the following new scale of charges for water supplied for petty trade purposes and the withdrawal of the concession of a free supply of water allowed to registered dairies. (2) The reports of the Waterworks Engineer and the Acting Municipal Treasurer. (3) The report of the Medical Officer of Health regarding the quantity of water required per head of cattle per day.

*Recommendation referred to.*—(a) That the following scale of charges be substituted for water supplied for petty trade purposes in place of that sanctioned by Council on March 4, 1925 :—For estimated quantity of water used in a month : 2,000 gallons, Re. 1; 3,000 gallons, Rs. 2; 4,000 gallons, Rs. 3; 5,000 gallons, Rs. 4; 6,000 gallons, Rs. 5; 7,000 gallons, Rs. 6; provided that in the case of eating-houses, restaurants, private laundries, and cattle galas, double the quantity of water shall be allowed. If the consumption exceeds 7,000 gallons a month (in the case of eating-houses, restaurants, private laundries, and cattle galas 14,000 gallons a month) the service to the premises shall be metered and charges levied at the rates specified in Regulation 32A. Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke to the motion.

The Chairman explained the reasons which prompted the Four Standing Committees to make that recommendation.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved, as an amendment, that if the Government guaranteed that at least 1,000 unskilled labour will be employed and that the unemployment work will be extended to a period of 12 months, this Council agree to vote half the total cost of flood improvement the maximum not to exceed 200,000 provided that a further scheme, to which the Municipality is prepared to contribute its share, is undertaken by Government simultaneously, so as to afford, together with the Flood Scheme, employment to not less than 1,800 persons daily during the period.

The Chairman suggested that the amendment might be worded as follows:—That the Council agrees to contribute, up to a maximum contribution of Rs. 200,000, half the total cost of the Government's Scheme for raising the flood embankments, if it is undertaken as a relief work at the present juncture and provided that a further scheme (or schemes) to which the Municipality is prepared to contribute its share, is undertaken by Government simultaneously, so as to afford, together with the Flood Scheme, employment to not less than 1,800 persons daily for a period of 12 months.

The mover and the seconder of the amendment accepted the wording suggested by the Chairman.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, with the permission of the seconder, withdrew his motion.

The amendment, as drafted by the Chairman became the substantive motion, which was put to the meeting and carried.

(5) To consider:—(a) Letter, dated February 13, 1933, from Mr. A. R. A. Razik, M.M.C., suggesting that in view of the heavy travelling necessitated by the intensive campaign carried on to arrest the epidemic of smallpox by the field officers of the Public Health Department, the officers concerned should at least be recompensed for the extra travelling expenses they necessarily must meet. (b) Reports thereon of the Medical Officer of Health and the Municipal Treasurer. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, Dr. E. V. Ratnam, and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando spoke again.

Mr. T. W. Hockly and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha supported the amendment.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik and Dr. S. T. Gunasekera supported the motion.

Registered No. 1,062.—Recommended:—(1) That the post be advertised in the United Kingdom to be filled on a temporary agreement for a period of 5 years without renewal; the commencing salary to be Rs. 12,000 a year rising to Rs. 15,000 a year by annual increments of Rs. 600, with a travelling allowance of Rs. 1,800 a year, the officer being required to provide himself with a car. *Qualifications.*—Applicants should hold the degree of M.R.C.V.S. and it would be desirable that they should in addition possess the D.V.S.M. All applicants should have had at least two years' experience with a local authority. (2) That, as a temporary measure, Government be asked for the loan of the services of Mr. G. B.

de Silva, on the terms mentioned in Government letter No. 1,370/33 of June 27, 1933, subject to the following alteration :—  
(c) Payment of a special allowance of Rs. 150 per mensem, with the right to retain his private practice, instead of the payment of a special allowance of Rs. 300 per mensem.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that part (2) of the recommendation be rejected and that the present acting arrangements be continued. Mr. A. R. A. Razik seconded. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal supported.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted and that the Chairman be authorized to arrange with Government the terms on which the services of Mr. G. B. de Silva are to be lent to the Council. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha pressed his motion. Mr. Aelian W. Pereira supported the motion.

The Chairman's amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam called for a division and the Council divided as follows :—

Hockly, (8) Mr. W. J. Price, (9) Mr. T. A. Owles. (Mr. N. R. Blande declined to vote.)

The motion of Mr. A. E. Goonesinha was put to the meeting and carried.

(2) To consider a report of the Acting Municipal Veterinary Surgeon and a memorandum of the Chairman, dated June 23, 1933, on the request of the Ministry of Agriculture and Lands for Council's opinion as to the revision of the quota for the importation of sheep and goats. Registered No. 1,024.—Recommended that the Council agree to the quota being reduced from 5,000 to 4,000 a month.

*The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement of June 30, 1933, was considered.*

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider the petition, presented by Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.M.C., in Council on April 5, 1933, from the residents of Mount Pleasant, Baseline road, praying for the installation of gas or electric lights on their road. Registered No. 661.—Recommended that electric lighting of street be provided on payment by the frontaging owners of the initial cost of connection to the existing electric main.

1. To consider a memorandum by the Chairman, dated June 23, 1933, regarding the recent pronouncement of the Supreme Court on the meaning of the words "existing street" in section 18 (1) (a) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915. Registered No. 999.—Recommended that section 18 (1) (a) of Chapter II. of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, be amended by the substitution of the words "a street in existence at the time of the passing of this Ordinance and" for the words "an existing street". The portion when amended to read as follows :—(a) "Shall be erected either upon the line of a street in existence at the time of the passing of this Ordinance and not less than twenty feet in width, or . . . ."

3. The Chairman moved in Committee :—

That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

4. The Chairman moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

5. The Council proceeded to elect by ballot a member in place of Mr. H. K. de Kretser, resigned, for the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

The Chairman declared that Mr. W. J. Price was elected.

6. To appoint a member in place of Mr. G. W. Dodds, resigned, for the Special Committee regarding Relief to Ratepayers.

Dr. S. muttiah moved that Mr. T. A. Owles be appointed. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried.

## ANNEXURE B.

## Proposed New By-law 25.

25. (i.) If any office be vacated by the death, removal, or absence on long leave of the holder, the person appointed to act in that office shall be remunerated as follows :—

- (1) If the person appointed is not in the Municipal Service he shall be remunerated at such rate, as may be decided in terms of Municipal Leave By-law 13.
- (2) If he is the holder of another office, but is not performing the duties of it—
  - (a) If his salary in his substantive office is not less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting he shall continue to draw the former.
  - (b) If his salary in his substantive office is less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting, he may, while so acting, receive half the initial salary of the office in which he is acting, half the initial salary of his substantive office and all the increments he has earned in his substantive office, provided that he shall not receive in all more than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting or more than his substantive salary increased by one-third if this amounts to less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting.
- (3) If he is the holder of another office and is required to discharge the duties of that office while acting, he may receive—
  - (a) If the offices are distinct and separate offices in different departments or do not stand to one another in any immediate relation of superiority or subordination, half the initial salary of the office in which he is acting together with the whole of his salary in his substantive office.
  - (b) In any other case the salary which he would receive if his case fell under (2) above.
- (4) When an officer acts in a post to which a higher commuted allowance than that which he normally draws is attached he may draw the higher allowance while it is available.

(ii.) For the purposes of this by-law, absence on long leave shall mean absence on leave for a period amounting to or exceeding sixty days.

(iii.) An officer appointed to act in an appointment other than his own cannot draw "acting" or "officiating" pay while he himself is on leave. This rule does not apply to casual leave granted under Municipal Leave By-law 14.

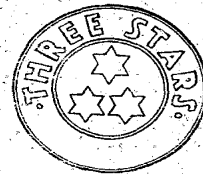

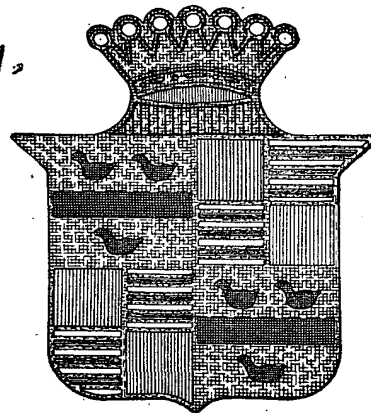
